PROCEEDINGS OF THE ANNUAL MEETING:

The Sixty Fifth Annual Session of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists convened at the Trinity Fellowship Free Will Baptist Church in Hampton, Georgia, on March 15-17, 2001. Music was coordinated by Rev. Mike Crews and provided by several different individuals, groups, and song leaders. Mrs. Carmen Claire served as pianist.

THURSDAY EVENING WORSHIP SESSION

Rev. Fred Lockwood welcomed everyone to Hampton and then led the congregation in singing "Since Jesus Came Into My Heart". Rev. Wayne Miracle opened the session with prayer. Rev. Lockwood then led the congregation in singing "Dwelling in Beulah Land". Rev. Wayne Miracle then led the congregation in the pledges to the American Flag and Christian Flag.

The State Clerk, Rev. Terry Pierce, officially called the 65th Annual Session of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists into session. He introduced the Moderator, Rev. Paul Smith, who extended a welcome to everyone.

Rev. Paul Smith then appointed the Committee on Committees members who were: Chairman Rudy Woods, Mitch Griffin, Bill McCarty, Keith Lloyd, and Henry Shellman. Clerk Pierce then read two Constitutional changes that were tabled for the following session. The Moderator then asked for the roll call of District Associations.

The congregation continued to worship by singing "When We All Get To Heaven". Rev. Eddie Vincent sang a special. Rev. Miracle then presented the keynote speaker, Rev. Parnell Aldridge, Pastor of Piney Grove Free Will Baptist Church in Bristol. Rev. Aldridge challenged our hearts on the subject of "I Am With You To Help Feed The Flock," from the passage of Acts 20:20-32. An invitation hymn "I Surrender All" was then sung.

Rev. Miracle and Rev. William Smith shared some announcements. Rev. S.E. Newberry gave the Credentials Committee Report. He reported a voting delegation of 77 with 124 in attendance. Rev. Terry Hennecke then dismissed the service in prayer.

FRIDAY MORNING SESSION

Rev. Mike Crews led the congregation in singing "The Lord Is King". Rev. Jeff Goodman opened the session with prayer. Moderator Paul Smith opened the session with a Scripture reading.

Moderator Smith recognized the standing delegates and entertained a motion to seat all elected delegates. The motion was adopted. Rev. S.E. Newberry gave the Credentials Committee Report. He reported a voting delegation of 87 with 138 total registration. The Moderator recognized all corresponding visitors. Clerk Terry Pierce read the Committee on Committees report with the following nominations:

Motion was carried to receive this report and all nominees be elected.

Clerk Terry Pierce gave the report of the Executive Board as stated in the Digest of Reports with the following items to be voted on individually:

Item 1: A 2002 calendar year overall budget of \$550,000 is proposed. A Georgia State Cooperative Budget of \$225,000 is included in the overall budget. You will find the budget included with this report for your approval. Motion, seconded and carried.

Item 2: To have the State Meeting at Calvary Free Will Baptist Church in Columbus, Georgia, March 13-15, 2003. Motion, seconded and carried.

Item 3: FIRST CONSTITUTIONAL CHANGE: LISTED IN THE GEORGIA STATE CONSTITUTION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS, UNDER THE HEADING OF "BY-LAWS, SECTION 2-F".

Any and all correspondence from any member of this State Association, (includes either individual, group, Board or District Association) directed to any Board, or Chairman of said Board, or any officer of this State Association, or any open letters to any or all District Associations of this State, that pertains to any business which is desired or required to be brought before this body at any scheduled or special called meeting, shall be properly sent directly to the Clerk of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists. The Clerk will be responsible for routing the correspondence to its proper designation and determining if said correspondence needs to be brought before the Executive Board for discussion or information. All correspondence as mentioned above, shall be required to be received by the Clerk of the State Association at least 30 days prior to any scheduled State Association Meeting if said correspondence contains business that is to be introduced and discussed at said meeting.

Motion, seconded, and carried to table this item. Motion, seconded, and carried for Moderator to appoint a committee to re-write the proposed Constitutional change. Chairman, Assistant Clerk Terry Hennecke, Clerk Terry Pierce, Eddie Vincent, and Chip Sekulich were appointed.

Item 4: LISTED IN THE GEORGIA STATE CONSTITUTION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS, UNDER THE HEADING OF "Constitution, Article III Section 7". Change to: There shall be two members on the Board of Trustees of the Free Will Baptist Children's Home, Eldridge Alabama, elected for terms of four (4) years. Election will take place on odd years and shall be staggered. Motion, seconded and carried.

Item 5: STATE OFFICE BUILDING PROPOSAL

Following the directive of the State at last year's State Meeting concerning the moving of the State Office a joint meeting with the Trustee and Executive Boards was held on September 23 with several concerned parties in attendance. The following conclusions and decisions were made:

1. A general consensus that the State wants to relocate.
2. A general consensus that the State wants to buy land and build instead of renting.
3. A general consensus that the State would like to relocate to the Albany or Cordele surrounding area.

4. A definite conclusion that the members of both the Trustee and the Executive Boards will support any and all final decisions on relocation made by the majority of this Joint Board Meeting and the ones to follow.

5. A committee was appointed to research property from the Northeast corridor of Albany to the surrounding area of Cordele. A suitable site on which a State Office could be built is to be found. (We would request that this item be discussed under the Trustee Board Report.) Motion, seconded, and carried.

Executive Secretary/Treasurer William Smith gave the Executive Office report. He reported on a great year and of all the wonderful things that God is doing in the State of Georgia. He shared how that God has blessed the giving to our State Association. Bro. Smith also shared a vision for the state work and how he believes that we can fulfill God's direction for the future. Motion, seconded, and carried to receive this report.

Mrs. Gail Smith gave the Women of Georgia Active for Christ report. Motion, seconded and carried to receive this report. Mrs. Marjorie Workman gave the National Women Active for Christ report. Executive Secretary/Treasurer William Smith gave the Christian Education Board report. Motion, seconded and carried to accept this report. Rev. Paul Creech gave the Board of Camping report. Rev. Creech honored Rev. Terry Pierce with a plaque for his service as Teen Camp Director for the last 6 years. Motion, seconded and carried to accept this report. Session was adjourned for worship.

Rev. Rudy Woods opened the Morning Worship session by leading the congregation in singing "Surely Goodness and Mercy". Rev. Charles Clark asked for Rev. Arthur Smith to lead in prayer. The congregation then sang "God Will Take Care Of You". Rev. Matt Pinson ministered in music. Rev. Cliff Holland, Pastor of Bellview Free Will Baptist Church in Colquitt, gave a wonderful message on the subject of "I Am With You To Help Comfort The Flock," from the text of John 14. Rev. Charles Clark led the congregation in an invitation hymn. Rev. Trent Dykes dismissed the session with prayer.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

Rev. Mike Crews led the congregation in singing "Blessed Be The Name". Rev. Larry Montgomery led in prayer. Rev. Russell Horne opened the Afternoon Session with a Scripture reading and prayed for God's blessings.

Item 3 under the Executive Board Report was placed back into consideration. Assistant Clerk Hennecke then read the changes to this Constitutional Change. Motion, seconded, and carried to strike the phrase (*and determining if said correspondence needs to be brought before the Executive Board for discussion or information.*) and adopt the rest of the proposal. The Constitution will read as follows. **FIRST CONSTITUTIONAL CHANGE : LISTED IN THE GEORGIA STATE CONSTITUTION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS, UNDER THE HEADING OF "BY-LAWS, SECTION 2-F".**

Any and all correspondence from any member of this State Association, (includes either individual, group, Board or District Association) directed to any Board, or Chairman of said Board, or any officer of this State Association, or any open letters to any or all District Associations of this State, that pertains to any business which is desired or required to be brought before this body at any scheduled or special called meeting, shall be properly sent directly to the Clerk of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists. The Clerk will be responsible for routing the correspondence to its proper designation. All correspondence as mentioned above, shall be required to be received by the Clerk of the State Association at least 30 days prior to any scheduled State Association Meeting if said correspondence contains business that is to be introduced and discussed at said meeting.

Dr. Lynn Frazier gave a report from the Christian Education Board concerning a Georgia Bible Institute policy. Motion, seconded, and carried to receive this report. Rev. Wayne

Miracle gave the Trustee Board report. He reported on the plans for the future State Office. Motion, seconded, and carried to receive this report. The Trustee Board recommends that we purchase two acres of property on highway 91 in Cordele, Georgia at \$20,000 per acre. To build a 2,200 sq. ft. office building. This building will contain one executive office, two other offices, a reception area, kitchen/work area, restrooms, conference meeting room, archive room, and a storage room. The total maximum project costs will be \$240,000. Motion, seconded, and carried.

Mr. Malcom Freeman reported for the State Missions Board. Motion, seconded and carried to accept this report. Rev. Bill Evans reported for our National Executive Office in the absence of Rev. Melvin Worthington. Motion, seconded and carried to accept this report.

Rev. Alton Loveless gave the Randall House Publications and Spanish Curriculum report. Rev. James Kilgore gave the report of the Tennessee Family Ministries. Rev. Roy Harris gave the Free Will Baptist Bible College report. Rev. Bill Evans reported on the Board of Retirement and he also reported for the Free Will Baptist Foundation. Motion, seconded, and carried to accept all of these reports.

Rev. S. E. Newberry then gave the report of the Credentials Committee. He reported that there are 96 voting delegates and 148 total registered. Motion was seconded and approved to receive this report.

Clerk Terry Pierce read a partial report from the Nominating Committee. Motion, seconded, and carried to receive these nominations. To elect Charles Sumner to the Alabama Children's Home. Motion, seconded, and carried. To elect Heather Goodman to the Credentials Committee. Motion, seconded, and carried.

FRIDAY EVENING WORSHIP SESSION

Rev. Roger Russell welcomed everyone to the evening service and then led the congregation in singing "Bring Them In". Rev. William Smith then honored and recognized Brother Malcom Freeman for his 25 years of service on the Mission Board including 23 years as Chairman. He was given a plaque in honor of his service and this occasion. His wife, Pat was also given roses for her faithful support. A standing ovation was given in their honor.

Rev. Ron Wallace led the congregation in prayer for the blessing on the missions' offering. Offering total was \$591.25. Rev. Russell then led the congregation in singing "Rescue The Perishing". The Ladies Trio sang a moving special. Rev. Smith introduced the evening speaker, Rev. Billy Bevan Jr., Pastor of Camden Free Will Baptist Church in Kingsland, who gave a wonderful message on the subject of "I Am With You To Help Enlarge The Flock," from the text of Matthew 28:18-20. He emphasized the need to see the Church grow. Rev. Russell led the congregation in an invitational hymn of "So Send I You" with several responding to the invitation. Rev. Steve Faison announced that Free Will Baptist singers and musicians have made a special tape, CD, and video singing the Lord's praises. Rev. William Smith made announcements and Rev. Eddie Payne closed the service in prayer.

SATURDAY MORNING SESSION

Rev. Mike Crews led the congregation in singing "Crown Him With Many Crowns". Rev. Eddie Vincent led in prayer. Rev. Terry Hennecke opened the Morning Session with a scripture reading.

Rev. Randy Keys gave the Alabama Children's Home report. Rev. Tom Dooly gave the National Master's Men Department report. Rev. Eddie Payne gave the Foreign Missions Department report. Rev. James Wilhide gave the South Carolina Children's Home report.

Rev. Larry Powell gave the National Home Missions Department report. Rev. Ron Wallace also shared about the work in Alaska. Rev. Steve Faison gave the Media Commission report. Rev. Matt Pinson gave the Commission for Theological Integrity report. All reports were received.

Clerk Terry Pierce read the Resolutions Committee report. Two resolutions were received and adopted. (See Resolutions) The Final Credentials Committee report was given by Rev. S.E. Newberry with 98 voting delegates and 158 in attendance. Motion, seconded, and carried.

Under Miscellaneous Business a request was made to record the Worship Services of our State Meeting. Delegates were elected as follows to the National Convention as well as the following alternates: Edwina Drinkwater, Geraldine Waid, Belyn Pierce, Arlene Smith, and Cheryl Wilson. Alternates - Gail Smith, Helen Gilchrist, Patty Hennecke, Janice Temples, and Nora McCarty. Motion, seconded, and carried to accept these as delegates. Clerk Terry Pierce read final Nominating Committee Report. Motion, seconded, and carried to receive these nominations.

Announcements were made. Mr. Norris Caudle closed the session in prayer.

Report of the Resolutions Committee

Resolution One

Whereas six Free Will Baptist national agencies (Executive Office, Foreign Missions Department, Home Missions Department, Free Will Baptist Bible College, and the Sunday School and Church Training Department) print magazines or newsletters and distribute them to the denominational constituency, and,

Whereas five of these national magazines/newsletters are mailed free to subscribers (*AIM*, *Heartbeat*, *Master's Men Newsletter*, *FWBBC Bulletin*, and *Outreach*), while one is mailed to a paid subscription list (*Contact*), and,

Whereas the cost of producing, printing, and mailing these publications continues to rise each year,

Therefore, to avoid needless duplication of mailing lists and more effectively to promote denominational stewardship, departmental cooperation, and a spirit of unity,

Be it Resolved that the National Association moderator appoint a five-person Publications Committee from the ranks of the state promotional men to study the feasibility of printing one enlarged national monthly magazine with sections in the publication that incorporate material from each national agency, that the publication be mailed free to subscribers (It is understood that institutions such as Free Will Baptist Bible College and Randall House, which use their publications for advertising purposes and mail them to constituencies outside the denomination, may still need to publish separate periodicals), and

Be it further resolved that the national agencies, along with their directors and editors, be instructed to provide the Publications Committee unlimited access to their financial records and editorial schedules, and that the directors and editors be instructed to meet with the Publications Committee as needed, and

Be it finally resolved that the Publications Committee report its findings and recommendations to the delegates at the July 21-25, 2002, session of the National Association of Free Will Baptists which will meet in Memphis, Tennessee.

Whereas, we realize the immense amount of planning and work that goes into hosting the Georgia State Meeting, and,

Whereas, Brother Paul Smith and the congregation of Trinity Fellowship Church have done a splendid job in hosting this meeting in their new facility,

Thank you for your financial support in 2000. *Cooperative* receipts totaled \$221,726.53, with an increase of \$22,087.69 or 11%. *Georgia Acts 1:8* receipts totaled \$135,499.84, with an increase of \$40,008.10 or 41.9%. Receipts through to State Office totaled \$655,616.15, with and increase of \$44,866.09 or 7.3%

Several churches are still without pastors. The majority of our pastors are over the age of fifty-five. We need to pray that the Lord of the harvest will send laborers to our state.

The decisions made by the Executive Board are made with consideration and an acute awareness of our responsibility and accountability. The following items are presented for general information and for your approval at this Sixty-fifth Annual Session.

2001 STATE PROGRAM

The program theme for the 2001 session of our State Association is ***"I Am With You"***.

GEORGIA STATE BUDGET PROPOSED

A 2001 calendar year overall budget of \$550,000 is proposed. A Georgia State Cooperative Budget of \$210,000 is included in the overall budget. You will find the budget (page 6) included with this report for your approval.

STATE OFFICE EQUIPMENT

A digital camera, portable computer, fax machine, and color printer were added to the State Office equipment.

STATE MEETING SITE

To have the State Meeting at Calvary Free Will Baptist Church in Columbus, Georgia, June 13-15, 2003.

STATE OFFICE AND PROMOTIONAL ACCOUNTS

The surplus from the State Office and Promotional Accounts that was allocated for the 2000 budget has been placed in a Trust Fund with the National Board of Retirement for the minister's retirement.

STATE OFFICE PERSONNEL EVALUATION

Granted an increase in the salary for the Executive Secretary of 6%.

FIRST CONSTITUTIONAL CHANGE

LISTED IN THE GEORGIA STATE CONSTITUTION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS, UNDER THE HEADING OF ***"BY-LAWS, SECTION 2-F"***.

Any and all correspondence from any member of this State Association (includes either individual, group, Board, or District Association) directed to any Board, or Chairman of said Board, or any officer of this State Association, or any open letters to any or all District Associations of this State, that pertains to any business which is desired or required to be brought before this body at any scheduled or special called meeting, shall be properly sent directly to the Clerk of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists. The clerk will be responsible for routing the correspondence to its proper designation and determining if said correspondence needs to be brought before the Executive Board for discussion or information. All correspondence as mentioned above, shall be required to be received by the Clerk of the State Association at least 30 days prior to any scheduled State Association Meeting if said correspondence contains business that is to be introduced and discussed at said meeting.

SECOND CONSTITUTIONAL CHANGE

LISTED IN THE GEORGIA STATE CONSTITUTION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS, UNDER THE HEADING OF "*Constitution, Article III SECTION 7*".

Now reads: There shall be a member of the Board of Trustees of the Free Will Baptist Children's Home, Eldridge Alabama, elected during the 1971 session for a term of four (4) years. Election thereafter shall be for a four (4) year term.

Change to: There shall be two members on the Board of Trustees of the Free Will Baptist Children's Home, Eldridge Alabama, elected for terms of four (4) years. Election will take place on odd years and shall be staggered.

STATE OFFICE BUILDING PROPOSAL

Following the directive of the State at last year's State Meeting concerning the moving of the State Office a joint meeting with the Trustee and Executive Boards was held on September 23 with several concerned parties in attendance. The following conclusions and decisions were made:

1. A general consensus that the State wants to relocate
2. A general consensus that the State wants to buy land and build instead of renting
3. A general consensus that the State would like to relocate to the Albany or Cordele surrounding area
4. A definite conclusion that the members of both the Trustee and the Executive boards will support any and all final decisions on relocation made by the majority of this Joint Board Meeting and the ones to follow
5. A committee was appointed to research property from the Northeast corridor of Albany to the surrounding area of Cordele. A suitable site on which a State Office could be built is to be found. (We would request that this item be discussed under the Trustee Board Report.)



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
AUDITING COMMITTEE REPORT TO THE GEORGIA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

GEORGIA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS, Inc.

PREAMBLE

We, the Free Will Baptist of the State of Georgia, do ordain this Constitution for the purpose of advocating, promoting and increasing all phases of the cause of Christ.

ARTICLE I

This assembly shall be known as the ***Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.***

Article II

SECTION 1. The officers of this association shall be Moderator, an Assistant Moderator, a Clerk, an Assistant Clerk, and an Executive Secretary/Treasurer.

SECTION 2. The Executive Board shall be composed of the regular officers; the chairman of each of the standing boards; and the previous moderator, as an ex officio member for a period of two years following his term of office.

SECTION 3. This Association shall be composed of ordained Ministers, ordained Deacons, Missionaries, and Board Members who are members of affiliated bodies; one (1) delegate for every three hundred (300) members or fraction thereof from District Associations; one (1) delegate for every three hundred (300) members or fraction thereof from District Associations; one (1) delegate for every one hundred (100) members or fraction thereof from each local affiliated church.

SECTION 4. All delegates from District Associations and local churches shall be elected from the laity of the body sending them.

SECTION 5. Funds to meet current needs of this body shall be paid to the treasurer of this association. Each District Association will give a minimum of fifteen dollars(\$15.00) per delegate authorized, and each local church will give ten cents (\$.10) per capita of their respective memberships.

SECTION 6. In order to pay our Georgia State Association's annual representation fee to the National Association, each local association is to be responsible to promote, receive and forward the amount designated by the National Association per church per year to the State Office, along with their annual State Association representation fee, on or before our annual State Association session.

ARTICLE III

SECTION 1. It shall be the privilege of each affiliated District Association to recommend a member for each standing board. Terms of office on these boards shall be on a rotating basis which will necessitate the election by the State Association of five (5) members every two (2) years, thus giving each member a four (4) year term of office.

SECTION 2. There shall be a **Board of Missions** composed of members who are noted for their missionary zeal.

- A. The Board of Missions shall employ missionaries as needed to establish Free Will Baptist mission/churches in the State of Georgia. These

missionaries may be employed exclusively or jointly with other Free Will Baptist agencies.

- B. A mission/church sponsored by the Georgia State Association and their missionaries are under the authority of the State Association and the supervision of the Georgia State Board of Missions.
- C. A mission/church does not have autonomous church status. As long as the mission/church is unable to provide for its own business, it is in a dependent relationship to the State Association and its Board of Missions.
- D. When the mission/church is self-sustaining, self-governing, self-discipline, and self-propagating. It should be organized into an autonomous Free Will Baptist Church following the procedures adopted by the Georgia State Association.
- E. After proper procedures are satisfied and the church is duly organized into autonomous Free Will Baptist church it shall have all normal rights, privileges, and responsibilities of any other Free Will Baptist Church.

SECTION 3. There shall be a **Board of Camping** whose duties shall be to schedule and arrange all camp sessions, and to appoint the Camp Director each year.

SECTION 4. There shall be a **Board of Christian Education** whose duties shall be:

- A. To provide educational services for the members of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists.
- B. To set policy and supervise the functions of the State Youth Committee. This Board shall appoint this Committee to carry out Board policy.
- C. To organize sponsor and promote educational and inspirational retreats for our members.
- D. To organize, sponsor and promote Sunday School and Church Training seminars.
- E. To set policy and supervise the Historical Committee. This Board shall appoint the Historical Committee to gather and set forth for public knowledge and posterity the history of Georgia Free Will Baptists.

SECTION 5. There shall be a **Board of Trustees** whose duties shall be; maintenance, upkeep and insuring of all State Association properties; the planning and supervision of all future developments and expansion of these properties as directed by the State Association except otherwise provided in this Constitution.

SECTION 6. There shall be a **Credentials Committee**, which shall consist of three (3) members of three-year terms. And the term of one expiring each year thereafter according to seniority of service, who shall be in charge of the registration and examination of delegates and the receiving of al dues.

SECTION 7. There shall be two members on the Board of Trustees of the Free Will Baptist Children's Home, Eldridge Alabama, elected for terms of four (4) years. Election will take place on odd years and shall be staggered.

SECTION 8. There shall be a **Georgia State Master's Men**. They shall select their own officers and conduct their own business.

SECTION 9. There shall be a **Georgia State Woman's Auxiliary Convention (GWAC)**. They shall elect their officers, conduct their business and maintain their treasury.

ARTICLE IV

SECTION 1. All officers except board members and the Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be elected to serve a term of two (2) years. The Executive

Secretary/Treasurer shall be employed by the Executive Board of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, subject to the ratification of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists at its next regular session, for an indefinite period, with an agreement of sixty (60) day notice of termination by either the Executive Secretary or the Executive Board.

SECTION 2. Standing Boards of the State Association have no power of final authority to hire, full-time employees until the matter has been presented to and acted on by the State Association in session except where otherwise provided.

SECTION 3. The Executive Board may fill vacancies on any of the boards or committees, which occur between regular sessions of this State Association, until the convening of the annual session of said association.

SECTION 4. Election of all General Officers shall take place on the odd years of the calendar.

SECTION 5. If a member of any board fails in the function of his or her duty without good and sufficient reasons, the board of which the delinquent is a member may declare that particular office vacant. Further, this body shall have and does reserve the right to deal with the officer or board member who does not conduct his or her office in a Christian, business like manner according to the rules of Christian conduct as set forth in the New Testament.

Any standing board of this State Association may appoint proxies to serve in lieu of the absent members.

At the pleasure of the boards, and subsequent to the meeting from which the regular member is absent, the boards have the right to deal with the delinquent member in the manner stated in this section.

SECTION 6. The Chairman or Vice-Chairman of said board, or by the Moderator or Assistant Moderator of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, upon the request of the majority of the members of said boards, may call boards into session.

SECTION 7. An auditing Committee of three (3) members will be elected annually.

AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be changed, altered, or amended by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all delegates present and voting at any regular session of the State Association. Prior to a final vote on any amendment, change or alteration, said amendment, change or alteration shall be submitted in writing to the Clerk of this association and shall lie on the table from one (1) business meeting to the next during the same session, during which time it shall be read at least two (2) times in open session. Officers, standing boards, and/or standing committees may be added or deleted as the need arises.

BY-LAWS

SECTION 1:

- A.** All real property, checking and savings account or any other assets of this Association shall be in the name of the *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*
- B.** One or more of the corporate officers of the Association shall be the legal signers of all Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists business. These officers are: the Moderator as the corporate President; the Clerk as

the corporate Vice-President; the Executive Secretary/Treasurer as the Secretary/Treasurer.

- C. The State Office shall be responsible for the safekeeping of the corporate seal and all official documents of the State Association.
- D. No State Board may borrow money or financially obligated the State Association without the approval of the Executive Board.
- E. The fixed assets (building, land) of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists shall not be liquidated except by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the delegates present and voting at any regular session of the Association.
- F. The records of all financial transaction shall be open to all members of the Georgia State Association. The financial transactions of the State Office and State Boards shall be audited annually.
- G. Annual financial reports of the State Office and State Boards and the auditor's report shall be made to the State Association in session and be entered in the Annual State Minutes.
- H. The State Treasurer shall be bonded in amount stipulated by the State Executive Board.
- I. This Association shall meet for its regular session annually on Thursday following the second Sunday in March and shall adjourn on the Saturday immediately following.

SECTION 2.

- A. When the State Association is not in session, the State Executive Board shall be duly authorized to do business in the name of the State Association.
- B. The State Association has full authority to direct the State Executive Board in all business conducted on its behalf.
- C. The State Executive Board shall report to the State Association in session concerning the business conducted for the State Association since its last convening.
- D. The State Executive Board has the prerogative of deferring any matter to the State Association as a whole but is not under obligation to do so.
- E. The State Executive Board shall meet quarterly in the following months: March, June, September, and December. The March meeting shall be held just prior to the regular meeting of the State Association.
- F. Any and all correspondence from any member of this State Association, (includes either individual, group, Board or District Association) directed to any Board, or Chairman of Said Board, or any officer of this State Association, or any open letters to any or all District Associations of this State, that pertains to any business which is desired or required to be brought before this body at any scheduled or special called meeting, shall be properly sent directly to the Clerk of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, The clerk will be responsible for routing the correspondence to its proper designation. All correspondence as

mentioned above, shall be required to be received by the Clerk of the State Association at least 30 days prior to any scheduled State Association Meeting if said correspondence contains business that is to be introduced and discussed at said meeting.

SECTION 3.

- A. The moderator shall preside at the Annual Session of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists and the meetings of the Executive Board. The Moderator shall be the President of the Corporation known as the *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*
- B. The Assistant Moderator shall preside in the absence of the Moderator and/or when appointed by the Moderator as the need arises.
- C. The Clerk shall keep records of the proceedings of the Annual Associational meeting and of the Executive Board meetings. It shall also be his responsibility to have the minutes of these sessions printed and distributed. The Clerk shall be the Vice-President of the Corporation known as *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*
- D. The Assistant Clerk in the absence of the Clerk, shall fulfill the functions and duties of the Clerk as stated in paragraph C of this document.

SECTION 4.

- A. The Executive Secretary shall be responsible and accountable to the Executive Board in the fulfillment of the duties of his office as determined by the Executive Board.
- B. The Executive Secretary shall be allowed four (4) weeks vacation per year with pay.
- C. Funds received by the Executive Secretary for revivals, special speaking engagements and promotional meetings shall go into the Cooperative Fund. The exception to this regulation relates to remuneration received by the Executive Secretary during his four (4) weeks vacation, which shall be his personally and need not be accounted for to this State Association.
- D. Salary, mileage and operational expenses of the Executive Secretary shall be determined by the Executive Board.
- E. The Executive Secretary shall be the Secretary/Treasurer of the Corporation known as the *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*
- F. **General Promotion.** He is to be present, or cause to be represented, the association at all affairs of interest to the association and he is to promote the works, missionaries, mission conferences, etc. Through personal communication he shall keep close contact with pastors, churches, and district association.
- G. **Administration.** He shall administer the affairs of the executive office and carry out the responsibilities delegated to him by the State Association and the Executive Board. He is to serve with all standing boards and committees of the association in an ex-official capacity. He is to report to the association during each annual session.

- H. Stewardship.** He shall serve as treasurer of this association. An accurate and complete record of all funds received and disbursed shall be kept and a written report shall be included in his report to this association in its annual session. He shall receive, hold and disburse money as is made available by the State Association to the various boards. Disbursements to the various boards will be made available when requested.
- I. Publication.** It shall be his duty to edit and publish the state paper. He shall direct the production of general promotional materials, pamphlets, audiovisuals, and books as approved by the Executive Board.
- J. Arranging State Association.** He shall expedite the planning of the State Association program, enroll all ministers and delegates, print and distribute minutes, and investigate future sites for the annual session.

SECTION 5.

- A.** The Executive Board shall serve as the Placement Committee for the State Association. In this capacity the board shall investigate places suitable for this meeting and make recommendations to said State Association. Meeting places shall be determined two (2) years in advance.
- B.** The Executive Board shall plan the program for the annual meetings of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists and the annual meetings shall follow the programs as closely as possible. Business sessions shall be conducted according to the commonly accepted rules of Parliamentary Procedure.
- C.** The Executive Board shall formulate the budget for the State Association annually and recommend to the body in the session the allocations to be observed in the Cooperative Plan for Giving. This board shall, in addition to the above stated duties, also recommend a mileage rate for travel by the members of all standing boards in said association.

SECTION 6.

The Moderator shall appoint necessary committees unless otherwise provided for by the body.

SECTION 7.

WOMEN OF GEORGIA ACTIVE FOR CHRIST
TRINITY FELLOWSHIP FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH
March 15, 2001

President Gail Smith welcomed everyone prior to the business session. Helen Holland led the congregation in "His Name is Wonderful" and "Grace that is Greater." Donna Walker then sang, "I am Not Ashamed of the Gospel." We were privileged to have Ron and Janice Wallace, home missionaries to Fairbanks, Alaska, back in Georgia and Ron spoke on "The Shepherd and his Sheep." Ron read from John 10: 11-16 and Luke 15: 3-7, and stressed the importance of the shepherd's role to his sheep and the many aspects of the shepherd's task. He also encouraged the sheep to only listen to the voice of their shepherd and not the voice of strangers.

We then had a special time of recognition for Mrs. Lora Shutes, the first President of the Georgia Woman's Auxiliary Convention in 1937. (Mrs. Shutes was in ill health and was not able to attend.) Martha Everson gave us a chronological overview of Mrs. Shutes' life and her many contributions to the ladies in Georgia. She told of Mrs. Shutes' commitment to serving Christ from the age of 8, her glorious healing from pernicious anemia, and then the tragic loss of her ten year old son, Terry, to leukemia, and the loss of her husband at the age of 57, leaving her a widow at the age of 44. But through all of her adversities, she never wavered in her love for Jesus Christ and the ladies of Georgia. Mrs. Shutes and her husband, Ken, were also instrumental in establishing the Children's Home in Eldridge, Alabama, and supported the establishment of the Free Will Baptist Bible College in Nashville, as well as establishing many Free Will Baptist Churches in Georgia. Gail Smith then presented a dozen red roses and a silver tray in honor of Mrs. Shutes. Mrs. Shutes, we salute you!

The 2001 Session was opened by singing "He Touched Me" which was led by Helen Holland.

President Gail Smith then called the business session to order at 10:30 a.m. and led in prayer. This year's theme is "I Have Placed Before You An Open Door." (Rev. 3:8.)

Nora McCarty recognized those ladies who have gone on to be with the Lord during the past two years. They were: Mrs. Minnie Cobb and Mrs. Nannie Lou Drinkwater. Mrs. Nora read "Go Light Your World," and also remembered Laura Bell Barnard, and said a special prayer of thanks for these ladies.

Belyn Pierce gave the Credentials Committee Report. From 10 districts, 8 districts and 1 local church reported. The voting delegates were then seated. Belyn stressed the importance of the district secretaries and treasurers correlating their reports before sending them in to the State Treasurer and Secretary.

Secretary Donna Jewell read the minutes from the 1999 meeting. M/S/C to accept as read.

Treasurer Christine Daniel read the financial report. The beginning balance was \$5,487.38, with \$39,231.75 received and \$40,892.88 in disbursements, leaving a balance of \$3,826.25. Today's offering was \$205.80.

WNAC Executive Secretary, Marjorie Workman, gave a report from the National Office. She commended the Georgia Women for their support state-wide and nationally. The National meeting will be in Detroit this year. She encouraged everyone to get their tickets for the leadership luncheon and banquet. Seminar topics will be "How to Handle Criticism" and "Record Keeping." A scholarship in the amount of \$1,000 was given to an Ivory Coast student and a \$1,000 scholarship was given to a student studying in the Cuban Seminary. A \$1,000 scholarship will also be given to a Brazilian student. Approximately

one-half of the goal for the organ fund for FWBBC has been met. WNAC voted at Anaheim to furnish a mission house on the new FWBBC campus in conjunction with the Masters Men and Foreign Missions Department. She introduced us to some new informational material being published at the National Office, including a new handbook for younger women. She also encouraged everyone to purchase the Co-Laborer.

Old Business:

Belyn Pierce gave the report of the 2000 Retreat at Norman Park. Our guest speaker, Teri Peacock, did an outstanding job portraying Viney May on Friday Night, and then Mary on Saturday. She encouraged everyone to attend the Retreat in October which is already in the planning stages. She said the setting for the National in Anaheim was beautiful with the oceans and the mountains at the same place. She said the business session went very smooth and noted that the Slavic Choir was wonderful. She said the highlight of the Ridgecrest Retreat was Gail Smith, an accomplished pianist and composer.

Committee Reports:

A. Rachel Horne gave the Resolutions Committee Report.

1. BE IT RESOLVED that the annual dues for WGAC be increased to \$2.50 per member effective January 1, 2002. M/S/C
2. BE IT RESOLVED That under the WGAC By-Laws, Article VI, we add Item 11 as follows: That the month of June be designated as WGAC Emphasis Month effective 2001. M/S/C after Gail explained that these special offerings will help defray the cost of retreats, expenses, etc.
3. BE IT RESOLVED that under the WGAC Constitution, Article III, that we add Item 3 as follows: Executive Committee members are required to attend all scheduled committee meetings. Any officer missing three meetings is subject to review and removal by the Executive Committee. M/S/C
4. Whereas, the women of the Trinity Fellowship Free Will Baptist Church of Hampton, have hosted the state convention of the WGAC, BE IT RESOLVED that this body give them a rising vote of thanks for their gracious hospitality. M/S/C by everyone standing.

B. Christine Daniel gave the Finance Committee Report. \$3,826.25 balance brought forward, today's offering was \$205.80, leaving a balance of \$4,032.05. We agreed to pay an honorarium to Ron Wallace in the amount of \$250, and also \$500 of his airfare. Balance on hand as of March 15, 2001 is \$3,282.05. M/S/C to accept.

C. Mary Bruner gave the Registration Committee Report. 79 registered, with 20 ministers, 3 missionaries, 15 visitors, 31 delegates, 7 state officers, 1 national officer, and 9 districts represented. (It was later noted that 2 additional ladies had registered.)

New Business:

The proposed 2002 budget was reviewed and after explanation, M/S/C to accept.

The 2001 Retreat will be at Norman Park October 19 and 20, 2001.

The Delegates to the National Convention in Detroit were elected as follows: Janice Temples, Helen Gilchrist, Nadine Blanton, Jackie Barnard, Lauren Willowford, Geraldine Wade, Bonnie Amburgey, Edwina Drinkwater, Susie Mounts, Nora McCarty, Melinda Pinson, Terra Smith, Robin Faison, Helen Holland, and Carmen Claire. M/S/C to accept.

Nadine Blanton gave the Nominating Committee Report and there was a M/S/C to elect individually, a follows:

Vice President: Belyn Pierce M/S/C to accept

Secretary: Donna Jewell M/S/C to accept

Treasurer: Christine Daniel M/S/C to accept

Field Worker: Terra Smith M/S/C to accept

Historian: Marie Glover M/S/C to accept

Members at Large: Carmen Claire, Janice Temples and Sammie Montgomery; M/S/C to accept.

Announcements were given. As information, Christine Daniel noted that Norman Park would serve lunch at the Retreat on Saturday at a minimal cost. An informal vote was taken and the majority wanted to stay for lunch.

Martha Everson stated that Edith Shiver was recuperating from knee surgery.

Doris Grant then installed the new officers.

M/S/C to set a goal for the State Project at \$7,000.00.

Gail thanked the ladies who have worked on the board for many years but were not returning this term

The meeting was adjourned and Rachel Horne dismissed in prayer.

WOMEN OF GEORGIA ACTIVE FOR CHRIST
Of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.
Constitution and By-Laws

Article I

Name

This organization shall be known as Women of Georgia Active for Christ of the Georgia Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. commonly known by its initials, WGAC. Its members shall elect their officers, conduct their business and maintain their treasury.

Article II

Purpose

The purpose of this organization shall be to assist the various women composing the WGAC in providing opportunities for them to understand and fulfill the Great Commission through their responsibilities in the family, in the church, in the community and around the world.

It shall bring the women of each district together for fellowship sharing information and encouraging one another in the work of the Lord and furthering the purpose and goals of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists.

Article III

Officers

The officers of this convention shall be a president, a vice president, a recording secretary, a treasurer, a field worker, a historian, and three members at large, all of which are elected by the convention. These shall serve as the State Executive Committee. Five of these shall be a quorum for transacting business.

Any officer or elected committee member of this convention must be an active member of a local Free Will Baptist Church and an active member of the WGAC group of a local church

Executive Committee members are required to attend all scheduled committee meetings. Any officer missing three meetings is subject to review and removal by the Executive Committee.

Article IV

Membership

1. This convention shall be composed of the officers of the convention together with the district coordinators, the district field worker, ten delegates (duty accredited by the credentials committee) from each district convention, four delegates and the coordinator from each local WGAC in good standing with its district convention.
2. Local groups in an area where there is no district convention may represent with five delegates by payment of their membership fees. All delegates as well as the officers of the convention should be in good standing with a church that is in good standing with the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists and shall perform the duties as set forth for them in the present manual.

Article V

Meetings

1. The annual meeting shall be held each year the day before the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists is held, being in the

same place or at such a time and place may be determined at the previous annual meeting or by the executive committee.

2. A prayer retreat shall be held annually, time and place to be planned by the executive committee.

Article VI

Amendments

The constitution may be amended at any annual meeting of the convention by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

BY LAWS

Article I

Duties of Officers

Section 1. – President – The president shall preside over all meetings, appoint such committees as may be needed; call the executive committee together when necessary, be ex-official member of all committees, except the nominating committee; see that reports are made promptly to the National WNAC secretary; and perform all duties usually pertaining to such an office. She should see that the WGAC is represented in the State Promotional Bulletin in the WGAC news section. Articles should be sent to the state executive office by the 7th of each month. She may either write the articles or ask someone to write them for her. (rev.98)

Section 2. – Vice President - The vice president shall preside in the absence of the president or by her request and otherwise assist her in the oversight of the work in general. She shall serve as chairman of the credentials committee.

Section 3. – Recording Secretary – The secretary shall keep an accurate record of all proceedings of the convention and executive committee meetings, preserve all valuable papers and turn same over to her successor in office. She shall make an annual report to the national secretary of the WNAC on a form available from WNAC office within 15 days after the State WGAC Convention. She shall compile the districts' slates of officers and addresses immediately after the convention and send all state officers a list of district officers. She shall send a slate of state officers to the National Executive Secretary and to each state officer. She is responsible for getting the minutes prepared and to the state associational office in the time to be included in the state minutes each year.

Section 4. – Treasurer - The treasurer shall have charge of all funds belonging to this convention and shall pay out same only when authorized by the convention. The treasurer shall keep an accurate account, and give a written report of all funds received and disbursed at each annual meeting of the convention. She shall send an annual report to the VVNAC Executive Secretary-Treasurer within 15 days after the convention. She is required to deposit and distribute all checks in her possession by the 30th of each month. She shall be bonded through the state office and audited annually.

Section 5. – Field Worker- The field worker shall promote the WGAC program of work through personal contact and the distribution of literature. She shall assist the state officers in organizing the state conventions. (rev. 98)

Section 6. – Historian – The historian shall keep a historical record and have a display at the state meeting. She shall send historical information to the National Executive Secretary annually.

Section 7. – Members at Large - The members at large shall help promote the work in general, meet with the executive committee, and serve wherever needed.

Article II

Elections

The general officers and members at large shall be nominated by a nominating committee. Following the nominating committee's report opportunity shall be given for nominations from the floor. In case of more than one nominee for any particular office, a vote will be taken each; other wise they may be elected by acclamation. The officers shall be elected every two years on odd number years. Not more than one-half of the elected officers shall be changed in any regular election. All elections shall be held at the closing session of the annual convention.

Article III

Expenses

An appropriation toward the expense of the secretary's postage and stationary shall be made by the convention. Expenses for postage and telephone calls made by the president shall be reimbursed. All field promotional work is subject to the state executive committee, who should approve all work done by the state officers in the interest of state work as well as expense of same.

Article IV

Committees

Section 1. – Executive Committee – This committee shall be composed of the six officers and three members at large elected by the convention. Five of these shall compose a quorum. They shall hold meetings for the transaction of business as often as necessary. It shall be the duty of the executive committee to maintain an oversight of the work at large. The committee shall act for the convention when necessary. It shall prepare the program for the regular meeting of the convention, and fill any vacancy between elections.

Section 2. – Resolutions Committee – A resolutions committee shall be appointed by the president. A member of the executive committee shall chair this committee.

Section 3. – Nominating Committee – The nominating committee shall be composed of one member from each district convention and shall be elected one year prior to making their report. The name of the member from each district shall be submitted with the convention annual report. The committee shall serve for two (2) years.

Section 4. – Credentials Committee – The vice president shall be the chairman of the credentials committee and the president shall appoint two other members.

Section 5. – Finance Committee - The treasurer shall be chairman of the finance committee and four other members may be appointed by the president. This committee reviews the financial records of the year, reports on same to the convention, and makes recommendations of disbursements of the funds of the convention.

Section 6. – Registration Committee - The president shall appoint members as needed to serve on this committee. This committee registers those in attendance and gives a report to the convention.

Article V

Fees and Reports

Active members shall pay dues yearly as required by the WGAC Convention for membership fee. These fees should come through the district treasurers. Beginning Jan 1, 2002 the dues are 12.50 per member Georgia will retain \$2.50 per member and the WNAC receives dues of \$10.00 per member.

Article VI

Gifts

1 – Season of Prayer offerings-

(a) **Pre-Easter Week Prayer** offering is used for Foreign Missions in memory of Laura Bell Barnard, our first foreign missionary.

(b) **Pre-Thanksgiving Week of Prayer** offering is used for State Missions in memory of Mrs. Lizzie McAdams, a great writer of our literature and a first National officer.

(c) **The December Week of Prayer** offering is used for State Missions in memory of Mrs. Alice E. Lupton, our first National president.

2. – Co-Laborer Offering – Is the financial plan of support of the WNAC. Each local WGAC is encouraged to support the WNAC office with a monthly offering.

3. – Provision Closet – This project helps missionaries as they return home to pick up household items, etc., from the closet in/at the National Office. Each local WGAC is encouraged to keep abreast of the items and supplies needed as they are listed in the **Co-Laborer** periodically and give to this project at least once a year.

4. – WNAC Emphasis – A special offering to supplement the Co-Laborer offerings for WNAC expenses of operation, literature, etc. This offering is received during August when locals present a special program to enlist others in work.

5. – Remembrance Fund - This is a fund established by WNAC and a distinct way to honor any occasion the donor wishes to note: anniversaries, birthdays, or as a memorial gift at the time of death. A remembrance card notifying the family of the person being honored and the donor will be entered in the Book of Remembrance permanently kept in the WNAC office. These gifts will be recorded and used to advance the kingdom of God through WNAC.

A Remembrance Service is to be conducted at our state WGAC convention each year.

6. – Foreign Student Scholarship Fund - Any WGAC group who wishes to may contribute to this special fund set up by WNAC to train Nationals from our foreign fields. February is designated as Foreign Student month.

7. – Dot Harvey Loan Fund – A revolving loan fund set up by the Georgia Woman's Auxiliary Convention in 1954 to aid worthy Georgia Students who need financial assistance to attend Free Will Baptist Bible College in Nashville, Tennessee. This fund was planned in honor of Miss Dot Harvey who was a forerunner of the youth work in Georgia. She died in 1993. Each local WGAC group is asked to send one dollar per month toward this project. Annual offerings are received in September to add to this fund.

8. – Westfield Church Fund – This fund is used to assist the church in Kotogiri, South India in memory of Miss Laura Bell Barnard. All groups are encouraged to give to this Georgia project \$1 monthly.

9. – Other Gifts – The state WGAC may decide upon and promote other projects for funds at its own discretion.

10. – Lora Shutes Mission Project – This is a statewide project with the goal set each year at the annual meeting. Funds are disbursed to missionaries through the State Acts 1:8 Program.

11. – WGAC Emphasis – The month of June is designated as WGAC Emphasis Month.
