#### PROCEEDINGS OF THE ANNUAL MEETING

The fifty-seventh Annual Session of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists convened at the Norman Baptist Assembly, Norman Park, Georgia, on November 18-20, 1993. The theme of the meeting was "Found Faithful" using I Corinthians 4:2 as a Scripture text. Music was coordinated by Rev. James Ursrey, and provided by several different individuals, groups, and song leaders. Mrs. Janet Baxley served as pianist.

#### THURSDAY EVENING WORSHIP SERVICE

Music Director, J.M. Creech, opened the worship session with the singing of "He Keeps Me Singing". Rev. C.B. Dowdney led the congregation in the pledges to the American and Christian Flags. Prayer followed the pledges.

The 57th Annual Session of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists as officially called in session by the State Clerk, Rev. Terry Pierce. He introduced the Moderator, Rev. Paul Smith, who extended a welcome to everyone.

Clerk Pierce called the roll of district associations with the representatives from all ten districts answering. Moderator Smith then appointed Committee on Committees members who were: Willie Martin, Chairman, Owen Ganey, Charles Drinkwater, Kenneth Murphy, and Marvin Castle.

The congregation then sang "Trust and Obey". After a prayer by Rev. Ronald Wallace the congregation worshipped through giving with an offering of \$88.00. Special music was provided by Rev. Russell Horne who sang "It Took A Miracle". Rev. C.B. Dowdney presented the keynote speaker. Rev. Wayne Miracle, pastor of the Pine Level Free Will Baptist Church in Alma. Before the message Rev. J.M. Creech led the congregation in singing "Turn Your Eyes Upon Jesus". Rev. Miracle gave a wonderful message on being "Found Faithful" from the passage of Revelation 2:1-7.

Moderator Smith recognized Rev. Jeff Lunsford, Chairman of the Credentials Committee, who gave a partial report: 10 districts; 50 churches; voting delegation of 87; 33 visitors; with a total registered of 120.

Announcements were made by Moderator Smith. Meeting was closed in prayer by Rev. Russell Horne.

#### FRIDAY MORNING SESSION

Mr. Trent Walley led the congregation in singing "Stand Up For Jesus". Rev. Steve Hutchinson called the morning session into order. Rev. Joe Buttgen led in prayer. Mr. Walley led the congregation in singing "Tell It To Jesus". Rev. Joel Lauckner provided the special music by singing "I Am Determined".

The morning devotional was brought by Rev. Carl Miller, pastor of the Deep Creek Free Will Baptist Church in Midville. He brought a stirring message from Jonah 2:1-10 on how to confront God in our prayer life.

The Moderator called for a report from the Credentials Committee. Rev. Jeff Lunsford gave a partial report declaring a voting delegation of 114, with a total registration of 158.

Moderator Smith recognized the standing delegates and entertained a motion to seat all elected delegates. The motion was adopted. The Moderator recognized all corresponding visitors: Rev. Jimmy Aldridge of the Foreign Missions Department; Rev. Bob Shockey of Free Will Baptist Bible College; Rev. Billy Brown of Randall House Publications; Rev. William Evans of Retirement and Insurance Department; Rev. Glenn Thomas of Home Missions Department; Miss Dawn Sweeney of Tennessee Children's Home.

Motions were carried to receive this report and all nominees be elected.

Clerk Terry Pierce gave the report of the Executive Board as stated in the Digest of Reports with the appropriate additions. Additions: (1) To accept the 1994 Budget proposal. Motion was seconded and carried. (2) Recommend the Foreign Missions Department share of the Laura Belle Barnard Day receipts will be split with 1/3 each to the Snows, Bishops, and Crowsons. Motion was

seconded and carried. (3) To defer the State Office Project to the Trustee Board report. Motion was seconded and carried. (4) To table a constitutional change of Article III, Section 3, part A. Motion was seconded and carried.

Executive Secretary, Herbert Waid, presented a report from the State Office. Motion was seconded and carried to adopt this report.

Rev. Billy Brown gave a report from Randall House Publications. Motion was seconded and carried to receive this report. Motion was seconded and carried that Clerk Pierce send a letter of appreciation to Roger Reeds, the soon to be retired Director of Randall House Publications. Rev. Bob Shockey gave a report on the ministries of Free Will Baptist Bible College. Motion was seconded and carried to receive this report. Motion was seconded and carried to adjourn for recess.

Rev. James Ursrey opened the morning worship service by leading the congregation in singing "More About Jesus". Rev. Ronald Wallace led in prayer. Rev. Charles Clark presided as the congregation worshipped in giving. Rev. Howard Faircloth asked the blessing upon the offering. Miss Chanda Daughtry provided the special music as she sang "Holy Ground". Rev. J.M. Creech, Pastor of the Bellview Free Will Baptist Church, Colquitt, preached on the subject of "Faithful To The Scripture", found in Il Timothy 3:14-17. Rev. Irvin Murphy closed the service in prayer.

#### FRIDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

Rev. Johnny Beasley opened the afternoon session. Mr. Trent Walley led the congregation in singing "I Stand Amazed In The Presence Of The Lord". Rev. Gene Cross led in prayer. Mrs. Frances Beasley presented the special music. Rev. Paul Smith brought the afternoon message on the topic of "Faithful To The Program". He spoke from I Corinthians 4:2.

The Moderator called for other reports. Mrs. Janice Wallace gave the State Woman's Auxiliary report. Rev. Willie Martin then shared about the various ministries that the Board of Christian Education was involved in this past year. Mr. Jack Lysaker gave a report from the Board of Camp Mt. Bethel. He shared the progress of rebuilding the Camp dining hall. All of these reports were received and adopted.

Rev. William Smith gave the Board of Trustees report. Motion was seconded and carried to receive this report. The Board of Trustees recommended that the plan to move the State Office be presented at the 1994 State Meeting. Motion was seconded and

carried to adopt this recommendation. Mr. Malcom Freeman gave the Board of Missions report. Motion was seconded and carried to receive this report.

Rev. William Evans gave both the Retirement and Insurance Department report and the Free Will Baptist Foundation report. Brother Evans also reported for the National Executive Office. Motion was seconded and carried to receive these reports. Rev. Terry Pierce gave the Georgia Double in a Decade report. Rev. Jimmy Aldridge shared the National Foreign Missions Department report. Rev. Glenn Thomas reported for the National Home Missions Department. Motion was seconded and carried to receive each of these reports.

Rev. Jimmy Aldridge introduced missionaries Paul and Rhoda Creech. Paul shared about their missionary work in Cote d'Ivoire. Miss Dawn Sweeney reported on the ministry of the Tennessee Children's Home.

Rev. Jeff Lunsford gave an updated report of the Credentials Committee with a count of 120 voting delegates and 171 total registered. A motion was seconded and approved to receive this report.

Rev. Charles McNeese gave the partial report of the Nominating Committee. Motion was seconded and carried to receive this report. Motion was seconded to adjourn for recess.

#### FRIDAY EVENING WORSHIP SERVICE

Rev. Wayne Price opened the evening session by leading the congregation in singing "Blessed Assurance". Rev. Walter Baxley led in prayer. Presider Mr. Malcom Freeman introduced the New Home Trio who sang "My House Is Full" and "Christ Through Me". Mr. Benny Lariscy informed the congregation that the State Mission Board half of the Laura Belle Barnard Day receipts will be divided as follows: 1/3 to the Paul Creech account, \$1,000 to the Georgia Union District Perry Mission Church Building Project, and the balance to the North Fayette Church Loan.

Rev. Herbert Waid led in prayer before the Missions offering was received. The offering total was \$451.00. Rev. Jimmy Aldridge preached on the topic of being "Faithful In Service". He preached from Philemon verse 24. Rev. Luther Burns dismissed in prayer.

#### SATURDAY MORNING SESSION

Rev. S.E. Newberry opened the final service by presenting Rev.

Joel Lauckner who led the congregation in singing "Standing On The Promises". Rev. Bud Hill led in prayer. Rev. Newberry sang "He Touched Me". Rev. Steve Hughes preached the final message of the meeting an the topic of "Faithful In Praise". He shared from the passages of I Corinthians 4:2 and Nehemiah 9:5. He closed the message with prayer.

Moderator Paul Smith continued the business session by asking for more reports. Mr. Jim Vallance gave the report of the National Master's Men. Motion was seconded and carried to receive this report. Rev. Charles Clark gave the Resolutions Committee Report. Three resolutions were submitted with each being adoped. (See Resolutions).

Rev. Jeff Lunsford gave the final report of the Credentials Committee. He stated that we had a voting delegation of 127 with a total registered of 185. Motion was seconded and carried to receive this report. Delegates to the National Association were elected as follows: Mrs. Edwina Drinkwater, Mrs. Barbara Dunbar, Mrs. Cheryl Barwick, Mrs. Rose Cross, and Mrs. Arlene Smith. Alternates are: Mrs. Belyn Pierce, Mrs. Gail Smith, Mrs. Henrietta Brown, Mrs. Darlene Buttgen, and Mrs. Martha Morris. Motion was carried to elect the above.

Moderator Smith introduced the proposed Constitutional Change to read "if the cost of a project is to exceed \$5,000 rather than \$2,500". This change is found in Article II, section 3, part A. Motion seconded and carried to adopt the change. Rev. Bill Barksdale gave the report for the Alabama Children's Home. Motion was seconded and carried to receive this report.

The Nominating Committee final report was given by Rev. William Smith. It was recommended that the following serve: Howard Price, Assistant Clerk; Terry Pierce, Clerk; Russell Horne, Assistant Moderator; Paul Smith Moderator. Motion was seconded and carried to accept these as the State Officers.

The next State Association meeting was announced for November 17-19 at Norman Baptist Assembly in Norman Park. Motion was seconded and carried to adjourn. Mr. Benny Lariscy dismissed in prayer.

#### EXECUTIVE BOARD REPORT

November 1992 - November 1993

The Executive Board is Constitutionally charged with the responsibility of acting for the Georgia State Association when it is not in session, and then reporting to the State Association in session for approval of its actions. The decisions made by the Executive Board are made by consideration and an acute awareness of our responsibility and accountability. The following items are presented for your approval at this Fifty-Seventh Annual Session.

#### 1993 STATE PROGRAM

The program theme for the 1993 session of our State Association is "Found Faithful" taken from I Corinthians 4:2.

#### DOUBLE IN A DECADE

The Georgia Double in a Decade Committee met on February 19, 1993 to discuss methods for promoting this effort in district associations. A statewide rally was held on September 18 at Camp Mt. Bethel. Seven of our associations were represented at the meeting. Challenge, instruction, and encouragement were the topic for the day. This meeting was closed with a special prayer for the salvation of the lost souls in our communities and state.

#### GEORGIA STATE BUDGET PROPOSED

A 1994 calendar year overall budget of \$500,000 is proposed. A Georgia State Cooperative Budget of \$175,000.00 is included in the overall budget. You will find the budget included with this report for your approval.

#### NATIONAL OFFICE BUILDING FUND DAY

July 4, 1993 was designated as a statewide day for a special offering for the liquidation of the debt on the National Office Building. An updated report of the total funds given in Georgia can be found elsewhere in this Digest.

#### OFFICE EQUIPMENT UPDATED

The State Office computer was updated in July.

#### LAURA BELLE BARNARD DAY

Our ninth annual Laura Belle Barnard Day was observed on October 12, 1993. Half of the receipts will be used by our State Mission Board for a Georgia State mission project. The other half of the funds received will be given to our Georgia Foreign Missionary who has an account need. The need is determined by the Georgia State Executive Board in consultation with the Foreign Mission Treasurer.

#### STATE OFFICE PERSONNEL EVALUATION

Granted was an increase in the salary for the Executive Secretary and the bookkeeper of 5%.

#### JOINT BOARD MEETING CHAIRMAN

The Executive Board elected Jack Lysaker as the Chairman of the joint board meetings between the Camp and Trustee Board. These boards are working together on the project of rebuilding the dining hall at Camp Mt. Bethel.



#### EXECUTIVE SECRETARY/TREASURER REPORT

You and I, your church and mine, your district association and mine, our State and National Associations are all components of a single whole. Together we are an integral part of the mystical Body of Christ. Other believers are parts of the Body too. They have their role to play, we have ours. It is imperative Free Will Baptists work together as a healthy, unified, well functioning part of the Body of Christ.

Recently our unity was threatened when we were called on to take sides in an issue not of our making. Doubts and confusion were spread by attacking our foreign missionaries. While the missionaries were stating they maintain a stand against drinking alcoholic beverages, some were skeptical. Finally, the missionaries' reaffirmation of their stand was heard. The controversy was laid to rest at our National Association meeting in July, but not before grave damage was done to the unity of the Body of Christ. Meantime, support for our foreign missionaries was eroded. Four of five of the accounts of our foreign missionaries from Georgia are in the red. This is representative of the general financial distress our foreign missions department is experiencing.

We have just had a crisis in the Body of Christ. A crisis will end in one of two ways. Either the body will die or, if the fever breaks, slowly recover. Thank the Lord, we are in a recovery phase. Hopefully, we are wiser because of this difficult experience—we will cherish our unity. Hopefully, we will rally to the ministry needs of our denomination—all of us supporting all of the ministries.

Some may say, "Our church is not able to give much. Our part would not help if we give or be missed if we don't give." Wrong. Most churches cannot give much but multiply the "some" of each church by what a 100 plus churches of the Georgia State Association can do and the accumulative results will be abundantly beyond what we have done yet.

What ministries should we support? Do not neglect any. Supporting a ministry is a vote for it. Conversely, not supporting a ministry is a vote against it. No church should be for the State

ministries but be against their district association ministries. No church should be for the National ministries but be against their church's ministries. Jointly we are complexly interrelating parts or elements of the Body of Christ.

How should we give? Ideally the church should at least tithe their undesignated income to ministries outside the local church. The most consistent and impartial method is to support both the State COOPerative Plan and the National COOPerative Plan. An alternate plan for funding the National ministries is to generously support the "National Together Way" plan. "The Together Way" asks each church to promote and give a generous special offering to each National ministry in certain months, specifically:

APRIL Foreign Missions

SEPTEMBER "The Rest of the Family"

(all other National ministries)

NOVEMBER National Home Missions

DECEMBER Free Will Baptist Bible College

May I commend those who are fulfilling their financial responsibility as a Georgia State Association member church. You are making Free Will Baptist ministries happen. All Georgia State ministries are almost totally funded by our COOPerative giving churches. Thank you, COOPerative givers.

In 1990 we launched a three year project to raise \$300,000 to relocate the State Office. Thank you to those who have responded. It is time to evaluate our options.

In 1991 we adopted a \$50,000 project to fund the new National Office Building. This project is to be completed by July 1994. About one third (32.5%) of our churches have given their \$5.00 per church member.

As a member church you automatically come under the umbrella of the National Association for IRS approval for tax exemption. Without this status your church, if challenged, would be libel for paying tax on all offerings and the value of all church property. Each year your church has been paying a \$10 representation fee to the National Association. This gives your church the above tax exemption right and the privilege to have State delegates and your pastor and deacons seated as voting delegates in the National Association business sessions. From next year the representation fee will be raised to \$25.

Ten times that much would be a bargain. You are part of the "Body" with rights and privileges and responsibilities. Rejoice in your position. Be faithful.

The enclosed 1992 annual financial reports are audited and show (1) balance brought forward on January 1, 1992; (2) receipts; (3) expenditures; (4) balance on hand on December 31, 1992. Written reports are current as of November 1, 1993.

#### BOARD OF CAMP MT. BETHEL REPORT

November 1992 - November 1993

The Board of Camp Mt. Bethel report this year is one of mixed emotions. We have accomplished much, but we have also suffered loss. We have made significant progress and we have felt the sting of our dining facility fire. The upgrading of our camp continues but now we have changed our priorities to rebuild our dining facilities.

Our camping year started off with a large work force of men and women concentrating on preparing the camp for the summer. The major project was the new boys washroom area. We would like to give special thanks to Mr. Jerry McNease from Colquitt for drafting the plans for our bathroom and also to Rev. Charles McNeese for overseeing the project. We were shocked at the significant increases in building materials caused by the two hurricanes Hugo and Andrew. Just weeks after our estimates had been negotiated and the old wash room area ripped out, many building materials tripled in price creating a large cost overrun of about \$7,000. The project is now completed and should serve us for many years.

Other improvements included a new mower deck for grass cutting, tile in the kitchen, painting of both dorms and the canteen and a change in food preparation to reflect the new meat cooking temperature requirements given to us by the State Food Service Managers.

Our regular camping statistics for the year included seven regular sessions, 369 paid campers and 43 visitors. We recorded 32 salvation decisions along with 85 rededications and 15 other decisions. We have experienced about an 80% return rate of children from last year's sessions. We also had 7 new churches send children to camp this year.

This year's active staff included: State Camp Director, David Starr; State Grounds Director, William Smith; Camp Evangelist, Eric Thomsen; Lifeguards, Tim Wilhoite and Stephani McElhaney; Cook, Mrs. Sara Thompson; Caretaker, Jim Lamb; cook's helpers, Cheryl Wild and Tori Lindsey. Addition volunteer help of 113 councilors and various helpers provided us with a full staff of workers.

In addition to our regular camping sessions the Board of Christian Education sponsored a ministers retreat in April and a Family Retreat in June at the Camp.

The successful camp year has been somewhat shadowed by the August 11 fire that destroyed our Dining Hall, Kitchen and Cooks Quarters. On September 11 a joint meeting of the Board of Trustees and the Board of Camp Mt. Bethel was held. We appointed a steering committee to help rebuild and enhance the dining area. it is our intention to have these facilities ready as soon as possible so that we might continue our ministry at Camp Mt. Bethel. Several other projects were placed on hold until we replace the destroyed building. The new facility will have to meet specifications required by the State Food Service Manual. This will include a new deep sink, dish washing area, first aid area and other minor items of concern.

To date several hundred dollars have been raised to aid this special need and we pray that the remainder of funds will be provided shortly. Please send your gifts to the State Office earmarked "Camp Fire Fund."

Our Lord has given us a good camp. Many souls are claimed for Jesus and many others decide to serve and follow the Lord each year. We would like to believe that the spiritual changes indicated at Camp Mt. Bethel will provide a good foundation for our future church leaders. Your support of both the camp and its board is appreciated.

 Mission Project of this Convention goal remain \$7,000.00 to be disbursed as follows:

Creech's Account 25%
Crowson's Account 25%
Griffin's Account 10%
Snow's Account 15%

4. Whereas, the Free Will Baptist Bible College is seeking regional accreditation, and the Welch Library at the College is in need of books;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that we encourage each local Woman's Auxiliary to give money for two or more books (ranging from \$9.95 to \$99.95 or more) to the Welch Library at the Free Will Baptist Bible College. (If any Auxiliary or individual wishes to give a book in memory of or in honor of someone, the library uses a nameplate to show the gift.)

 Whereas, The Woman's National Auxiliary Convention voted in 1993 to change the National Organization's name to "WOMEN NATIONALLY ACTIVE for CHRIST"

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Georgia Woman's Auxiliary Convention change its name to "WOMEN of GEORGIA ACTIVE for CHRIST" and it will be known as the "Women of Georgia Active for Christ (WGAC) Convention of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists".

6. Whereas, the Woman's Auxiliary Convention in 1993 increased National dues to \$10.00 a year per member;

### THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED

- (1) That the Georgia Woman's Auxiliary Convention (WGAC) increase State dues to \$10.50 a year per member, of which \$10.00 will be sent for National dues and \$.50 will be retained in the State Treasury, beginning January 1994;
- (2) We recommend the Districts, if they desire, to set their dues as above \$10.50, plus \$.25 or more to be retained in the District's Treasury.

- 7. BE IT RESOLVED that the cost of the WGAC State Retreat be \$34.00 for each person, and a deposit of \$14.00 be sent to the State Treasurer no later than February 1, 1994 by all who plan to attend the State Retreat.
- 8. Whereas, many women would like to have the names and addresses of auxiliary members over the State,
  - THEREFORE, we resolve that the names and address of members in each auxiliary in Georgia be compiled by Districts and a copy be made available to each local auxiliary through the State Secretary.
- 9. BE IT RESOLVED that we express our appreciation to each one who has helped make this Convention one of the best, and we give them a rising vote of thanks with a hearty Amen.

## **CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS**

# GEORGIA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

## PREAMBLE

We, the Free Will Baptist of the State of Georgia, do ordain this Constitution for the purpose of advocating, promoting and increasing all phases of the cause of Christ.

## **ARTICLE !**

This assembly shall be know as the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.

## ARTICLE II

SECTION 1. The officers of this association shall be a Moderator, an Assistant Moderator, a Clerk, an Assistant Clerk, and an Executive Secretary/Treasurer.

SECTION 2. The Executive Board shall be composed of the regular officers; the chairman of each of the standing boards; and the previous moderator, as an *ex officio* member for a period of two years following his term of office.

SECTION 3. This association shall be composed of all active Ministers, Deacons, Missionaries, and Board Members who are members of affiliated bodies: one (1) delegate for every three hundred (300) members or fraction thereof from District Associations; one (1) delegate for every one hundred (100) members or fraction thereof from each local affiliated church.

SECTION 4. All delegates from District Associations and local churches shall be elected from the laity of the body sending them.

SECTION 5. Funds to meet current needs of this body shall be paid to the treasurer of this association. Each District Association will give a minimum of fifteen dollar (\$15) per delegate authorized, and each local church will give ten cents (\$.10) per capita of their respective memberships.

SECTION 6. In order to pay our Georgia State Association's annual representation fee to the National Association, each local association is to be responsible to promote, receive and forward the amount designated by the National Association per church per year to the State Office, along with their annual State Association

### **ARTICLE III**

SECTION 1. It shall be the privilege of each affiliated District Association to recommend a member for each standing board. Terms of office on these boards shall be on a rotating basis which will necessitate the election by the State Association of five (5) members every two (2) years, thus giving each member a four (4) year term of office.

SECTION 2. There shall be a **Board of Missions** composed of members who are noted for their missionary zeal.

- A. The Board of Missions shall employ missionaries as needed to establish Free Will Baptist mission/churches in the State of Georgia. These missionaries may be employed exclusively or jointly with other Free Will Baptist mission agencies.
- B. A mission/church sponsored by the Georgia State Association and its missionary are under the authority of the State Association and the supervision of the Georgia State Board of Missions.
- C. A mission/church does not have autonomous church status. As long as the mission/church is unable to provide for its own financial needs, enlist its own members and officers, maintain its own worship and outreach ministries and conduct its own business, it is in a dependent relationship to the State Association and its Board of Missions.
- D. When the mission/church is self-sustaining, self-governing, self-discipling and self-propagating it should be organized into an autonomous Free Will Baptist church following the procedures adopted by the Georgia State Association.
- E. After proper procedures are satisfied and the church is duly organized into an autonomous Free Will Baptist church it shall have all the normal rights, privileges and responsibilities of any other Free Will Baptist Church.

SECTION 3. There shall be a Board of Camp Mt. Bethel whose duties shall be:

- A. To be responsible for maintenance, upkeep and insurance of Camp Mt. Bethel. This Board is to repair, modify or alter any building at Camp Mt. Bethel at their discretion with the provision that the Board of Trustees shall be considered if the cost of a project is to exceed \$5,000. The above "shall be considered" here means that the Board of Camp Mt. Bethel and the Board of Trustees shall function as a single joint board with co-equal authority and responsibility.
- B. To schedule and arrange all camp sessions to be held at Camp Mt. Bethel, and to appoint the Camp Director each year. It is

understood and agreed in this connection that the Camp Director shall be in authority in matters of faculty, curriculum, administration, food service, and recreation during camp sessions.

SECTION 4. There shall be a Board of Christian Education whose duties shall be:

- A. To provide educational services for the members of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists.
- B. To set policy and supervise the functions of a State Youth Committee. This Board shall appoint this Committee to carry out Board policy.
- C. To organize, sponsor and promote educational and inspirational retreats for our members.
- D. To organize, sponsor and promote Sunday School and Church Training Service seminars.
- E. To set policy and supervise the function of a Historical Committee. This Board shall appoint the Historical Committee to gather and set forth for public knowledge and posterity the history of Georgia Free Will Baptists.

SECTION 5. There shall be a **Board of Trustees** whose duties shall be: the maintenance, upkeep and insuring of all State Association properties; the planning and supervision of all future developments and expansion of these properties as directed by this State Association except as otherwise provided in this Constitution.

SECTION 6. There shall be a Credentials Committee which shall consist of three (3) members who shall be in charge of the registration and examination of delegates and the receiving of all dues. These members are to be elected at the time of the General Officers.

SECTION 7. There shall be a member of the Board of Trustees of the Free Will Baptist Children's Home, Eldridge, Alabama, elected during the 1971 session for a term of four (4) years. Election thereafter shall be for a four (4) year term.

SECTION 8. There shall be a Georgia Sate Master's Men. They shall select their own officers and conduct their own business.

SECTION 9. There shall be a Georgia State Woman's Auxiliary Convention (GWAC). They shall elect their officers, conduct their business and maintain their treasury.

### **ARTICLE IV**

SECTION 1. All officers except board members and the Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be elected to serve a term of two (2) years. The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be employed by the Executive Board of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, subject to the ratification of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists at its next regular session, for an indefinite period, with an

agreement of a sixty (60) day notice of termination by either the Executive Secretary or the Executive Board.

SECTION 2. Standing boards of the State Association have no power or final authority to hire, full-time employees until the matter has been presented to and acted on by the State Association in session except where otherwise provided.

SECTION 3. Vacancies on any of the boards or committees which occur between regular sessions of this State Association, may be filled by the Executive Board until the convening of the annual session of said association.

SECTION 4. Election of all General Officers shall take place on the odd years of the calendar.

SECTION 5. If a member of any board fails in the function of his or her duty without good and sufficient reasons, the board of which the delinquent is a member may declare that particular office vacant. Further, this body shall have and does reserve the right to deal with any officer or board member who does not conduct his or her office in a Christian, businesslike manner according to the rules of Christian conduct as set forth in the New Testament.

Any standing board of this State Association may appoint proxies to serve in lieu of the absent members.

At the pleasure of the boards, and subsequent to the meeting from which the regular member is absent, the boards have the right to deal with the delinquent member in the manner stated in this section.

SECTION 6. Boards may be called into session by the Chairman or Vice-Chairman of said board, or by the Moderator or Assistant Moderator of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, upon the request of the majority of the members of said boards.

### **AMENDMENTS**

This Constitution may be changed, altered, or amended by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all delegates present and voting at any regular session of the State Association. Prior to a final vote on any amendment, change or alteration, said amendment, change or alteration shall be submitted in writing to the Clerk of this association and shall lie on the table from one (1) business meeting to the next during the same session, during which time it shall be read at least two (2) times in open session. Officers, standing boards, and/or standing committees may be added or deleted as the need arises.

## **BY-LAWS**

### SECTION 1.

- A. All real property, checking and savings accounts or any other assets of this Association shall be in the name of the *Georgia State*Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.
- B. One or more of the corporate officers of the Association shall be the legal signers for all Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists' business. These officers are: the Moderator as the corporate President; the Clerk as the corporate Vice-President; the Executive Secretary/Treasurer as the corporate Secretary/Treasurer.
- C. The State Office shall be responsible for the safekeeping of the corporate seal and all official documents of this Association.
- D. No State Board may borrow money or financially obligate the State Association without the approval of the State Executive Board.
- E. The fixed assets (building, land) of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists shall not be liquidated except by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the delegates present and voting at any regular session of the Association.
- F. The records of all financial transactions shall be open to all members of the Georgia State Association. The financial transactions of the State Office and State boards shall be audited annually.
- G. Annual financial reports of the State Office and State boards and the auditor's report shall be made to the State Association in session and be entered in the Annual State Minutes.
- H. The State Treasurer shall be bonded in an amount stipulated by the State Executive Board.
- I. This Association shall meet for its regular session annually on Thursday following the second Sunday in November and shall adjourn on the Saturday immediately following.

### **SECTION 2**

- A. When the State Association is not in session, the State Executive Board shall be fully authorized to do business in the name of the State Association.
- B. The State Association has full authority to direct the State Executive Board in all business conducted on its behalf.
- C. The State Executive Board shall report to the State Association in session concerning the business conducted for the State Association since its last convening.
- D. The State Executive Board has the prerogative of deferring any matter to the State Association as a whole but is not under obligation to do so.

E. The State Executive Board shall meet quarterly on Friday or Saturday before the second Sunday of the following months: February, May, and August. The November meeting shall be held just prior to the regular meeting of the State Association.

### SECTION 3.

- A. The Moderator shall preside at the Annual Sessions of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists and the meetings of the Executive Board. The Moderator shall be the President of the Corporation known as the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.
- B. The Assistant Moderator shall preside in the absence of the Moderator and/or when appointed by the Moderator as the need arises.
- C. The Clerk shall keep records of the proceedings of the Annual Associational meetings and of the Executive Board meetings. It shall also be his responsibility to have the minutes of these sessions printed and distributed. The Clerk shall be the Vice-President of the Corporation known as the *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists*, *Inc.*
- D. The Assistant Clerk, in the absence of the Clerk, shall fulfill the functions and duties of the Clerk as stated in paragraph C of this document.

## **SECTION 4**

- A. The Executive Secretary shall be responsible and accountable to the Executive Board in the fulfillment of the duties of his office as determined by the Executive Board.
- B. The Executive Secretary shall be allowed four (4) weeks vacation per year with pay.
- C. Funds received by the Executive Secretary for revivals, special speaking engagements and promotional meetings. shall go into the Cooperative Fund. The exception to this regulation relates to any remuneration received by the Executive Secretary during his four (4) weeks vacation, which funds shall be his personally and need not be accounted for to this State Association.
- D. Salary, mileage, and operational expenses of the Executive Secretary shall be determined by the Executive Board.
- E. The Executive Secretary shall be Secretary/Treasurer of the Corporation known as the *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists*, *Inc.*

## **SECTION 5**

- A. The Executive Board shall serve as the Placement Committee for the State Association. In this capacity the board shall investigate places suitable for this meeting and make recommendations to said State Association. Meeting places shall be determined two (2) years in advance.
- B. The Executive Board shall plan the program for the annual meetings of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists and the annual meetings shall follow the programs as closely as possible. Business sessions shall be conducted according to the commonly accepted rules of Parliamentary Procedure.
- C. The Executive Board shall formulate the budget for the State Association annually and recommend to the body in session the allocations to be observed in the Cooperative Plan of Giving. This board shall, in addition to the above state duties, also recommend a mileage rate for travel by the members of all standing boards of said association.

#### **SECTION 6**

Necessary committees shall be appointed by the Moderator unless otherwise provided for by the body.

### SECTION 7

These By-Laws may be altered, changed, or amended at any regular session of this association by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of delegates present and voting.
