Proceedings of the 67th Annual Session:

The Sixty-seventh Annual Session of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists convened at the Calvary Free Will Baptist Church in Columbus, Georgia, on March 13-15, 2003. Music was coordinated by a Music Committee consisting of Rev. Donnie Burke, Rev. Tim Horne, Mr. Todd Horne, Rev. Roger Mercer, and Mr. Mark Walker.

THURSDAY EVENING WORSHIP SESSION

The evening session began with a prelude of special music by the "Georgia Boys Quartet", alternately consisting of Rev. Donnie Burke, Rev. Tim Horne, Bro. Todd Horne, Rev. Roger Mercer, and Bro. Mark Walker. Rev. Brett Sanders welcomed everyone to the 67th Annual Session of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists and to the Calvary FWB Church in Columbus, Georgia. Rev. Willie Martin opened the meeting in prayer and Bro. Todd Horne led the congregation in singing "Blessed Be The Name of the Lord", followed by the pledges to the Christian and American flags.

Call to Session & Preliminaries

Clerk Keith Lloyd officially called the Sixty-seventh Annual Session of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists into session, and introduced the Acting Moderator, Rev. Billy Hanna. The Moderator welcomed everyone and then proceeded with the Roll Call of District Associations. The Moderator appointed the Committee on Committees as follows: Chairman Arthur Smith, Herbert Waid, Jeff Goodman, Rudy Woods, and Jim Mounts.

Bro. Todd Horne led the congregation in several praise and worship choruses and Rev. Donnie Burke directed the "GAFWB Mass Choir" in the song "Above All". Sis. Michelle Mercer blessed us with a special song entitled "A New Life in Jesus". Rev. Brett Sanders introduced the evening speaker Rev. Michael Bryan, pastor of the Ebenezer FWB Church in Glennville. Rev. Bryan took his text from 1 Corinthians 15:57-58 on the subject of "Keep on the Firing Line". An invitational hymn, "I Must Tell Jesus" was played as an opportunity to respond to the Word was offered. Rev. Tim Horne led the congregation in singing the old hymn "Keep on the Firing Line".

Acting Moderator Billy Hanna and Executive Secretary William Smith made several announcements concerning committees, registrations and meeting times. Rev. Terry Pierce, former Clerk and pastor in the GAFWB, dismissed the evening in prayer.

FRIDAY MORNING BUSINESS SESSION

Rev. Donnie Burke led the congregation in singing a medley of songs, including "I'll Fly Away", "Heaven's Jubilee", and "How Beautiful Heaven Must Be". Rev. Gene Ross opened the session in prayer. Acting Moderator Billy Hanna began the session with a Scripture reading from 1 Corinthians 14, followed with some instructions concerning parliamentary procedure.

Partial Credentials Committee Report

Rev. Bobby Taylor gave a partial report of Credentials Committee. He reported a voting delegation of 99 with 146 total registrations. Acting Moderator Billy Hanna recognized the standing delegates, national messengers, and visitors. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to seat all elected delegates.

Executive Board Report

Clerk Keith Lloyd gave the report of the Executive Board. A correction was made concerning the annual increase of the cell tower contract at the Hampton property. The 3% increase will begin with a seven-year increment, and thereafter increase in five-year increments. Motion, seconded and carried to receive the report, with the following items to be voted on individually:

Item 1: To approve the holding the Sixty-ninth Annual Session at the Shallowford FWB Church in Marietta, Georgia, on March 17-19, 2005. Motion, seconded and carried.

Item 2: To approve a Georgia 2004 Cooperative Budget of \$265,000. Motion, seconded and carried.

Executive Secretary / Treasurer Report

Executive Secretary/Treasurer William Smith gave the Executive Office report. His report included, among other things: Roll Call Sunday attendance increased 34% from last year: 2002 was a record year in giving: Georgia does exceptionally well in supporting State and National ministries; Georgia is number ten in membership and within the top five in giving in the National Association; the camping program and retreat ministry in Georgia continues to experience growth; participation in youth competition is growing; the Acts 1:8 program is growing, but needs additional support in order to accomplish what it was designed to do; the status of foreign missionaries from Georgia is positive; Nathan and Linda Snow will be returning to the field following the Annual Session, and Dale and Sandra Bishop will begin their stateside ministry this year; the current home mission project in Kingsland. Georgia, and the joint project in Alaska are both experiencing growth: the closing of the Hampton mission work was a difficult but necessary action; participation in the minister's retirement program continues to grow; statistical information concerning membership and giving was summarized, and are included the Digest of Reports; the continued acquisition of several endowments and trusts give us the promise of future financial blessings. Motion, seconded and carried to receive his report.

Executive Secretary/Treasurer William Smith answered questions concerning the inclusion of the Free Will Baptist Bible College into the Acts 1:8 Budget, and the eligibility of others wishing to participate. A question was also raised as to the possibility of including other information in the statistical reports. A rising vote of thanks was given to Bro. William for his work in the Executive Office.

Reports from Georgia Missionaries

Rev. Nathan Snow, missionary to Japan, addressed the session concerning the work there, and expressed appreciation for Georgia's past and continued support, both financially and prayerfully. The Snow family will be returning to Japan following the Session.

Rev. Ronald Wallace, home missionary to Alaska, addressed the session concerning the work there. Rev. Billy Bevan addressed the session concerning the home mission work in Kingsland, Georgia.

FRIDAY MORNING WORSHIP SESSION

Following a brief recess, the session resumed at 10:45 am with Rev. Tony Jernigan presiding over the morning worship session. Rev. Jernigan opened the session in prayer, and Rev. Tim Horne led the congregation in singing "Just Over in the Glory Land" and a medley of choruses. Rev. Jernigan introduced our speaker, Rev. Kent Barwick, pastor of the Colquitt FWB Church. Rev. Barwick spoke on the subject of "The Process of Ministry", taking his text from Mark 5:1-20. Asking the congregation to join hands in a prayer of commitment to receive the preached Word, Rev. Jernigan led us in prayer. A few announcements were made and the session recessed for lunch.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON BUSINESS SESSION

After a lunch break, the session resumed at 1:30 pm, as Rev. Tim Horne led the congregation in singing "Because He Lives", and the chorus of "How Great Thou Art". Rev. Russell Horne read a selection of Scripture from Matthew 6:33-34, and opened the afternoon business session in prayer.

GWAC & WNAC Reports

Sis. Debra Van Pelt gave the Georgia Women Active for Christ report. Motion, seconded and carried to receive this report as information. Sis. Debra also gave the National Women Active for Christ report. Motion, seconded and carried to receive this report as information.

Board of Camping Report

Rev. Paul Creech gave the Board of Camping report. This report is included in the Digest of Reports. The report was amended to include the fact that several decisions for Christ were made at the Twin Cities Association Junior Camp. Motion, seconded and carried to receive this report as information.

Board of Trustees Report

Rev. Wayne Miracle gave the Board of Trustees report. This report is included in the Digest of Reports. Bro. Charles Austin, project manager, gave other pertinent information concerning the State Office Building project. The Board of Trustees requests that the approved cost proposal of \$240,000 for building a State Office Building be amended, up to \$50,000, for a total of up to \$290,000; and, moved that the Executive Board obtain a loan of up to \$150,000, pending the project cost extension passage. Motion and seconded to receive this report. The motion was amended to include the requests for the project cost extension of up to \$50,000. Motion, seconded and carried to approve the amended motion. The motion and second to receive the report was carried. A motion was made and seconded to authorize the Executive Board to borrow up to \$150,000 for the State Office Building project. Discussion ensued as to where the money would be borrowed from, with the question as to whether it might come from an in-house loan from the Camp Board funds. A motion was made seconded and carried to call for the guestion. The motion to authorize the Executive Board to borrow \$150,000 for the State Office Building project to borrow \$150,000 for the State Office Building project failed. The Moderator then called for a brief recess.

Following the recess, Rev. Wayne Miracle, the chairman of the Board of Trustees, clarified the previous actions of the body. The State Office Building project is not dead and fundraising efforts will continue until funds are secured to complete the project.

Special Presentation to Dr. Lucy Hyman

Rev. Eric Thomsen, representing Randall House Publications, recognized Dr. Lucy Hyman for her 20-year contribution to the Spanish literature publishing efforts of Randall House Publications. The session gave Sis. Hyman a rising vote of thanks, and Rev. Thomsen presented her with a plaque of appreciation on behalf of Randall House Publications. This report was received as information.

Board of Christian Education Report

Bro. Mark Walker gave the Board of Christian Education report. This report is included in the Digest of Reports along with the schedule of retreats. Sis. Geraldine Waid encouraged churches to begin efforts to publish their history for the benefit of future generations, and offered her assistance to any who may be interested in such an endeavor. Motion, seconded and carried to receive this report as information.

Board of Missions Report

Rev. Russell Horne gave the report for the Board of Missions. This report is included in the Digest of Reports. Executive Secretary William Smith spoke to the session concerning the closing of the Hampton mission work. With much prayer and consideration,

the Board of Missions recommends that the Hampton mission property be sold, and that proceeds from the sale be used to retire indebtedness and begin new mission works around the State. Motion, seconded and carried to receive this report. A motion was made and seconded to sell the Hampton mission property. After much discussion, a motion was made, seconded and carried to call for the question. The motion to sell the Hampton mission property carried.

National Association Reports

Rev. Keith Burden gave the report for the National Executive Office. Motion, seconded and carried to receive this report as information. Rev. Eric Thomsen gave the report for Randall House Publications and the National Sunday School and CTS Department. Motion, seconded and carried to receive this report as information. Rev. David Williford gave the report for the Free Will Baptist Bible College. Motion, seconded and carried to receive his report as report for the Retirement and Insurance Department and the Free Will Baptist Foundation. Motion, seconded and carried to receive his report as information. Rev. Bill Evans gave a report for the Retirement and Insurance Department and the Free Will Baptist Foundation. Motion, seconded and carried to receive his report as information. Ralph Dingus gave the report for Tennessee Family Ministries. Motion, seconded and carried to receive his report as information.

Partial Credentials Committee Report

Rev. Bobby Taylor gave a partial Credentials Committee report with 102 voting delegates and 156 registered. Motion, seconded and carried to receive this partial report.

FRIDAY EVENING WORSHIP SESSION

The Free Will Baptist Bible College Choir, under the direction of Thurman Lucas, ministered to the congregation in song as a prelude to the evening worship session. The session began at 7:00 pm with Bro. Mark Walker presiding and Rev. Donnie Burke directing the music. A mission offering of \$752.75 was received.

Bro. Mark Walker welcomed the congregation to the Friday evening "Georgia Praise Gathering". The evening was filled with Spirit-filled singing and praise and worship. In addition to uplifting congregational singing, the session was blessed with a variety of choir, quartet, trio, duet, and solo musical selections. Among the participants were: the "GAFWB Mass Choir"; the "Georgia Boys Quartet", consisting of Mark Walker, Tim Horne, Todd Horne, Roger Mercer, and Donnie Burke; the "Older Georgia Boys Quartet", consisting of Len Blanchard, Paul Creech, Russell Horne, Martha Jordan, Ronnie Knighton, and Rae Knighton; a trio of ladies consisting of Heather Goodman, Tara Smith, and Rachel Horne; a duet consisting of Mark and Donna Walker; soloists included Jerry McArthur, Nathan Snow, Heather Goodman, and Todd Horne.

Rev. Ronald Wallace gave the Nominating Committee report. A motion was made to elect the nominees submitted from various local associations to serve on State Boards, and was seconded and carried. Nominations were presented to serve on committees and as officers of the GAFWB. No other nominations were offered. A motion was made, seconded and carried to elect those individuals nominated. Appreciation was expressed for those serving as State Officers.

With no other business, a motion to adjourn was made, seconded and carried.

Executive Secretary/Treasurer Report March 2002 – March 2003

Welcome to the Sixty-seventh annual session of the Georgia Free Will Baptists. We have gathered to conduct our state association business and receive reports from all of our state boards and national agencies. This will also be a time to enjoy worship services that include gospel preaching and singing. We will visit with old friend and meet new ones.

Thank you for your faithful support during 2002. Receipts through the State Office totaled \$797,780.36. Of this amount \$241,901.62 was *Cooperative Receipts*, \$154,292.08 was *Georgia Acts 1:8 Receipts*, and \$401,586.66 was *Designated Receipts*. We had increase of 6.44% in *Cooperative Receipts*, 9.51% in *Georgia Acts 1:8 Receipts*, and 13.3% increase in *Total Giving*. Thank you for making 2002 a record year in giving to the *Cooperative Plan and the Georgia State Acts 1:8 Plan*.

This digest contains reports from all the Georgia state boards. The board reports cover the period of March 2002 – March 2003. All financial reports cover the period of January 1, 2002 – December 31, 2002.

The Board of Camping saw an increase in those participating in the 2002 camping program of 10% over the previous year. All of the retreats sponsored by the Board of Christian Education were well attended. The Board of Missions has closed the work in Hampton and is recommending that the state association sell the building and property. The Board of Trustees has been busy working on the proposed office building with LRA Construction Company.

We are thankful for the increase in the *Acts 1:8 Receipts*. However, we do not receive enough through this program to fully underwrite the budgets of our Georgia State Missionaries. In 2002 we gave over \$75,000.00 to National Foreign Missionaries and over \$40,000.00 to National Home Missionaries that are not a part of the *Georgia Acts 1:8 Program*. If we would shift this support to the *Georgia Acts 1:8 Program* we would have sufficient funds to support our Georgia Missionaries. We need to address our mission giving before we encounter large deficits in the accounts of our Georgia Missionaries.

Continue to pray for our missionaries. Dale and Sandra Bishop plan to return for state side ministry this summer. Debbie Griffin continues to do well with her ministry in Japan. Nathan and Linda Snow plan to return to Japan next month. Billy and Shara Bevan continue to see progress with the work in Kingsland. Ron and Janice Wallace are in the process of building a new building in Fairbanks, Alaska. We are thankful for all of our missionaries and the work they do to further the Kingdom of Christ.

The most pressing issue we face is finding pastors for our churches. We have several churches that are looking for pastors and we have several churches that have pastors who are at or nearing the age of retirement. God has blessed us with some talented young men but we do need to continue to pray for more.

Thank you all once again for your prayers and support.

- Following the camp session, a deadline of October 1st, is set for you to give a financial account of your camp session. A form will be provided by the board, and this form will require two signatures. Failure to meet the deadline will result in the forfeiture of the grant for the following year.

Board Christian Education Report March 2002-2003

Our retreats are growing bigger than ever. They have been well received throughout the State. We are very grateful for your support and will continue to try and provide them for you. We have decided to have two board members at these retreats to assist Brother William in registration and any problems that might occur.

Our board distributed twenty-six \$200.00 scholarships for students at FWB Bible College in 2002. A Bible College student from Georgia may request \$200.00 per semester.

The dates of our Youth Competition will be May 2-3 and the competition will be held at Baxley Free Will Baptist Church. The registration deadline is April 9th. If you are not registered by then, the fees will be doubled. This is a ruling by the National.

Mrs. Geraldine Waid, the archivist in our Historical Society has been working diligently. Our Historical records of State and District Minutes from 1842 to 1999 have been filed in as complete a collection as we can make them. After collecting for several years, with the help of many of our clerks, pastors, and lay people, we have declared this part of our history collected. Although there are gaps in the collection that we were not able to fill, we now have a total of 587 State and District Minutes in our collection. We also have other valuable materials, such as church histories and pictures in the collection, as well as information on missionaries that have gone out from Georgia.

The most exciting thing that happened this year is that we have sent all of the collection of State and District Minutes off to have them microfilmed. The staff at the Special Collections section of the Mercer University Library in Macon helped us in this endeavor. Their help and expertise with this was invaluable. They even added some of their Free Will Baptist Minutes that we did not have so that the history on film would be more complete. The microfilming of our materials is a safeguard in protecting our collection and our heritage. This microfilming job will be completed later this year.

Another thing that has been completed is the compilation of ministries, where they served and the dates of their service; also, a record of District Association Churches with a list of their pastors. This services as an index for research that makes it easy to find information for inquires.

The next step is to continue the collection starting from the year 2000. Thanks to all of you who are interested and are helping with this effort to preserve our history for future generations.

We've had some discussion concerning obituaries. We would like to encourage the Clerks of each association to send them to the Promotional Bulletin for publication.

There has been very little interest show in our Bible Institute for the past two semesters. Dr. Lynn Frazier has put a lot of time and work into this. Several who were trained by Dr. Frazier have not left the State. We appreciate Dr. Frazier's work greatly but if the interest is not there, we will not be able to continue. We learned that Free Will Baptist Bible College has expressed interest in bringing courses to Georgia. We are in contact with them to learn what they can offer us.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

GEORGIA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS, Inc.

PREAMBLE

We, the Free Will Baptist of the State of Georgia, do ordain this Constitution for the purpose of advocating, promoting and increasing all phases of the cause of Christ.

ARTICLE I

This assembly shall be known as the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.

Article II

SECTION 1. The officers of this association shall be Moderator, an Assistant Moderator, a Clerk, and Assistant Clerk, and an Executive Secretary/Treasurer.

SECTION 2. The Executive Board shall be composed of the regular officers; the chairman of each of the standing boards; and the previous moderator, as an ex officio member for a period of two years following his term of office.

SECTION 3. This Association shall be composed of ordained Ministers, ordained Deacons, Missionaries, and Board Members who are members of affiliated bodies; one (1) delegate for every three hundred (300) members or fraction thereof from District Associations; one (1) delegate for every one hundred (100) members or fraction thereof from each local affiliated church.

SECTION 4. All delegates from District Associations and local churches shall be elected from the laity of the body sending them.

SECTION 5. Funds to meet current needs of this body shall be paid to the treasurer of this association. Each District Association will give a minimum of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) per delegate authorized, and each local church will give ten cents (\$.10) per capita of their respective memberships.

SECTION 6. In order to pay our Georgia State Association's annual representation fee to the National Association, each local association is to be responsible to promote, receive and forward the amount designated by the National Association per church per year to the State Office, along with their annual State Association representation fee, on or before our annual State Association session.

ARTICLE III

SECTION 1. It shall be the privilege of each affiliated District Association to recommend a member for each standing board. Terms of office on these boards shall be on a rotating basis which will necessitate the election by the State Association of five (5) members every two (2) years, thus giving each member a four (4) year term of office.

SECTION 2. There shall be a **Board of Missions** composed of members who are noted for their missionary zeal.

A. The Board of Missions shall employ missionaries as needed to establish Free Will Baptist mission/churches in the State of Georgia. These missionaries may be employed exclusively or jointly with other Free Will Baptist agencies.

B. A mission/church sponsored by the Georgia State Association and their missionaries are under the authority of the State Association and the supervision of the Georgia State Board of Missions.

C. A mission/church does not have autonomous church status. As long as the mission/church is unable to provide for its own business, it is in a dependent relationship to the State Association and its Board of Missions.

D. When the mission/church is self-sustaining, self-governing, self-discipline, and self-propagating. It should be organized into an autonomous Free Will Baptist Church following the procedures adopted by the Georgia State Association.

E. After proper procedures are satisfied and the church is duly organized into autonomous Free Will Baptist church it shall have all normal rights, privileges, and responsibilities of any other Free Will Baptist Church.

SECTION 3. There shall be a **Board of Camping** whose duties shall be to schedule and arrange all camp sessions, and to appoint the Camp Director each year.

SECTION 4. There shall be a Board of Christian Education whose duties shall be:

A. To provide educational services for the members of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists.

B. To set policy and supervise the functions of the State Youth Committee. This Board shall appoint this Committee to carry out Board policy.

C. To organize sponsor and promote educational and inspirational retreats for our members.

D. To organize, sponsor and promote Sunday School and Church Training seminars.

E. To set policy and supervise the Historical Committee. This Board shall appoint the Historical Committee to gather and set forth for public knowledge and posterity the history of Georgia Free Will Baptists.

SECTION 5. There shall be a **Board of Trustees** whose duties shall be; maintenance, upkeep and insuring of all State Association properties; the planning and supervision of all future developments and expansion of these properties as directed by the State Association except otherwise provided in this Constitution.

SECTION 6. There shall be a **Credentials Committee**, which shall consist of three (3) members of three-year terms. And the term of one expiring each year thereafter according to seniority of service, who shall be in charge of the registration and examination of delegates and the receiving of all dues.

SECTION 7. There shall be two members on the Board of Trustees of the Free Will Baptist Children's Home, Eldridge, Alabama, elected for terms of four (4) years. Election will take place on odd years and shall be staggered.

SECTION 8. There shall be a **Georgia State Master's Men.** They shall select their own officers and conduct their own business.

SECTION 9. There shall be a **Georgia State Woman's Auxiliary Convention** (**GWAC**). They shall elect their officers, conduct their business and maintain their treasury.

ARTICLE IV

SECTION 1. All officers except board members and the Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be elected to serve a term of two (2) years. The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be employed by the Executive Board of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, subject to the ratification of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists at its next regular session, for an indefinite period, with an agreement of sixty (60) day notice of termination by either the Executive Secretary/Treasurer or the Executive Board.

SECTION 2. Standing Boards of the State Association have no power of final authority to hire, full–time employees until the matter has been presented to and acted on by the State Association in session except where otherwise provided.

SECTION 3. The Executive Board may fill vacancies on any of the boards or committees, which occur between regular sessions of this State Association, until the convening of the annual session of said association.

SECTION 4. Election of all General Officers shall take place on the odd years of the calendar.

SECTION 5. If a member of any board fails in the function of his or her duty without good and sufficient reasons, the board of which the delinquent is a member may declare that particular office vacant. Further, this body shall have and does reserve the right to deal with the officer or board member who does not conduct his or her office in a Christian, business like manner according to the rules of Christian conduct as set forth in the New Testament.

Any standing board of this State Association may appoint proxies to serve in lieu of the absent members.

At the pleasure of the boards, and subsequent to the meeting from which the regular member is absent, the boards have the right to deal with the delinquent member in the manner stated in this section.

SECTION 6. The Chairman or Vice-Chairman of said board, or by the Moderator or Assistant Moderator of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, upon the request of the majority of the members of said boards, may call boards into session.

SECTION 7. An auditing Committee of three (3) members will be elected annually.

AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be changed, altered, or amended by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all delegates present and voting at any regular session of the State Association. Prior to a final vote on any amendment, change or alteration, said amendment, change or alteration shall be submitted in writing to the Clerk of this association and shall lie on the table from one (1) business meeting to the next during the same session, during which time it shall be read at least two (2) times in open session. Officers, standing boards, and/or standing committees may be added or deleted as the need arises.

BY-LAWS

SECTION 1:

A. All real property, checking and savings account or any other assets of this Association shall be in the name of the *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*

B. One or more of the corporate officers of the Association shall be the legal signers of all Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. business. These officers are: the Moderator as the corporate President; the Clerk as the corporate Vice-President; and the Executive Secretary/Treasurer as the Secretary/Treasurer.

C. The State Office shall be responsible for the safekeeping of the corporate seal and all official documents of the State Association.

D. No State Board may borrow money or financially obligated the State Association without the approval of the Executive Board.

E. The fixed assets (building, land) of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists shall not be liquidated except by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the delegates present and voting at any regular session of the Association.

F. The records of all financial transaction shall be open to all members of the Georgia State Association. The financial transactions of the State Office and State Boards shall be audited annually.

G. Annual financial reports of the State Office and State Boards and the auditor's report shall be made to the State Association in session an be entered in the Annual State Minutes.

H. The State Treasurer shall be bonded in amount stipulated by the State Executive Board.

I. This Association shall meet for its regular session annually on Thursday following the second Sunday in March and shall adjourn on the Saturday immediately following.

SECTION 2.

A. When the State Association is not in session, the State Executive Board shall be duly authorized to do business in the name of the State Association.

B. The State Association has full authority to direct the State Executive Board in all business conducted on its behalf.

C. The State Executive Board shall report to the State Association in session concerning the business conducted for the State Association since its last convening.

D. The State Executive Board has the prerogative of deferring any matter to the State Association as a whole but is not under obligation to do so.

E. The State Executive Board shall meet quarterly in the following months: March, June, September, and December. The March meeting shall be held just prior to the regular meeting of the State Association.

F. Any and all correspondence from any member of this State Association, (includes either individual, group, Board or District Association) directed to any Board, or

Chairman of said Board, or any officer of this State Association, or any open letters to any or all District Associations of this State, that pertains to any business which is desired or required to be brought before this body at any scheduled or special called meeting, shall be properly sent directly to the Clerk of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, The clerk will be responsible for routing the correspondence to its proper designation. All correspondence as mentioned above, shall be required to be received by the Clerk of the State Association at least 30 days prior to any scheduled State Association Meeting if said correspondence contains business that is to be introduced and discussed at said meeting.

SECTION 3.

A. The moderator shall preside at the Annual Session of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists and the meetings of the Executive Board. The Moderator shall be the President of the Corporation known as the *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*

B. The Assistant Moderator shall preside in the absence of the Moderator and/or when appointed by the Moderator as the need arises.

C. The Clerk shall keep records of the proceedings of the Annual Associational meeting and of the Executive Board meetings. It shall also be his responsibility to have the minutes of these sessions printed and distributed. The Clerk shall be the Vice-President of the Corporation known as *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*

D. The Assistant Clerk in the absence of the Clerk, shall fulfill the functions and duties of the Clerk as stated in paragraph C of this document.

SECTION 4.

A. The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be responsible and accountable to the Executive Board in the fulfillment of the duties of his office as determined by the Executive Board.

B. The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be allowed four (4) weeks vacation per year with pay.

C. Funds received by the Executive Secretary/Treasurer for revivals, special speaking engagements and promotional meetings shall go into the Cooperative Fund. The exception to this regulation relates to remuneration received by the Executive Secretary during his four (4) weeks vacation, which shall be his personally and need not be accounted for to this State Association.

D. Salary, mileage and operational expenses of the Executive Secretary/ Treasurer shall be determined by the Executive Board.

E. The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be the Secretary/Treasurer of the Corporation known as the *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*

F. General Promotion. He is to represent, or cause to be represented, the association at all affairs of interest to the association and he is to promote the work of the association in such a manner so as to unify the association as well as promote both the state and national works, missionaries, mission conferences, etc. Through personal communication he shall keep close contact with pastors, churches, and district association.

G. Administration. He shall administer the affairs of the executive office and carry out the responsibilities delegated to him by the State Association and the Executive

Board. He is to serve with all standing boards and committees of the association in an exofficial capacity. He is to report to the association during each annual session.

H. Stewardship. He shall serve as treasurer of this association. An accurate and complete record of all funds received and disbursed shall be kept and a written report shall be included in his report to this association in its annual session. He shall receive, hold and disburse money as is made available by the State Association to the various boards. Disbursements to the various boards will be made available when requested.

I. Publication. It shall be his duty to edit and publish the state paper. He shall direct the production of general promotional materials, pamphlets, audiovisuals, and books as approved by the Executive Board.

J. Arranging State Association. He shall expedite the planning of the State Association program, enroll all ministers and delegates, print and distribute minutes, and investigate future sites for the annual session.

SECTION 5.

A. The Executive Board shall serve as the Placement Committee for the State Association. In this capacity the board shall investigate places suitable for this meeting and make recommendations to said State Association. Meeting places shall be determined two (2) years in advance.

B. The Executive Board shall plan the program for the annual meetings of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists and the annual meetings shall follow the programs as closely as possible. Business sessions shall be conducted according to the commonly accepted rules of Parliamentary Procedure.

C. The Executive Board shall formulate the budget for the State Association annually and recommend to the body in the session the allocations to be observed in the Cooperative Plan for Giving. This board shall, in addition to the above stated duties, also recommend a mileage rate for travel by the members of all standing boards in said association.

SECTION 6.

The Moderator shall appoint necessary committees unless otherwise provided for by the body.

SECTION 7.

These By-Laws may be altered, changed, or amended at any regular session of this association by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of delegates present and voting (Revised 2001)

GEORGIA WOMEN ACTIVE FOR CHRIST CALVARY FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH COLUMBUS, GEORGIA MARCH 13, 2003

Stephanie Burgess welcomed everyone prior to the business session and started the worship time with prayer. Sherrie Bailey led the congregation in "This is the Day", "The Family of God" and "Bind Us Together". An offering was taken and we then sang "People Need the Lord". Heather Goodman then sang "Under His Wings". Fleda Snow welcomed Nathan Snow, who spoke in place of Linda, who was tending to a sick child. Nathan began by thanking the Georgia women for their support in prayers, giving, and participation in the Acts 1:8 Plan. He shared that 199 out of 200 Japanese people have not heard the gospel, but strangely enough, the Japanese people love gospel music. He then read Acts 1: 6-8 which says that the disciples were burdened for Israel but God said that Power comes from the Holy Spirit in His time and in the right season. Nathan said that abortion is just standard birth control in Japan and the Japanese people do not believe in creation, but evolution. He sang "I Love You" and read Psalm 67. He said that their minimum support goal was reached and they will be leaving Atlanta on March 26 to go back to Japan. He then had a Q&A time.

We took a break and when we reconvened, the business session was opened by singing "His Name is Wonderful" and "Something About That Name". Marie Glover gave the Remembrance Report and said that no ladies had passed away during 2002. She said a prayer of thanks to God for his goodness and safe keeping of our ladies. President Debra Van Pelt then called the 2003 business session to order.

Sammie Montgomery gave the Resolutions Committee Report, as follows:

BE IT RESOLVED, that GWAC pray daily for all Free Will Baptist missionaries and all other Christian missionaries in these dangerous times.

BE IT RESOLVED, that GWAC promote daily prayer for our President, world leaders and our military.

BE IT RESOLVED that the following be added to reporting forms: "All monetary or monetary value of material gifts given to missions and/or missionaries be reported for credit on local, state and national level."

BE IT RESOLVED that the women of the Calvary Free Will Baptist Church of Columbus have hosted the state convention of the GWAC, and that the Convention give them a rising vote of thanks for their gracious hospitality. M/S/C by everyone standing.

Terra Smith gave the Registration Committee Report. 71 registered, 2 missionaries, 22 visitors, 34 delegates, 13 state officers. M/S/C to accept.

New Business:

Rachel Horne gave the nominating committee report. She said, "that each district needs to send a nominating committee member." President: Debra Van Pelt from Twin Cities; Vice President: Sandra Jackson from Union; Secretary Donna Jewell from Georgia Union; Treasurer Christine Daniel from Midway; Historian Marie Glover from Midway; Field Worker Terra Smith from Martin; and three members at large: Sammie Montgomery from South Georgia; Suzie Mounts from North Georgia; and Melinda Clark from Georgia Union; M/S/C to adopt the report as read and each board member was voted on separately and voted unanimously to accept.

Janice Temples gave the Retreat Report. She said it was wonderful and everyone enjoyed the FROG theme. Tina Tolbert was the speaker and everyone enjoyed her fun time Friday night and talk on Saturday morning. Gail Smith resigned as President due to moving to Florida. Door prizes were given and everyone had a great time. The 2003 Retreat will be at Norman Park on October 17 and 18.

Edwina Drinkwater gave the National WAC report. She said the Tennessee women really went all out and the seminars for pastor's wives was great. Debe Taylor was the speaker. She said "The Fruit of our Hands" cookbook was "unveiled". At the Fellowship Luncheon, birdhouses were given as door prizes. Terry Peacock entertained as Viney Mae and she also portrayed Mary, the mother of Jesus.

Nadine Blanton gave the Ridgcrest Report. She said the meeting was wonderful. The theme was "For Such a Time as This" with 941 registering. Speaker Ashley Hartley did a great job, as did Rhonda Freeman, who rendered the special music.

Announcements were given. The idea of a luncheon at next year's convention was mentioned and after some discussion, it was decided that the Executive Board will discuss at its next board meeting.

Nora McCarty then installed the new officers for 2003 and 2004. She read from "Listen to the Silence" and challenged every lady including those in the congregation, and said a heart-felt prayer for each officer and our nation.

The meeting was adjourned and Linda Blanchard dismissed in prayer.

GEORGIA WOMEN ACTIVE FOR CHRIST Of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. Constitution and By-Laws

Name

Article I

This organization shall be known as Georgia Women Active for Christ a division of the Georgia Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc., commonly known by its initials, GWAC. Its members shall elect officers, conduct business and maintain a treasury.

Article II

<u>Purpose</u>

The purpose of this organization shall be to assist the various women composing the GWAC in providing opportunities to understand and fulfill the Great Commission through their responsibilities in the family, church, community, and around the world.

It shall bring the women of each district together for fellowship, sharing information, encouraging one another in the work of the Lord and furthering the purpose and goals of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists.

Article III

Officers

- The officers of this convention shall be president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, field worker, historian, and three members at large, all of which are elected by the convention. These officers shall serve as the State Executive Board. A minimum of five officers shall be a quorum for transacting business.
- Any officer or elected board member of this convention must be an active member of a local Free Will Baptist Church and an active member of the GWAC group of a local church.
- Executive Board members are required to attend all scheduled board meetings. Any officer missing three meetings is subject to review and removal by the Executive Board.

Article IV

Membership

- This convention shall be composed of: the officers of the convention, district presidents, district field workers, ten delegates (duly accredited by the credentials committee) from each district convention, four delegates and the president from each local GWAC in good standing with its district convention.
- 2. Local groups in an area where there is no district convention may be represented with five delegates by payment of their membership dues. All delegates, as well as officers of the convention, shall be in good standing with a church that is in good standing with the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, and shall perform the duties as set forth for them in the present WNAC manual and this Constitution and By-Laws.

<u>Meetings</u>

Article V

- The annual meeting shall be held each year the day before the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists convention in the same place or at such a time and place determined at the previous annual meeting or by the Executive Board.
- 2. A prayer retreat shall be held annually, time and place to be planned by the Executive Board.

Article VI

Amendments

This Constitution may be amended at any annual meeting of the convention by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

By-Laws

Article I

Duties of Officers

President – The president shall preside over all meetings, appoint such committees as may be needed; call the Executive Board together when necessary; be exofficio member of all committees, except the nominating committee; see that reports are sent promptly to the WNAC secretary; and perform all duties pertaining to such an office. She should see that GWAC is represented in the State Promotional Bulletin. Articles should be sent to the state executive office by the 1st of each month. She may either write the articles or ask someone to write the articles for her.

Vice President – The vice president shall preside in the absence of the president or by her request and otherwise assist her in the oversight of the work in general. She shall serve as chairman of the credentials committee.

Secretary – The secretary shall keep an accurate record of all proceedings of the convention and Executive Board meetings; preserve all valuable papers and turn same over to her successor; make an annual report to the WNAC secretary on a form available from the WNAC office within 15 days after the State GWAC Convention; compile the districts' slate of officers and addresses immediately after the convention; send a slate of state officers to the WNAC secretary and to each state officer. She is responsible for getting the minutes prepared and to the state associational office in time to be included in the state minutes each year.

Treasurer – The treasurer shall have charge of all funds belonging to this convention and shall pay out same only when authorized by the convention. The treasurer shall keep an accurate account, and give a written report of all funds received and disbursed at each annual meeting of the convention. She is required to deposit all checks in her possession and disburse all designated funds by the 30th of each month. She shall be bonded through the state office and audited annually.

Field Worker – The field worker shall promote GWAC programs through personal contact and the distribution of literature and serve where needed as directed by the Executive Board.

Historian – The historian shall keep a historical record and have a display at all state meetings and serve where needed as directed by the Executive Board.

Members at Large – The members at large shall help promote the work in general, meet with the Executive Board, and serve where needed as directed by the Executive Board.

Article II

Elections

A nominating committee shall nominate the general officers and members at large. Following the nominating committee's report, opportunity shall be given for nominations from the floor. In case of more than one nominee for any particular office, a vote will be taken for each; otherwise they may be elected by acclamation. The officers shall be elected every two years on odd number years. Not more than one-half of the elected officers shall be changed in any regular election. All elections shall be held at the closing sessions of the annual convention.

Article III

Expenses

Estimated expenses for the state work shall be set by an annual budget approved by the convention. The Executive Board must approve all reimbursement.

Article IV

Boards and Committees

Executive Board – This Board shall be composed of six officers and three members at large elected by the convention. Five of these shall compose a quorum. They shall hold meetings for the transaction of business as often as necessary. It shall be the duty of the Executive Board to maintain an oversight of the work at large. The Board shall act for the convention when necessary. It shall prepare the program for the regular meetings and fill any vacancy between elections.

Resolutions Committee – A resolutions committee shall be appointed by the president. A member of the Executive Board shall chair this committee. This committee shall review all resolutions presented, having the prerogative of passing on to the convention those resolutions that are deemed proper and profitable. Resolutions should be properly worded, i.e. "Be it Resolved....."

Nominating Committee – The nominating committee shall be composed of one member from each district convention and shall be elected one year prior to making their report. The names of the members from each district shall be submitted with the convention annual report. The president shall appoint a chairperson from the members of the nominating committee.

Credentials Committee – The vice president shall be the chairman of the credentials committee and the president shall appoint two other members. This committee shall examine the reports of the represented women's groups to see if fees are paid and if reports are in order.

Finance Committee – The treasurer shall be chairman of the finance committee and the president may appoint four other members. This committee reviews the financial records for the year, reports on same to the convention, and makes recommendations of disbursements of funds to the convention.

Registration Committee – The president shall appoint members as needed to serve on this committee. This committee registers those in attendance and gives a report to the convention.

Article V

Dues and Reports

Active members shall pay dues yearly as required by the GWAC Convention for membership. These dues should come through the district treasurers by January 10th following the close of the previous year. District secretaries and treasurers annual reports should be filed with the state secretary and treasurer no later than February 1 following the close of the previous year. Beginning 2002 the dues are \$12.50 per member with Georgia retaining \$2.50 per member and WNAC receiving dues of \$10.00 per member.

Gifts

Article VI

- Season of Prayer Offerings-
 - 1. **Pre-Easter Week of Prayer** offering is used for Foreign Missions in memory of Laura Bell Barnard, our first foreign missionary.

- 2. **Pre-Thanksgiving Week of Prayer** offering is used for National Home Missions in memory of Mrs. Lizzie McAdams, a great writer of our literature and one of the first National officers.
- 3. The December Week of Prayer offering is used for State Missions in memory of Mrs. Alice E. Lupton, our first National president.

Co-Laborer Offering – A financial plan of support for WNAC. Each local GWAC is encouraged to support the WNAC office with a monthly offering.

Provision Closet - This project helps missionaries as they return home to pick up household items, etc., from the closet at the National Office. Each local GWAC is encouraged to keep abreast of the items and supplies needed as they are periodically listed in the **Co-Laborer** magazine, and give to this project as needed.

WNAC Emphasis – A special offering to supplement the Co-Laborer Offerings for WNAC expenses of operation, literature, etc. This offering is received during August.

Remembrance Fund – This is a fund established by WNAC and a distinct way to honor any occasion the donor wishes to note: Anniversaries, birthdays, or as a memorial gift at the time of death. A remembrance card notifying the family of the person being honored, and the donor, will be entered in the permanent Book of Remembrances in the WNAC office. These gifts will be used to advance the kingdom of God through WNAC. A Remembrance Service is to be conducted at our state GWAC convention each year.

Dr. Mary Ruth Wisehart Foreign Student Scholarship Fund – Any GWAC group who wishes may contribute to this special fund set up by WNAC to train Nationals from our foreign fields. February is designated as Foreign Student month.

Dot Harvey Loan Fund – This revolving loan fund was established in honor of Miss Dot Harvey, a forerunner of youth work in Georgia, by the Georgia Women's Auxiliary Convention in 1954 to aid worthy Georgia students attending Free Will Baptist Bible College. Each local group is asked to donate monthly toward this project. A special offering is received in September to add to this fund.

Westfield Church Fund – This fund is used to assist the church in Kotogiri, South India in memory of Miss Laura Bell Barnard. All groups are encouraged to give to this Georgia project monthly.

Other Gifts – The state GWAC may decide on and promote other projects for funds at its own discretion.

Lora Shutes Mission Project – This is a statewide project with the goal set each year at the annual convention. Funds are disbursed to missionaries through the State Acts 1:8 Program.

GWAC Emphasis – June is designated as GWAC Emphasis Month. Each group is asked to receive a special offering to supplement GWAC operational expenses.
