Proceedings of the 74th Annual Session of the GAFWB

The minutes of the Seventy-fourth Annual Session of the Georgia Association of Free Will Baptists, convened at the Cartersville Family Church in Cartersville, Georgia, on March 24-26, 2010.

WEDNESDAY EVENING WORSHIP SERVICE

Rev. Donnie Burke led the congregation in singing "Hosanna", "To God Be the Glory", and "Forever". Rev. Bill Crank, pastor of the Cartersville Family Church, welcomed the Association and led in an opening prayer.

A trio from the Cartersville church ministered with a special entitled "*I Have a Father Who Can*", followed by the congregation singing "*Your Grace Is Enough*". Rev. Jeff Goodman read 2nd Corinthians 12:9-10. The congregation worshiped together, mixing old with new, in the powerful praise song, "*Amazing Grace, My Chains Are Gone*". A duet from the Cartersville church concluded the musical portion of the service with a beautiful rendition of "*In the Presence of Jehovah*".

Dr. Rick Cason, the pastor of the Ebenezer FWB Church in Glennville, Georgia brought the evening message from 2nd Kings 11:1-16, entitled "*They Still Work*".

The congregation sang "*Turn Your Eyes Upon Jesus*" as an opportunity to respond to the preached Word was offered.

Following a few announcements, Moderator Len Blanchard appointed the Committee on Committees as follows: Rev. Danny Ryals – Chairman, Rev. S.E. Newberry, Rev. Mike Mounts, Rev. Fred Hersey, and Rev. Aaron Baldridge.

Moderator Len Blanchard appointed a program committee to begin planning for the 75th Annual Session. The members are as followed: Rev. William Smith, Rev. Mark Walker, Rev. Willie Martin, Sister Nadine Blanton, and Sister Geraldine Waid.

The meeting was dismissed in prayer by Rev. Barry Long.

THURSDAY MORNING BIBLE CONFERENCE

Rev. Wayne Miracle presided over the Thursday morning Bible Conference. He and Rev. Grover Jewell led in singing several familiar congregational hymns.

Rev. Terry Forrest delivered two messages on very relevant contemporary topics: "Evangelical Worship in Early Post-Modern America – The Substance and Style of Worship According to the Bible"; and, "What Do We Do About Youth Leaving the Church? Take Them Back to the Origins of Creation."

Rev. Willie Martin dismissed the meeting with prayer.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON BUSINESS SESSION

Call to Session & Preliminaries

At 2:00 PM, the GAFWB convened with Rev. Randy Jackson presiding and leading the congregation in singing "*Showers of Blessing*". Rev. Trent Dykes led in prayer.

Clerk Keith Lloyd officially called the Seventy-fourth Annual Session of the Georgia Association of Free Will Baptists to order and introduced the Moderator, Rev. Len Blanchard, who began the session with a Scripture reading from Philippians 2:1-5.

The Moderator welcomed everyone and recognized the Standing Delegates, which includes ordained ministers and deacons, state board members and missionaries. The Moderator then recognized the national messengers and welcomed other visitors.

International Missions Director James Forlines requested special prayer for the Darren and Dana Portell family, missionaries in Morocco, who may be expelled from the predominantly Muslim country. He asked association churches not to list missionaries who are serving in *"creative access"* countries on church websites.

Rev. Rick Cason gave a partial report of the Credentials Committee.

A motion was made, seconded, and carried to seat all elected delegates.

Rev. Danny Ryals presented the <u>Committee on Committees</u> report as follows: <u>2010 Nominating Committee</u>: <u>2010 Resolutions Committee</u>:

A motion was made, seconded and carried to receive the report.

Executive Board Report

Clerk Keith Lloyd read the Executive Board report. The report included a proposed 2011 COOP Budget of \$355,000.00, Annual Session plans for 2011 and 2012, and an addendum requesting a change to the By-Laws, Section 1. Letter I. A motion was made and seconded to receive the report. The motion carried. The proposed changed to the By-Laws will be considered during new business.

Executive Secretary / Treasurer Report

Executive Secretary/Treasurer William Smith gave the Executive Office report.

In 2009, Acts 1:8 giving decreased by 3.28% and Cooperative gifts by 2.28% from the previous year. The last six months of the year were particularly difficult.

The Auditing Committee report to the GAFWB found all State Office records and financial reports to be in order and properly documented.

Various district association statistical and financial reports were highlighted in the Digest of Reports, as well as the state's giving to National agencies and other ministries.

An explanation was given concerning recent changes to the funding of International Missions through the Georgia Acts 1:8 Plan of Missions Support. Churches were encouraged to participate in Cooperative and Acts 1:8 giving.

A motion was made and seconded to receive the report. After several questions and observations, the report was received.

National & Other Reports

Executive Secretary Keith Burden presented a report for the **National Executive Office** and ONE magazine. He thanked Georgia for their support and representation in national leadership. Information was given concerning plans for the upcoming National Convention and also related to ONE magazine. A website designed especially for pastors has also been launched. The report was received as information.

The **Georgia Women Active for Christ (GWAC)** was given by Sister Sandra Jackson, who is serving as the ministry's president. The GWAC report will be included in its entirety in the minutes of the 74th Annual Session.

Sister Sandra Jackson also reported for the *Women Nationally Active for Christ* (*WNAC*) by reading a letter from the national agency.

Director James Forlines reported for the *International Missions Department*. The department's first missionary 75 years ago was Georgia native, Laura Belle Barnard. More than 1100 churches and mission works are currently being supported by the department. The financial crisis and decrease in giving, along with the devaluing of the dollar against foreign currencies, has made international missions efforts more difficult, but the commitment to carry the Gospel to the ends of the earth remains steadfast. The annual convention will feature a celebration of 75 years of ministry. The report was received as information.

Rev. Ray Lewis reported for **Board of Retirement & Insurance**. He thanked William Smith for promoting the retirement plan among Georgia pastors. The new interactive website has proven to be very popular. Recent earnings have improved. Pastors may now also choose investment options. The report was received as information.

The *Home Missions Department* report was given by Rev. Richard Atwood. He thanked Georgia for financial and prayer support, as well as for the missionaries from the state who are serving with the department. The report was received as information.

Brother David Brown reported for the *Free Will Baptist Foundation*. He began by thanking Moderator Len Blanchard for his leadership service on the Foundation's board of directors. Monies being managed by the Foundation will benefit FWB ministries for many years to come. The report was received as information.

The **Free Will Baptist Bible College** report was given by Rev. David Williford. He thanked Georgia for their partnership, participation and leadership at the college. The recession has taken its toll on the college as well, resulting in an increased tuition cost. FWBBC has been ranked as one of the top 100 baccalaureate colleges in the south by U.S. News and World Report. After answering a question concerning the progress of relocation efforts, the report was received as information.

State Board Reports

Board of Christian Education

Rev. Randy Jackson gave a report for the Board of Christian Education.

The State retreats have been a tremendous blessing to our people, although attendance has slipped somewhat from recent years, perhaps due to the poor economy.

The Historical Society continues to gather artifacts. Two historical booklets have been reproduced and are being made available at no charge to Georgia pastors.

Earlier this year, Dr. Danny Conn presented a workshop on Youth Competition. National Youth Competition winners are listed in the Digest of Reports. The State Youth Competition will be held on Saturday, May 8, at the Ozias FWB Church in Pearson.

Charles Clark Scholarships have been awarded to 19 FWBBC students from Georgia.

This report and the financial report are included in the Digest of Reports. A motion was made, seconded and carried to receive the report as information.

The session recessed until Friday morning. Rev. Dale McCoy closed in prayer.

THURSDAY EVENING WORSHIP SERVICE

The Cotton Patch Players (Grover Jewell, Wayne Miracle, Donna Jewell and Kristen Crabtree) provided special music as a prelude to the evening worship service.

Led by Rev. Monte McKenzie, the congregation sang "Come Christians Join to Sing" and "The Power of Your Love". Rev. Ron Wallace welcomed the Association and led in an opening prayer.

Special prayer was offered for home missionaries from Georgia who were recently commissioned to plant churches in North America. The missionaries are as follows: Josh Bennett, Donnie Burke, Jeff Goodman and Barry Long.

The congregation joined in worship again, singing together "*It Is Well With My Soul*" with a solo verse by Rev. Eric Puschman. Rev. Barry Long read a selection of Scripture from Ephesians 1:17. The congregation followed with the song "*In Christ Alone*".

Sister Rebecca Jackson ministered with a special selection entitled "I'm Amazed".

Rev. Ron Wallace introduced the evening speaker, Rev. Dale Bishop, missionary to Japan. Using Psalm 67:1-7 as his text, Brother Dale preached a challenging message on the subject of "Being Blessed to Be a Blessing".

The congregation sang "*Turn Your Eyes Upon Jesus*" as an opportunity to respond to the preached Word was offered.

After announcements, Rev. Ron Wallace dismissed the session in prayer.

FRIDAY MORNING BUSINESS SESSION

Assistant Clerk Tim Horne led the congregation in singing "*Amazing Grace*" and Dr. Charles Thigpen offered an opening prayer. Assistant Moderator Wayne Miracle began the session with a Scripture reading from Romans 1:14-17.

State Board Reports Board of Missions Report

Rev. Paul Creech gave the Board of Missions report. Five years ago the board hired two men to plant new churches in Georgia, Dr. Bill Crank and Dr. Bill Lewis. Two new FWB churches now exist, one in Valdosta and the other in Bartow County.

The Open Door Fellowship in Valdosta entered self-supporting, autonomous church status in January 1, 2010. They also recently dedicated a new worship facility.

The Cartersville Family Church in Bartow County is still under mission church status. but the progress is evident as we they serve as the host church of this 74th Annual Session in the recently completed worship facility.

Rev. Jay Hollis continues to see progress in planting a church in Harris County.

Sister Melonie Brown was recognized and thanked for her work on the Mission Board as the Little River Association representative.

This report and the financial report are included in the Digest of Reports.

A motion was made, seconded and carried to receive this report as information.

Welcome to the Seventy-fourth annual session of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. We have gathered to conduct our state association business and receive reports from our state boards and national agencies. God richly blessed our state during 2009.

This digest contains reports from all the Georgia State Boards. The board reports and all financial reports cover the period of January 1, 2009 – December 31, 2009.

Thank you for your faithful support during 2009. Receipts through the State Office totaled \$912,145.09. Of this amount \$318,579.64 was *Cooperative Receipts*, \$217,022.98 was *Georgia Acts 1:8 Receipts*, and \$376,542.47 was *Designated Receipts*. We had a decrease of \$7,432.22 or 2.28% in *Cooperative Receipts* and a decrease of \$7,365.74 or 3.28% in *Georgia Acts 1:8 Receipts*.

Your faithfulness to support the *Georgia Cooperative Plan* and the *Georgia Acts 1:8 Plan* makes it possible for the gospel to be shared in foreign countries, new churches to be planted in our state, and Georgia students to attend Free Will Baptist Bible College. You also help fund nine sessions of youth camp, five retreats and the retirement program for Georgia pastors. By supporting these two plans you are supporting every phase of the state work and all of the national departments except for Randall House Publications.

During the last six months of 2009 we saw a decrease in giving. Many of our churches had to cut their budgets because of the decline in the economy. We are aware of the economic conditions. The decline in our giving and the unsure future will present us with many challenges, but we will be diligent when if comes to spending your money.

 - The 2010 Acts 1:8 budget shall be disbursed at 70% to International Missions and 30% to Home Missions, with 10% of the Home Missions budget being designated to Ron Wallace, and the remaining 20% divided equally between Josh Bennett, Donnie Burke, Jeff Goodman and Barry Long (5% each);
 - For 2011 and years following, the Acts 1:8 budget shall be disbursed at 70% to International Missions and 30% to Home Missions, with the Home Missions budget divided equally between the qualified missionaries included in the plan;
 - Missionaries serving under Home Missions shall be included in the plan for five (5) years, after which they will be re-evaluated and either included or excluded in future Acts 1:8 budget disbursements.

All of our speakers were inspiring and well received by our people. The music for the retreats was encouraging and uplifting. We are thankful for the opportunity to provide quality retreats in the State of Georgia so our people can be blessed and rejuvenated.

The Georgia State Historical Society is continuing to preserve and maintain the historical artifacts of the Georgia Free Will Baptists. It is our hope that members of our state denomination will continue to entrust their artifacts to our care. We have added significantly to our collection and our research during 2009. The archives can be visited at the State Offices in Colquitt.

Our "Time Machine" was published in March and September in our Georgia *Promotional Bulletin*. The March installment focused on missionaries Laura Belle Barnard and Sam Wilkinson. In September, the publication focused on the personal impact that Bro. Damon Dodd made upon our denomination. Additionally, 2009 began the production of two historical booklets to be available at the State Meetings in 2010, "The Origin of Free Will Baptists in Georgia (by Daniel Williams) and "A Scriptural View of the Atonement" (a reproduction Cyrus White's letters).

Our desire is to continue to serve this denomination for years to come, but we will always need your help. Please continue to bring materials to us. Nothing historical is worthless. Before you throw anything away, let us see if we might need to add it to our collection. The Society meets semi-annually in March at the State Meeting and in September at the State Office.

If you have material to contribute to our state archive or if you are interested in being involved in this valuable work please contact Rev. Benjamin Miller, president, or Sister Geraldine Waid, Secretary.

Board of Missions Report January 1, 2009 – December 31, 2009

In the fall of 2005, the Mission Board met at St. Mark's church in Phenix City with a dream in our hearts. Our mission – plant Free Will Baptist Churches in the peach state. With some trepidation, two preachers were introduced and then interviewed.

Dr. Bill Lewis was no stranger to us; he was a member of the Albany First Church. He had pastored in Georgia, worked in the school system, and was active in his church. He would be a good fit for a church plant in Lowndes County.

A struggling congregation had donated their facility to the mission board, asking that the resources be re-invested in Lowndes County. Brother Bill utilized this facility for several months. He soon realized that a new start and location was needed. His capable leadership guided the church plant through the sale of that property, then relocating to a rental facility. After a couple of years, a 7 acre plot of land was secured, and a new building was erected on this prime Inner Perimeter Road location.

God provided a contractor to oversee the project right from the congregation. With much donated labor, resources, and supplies, the new church building in Valdosta is beautiful. To God be the glory. On December 31, 2009, the mission board officially recognized the Open Door Fellowship as a self supporting church. Please pray for the fine folks of Lowndes County as they reach their community for Christ.

In that same meeting, another man was interviewed, Dr. Bill Crank. His story was different, coming to us from Illinois. Soon the desire of his heart was revealed. He wanted to come south to Georgia, but not *too far south*. Bartow County caught his eye and soon Cartersville was his address.

A storefront building was leased and soon outgrown. Another location was found and filled. Land on Grassdale Road was found and purchased. Building began. This report is being delivered in the realization of this vision. A two-year contract extension was given to help this congregation succeed as a self supporting church.

We praise the Lord together. After only sixty months, God has blessed our state association with two solid churches under the leadership of two fine Christian men.

Subsequently, an additional church planter was brought on board to land in Harris County for a third church plant. God is working in the hearts of people in Cataula and lives are being changed. Buildings have been changed as well. One Thursday evening, a van driver drove right **into** the sanctuary, to the altar, then out the end wall. Undeterred, Bro. Hollis continues to seek the lost and encourage saints.

With the downturn in the American economy, gifts have decreased for mission work here in Georgia. We receive designated monies as well as COOP funds. We rely solely of the generosity of God's people to supply the financial needs of planting churches in the peach state.

God's plan to provide for His work is tithes and offerings. As Free Will Baptists, we have the privilege to give. God does not send a bill at the end of the month; He sends blessings as His children obey. The tithe goes to the church. Free will offerings support outside causes, like the GSAFWB Mission Board.

2010 presents us with a great opportunity. We will see what God can do and invest in His Will, or our circumstances will cloud our sight. Giving by faith is equally as rewarding as living by faith. Like the familiar song,

Trust and Obey, for there's no other way, to be happy in Jesus, but to trust and obey! Thank you for allowing us to serve you as members of the State Mission Board.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

GEORGIA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS, Inc.

PREAMBLE

We, the Free Will Baptist of the State of Georgia, do ordain this Constitution for the purpose of advocating, promoting and increasing all phases of the cause of Christ.

ARTICLE I

This assembly shall be known as the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.

Article II

SECTION 1. The officers of this association shall be Moderator, an Assistant Moderator, a Clerk, an Assistant Clerk, and an Executive Secretary/Treasurer.

SECTION 2. The Executive Board shall be composed of the regular officers; the chairman of each of the standing boards; and the previous moderator, as an ex officio member for a period of two years following his term of office; and the moderator of the District Associations not represented shall serve as members at large.

SECTION 3. This Association shall be composed of ordained Ministers, ordained Deacons, Missionaries, and Board Members who are members of affiliated bodies; one (1) delegate for every three hundred (300) members or fraction thereof from District Associations; one (1) delegate for every one hundred (100) members or fraction thereof from each local affiliated church.

SECTION 4. All delegates from District Associations and local churches shall be elected from the laity of the body sending them.

SECTION 5. Funds to meet current needs of this body shall be paid to the treasurer of this association. Each District Association will give a minimum of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per delegate authorized, and each local church will give twenty-five (\$25.00) per delegate.

SECTION 6. In order to pay our Georgia State Association's annual representation fee to the National Association, each local association is to be responsible to promote, receive and forward the amount designated by the National Association per church per year to the State Office, along with their annual State Association representation fee, on or before our annual State Association session.

ARTICLE III

SECTION 1. It shall be the privilege of each affiliated District Association to recommend a member for each standing board. Terms of office on these boards shall be on a rotating basis which will necessitate the election by the State Association of five (5) members every two (2) years, thus giving each member a four (4) year term of office.

SECTION 2. There shall be a **Board of Missions** composed of members who are noted for their missionary zeal.

A. The Board of Missions shall employ missionaries as needed to establish Free Will Baptist mission/churches in the State of Georgia. These missionaries may be employed exclusively or jointly with other Free Will Baptist agencies.

B. A mission/church sponsored by the Georgia State Association and their missionaries are under the authority of the State Association and the supervision of the Georgia State Board of Missions.

C. A mission/church does not have autonomous church status. As long as the mission/church is unable to provide for its own business, it is in a dependent relationship to the State Association and its Board of Missions.

D. When the mission/church is self-sustaining, self-governing, self-discipline, and selfpropagating. It should be organized into an autonomous Free Will Baptist Church following the procedures adopted by the Georgia State Association.

E. After proper procedures are satisfied and the church is duly organized into autonomous Free Will Baptist church it shall have all normal rights, privileges, and responsibilities of any other Free Will Baptist Church.

SECTION 3. There shall be a **Board of Camping** whose duties shall be to schedule and arrange all camp sessions, and to appoint the Camp Director each year.

SECTION 4. There shall be a Board of Christian Education whose duties shall be:

A. To provide educational services for the members of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists.

B. To set policy and supervise the functions of the State Youth Committee. This Board shall appoint this Committee to carry out Board policy.

C. To organize sponsor and promote educational and inspirational retreats for our members.

D. To organize, sponsor and promote Sunday School and Church Training seminars.

E. To set policy and supervise the Historical Committee. This Board shall appoint the Historical Committee to gather and set forth for public knowledge and posterity the history of Georgia Free Will Baptists.

SECTION 5. There shall be a **Board of Trustees** whose duties shall be; maintenance, upkeep and insuring of all State Association properties; the planning and supervision of all future developments and expansion of these properties as directed by the State Association except otherwise provided in this Constitution.

SECTION 6. There shall be a **Credentials Committee**, which shall consist of three (3) members of three-year terms. And the term of one expiring each year thereafter according to seniority of service, who shall be in charge of the registration and examination of delegates and the receiving of all dues.

SECTION 7. There shall be two members on the Board of Trustees of the Free Will Baptist Children's Home, Eldridge, Alabama, elected for terms of four (4) years. Election will take place on odd years and shall be staggered.

SECTION 8. There shall be a **Georgia State Master's Men.** They shall select their own officers and conduct their own business.

SECTION 9. There shall be a **Georgia State Woman's Auxiliary Convention (GWAC).** They shall elect their officers, conduct their business and maintain their treasury.

ARTICLE IV

SECTION 1. All officers except board members and the Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be elected to serve a term of two (2) years. The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be employed by the Executive Board of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, subject to the ratification of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists at its next regular session, for an indefinite period, with an agreement of sixty (60) day notice of termination by either the Executive Secretary/Treasurer or the Executive Board.

SECTION 2. Standing Boards of the State Association have no power of final authority to hire, full–time employees until the matter has been presented to and acted on by the State Association in session except where otherwise provided.

SECTION 3. The Executive Board may fill vacancies on any of the boards or committees, which occur between regular sessions of this State Association, until the convening of the annual session of said association.

SECTION 4. Election of all General Officers shall take place on the odd years of the calendar.

SECTION 5. If a member of any board fails in the function of his or her duty without good and sufficient reasons, the board of which the delinquent is a member may declare that particular office vacant. Further, this body shall have and does reserve the right to deal with the officer or board member who does not conduct his or her office in a Christian, business like manner according to the rules of Christian conduct as set forth in the New Testament.

Any standing board of this State Association may appoint proxies to serve in lieu of the absent members.

At the pleasure of the boards, and subsequent to the meeting from which the regular member is absent, the boards have the right to deal with the delinquent member in the manner stated in this section.

SECTION 6. The Chairman or Vice-Chairman of said board, or by the Moderator or Assistant Moderator of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, upon the request of the majority of the members of said boards, may call boards into session.

SECTION 7. An auditing Committee shall consist of three (3) members elected for three (3) three year terms.

AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be changed, altered, or amended by two-thirds (2/3) vote of all delegates present and voting at any regular session of the State Association. Prior to a final vote on any amendment, change or alteration, said amendment, change or alteration shall be submitted in writing to the Clerk of this association and shall lie on the table from one (1) business meeting to the next during the same session, during which time it shall be read at least two (2) times in open session. Officers, standing boards, and/or standing committees may be added or deleted as the need arises.

BY-LAWS

SECTION 1:

A. All real property, checking and savings account or any other assets of this Association shall be in the name of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.

B. One or more of the corporate officers of the Association shall be the legal signers of all Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. business. These officers are: the Moderator as the corporate President; the Clerk as the corporate Vice-President; and the Executive Secretary/Treasurer as the Secretary/Treasurer.

C. The State Office shall be responsible for the safekeeping of the corporate seal and all official documents of the State Association.

D. No State Board may borrow money or financially obligated the State Association without the approval of the Executive Board.

E. The fixed assets (building, land) of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists shall not be liquidated except by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the delegates present and voting at any regular session of the Association.

The Executive Board shall have the authority to approve the sale of properties donated to any Board of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc., upon recommendation of the Board to which the donation was made, with proceeds remaining under the authority of the recommending Board."

F. The records of all financial transaction shall be open to all members of the Georgia State Association. The financial transactions of the State Office and State Boards shall be audited annually.

G. Annual financial reports of the State Office and State Boards and the auditor's report shall be made to the State Association in session an be entered in the Annual State Minutes.

H. The State Treasurer shall be bonded in amount stipulated by the State Executive Board.

I. This Association shall meet for its regular session annually on the third Thursday in March.

SECTION 2.

A. When the State Association is not in session, the State Executive Board shall be duly authorized to do business in the name of the State Association.

B. The State Association has full authority to direct the State Executive Board in all business conducted on its behalf.

C. The State Executive Board shall report to the State Association in session concerning the business conducted for the State Association since its last convening.

D. The State Executive Board has the prerogative of deferring any matter to the State Association as a whole but is not under obligation to do so.

E. The State Executive Board shall meet quarterly in the following months: March, September, and December. The March meeting shall be held just prior to the regular meeting of the State Association.

F. Any and all correspondence from any member of this State Association, (includes either individual, group, Board or District Association) directed to any Board, or Chairman of said Board, or any officer of this State Association, or any open letters to any or all District Associations of this State, that pertains to any business which is desired or required to be brought before this body at any scheduled or special called meeting, shall be properly sent directly to the Clerk of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, The clerk will be responsible for routing the correspondence to its proper designation. All correspondence as mentioned above, shall be required to be received by the Clerk of the State Association at least 30 days prior to any scheduled State Association Meeting if said correspondence contains business that is to be introduced and discussed at said meeting.

SECTION 3.

A. The moderator shall preside at the Annual Session of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists and the meetings of the Executive Board. The Moderator shall be the President of the Corporation known as the *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*

B. The Assistant Moderator shall preside in the absence of the Moderator and/or when appointed by the Moderator as the need arises.

C. The Clerk shall keep records of the proceedings of the Annual Associational meeting and of the Executive Board meetings. It shall also be his responsibility to have the minutes of these sessions printed and distributed. The Clerk shall be the Vice-President of the Corporation known as *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*

D. The Assistant Clerk in the absence of the Clerk, shall fulfill the functions and duties of the Clerk as stated in paragraph C of this document.

SECTION 4.

A. The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be responsible and accountable to the Executive Board in the fulfillment of the duties of his office as determined by the Executive Board.

B. The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be allowed four (4) weeks vacation per year with pay.

C. Funds received by the Executive Secretary/Treasurer for revivals, special speaking engagements and promotional meetings shall go into the Cooperative Fund. The exception to this regulation relates to remuneration received by the Executive Secretary during his four (4) weeks vacation, which shall be his personally and need not be accounted for to this State Association.

D. Salary, mileage and operational expenses of the Executive Secretary/ Treasurer shall be determined by the Executive Board.

E. The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be the Secretary/Treasurer of the Corporation known as the *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*

F. General Promotion. He is to represent, or cause to be represented, the association at all affairs of interest to the association and he is to promote the work of the association in such a manner so as to unify the association as well as promote both the state and national works, missionaries, mission conferences, etc. Through personal communication he shall keep close contact with pastors, churches, and district association.

G. Administration. He shall administer the affairs of the executive office and carry out the responsibilities delegated to him by the State Association and the Executive Board. He is to serve with all standing boards and committees of the association in an ex-official capacity. He is to report to the association during each annual session.

H. Stewardship. He shall serve as treasurer of this association. An accurate and complete record of all funds received and disbursed shall be kept and a written report shall be included in his report to this association in its annual session. He shall receive, hold and disburse money as is made available by the State Association to the various boards. Disbursements to the various boards will be made available when requested.

I. Publication. It shall be his duty to edit and publish the state paper. He shall direct the production of general promotional materials, pamphlets, audiovisuals, and books as approved by the Executive Board.

J. Arranging State Association. He shall expedite the planning of the State Association program, enroll all ministers and delegates, print and distribute minutes, and investigate future sites for the annual session.

SECTION 5.

A. The Executive Board shall serve as the Placement Committee for the State Association. In this capacity the board shall investigate places suitable for this meeting and make recommendations to said State Association. Meeting places shall be determined two (2) years in advance.

B. The Executive Board shall plan the program for the annual meetings of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists and the annual meetings shall follow the programs as closely as possible. Business sessions shall be conducted according to the commonly accepted rules of Parliamentary Procedure.

C. The Executive Board shall formulate the budget for the State Association annually and recommend to the body in the session the allocations to be observed in the Cooperative Plan for Giving. This board shall, in addition to the above stated duties, also recommend a mileage rate for travel by the members of all standing boards in said association.

SECTION 6.

The Moderator shall appoint necessary committees unless otherwise provided for by the body.

SECTION 7.

These By-Laws may be altered, changed, or amended at any regular session of this association by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of delegates present and voting (Revised March 2010)

GEORGIA WOMEN ACTIVE FOR CHRIST ANNUAL MEETING CARTERSVILLE FAMILY CHURCH March 25, 2010

Kristen Crabtree welcomes everyone to the 2010 Session of the GWAC and led the congregation in "Come Into His Presence" and "Step by Step".

President Sandra Jackson called the 2010 session to order and asked God to bless the meeting. The voting delegates were then seated.

James Forlines, Director of International Missions, gave a report from the National Office. He highlighted the life of Laura Belle Barnard, the first FWB Missionary to India 75 years ago. He shared information about the GO10 Walk which commemorates the 75th anniversary of FWBIM, and includes walkers from Glenville, Georgia to Tulsa, Oklahoma, with stops in between, and which kicks off on Easter Sunday. Bro. James thanked the Georgia walkers, and also those who have pledged their financial and prayerful support.

Staying with the 2010 Theme of "Show Me The Path", three missionary sisters were remembered with a brief history of each of their lives. Henrietta Brown began by recounting the life of Laura Belle Barnard as she dedicated her life on the mission field of India until 1957. Terra Smith remembered Lorene Miley by chronicling her life as a missionary in the Ivory Coast until 1979. Finally, Sandy Mounts memorialized the life of Trula Cronk, who was a missionary to India from 1948 until 1973.

Sandra gave the Credentials Report reflecting 351 members paying dues for 2009, which will result in each member paying \$22.00 during 2010 to meet the Acts 1:8 goal of \$7,500.00. Everyone was reminded of the State dues of \$3.00 and National dues of \$15.00 per member. MSC to accept the Credentials Report as read. Sandra noted that GWAC membership was down for 2009 and encouraged everyone to renew their commitment to GWAC and encourage other ladies to do the same.

Sandra gave the Resolutions Report as follows:

WHEREAS, we recommend that the WNAC consider having the meeting of the WNAC National Convention at a time other than when the youth compete in order for WNAC members to support both the WNAC Convention as well as the Youth Competition;

WHEREAS, that we keep in mind and actively promote the aims and goals of our state and national WAC, namely to teach and support missions through programs with special emphasis on Seasons of Prayer, regular Bible study and ongoing Service Projects, each of these designed to better prepare us to grow in our personal commitment to Christ as well as to lead lost souls to Him while diligently supporting our missionaries.

WHEREAS, our nation is straying away from its Christian heritage; BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that our women take a stand by contacting our elected officials and opposing same sex marriages, government funded abortions, the banning of public prayers, etc., as we continue to pray for all government officials, from our local leaders through our president and all those in between, to seek and obey God's will in leading our nation back to Him.

After hearing these Resolutions, MSC to adopt each one as presented.

Henrietta Brown remembered those ladies who have gone to be with the Lord since last year's meeting: Lora Shutes, who was GWAC's first President (Union); Evelyn Temples, Doris Grant and Eleanor Sheffield (Midway); and Evalee Smart (South Georgia). Henrietta called for a moment of silence and then prayed a prayer of remembrance and thanks for these faithful ladies of Georgia.

President Sandra Jackson noted that Henrietta Brown and Donna Jewell are presently the co-editors and coordinators of the *Georgia Women in Touch* Newsletter and that it is the desire of the Executive Board to continue this project when Henrietta and Donna are no longer on the Board. Therefore, it was the Executive Board's recommendation to adopt the

following proposed Constitutional addition of officers under Article III, Section 1, and Bylaws Article 1, Section 8: Two (2) Media Coordinators who will be responsible for compiling, editing and publishing the *Georgia Women in Touch* Newsletter.

Kristen Crabtree introduced the Georgia Women Active for Christ Face Book Page so that the Georgia ladies can become "fans", and can monitor and post activities at the State, District and Local level. She thanked everyone who has already signed on as fans and encouraged everyone to get active on this site.

Carmen McKenzie gave a plea to everyone to support missions even more financially and prayerfully. MSC for GWAC to give \$2,500.00 to those participating in the GO10 Walk, which \$2,500.00 will be doubled by an anonymous donor. GEORGIA WOMEN ACTIVE FOR CHRIST Of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. Constitution and By-Laws

Article I

Name

This organization shall be known as Georgia Women Active for Christ a division of the Georgia Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc., commonly known by its initials, GWAC. Its members shall elect officers, conduct business and maintain a treasury.

Article II

Purpose

The purpose of this organization shall be to assist the various women composing the GWAC in providing opportunities to understand and fulfill the Great Commission through their responsibilities in the family, church, community, and around the world.

It shall bring the women of each district together for fellowship, sharing information, encouraging one another in the work of the Lord and furthering the purpose and goals of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists.

Article III

Officers

1. The officers of this convention shall be president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, field worker, historian, two media coordinators, and three members at large, all of which are elected by the convention. These officers shall serve as the State Executive Board. A minimum of five officers shall be a quorum for transacting business.

2. Any officer or elected board member of this convention must be an active member of a local Free Will Baptist Church and an active member of the GWAC group of a local church.

3. Executive Board members are required to attend all scheduled board meetings. Any officer missing three meetings is subject to review and removal by the Executive Board.

Article IV

Membership

1. This convention shall be composed of: the officers of the convention, district presidents, district field workers, ten delegates (duly accredited by the credentials committee) from each district convention, four delegates and the president from each local GWAC in good standing with its district convention.

2. Local groups in an area where there is no district convention may be represented with five delegates by payment of their membership dues. All delegates, as well as officers of the convention, shall be in good standing with a church that is in good standing with the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, and shall perform the duties as set forth for them in the present WNAC manual and this Constitution and By-Laws.

Article V

Meetings

1. The annual meeting shall be held each year the day before the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists convention in the same place or at such a time and place determined at the previous annual meeting or by the Executive Board.

2. A prayer retreat shall be held annually, time and place to be planned by the Executive Board.

Amendments

Article VI

This Constitution may be amended at any annual meeting of the convention by a twothirds vote of the members present.

By-Laws

Article I

Duties of Officers

President – The president shall preside over all meetings, appoint such committees as may be needed; call the Executive Board together when necessary; be ex-officio member of all committees, except the nominating committee; see that reports are sent promptly to the WNAC secretary; and perform all duties pertaining to such an office. She should see that GWAC is represented in the State Promotional Bulletin. Articles should be sent to the state executive office by the 1st of each month. She may either write the articles or ask someone to write the articles for her.

Vice President – The vice president shall preside in the absence of the president or by her request and otherwise assist her in the oversight of the work in general. She shall serve as chairman of the credentials committee.

Secretary – The secretary shall keep an accurate record of all proceedings of the convention and Executive Board meetings; preserve all valuable papers and turn same over to her successor; make an annual report to the WNAC secretary on a form available from the WNAC office within 15 days after the State GWAC Convention; compile the districts' slate of officers and addresses immediately after the convention; send a slate of state officers to the WNAC secretary and to each state officer. She is responsible for getting the minutes prepared and to the state associational office in time to be included in the state minutes each year.

Treasurer – The treasurer shall have charge of all funds belonging to this convention and shall pay out same only when authorized by the convention. The treasurer shall keep an accurate account, and give a written report of all funds received and disbursed at each annual meeting of the convention. She is required to deposit all checks in her possession and disburse all designated funds by the 30th of each month. She shall be bonded through the state office and audited annually.

Field Worker – The field worker shall promote GWAC programs through personal contact and the distribution of literature and serve where needed as directed by the Executive Board.

Historian – The historian shall keep a historical record and have a display at all state meetings and serve where needed as directed by the Executive Board.

Members at Large – The members at large shall help promote the work in general, meet with the Executive Board, and serve where needed as directed by the Executive Board.

Media Coordinators – Two Media Coordinators who will be responsible for compiling, editing and publishing the *Georgia Women in Touch* Newsletter.

Elections

Article II

A nominating committee shall nominate the general officers and members at large. Following the nominating committee's report, opportunity shall be given for nominations from the floor. In case of more than one nominee for any particular office, a vote will be taken for each; otherwise they may be elected by acclamation. The officers shall be elected every two years on odd number years. Not more than one-half of the elected officers shall be changed in any regular election. All elections shall be held at the closing sessions of the annual convention.

Article III

Expenses

Estimated expenses for the state work shall be set by an annual budget approved by the convention. The Executive Board must approve all reimbursement.

Article IV

Boards and Committees

Executive Board – This Board shall be composed of six officers and three members at large elected by the convention. Five of these shall compose a quorum. They shall hold meetings for the transaction of business as often as necessary. It shall be the duty of the Executive Board to maintain an oversight of the work at large. The Board shall act for the convention when necessary. It shall prepare the program for the regular meetings and fill any vacancy between elections.

Resolutions Committee – A resolutions committee shall be appointed by the president. A member of the Executive Board shall chair this committee. This committee shall review all resolutions presented, having the prerogative of passing on to the convention those resolutions that are deemed proper and profitable. Resolutions should be properly worded, i.e. "Be it Resolved....."

Nominating Committee – The nominating committee shall be composed of one member from each district convention and shall be elected one year prior to making their report. The names of the members from each district shall be submitted with the convention annual report. The president shall appoint a chairperson from the members of the nominating committee.

Credentials Committee – The vice president shall be the chairman of the credentials committee and the president shall appoint two other members. This committee shall examine the reports of the represented women's groups to see if fees are paid and if reports are in order.

Finance Committee – The treasurer shall be chairman of the finance committee and the president may appoint four other members. This committee reviews the financial records for the year, reports on same to the convention, and makes recommendations of disbursements of funds to the convention.

Registration Committee – The president shall appoint members as needed to serve on this committee. This committee registers those in attendance and gives a report to the convention.

Article V

Dues and Reports

Active members shall pay dues yearly as required by the GWAC Convention for membership. These dues should come through the district treasurers by January 10th following the close of the previous year. District secretaries and treasurers annual reports should be filed with the state secretary and treasurer no later than February 1 following the close of the previous year. Beginning 2002 the dues are \$12.50 per member with Georgia retaining \$2.50 per member and WNAC receiving dues of \$10.00 per member.

Article VI

<u>Gifts</u> Season of Prayer Offerings-

1. Pre-Easter Week of Prayer offering is used for Foreign Missions in memory of Laura Bell Barnard, our first foreign missionary.

2. Pre-Thanksgiving Week of Prayer offering is used for National Home Missions in memory of Mrs. Lizzie McAdams, a great writer of our literature and one of the first National officers.

3. The December Week of Prayer offering is used for State Missions in memory of Mrs. Alice E. Lupton, our first National president.

Co-Laborer Offering – A financial plan of support for WNAC. Each local GWAC is encouraged to support the WNAC office with a monthly offering.

Provision Closet - This project helps missionaries as they return home to pick up household items, etc., from the closet at the National Office. Each local GWAC is encouraged to keep abreast of the items and supplies needed as they are periodically listed in the **Co-Laborer** magazine, and give to this project as needed.

WNAC Emphasis – A special offering to supplement the Co-Laborer Offerings for WNAC expenses of operation, literature, etc. This offering is received during August.

Remembrance Fund – This is a fund established by WNAC and a distinct way to honor any occasion the donor wishes to note: Anniversaries, birthdays, or as a memorial gift at the time of death. A remembrance card notifying the family of the person being honored, and the donor, will be entered in the permanent Book of Remembrances in the WNAC office. These gifts will be used to advance the kingdom of God through WNAC. A Remembrance Service is to be conducted at our state GWAC convention each year.

Dr. Mary Ruth Wisehart Foreign Student Scholarship Fund – Any GWAC group who wishes may contribute to this special fund set up by WNAC to train Nationals from our foreign fields. February is designated as Foreign Student month.

Dot Harvey Loan Fund – This revolving loan fund was established in honor of Miss Dot Harvey, a forerunner of youth work in Georgia, by the Georgia Women's Auxiliary Convention in 1954 to aid worthy Georgia students attending Free Will Baptist Bible College. Each local group is asked to donate monthly toward this project. A special offering is received in September to add to this fund.

Westfield Church Fund –This fund is used to assist the church in Kotogiri, South India in memory of Miss Laura Bell Barnard. All groups are encouraged to give to this Georgia project monthly.

Other Gifts – The state GWAC may decide on and promote other projects for funds at its own discretion.

Lora Shutes Mission Project – This is a statewide project with the goal set each year at the annual convention. Funds are disbursed to missionaries through the State Acts 1:8 Program.

GWAC Emphasis – June is designated as GWAC Emphasis Month. Each group is asked to receive a special offering to supplement GWAC operational expenses.
