## **Proceedings of the 70<sup>th</sup> Annual Session of the GAFWB**

The minutes of the Seventieth Annual Session of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, convened at the Calvary Free Will Baptist Church in Columbus, Georgia, on March 16 –18, 2006.

### **WEDNESDAY EVENING WORSHIP SERVICE**

The evening began with a prelude of special music from the Calvary Quartet and a welcome by the host church pastor, Rev. Russell Horne. The congregation and choir then joined together in a time of heart-moving praise and worship celebrating the greatness of God and the power of Jesus' blood. After Rev. Russell Horne introduced the speaker, the Calvary Quartet sang a special selection entitled, "I'm Free". (The Calvary Women Active for Christ also made a special gift presentation to our home missionaries from Alaska, Rev. Ron and Sis. Jan Wallace.)

Rev. Rick Wilson, the pastor of the Lyons FWB Church, brought the evening message and took his text from Amos 8:11-13, concerning America's "Famine of Hearing the Word of God". The Association was challenged to stay true to the preaching, hearing and heeding of God's holy, infallible, inerrant, and inspired Word.

"In My Life, Lord, Be Glorified" was the invitational hymn, as an opportunity to respond to the preached Word was offered.

Following a few brief announcements, the Rev. Len Blanchard dismissed in prayer.

### **THURSDAY MORNING BIBLE CONFERENCE**

Rev. Danny Ryals presided over the Thursday morning Bible Conference. Rev. Paul Creech led the music for the first session and Rev. Arthur Smith and his son Junior sang a special entitled, "Living By Faith". (Because of his failing health, fellow ministers had a special time of prayer for Bro. Arthur.)

Dr. Bill Lewis, church-planter and pastor of the Open Door Fellowship FWB Church in Valdosta, Georgia, brought the first message for the Bible Conference. Dr. Lewis took his text from Luke 15 on the subject, "What Will You Do With The Sinner?"

Bro. Monty McKenzie led the music for the second session and Rev. Ben Crabtree sang a special entitled, "Three Wooden Crosses".

Dr. Bill Crank, church-planter and pastor of the Cartersville Family Church FWB Church, in Cartersville, Georgia, brought the second message for the Bible Conference. Dr. Crank took his text from Proverbs 4:23-27 on the subject, "Guarding Our Heart."

The Bible Conference concluded with a time of prayer for our two Georgia church-planters, Dr. Bill Lewis and Dr. Bill Crank, and their respective ministries.

### **THURSDAY EVENING BUSINESS & WORSHIP SESSION**

The evening session began with a prelude of special music by the "Georgia Boys", a group of GAFWB ministers (youth, music and pastoral) consisting of Mark Walker, Roger Mercer, Donnie Burke, Tim Horne and Todd Horne, with Ben Crabtree providing musical accompaniment on the piano and guitar.

Led by Donnie Burke, the congregation sang together the "Doxology" and "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name". Rev. Russell Horne welcomed everyone to the 70<sup>th</sup> Annual Session of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists and to the Calvary FWB Church. Bro. James Tidwell opened the meeting in prayer, Bro. Buddy Johnson sang the National Anthem and the session recited pledges to the American flag, Christian flag, and to the Bible.

### **Call to Session & Preliminaries**

Clerk Keith Lloyd officially called the Seventieth Annual Session of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists to order and introduced the Moderator, Rev. Len Blanchard. The Moderator welcomed everyone, called the Roll of District Associations, and

then appointed the Committee on Committees as follows: Chairman Jeff Goodman, Keith Horn, Grover Jewell, Barry Long and Herbert Waid.

### **Evening Worship**

Donnie Burke led the congregation in a worship song entitled, "The Wonderful Cross". Rev. Russell Horne introduced the evening speaker, Rev. Reuben Cason, pastor of the Ebenezer FWB Church in Glenville, Georgia. Just before the evening message, the "Horne Family Trio" (Rachel, Tim and Todd) ministered to the Association with a special music selection called, "Inside the Gate".

Rev. Cason, using 1 Samuel 16:1-13 as his text, brought a message titled, "Don't Sit Down Until the King Comes". The sermon was a challenge to all, but especially the ministers, that we must finish the race of faith and ministry well, never giving up or giving in to discouragement and trials. As the congregation sang "I Have Decided to Follow Jesus", an opportunity to respond to the Word was offered and many came forward to an altar of prayer.

Announcements were made and Rev. Danny Ryals dismissed the session in prayer.

### **FRIDAY MORNING BUSINESS SESSION**

Rev. Tim Horne led the congregation in singing "This Is The Day". Moderator Len Blanchard began the session with a Scripture reading from Proverbs 25:11-15 and a brief devotion on the subject of "When We Communicate". Rev. Parnell Aldridge opened the session in prayer.

The Moderator recognized the Standing Delegates, asking each to stand and introduce themselves to the Association.

### **Partial Credentials Committee Report**

Rev. Bobby Taylor gave a partial report of Credentials Committee. He reported a voting delegation of 76 with 107 total registrations.

After brief opening remarks by the Moderator, a motion was made, seconded, and carried to seat all elected delegates. The Moderator then recognized the national messengers and other visitors.

### **Executive Board Report**

Clerk Keith Lloyd gave a report of the Executive Board. A motion was made to receive the report as read, acting on the Budget approval separately. The motion was seconded and carried.

A motion was made to accept a 2007 calendar year budget of \$800,000.00. Included in this budget is a Coop Budget of \$315,000.00. The motion was seconded and carried.

(Following the Executive Board report, the Association stood together and Rev. Fred Hersey led in prayer for Rev. Arthur Smith who had been hospitalized.)

### **Executive Secretary / Treasurer Report**

Executive Secretary/Treasurer William Smith gave the Executive Office report and began by thanking Rev. Herbert and Sis. Geraldine Waid for the accounting procedures

they implemented at the State Office during their tenure as Promotional Director / Executive Secretary. The Association also thanked them with a round of applause.

Receipts in 2005 exceeded all budget requirements, with an overall increase of 6.02% in Total Giving. Georgia Free Will Baptists continue to be generous in their giving as reflected in the almost \$1.5 million given through the State Office in 2005, including over \$50,000.00 given to hurricane Katrina relief efforts in Mississippi.

Endowments, Trust Funds and Annuities continue to grow, again reflecting the generous nature of Georgia Free Will Baptists to the work of Christ's Kingdom.

The retreat and camping programs in Georgia are increasing in attendance each year, in many cases outgrowing the facilities in which they have been traditionally held.

The population of Georgia is growing at a rapid pace, with projections of a 10% increase by the year 2010, and the potential of doubling in the next 20 years. Many factors are fueling this increase, including industrial, corporate, and military related growth. Georgia Free Will Baptists are ready to take advantage of the opportunity that presents itself with the influx of new people coming into our state.

Brother William closed with the exhortation, "To whom much is given, much will be required", and challenged Georgia FWB to continue to rise to the opportunity and responsibility that God has placed before us.

A motion was made, seconded and carried to receive his report.

Brother William and Rev. Bill Evans, of the Free Will Baptist Foundation, made a special presentation to Danny and Faye Dinkins for their generous endowment gift to State and National Free Will Baptist ministries. Their gift was the largest ever given to the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. Brother Danny and Sister Faye are members of the Philadelphia FWB Church, Folkston, Georgia, in the South Georgia Association. Brother Danny serves as a Deacon, Church Treasurer and as an active member and speaker for Gideon's International. Sister Faye serves as a faithful helpmate to her husband in each of these capacities. The Association shared their gratitude for this generous gift with a standing ovation and round of applause.

### **GWAC & WNAC Reports**

Sis. Debra Van Pelt gave reports from the GWAC and WNAC. The complete written report is included in the Minutes of the GAFWB.

### **Board of Missions Report**

Rev. Billy Hanna gave the report for the Board of Missions. This report and the financial report are included in the Digest of Reports.

The Board's next targeted area to plant a church is in Harris County, and, as such, they are elated by the recent news that Kia, a major automobile manufacturer, plans to build a production facility there, bringing a surge in the population and economy that Georgia FWB are poised to take advantage of.

The Board would like to see the Damon C. Dodd Georgia Mission Offering grow to the point of supporting the salaries of our Georgia church-planters.

According to our reported 2005 statistics (if they are accurate), the number of FWB churches in Georgia has decreased by one, from 118 to 117, and membership and income within those churches remaining is also in decline. The Board believes and is committed to the vision that now is the time and we are people to do something positive for the growth of the Kingdom by planting new FWB churches in our growing state.

A motion was made to accept the report and adopt the budget. After comment and discussion, the motion was seconded and carried.

### **FRIDAY MORNING WORSHIP SESSION**

Following a brief recess, the session resumed with Rev. Ron Wallace presiding over the morning worship service. Rev. Tim Horne led the congregation in singing "Open the Eyes of My Heart" and "Open Our Eyes, Lord". Rev. Billy McKinney led in an opening prayer and Rev. Mark Kennedy ministered in song (also playing the piano) with a special entitled, "A Place Called Grace".

Rev. Wallace introduced our speaker, Rev. Willie Martin, pastor of the First FWB Church of Columbus. Rev. Martin brought a challenging message from 2<sup>nd</sup> Kings 4:25-31 entitled, "Failed Ministry". Using Elisha's servant Gehazi as an example of failure in ministry, Rev. Martin called upon pastors to be men who communicate well, whom people have confidence in, who have compassionate hearts, and who are competent to face the challenges of ministry.

After some brief announcements, the session recessed for lunch.

### **FRIDAY AFTERNOON BUSINESS SESSION**

The session resumed at 1:30 pm with Bro. Todd Horne leading the congregation in singing a rousing rendition of "By and By". Rev. Wayne Miracle read a selection of Scripture from Psalm 51:1-19 and led in an opening prayer.

Executive Secretary William Smith announced the availability of the reprinted New Church Members Handbook, written by Rev. Damon C. Dodd. The Moderator announced that the Historical Society will meet briefly following the afternoon session.

#### **Board of Trustees Report**

Rev. Russell Horne gave the Board of Trustees report. This report and the financial report are included in the Digest of Reports.

Outside renovations to the State Office Building in Colquitt have been completed and internal remodeling is under way, including the addition of a room that will provide storage for the State Archives.

The Zion FWB Church in Rowena and the Oak Grove FWB Church in Colquitt have recently turned their properties over to the Trustee Board. The sale of the facilities will help in the funding of future projects of the GAFWB.

The report was received as information.

#### **Board of Camping Report**

Rev. Paul Creech gave the Board of Camping report. This report and the financial report are included in the Digest of Reports.

Our camping program is so successful that other states are bringing their children to Georgia's Teen Camp. The theme for this year's camp is "C.S.I.: Discovering God: It Matters What You're Looking For". Teen Camp will be held again at Camp Echeconnee in Lizella with Mark Walker directing.

This year's junior camp grants for District Associations will be \$1,600.00, and increase of \$100.00 from previous years.

The report was received as information.

#### **Board of Christian Education Report**

Bro. Mark Walker gave the Christian Education Board report. This report and the financial report are included in the Digest of Reports.

The Master's Program has been successful with nine people taking advantage of this "off campus" experience being offered by Hillsdale FWB College. The CE Board offers scholarships to ordained ministers from Georgia.

The retreats continue to experience growth and success at a rate that requires the Board to look for larger facilities.

The State Youth Competition will be held on May 6<sup>th</sup> at the White Oaks FWB Church in Macon. A Friday night Youth Rally will precede the competition. The Georgia winners of last year's National Youth Competition are listed in the digest of reports.

There were 17 Charles Clark Scholarships awarded to Georgia students who are attending the Free Will Baptist Bible College.

The report was received as information.

#### **National Association Reports**

Bro. Eric Thomsen reported for the National Executive Office, thanking the Association for their financial support and for sharing their leadership at the national level. The NAFWB

is preparing for this year's National Convention in Birmingham, Alabama, and are gearing up to make an impact for the Kingdom while there. "ONE" Magazine has been a success and the companion website offers even more information. "Rejoice" hymnals have been reprinted and are available through Randall House. More than \$200,000 came through the National Office for hurricane relief efforts. The NAFWB Executive Office is debt-free and financially healthy. A new staff member is being hired to assume various responsibilities. The report was received as information.

Bro. David Williford gave the report for the Free Will Baptist Bible College and thanked the GAFWB for their past and continuing support. Almost 10% of the college's undesignated gifts last year came from Georgia. An offer has been made to purchase the existing campus and the college is currently engaged in a feasibility study regarding the possibility of relocation. The report was received as information.

Bro. Bill Evans gave a report for the Free Will Baptist Foundation and expressed appreciation for the "positive reports" given in the GAFWB Annual Session. The Foundation continues to experience growth and is now managing assets in excess of \$33 million. The report was received as information.

Bro. Matt Markins gave a report for Randall House Publications. The Sunday School literature published by Randall House continues to receive positive feedback. The new commentary on Hebrews is now available and several other books by Free Will Baptist authors were highlighted. The report was received as information.

Bro. Tim York gave a report for the International Missions Board, thanking Georgia for their partnership in sharing the Gospel around the world. Former, retired and active missionaries present were recognized for their service. IM is actively promoting the use of coin banks for this year's annual World Missions Offering at the end of April. The report was received as information.

Bro. Ray Lewis gave a report for the Board of Retirement and Insurance, specifically thanking William Smith for his promotion of the Retirement Program, of which one hundred people in Georgia are now enrolled. The Department is now handling retirement accounts for 1,434 people, with 101 now drawing benefits. "AtYourService" is a new e-mail information system being implemented by the Department. The report was received as information.

### **Nominating Committee Report**

Rev. Billy McKinney gave a report for the Nominating Committee, as follows:

Donna Jewell replacing Wendy Horne - 2007.

A motion was made, seconded and carried to elect these individuals as nominated.

### **Miscellaneous Reports**

Bro. Jack Taylor gave a report from FWB Family Ministries in Greeneville, TN. The Ministry served over 400 children last year, with over 100 of these children making a profession of faith in Christ. Over the last 67 years, FWB Family Ministries has been touching children's lives with the love of Christ and are constantly striving to expand their outreach through the prayer and financial support of others.

Bro. Roy Roach gave a report from the South Carolina Children's Home. The home cared for 35 children last year, with 7 of those children making professions of faith in Christ. Bro. Roach thanked the GAFWB for past and continuing support.

### **National Convention Delegates & Alternates**

A motion was made, seconded and carried to seat the following delegates and alternate delegates to the 2006 FWB National Convention, to be held in Birmingham, Alabama: Karen Edwards, Jessica Long, Carolyn Smith, Kim Dowless, Betty Henderson, Edwina Drinkwater (alt.), Jackie Barnard (alt.).

### **Resolutions Committee Report**

Committee Chairman, Rev. Mike Edwards, presented the following resolution for the Association's approval and action:

***"Whereas the Calvary FWB Church has been so accommodating and such gracious hosts, Let it be resolved that the Georgia State Association give the Calvary FWB Church a rising vote of thanks."***

(Approved and acted upon.)

### **Miscellaneous**

A motion was made, seconded and carried to allow the final Credentials Committee report to be given at the conclusion of the Friday evening worship session.

Rev. Herbert Waid reported that Rev. Randy Jackson, pastor of the Midway FWB Church in Moultrie, missed the State Meeting in order to take advantage of a ministry opportunity in Cuba.

Rev. Tim Byers, missionary to Ashtabula, Ohio, introduced himself to the GAFWB.

Rev. Dale Bishop, missionary to Japan and International Missions Regional Director for Asia gave a report on the work of FWB in several countries, representing several ministries and missionaries. He also brought greetings from all of Georgia's missionaries currently serving in Japan.

Announcements were made and the business session recessed for the afternoon.

### **FRIDAY EVENING WORSHIP SESSION**

"The Scrap Iron Trio", from Double Branch FWB Church in Hawkinsville ministered to the congregation in song as a prelude to the evening worship session. Songs included, "God is Good All The Time", "Everything Good", "Heartbreak Ridge, New Hope Road", "Show Me The Cross", and "Jesus Needs A Few Good Men". (The trio consists of Rev. ### **Unfinished Business**

Bro. Randy Key gave a report from the Alabama Children's Home. The Home currently has 25 children in its care, but may have 40 or more different children come through in any given year. He thanked the GAFWB for their faithful support, without which the Home would be unable to operate. One young lady who has been in the care of the Home will be graduating this year, Sis. Carolyn Edwards, and she plans to attend the FWBBC. A fund has been set up for those who may feel led to help her with college expenses. House parents for young boys are also needed at the Home. The report was received as information.

### **Final Credentials Committee Report**

Rev. Bobby Taylor thanked his assistants on the Credentials Committee, Sis. Wendy Horne, Sis. Debra Taylor (his wife) and Sis. Jenny Taylor (his daughter). The final Credentials Committee report is as follows: 62 standing delegates and 32 elected delegates for a total voting delegation of 94. There were also 42 visitors registered for a total registration of 136. The Friday evening attendance was 241. A motion was made, seconded and carried to receive the final Credentials Committee Report.

With no other business, a motion to adjourn was made, seconded and carried. There will be no Saturday morning session.

The Association sang "Happy Birthday" to Executive Secretary William Smith and presented him with a cake and surprise party in celebration of his 50<sup>th</sup> birthday.

The evening and the 70<sup>th</sup> Annual Session came to a fitting close as the Association lifted their voices in praise to God with a final verse of "How Great Thou Art".

## **Executive Secretary/Treasurer Report January 1, 2005 – December 31, 2005**

Welcome to the Seventieth annual session of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. We have gathered to conduct our state association business and receive reports from all of our state boards and national agencies. God richly blessed our state during 2005. We gather to rejoice as we look at the past and we are challenged as we look toward the future.

This digest contains reports from all the Georgia State Boards. The board reports cover the period of January 1, 2005 – December 31, 2005. All financial reports cover the period of January 1, 2005 – December 31, 2005.

Thank you for your faithful support during 2005. Receipts through the State Office totaled \$1,493,732.57. Of this amount \$297,701.58 was *Cooperative Receipts*, \$194,760.00 was *Georgia Acts 1:8 Receipts*, \$434,475.42 was *Designated Receipts*, and \$565,795.57 net receipts from the sale of the Hampton property. We had an increase of 4.14% in *Cooperative Receipts*, 3.78% in *Georgia Acts 1:8 Receipts*, and 6.02% increase in *Total Giving*. Thank you for making 2005 a record year in giving to the *Cooperative Plan* and the *Acts 1:8 Plan*. Giving to the total program has always been the philosophy for Georgia Free Will Baptists.

The generosity of Georgia Free Will Baptists is amazing. Thru the state office our churches gave a total of \$927,937.00 or \$103.59 per member. Georgia Free Will Baptists gave a total of \$1,088,936.19 or \$121.56 per member to state and national ministries. This number is much greater than other denominations. Your compassions can be seen in the gift of \$51,275.29 to Hurricane Katrina relief efforts. Your faithfulness to support the *Georgia Cooperative Program* and the *Georgia Acts 1:8 Program* makes it possible for the gospel to be shared in foreign countries, new churches to be planted in our state, Georgia students to attend Free Will Baptist Bible College and Georgia pastors to get their masters degree by attending the Georgia extension of the Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College. You also help fund eight sessions of youth camp, five retreats and the retirement program for Georgia pastors.

The future is bright for our state. The population continues to grow at record pace. With this comes an awesome responsibility to be faithful to spread the gospel to the state of Georgia as well as the people of the world.

## **Executive Board Report March 2005 – March 2006**

The Executive Board is constitutionally charged with the responsibility of acting for the Georgia State Association when it is not in session, and then reporting to the State Association in session for approval of its actions. The decisions made by the Executive Board are made with consideration and an acute awareness of our responsibility and accountability. Since our last State Association Session, the Executive Board has met to conduct the State business at the following times and locations:

March 19, 2005, Shallowford FWB Church, Marietta, GA (after 69<sup>th</sup> Annual Session)

July 5, 2005, White Oaks FWB Church, Macon, GA

September 19-20, 2005, Little Ocmulgee State Park, McRae, GA

December 19, 2005, White Oaks FWB Church, Macon, GA

March 15, 2006, Holiday Inn, Columbus, GA

From these meetings, the following items are presented for general information and/or approval at this 70<sup>th</sup> Annual Session of the GAFWB.

## **2006 State Program**

Featured speakers for the 70<sup>th</sup> Annual Session: Rev. Rick Wilson, Rev. Reuben Cason, Rev. Willie Martin, Rev. S.E. Newberry, Rev. Bill Lewis, and Rev. Bill Crank.

## **Georgia State Budget Proposed**

A 2007 calendar year budget of \$800,000.00 is proposed. A 2007 Georgia State *Cooperative Budget* of \$315,000.00 and a 2006 *Acts 1:8 Budget* of \$224,335.89 is included in the overall budget. You will find the proposed 2007 *Cooperative Budget* included with this report on page 19 for your approval.

## **Hampton Property Sold**

The Hampton property was sold for \$685,000.00. After brokerage fees (\$42,500.00), loan payoff (\$130,587.73), and transfer taxes (\$685.00), the GAFWB net at closing was \$506,227.27. An outstanding insurance claim for tornado damage of \$59,568.30 was also received. This made the net proceeds to total \$565,795.57.

## **Meeting Location Change**

Due to some scheduling conflicts with the Christian school located there, the First FWB Church of Brunswick requested that the 2006 State Meeting be moved to another location. The Board elected to advance to the next Church on the hosting schedule; therefore, the 2006 State Meeting will be held at the Calvary FWB Church in Columbus.

## **Acts 1:8 Changes**

The following accounts were removed from the 2006 Acts 1:8 Budget: Joni Thomas, formerly a short-term missionary to Japan; NAFWB International Missions General Fund; and, NAFWB Home Missions General Fund.

## **International Missions Budget Concerns**

Steve Lytle, of the NAFWB International Missions Department, met with the Board to discuss concerns about the rising budgets of Georgia missionaries serving in Japan. Although *Acts 1:8* giving continues to increase, it has not kept pace with the requested budget increases handed down from the International Missions Department.

## **2007 State Meeting Site**

The Board proposes that the 2007 State Meeting be held at the White Oaks FWB Church in Macon on March 15-17, 2007.

## **Stewardship Seminar Funding**

The Board agreed to pay the registration fee of \$20.00, using contingency funds, for all licensed and ordained ministers, and staff members of Georgia FWB churches who attend the "Building Kingdom Stewards Seminar", by Dr. Stan Toler, at First FWB Church of Albany.

## **Music Commission Budget**

The Music Commission, who is responsible for the music at the State Meeting and all State sponsored retreats, will be required to submit a budget to the Executive Board for consideration and approval. This budget would include all costs associated with travel and meal expenses, honorariums, equipment purchase or rental, and other related costs.

## **Valdosta Property**

The Board gave authority to the Board of Missions to sell the Valdosta property with the purpose and intent of relocating the mission work within the Lowndes county area.

## **Early County Property**

At the request of the Board of Trustees, the Executive Board approved the sale of ¼ acre of property in Early County where a Free Will Baptist church was once located. The \$20,000.00 received from this sale will be placed in a COOP Endowment.

## **State Office Renovations**

The Board approved an in-house loan to the Trustee Board to complete renovations to the State Office building in Colquitt.

## **State Office Personnel Evaluation**

Granted a 10% increase in the salary of Executive Secretary William Smith, to be calculated from his salary, retirement and housing allowance.

Granted a 4% increase in the salary of State Office Secretary Rhonda Chandler, bringing her from \$10.00 per hour to \$10.40 per hour.

We are pleased, thankful, and humbled to give the following report:

**THE SALE OF THE HAMPTON PROPERTY**

After numerous meetings, much negotiation, a lot of disappointments we are happy to report to you that the Hampton Property has been sold and we have netted, after the loan pay-off \$506,227.27. In addition to this we received \$59,568.30 from the insurance company for tornado damage and \$62,356.45 for the cell tower lease. This gives us a total of \$529,362.01 in our Mission Board Account. This makes it easier to recruit Church Planters and fulfill the vision of planting churches in Georgia.

**THE DAMON C. DODD GEORGIA STATE MISSION OFFERING**

We are excited about this offering for the Georgia State Missions. Brother Dodd epitomized one given to a missionary vision. This year was our first annual offering and we received \$14,548.42. We are convinced that it will grow each year. Few of us like to talk about money but we all know it is an absolute necessity. With the funds from the Hampton Property and the Dodd offering we can do unparalleled things in the history of Georgia State Missions. Thank you for your support.

Bill Lewis and Bill Crank are breaking new ground in Valdosta and Cartersville. They give the following report.

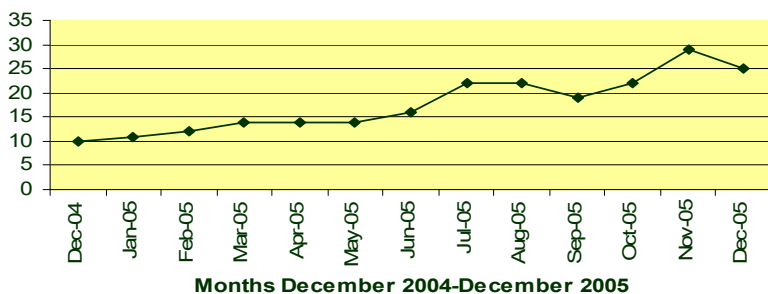
**BROTHER BILL LEWIS REPORTS FROM VALDOSTA**

Open Door Fellowship made some strides forward during 2005. Attendance rose 250% from an average of 10 in December 2004 to an average of 25 in December 2005. Along with the rising attendance, offerings grew by about 104% from a monthly average of \$1,280.00 in the fourth quarter of 2004 to a monthly average of \$2,610.00 in the fourth quarter of 2005.

The appearance of the facilities also improved during 2005. Awnings were added to provide contrast and design to the metal building and to replace a worn wooden cover on the brick/wood framed building. All the exposed wood on the older building was covered with siding. Even with the improvements, location continues to be a concern for long term growth.

Attendance steadily increased from December 2004 through December 2005. The high attendance Sunday for the time period occurred on November 6, 2005 when 32 were present. The average attendance for December 2004 was 10 and the average attendance for December 2005 was 25.

The average age of those attending also steadily declined through the time period. The majority of the growth has been couples and individuals younger than those who were in attendance in December 2004. The church also now maintains a children's church ministry directed by Mrs. Amy Fitzgerald.

## **BROTHER BILL CRANK REPORTS FROM CARTERSVILLE**

While the past year has been much slower than anticipated going in, given the task at hand, it is probably the norm. We entered the city with no name recognition, no local families committed to join with us and no denominational recognition. We have adopted the approach of invest and invite intentionally. I have become a member of the local Chamber of Commerce, sought ways to become known in the public school arena, and began a mentoring program with a young man. All of this was to lead to meeting people and sharing our vision and the gospel. We started in our home attempting Bible studies with mixed results, moved to the Holiday Inn for a series of services, back to my home for services and finally have located in a store front in a highly public area at the end of the year. The last place has proved a good fit financially and with the length of the lease being for only one year. It will allow an evaluation and relocation if need be. We have also accomplished some of our administrative actions such as our 501(c)3, EIN and other items for making us legal.

**Our Present situation** – We have been settling into our new location and had much cosmetic work to do to make our building presentable. The previous tenant had a lighted 5 X 8 sign which he offered to us for \$950 and then gave it to us for free for a donation letter. We have lettered the windows and the new sign which helps us to have the appearance of being legitimate. We are in a high traffic area with a lot of visibility. We are still in the process of making the building feel like a church.

**Our future is preparing for a spring launch service.** We also have plans to continue our mailings, outreach, and special emphasis of every month. We will go forward with meeting people face to face and helping others understand what and why we are here for.

### **Attendance report –**

- August started with varied results with a high day of 16 and an average of 11.
- September had an average of 15 with a high day of 17. During the month, we also moved from the Holiday Inn to my home.
- October had an average of 18 with a high day of 21.
- November's average was 17 as was December's.

Though our attendance the last two months did not reflect an increase, we also had to deal with holidays, illness and various other family gatherings that kept regulars away from our services.

We have nine families that are committed to our work but with differing levels of commitment. Our goal is to add six more families before our launch.

## CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

### GEORGIA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS, Inc.

#### PREAMBLE

We, the Free Will Baptist of the State of Georgia, do ordain this Constitution for the purpose of advocating, promoting and increasing all phases of the cause of Christ.

#### ARTICLE I

This assembly shall be known as the ***Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.***

#### Article II

**SECTION 1.** The officers of this association shall be Moderator, an Assistant Moderator, a Clerk, an Assistant Clerk, and an Executive Secretary/Treasurer.

**SECTION 2.** The Executive Board shall be composed of the regular officers; the chairman of each of the standing boards; and the previous moderator, as an ex officio member for a period of two years following his term of office; and the moderator of the District Associations not represented shall serve as members at large.

**SECTION 3.** This Association shall be composed of ordained Ministers, ordained Deacons, Missionaries, and Board Members who are members of affiliated bodies; one (1) delegate for every three hundred (300) members or fraction thereof from District Associations; one (1) delegate for every one hundred (100) members or fraction thereof from each local affiliated church.

**SECTION 4.** All delegates from District Associations and local churches shall be elected from the laity of the body sending them.

**SECTION 5.** Funds to meet current needs of this body shall be paid to the treasurer of this association. Each District Association will give a minimum of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per delegate authorized, and each local church will give twenty-five (\$25.00) per delegate.

**SECTION 6.** In order to pay our Georgia State Association's annual representation fee to the National Association, each local association is to be responsible to promote, receive and forward the amount designated by the National Association per church per year to the State Office, along with their annual State Association representation fee, on or before our annual State Association session.

#### ARTICLE III

**SECTION 1.** It shall be the privilege of each affiliated District Association to recommend a member for each standing board. Terms of office on these boards shall be on a rotating basis which will necessitate the election by the State Association of five (5) members every two (2) years, thus giving each member a four (4) year term of office.

**SECTION 2.** There shall be a **Board of Missions** composed of members who are noted for their missionary zeal.

**A.** The Board of Missions shall employ missionaries as needed to establish Free Will Baptist mission/churches in the State of Georgia. These missionaries may be employed exclusively or jointly with other Free Will Baptist agencies.

**B.** A mission/church sponsored by the Georgia State Association and their missionaries are under the authority of the State Association and the supervision of the Georgia State Board of Missions.

**C.** A mission/church does not have autonomous church status. As long as the mission/church is unable to provide for its own business, it is in a dependent relationship to the State Association and its Board of Missions.

**D.** When the mission/church is self-sustaining, self-governing, self-discipline, and self-propagating. It should be organized into an autonomous Free Will Baptist Church following the procedures adopted by the Georgia State Association.

**E.** After proper procedures are satisfied and the church is duly organized into autonomous Free Will Baptist church it shall have all normal rights, privileges, and responsibilities of any other Free Will Baptist Church.

**SECTION 3.** There shall be a **Board of Camping** whose duties shall be to schedule and arrange all camp sessions, and to appoint the Camp Director each year.

**SECTION 4.** There shall be a **Board of Christian Education** whose duties shall be:

**A.** To provide educational services for the members of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists.

**B.** To set policy and supervise the functions of the State Youth Committee. This Board shall appoint this Committee to carry out Board policy.

**C.** To organize sponsor and promote educational and inspirational retreats for our members.

**D.** To organize, sponsor and promote Sunday School and Church Training seminars.

**E.** To set policy and supervise the Historical Committee. This Board shall appoint the Historical Committee to gather and set forth for public knowledge and posterity the history of Georgia Free Will Baptists.

**SECTION 5.** There shall be a **Board of Trustees** whose duties shall be; maintenance, upkeep and insuring of all State Association properties; the planning and supervision of all future developments and expansion of these properties as directed by the State Association except otherwise provided in this Constitution.

**SECTION 6.** There shall be a **Credentials Committee**, which shall consist of three (3) members of three-year terms. And the term of one expiring each year thereafter according to seniority of service, who shall be in charge of the registration and examination of delegates and the receiving of all dues.

**SECTION 7.** There shall be two members on the Board of Trustees of the Free Will Baptist Children's Home, Eldridge, Alabama, elected for terms of four (4) years. Election will take place on odd years and shall be staggered.

**SECTION 8.** There shall be a **Georgia State Master's Men**. They shall select their own officers and conduct their own business.

**SECTION 9.** There shall be a **Georgia State Woman's Auxiliary Convention (GWAC)**. They shall elect their officers, conduct their business and maintain their treasury.

#### **ARTICLE IV**

**SECTION 1.** All officers except board members and the Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be elected to serve a term of two (2) years. The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be employed by the Executive Board of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, subject to the ratification of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists at its next regular session, for an indefinite period, with an agreement of sixty (60) day notice of termination by either the Executive Secretary/Treasurer or the Executive Board.

**SECTION 2.** Standing Boards of the State Association have no power of final authority to hire, full-time employees until the matter has been presented to and acted on by the State Association in session except where otherwise provided.

**SECTION 3.** The Executive Board may fill vacancies on any of the boards or committees, which occur between regular sessions of this State Association, until the convening of the annual session of said association.

**SECTION 4.** Election of all General Officers shall take place on the odd years of the calendar.

**SECTION 5.** If a member of any board fails in the function of his or her duty without good and sufficient reasons, the board of which the delinquent is a member may declare that particular office vacant. Further, this body shall have and does reserve the right to deal with the officer or board member who does not conduct his or her office in a Christian, business like manner according to the rules of Christian conduct as set forth in the New Testament.

Any standing board of this State Association may appoint proxies to serve in lieu of the absent members.

At the pleasure of the boards, and subsequent to the meeting from which the regular member is absent, the boards have the right to deal with the delinquent member in the manner stated in this section.

**SECTION 6.** The Chairman or Vice-Chairman of said board, or by the Moderator or Assistant Moderator of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, upon the request of the majority of the members of said boards, may call boards into session.

**SECTION 7.** An auditing Committee shall consist of three (3) members elected for three (3) three year terms.

#### **AMENDMENTS**

This Constitution may be changed, altered, or amended by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all delegates present and voting at any regular session of the State Association. Prior to a final vote on any amendment, change or alteration, said amendment, change or alteration shall be submitted in writing to the Clerk of this association and shall lie on the table from one (1) business meeting to the next during the same session, during which time it shall be read at least two (2) times in open session. Officers, standing boards, and/or standing committees may be added or deleted as the need arises.

## **BY-LAWS**

### **SECTION 1:**

**A.** All real property, checking and savings account or any other assets of this Association shall be in the name of the *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*

**B.** One or more of the corporate officers of the Association shall be the legal signers of all Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. business. These officers are: the Moderator as the corporate President; the Clerk as the corporate Vice-President; and the Executive Secretary/Treasurer as the Secretary/Treasurer.

**C.** The State Office shall be responsible for the safekeeping of the corporate seal and all official documents of the State Association.

**D.** No State Board may borrow money or financially obligated the State Association without the approval of the Executive Board.

**E.** The fixed assets (building, land) of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists shall not be liquidated except by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the delegates present and voting at any regular session of the Association.

The Executive Board shall have the authority to approve the sale of properties donated to any Board of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc., upon recommendation of the Board to which the donation was made, with proceeds remaining under the authority of the recommending Board."

**F.** The records of all financial transaction shall be open to all members of the Georgia State Association. The financial transactions of the State Office and State Boards shall be audited annually.

**G.** Annual financial reports of the State Office and State Boards and the auditor's report shall be made to the State Association in session and be entered in the Annual State Minutes.

**H.** The State Treasurer shall be bonded in amount stipulated by the State Executive Board.

**I.** This Association shall meet for its regular session annually on Thursday following the second Sunday in March and shall adjourn on the Saturday immediately following.

### **SECTION 2.**

**A.** When the State Association is not in session, the State Executive Board shall be duly authorized to do business in the name of the State Association.

**B.** The State Association has full authority to direct the State Executive Board in all business conducted on its behalf.

**C.** The State Executive Board shall report to the State Association in session concerning the business conducted for the State Association since its last convening.

**D.** The State Executive Board has the prerogative of deferring any matter to the State Association as a whole but is not under obligation to do so.

**E.** The State Executive Board shall meet quarterly in the following months: March, June, September, and December. The March meeting shall be held just prior to the regular meeting of the State Association.

**F.** Any and all correspondence from any member of this State Association, (includes either individual, group, Board or District Association) directed to any Board, or Chairman of said Board, or any officer of this State Association, or any open letters to any or all District Associations of this State, that pertains to any business which is desired or required to be brought before this body at any scheduled or special called meeting, shall be properly sent directly to the Clerk of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists. The clerk will be responsible for routing the correspondence to its proper designation. All correspondence as mentioned above, shall be required to be received by the Clerk of the State Association at least 30 days prior to any scheduled State Association Meeting if said correspondence contains business that is to be introduced and discussed at said meeting.

### **SECTION 3.**

**A.** The moderator shall preside at the Annual Session of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists and the meetings of the Executive Board. The Moderator shall be the President of the Corporation known as the *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*

**B.** The Assistant Moderator shall preside in the absence of the Moderator and/or when appointed by the Moderator as the need arises.

**C.** The Clerk shall keep records of the proceedings of the Annual Associational meeting and of the Executive Board meetings. It shall also be his responsibility to have the minutes of these sessions printed and distributed. The Clerk shall be the Vice-President of the Corporation known as *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*

**D.** The Assistant Clerk in the absence of the Clerk, shall fulfill the functions and duties of the Clerk as stated in paragraph C of this document.

### **SECTION 4.**

**A.** The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be responsible and accountable to the Executive Board in the fulfillment of the duties of his office as determined by the Executive Board.

**B.** The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be allowed four (4) weeks vacation per year with pay.

**C.** Funds received by the Executive Secretary/Treasurer for revivals, special speaking engagements and promotional meetings shall go into the Cooperative Fund. The exception to this regulation relates to remuneration received by the Executive Secretary during his four (4) weeks vacation, which shall be his personally and need not be accounted for to this State Association.

**D.** Salary, mileage and operational expenses of the Executive Secretary/ Treasurer shall be determined by the Executive Board.

**E.** The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be the Secretary/Treasurer of the Corporation known as the *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*

**F. General Promotion.** He is to represent, or cause to be represented, the association at all affairs of interest to the association and he is to promote the work of the association in such a manner so as to unify the association as well as promote both the state and national works, missionaries, mission conferences, etc. Through personal communication he shall keep close contact with pastors, churches, and district association.

**G. Administration.** He shall administer the affairs of the executive office and carry out the responsibilities delegated to him by the State Association and the Executive Board. He is to serve with all standing boards and committees of the association in an ex-official capacity. He is to report to the association during each annual session.

**H. Stewardship.** He shall serve as treasurer of this association. An accurate and complete record of all funds received and disbursed shall be kept and a written report shall be included in his report to this association in its annual session. He shall receive, hold and disburse money as is made available by the State Association to the various boards. Disbursements to the various boards will be made available when requested.

**I. Publication.** It shall be his duty to edit and publish the state paper. He shall direct the production of general promotional materials, pamphlets, audiovisuals, and books as approved by the Executive Board.

**J. Arranging State Association.** He shall expedite the planning of the State Association program, enroll all ministers and delegates, print and distribute minutes, and investigate future sites for the annual session.

## **SECTION 5.**

**A.** The Executive Board shall serve as the Placement Committee for the State Association. In this capacity the board shall investigate places suitable for this meeting and make recommendations to said State Association. Meeting places shall be determined two (2) years in advance.

**B.** The Executive Board shall plan the program for the annual meetings of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists and the annual meetings shall follow the programs as closely as possible. Business sessions shall be conducted according to the commonly accepted rules of Parliamentary Procedure.

**C.** The Executive Board shall formulate the budget for the State Association annually and recommend to the body in the session the allocations to be observed in the Cooperative Plan for Giving. This board shall, in addition to the above stated duties, also recommend a mileage rate for travel by the members of all standing boards in said association.

## **SECTION 6.**

The Moderator shall appoint necessary committees unless otherwise provided for by the body.

## **SECTION 7.**

These By-Laws may be altered, changed, or amended at any regular session of this association by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of delegates present and voting

Sherrie Bailey welcomed everyone and opened the 2006 Session in prayer. Michelle Mercer led the congregation in "This is the Day" and "Great is the Lord", accompanied by Sandra Jackson on the piano. Teresa Womack remembered several Georgia ladies, Mary Lou Dixon from Piney Grove Church, Voncille Muscroe from Travelers Rest Church, and Margie Carter from the Albany Church, who have gone to be with the Lord during 2005. We had a moment of silence and Teresa said a prayer of thanksgiving and remembrance for each one.

President Debra Van Pelt then called the meeting to order and welcomed everyone to the 2006 Session. Vice President Sandra Jackson reported that all 10 districts reported prior to the meeting, which has not happened in recent GWAC history. A total of 465 members were reported, which represents 39 local churches. The 24 delegates who were present were then seated. Secretary Donna Jewell read the minutes from the 2005 session and they were approved as read. Treasurer Lynda Blanchard gave the treasurer's report which reflects a balance of \$5,504.36 as of December 31, 2005. Her report was approved as read. She also reported that the State Project/Acts 1:8 goal will remain at \$7,500.00, and this breaks down to \$16.13 per member in order to reach this goal. State dues remain at \$2.50.

Susie Mounts read the following proposed Resolutions:

"1. Be it resolved that since TV programming has become so offensive, we contact the networks and ask them not to air programs containing immorality, nudity and alternate lifestyles, especially during prime time viewing. The suggested networks are NBC, ABC and CBS."

"2. Be it resolved that each GWAC Group be encouraged to give to the emphasis offering for WNAC general fund in an effort to help with the expense and income for the WNAC office."

"3. Be it resolved that we give Calvary Free Will Baptist Church a rising vote of thanks for their hospitality in hosting the State GWAC Conference."

Each resolution was duly passed.

Debra then noted that the Executive Board was charged with investigating a resolution which was tabled from the 2005 session regarding changing our reporting times to coincide with the National Office. The Board met with Marjorie Workman in January and she reaffirmed that we do not need to change anything, but she stressed turning in the reports in a timely manner, using a reporting time of January 1 through December 31. Therefore, the resolution did not pass.

Henrietta Brown gave the Registration Committee Report. 48 registered delegates; 13 visitors; 8 state officers; 2 missionaries and 1 National representative. 72 total registered.

Jack Taylor gave a report for Family Ministries in Greenville, Tennessee. He encouraged everyone to subscribe to the free monthly newsletter. The Children's Home served over 400 children in 2005, and over 100 of that number have made professions of faith.

Rachel Horne gave a report of the 2005 National Convention in Louisville, Kentucky. Everyone enjoyed the session on romancing husbands; Sandy Atwood held a session "Are we there yet?" and hearts were warmed by Heart to Heart as they performed in sign language. Salvation Reign, a bluegrass gospel group performed; Anthony and Lee Edgemon were speakers. New slate of officers was elected. Rachel encouraged everyone to support WNAC and to subscribe to the *CoLaborer* Magazine. MSC to accept as information.

The proposed 2007 Budget was reviewed and M/S/C to approve.

Delegates were chosen for the National Meeting to be held in Birmingham in July, to wit, Sandra Jackson, Terra Smith, Jackie Barnard, Betty Henderson, Sherrie Parker,

Rachel Horne, Susie Mounts, Lynda Blanchard, Joyce Taylor, Jessica Long, Janice Temples, Nadine Blanton and Sue Williams.

Nominating committee for 2007 elections was appointed, to wit, Rhoda Creech (Chairperson) from Georgia Union; Mary Nell Rentz from Martin; Christine Daniel from Midway; Betty Henderson from South Georgia; and Sherrie Bailey from Twin Cities.

Donna Jewell read the minutes of the current session and after a couple of changes, they were approved as read.

Henrietta Brown encouraged everyone to attend the Prayer Retreat April 21 and 22 at Norman Park. This year's theme is "Make a Joyful Noise". Some of the activities include a song-writing contest and musical ensembles, which Henrietta invited everyone to participate in. She was very excited about several Japanese ladies who will be attending the Retreat with Debbie Griffin and she asked for volunteers to host these ladies during their stay in Georgia.

We were privileged to have WNAC Executive Secretary, Marjorie Workman, in attendance and she handed out a report which outlined the ongoing work in the National WNAC Office. She reviewed several books which she encouraged everyone to purchase and she also encouraged everyone to subscribe to the *Co-Laborer Magazine*. She explained the Christmas Joy program for children in Central Asia and asked everyone to pass this information on to their local members. Each \$15.00 gift will provide a box filled with items for many children in this poverty stricken area. Marjorie also reminded everyone that the National Dues have been increased to \$15.00. She thanked Georgia for their support of the National Office.

Debra noted that the subject of changing our annual convention date had been discussed in the past, and after tallying surveys from the ladies at the prayer retreat last year, the result was to continue meeting during the same time that the Georgia Annual Meeting is held in March.

He read I Kings 17: 1-24 and asked the question "Lord, Do You Really Expect Me To Do That?" He spoke of how, each time God told Elijah to go, he went, and likewise, when God speaks to our hearts, it is our duty to obey, but we must do it on God's timetable and not ours. He also warned everyone that when the pasture is greener on the other side, there is usually a lot of "fertilizer".

Bill Crank then dismissed in prayer and everyone was reminded of the luncheon at the Holiday Inn.

**GEORGIA WOMEN ACTIVE FOR CHRIST**  
**Of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.**  
**Constitution and By-Laws**

**Article I**

**Name**

This organization shall be known as Georgia Women Active for Christ a division of the Georgia Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc., commonly known by its initials, GWAC. Its members shall elect officers, conduct business and maintain a treasury.

**Article II**

**Purpose**

The purpose of this organization shall be to assist the various women composing the GWAC in providing opportunities to understand and fulfill the Great Commission through their responsibilities in the family, church, community, and around the world.

It shall bring the women of each district together for fellowship, sharing information, encouraging one another in the work of the Lord and furthering the purpose and goals of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists.

**Article III**

**Officers**

1. The officers of this convention shall be president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, field worker, historian, and three members at large, all of which are elected by the convention. These officers shall serve as the State Executive Board. A minimum of five officers shall be a quorum for transacting business.

2. Any officer or elected board member of this convention must be an active member of a local Free Will Baptist Church and an active member of the GWAC group of a local church.

3. Executive Board members are required to attend all scheduled board meetings. Any officer missing three meetings is subject to review and removal by the Executive Board.

**Article IV**

**Membership**

1. This convention shall be composed of: the officers of the convention, district presidents, district field workers, ten delegates (duly accredited by the credentials committee) from each district convention, four delegates and the president from each local GWAC in good standing with its district convention.

2. Local groups in an area where there is no district convention may be represented with five delegates by payment of their membership dues. All delegates, as well as officers of the convention, shall be in good standing with a church that is in good standing with the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, and shall perform the duties as set forth for them in the present WNAC manual and this Constitution and By-Laws.

**Article V**

**Meetings**

1. The annual meeting shall be held each year the day before the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists convention in the same place or at such a time and place determined at the previous annual meeting or by the Executive Board.

2. A prayer retreat shall be held annually, time and place to be planned by the Executive Board.

**Article VI**

**Amendments**

This Constitution may be amended at any annual meeting of the convention by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

## **By-Laws**

### **Article I**

#### **Duties of Officers**

**President** – The president shall preside over all meetings, appoint such committees as may be needed; call the Executive Board together when necessary; be ex-officio member of all committees, except the nominating committee; see that reports are sent promptly to the WNAC secretary; and perform all duties pertaining to such an office. She should see that GWAC is represented in the State Promotional Bulletin. Articles should be sent to the state executive office by the 1<sup>st</sup> of each month. She may either write the articles or ask someone to write the articles for her.

**Vice President** – The vice president shall preside in the absence of the president or by her request and otherwise assist her in the oversight of the work in general. She shall serve as chairman of the credentials committee.

**Secretary** – The secretary shall keep an accurate record of all proceedings of the convention and Executive Board meetings; preserve all valuable papers and turn same over to her successor; make an annual report to the WNAC secretary on a form available from the WNAC office within 15 days after the State GWAC Convention; compile the districts' slate of officers and addresses immediately after the convention; send a slate of state officers to the WNAC secretary and to each state officer. She is responsible for getting the minutes prepared and to the state associational office in time to be included in the state minutes each year.

**Treasurer** – The treasurer shall have charge of all funds belonging to this convention and shall pay out same only when authorized by the convention. The treasurer shall keep an accurate account, and give a written report of all funds received and disbursed at each annual meeting of the convention. She is required to deposit all checks in her possession and disburse all designated funds by the 30<sup>th</sup> of each month. She shall be bonded through the state office and audited annually.

**Field Worker** – The field worker shall promote GWAC programs through personal contact and the distribution of literature and serve where needed as directed by the Executive Board.

**Historian** – The historian shall keep a historical record and have a display at all state meetings and serve where needed as directed by the Executive Board.

**Members at Large** – The members at large shall help promote the work in general, meet with the Executive Board, and serve where needed as directed by the Executive Board.

### **Article II**

#### **Elections**

A nominating committee shall nominate the general officers and members at large. Following the nominating committee's report, opportunity shall be given for nominations from the floor. In case of more than one nominee for any particular office, a vote will be taken for each; otherwise they may be elected by acclamation. The officers shall be elected every two years on odd number years. Not more than one-half of the elected officers shall be changed in any regular election. All elections shall be held at the closing sessions of the annual convention.

### **Article III**

#### **Expenses**

Estimated expenses for the state work shall be set by an annual budget approved by the convention. The Executive Board must approve all reimbursement.

### **Article IV**

#### **Boards and Committees**

**Executive Board** – This Board shall be composed of six officers and three members at large elected by the convention. Five of these shall compose a quorum. They shall hold meetings for the transaction of business as often as necessary. It shall be the duty of the Executive Board to maintain an oversight of the work at large. The Board shall act for the convention when necessary. It shall prepare the program for the regular meetings and fill any vacancy between elections.

**Resolutions Committee** – A resolutions committee shall be appointed by the president. A member of the Executive Board shall chair this committee. This committee shall review all resolutions presented, having the prerogative of passing on to the convention those resolutions that are deemed proper and profitable. Resolutions should be properly worded, i.e. "Be it Resolved...."

**Nominating Committee** – The nominating committee shall be composed of one member from each district convention and shall be elected one year prior to making their report. The names of the members from each district shall be submitted with the convention annual report. The president shall appoint a chairperson from the members of the nominating committee.

**Credentials Committee** – The vice president shall be the chairman of the credentials committee and the president shall appoint two other members. This committee shall examine the reports of the represented women's groups to see if fees are paid and if reports are in order.

**Finance Committee** – The treasurer shall be chairman of the finance committee and the president may appoint four other members. This committee reviews the financial records for the year, reports on same to the convention, and makes recommendations of disbursements of funds to the convention.

**Registration Committee** – The president shall appoint members as needed to serve on this committee. This committee registers those in attendance and gives a report to the convention.

### **Article V**

#### **Dues and Reports**

Active members shall pay dues yearly as required by the GWAC Convention for membership. These dues should come through the district treasurers by January 10<sup>th</sup> following the close of the previous year. District secretaries and treasurers annual reports should be filed with the state secretary and treasurer no later than February 1 following the close of the previous year. Beginning 2002 the dues are \$12.50 per member with Georgia retaining \$2.50 per member and WNAC receiving dues of \$10.00 per member.

### **Article VI**

#### **Gifts**

#### **Season of Prayer Offerings-**

**1. Pre-Easter Week of Prayer** offering is used for Foreign Missions in memory of Laura Bell Barnard, our first foreign missionary.

**2. Pre-Thanksgiving Week of Prayer** offering is used for National Home Missions in memory of Mrs. Lizzie McAdams, a great writer of our literature and one of the first National officers.

**3. The December Week of Prayer** offering is used for State Missions in memory of Mrs. Alice E. Lupton, our first National president.

**Co-Laborer Offering** – A financial plan of support for WNAC. Each local GWAC is encouraged to support the WNAC office with a monthly offering.

**Provision Closet** - This project helps missionaries as they return home to pick up household items, etc., from the closet at the National Office. Each local GWAC is encouraged to keep abreast of the items and supplies needed as they are periodically listed in the **Co-Laborer** magazine, and give to this project as needed.

**WNAC Emphasis** – A special offering to supplement the Co-Laborer Offerings for WNAC expenses of operation, literature, etc. This offering is received during August.

**Remembrance Fund** – This is a fund established by WNAC and a distinct way to honor any occasion the donor wishes to note: Anniversaries, birthdays, or as a memorial gift at the time of death. A remembrance card notifying the family of the person being honored, and the donor, will be entered in the permanent Book of Remembrances in the WNAC office. These gifts will be used to advance the kingdom of God through WNAC. A Remembrance Service is to be conducted at our state GWAC convention each year.

**Dr. Mary Ruth Wisheart Foreign Student Scholarship Fund** – Any GWAC group who wishes may contribute to this special fund set up by WNAC to train Nationals from our foreign fields. February is designated as Foreign Student month.

**Dot Harvey Loan Fund** – This revolving loan fund was established in honor of Miss Dot Harvey, a forerunner of youth work in Georgia, by the Georgia Women's Auxiliary Convention in 1954 to aid worthy Georgia students attending Free Will Baptist Bible College. Each local group is asked to donate monthly toward this project. A special offering is received in September to add to this fund.

**Westfield Church Fund** – This fund is used to assist the church in Kotogiri, South India in memory of Miss Laura Bell Barnard. All groups are encouraged to give to this Georgia project monthly.

**Other Gifts** – The state GWAC may decide on and promote other projects for funds at its own discretion.

**Lora Shutes Mission Project** – This is a statewide project with the goal set each year at the annual convention. Funds are disbursed to missionaries through the State Acts 1:8 Program.

**GWAC Emphasis** – June is designated as GWAC Emphasis Month. Each group is asked to receive a special offering to supplement GWAC operational expenses.
