Proceedings of the 75th Annual Session

The minutes of the Seventy-Fifth Annual Session of the Georgia Association of Free Will Baptists, when convening at the First Free Will Baptist Church of Albany, Georgia, on March 17th – 18th, 2011.

WEDNESDAY EVENING WORSHIP SERVICE

The Praise Team of Colquitt Free Will Baptist Church sang a mixed selection of old and new songs as a prelude to the evening worship service.

Rev. Mark Walker, accompanied by the Albany First choir, led the congregation in singing "Take My Life and Let It Be" and "The Lily of the Valley".

Dr. Rick Cason, presiding, welcomed the congregation to the 75th Annual Session and led in an opening prayer.

The Albany Adult and Children's Choir provided special music. Congregational singing concluded with "His Eye Is On the Sparrow", and "Search Me, O God."

Dr. Rick Cason gave a moving, historical and inspirational introduction of the distinguished speaker for the evening, his dad, Dr. Mance Cason.

Using 1st Corinthians 1:21 and 2nd Timothy 4:2 as his text, Bro. Mance delivered a challenging message entitled, "The Kind of Preaching We Need in the 21st Century."

The congregation sang "Just As I Am" as an invitational hymn. National Executive

Secretary Keith Burden led in prayer.

Following a few announcements, Moderator Len Blanchard appointed the Committee on Committees as follows: Rev. S.E. Newberry (Chairman), Bro. Louis Durbin, Rev. Shane Suggs. Bro. Jack Daniel, and Bro. Gerald Moore.

The meeting was dismissed in prayer by Rev. Steve Dowless.

THURSDAY MORNING BIBLE CONFERENCE

Rev. Benjamin Miller presided over the Thursday morning Bible Conference. Rev. Grover Jewell and Rev. Wayne Miracle, with guitar and mandolin, led the assembly in several familiar hymns, including "Power in the Blood", "The Unclouded Day", and "Mansion Over the Hilltop".

Due to the recent passing of his wife's mother and grandmother, Dr. Matt Pinson was unable to speak at the Bible Conference as scheduled. National Executive Secretary Keith Burden graciously agreed to serve in Bro. Matt's stead, and he began by leading in a prayer for the Pinson family.

Taking his text from 2nd Chronicles 34:23-28, with emphasis on verse 27, Bro. Keith preached on the subject of the reasons for King Josiah's great success: his heart was tender, his humility was true, and his hearing was tuned.

After several announcements, Rev. Herbert Waid dismissed the meeting with prayer.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON BUSINESS SESSION

Call to Session & Preliminaries

The 75th Annual Session convened at 2:30 PM on Thursday afternoon. March 17. with Rev. Tim Horne leading the congregation in singing "Redeemed How I Love To Proclaim It".

Clerk Keith Lloyd officially called Session to order and introduced the Moderator, Rev. Len Blanchard, who began with a Scripture reading from Matthew 13:44.

The Moderator welcomed everyone and recognized the Standing Delegates, which includes ordained ministers and deacons, board members and missionaries.

Rev. Rick Cason gave a partial report of the Credentials Committee.

Rev. Wayne Miracle led in special prayer concerning many great needs among the people and agencies of our denomination, as well as for the people of Japan in the aftermath of the recent earthquake and tsunami.

A motion was made, seconded, and carried to seat all elected delegates.

The Moderator then recognized the national messengers and welcomed other visitors.

Clerk Keith Llovd presented the *Committee on Committees* report as follows:

A motion was made, seconded and carried to receive the report.

Executive Board Report

Clerk Keith Lloyd gave the Executive Board report, which included a proposed 2012 Cooperative Budget of \$310,000.00 and disbursement changes in the Acts 1:8 Program. A motion was made and seconded to receive the report. The motion carried.

Executive Secretary / Treasurer Report

Executive Secretary/Treasurer William Smith gave the Executive Office report. He began his report by praising God for the safety of Georgia missionaries in Japan, and by informing delegates that gifts for relief efforts can be given through the State Office.

Bro. William gave a brief history of the Georgia Association. He encouraged delegates to visit the historical archives at the State Office, and to assist the Historical Committee in gathering other artifacts.

In 2010, Acts 1:8 giving decreased by 1.65% and Cooperative gifts decreased by 6.09%. An increase in designating giving resulted in a 0.09% increase in total giving.

Bro. William thanked Sis. Margaret Daniels, Sis. Henrietta Brown, and Sis. Rhonda Chandler for their invaluable assistance in helping to fulfill State Office responsibilities. He also thanked his wife. Sis. Terra Smith. for her encouragement and support.

The Auditing Committee found all State Office records and financial reports to be in order and properly documented.

A motion was made, seconded, and carried to receive the report.

National & Other Reports

Executive Secretary Keith Burden presented a report for the *National Executive Office* and ONE magazine. Last year's National Convention in Oklahoma City was the largest ever. Because of the current financial crunch, National Convention registration fees will be moderately increased. Information concerning housing for this year's convention was given. ONE Magazine was promoted, as well as the National Leadership Conference. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to receive the report.

The **Georgia Women Active for Christ (GWAC)** report was given by current president, Sis. Sandra Jackson. Her report will be included in its entirety in the minutes of the 75th Annual Session. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to receive the report.

Sis. Elizabeth Hodges, president of the **Women Nationally Active for Christ (WNAC)**, thanked Georgia Free Will Baptists for their faithful support through the years. She spoke of the ministry's continuing commitment to a missionary support emphasis. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to receive the report.

Rev. Danny Williams reported for the *Alabama Children's Home*. Since it's beginning, over 800 children have benefited from the Home's ministry, and Georgia has always been a strong supporter. They are beginning a new ministry to help bridge adolescents into responsible, independent adult living. Renovations are being made to accommodate handicapped children. Evangelism and discipleship continue to be an important element of the Home's ministry. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to

receive the report. Bro. Danny was commended from the floor for his good work, not only at the Home, but also on the International Mission Board.

Rev. Russell Horne dismissed the business session with prayer until Friday morning.

THURSDAY EVENING WORSHIP SERVICE

The Roddenberry Sisters (Doris Roddenberry Lloyd, Latrelle Roddenberry McDowell, and Noelle McDowell) provided special music as a prelude to the evening worship service. (The older sister of the trio, Betty Roddenberry Owens, was unable to attend due to medical issues. Her niece, Noelle, filled her part in the harmony.) Of special interest was an old, "Sacred Harp", accapella rendition of "Amazing Grace".

Led by Rev. Mark Walker, the congregation sang "Revive Us Again", "Revive Us, O Lord", and "Agnus Dei". Rev. Randy Jackson, presiding, welcomed the Association and Bro. Chuck Snow led in an opening prayer.

Congregational singing concluded with the powerful hymns, "The Wonderful Cross" and "In Christ Alone". The Georgia Boys (Matt Hallman, Tim Horne, Monte McKenzie, and Mark Walker) sang a moving rendition of "I Bowed On My Knees".

Rev. Randy Jackson gave an informative introduction of the evening speaker, Rev. Keith Lloyd, the pastor the Zion Hill Church in Millwood for over 15 years.

Using 2nd Samuel 23:11-12 as his text, Bro. Keith preached a message entitled, "Victory in the Pea Patch".

The congregation sang "Bind Us Together" as an opportunity to respond to the preached Word was offered.

After announcements, the assembly was dismissed until Friday morning.

FRIDAY MORNING BUSINESS SESSION

The Friday morning business session began with Rev. Monte McKenzie leading the congregation in singing "Saved, Saved, Saved!" Assistant Moderator Wayne Miracle read from Philippians 2:1-11 and led in an opening prayer.

Reports from Home Missionaries from Georgia

Rev. Donnie Burke shared information and a brief PowerPoint presentation on the church planting endeavor in **Castlerock, Colorado**. The name of the new work will be *Truth Free Will Baptist Church*. Average attendance in the preview services is 31. The Burke's anticipate being joined soon by other team members, the McCraney's, as soon as they finish their itinerate work. They will be leasing a temporary meeting location from Academy Charter School. Bro. Donnie thanked Georgia for its support, especially for including them in the Georgia Acts 1:8 Progam.

Rev. Barry Long brought news on the progress of the new church plant in **Aurora, Colorado**. A DVD of testimonials from those involved in preliminary Bible studies was made available. They are averaging just over 20 people each week in these studies, which are being held in their home while they search for a facility to rent. Bro. Barry thanked Georgia for their prayers and financial support.

Georgia Association Board Reports

Board of Trustees Report

Rev. Russell Horne gave the report for the Board of Trustees. The Board has received title to the property of the First Free Will Baptist Church in Bainbridge. Proceeds from the property rental are currently being directed into the Trustee Board account.

This report and the financial report are included in the Digest of Reports. A motion was made, seconded and carried to receive this report as information.

Board of Camping Report

Rev. Mark Walker gave the report for the Board of Camping. Teen camp was a huge success, with a large number of campers and many decisions for Christ. Camp Director James Judkins and Camp Evangelist Tommy Swindoll did a great job. Bro. Mark also thanked all the volunteer workers who help make Teen Camp possible. The 2011 Teen Camp will be held on June 5-10 at Camp Echeconnee.

In response to the recent Camp Board budget crunch, Junior Camp grants were reduced from \$1600.00 to \$1000.00 per association. Bro. Mark suggested that districts may consider combining their Junior Camp programs.

This report and the financial report are included in the Digest of Reports. A motion was made, seconded and carried to receive the report as information.

Board of Christian Education

Rev. Randy Jackson gave a report for the Board of Christian Education. The board continues to plan and promote very successful State Retreats, and the organizing and oversight of the popular State Youth Competition. Competition winners are listed in the Digest of Reports.

The board continues to receive positive feedback from the work of the Historical Society, especially in regard to the Time Machine articles which are regularly published in the Promotional Bulletin.

Charles Clark Scholarships were awarded to nine (9) Free Will Baptist Bible College students from Georgia in 2010.

This report and the financial report are included in the Digest of Reports. A motion was made, seconded and carried to receive the report as information.

Board of Missions Report

Rev. Paul Creech gave the Board of Missions report. Georgia church planting efforts continue to experience growth. He encouraged delegates to speak with Georgia church planters Bill Crank and Jay Hollis for a personal perspective on what is happening. Budget shortfalls required these two men to take a 10% cut in pay during the last quarter of 2010. To their credit and commendation, both were committed to stay on task.

On behalf of the Board, Bro. Paul pledged to be good stewards of the financial resources entrusted to Georgia church planting efforts.

Special prayer was offered by Moderator Len Blanchard for Rev. Bill Crank and his family, who were unable to attend the meeting due to family medical issues. Bro. Paul then read a letter of resignation from Rev. Bill Crank, effective June 30, 2011.

This report and the financial report are included in the Digest of Reports. A motion was made and seconded to receive this report as information.

A question was raised by Rev. Billy Hanna concerning the inclusion of the Georgia Mission Board into the Acts 1:8 Program and what affect it had on our giving to the Global Evangelism Fund. Executive Secretary William Smith clarified that the percentage of disbursement to Home Missionaries from Georgia had been affected, but not the International Missions disbursement. Bro. Billy expressed concern about the effect of adding other missionaries when it negatively impacts missionaries whom we are already committed to support.

After questions and comments, the motion was carried.

National Convention Delegates

The following volunteered to serve as Georgia's delegates at the 2011 Free Will Baptist National Convention to be held in Charlotte, NC: June Hersey, Fleda Snow, and Edwina Drinkwater. A motion was made to appoint these three and that the Executive Secretary has authority to appoint additional and/or alternate delegates as necessary. The motion was seconded and carried.

National & Other Reports Continued

Bro. Ray Lewis reported for the **Board of Retirement and Insurance**. He began by thanking Georgia for its involvement and support. 2010 was a good year, with nearly a 13% return for those involved in the retirement program. The goal of the board is to "serve those who serve others". A motion was made, seconded, and carried to receive the report as information.

Bro. Ken Akers gave a report on behalf of *Master's Men*. He thanked Georgia churches for their support. The agency is currently focused on encouraging a mentoring-style discipleship among men. Information was given on several mission work related projects. Bro. Ken asked churches to consider a special Father's Day offering for Master's Men. The agency will again be actively involved in evangelism outreach during the National Convention in Charlotte. Disaster relief efforts continue to be an important aspect of the Master's Men ministry. The Annual Golf and Softball Tournaments are crucial to the agency's fundraising efforts. As an incentive to bring more churches on board, new chapters are being offered their first year dues free. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to receive the report as information.

Rev. Larry Powell gave a report from the *Home Missions Department*. He thanked Georgia for the Acts 1:8 Program and other designated giving which currently supports 15 missionaries serving under the department. Special prayer was requested for Chaplain David Spears. A motion was made and seconded to receive the report as information. Bro. Chuck Snow requested that Tim and Lori Byers be permitted, at some point in the session,

to share information concerning their work in Ohio. The Moderator assured they were on the afternoon agenda. The motion carried.

The business session dismissed for a brief recess before the morning worship service.

FRIDAY MORNING WORSHIP SESSION

The session reassembled with Rev. Monte McKenzie leading the congregation in singing "Since Jesus Came Into My Heart" and "When We All Get to Heaven".

Rev. Len Blanchard introduced the speaker for the morning, Rev. Chris Rumfelt, pastor of the First Free Will Baptist Church of Hayesville, North Carolina.

Sis. Henrietta Brown ministered to the congregation with a solo special entitled, "Power in His Name".

Following the special music, Bro. Chris preached an encouraging message from 1st Peter 5:7 on the subject of "Recognizing and Assisting a Victim of Spiritual Stroke".

Rev. Tim Horne led the congregation in "Search Me, O God" as an invitation to respond to the preached Word was given.

Bro. Gerald Moore offered a dismissal prayer. The session recessed for lunch, with business scheduled to resume at 2:00 PM.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON WORSHIP SESSION

The session reconvened at 2:00 PM with Rev. Dale McCoy leading in prayer. Clerk Keith Lloyd read a selection of Scripture from 1st Corinthians 4:1-2.

National and Other Reports continued

Bro. David Brown reported for the *Free Will Baptist Foundation*. Georgia Free Will Baptists are among the most well represented participants in the Foundation's ministry. Endowments are already providing major support to denominational ministries and, as more people become involved, that support will continue to grow. Bro. Brown encouraged delegates to visit the website for additional information. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to receive the report as information.

The *Free Will Baptist Bible College* report was given by Bro. David Williford. In spite of economic challenges and overall enrollment decreases, the number of young men enrolled in the pastoral ministry track has grown. All costs associated with attending the college have been frozen, including tuition and housing, in an effort to make the college more accessible during these financially difficult times. The college continues to expand the programs it offers, and is currently engaged in a feasibility study regarding changing the name of the college to more adequately reflect this expansion. A motion was made and seconded to receive the report as information. Bro. Chuck Snow asked Bro. David to share information regarding the new Bert & Dianne Tippet Scholarship Fund. After doing so, the motion was carried.

Rev. Tim Owen reported for *Randall House Publications*. Appreciation was expressed for those churches which purchase curriculum, materials, and books. Bro. Tim encouraged the use of a new, downloadable Bible study resource called "Access". A motion was made and seconded to receive the report as information. Rev. Dale McCoy asked Bro. Tim to share information regarding a new adult Bible study series called "Heritage", which is currently being edited and assembled in cooperation with Rev. Dale Burden. After sharing this information, the motion carried.

The *International Missions Department* report was given by Rev. Paul Creech. Heath and Joni Hubbard were allowed to share briefly concerning their appointment to serve in Spain. Nathan and Linda Snow submitted a newsletter outlining how Georgia Free Will Baptists can assist in the current earthquake and tsunami relief efforts in Japan. Dale and Sandra Bishop send a letter expressing appreciation for the show of support and prayers in regard to the crisis in Japan. Bro. Paul reported on the exciting success of Free Will Baptist mission works around the world. The World Mission's Offering was promoted as being critical to the continuance of these great works. International Missions is currently

undergoing a change in leadership. At the request of the board, General Director James Forlines has submitted his resignation; Clint Morgan is currently serving as the interim General Director until a suitable replacement is found. Fervent prayer and sacrificial giving is essential to keeping missionaries on the field of service, and the International Mission Board is committed to do whatever is necessary to keep them there. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to receive the report as information.

Rev. Ron Wallace reported on the mission work in **Fairbanks, Alaska**. A local man has been filling in for Bro. Ron in his absence. It is their prayer than this man will soon assume the role of pastor. Thanks were extended to Georgia for their long-term support of this mission effort.

Rev. Tim Byers, missionary to **Ashtabula, Ohio**, reported that the church there is doing well. Most of the congregants have been converted to Christ under the church's ministry. He thanked Georgia Free Will Baptists for their prayer and support.

The **South Carolina Children's Home** report was given by Rev. Todd Parrish. He has served as the Home's Director since October 2009. They averaged 26 children in 2010. Three dorms are currently open and running. The Home is debt free and finished last year under budget and in the black. They are also now a state-licensed facility. He invited delegates to visit the Home and see first-hand the ministry operation. A newsletter is being published to keep churches more informed of activities and needs. Bro. Todd shared a touching personal story of troubled young man who recently accepted Christ through the ministry of the Home. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to receive the report as information.

Resolutions Committee Report

Representing the Resolutions Committee, Rev. Ron Wallace presented the following resolutions for the Association's approval and action:

- 1. "Whereas, First Free Will Baptist Church, Albany, Georgia, has been a warm and gracious host of the 75th Annual Session of the Georgia State Association; Be it therefore resolved, that we express our deep appreciation and gratitude to the pastor and church family by a rising vote of thanks."
- 2. "Whereas, the nation of Japan has suffered great damage and loss of life resulting from the recent earthquake and tsunami, and, face the possibility of additional hazards from damaged nuclear reactors; Be it therefore resolved, that constant prayer and fasting be made from our churches; and, that relief funds be generously given on behalf of the people of Japan; and, that our pastors and churches under gird our missionaries to Japan through prayer and encouragement."
- 3. "Whereas, many of our churches are without pastors, and are in great need; Be it therefore resolved, that the pastors and churches of the Georgia Association of Free Will Baptists pray for our sister churches, that God will supply the men to meet this great need."

A motion was made, seconded and carried to approve the 1st resolution. The resolution was acted upon accordingly.

A motion was made, seconded and carried to approve and act upon the 2nd resolution. A motion was made, seconded and carried to approve and act upon the 3rd resolution.

Final Report of the Nominating Committee

Clerk Keith Lloyd read the following nominations from the committee:

Ben Clenney was nominated to serve on the Auditing Committee for a term to expire in 2014. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to approve the nomination.

Rev. Dale McCoy was nominated to replace Rev. Rick Cason on the Credentials Committee for a term to expire in 2014. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to approve the nomination.

Rev. Wayne Miracle was nominated to replace Rev. Len Blanchard as the Moderator for a term to expire in 2013; Rev. Rick Cason was nominated to replace Rev. Wayne Miracle as the Assistant Moderator for a term to expire in 2013; Rev. Keith Lloyd was nominated to serve as the Clerk for a term to expire in 2013; and, Rev. Tim Horne was nominated to serve as the Assistant Clerk for a term to expire in 2013. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to approve these nominations by acclamation.

Several announcements were made by Executive Secretary William Smith. At the recommendation of Rev. Herbert Waid, a round of applause was given in appreciation for Rev. Len Blanchard's faithful service as the Moderator of the Association. Bro. Len will be relocating to northern Alabama to serve as a church planter.

Rev. Paul Smith dismissed the session in prayer.

FRIDAY EVENING WORSHIP SESSION

The "Sounds of Praise" from the Albany Church provided beautiful and inspiring special music as a prelude to the evening worship service.

Presiding over the evening worship service, Rev. William Smith welcomed the congregation to the 75th Annual Session Celebration Worship Service, with a theme of "*Remembering the Past, Living in the Present, Looking to the Future*".

Newly elected Moderator, Rev. Wayne Miracle, gave special recognition to former Moderator, Rev. Len Blanchard, for his eight faithful years of service. The congregation honored him with a standing ovation. Bro. Len expressed his love for Georgia Free Will Baptists. A plaque commemorating his service will be forthcoming.

With a solo part by Matt Hallman, the Association Choir sang "We Will Remember". Rev. Mark Walker, representing the Camp Board, shared interesting information on the

past, present, and future of the camping ministry of the Georgia Association.

Rev. Randy Jackson, representing the Christian Education Board, gave an informative presentation concerning the various ministries and endeavors which the board had been involved in through the years. The board is currently promoting state retreats, youth competitions, and pastoral education experiences, and is always looking for ways to expand Christian education opportunities within the Association.

With an introductory solo by Rev. Mark Walker, the congregation joined together in "Victory in Jesus", followed by the choir singing "I'll Have a New Life".

Sis. Lucy Hyman and Sis. Joni Thomas Hubband sang the verses of "The Longer I Serve Him", and were joined in the chorus by the choir. Sis. Joni Thomas Hubbard and Sis. Donna Walker sang "Poor Wayfaring Stranger". The choir followed with "Let the Redeemed Sav So".

The Anniversary Celebration concluded with the choir singing "Because We Believe" and "The Church Triumphant", with Rev. Len Blanchard delivering a powerful recitation concerning the ever-enduring and eternally-alive Church of Jesus Christ.

Rev. William Smith made brief closing remarks and dismissed the 75th Annual Session of the Georgia Association of Free Will Baptists with a blessing.

Final Credentials Committee Report

Rev. Rick Cason submitted the final report of the Credentials Committee as follows: 56 standing delegates and 17 elected delegates for a total voting delegation of 73. There were also 38 visitors registered for a total registration of 111. The Friday evening attendance was 170. (Sis. Henrietta Brown and Sis. Donna Jewell also served on this year's Credentials Committee.)

Executive Secretary/Treasurer Report

January 1, 2010 - December 31, 2010

Welcome to the Seventy-fifth annual session of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. This year we celebrate our seventy-fifth annual session and seventy six years of service for the Lord as a State Association. We have gathered to conduct our state association business and receive reports from our state boards and national agencies. God richly blessed our state during 2010.

The board reports and all financial reports cover the period of January 1, 2010 – December 31, 2010.

Thank you for your faithful support during 2010. Receipts through the State Office totaled \$920,438.62. Of this amount \$299,189.65 was *Cooperative Receipts*, \$213,448.86 was *Georgia Acts 1:8 Receipts*, and \$407,800.11 was *Designated Receipts*. We had a decrease of \$19,389.99 or 6.09% in *Cooperative Receipts*, a decrease of \$3,574.12 or 1.65% in *Georgia Acts 1:8 Receipts*, and an increase of \$8.293.53 or 0.09% in total giving.

Your faithfulness to support the *Georgia Cooperative Plan* and the *Georgia Acts 1:8 Plan* makes it possible for the gospel to be shared in foreign countries, new churches to be planted in our state, and Georgia students to attend Free Will Baptist Bible College. You also help fund eight sessions of youth camp, five retreats and the retirement program for Georgia pastors. By supporting these two plans you are supporting every phase of the state work and all of the national departments except for Randall House Publications.

We are aware of the economic conditions of our country. This was reflected in our giving the last two years. The decline in our giving and the unsure economic future presents us with many challenges. This past year we had to cut my salary along with the salaries of Bill Crank and Jay Hollis to maintain a healthy cash flow. After making deep budget cuts we were able to restore all salaries to previous levels beginning January 1, 2011. We will not and cannot operate with the philosophy that "we can spend money that we do not have." We will be diligent when if comes to spending your money.

Georgia Free Will Baptists gave of total of \$1,141,009.93 or \$142.47 per member to district, state, and national ministries. This is amazing when you consider the times in which we live. Thank you for your faithful support. We are confident that God will supply all our needs.

I thank God for giving me the opportunity to serve Him in the **Great State of Georgia**. It is hard to believe I have served in the state office for over thirteen years. Thank you for your support and your continued prayers.

Georgia State Budget

A 2011 Georgia State *Cooperative Budget* of \$305,000.00, a 2011 Acts 1:8 Budget of \$215,000.00 and an estimated \$305,000.00 in *Designated Giving* is included in the overall budget. You will find the proposed 2012 *Cooperative Budget* of \$310,000.00 included with this report on page 7 for your approval.

Georgia Acts 1:8 Program

Due to significant Cooperative Budget shortfalls, the Board placed the Georgia Mission Board into the 2011 Acts 1:8 Budget. The disbursement of 2011 Acts 1:8 receipts will be divided as follows: 65% to the Global Evangelism Fund, 25% to the Georgia Mission Board, and 2% each to Home Missionaries Josh Bennett, Donnie Burke, Jeff Goodman, Barry Long, and Ron Wallace.

Property Acquisition

The property formerly owned by the First FWB Church of Bainbridge has been deeded to the State Association, with stipulations regarding the distribution of funds upon its future sale. The building is currently being rented with proceeds directed to the Board of Trustees account.

2019 NAFWB Convention

Negotiations are being made with the Cobb County Galleria for the possibility of hosting the 2019 NAFWB Convention.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

GEORGIA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS, Inc.

PREAMBLE

We, the Free Will Baptist of the State of Georgia, do ordain this Constitution for the purpose of advocating, promoting and increasing all phases of the cause of Christ.

ARTICLE I

This assembly shall be known as the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.

Article II

- **SECTION 1.** The officers of this association shall be Moderator, an Assistant Moderator, a Clerk, an Assistant Clerk, and an Executive Secretary/Treasurer.
- **SECTION 2.** The Executive Board shall be composed of the regular officers; the chairman of each of the standing boards; and the previous moderator, as an ex officio member for a period of two years following his term of office; and the moderator of the District Associations not represented shall serve as members at large.
- **SECTION 3.** This Association shall be composed of ordained Ministers, ordained Deacons, Missionaries, and Board Members who are members of affiliated bodies; one (1) delegate for every three hundred (300) members or fraction thereof from District Associations; one (1) delegate for every one hundred (100) members or fraction thereof from each local affiliated church.
- **SECTION 4.** All delegates from District Associations and local churches shall be elected from the laity of the body sending them.
- **SECTION 5.** Funds to meet current needs of this body shall be paid to the treasurer of this association. Each District Association will give a minimum of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per delegate authorized, and each local church will give twenty-five (\$25.00) per delegate.
- **SECTION 6.** In order to pay our Georgia State Association's annual representation fee to the National Association, each local association is to be responsible to promote, receive and forward the amount designated by the National Association per church per year to the State Office, along with their annual State Association representation fee, on or before our annual State Association session

ARTICLE III

- **SECTION 1.** It shall be the privilege of each affiliated District Association to recommend a member for each standing board. Terms of office on these boards shall be on a rotating basis which will necessitate the election by the State Association of five (5) members every two (2) years, thus giving each member a four (4) year term of office.
- **SECTION 2.** There shall be a **Board of Missions** composed of members who are noted for their missionary zeal.

- **A.** The Board of Missions shall employ missionaries as needed to establish Free Will Baptist mission/churches in the State of Georgia. These missionaries may be employed exclusively or jointly with other Free Will Baptist agencies.
- **B.** A mission/church sponsored by the Georgia State Association and their missionaries are under the authority of the State Association and the supervision of the Georgia State Board of Missions.
- **C.** A mission/church does not have autonomous church status. As long as the mission/church is unable to provide for its own business, it is in a dependent relationship to the State Association and its Board of Missions.
- **D.** When the mission/church is self-sustaining, self-governing, self-discipline, and self-propagating. It should be organized into an autonomous Free Will Baptist Church following the procedures adopted by the Georgia State Association.
- **E.** After proper procedures are satisfied and the church is duly organized into autonomous Free Will Baptist church it shall have all normal rights, privileges, and responsibilities of any other Free Will Baptist Church.
- **SECTION 3.** There shall be a **Board of Camping** whose duties shall be to schedule and arrange all camp sessions, and to appoint the Camp Director each year.
- **SECTION 4.** There shall be a **Board of Christian Education** whose duties shall be:
- **A.** To provide educational services for the members of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists.
- **B.** To set policy and supervise the functions of the State Youth Committee. This Board shall appoint this Committee to carry out Board policy.
- **C.** To organize sponsor and promote educational and inspirational retreats for our members.
 - D. To organize, sponsor and promote Sunday School and Church Training seminars.
- **E.** To set policy and supervise the Historical Committee. This Board shall appoint the Historical Committee to gather and set forth for public knowledge and posterity the history of Georgia Free Will Baptists.
- **SECTION 5.** There shall be a **Board of Trustees** whose duties shall be; maintenance, upkeep and insuring of all State Association properties; the planning and supervision of all future developments and expansion of these properties as directed by the State Association except otherwise provided in this Constitution.
- **SECTION 6.** There shall be a **Credentials Committee**, which shall consist of three (3) members of three-year terms. And the term of one expiring each year thereafter according to seniority of service, who shall be in charge of the registration and examination of delegates and the receiving of all dues.
- **SECTION 7.** There shall be two members on the Board of Trustees of the Free Will Baptist Children's Home, Eldridge, Alabama, elected for terms of four (4) years. Election will take place on odd years and shall be staggered.
- **SECTION 8.** There shall be a **Georgia State Master's Men.** They shall select their own officers and conduct their own business.

SECTION 9. There shall be a **Georgia State Woman's Auxiliary Convention (GWAC)**. They shall elect their officers, conduct their business and maintain their treasury.

ARTICLE IV

- **SECTION 1.** All officers except board members and the Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be elected to serve a term of two (2) years. The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be employed by the Executive Board of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, subject to the ratification of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists at its next regular session, for an indefinite period, with an agreement of sixty (60) day notice of termination by either the Executive Secretary/Treasurer or the Executive Board.
- **SECTION 2.** Standing Boards of the State Association have no power of final authority to hire, full–time employees until the matter has been presented to and acted on by the State Association in session except where otherwise provided.
- **SECTION 3.** The Executive Board may fill vacancies on any of the boards or committees, which occur between regular sessions of this State Association, until the convening of the annual session of said association.
- **SECTION 4.** Election of all General Officers shall take place on the odd years of the calendar.
- **SECTION 5.** If a member of any board fails in the function of his or her duty without good and sufficient reasons, the board of which the delinquent is a member may declare that particular office vacant. Further, this body shall have and does reserve the right to deal with the officer or board member who does not conduct his or her office in a Christian, business like manner according to the rules of Christian conduct as set forth in the New Testament.

Any standing board of this State Association may appoint proxies to serve in lieu of the absent members.

At the pleasure of the boards, and subsequent to the meeting from which the regular member is absent, the boards have the right to deal with the delinquent member in the manner stated in this section.

SECTION 6. The Chairman or Vice-Chairman of said board, or by the Moderator or Assistant Moderator of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, upon the request of the majority of the members of said boards, may call boards into session.

SECTION 7. An auditing Committee shall consist of three (3) members elected for three (3) three year terms.

AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be changed, altered, or amended by two-thirds (2/3) vote of all delegates present and voting at any regular session of the State Association. Prior to a final vote on any amendment, change or alteration, said amendment, change or alteration shall be submitted in writing to the Clerk of this association and shall lie on the table from one (1) business meeting to the next during the same session, during which time it shall be read at least two (2) times in open session. Officers, standing boards, and/or standing committees may be added or deleted as the need arises.

BY-LAWS

SECTION 1:

- **A.** All real property, checking and savings account or any other assets of this Association shall be in the name of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.
- **B.** One or more of the corporate officers of the Association shall be the legal signers of all Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. business. These officers are: the Moderator as the corporate President; the Clerk as the corporate Vice-President; and the Executive Secretary/Treasurer as the Secretary/Treasurer.
- **C.** The State Office shall be responsible for the safekeeping of the corporate seal and all official documents of the State Association.
- **D.** No State Board may borrow money or financially obligated the State Association without the approval of the Executive Board.
- **E.** The fixed assets (building, land) of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists shall not be liquidated except by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the delegates present and voting at any regular session of the Association.
- The Executive Board shall have the authority to approve the sale of properties donated to any Board of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc., upon recommendation of the Board to which the donation was made, with proceeds remaining under the authority of the recommending Board."
- **F.** The records of all financial transaction shall be open to all members of the Georgia State Association. The financial transactions of the State Office and State Boards shall be audited annually.
- **G.** Annual financial reports of the State Office and State Boards and the auditor's report shall be made to the State Association in session an be entered in the Annual State Minutes.
- **H.** The State Treasurer shall be bonded in amount stipulated by the State Executive Board
- I. This Association shall meet for its regular session annually on the third Thursday in March.

SECTION 2.

- **A.** When the State Association is not in session, the State Executive Board shall be duly authorized to do business in the name of the State Association.
- **B.** The State Association has full authority to direct the State Executive Board in all business conducted on its behalf.
- **C.** The State Executive Board shall report to the State Association in session concerning the business conducted for the State Association since its last convening.
- **D.** The State Executive Board has the prerogative of deferring any matter to the State Association as a whole but is not under obligation to do so.
- **E.** The State Executive Board shall meet quarterly in the following months: March, September, and December. The March meeting shall be held just prior to the regular meeting of the State Association.

F. Any and all correspondence from any member of this State Association, (includes either individual, group, Board or District Association) directed to any Board, or Chairman of said Board, or any officer of this State Association, or any open letters to any or all District Associations of this State, that pertains to any business which is desired or required to be brought before this body at any scheduled or special called meeting, shall be properly sent directly to the Clerk of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, The clerk will be responsible for routing the correspondence to its proper designation. All correspondence as mentioned above, shall be required to be received by the Clerk of the State Association at least 30 days prior to any scheduled State Association Meeting if said correspondence contains business that is to be introduced and discussed at said meeting.

SECTION 3.

- **A.** The moderator shall preside at the Annual Session of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists and the meetings of the Executive Board. The Moderator shall be the President of the Corporation known as the *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*
- **B.** The Assistant Moderator shall preside in the absence of the Moderator and/or when appointed by the Moderator as the need arises.
- **C.** The Clerk shall keep records of the proceedings of the Annual Associational meeting and of the Executive Board meetings. It shall also be his responsibility to have the minutes of these sessions printed and distributed. The Clerk shall be the Vice-President of the Corporation known as *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*
- **D.** The Assistant Clerk in the absence of the Clerk, shall fulfill the functions and duties of the Clerk as stated in paragraph C of this document.

SECTION 4.

- **A.** The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be responsible and accountable to the Executive Board in the fulfillment of the duties of his office as determined by the Executive Board.
- **B.** The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be allowed four (4) weeks vacation per year with pay.
- **C.** Funds received by the Executive Secretary/Treasurer for revivals, special speaking engagements and promotional meetings shall go into the Cooperative Fund. The exception to this regulation relates to remuneration received by the Executive Secretary during his four (4) weeks vacation, which shall be his personally and need not be accounted for to this State Association.
- **D.** Salary, mileage and operational expenses of the Executive Secretary/ Treasurer shall be determined by the Executive Board.
- **E.** The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be the Secretary/Treasurer of the Corporation known as the *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*
- **F. General Promotion.** He is to represent, or cause to be represented, the association at all affairs of interest to the association and he is to promote the work of the association in such a manner so as to unify the association as well as promote both the state and national works, missionaries, mission conferences, etc. Through personal communication he shall keep close contact with pastors, churches, and district association.

- **G. Administration.** He shall administer the affairs of the executive office and carry out the responsibilities delegated to him by the State Association and the Executive Board. He is to serve with all standing boards and committees of the association in an ex-official capacity. He is to report to the association during each annual session.
- **H. Stewardship.** He shall serve as treasurer of this association. An accurate and complete record of all funds received and disbursed shall be kept and a written report shall be included in his report to this association in its annual session. He shall receive, hold and disburse money as is made available by the State Association to the various boards. Disbursements to the various boards will be made available when requested.
- **I. Publication.** It shall be his duty to edit and publish the state paper. He shall direct the production of general promotional materials, pamphlets, audiovisuals, and books as approved by the Executive Board.
- **J. Arranging State Association.** He shall expedite the planning of the State Association program, enroll all ministers and delegates, print and distribute minutes, and investigate future sites for the annual session.

SECTION 5.

- **A.** The Executive Board shall serve as the Placement Committee for the State Association. In this capacity the board shall investigate places suitable for this meeting and make recommendations to said State Association. Meeting places shall be determined two (2) years in advance.
- **B.** The Executive Board shall plan the program for the annual meetings of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists and the annual meetings shall follow the programs as closely as possible. Business sessions shall be conducted according to the commonly accepted rules of Parliamentary Procedure.
- **C.** The Executive Board shall formulate the budget for the State Association annually and recommend to the body in the session the allocations to be observed in the Cooperative Plan for Giving. This board shall, in addition to the above stated duties, also recommend a mileage rate for travel by the members of all standing boards in said association.

SECTION 6.

The Moderator shall appoint necessary committees unless otherwise provided for by the body.

SECTION 7.

These By-Laws may be altered, changed, or amended at any regular session of this association by two-thirds (2/3) vote of delegates present and voting (Revised March 2010)

GEORGIA WOMEN ACTIVE FOR CHRIST ANNUAL MEETING ALBANY FIRST FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH March 17, 2011

Leslie Baldridge opened the service as we sang "His Name is Wonderful" and "Jesus Name Above All Names". Christine Daniel welcomed everyone to the 2011 Session of the GWAC, and opened the session in prayer. President Sandra Jackson called the 2011 session to order and the voting delegates were seated.

Fred Hersey gave a report from International Missions and talked about the coin bank program which supports institutes on the foreign field.

Sandra led a special prayer for Bessie Richards who is having surgery today, our missionaries in Japan, and Debbie Griffin and her mother.

Lynda Blanchard gave the Treasurer's Report, showing a balance as of December 31, 2010 of \$6,577.48. She was glad to report that we exceeded our 2010 \$7,500.00 state project goal of over \$9,000.00. The Treasurer's Report was adopted.

Leslie Baldridge gave the Credentials Report: 58 registered, including 6 districts, 26 delegates, 7 state officers, 1 minister, 22 visitors, and 2 missionaries. The report was adopted as information.

Sandra made committee appointments and we took a break while we enjoyed a power point presentation of 75 years of GWAC history. When we reconvened, Leslie led the congregation in "How Majestic is Your Name".

Sandra introduced Elizabeth Hodges, newly elected WNAC Executive Director. Elizabeth stated that Georgia Women are 2^{nd} in giving and 4^{th} in membership nationally. She gave a power point presentation of WNAC history. The 20/20/20 project was completed with a total amount given of \$53,592.28. Shine 75 Project began in 2010, the goal of which is to raise \$75,000.00, which will be divided among three Hispanic institutes. She told of other works that are ongoing at the national level with the help of the WAC groups nationwide. WAC ladies (total of (4,996 members) gave \$560,103.32 last year.

Debbie Griffin gave a report about her mother and the ongoing work in Japan. Debbie has taken a two-month leave of absence due to her mother's failing health. She asked for prayer as she makes the decision of whether or not to stay home permanently with her mother. She also asked everyone to pray that the earthquake/tsunami aftermath will give our missionaries new opportunities to reach the lost people in Japan. She praised the Lord for keeping our missionaries safe.

Carmen McKenzie remembered those ladies who have gone on to be with the Lord in 2010: Mary Harper (South Georgia), Eudene Boyd (Martin), Doris Grant (Midway), Mary Davis (Travelers Rest Church), Christine Hathcock (Spring Hill Church), and Janice Ursury (South Georgia). Carmen asked everyone to submit obituary information that can be included in a power point presentation.

Terra Smith gave the Resolutions Report as follows:

WHEREAS, we recommend that the WNAC consider having the meeting of the WNAC National Convention at a time other than when the youth compete in order for WNAC members to support both the WNAC Convention as well as the Youth Competition; (It was noted that this Resolution was presented last year and it was not necessary to act on this resolution — also, Elizabeth Hodges stated that the National Executive Committee addressed this issue and decided that there will be no WNAC activities at the National on

Monday and Tuesday's sessions will begin at 8:00 a.m. with a 10-minute break between each one in order to give opportunity to go to youth competitions.)

WHEREAS, the GWAC Executive Committee recommended that the body consider combining its annual meeting time with the annual prayer retreat. This allows optimum participation from our women, whereas lodging, transportation costs and speaker costs are reduced, time away from personal responsibilities is minimized, our retreats draw the largest attendance and participants would be more informed and more involved in the State work.

(There was a motion to discuss this change, some for and some against. After giving ample opportunity for everyone to respond, MSC to table until next year to give the Executive Board to give proper consideration to this matter.)

BE IT RESOLVED that we give the First Free Will Baptist Church of Albany a rising vote of thanks for hosting the GWAC State Meeting. MSC by everyone standing.

Lynda Blanchard gave the finance report: balance on hand in the treasury as of December 31, 2010 is \$6,577.48, GWAC (2011) Convention Offering - \$656.90, sub-total:- \$7,234.38; honorarium and travel expense for 2010 speakers: \$300.00; final total: \$6,934.38. MSC to accept the finance report and include in the State Minute Book.

Debra Van Pelt gave the Nominating Committee Report, with the following recommendations for 2011-2013 Executive Board: President: Sandra Jackson; Vice President: Debbie Cason; Secretary: Leslie Baldridge; Treasurer: Linda Gay; Field Worker: Sheila McCardle; Historian: Becky Woods; Members at Large: Carmen McKenzie, Sheree Parker, Terra Smith; Communications Coordinators: Henrietta Brown, Donna Jewell. There were not further nominations from the floor and the slate of officers was duly elected with a motion, second and unanimous vote in favor of the new Executive Board.

The 2011 budget was approved to remain the same as the 2010 budget.

Delegates to the National: Edwina Drinkwater, Fleda Snow, June Hersey, Christine Daniel, Jamie Suggs, Leslie Baldridge, Henrietta Brown, Geraldine Waid. Fleda Snow agreed to serve on the National Nominating Committee.

Sandra recognized all of the past presidents in attendance: Janice Wallace, Fleda Snow, Debra Van Pelt. Martha Everson.

MSC to dismiss the business session.

When we reconvened to the worship service, we opened by singing "Great is They Faithfulness" and Len Blanchard opened in prayer, and we took an offering. Celebrating 75 years of GWAC, Geraldine Waid and Martha Everson gave a history of all phases of the GWAC. Ron and Janice Wallace were guest speakers – Janice read Luke 10:2, and reminded us that God is still calling forth laborers. Ron read Romans 12: 6-16, outlining various ministry gifts. He emphasized that the main focus of WAC is still missions, and challenged us to continue supporting our missionaries.

GEORGIA WOMEN ACTIVE FOR CHRIST Of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. Constitution and By-Laws

Article I

Name

This organization shall be known as Georgia Women Active for Christ a division of the Georgia Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc., commonly known by its initials, GWAC. Its members shall elect officers, conduct business and maintain a treasury.

Article II

Purpose

The purpose of this organization shall be to assist the various women composing the GWAC in providing opportunities to understand and fulfill the Great Commission through their responsibilities in the family, church, community, and around the world.

It shall bring the women of each district together for fellowship, sharing information, encouraging one another in the work of the Lord and furthering the purpose and goals of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists.

Article III

Officers

- 1. The officers of this convention shall be president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, field worker, historian, two media coordinators, and three members at large, all of which are elected by the convention. These officers shall serve as the State Executive Board. A minimum of five officers shall be a quorum for transacting business.
- 2. Any officer or elected board member of this convention must be an active member of a local Free Will Baptist Church and an active member of the GWAC group of a local church
- Executive Board members are required to attend all scheduled board meetings.
 Any officer missing three meetings is subject to review and removal by the Executive Board

Article IV

Membership

- 1. This convention shall be composed of: the officers of the convention, district presidents, district field workers, ten delegates (duly accredited by the credentials committee) from each district convention, four delegates and the president from each local GWAC in good standing with its district convention.
- 2. Local groups in an area where there is no district convention may be represented with five delegates by payment of their membership dues. All delegates, as well as officers of the convention, shall be in good standing with a church that is in good standing with the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, and shall perform the duties as set forth for them in the present WNAC manual and this Constitution and By-Laws.

Article V

Meetings

- 1. The annual meeting shall be held each year the day before the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists convention in the same place or at such a time and place determined at the previous annual meeting or by the Executive Board.
- 2. A prayer retreat shall be held annually, time and place to be planned by the Executive Board.

Article VI

Amendments

This Constitution may be amended at any annual meeting of the convention by a twothirds vote of the members present.

By-Laws

Article I

Duties of Officers

President – The president shall preside over all meetings, appoint such committees as may be needed; call the Executive Board together when necessary; be ex-officio member of all committees, except the nominating committee; see that reports are sent promptly to the WNAC secretary; and perform all duties pertaining to such an office. She should see that GWAC is represented in the State Promotional Bulletin. Articles should be sent to the state executive office by the 1st of each month. She may either write the articles or ask someone to write the articles for her.

Vice President – The vice president shall preside in the absence of the president or by her request and otherwise assist her in the oversight of the work in general. She shall serve as chairman of the credentials committee.

Secretary – The secretary shall keep an accurate record of all proceedings of the convention and Executive Board meetings; preserve all valuable papers and turn same over to her successor; make an annual report to the WNAC secretary on a form available from the WNAC office within 15 days after the State GWAC Convention; compile the districts' slate of officers and addresses immediately after the convention; send a slate of state officers to the WNAC secretary and to each state officer. She is responsible for getting the minutes prepared and to the state associational office in time to be included in the state minutes each year.

Treasurer – The treasurer shall have charge of all funds belonging to this convention and shall pay out same only when authorized by the convention. The treasurer shall keep an accurate account, and give a written report of all funds received and disbursed at each annual meeting of the convention. She is required to deposit all checks in her possession and disburse all designated funds by the 30th of each month. She shall be bonded through the state office and audited annually.

Field Worker – The field worker shall promote GWAC programs through personal contact and the distribution of literature and serve where needed as directed by the Executive Board.

Historian – The historian shall keep a historical record and have a display at all state meetings and serve where needed as directed by the Executive Board.

Members at Large - The members at large shall help promote the work in general, meet with the Executive Board, and serve where needed as directed by the Executive Board.

Media Coordinators – Two Media Coordinators who will be responsible for compiling, editing and publishing the *Georgia Women in Touch* Newsletter.

Article II

Elections

A nominating committee shall nominate the general officers and members at large. Following the nominating committee's report, opportunity shall be given for nominations from the floor. In case of more than one nominee for any particular office, a vote will be taken for each; otherwise they may be elected by acclamation. The officers shall be elected every two years on odd number years. Not more than one-half of the elected officers shall be changed in any regular election. All elections shall be held at the closing sessions of the annual convention.

Article III

Expenses

Estimated expenses for the state work shall be set by an annual budget approved by the convention. The Executive Board must approve all reimbursement.

Article IV

Boards and Committees

Executive Board – This Board shall be composed of six officers and three members at large elected by the convention. Five of these shall compose a quorum. They shall hold meetings for the transaction of business as often as necessary. It shall be the duty of the Executive Board to maintain an oversight of the work at large. The Board shall act for the convention when necessary. It shall prepare the program for the regular meetings and fill any vacancy between elections.

Resolutions Committee – A resolutions committee shall be appointed by the president. A member of the Executive Board shall chair this committee. This committee shall review all resolutions presented, having the prerogative of passing on to the convention those resolutions that are deemed proper and profitable. Resolutions should be properly worded, i.e. "Be it Resolved....."

Nominating Committee – The nominating committee shall be composed of one member from each district convention and shall be elected one year prior to making their report. The names of the members from each district shall be submitted with the convention annual report. The president shall appoint a chairperson from the members of the nominating committee.

Credentials Committee – The vice president shall be the chairman of the credentials committee and the president shall appoint two other members. This committee shall examine the reports of the represented women's groups to see if fees are paid and if reports are in order.

Finance Committee – The treasurer shall be chairman of the finance committee and the president may appoint four other members. This committee reviews the financial records for the year, reports on same to the convention, and makes recommendations of disbursements of funds to the convention.

Registration Committee – The president shall appoint members as needed to serve on this committee. This committee registers those in attendance and gives a report to the convention.

Article V

Dues and Reports

Active members shall pay dues yearly as required by the GWAC Convention for membership. These dues should come through the district treasurers by January 10th following the close of the previous year. District secretaries and treasurers annual reports should be filed with the state secretary and treasurer no later than February 1 following the close of the previous year. Beginning 2002 the dues are \$12.50 per member with Georgia retaining \$2.50 per member and WNAC receiving dues of \$10.00 per member.

Article VI

Gifts

Season of Prayer Offerings-

 Pre-Easter Week of Prayer offering is used for Foreign Missions in memory of Laura Bell Barnard, our first foreign missionary.

- 2. Pre-Thanksgiving Week of Prayer offering is used for National Home Missions in memory of Mrs. Lizzie McAdams, a great writer of our literature and one of the first National officers.
- **3. The December Week of Prayer** offering is used for State Missions in memory of Mrs. Alice E. Lupton, our first National president.

Co-Laborer Offering – A financial plan of support for WNAC. Each local GWAC is encouraged to support the WNAC office with a monthly offering.

Provision Closet - This project helps missionaries as they return home to pick up household items, etc., from the closet at the National Office. Each local GWAC is encouraged to keep abreast of the items and supplies needed as they are periodically listed in the **Co-Laborer** magazine, and give to this project as needed.

WNAC Emphasis – A special offering to supplement the Co-Laborer Offerings for WNAC expenses of operation, literature, etc. This offering is received during August.

Remembrance Fund – This is a fund established by WNAC and a distinct way to honor any occasion the donor wishes to note: Anniversaries, birthdays, or as a memorial gift at the time of death. A remembrance card notifying the family of the person being honored, and the donor, will be entered in the permanent Book of Remembrances in the WNAC office. These gifts will be used to advance the kingdom of God through WNAC. A Remembrance Service is to be conducted at our state GWAC convention each year.

Dr. Mary Ruth Wisehart Foreign Student Scholarship Fund – Any GWAC group who wishes may contribute to this special fund set up by WNAC to train Nationals from our foreign fields. February is designated as Foreign Student month.

Dot Harvey Loan Fund – This revolving loan fund was established in honor of Miss Dot Harvey, a forerunner of youth work in Georgia, by the Georgia Women's Auxiliary Convention in 1954 to aid worthy Georgia students attending Free Will Baptist Bible College. Each local group is asked to donate monthly toward this project. A special offering is received in September to add to this fund.

Westfield Church Fund –This fund is used to assist the church in Kotogiri, South India in memory of Miss Laura Bell Barnard. All groups are encouraged to give to this Georgia project monthly.

Other Gifts – The state GWAC may decide on and promote other projects for funds at its own discretion.

Lora Shutes Mission Project – This is a statewide project with the goal set each year at the annual convention. Funds are disbursed to missionaries through the State Acts 1:8 Program.

GWAC Emphasis – June is designated as GWAC Emphasis Month. Each group is asked to receive a special offering to supplement GWAC operational expenses.
