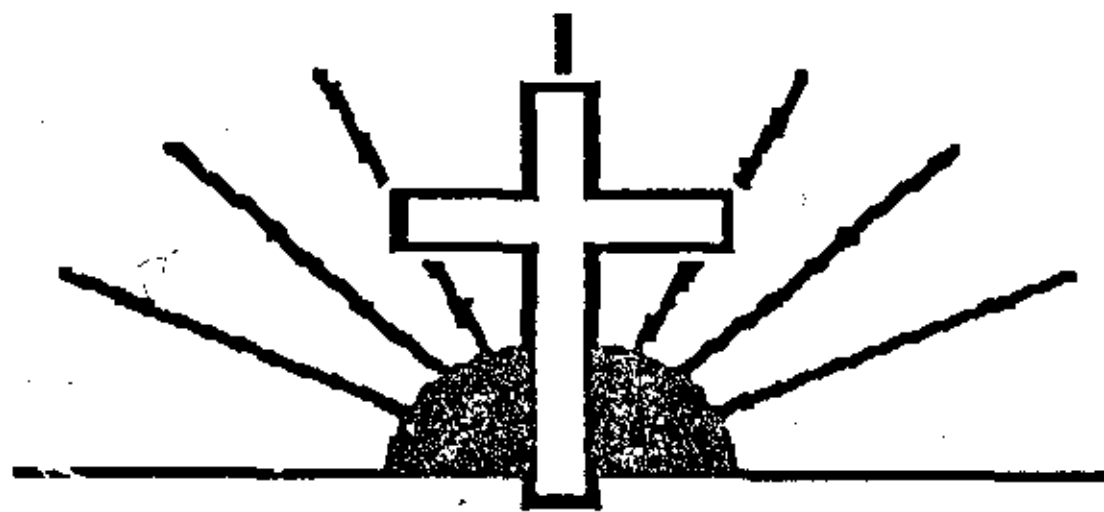

PROCEEDINGS OF THE ANNUAL MEETING

The fifty-fifth Annual Session of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists convened at the Norman Baptist Assembly, Norman Park, Georgia, on November 14-16, 1991. The theme of the meeting was "Triumphant In Christ" using II Corinthians 2:14 as a Scripture text. Music was coordinated by Rev. Danny Thomas, and provided by several different individuals and groups and song leaders. Mrs. Shirley Kimbrel served as pianist.

THURSDAY EVENING

Presiding officer, Rev. James Ursrey, opened the worship session with an introduction of Thursday evening music director, Todd Shelton, who led the congregation in singing "Stand Up For Jesus". Opening prayer was offered by Rev. Galen Dunbar with a special season of prayer for Paul Sparks. Mr. Shelton led the congregation in pledges to the American and Christian Flags.

The 55th Annual Session of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists was officially called in session by State Clerk Howard Price. He presented the Moderator, Rev. Paul Smith, pastor of Double Branch Free Will Baptist Church.

Moderator Smith gave the official welcome to all members present and recognized the following guest: Rev. Eugene Waddell, Director of Foreign Missions Department; National Association of Free Will Baptists Executive Secretary, Dr. Melvin Worthington; Home Missions Director, Rev. Roy Thomas and Rev. Billy Brown who represented Randall House Publications.

Moderator Smith called the roll of district associations with representatives from all ten districts answering. He also appointed Committee on Committees members who were: Rev. Buddy Morris, Chairman, Rev. Larry E. Williams, Mr. Gleason Fowler, Rev. James Sellers, Rev. Owen Ganey.

The congregation then sang "He Keeps Me Singing". After a prayer by Rev. Rex Lynn the congregation worshipped through giving with an offering of \$93.61. Offertory hymn, "Great Is Thy Faithfulness", was played by the pianist. Special music was provided by Mr. Bill Parker who sang a medley of hymns.

Rev. Ursrey presented the keynote speaker. Rev. Terry Pierce, pastor of First Free Will Baptist Church in Thomaston, who brought a stirring message from II Corinthians 2:14 on the "The Characteristics of a Triumphant Christian."

Moderator Smith recognized Rev. Irvin Murphy, Chairman of the Credentials Committee, who gave a partial report with the following information: 10 districts; 5 churches; voting delegation of 67; 36 visitors; with a total registered of 103.

Announcements were made by Moderator Smith and Rev. Herbert Waid. Meeting closed in prayer by Rev. Jackie Cabiness.

FRIDAY MORNING

The session was called to order by presiding officer, Rev. Dilmos Johnston, who called on Mr. Maurice Bryant to lead in the opening prayer. Rev. Wayne Price, music director, led the congregation in singing "Wonderful Grace Of Jesus". Mr. Trent Wally of Savannah brought the special music for the opening service.

The morning devotional was brought by Rev. Marvin Castle, pastor of the Macedonia Free Will Baptist Church in Colquitt, who brought a challenge from Matthew 7:7-11 entitled "Triumphant in Prayer".

Rev. Irvin Murphy gave an updated Credentials Committee report. New total registered was 154.

Moderator Smith continued the business session by recognizing all standing delegates then entertained a motion to seat all elected delegates. Motion carried. He then extended a welcome to all visitors and asked for corresponding messengers.

Rev. Buddy Morris gave the report of the Committee on Committees with the following nominations: Resolutions Committee: Ralph Lightsey, Chairman, Maurice Bryant, Kyle McDowell, Albert Rollins, William Smith; Nominating Committee: Luther Burns, Chairman, Amos McMillan, James Ursrey, Charles McNeese, Harris Nix. Motion, seconded and carried to receive this report.

Clerk Howard Price gave the report of the Executive Board as printed in the Digest Of Reports with appropriate additions to the printed report.

(1) Election of Rev. Ronald Wallace to serve as Assistant Moderator for this session. (2) Foreign Missions portion of Laura Belle Barnard Day receipts to be distributed as follows: Bishops, 12/5%; Creeches, 12/5%; Crowsons, 75%. (3) Budget Study Committee report and recommendations. (4) New National Office Building project and recommendation from the Executive Board to raise \$50,000 from Georgia for this project. Motion, seconded and carried to receive the report and act on these 4 items separately. Motion, seconded and carried to adopt items 1 and 2. Item 3 was deferred by the body until the afternoon session. Rev. Melvin

Worthington, Executive Secretary of the National Association of Free Will Baptists was recognized to give an updated report on the new National Office project. Following his report item 4 was adopted by a unanimous standing vote.

Rev. Herbert Waid, State Executive Secretary gave the report from that office. Motion, seconded and carried to receive the report.

Rev. Ronald Wallace gave the report of the Financial Study Committee with an explanation of the newly proposed budget format.

Rev. Roy Thomas, Director of National Home Missions Department gave the report from that office. He noted that so far this year that Georgia had given more than \$66,000. Motion, seconded and carried to receive the report as information.

The morning worship service was opened by presiding officer, Rev. Charles McNeese. Mr. Trent Wally, music director, led the congregation in singing the old favorite hymn "Tell Me The Story Of Jesus". Prayer was offered by Rev. Steve Hutchinson. The congregation joined in worship through giving with an offering of \$110.50. A prayer of thanksgiving was led by Rev. Steve Hughes.

Mrs. Debra Seagroves, member of the Albany Church, rendered the special music. Rev. Wayne Price, pastor of the Patmos Church, preached the morning message on Ephesians 2:13-22. His subject was "Triumphant In The Church". Closing prayer was given by Rev. Gerald Brown.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

Presiding officer, Rev. Amos McMillan, opened the afternoon session. Music Director, Rev. James Ursrey, led the congregation in singing "Since I Have Been Redeemed". Mr. Danny Dinkins then led in prayer. Special music was presented by Trent Walley.

Rev. Tony Trott, pastor of Glennville Church, brought a challenging message entitled, "Triumphant In Stewardship" based on II Corinthians 9:6-8.

President Janice Wallace gave the report from the Woman's Auxiliary. Rev. Willie Martin, chairman, gave the report of the Board of Christian Education. In the absence of Chairman Jack Lysaker, the report of the Board of Camp Mt. Bethel was given by Rev. Chuck Scarborough, State Director. Mr. Tim Jordan gave the report for the State and National Master's Men Departments. Motion, seconded and carried to receive these reports.

Rev. Ronald Wallace gave the report and recommendations from the State Financial Study Committee. Motion, seconded and carried to accept the report

and act on each item separately. Recommendation #1 (See attached report) was discussed at length. There was a call for the question motion which passed. Recommendation #1 was voted on and passed by a majority vote. Recommendation #2 was discussed. A motion carried to adopt Recommendation #2.

Proposed budget on page eight of the Digest of Reports was brought to the floor. After some discussion a motion to amend the proposed budget as shown on page 8 was presented. Following discussion of proposed amendment a motion to move the question was passed. Motion, seconded and carried to adopt the amendment to the proposed budget. After further discussion there was a motion, second to adopt the proposed budget as amended. Motion carried.

The changes (amendments) to the printed budget are as follows: set aside \$59,000 to operate the State Office and Promotional Materials and then distribute the remaining 100% on the following percentages: Executive Board, 2.1%; Missions, 60.3%; Camp Mt. Bethel, 22.5%; Christian Education, 8.6%; Trustees, 5.1%; National COOP 1.4%. In anticipation of an increase in COOP funds a motion was made to permit the Executive Board to adjust finances to reflect a 35/65 percentage State/National split of total COOP receipts. Motion passed.

Rev. Eugene Waddell, Director of Foreign Missions, gave the report from that department. Dr. Melvin Worthington, Executive Secretary of the National Association of Free Will Baptists, presented a report from that office. Rev. Bob Shockey presented the report from Free Will Baptist Bible College noting that the state of Georgia gave \$100,607 to that ministry last year. These reports were received as information.

Rev. Irvin Murphy gave an updated report of the Credentials Committee with a new total registered of 172. The afternoon session was dismissed in prayer by Rev. Dilmos Johnston.

FRIDAY EVENING WORSHIP SERVICE

Rev. Russell Horne served as the presiding officer. Mr. Trent Walley led the congregation in singing "Victory In Jesus". Rev. Charles Clark led in the opening prayer.

Rev. Horne presented the Georgia missionaries who were present and asked them to give a brief word of testimony. Those present were: Rev. Albert Rollins, Dublin; Rev. Rex Lynn, Rome; Rev. Brian Ray, East Atlanta; Rev. Luther Burns, South Atlanta. Offertory prayer was by Rev. Roger Russell and the congregation worshipped in giving a mission offering

of \$160.00. The Youth Evangelistic Team from the Albany Church presented the special music.

Rev. Eugene Waddell, Director of National Foreign Missions, preached on "Triumphant In The World", from a text in Matthew 16:18. Service was dismissed in prayer by Rev. Brian Ray.

SATURDAY MORNING SESSION

Presiding officer, Rev. Benny Smith, opened the final session by presenting Mr. Todd Shelton who led the congregation in singing "To God Be The Glory". Opening prayer was offered by Mr. Curtis Gay. Special music was presented by Todd Shelton and Trent Walley who sang, "How Long Has It Been", and Todd Shelton sang "He Hideth My Soul". Rev. Mark Barber preached the final devotional on "Triumphant In The Home" from a text in Ephesians 5:22-6:4.

Moderator Rev. Paul Smith continued the business session by calling on Rev. Billy Brown to give a report from the National Sunday School and CTS Departments. It was received as information.

Mr. Gleason Fowler gave the report of the Board of Trustees in the absence of Chairman Emmett Dunaway because of illness. Motion carried to receive his report. Mr. Benny Lariscy gave the report of the State Board of Missions. Motion was carried to receive the report. Rev. Levy Cory presented the report from the Alabama Children's Home. Motion carried to receive it as information.

Rev. Terry Pierce presented the report for the Double In A Decade Committee. Motion, seconded and carried to receive the report.

Rev. Willie Martin gave the report of the Resolutions Committee. Motion, seconded and carried to receive the report and act upon each resolution individually. (See Resolutions) Resolutions 1-4 passed. A resolution from the floor failed.

Delegates to the National Association were elected as follows: Mr. Kyle McDowell, Mrs. Belyn Pierce; Mrs. Gail Smith; Mrs. Karen Barber; Mrs. Edwina Drinkwater; Alternates were: Mrs. Debbie Lynn, Mrs. Carol Dubose, Mrs. Gennette McNeese, Mrs. Argent Corbett, Mrs. Valrie Price.

Rev. Luther Burns presented the report of the Nominating Committee. The officers, listed in front of these Minutes, were elected as presented.

There was a motion, seconded and carried to give our moderator a rising vote of appreciation for a job well done.

EXECUTIVE BOARD REPORT

November 1990 - November 1991

The Executive Board is Constitutionally charged with the responsibility of acting for the Georgia State Association when it is not in session, and then reporting to the State Association in session for approval of its actions. The decisions made by the Executive Board are made with prayerful consideration and an acute awareness of our responsibility and accountability. The following items are presented for your approval at this Fifty-Fifth Annual Session.

1991 STATE PROGRAM

The program theme for the 1991 session of our State Association is "Triumphant In Christ" taken from II Corinthians 2:14.

DOUBLE IN A DECADE

A Double In A Decade rally was held in Hawkinsville on August 23-24, 1991 with more than 140 attending. Of that number over 90 were teenagers. The Georgia theme for Double In A Decade is "20,000 by 2000" which was submitted by Howard Price. The Executive Board Account will fund all Double In A Decade activities.

GEORGIA STATE BUDGET PROPOSED

A 1992 calendar year budget of \$500,000 is proposed. You will find two different budgets included with this report for your approval. One budget is in the format of the budget we have used for ten years. The other budget was recommended by the Budget Study Committee and approved by the Executive Board.

CPA CHECKS STATE OFFICE PROCEDURES

To prepare for possible tax audits, the Executive Board approved a Certified Public Accountant Firm, the same that conducted a Tax Seminar for us last year at the State Association meeting, to evaluate our operations and procedures at the State Office. The firm advised the State

Office to keep a copy of the original incorporation papers on the premises.

The second thing suggested was meticulous minutes be taken at State Board meetings. This includes the Executive Board, Board of Camp Mt. Bethel, Board of Christian Education, Board of Missions and the Board of Trustees. A permanent copy of these board's minutes should be put in a binder at the State Office.

STRATEGY FOR PROMOTION OF THE NEW STATE OFFICE

Our people are being encouraged to purchase the new State Office by the square foot. For each five dollars given, one buys one dollar's worth of land and four dollars worth of building.

All contributions will be acknowledged with appreciation in the Promotional Bulletin and the Georgia State Annual Minutes. A permanent memorial plaque to be displayed in the new State Office will honor major contributors (\$500 from individuals; \$1,000 from groups).

LAURA BELLE BARNARD DAY

Our seventh annual Laura Belle Barnard Day was observed on October 13, 1991. Half of the receipts will be used by our State Mission Board for a Georgia State mission project. Half will be designated to the account of one or more Georgians serving overseas with our Foreign Missions Department. The State Executive Board makes this allocation in consultation with Foreign Missions Office administrative personnel. The Laura Belle Barnard Day is observed in October but the account is held open until December 31 at which time the money is distributed and a final report is put in the Promotional Bulletin.

STATE OFFICE PERSONNEL CONSIDERED

Granted was an increase in the amount of FICA taxes paid for the Executive Secretary and the bookkeeper.

In keeping with suggestions made by the CPA when he examined our procedures, the Executive Board voted to state in writing on an appropriate form the salaries and benefits for the State Office personnel. This official form will be kept in the file with other Executive Board minutes.

STATE OFFICER RESIGNS

Rev. Billy Sharpston, State Moderator, resigned as Moderator because he accepted a church in another State. That office will be filled at this meeting by the Assistant Moderator, Rev. Paul Smith.

STATE FINANCE STUDY COMMITTEE:

SUBMITTED FOR ADOPTION AT THE STATE ASSOCIATION
MEETING: November 15, 1991

The Finance Committee submits the following report for your consideration and recommendation to the State Association for adoption.

The committee considered the dissatisfaction with the present system of managing the gifts from the churches in the State Association and attempted to look objectively at ways to improve the system.

The following method of managing the monies given through the State financial program is suggested:

RECOMMENDATION 1

That the Georgia Coop system be a true co-operative plan with all the gifts received supporting Georgia Ministries except a percentage that will be sent from Georgia to the National Coop plan. The percentage sent to the National shall not exceed 10% until the total COOP giving has reached a level that allows for a greater percentage.

That the budget be a combined budget which incorporates giving through Georgia COOP and Designated giving. And, that the State Ministries be allowed to receive designated gifts as well as COOP receipts.

RECOMMENDATION 2

That the following guidelines be adopted to implement the changes necessitated by Recommendation 1.

1. All COOP and Designated funds will be disbursed promptly to the targeted source at the end of each month.

2. All COOP funds will be disbursed on a percentage plan as adopted by the State Association. The proposed Annual Budget will recommend the allocations for each fiscal year.

3. State Ministries will be allowed to receive Designated funds in addition to COOP funds without penalty or punitive consideration.

4. The State Budget will project income to each Ministry based on COOP and Designated giving. To ensure adequate funding for each State Ministry, the COOP percentages will be recommended based on the amount of Designated funds directed toward each State Ministry.

5. Each State Ministry will submit a proposed budget to the Executive Board for the fiscal year. The budget will reflect projected income from COOP and from Designated giving. All special projects for generating Designated giving will be declared in the budget proposal.

6. In the event of an emergency financial need arising during the fiscal year, the Executive Board will be given the authority to take action to deal with the emergency as best suits the need.

7. All fund raising outside the adopted State Budget, such as special projects by a State Ministry, must be presented for approval by the Executive Board prior to being initiated.

PERSONAL NOTE FROM THE STUDY COMMITTEE:

The committee understands the autonomous right of each Church to transact business according to the conscience of the local leadership. However, we urge each church to join in a united effort to support the total ministry of Free Will Baptists on the State and National levels. You can accomplish this goal by supporting the adopted budget of our State Association.

If you choose to chart your own course of support, we challenge you to be good stewards with the Lord's tithes, and designate to each ministry of your State and to each ministry of the National Association. We are motivated with the conviction that all of the Lord's work is important and worthy of support.

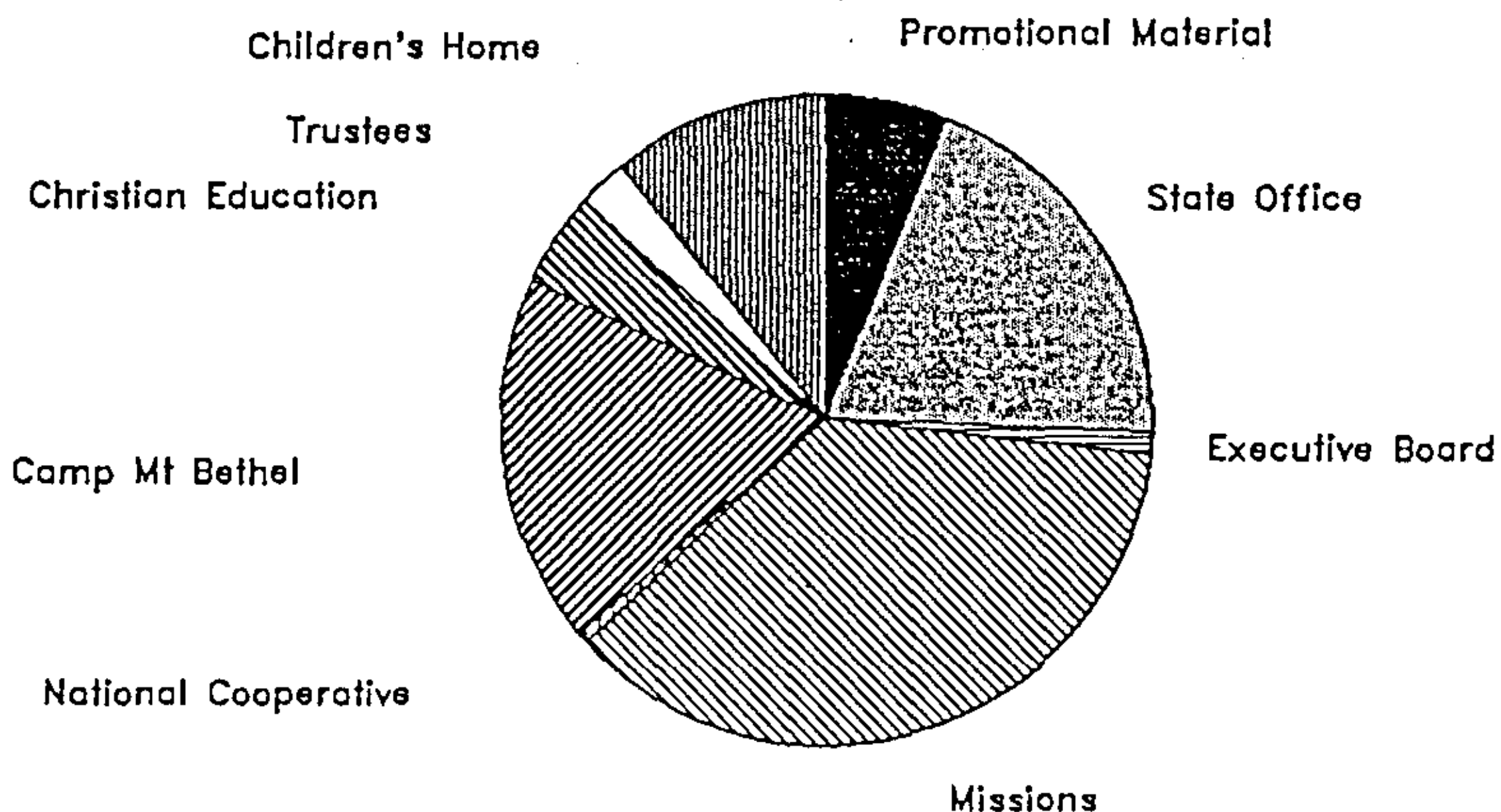

EXECUTIVE SECRETARY/TREASURER REPORT

It is exciting to see so many of our churches improving their church buildings. Others are moving ahead with plans to relocate or remodel. Even greater is the joy of hearing the reports of souls being saved and added to our church rolls. Often these two, better facilities and church growth, go together. A beautiful and spacious church with ample classrooms will not by itself cause a congregation to grow, but it helps.

Georgia Free Will Baptist are busy for the Lord. The Saturday schedule may be a fair indicator of just how busy we are. The State Executive Secretary/Treasurer had fewer than one Saturday a month during the first ten months of this year when he was not with a board, committee or auxiliary, or a district association, or the National Association. Although State Association business is usually done on Saturdays, State and National functions and board and committee meetings fall on week days too.

Last year the State Association voted to move the State Office to Macon. By the end of October 1991 we had receive \$12,773.50 for this project. We deeply appreciate those who have taken seriously the will of the delegates. Sunday School classes and auxiliaries have adopted this project. Walk-a-thons have been sponsored by district associations and churches. Others have put the project in their church budgets. A few churches have given a considerable sum in a one time offering. Some individuals have been very generous. The two people who pledged one thousand dollars each at the State meeting last year have paid their commitments.

The new State Office Land/Building fund raising project was set to be completed in three years. The long ranged goal was fixed so everyone could do a little all along and the cumulative result would be \$300,000. No one would be in a strain, other ministries would not be affected and the State Association ministries would be enhanced. That was the plan. It seems many may have taken the three year goal to mean we can wait 1,095 days before we need to begin to give.

No outsider would tell a Free Will Baptist church how to budget its money. Meantime, every church expects their members to give their tithes and offerings to finance whatever their church votes to do. Fair enough. Good church members support their church.

Equally true is the fact every church that is a member of our State Association has an obligation to support the decisions voted by the State Association in session. Every church can influence the vote of the State Association. Some do not avail themselves of the opportunity to attend and vote their convictions. That is their choice. All active ministers and deacons vote as standing members. Every church may send one elected delegate for every one hundred or fraction of a hundred members. Even the district association delegates are church members too. Only these church member delegates adopt the constitution, elect the officers and board members, set the budgets and approve the reports and projects. Neither the State Executive Board nor the State Office sets the agenda and makes the business decisions of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists. Only our churches do. Our churches speak as their delegates meet together to conduct business in the name of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists.

Membership has its privileges and its responsibilities. It is futile to vote and then not comply with the result of the vote. A minority view should be respectfully debated but a minority cannot prevail over the will of the majority. No democratic body can function without majority rule. The whole idea of democratic government is, those who bear responsibilities have the privilege of making the decisions. Conversely, those who have the privilege of making decisions have the responsibility to back the vote of the majority.

Even as our churches are responsible members of the State Association, so are they of the National Association. We have an indebtedness of \$1.5 million for our new National Office building. We hope to sell the old property for a half million dollars. The balance must be given by our church people. When dividing one million dollars by the membership of the National Association, state by state, we find Georgia's obligation is \$48,620 or 4.862% of the total. We really should give fifty thousand dollars (5% of the total) or more because some states may not pull their load. If some states shirk their duty, the conscientious ones must do the noble thing and pay the part they fall short. One way or the other the debt must be paid and we are the only ones to do it. Soon you will be hearing more about this urgent project.

The enclosed 1990 annual financial reports are audited and show (1) balances brought forward on January 1, 1990; (2) receipts; (3) expenditures; (4) balances on hand on December 31, 1990. Written reports are current as of November 1, 1991.

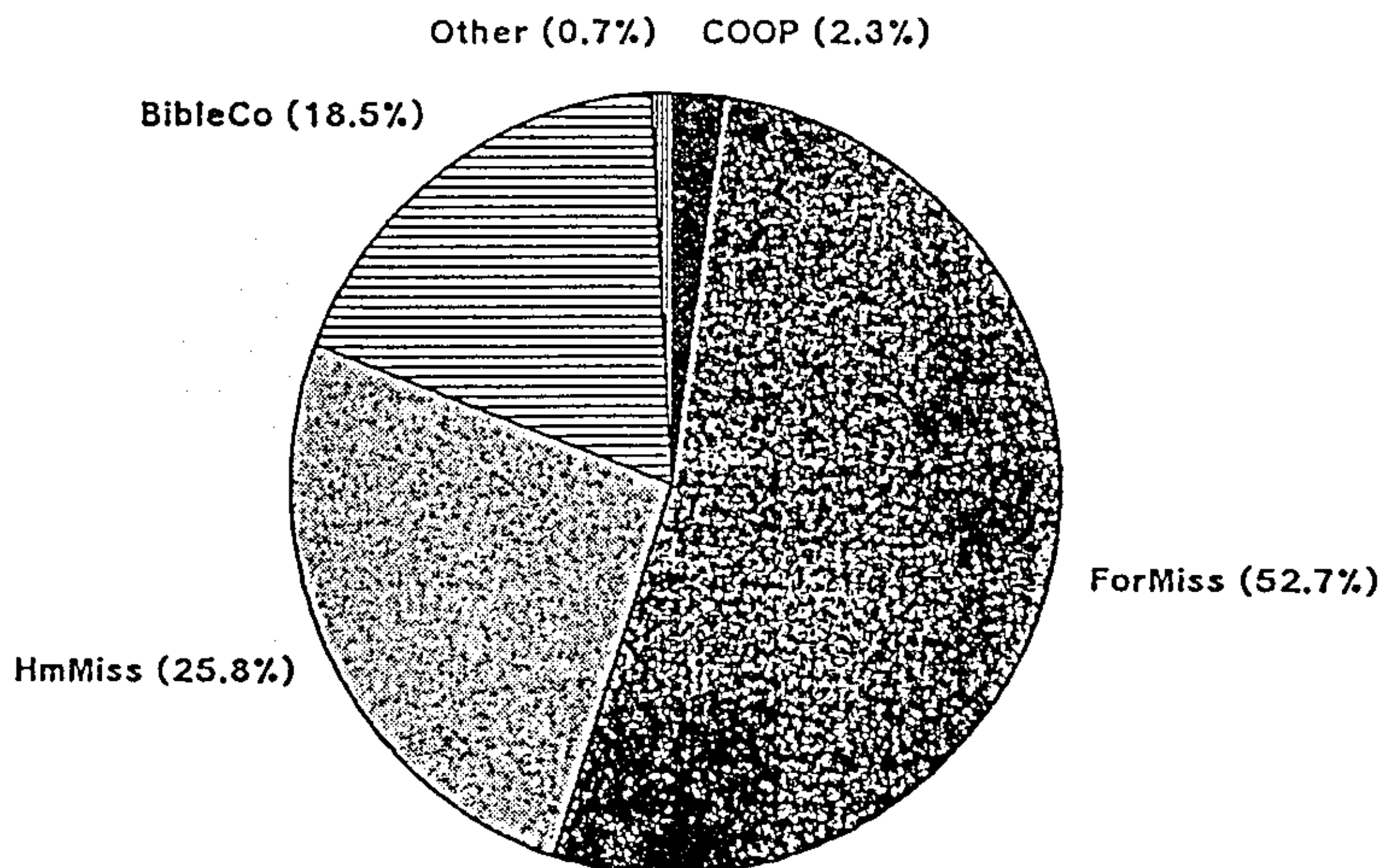

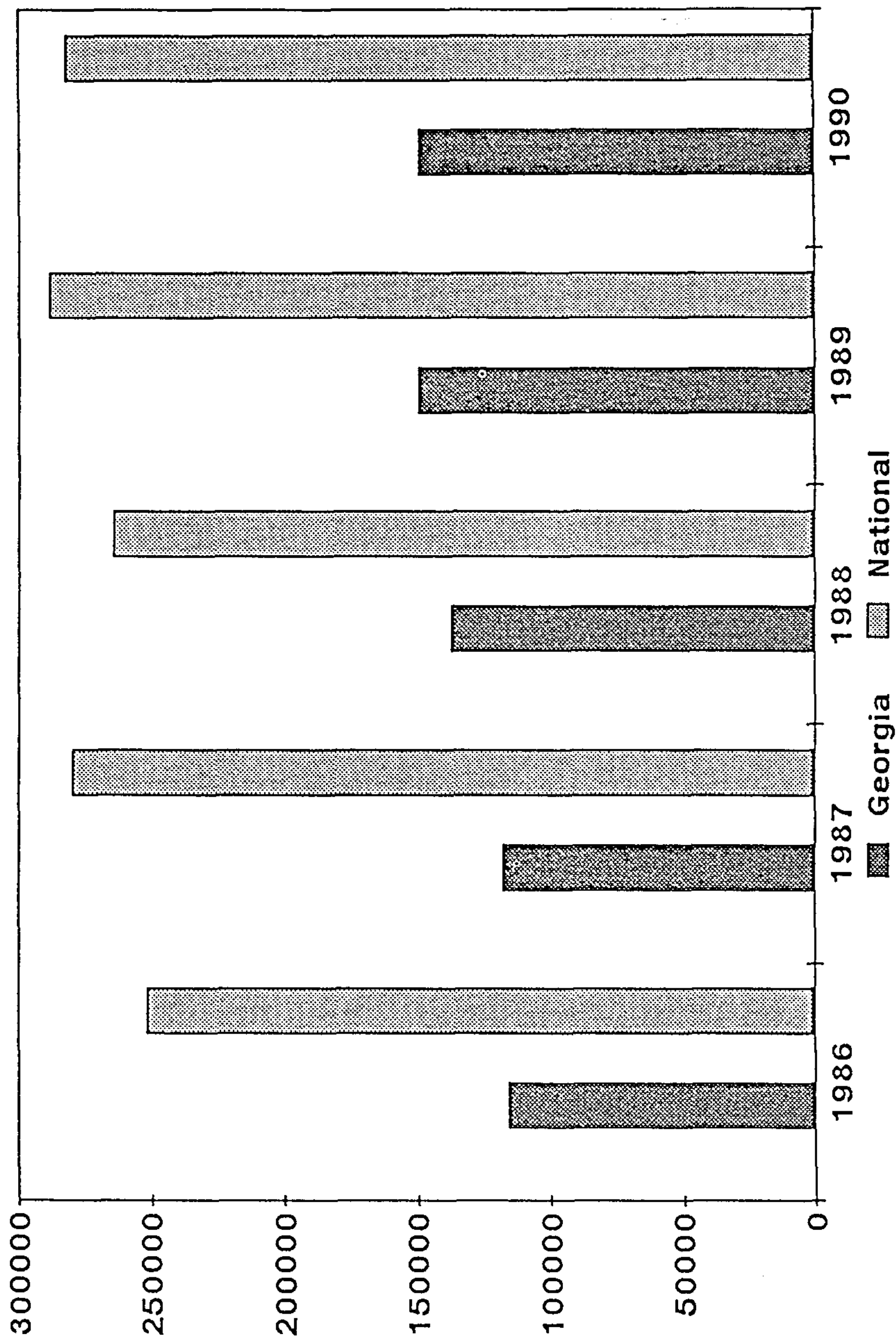

BOARD OF CAMP MT. BETHEL REPORT

November 1990 - November 1991

The Board is pleased to report a good year of work on your behalf at Camp Mt. Bethel. For the third year we have been able to make significant progress on the camp facilities, and have developed a five year plan to continue upgrading and improving the camp.

Our first activity of the year was a teen camp over the spring school break. Although attendance was down, the work of the Lord was great. Spiritual renewal is our aim.

Prior to the summer session we again had some work days with as many as 20 workers helping. We were able to repair broken items and upgrade in all areas required by the fire marshall. This work was coordinated by the Grounds Director, Rev. William Smith. A break down of what was done is:

- * We installed new metal doors to most of the buildings
- * New roof on the structures
- * New and improved exit and fire lights
- * 60 mattresses for the dorms
- * Full size bed and mattress for the cooks room
- * Replaced a refrigerator
- * Installed small air conditioners in cooks & evangelist room
- * Privacy fence constructed near girls dorm
- * Constructed fence at end of basketball court
- * Repairs on the chapel building

We commend the many people and groups of people who have made all these nice improvements possible and complete.

The State Camp Director, Rev. Chuck Scarborough, planned and supervised another great year. His regular camp staff members were: Evangelist Dennis Moore; Lifeguards and Bible teachers, Charles Lysaker and Christine Wright; Cook, Mrs. Sarah Thompson; Caretaker, Jim Lamb. In addition several of the district associations provided volunteer workers for their respective sessions.

We conducted seven camp sessions this summer, with a total of 356 campers, 80 helpers and 12 visitors. Sixty-two of the campers accepted Jesus as Saviour and 52 other decisions which included one camper answering the call to preach and another the call to missions. Two campers determined to go to Free Will Baptist Bible College.

We greatly appreciate the support we received from the Georgia State Budget because of COOP giving. We also appreciate the Master's Men help. These monies in conjunction with campers fees and private donations provide us with the funds needed to maintain Camp Mt. Bethel.

This coming year we plan to continue upgrading the facilities by remodeling the boys dorm washroom, camp evangelists living quarters, replacing the tile in the kitchen, tiling the dining hall and some remodeling in the chapel.

Thanks for helping us make the camp a more comfortable and convenient place. Camp is where many of our teens are coming face to face with the Lord. We are proud to be a part of that process. Thank you for the trust you have placed in the camp board to do this part of the Lord's work.

The Board of Missions met in December of 1990 at the State Office and in May at the North Fayette Church. At that meeting it was voted to give Luther Burns a salary increase and to give missionaries Rex Lynn and Brian Ray a housing allotment. The Board also made provisions to pay the expense for our Georgia State missionaries to attend the State Association meeting.

Although the North Fayette church was completed in 1990 they are still having to meet building code qualifications from new city and county inspectors. However, most of Brother Luther's time is now spent visiting and trying to build a membership.

The Dublin church is on its way to being indigenous. Brother Rollins is adding stable church members to the church roll.

Brother Rex Lynn is having a difficult time building a nucleus of believers in gospel hardened Rome. They continue to hold services in a rented building.

The Brian Rays have seen some growth but seems to be having difficulty keeping a good core of believers. They too are having services in a rented building. Brother Brian has been on itinerate to raise monthly support.

The Board has reactivated the Living Memorial Church Building Fund to save money for land and buildings. All money paid back from loans the Board has made and 10% of its share of the State Budget is going into the fund at present.

We adopted a new Missionary Contract which is included elsewhere in this report for your information.

As the Board looks to the future we trust that we can be a part of Double In A Decade by helping establish several new works. We thank all of you who are concerned about winning souls and who are supporting our efforts by giving through the State Budget with Cooperative offerings. The Budget receipts make up most of our working funds. If the Lord leads you to designate above your tithe we trust you will pray about giving to our State missionaries.

Thank you for giving us an opportunity to serve you.

MINUTES OF GEORGIA STATE
WOMAN'S AUXILIARY CONVENTION

The Georgia State Woman's Auxiliary Convention held it's annual meeting November 13 & 14, 1991, at Norman Baptist Assembly, Norman Park, Georgia, using as its theme "Until He Comes". Titus 2:12-13 was the chosen scripture text.

The Wednesday evening session of the convention was opened by singing "To God Be The Glory" led by Marie Glover, who was the music director for the convention; accompanied by Janet Baxley, pianist, and Fleda Snow, organist, musicians for the convention. An inspirational song session was presented by several groups and soloists. The evening message, delivered by Rev. Ronald Wallace, challenged us to evaluate ourselves as Christians for possible reasons for powerless lives. He chose Luke 9:34-41 as his text. The service was dismissed by singing the first verse of "Amazing Grace".

The session reconvened at 10:00 Thursday morning with the congregation singing "More About Jesus" and "I Am Resolved". Several special prayer requests were acknowledged after which Barbara Fletcher led in prayer. Special music was rendered by a group of the Homerville Auxiliary Women. A very heartening devotion was delivered by Janet Massey. Recognition was made of Fleda Snow and Mary Griffin, Georgia Foreign Missionary moms present in the meeting.

President Janice Wallace called the meeting to order. The Credentials Committee report was given by Wynelle Clower, Chairperson. Motion carried to accept report and seat delegates. The Secretaries report revealed that we have 61 Auxiliaries with a total membership of 626 and 3 Actionette groups with a membership of 25. Edith Shiver conducted the Remembrance Service for former Co-Laborers: Ruth Griffin, Betty Bentley, Clyde Johnson, Essie Lou Clower and Nancy Johnson all from the Midway District; Ether Chesser from the South Georgia District; Lura Irene Driggers from the Martin District. Edith Shiver led in a prayer of remembrance for these faithful women. Ingrid Skeens gave the Georgia Retreat update, encouraging all women to consider attending the next retreat to be held March 13-14, 1992. A short recess was taken before the morning worship service.

The morning worship service was opened by singing "All That Thrills My Soul Is Jesus". Prayer

was offered by Rev. James Ursrey. The offertory prayer was by Betty Henderson. Lida Wallace sang "He Restoreth My Soul" prior to Lucy Hyman's introduction of our special speaker, Dr. Mary Ruth Wisehart. Dr. Wisehart used Acts 1:9-11 as her text, and challenged us to hold loosely the things of this world; hold fast to God; keep on obeying; and keep expecting. She urged us to execute these precepts joyfully. A prayer of dismissal and thanksgiving for the food was offered by Rev. Herbert Waid.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS
GEORGIA STATE ASSOCIATION OF
FREE WILL BAPTISTS

PREAMBLE

We, the Free Will Baptist of the State of Georgia, do ordain this Constitution for the purpose of advocating, promoting and increasing all phases of the cause of Christ.

ARTICLE I

This assembly shall be known as the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.

ARTICLE II

SECTION 1. The officers of this association shall be a Moderator, an Assistant Moderator, a Clerk, an Assistant Clerk, and an Executive Secretary/Treasurer.

SECTION 2. The Executive Board shall be composed of the regular officers; the chairman of each of the standing boards; and the previous moderator, as an ex officio member for a period of two years following his term of office.

SECTION 3. This association shall be composed of all active Ministers, Deacons, Missionaries, and Board Members who are members of affiliated bodies: one (1) delegate for every three hundred (300) members or fraction thereof from District Associations; one (1) delegate for every one hundred (100) members or fraction thereof from each local affiliated church.

SECTION 4. All delegates from District Associations and local churches shall be elected from the laity of the body sending them.

SECTION 5. Funds to meet current needs of this body shall be paid to the treasurer of this association. Each District Association will give a minimum of fifteen dollars (\$15) per delegate authorized, and each local church will give ten cents (\$.10) per capita of their respective memberships.

SECTION 6. In order to pay our Georgia State Association's annual representation fee to the National Association, each local association is to be responsible to promote, receive and forward the amount designated by the National Association per church per year to the State Office, along with their annual State Association representation fee, on or before our annual State Association session.

ARTICLE III

SECTION 1. It shall be the privilege of each affiliated District Association to recommend a member for each standing board. Terms of office on these boards shall be on a rotating basis which will necessitate the election by the State Association of five (5) members every two (2) years, thus giving each member a four (4) year term of office.

SECTION 2. There shall be a Board of Missions composed of members who are noted for their missionary zeal.

A. The Board of Missions shall employ missionaries as needed to establish Free Will Baptist mission/churches in the State of Georgia. These missionaries may be employed exclusively or jointly with other Free Will Baptist mission agencies.

B. A mission/church sponsored by the Georgia State Association and its missionary are under the authority of the State Association and the supervision of the Georgia State Board of Missions.

C. A mission/church does not have autonomous church status. As long as the mission/church is unable to provide for its own financial needs, enlist its own members and officers, maintain its own worship and outreach ministries and conduct its own business, it is in a dependent relationship to the State Association and its Board of Missions.

D. When the mission/church is self-sustaining, self-governing, self-discipling and self-propagating it should be organized into an autonomous Free Will Baptist church following the procedures adopted by the Georgia State Association.

E. After proper procedures are satisfied and the church is duly organized into an autonomous Free Will Baptist church it shall have all the normal rights, privileges and responsibilities of any other Free Will Baptist Church.

SECTION 3. There shall be a Board of Camp Mt. Bethel whose duties shall be:

A. To be responsible for maintenance, upkeep and insurance of Camp Mt. Bethel. This Board is to repair, modify or alter any building at Camp Mt. Bethel at their discretion with the provision that the Board of Trustees shall be considered if the cost of a project is to exceed \$2,500. The above "shall be considered" here means that the Board of Camp Mt. Bethel and the Board of Trustees shall function as a single joint board with co-equal authority and responsibility.

B. To schedule and arrange all camp sessions to be held at Camp Mt. Bethel, and to appoint the Camp Director each year. It is understood and agreed in this connection that the Camp Director shall be in authority in matters of faculty, curriculum, administration, food service, and recreation during camp sessions.

SECTION 4. There shall be a Board of Christian Education whose duties shall be:

A. To provide educational services for the members of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists.

B. To set policy and supervise the functions of a State Youth Committee. This Board shall appoint this Committee to carry out Board policy.

C. To organize, sponsor and promote educational and inspirational retreats for our members.

D. To organize, sponsor and promote Sunday School and Church Training Service seminars.

E. To set policy and supervise the functions of a Historical Committee. This Board shall appoint the Historical Committee to gather and set forth for public knowledge and posterity the history of Georgia Free Will Baptists.

SECTION 5. There shall be a Board of Trustees whose duties shall be: the maintenance, upkeep and insuring of all State Association properties; the planning and supervision of all future developments and expansion of these properties as directed by this State Association except as otherwise provided in this Constitution.

SECTION 6. There shall be a Credentials Committee which shall consist of three (3) members who shall be in charge of the registration and examination of delegates and the receiving of all dues. These members are to be elected at the time of the General Officers.

SECTION 7. There shall be a member of the Board of Trustees of the Free Will Baptist Children's Home, Eldridge, Alabama, elected during the 1971 session for a term of four (4) years. Election thereafter shall be for a four (4) year term.

SECTION 8. There shall be a Georgia State Master's Men. They shall select their own officers and conduct their own business.

SECTION 9. There shall be a Georgia State Woman's Auxiliary Convention. They shall elect their officers, conduct their business and maintain their treasury.

ARTICLE IV

SECTION 1. All officers except board members and the Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be elected to serve a term of two (2) years. The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be employed by the Executive Board of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, subject to the ratification of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists at its next regular session, for an indefinite period, with an agreement of a sixty (60) day notice of termination by either the Executive Secretary or the Executive Board.

SECTION 2. Standing boards of the State Association have no power or final authority to hire full-time employees until the matter has been presented to and acted on by the State Association in session except where otherwise provided.

SECTION 3. Vacancies on any of the boards or committees which occur between regular sessions of this State Association, may be filled by the Executive Board until the convening of the annual session of said association.

SECTION 4. Election of all General Officers shall take place on the odd years of the calendar.

SECTION 5. If a member of any board fails in the function of his or her duty without good and sufficient reasons, the board of which the delinquent is a member may declare that particular office vacant. Further, this body shall have and does reserve the right to deal with any officer or board member who does not conduct his or her office in a Christian, businesslike manner according to the rules of Christian conduct as set forth in the New Testament.

Any standing board of this State Association may appoint proxies to serve in lieu of the absent members.

At the pleasure of the boards, and subsequent to the meeting from which the regular member is absent, the boards have the right to deal with the delinquent member in the manner stated in this section.

SECTION 6. Boards may be called into session by the Chairman or Vice-Chairman of said board, or by the Moderator or Assistant Moderator of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, upon the request of the majority of the members of said boards.

AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be changed, altered, or amended by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all delegates present and voting at any regular session of the State Association. Prior to a final vote on any amendment, change or alteration, said amendment, change or alteration shall be submitted in writing to the Clerk of this association and shall lie on the table from one (1) business meeting to the next during the same session, during which time it shall be read at least two (2) times in open session. Officers, standing boards, and/or standing committees may be added or deleted as the need arises.

BY-LAWS

SECTION 1.

A. All real property, checking and savings accounts or any other assets of this Association shall be in the name of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.

B. One or more of the corporate officers of the Association shall be the legal signers for all Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists' business. These officers are: the Moderator as the corporate President; the Clerk as the corporate Vice-President; the Executive Secretary/Treasurer as the corporate Secretary/Treasurer.

C. The State Office shall be responsible for the safekeeping of the corporate seal and all official documents of this Association.

D. No State board may borrow money or financially obligate the State Association without the approval of the State Executive Board.

E. The fixed assets (building, land) of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists shall not be liquidated except by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the delegates present and voting at any regular session of the Association.

F. The records of all financial transactions shall be open to all members of the Georgia State Association. The financial transactions of the State Office and State boards shall be audited annually.

G. Annual financial reports of the State Office and State boards and the auditor's report shall be made to the State Association in session and be entered in the Annual State Minutes.

H. The State Treasurer shall be bonded in an amount stipulated by the State Executive Board.

I. This Association shall meet for its regular session annually on Thursday following the second Sunday in November and shall adjourn on the Saturday immediately following.

SECTION 2.

A. When the State Association is not in session, the State Executive Board shall be fully authorized to do business in the name of the State Association.

B. The State Association has full authority to direct the State Executive Board in all business conducted on its behalf.

C. The State Executive Board shall report to the State Association in session concerning the business conducted for the State Association since its last convening.

D. The State Executive Board has the prerogative of deferring any matter to the State Association as a whole but is not under obligation to do so.

E. The State Executive Board shall meet quarterly on Friday or Saturday before the second Sunday of the following months: February; May; August. The November meeting shall be held just prior to regular meeting of the State Association.

SECTION 3.

A. The Moderator shall preside at the Annual Sessions of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists and the meetings of the Executive Board. The Moderator shall be the President of the Corporation known as the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.

B. The Assistant Moderator shall preside in the absence of the Moderator and/or when appointed by the Moderator as the need arises.

C. The Clerk shall keep records of the proceedings of the Annual Associational meetings and of the Executive Board meetings. It shall also be his responsibility to have the minutes of these sessions printed and distributed. The Clerk shall be the Vice-President of the Corporation known as the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.

D. The Assistant Clerk, in the absence of the Clerk, shall fulfill the functions and duties of the Clerk as stated in paragraph C of this document.

SECTION 4

A. The Executive Secretary shall be responsible and accountable to the Executive Board in the fulfillment of the duties of his office as determined by the Executive Board.

B. The Executive Secretary shall be allowed four (4) weeks vacation per year with pay.

C. Funds received by the Executive Secretary for revivals, special speaking engagements and promotional meetings, shall go into the Cooperative Fund. The exception to this regulation relates to any remuneration received by the Executive Secretary during his four (4) weeks vacation, which funds shall be his personally and need not be accounted for to this State Association.

D. Salary, mileage, and operational expenses of the Executive Secretary shall be determined by the Executive Board.

E. The Executive Secretary shall be Secretary/Treasurer of the Corporation known as the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.

SECTION 5.

A. The Executive Board shall serve as the Placement Committee for the State Association. In this capacity the board shall investigate places suitable for this meeting and make recommendations to said State Association. Meeting places shall be determined two (2) years in advance.

B. The Executive Board shall plan the program for the annual meetings of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists and the annual meetings shall follow the programs as closely as possible. Business sessions shall be conducted according to the commonly accepted rules of Parliamentary Procedure.

C. The Executive Board shall formulate the budget for the State Association annually and recommend to the body in session the allocations to be observed in the Cooperative Plan of Giving. This board shall in addition to the above stated duties, also recommend a mileage rate for travel by the members of all of the standing boards of said association.

SECTION 6.

Necessary committees shall be appointed by the Moderator unless otherwise provided for by the body.

SECTION 7.

These By-Laws may be altered, changed, or amended at any regular session of this association by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of delegates present and voting.
