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Proceedings of the 69th Annual Session of the GAFWB

The Sixty-ninth Annual Session of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists convened at the Shallowford Free Will Baptist Church in Marietta, Georgia, on March 17th – 19th, 2005.

WEDNESDAY EVENING WORSHIP SERVICE

The evening began with music from the Shallowford Choir and other special singing by members of the church. After congregational singing, Rev. Len Blanchard introduced the speaker, Rev. Andy Merritt, who pastors the Hebrew FWB Church in Donalsonville.

Rev. Merritt took his text from Jeremiah 6:16 and encouraged the GAFWB to continue to walk in the “old paths” of the fundamental doctrines of the Christian faith.

After an invitation, tribute was paid to one of Free Will Baptists greatest men, Dr. Lavene Miley, who went to be with the Lord in the days just preceding the Annual Session. Rev. Herbert Waid led the Association in a prayer of thanks for Dr. Miley’s service and ministry, and for God’s comfort and peace upon his family.

Following a few brief announcements, the congregation was dismissed in prayer.

THURSDAY MORNING BIBLE CONFERENCE

Rev. Dwight Smith presided over the Thursday morning Bible Conference and Bro. Monty McKenzie led the music.

Rev. Danny Ryals, pastor of St. Marks FWB Church in Phenix City, Alabama, brought the first message for the Bible Conference. Bro. Danny took his text from Proverbs 29:18, and preached concerning “The Vision We Need”.

Rev. Paul Creech, pastor of the White Oaks FWB Church in Macon, brought the second message for the Bible Conference. Bro. Paul, using various scriptures, exhorted us to be a “friend of God” by following Jesus’ example of being a “friend of sinners”.

THURSDAY EVENING BUSINESS & WORSHIP SESSION

The evening session began with a prelude of special music by the “Georgia Boys Quartet”, consisting of Mark Walker, Roger Mercer, Donnie Burke and Tim Horne. Todd Horne provided the musical accompaniment.

Rev. Willie Martin welcomed everyone to the 69th Annual Session of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists and to the Shallowford FWB Church. Rev. Steve Dowless opened the meeting in prayer, Bro. Buddy Johnson sang the National Anthem and the session recited the pledges to the Christian and American flags.

Call to Session & Preliminaries

Clerk Keith Lloyd officially called to order the Sixty-ninth Annual Session of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists and introduced the Moderator, Rev. Len Blanchard.

The Moderator welcomed everyone and called the Roll of District Associations. The Moderator appointed the Committee on Committees as follows: Chairman Willie Martin, Keith Horn, Jeff Goodman, Mark Kennedy, and Billy Bevan, Jr.

The Clerk read an Executive Board Report addendum, which proposed an addition to the By-Laws of the Association, and moved that the addition be laid on the table for consideration. The motion was seconded and carried.

Evening Worship

Rev. Roger Mercer led the congregation in the following worship songs: “Joy Unspeakable”, “Great Is The Lord”, “Awesome In This Place”, and “Holy”. “The Colquitt Trio” (consisting of Roger Mercer, Jeff Braswell and Buddy Johnson) sang a special selection entitled “I’ll Rise Again”.

Rev. Willie Martin introduced the evening speaker, Rev. Billy McKinney, pastor of the Liberty Bible Church in Gainesville, GA. Before beginning his message, Rev. McKinney paid tribute to two great men of God who had influenced his life and the lives of many others, Rev. Emmitt McDuffie and Rev. Rudy Woods, both of whom are now deceased. Rev. McKinney took his text from Mark 2:16-22 and preached a message entitled, "Gimme Some Skin: Fresh Focus on Fellowship". An invitational hymn, "I Surrender All", was sung as an opportunity to respond to the Word was offered.

Several announcements were made and Rev. Arthur Smith dismissed the session in prayer.

FRIDAY MORNING BUSINESS SESSION

Bro. Jim Mounts, a deacon at the Shallowford church, led the congregation in singing "O, How I Love Jesus" and "Amazing Grace". Bro. Steve Lytle opened the session in prayer. Moderator Len Blanchard began the session with a Scripture reading and brief devotion from Luke 15:1-7.

Partial Credentials Committee Report

Rev. Bobby Taylor gave a partial report of Credentials Committee. He reported a voting delegation of 78 with 118 total registrations.

Moderator Len Blanchard recognized the standing delegates, national messengers, and visitors. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to seat all elected delegates.

Executive Board Report

Clerk Keith Lloyd gave a report of the Executive Board. A motion was made, seconded and carried to receive the report.

A motion was made to accept a 2007 calendar year budget of \$800,000.00. Included in this budget is a Coop Budget of \$290,000.00. The motion was seconded and carried.

A motion was made, seconded and carried to remove from the table the proposed addition to the By-Laws. The addition was then acted upon as follows:

By-Laws: Section 1: Letter E.

Now reads:

"The fixed assets (building, land) of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists shall not be liquidated except by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the delegates present and voting at any regular session of the Association."

Proposed addition:

"The Executive Board shall have the authority to approve the sale of properties donated to any Board of the GAFWB, upon recommendation of the Board to which the donation was made, with proceeds remaining under the authority of the recommending Board."

A motion was made, seconded and carried to approve this addition to the By-Laws.

Executive Secretary / Treasurer Report

Executive Secretary/Treasurer William Smith gave the Executive Office report. Bro. William began his report by thanking Georgia Free Will Baptists for their faithfulness.

Receipts in 2004 exceeded all budget requirements, with an overall increase of 1.58% in Total Giving. Georgia Free Will Baptists are generous in their giving to the total program of Free Will Baptists, through both State and National ministries.

The retreat and camping programs in Georgia are growing in attendance each year, the number of churches has increased, church attendance numbers are on the rise, and Sunday School enrollment has grown. Many churches are building new facilities and the value of church properties reflects this growth.

The population of Georgia is growing at a rapid pace. Industry and military facilities are fueling much of this growth. Georgia Free Will Baptists are poised to take advantage of this growth by planting new FWB churches in these growing areas. Bro. William also exhorted the Association that we should be ready to change our methods, to deal with division in our ranks, and to enhance our programs of ministry, so that we may be able to take advantage of the opportunities that God has provided.

A motion was made, seconded and carried to receive his report.

Board of Christian Education Report

Bro. Mark Walker gave the Christian Education Board report. This report and the financial report are included in the minutes.

The State Youth Competition will be held on May 6th –7th at the Baxley FWB Church. Deadline for registration is April 13th. The Georgia winners of last year's National Youth Competition are listed in the digest of reports

There were 14 Charles Clark Scholarships awarded to Georgia students who are attending the Free Will Baptist Bible College.

The C.E. Board has entered into a joint project with Hillsdale FWB Bible College to provide a Master's Degree Program for our ministers. The Board has also agreed to provide \$200.00 per registrant from the Charles Clark Scholarship to initiate the beginning of this program.

The historical archives continue to grow. Sis. Geraldine Waid was commended for her work in this endeavor.

A motion was made, seconded and carried to receive the report.

Board of Trustees Report

Rev. Russell Horne gave the Board of Trustees report. This report and the financial report are included in the minutes.

The State Office Building in Colquitt has been purchased and renovations are under way. Bro. William Smith reported on some of the bids that have been received and reiterated the Trustee Board pledge that no monies would be borrowed or capital stewardship campaigns needed to complete these renovations.

A motion was made, seconded and carried to receive the report.

Board of Camping Report

Rev. Paul Creech gave the Board of Camping report. This report and the financial report are included in the minutes.

The Camp Board is responsible for planning the State Teen Camp and the Teen Winter Retreat. The camping program continues to grow in attendance and God is moving mightily among our youth. Bro. Mark Walker has been director of Teen Camp for the past several years and will continue to serve in that capacity this year. Teen Camp will be held this year on May 29th – June 3rd at Camp Echeconnee in Lizella. The theme for this year's camp session is: "God's Amazing Grace for our Amazing Race".

The Winter Retreat in 2004 was held at Epworth By The Sea on St. Simon's Island with Rev. Jeff Goodman serving as director. During the Tuesday evening service, the Spirit of God moved powerfully and many of our youth made decisions for Christ, both for salvation and recommitment, and for Christian service.

Financial grants of \$1,500.00 per year continue to be offered to our District Associations for their Junior Camp programs. A financial report from the associations receiving the grants is due by October of the same year, in order to be eligible for the next year's grant.

A motion was made, seconded and carried to receive the report.

National Association Reports

Rev. David Williford gave the report for the Free Will Baptist Bible College. The college continues to experience an increase in enrollment. Bro. Williford thanked the GAFWB for their past and continuing support. The Pastoral Ministries program is growing and is a primary focus of the college, but other ministries and vocations are also being promoted as well. This report was received as information.

Miscellaneous

Bro. William Smith took a moment to thank the office secretary Rhonda Chandler for taking on the responsibility of printing and binding the digest of reports for the State Meeting, and Sis. Henrietta Brown for her expertise as editor of the Promotional Bulletin.

Assistant Moderator Wayne Miracle expressed appreciation for the Executive Board and to the Executive Secretary for getting the "Pastors Who Stay" tape series, by H.B. London of Focus on the Family, into the hands of Georgia pastors.

Rev. Reuben Cason dismissed the morning business session in prayer.

FRIDAY MORNING WORSHIP SESSION

Following a brief recess, the session resumed with Rev. Jeff Goodman presiding over the morning worship service. Bro. Jeff informed the Association that he would have been a poor "presider" because of his inability to tell good jokes; however, he had resolved this problem by "hiring" Rev. Danny Ryals to handle his joke telling. As usual, Bro. Danny came though, as did Bro. Jeff, and the Association enjoyed a good laugh together. Bro. Jim Mounts led the congregation in singing "Lord, I Lift Your Name On High" and "All Hail The Power Of Jesus Name". Rev. Parnell Aldridge led in an opening prayer.

Rev. Goodman introduced our speaker, Rev. Randy Jackson, pastor of the Midway FWB Church in Moultrie. Rev. Jackson brought an inspiring message entitled, "Fearless Faith", taking his text from Isaiah 43:1-11.

After some brief announcements, Rev. Billy Hanna dismissed in prayer and the session recessed for lunch.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON BUSINESS SESSION

After a lunch break, the session resumed at 1:30 pm, as Bro. Jim Mounts led the congregation in singing "Since Jesus Came Into My Heart". Rev. Wayne Miracle read a selection of Scripture from Matthew 27:29-54 and Rev. Roy Woods opened the afternoon business session in prayer.

GWAC & NWAC Reports

Sis. Debra Van Pelt, as President, gave the Georgia Women Active for Christ report. She began by thanking pastors for their support of GWAC, and then read the minutes of their annual meeting. Sis. Debra Van Pelt also gave the National Women Active for Christ report on behalf of Sis. Marjorie Workman. This report was received as information.

Board of Missions Report

Rev. Billy Hanna gave the report for the Board of Missions. This report and the financial report are included in the minutes.

Rev. Hanna assured the association of the Mission Board's priority and commitment to building new FWB churches in Georgia. Though there have been many obstacles, God is working and opening doors for the Mission Board to reach their goals.

On behalf of the Mission Board, Rev. Hanna thanked Rev. Billy Bevan, Jr. for his labor in the Camden mission effort, and for his fulfillment of the five-year contract with the GAFWB Mission Board. He then asked Rev. Bevan to report on the ongoing work at the Camden FWB Church. Rev. Bevan informed the Association that the church is very close to reaching self-supporting status, and thanked the GAFWB and the Mission Board for their

support. Asking them to come forward, he gave an appreciation gift to each of the former and current Board members and to several previous members.

Rev. Ron Wallace, pastor of the Northern Lights FWB Church in Alaska, shared concerning the mission work there, thanked the association and Mission Board for their support, and reported that the new building has been completed and dedicated. They are looking forward to purchasing new, padded chairs and fully utilizing the new sanctuary.

The Mission Board has met repeatedly over the last year and hired two missionaries to begin the work of planting churches in the Valdosta and Cartersville areas. These two men and their wives, Dr. and Mrs. Bill Lewis and Dr. and Mrs. Bill Crank, were introduced to the Association and asked to share a few words of introduction.

Rev. Bill Lewis gave a brief report on the progress of the Valdosta work and his calling to this ministry. The name of the new church is "Open Door Fellowship". Rev. Bill Crank expressed his excitement at the opportunity of establishing of a soul-winning FWB church in the Cartersville area and asked for prayer as they settled in to begin.

Rev. Hanna reported that the Hampton property is still on the market for sale. There is also the potential that other properties may soon be donated to the GAFWB. The Board is excited about what God is doing and are praying that He would continue to raise up laborers to go forth into the ministry of planting new FWB churches in Georgia.

Rev. Hanna thanked the GAFWB for their past and continuing support of the Board and its endeavors. He gave an impassioned plea for Georgia Free Will Baptists to stay the course in realizing this goal of planting new Georgia Free Will Baptist churches. A motion was made, seconded and carried to receive this report.

More National Association Reports

Rev. Richard Atwood gave the report for the National Home Missions Department. The department is actively pursuing new mission works around the country. Cross-cultural ministries continue to expand. The Benjamin Randall offering set a new record and the department finished the year in the black financially. The department will focus attention on planting churches in the Northeast and Rocky Mountain areas of the United States. This report was received as information.

Rev. Bill Evans gave the report for the Board of Retirement. Georgia has the highest percentage of pastors who are participating in the retirement program. Rev. Evans encouraged the GAFWB to set a goal of 100% participation. On a personal note, he thanked Sis. Debbie Griffin for her faithful service in Japan and stateside ministry. Rev. Bill Evans gave a report for the Free Will Baptist Foundation. The Foundation continues to grow and provide funding and returns to various FWB ministries. These reports were received as information.

Bro. Matt Markins gave the report for Randall House Publications and the National Sunday School and CTS Department. He began his report by paying tribute to the life and ministry of Rev. Rudy Woods. Bro Markins informed the Association of some of the new materials offered by Randall House and encouraged the members to attend the upcoming Sunday School seminar to be offered in Georgia next August. Two copies of "The Case of Stuart's Ship", a newly released children's book from Randall House, were presented as gifts to the State Office and to Rev. Rudy Wood's church in his honor. This report was received as information.

Rev. Steve Lytle gave the report for the International Missions Department. He informed the Association of various resources offered by the department. On behalf of the department, he expressed appreciation to the GAFWB for their faithful support of International Missions. Rev. Lytle concluded his report by paying tribute to the mission work of the recently deceased Dr. Laverne Miley. Sis. Debbie Griffin gave a brief testimony concerning her ministry and calling to take the Gospel to the people of Japan. Matt and Christina Price thanked the people of Georgia for their support in helping them get to the mission field in France. This report was received as information.

Bro. Ken Akers gave a report for the National Master's Men Department. He informed the Association of some of the upcoming events and encouraged the men of Georgia to participate in these events. The department recently felt led to establish a disaster response team and has been blessed by several donations of equipment. More tools,

equipment and resources are needed to make this vision a working reality. This report was received as information.

Partial Nominating Committee Report

Rev. Ron Wallace gave a partial Nominating Committee report. A motion was made, seconded and carried to receive the nominations for the Board of Camping. A motion was made, seconded and carried to receive the nominations for the Board of Christian Education. A motion was made, seconded and carried to receive the nominations for the Board of Missions. A motion was made, seconded and carried to receive the nominations for the Board of Trustees. A motion was made, seconded and carried to receive the nomination for the Auditing Committee. A motion was made, seconded and carried to receive the nomination for the Credentials Committee. A motion was made, seconded and carried to receive the nomination for the representative to the Alabama Children's Home.

National Convention Delegates & Alternates

A motion was made, seconded and carried to seat the following delegates and alternate delegates to the 2005 FWB National Convention, to be held in Louisville, Kentucky: Kristen Crabtree, Lynda Blanchard, Ann Lewis, Edwina Drinkwater, Kim Dowless, Arlene Smith (Alt.), Susie Mounts (Alt.), Geraldine Waid (Alt.), Debra Van Pelt (Alt.), Terra Smith (Alt.).

Announcements were made and the business session recessed for the afternoon.

FRIDAY EVENING WORSHIP SESSION

"The Colquitt Trio", consisting of Roger Mercer, Jeff Braswell and Buddy Johnson, ministered to the congregation in song as a prelude to the evening worship session.

The session began at 7:00 pm with Rev. William Smith presiding and Rev. Donnie Burke directing the music. Bro. Donnie led the congregation in singing "Forever" and "God of Wonders", Bro. William welcomed everyone to the 3rd "Georgia Praise Gathering" and the session enjoyed a few moments of fellowship while the instrumentalists played. (Roger Mercer, Tim Horne, Todd Horne, and Ben Crabtree made up the band, and Monty McKenzie ran the sound equipment.)

The evening was filled with Spirit-filled singing and praise and worship. The choir began the evening with "Jesus is the Sweetest Name I Know", and accompanied soloist Wendy Horne in "O For A Thousand Tongues to Sing". The "Older Georgia Boys Quartet", consisting of Len Blanchard, Mark Kennedy, Russell Horne, and Wayne Miracle, sang "Peace in the Valley". Executive Secretary/Treasurer Report March 2004 – March 2005

Welcome to the Sixty-ninth annual session of the Georgia Free Will Baptists, Inc. We have gathered to conduct our state association business and receive reports from all of our state boards and national agencies. God richly blessed our state during 2004. We gather to rejoice as we look at the past and to be challenged as we look toward the future.

This digest contains reports from all the Georgia State Boards. The board reports cover the period of March 2004 – March 2005. All financial reports cover the period of January 1, 2004 – December 31, 2004.

Thank you for your faithful support during 2004. Receipts through the State Office totaled \$872,116.14. Of this amount \$285,861.05 was *Cooperative Receipts*, \$187,673.56 was *Georgia Acts 1:8 Receipts*, and \$398,581.53 was *Designated Receipts*. We had an increase of 14.47% in *Cooperative Receipts*, 14.58% in *Georgia Acts 1:8 Receipts*, and 1.58% increase in *Total Giving*. Thank you for making 2004 a record year in giving to the *Cooperative Plan and the Georgia State Acts 1:8 Plan*.

Giving to the total program has always been the philosophy for Georgia Free Will Baptists. Giving to the National Association ministries totaled \$597,366.20 in 2004. This is an increase of 16.24%. Please note that we had an increase of \$92,343.65 or 33.62% to International Missions. I continue to rejoice when I see the generosity of Georgia Free Will Baptists. However I realize this is the nature of Georgia Free Will Baptists. Since September 2001 there has been a decrease in giving to churches and charity in our nation. It does not surprise me that there has not been a decrease in our Georgia giving.

Continue to pray for our missionaries. Debbie Griffin will return to Japan in April. Joni Thomas will return to the United States in May. Nathan and Linda Snow and Dale and Sandra Bishop are doing well. I am glad to report the work in Japan has seen several saved this past year. Billy and Shara Bevan finished their work with the State Mission Board December 31, 2004. Continue to pray for the work in Kingsland. Ron and Janice Wallace moved into a new building in Fairbanks, Alaska. The dedication service was held Sunday May 23, 2004. The State Mission Board has hired Bill and Ann Lewis to plant a church in Valdosta and Bill and Loraine Crank to plant a church in Bartow County. We are thankful for all of our missionaries and the work they are doing to further the Kingdom of Christ.

Georgia State Budget Proposed

A 2006 calendar year budget of \$800,000.00 is proposed. A 2006 Georgia State *Cooperative Budget* of \$290,000 and a 2005 Acts 1:8 Budget of \$218,565.37 is included in the overall budget. You will find the proposed 2006 *Cooperative Budget* included with this report on page 6 for your approval.

State Office Building Purchase

The State Office Building located in Colquitt, Georgia, has been purchased and is now the property of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.

GAFWB Website

The State Association website is up and can be viewed at: www.gafwb.org. A new computer was purchased so that the website may be hosted separately from the computer which handles the financial records of the Georgia State Association.

Other Property Acquisitions

The Articles of Incorporation of the Athens Free Will Baptist Church, Inc., and the First Free Will Baptist Church of Valdosta, Inc., have been turned over to the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. The officers of the State Association are now listed as the officers of these two ministries; and, as such, the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. now holds title to the properties represented. Approximately \$39,000.00 of indebtedness on the Valdosta property was paid off, and the current estimated value of the property is \$400,000.00.

Acts 1:8 Changes

A qualified and eligible Georgia missionary was defined as one who meets a minimum of two of the following requirements: 1) a native of Georgia Free Will Baptists; 2) an individual with strong Free Will Baptist ties, such as children of Georgia missionaries; 3) a pastor or full-time Christian worker who has ministered in the state for 5 or more years; and, 4) the individual must be serving under the International Mission Board of the National Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc., the Home Mission Board of the National Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc., or the Georgia State Mission Board. (*Special circumstances will be considered on a case-by-case basis.*)

Georgia Mission's Offering

The first Sunday in March has been designated as the "**Damon C. Dodd Georgia State Mission's Offering Day**". Special offerings received on this day will be applied to existing and future church planting efforts in Georgia.

Pastor Appreciation Day

Adopted the following statement to be published in the Promotional Bulletin encouraging Georgia churches to recognize and show appreciation for their pastors: "*We the Executive Board strongly recommend that each church give their Pastor and staff a substantial Pastor's Appreciation Gift and a Christmas Bonus each year.*"

2007 State Meeting Site

The Board proposes that the 2007 Georgia State Meeting be held at the Calvary Free Will Baptist Church in Columbus, Georgia on March 15-17, 2007.

State Office Personnel Evaluation

Granted a \$2500.00 annual increase in the salary of Executive Secretary/Treasurer William Smith, and a Christmas bonus of \$750.00. Also gave a \$750.00 "*pastor appreciation*" gift in September, in recognition of his encouragement and support of Georgia pastors.

Increased the salary of State Office Secretary Rhonda Chandler from \$9.50 per hour to \$10.00 per hour.

**Board Of Trustees Report
March 2003 – March 2004**

The Georgia State Board of Trustees is the general overseer and insurer of all State Association property. The Board has the sole responsibility of upkeep of the State Office building and grounds.

Last year the State Association voted to purchase the office building that was being rented in Colquitt. This transaction was completed on April 30, 2004. The total cost for the building and legal fees were \$61,157.72. The property is completely paid for and deeded to the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.

A letters was sent to all churches and individuals asking what they wanted done with their contribution that was given to the Cordele project. In response a total of \$21,955.35 was refunded and a total of \$14,680.50 was transferred to other ministries. A list of the transferred money can be found on page 31.

The property in Cordele has been placed on the market to be sold. Interest has been shown, but at this time no offers have been put on the table.

Plans have been made to make improvements to the outside of the office building. The next project will be to relocate the archives to the Colquitt office.

Thank you for your prayers and support during the time decisions were being made on the location of the State Office building. The process took seven years and we are thankful for the unity that we have even though there was a wide variety of opinions of the direction we should go.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

GEORGIA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS, Inc.

PREAMBLE

We, the Free Will Baptist of the State of Georgia, do ordain this Constitution for the purpose of advocating, promoting and increasing all phases of the cause of Christ.

ARTICLE I

This assembly shall be known as the ***Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.***

Article II

SECTION 1. The officers of this association shall be Moderator, an Assistant Moderator, a Clerk, an Assistant Clerk, and an Executive Secretary/Treasurer.

SECTION 2. The Executive Board shall be composed of the regular officers; the chairman of each of the standing boards; and the previous moderator, as an ex officio member for a period of two years following his term of office; and the moderator of the District Associations not represented shall serve as members at large.

SECTION 3. This Association shall be composed of ordained Ministers, ordained Deacons, Missionaries, and Board Members who are members of affiliated bodies; one (1) delegate for every three hundred (300) members or fraction thereof from District Associations; one (1) delegate for every one hundred (100) members or fraction thereof from each local affiliated church.

SECTION 4. All delegates from District Associations and local churches shall be elected from the laity of the body sending them.

SECTION 5. Funds to meet current needs of this body shall be paid to the treasurer of this association. Each District Association will give a minimum of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per delegate authorized, and each local church will give twenty-five (\$25.00) per delegate.

SECTION 6. In order to pay our Georgia State Association's annual representation fee to the National Association, each local association is to be responsible to promote, receive and forward the amount designated by the National Association per church per year to the State Office, along with their annual State Association representation fee, on or before our annual State Association session.

ARTICLE III

SECTION 1. It shall be the privilege of each affiliated District Association to recommend a member for each standing board. Terms of office on these boards shall be on a rotating basis which will necessitate the election by the State Association of five (5) members every two (2) years, thus giving each member a four (4) year term of office.

SECTION 2. There shall be a **Board of Missions** composed of members who are noted for their missionary zeal.

A. The Board of Missions shall employ missionaries as needed to establish Free Will Baptist mission/churches in the State of Georgia. These missionaries may be employed exclusively or jointly with other Free Will Baptist agencies.

B. A mission/church sponsored by the Georgia State Association and their missionaries are under the authority of the State Association and the supervision of the Georgia State Board of Missions.

C. A mission/church does not have autonomous church status. As long as the mission/church is unable to provide for its own business, it is in a dependent relationship to the State Association and its Board of Missions.

D. When the mission/church is self-sustaining, self-governing, self-discipline, and self-propagating. It should be organized into an autonomous Free Will Baptist Church following the procedures adopted by the Georgia State Association.

E. After proper procedures are satisfied and the church is duly organized into autonomous Free Will Baptist church it shall have all normal rights, privileges, and responsibilities of any other Free Will Baptist Church.

SECTION 3. There shall be a **Board of Camping** whose duties shall be to schedule and arrange all camp sessions, and to appoint the Camp Director each year.

SECTION 4. There shall be a **Board of Christian Education** whose duties shall be:

A. To provide educational services for the members of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists.

B. To set policy and supervise the functions of the State Youth Committee. This Board shall appoint this Committee to carry out Board policy.

C. To organize sponsor and promote educational and inspirational retreats for our members.

D. To organize, sponsor and promote Sunday School and Church Training seminars.

E. To set policy and supervise the Historical Committee. This Board shall appoint the Historical Committee to gather and set forth for public knowledge and posterity the history of Georgia Free Will Baptists.

SECTION 5. There shall be a **Board of Trustees** whose duties shall be; maintenance, upkeep and insuring of all State Association properties; the planning and supervision of all future developments and expansion of these properties as directed by the State Association except otherwise provided in this Constitution.

SECTION 6. There shall be a **Credentials Committee**, which shall consist of three (3) members of three-year terms. And the term of one expiring each year thereafter according to seniority of service, who shall be in charge of the registration and examination of delegates and the receiving of all dues.

SECTION 7. There shall be two members on the Board of Trustees of the Free Will Baptist Children's Home, Eldridge, Alabama, elected for terms of four (4) years. Election will take place on odd years and shall be staggered.

SECTION 8. There shall be a **Georgia State Master's Men**. They shall select their own officers and conduct their own business.

SECTION 9. There shall be a **Georgia State Woman's Auxiliary Convention (GWAC)**. They shall elect their officers, conduct their business and maintain their treasury.

ARTICLE IV

SECTION 1. All officers except board members and the Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be elected to serve a term of two (2) years. The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be employed by the Executive Board of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, subject to the ratification of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists at its next regular session, for an indefinite period, with an agreement of sixty (60) day notice of termination by either the Executive Secretary/Treasurer or the Executive Board.

SECTION 2. Standing Boards of the State Association have no power of final authority to hire, full-time employees until the matter has been presented to and acted on by the State Association in session except where otherwise provided.

SECTION 3. The Executive Board may fill vacancies on any of the boards or committees, which occur between regular sessions of this State Association, until the convening of the annual session of said association.

SECTION 4. Election of all General Officers shall take place on the odd years of the calendar.

SECTION 5. If a member of any board fails in the function of his or her duty without good and sufficient reasons, the board of which the delinquent is a member may declare that particular office vacant. Further, this body shall have and does reserve the right to deal with the officer or board member who does not conduct his or her office in a Christian, business like manner according to the rules of Christian conduct as set forth in the New Testament.

Any standing board of this State Association may appoint proxies to serve in lieu of the absent members.

At the pleasure of the boards, and subsequent to the meeting from which the regular member is absent, the boards have the right to deal with the delinquent member in the manner stated in this section.

SECTION 6. The Chairman or Vice-Chairman of said board, or by the Moderator or Assistant Moderator of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, upon the request of the majority of the members of said boards, may call boards into session.

SECTION 7. An auditing Committee shall consist of three (3) members elected for three (3) three year terms.

AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be changed, altered, or amended by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all delegates present and voting at any regular session of the State Association. Prior to a final vote on any amendment, change or alteration, said amendment, change or alteration shall be submitted in writing to the Clerk of this association and shall lie on the table from one (1) business meeting to the next during the same session, during which time it shall be read at least two (2) times in open session. Officers, standing boards, and/or standing committees may be added or deleted as the need arises.

BY-LAWS

SECTION 1:

A. All real property, checking and savings account or any other assets of this Association shall be in the name of the *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*

B. One or more of the corporate officers of the Association shall be the legal signers of all Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. business. These officers are: the Moderator as the corporate President; the Clerk as the corporate Vice-President; and the Executive Secretary/Treasurer as the Secretary/Treasurer.

C. The State Office shall be responsible for the safekeeping of the corporate seal and all official documents of the State Association.

D. No State Board may borrow money or financially obligated the State Association without the approval of the Executive Board.

E. The fixed assets (building, land) of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists shall not be liquidated except by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the delegates present and voting at any regular session of the Association.

The Executive Board shall have the authority to approve the sale of properties donated to any Board of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc., upon recommendation of the Board to which the donation was made, with proceeds remaining under the authority of the recommending Board."

F. The records of all financial transaction shall be open to all members of the Georgia State Association. The financial transactions of the State Office and State Boards shall be audited annually.

G. Annual financial reports of the State Office and State Boards and the auditor's report shall be made to the State Association in session and be entered in the Annual State Minutes.

H. The State Treasurer shall be bonded in amount stipulated by the State Executive Board.

I. This Association shall meet for its regular session annually on Thursday following the second Sunday in March and shall adjourn on the Saturday immediately following.

SECTION 2.

A. When the State Association is not in session, the State Executive Board shall be duly authorized to do business in the name of the State Association.

B. The State Association has full authority to direct the State Executive Board in all business conducted on its behalf.

C. The State Executive Board shall report to the State Association in session concerning the business conducted for the State Association since its last convening.

D. The State Executive Board has the prerogative of deferring any matter to the State Association as a whole but is not under obligation to do so.

E. The State Executive Board shall meet quarterly in the following months: March, June, September, and December. The March meeting shall be held just prior to the regular meeting of the State Association.

F. Any and all correspondence from any member of this State Association, (includes either individual, group, Board or District Association) directed to any Board, or Chairman of said Board, or any officer of this State Association, or any open letters to any or all District Associations of this State, that pertains to any business which is desired or required to be brought before this body at any scheduled or special called meeting, shall be properly sent directly to the Clerk of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists. The clerk will be responsible for routing the correspondence to its proper designation. All correspondence as mentioned above, shall be required to be received by the Clerk of the State Association at least 30 days prior to any scheduled State Association Meeting if said correspondence contains business that is to be introduced and discussed at said meeting.

SECTION 3.

A. The moderator shall preside at the Annual Session of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists and the meetings of the Executive Board. The Moderator shall be the President of the Corporation known as the *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*

B. The Assistant Moderator shall preside in the absence of the Moderator and/or when appointed by the Moderator as the need arises.

C. The Clerk shall keep records of the proceedings of the Annual Associational meeting and of the Executive Board meetings. It shall also be his responsibility to have the minutes of these sessions printed and distributed. The Clerk shall be the Vice-President of the Corporation known as *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*

D. The Assistant Clerk in the absence of the Clerk, shall fulfill the functions and duties of the Clerk as stated in paragraph C of this document.

SECTION 4.

A. The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be responsible and accountable to the Executive Board in the fulfillment of the duties of his office as determined by the Executive Board.

B. The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be allowed four (4) weeks vacation per year with pay.

C. Funds received by the Executive Secretary/Treasurer for revivals, special speaking engagements and promotional meetings shall go into the Cooperative Fund. The exception to this regulation relates to remuneration received by the Executive Secretary during his four (4) weeks vacation, which shall be his personally and need not be accounted for to this State Association.

D. Salary, mileage and operational expenses of the Executive Secretary/ Treasurer shall be determined by the Executive Board.

E. The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be the Secretary/Treasurer of the Corporation known as the *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*

F. General Promotion. He is to represent, or cause to be represented, the association at all affairs of interest to the association and he is to promote the work of the association in such a manner so as to unify the association as well as promote both the state and national works, missionaries, mission conferences, etc. Through personal communication he shall keep close contact with pastors, churches, and district association.

G. Administration. He shall administer the affairs of the executive office and carry out the responsibilities delegated to him by the State Association and the Executive Board. He is to serve with all standing boards and committees of the association in an ex-official capacity. He is to report to the association during each annual session.

H. Stewardship. He shall serve as treasurer of this association. An accurate and complete record of all funds received and disbursed shall be kept and a written report shall be included in his report to this association in its annual session. He shall receive, hold and disburse money as is made available by the State Association to the various boards. Disbursements to the various boards will be made available when requested.

I. Publication. It shall be his duty to edit and publish the state paper. He shall direct the production of general promotional materials, pamphlets, audiovisuals, and books as approved by the Executive Board.

J. Arranging State Association. He shall expedite the planning of the State Association program, enroll all ministers and delegates, print and distribute minutes, and investigate future sites for the annual session.

SECTION 5.

A. The Executive Board shall serve as the Placement Committee for the State Association. In this capacity the board shall investigate places suitable for this meeting and make recommendations to said State Association. Meeting places shall be determined two (2) years in advance.

B. The Executive Board shall plan the program for the annual meetings of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists and the annual meetings shall follow the programs as closely as possible. Business sessions shall be conducted according to the commonly accepted rules of Parliamentary Procedure.

C. The Executive Board shall formulate the budget for the State Association annually and recommend to the body in the session the allocations to be observed in the Cooperative Plan for Giving. This board shall, in addition to the above stated duties, also recommend a mileage rate for travel by the members of all standing boards in said association.

SECTION 6.

The Moderator shall appoint necessary committees unless otherwise provided for by the body.

SECTION 7.

These By-Laws may be altered, changed, or amended at any regular session of this association by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of delegates present and voting

Georgia Women Active for Christ State Meeting
March 8, 2005
Shallowford Free Will Baptist Church, Marietta, Georgia

Susie Mounts welcomed everyone and opened the 2005 Session in prayer. Rachel Horne led the congregation in "Thou Art Worthy" and "Until Then", accompanied by Rhoda Creech on the piano. Terra Smith remembered several Georgia ladies, Bernice Rodenberry, Tessie Knowles, Celeste Dinkins, Nell Altman, Mary Lou Dixon and Lenora Johnson from South Georgia, Nettie Lou Jernigan, who is WAC President Debe Taylor's mother, and also Dr. LaVerne Miley, who have gone to be with the Lord. Rachel Horne said a prayer of thanksgiving and remembrance for each one.

President Debra Van Pelt then called the 2005 session to order. She welcomed Debbie Griffin, missionary to Japan, Janice Wallace, home missionary to Alaska, Lorraine Crank, home missionary in Cartersville, and Gloria Byers, home missionary in Ohio.

Donna Jewell gave the credentials report as reported to her by each local and/or district prior to the State Meeting: 7 out of 10 districts reporting, 32 local churches and 406 members, with 41 delegates.

The district, local and standing delegates stood; MSC to seat the voting delegates.

Secretary Donna Jewell read the minutes from the 2004 Session; MSC to approve as read.

Christine Daniel reported that after all expenditures during 2004, the balance in the treasury is \$4,800.59. MSC to accept report.

Marie Glover read the Resolutions and MSC to approve item by item.

1. "Whereas, 2001 brought a change in the date our annual reports were due to the State. Our ladies have endeavored to follow the change; however, change sometimes brings adjustments and our dates of reporting need to be adjusted so that our GWAC work can be recorded by the WNAC in the year it is accomplished. WNAC closes its books on December 31 of each calendar year. Any reports sent to WNAC after that date is recorded in the year it is received; therefore, the GWAC records do not match the WNAC records. BE IT RESOLVED that in order for the GWAC reports to be in-sync with the WNAC records, we ask that each Local Treasurer send he monthly report to the District Treasurer as soon as possible, and that each District Treasurer compile these reports and send her monthly report as soon as possible to the State Treasurer. We ask that each Annual Report be sent to the State Treasurer and State Secretary in November or early December. This will enable the report to reach the WNAC office before the end of the current year. (This should not have any effect on when each district has their annual meeting.)" After much discussion on this resolution, MSC for the Executive Board to take up this issue at its next meeting and report the results in the State Promotional Bulletin later this year.

2. "Whereas, the women of the Shallowford Free Will Baptist Church of Marietta have hosted the state convention of the GWAC; BE IT RESOLVED, that the body give them a rising vote of thanks for their gracious hospitality." MSC by everyone standing.

There was some discussion about changing the GWAC State meeting date as we have always met with the men at the State Convention, and it was suggested that we look for another time such as the retreat. President Debra encouraged everyone to think and pray about it and the Executive Committee will discuss at its next meeting.

Christine Daniel gave the finance committee report. Beginning balance \$4,800.59; honorarium to our speaker, Debbie Griffin, of \$550.00, leaving a balance of \$4,250.59. She

also reported that GWAC exceeded its goal of \$7,500.00 for the Acts 1:8 State project, which will remain at \$7,500 for the coming year; we currently have 406 members; therefore, in order to meet our goal, each member's share is \$18.50. MSC to accept report.

Susie Mounts gave the registration report: 9 districts represented; 15 district delegates; 9 local delegates; 7 officers, for a total of 31 delegates; 24 visitors, 3 missionaries, total of 58 registered. MSC to accept report.

Debbie Griffin shared a report regarding the Branson retreat. There were 650 in attendance. Pursuing His Heart was the theme. The entire program was conducted by missionaries. Nora McCarty gave a report on the National WAC Meeting and Banquet. Theme was Great Expectations. Ruth McDonald from Japan was the speaker. Nora also gave a report from Family Ministries Hope Center and gave information about the different arms of the center. Sherrie Bailey gave the Ridgecrest report. Everyone was moved by speaker Carol Kent's story of how her family dealt with unspeakable tragedy by trusting solely in God.

President Debra gave a synopsis of the National WAC Report which was distributed before the meeting. Theme for 2005 is Let us Pursue (Hosea 6:3). Georgia women are 5th in giving.

Janice Wallace gave a report on the Northern Lights Church in Fairbanks, Alaska. She encouraged anyone who can to come and visit. The church is growing and their new building is 95% complete, hopefully to be completed by homecoming this year.

The 2006 Budget was discussed and MSC to approve.

Lynda Blanchard gave the nominating committee report for the slate of officers for the next two-year term, ending March 2007, as follows: President: Debra Van Pelt; Vice President: Sandra Jackson; Secretary: Donna Jewell; Treasurer: Lynda Blanchard; Field Worker: Terra Smith; Historian: Henrietta Brown; Members at Large: Susie Mounts, Latrelle McDowell and Teresa Womack. MSC to accept each officer as nominated. President Debra thanked the outgoing officers for their hard work and dedication to GWAC, and she presented each with a gift.

Doris Grant installed the new officers and said a prayer of encouragement, not only for the new officers, but for all ladies who were present.

Before the business session was adjourned, Donna Jewell read the minutes of the current session.

MSC to dismiss the business session and Janice Temples dismissed in prayer.

The men joined in for the worship service and Kristen Crabtree sang "Any Road at Any Cost". We were then privileged to hear Debbie Griffin pour her heart out as she spoke about Pursuing Intimacy With God. Many wept as Debbie shared her heart and encouraged us to tear down whatever wall may be preventing us from having true worship with God. Debbie will be returning to Japan on April 7.

GEORGIA WOMEN ACTIVE FOR CHRIST
Of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.
Constitution and By-Laws

Article I

Name

This organization shall be known as Georgia Women Active for Christ a division of the Georgia Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc., commonly known by its initials, GWAC. Its members shall elect officers, conduct business and maintain a treasury.

Article II

Purpose

The purpose of this organization shall be to assist the various women composing the GWAC in providing opportunities to understand and fulfill the Great Commission through their responsibilities in the family, church, community, and around the world.

It shall bring the women of each district together for fellowship, sharing information, encouraging one another in the work of the Lord and furthering the purpose and goals of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists.

Article III

Officers

1. The officers of this convention shall be president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, field worker, historian, and three members at large, all of which are elected by the convention. These officers shall serve as the State Executive Board. A minimum of five officers shall be a quorum for transacting business.

2. Any officer or elected board member of this convention must be an active member of a local Free Will Baptist Church and an active member of the GWAC group of a local church.

3. Executive Board members are required to attend all scheduled board meetings. Any officer missing three meetings is subject to review and removal by the Executive Board.

Article IV

Membership

1. This convention shall be composed of: the officers of the convention, district presidents, district field workers, ten delegates (duly accredited by the credentials committee) from each district convention, four delegates and the president from each local GWAC in good standing with its district convention.

2. Local groups in an area where there is no district convention may be represented with five delegates by payment of their membership dues. All delegates, as well as officers of the convention, shall be in good standing with a church that is in good standing with the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, and shall perform the duties as set forth for them in the present WNAC manual and this Constitution and By-Laws.

Article V

Meetings

1. The annual meeting shall be held each year the day before the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists convention in the same place or at such a time and place determined at the previous annual meeting or by the Executive Board.

2. A prayer retreat shall be held annually, time and place to be planned by the Executive Board.

Article VI

Amendments

This Constitution may be amended at any annual meeting of the convention by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

By-Laws

Article I

Duties of Officers

President – The president shall preside over all meetings, appoint such committees as may be needed; call the Executive Board together when necessary; be ex-officio member of all committees, except the nominating committee; see that reports are sent promptly to the WNAC secretary; and perform all duties pertaining to such an office. She should see that GWAC is represented in the State Promotional Bulletin. Articles should be sent to the state executive office by the 1st of each month. She may either write the articles or ask someone to write the articles for her.

Vice President – The vice president shall preside in the absence of the president or by her request and otherwise assist her in the oversight of the work in general. She shall serve as chairman of the credentials committee.

Secretary – The secretary shall keep an accurate record of all proceedings of the convention and Executive Board meetings; preserve all valuable papers and turn same over to her successor; make an annual report to the WNAC secretary on a form available from the WNAC office within 15 days after the State GWAC Convention; compile the districts' slate of officers and addresses immediately after the convention; send a slate of state officers to the WNAC secretary and to each state officer. She is responsible for getting the minutes prepared and to the state associational office in time to be included in the state minutes each year.

Treasurer – The treasurer shall have charge of all funds belonging to this convention and shall pay out same only when authorized by the convention. The treasurer shall keep an accurate account, and give a written report of all funds received and disbursed at each annual meeting of the convention. She is required to deposit all checks in her possession and disburse all designated funds by the 30th of each month. She shall be bonded through the state office and audited annually.

Field Worker – The field worker shall promote GWAC programs through personal contact and the distribution of literature and serve where needed as directed by the Executive Board.

Historian – The historian shall keep a historical record and have a display at all state meetings and serve where needed as directed by the Executive Board.

Members at Large – The members at large shall help promote the work in general, meet with the Executive Board, and serve where needed as directed by the Executive Board.

Article II

Elections

A nominating committee shall nominate the general officers and members at large. Following the nominating committee's report, opportunity shall be given for nominations from the floor. In case of more than one nominee for any particular office, a vote will be taken for each; otherwise they may be elected by acclamation. The officers shall be elected every two years on odd number years. Not more than one-half of the elected officers shall be changed in any regular election. All elections shall be held at the closing sessions of the annual convention.

Article III

Expenses

Estimated expenses for the state work shall be set by an annual budget approved by the convention. The Executive Board must approve all reimbursement.

Article IV

Boards and Committees

Executive Board – This Board shall be composed of six officers and three members at large elected by the convention. Five of these shall compose a quorum. They shall hold meetings for the transaction of business as often as necessary. It shall be the duty of the Executive Board to maintain an oversight of the work at large. The Board shall act for the convention when necessary. It shall prepare the program for the regular meetings and fill any vacancy between elections.

Resolutions Committee – A resolutions committee shall be appointed by the president. A member of the Executive Board shall chair this committee. This committee shall review all resolutions presented, having the prerogative of passing on to the convention those resolutions that are deemed proper and profitable. Resolutions should be properly worded, i.e. "Be it Resolved...."

Nominating Committee – The nominating committee shall be composed of one member from each district convention and shall be elected one year prior to making their report. The names of the members from each district shall be submitted with the convention annual report. The president shall appoint a chairperson from the members of the nominating committee.

Credentials Committee – The vice president shall be the chairman of the credentials committee and the president shall appoint two other members. This committee shall examine the reports of the represented women's groups to see if fees are paid and if reports are in order.

Finance Committee – The treasurer shall be chairman of the finance committee and the president may appoint four other members. This committee reviews the financial records for the year, reports on same to the convention, and makes recommendations of disbursements of funds to the convention.

Registration Committee – The president shall appoint members as needed to serve on this committee. This committee registers those in attendance and gives a report to the convention.

Article V

Dues and Reports

Active members shall pay dues yearly as required by the GWAC Convention for membership. These dues should come through the district treasurers by January 10th following the close of the previous year. District secretaries and treasurers annual reports should be filed with the state secretary and treasurer no later than February 1 following the close of the previous year. Beginning 2002 the dues are \$12.50 per member with Georgia retaining \$2.50 per member and WNAC receiving dues of \$10.00 per member.

Article VI

Gifts

Season of Prayer Offerings-

1. Pre-Easter Week of Prayer offering is used for Foreign Missions in memory of Laura Bell Barnard, our first foreign missionary.

2. Pre-Thanksgiving Week of Prayer offering is used for National Home Missions in memory of Mrs. Lizzie McAdams, a great writer of our literature and one of the first National officers.

3. The December Week of Prayer offering is used for State Missions in memory of Mrs. Alice E. Lupton, our first National president.

Co-Laborer Offering – A financial plan of support for WNAC. Each local GWAC is encouraged to support the WNAC office with a monthly offering.

Provision Closet - This project helps missionaries as they return home to pick up household items, etc., from the closet at the National Office. Each local GWAC is encouraged to keep abreast of the items and supplies needed as they are periodically listed in the **Co-Laborer** magazine, and give to this project as needed.

WNAC Emphasis – A special offering to supplement the Co-Laborer Offerings for WNAC expenses of operation, literature, etc. This offering is received during August.

Remembrance Fund – This is a fund established by WNAC and a distinct way to honor any occasion the donor wishes to note: Anniversaries, birthdays, or as a memorial gift at the time of death. A remembrance card notifying the family of the person being honored, and the donor, will be entered in the permanent Book of Remembrances in the WNAC office. These gifts will be used to advance the kingdom of God through WNAC. A Remembrance Service is to be conducted at our state GWAC convention each year.

Dr. Mary Ruth Wisheart Foreign Student Scholarship Fund – Any GWAC group who wishes may contribute to this special fund set up by WNAC to train Nationals from our foreign fields. February is designated as Foreign Student month.

Dot Harvey Loan Fund – This revolving loan fund was established in honor of Miss Dot Harvey, a forerunner of youth work in Georgia, by the Georgia Women's Auxiliary Convention in 1954 to aid worthy Georgia students attending Free Will Baptist Bible College. Each local group is asked to donate monthly toward this project. A special offering is received in September to add to this fund.

Westfield Church Fund – This fund is used to assist the church in Kotogiri, South India in memory of Miss Laura Bell Barnard. All groups are encouraged to give to this Georgia project monthly.

Other Gifts – The state GWAC may decide on and promote other projects for funds at its own discretion.

Lora Shutes Mission Project – This is a statewide project with the goal set each year at the annual convention. Funds are disbursed to missionaries through the State Acts 1:8 Program.

GWAC Emphasis – June is designated as GWAC Emphasis Month. Each group is asked to receive a special offering to supplement GWAC operational expenses.
