## **Proceedings of the 76<sup>th</sup> Annual Session**

The minutes of the Seventy-sixth Annual Session of the Georgia Association of Free Will Baptists, when convening at the White Oaks Free Will Baptist Church in Macon, Georgia, on March 15<sup>th</sup>-16<sup>th</sup>, 2012.

### **WEDNESDAY EVENING WORSHIP SERVICE**

Rev. Billy McKinney presided and Bro. Gene Collins served as the worship leader of the Wednesday evening service. The congregation sang "Heaven's Jubilee" and Rev. Parnell Aldridge led in an opening prayer.

Bro. Gene Collins sang a special selection which blended an old hymn with a new chorus, "Amazing Grace, My Chains Are Gone".

Moderator Wayne Miracle presented Sis. Rhonda Creech and family with a special plaque which expressed Georgia Free Will Baptists' appreciation for the life and legacy of her husband, the late Rev. Paul Creech. An audio visual DVD tribute followed.

The congregation sang, "The Solid Rock" and "I'm Standing on the Solid Rock". Rev. Terry Tribble read Isaiah 41:10, then the congregation followed with the old hymn, "How Firm a Foundation". Bro. Gene Collins sang another special selection entitled, "I Do Believe".

Rev. Billy McKinney gave a passionate and appreciative introduction for the featured speaker, Dr. Charles Thigpen. Bringing a message from Romans 12:1-2, Dr. Thigpen preached an inspiring message entitled, "The Two Greatest Decisions You'll Ever Make". The first and greatest decision is to discern and receive salvation. The second is to discern and consistently do the will of God.

Following "Just As I Am" as an invitational hymn, Rev. Billy McKinney invited the congregation to join at the altar for a time of corporate prayer, offering thanksgiving to God and committing ourselves anew to His will. Rev. Larry Powell led in this prayer.

Wayne Miracle, with guitar and mandolin, led the assembly in song, which included the old favorites, "Heaven's Jubilee", "Send the Light", and "Where No One Stands Alone".

Rev. Wayne Miracle introduced the featured speaker, Dr. Matt Pinson, President of Free Will Baptist Bible College. Dr. Pinson brought an encouraging and informative lecture entitled, "Reflections on the Free Will Baptist Tradition". At the close of the meeting, Dr. Pinson responded to various questions posed by those attending.

### **THURSDAY AFTERNOON BUSINESS SESSION**

#### **Call to Session & Preliminaries**

The 76<sup>th</sup> Annual Session convened at 2:00 PM on Thursday afternoon, March 15, 2012 with Rev. Tim Horne leading the congregation in singing "He Keeps Me Singing".

Clerk Keith Lloyd led in an opening prayer, officially called the 76<sup>th</sup> Annual Session to order, and introduced the Moderator, Rev. Wayne Miracle, who began with a Scripture reading from 1<sup>st</sup> Timothy 4:1-18.

The Moderator welcomed everyone and recognized the Standing Delegates, which includes ordained ministers and deacons, board members and missionaries.

Rev. Dale McCoy gave a partial report of the Credentials Committee with a total registration of 60.

A motion was made, seconded, and carried to seat all elected delegates.

The Moderator then recognized the national messengers and welcomed other visitors.

**GAFWB Executive Board Report**

Clerk Keith Lloyd gave the Executive Board report, which included a proposed 2013 Cooperative Budget of \$315,000.00 and 2012 disbursement percentages of the Acts 1:8 Program. A motion was made and seconded to receive the report as information. The motion carried.

**GAFWB Executive Secretary / Treasurer Report**

Executive Secretary/Treasurer William Smith gave the Executive Office report.

In 2011, Acts 1:8 giving increased by 5.63% and Cooperative gifts by 1.96%. A decrease in designating giving resulted in a 3.71% decrease in total giving.

Bro. William gave the Association an overview of annual auditing procedures which take place at the State Office. The Auditing Committee again found all State Office records and financial reports to be in order and properly documented.

Statistical and financial highlights were pointed out in the Digest of Reports. Bro. William thanked Georgia Free Will Baptists for their faithful and generous giving. He encouraged the Association to continue to give to the Acts 1:8 and Cooperative Budgets as a means of supporting International Missions, Home Missions, and National Agencies.

Noting that 20 Georgia churches are currently without pastors, Bro. William implored pastors to preach on the subject of God's calling to ministry, and encouraged the Association to pray for the Lord to send forth laborers into the harvest.

A motion was made, seconded, and carried to receive the report as information.

**National Board of Retirement and Insurance Report**

Ray Lewis reported for the **Board of Retirement and Insurance**. The Board exists to serve the retirement and life insurance needs of our pastors, missionaries, and employees. A new project, the Labor of Love Campaign, will assist retired ministers who did not have opportunity to invest and who are now living in poverty.

**National Executive Office & ONE Magazine Report**

Executive Secretary Keith Burden reported for the **National Executive Office** and ONE Magazine. Several resources were mentioned which are available to the denomination. The office is currently working with the Master's Men Department to provide disaster relief in areas of Kentucky recently damaged by tornadoes. Bro. Keith reiterated the great need for young men to respond to the call of pastoral ministry. Rev. Billy Hanna commended the Executive Office for their handling of the negative publicity recently generated by a racially divisive issue in a small Kentucky congregation.

**GAFWB Board of Camping Report**

Rev. Mark Walker gave the report for the Board of Camping. All 2011 camp sessions went well. District association junior camp grants will be increased from \$1000.00 to \$1200.00 in 2012. The Board will require that any church which sends a handicapped child to teen camp also provide a full-time adult caretaker for that child.

This report and the financial report are included in the Digest of Reports. A motion was made, seconded and carried to receive the report as information.

**Georgia Women Active for Christ & National Women Active for Christ**

Sis. Donna Jewell reported for the **Georgia Women Active for Christ (GWAC)** and read a letter from the president of the **National Women Active for Christ**. The minutes of

the GWAC annual meeting will be included with the minutes of the 76<sup>th</sup> Annual Session. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to receive the report as information.

### **GAFWB Board of Christian Education**

Rev. Randy Jackson gave the report for the Board of Christian Education. Activities and responsibilities of the Board include retreats, youth competition, historical awareness and scholarships for Free Will Baptist colleges. The Georgia Music Commission also serves under the direction of the Board.

This report and the financial report are included in the Digest of Reports. A motion was made, seconded and carried to receive the report as information.

Trent Dykes replacing Paul Creech (*Georgia Union, term expires 2013*)

#### **Board of Trustees**

Larry Starling replacing Jessie Carroll (*Chattahoochee, term expires 2013*)

A motion was made, seconded and carried to receive the partial report and to elect by acclamation those nominated.

### **Miscellaneous Business**

A motion was made and seconded to adopt a 2013 Cooperative Budget of \$315,000.00. With no questions from the floor, the motion carried.

Executive Secretary William Smith addressed a proposal to discontinue the Friday evening service of the Annual Session. A motion was made and seconded to discontinue the Friday evening service beginning at the 77<sup>th</sup> Annual Session in 2013. By a majority standing vote, the motion carried.

Rev. Billy Hanna raised a question regarding why the Free Will Baptist Bible College (FWBBC) had been cut from the Georgia Cooperative Budget and the monies redirected to the National Cooperative Budget, which resulted in an overall decrease in Georgia's giving to the FWBBC. Executive Secretary William Smith attempted to clarify the primary reason, namely that the FWBBC also receives a portion of the National Cooperative Budget. Rev. Hanna then expressed concern that there seems to be some disparity in regards to the way the FWBBC is funded as compared to the International and Home Missions Departments, both of which also receive funds from the Georgia Acts 1:8 Budget and from the National Cooperative Budget. The Moderator allowed questions and concerns from the floor in regards to this issue. Rev. Billy McKinney raised a point of order as to whether it was permissible to discuss a matter which had already been approved, or if a new motion to rescind or reconsider should be offered. Hearing no motion to do either, the Moderator assured the Association that the Board would explore the matter further in future meetings.

The Moderator recessed the business session until Friday morning. Rev. Rick Cason led the Association in a closing prayer.

### **THURSDAY EVENING WORSHIP SERVICE**

Rev. Dale McCoy presided over the Thursday evening worship service, and Rev. Matt Hallman served as the worship leader. The service opened with the congregation singing "All Because Of Jesus", and Rev. Dale McCoy leading in prayer.

The congregation sang a medley of songs which included, "My Savior's Love", "I Have A Hope", and "The Power of Your Love".

Rev. Dale McCoy introduced the evening speaker, Rev. Mike Locklear, the pastor of the Savannah First Free Will Baptist Church. Bro. Tanner Stahl then sang a special selection entitled, "Just One Touch".

Using Psalm 11:1-7 as his text, Rev. Locklear preached an encouraging message on the subject, "In the LORD I Put My Trust".

The congregation sang "Just As I Am" as an invitational hymn.

After announcements, Rev. Parnell Aldridge led in a closing prayer.

### **FRIDAY MORNING BUSINESS SESSION**

The Friday morning business session began with Rev. Mark Walker leading the congregation in singing "In the Name of the Lord". Assistant Moderator Rick Cason led in an opening prayer and read a passage of Scripture from Mark 10:23-30. Moderator Wayne Miracle welcomed the Association and reconvened the business session.

#### **GAFWB Board of Missions Report**

Rev. Billy McKinney gave the report for the Board of Missions. The Harris County church planter resigned and the work there was discontinued. Though the Cartersville church plant has experienced a very difficult year, with several families leaving, Rev. Bill Crank remains committed to the task of planting a church in Bartow County. Because the congregation is too small to satisfy the mortgage payment on such a large debt, the Board's intent is to eventually put the building and property up for sale, when market values rebound enough to correspond with the investment. Until then, the church will continue to utilize and maintain the building.

Bro. Billy recognized the volunteer "mission work" of Bro. Charles and Sis. Becky Woods Harrell, and Bro. Andy, for their ministry in a drug rehabilitation facility in the Bainbridge area. The Association responded with a round of applause.

This report and the financial report are included in the Digest of Reports. A motion was made, seconded and carried to receive the report as information.

A video featuring several baptisms at the mission work of Marana, Arizona was shown. The work is led by church planters Jeff Goodman and Josh Bennett.

#### **GAFWB Board of Trustees Report**

Rev. Russell Horne gave the report for the Board of Trustees.

This report and the financial report are included in the Digest of Reports. A motion was made, seconded and carried to receive this report as information.

#### **National Convention Delegates**

Sis. Fleda Snow volunteered to serve as a Georgia delegate to the 2012 National Association of Free Will Baptists' Annual Convention to be held in Memphis, Tennessee. A motion was made to appoint Sis. Fleda Snow and to grant the Executive Secretary the authority to appoint additional and/or alternate delegates as necessary. The motion was seconded and carried.

#### **National & Other Reports Continued**

Bro. Ken Akers is involved with disaster relief in Kentucky, where three Free Will Baptist churches were recently damaged by tornadoes, and therefore could not be present to give a **Master's Men** report.

Bro. David Brown gave the report for the **Free Will Baptist Foundation**. The Foundation continues to offer higher interest rates than traditional investments. He encouraged individuals and churches to consider utilizing the Foundation as an investment tool which also benefits Free Will Baptist ministries. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to receive the report as information.

Dr. Matt Pinson reported for the **Free Will Baptist Bible College**. He thanked Georgia for their financial support and for the personal involvement of several individuals. The college is experiencing stressful financial times in the current economy. It's also difficult for the college to compete against secular colleges who often offer lottery-funded higher

education opportunities. In spite of these financial issues, the FWBBC continues to excel in academic excellence and is consistently recognized as such by national publications and entities. A proposed name change to "Welch College" will be considered at the National Convention. The college is still pursuing a buyer for the current campus so that relocation can move forward. Dr. Pinson asked for the continued prayers and financial support of the GAFWB. The report concluded with a short video regarding the proposed name change.

Rev. Eric Pushman reported for **Randall House Publications**. The purpose of Randall House is to build believers through the church and the home. Several resources which are currently being offered, or which are in the works, were highlighted. The D6 Conference continues to see growth in attendance and influence.

Rev. Sam McVay reported for the **International Missions Department**. He began by thanking Georgia for their faithful support. Though times are financially stressful for IM, churches are being planted, souls are being saved, and believers are being disciplined in foreign lands around the world. Regular financial support and participation in the World Mission Offering was encouraged. A small gift of appreciation was offered to pastors. After his report, international missionaries Rev. Dale Bishop and Rev. Heath Hubbard were given an opportunity to personally address the Association in regards to their respective ministries on the foreign mission field. Rev. Aaron Baldrige raised a question as to whether International Missions is still operating under the new funding structure or had reverted back to the old method. Rev. McVay assured the Association that the new funding structure is still in place, but was tweaked somewhat in regards to the strategic partnerships with local churches. Rev. Cliff Wilson asked when stateside missionaries would be allowed to return to the field. Rev. McVay could not give a specific timeframe, only that they would return as soon as the finances reached a sustainable level of support. Rev. Billy Hanna asked for clarification as to whether cash reserves or monthly giving decreases was the primary reason for missionaries being held from returning to the field. Rev. McVay pointed to both issues as part of the problem. Rev. Billy Hanna further asked whether designated giving could help a particular missionary get to the field. Rev. McVay responded that any giving will add to the overall goal of getting all the missionaries back on the field.

Rev. Danny Williams gave a report for the **Alabama Children's Home**. (As chairman of the International Mission Board, Rev. Williams added some additional clarification to the funding program of that department.) He thanked Georgia for their faithful support and gave updates on the ministry and needs of the Home. Most of the children who spend time in the home come from private referrals. Continued prayer and financial support was solicited from the Association.

Rev. Mike Allison reported for **Free Will Baptist Family Ministries**. He began by thanking Georgia for their prayers and faithful support. Various ministries of the ministry were highlighted. One of the newest additions to the ministry is an assisted living facility in Virginia, with another scheduled to open soon in Tennessee. As the ministry serves the needs of hurting families and children, the gospel is being presented and souls are being saved. The Hope Center continues to support ladies in crisis pregnancy situations. One of the goals of the Hope Center is to purchase an ultrasound machine. Youth who are struggling with alcohol and drug addictions are offered counseling. The ministry also offers retreats and summer camp opportunities.

### **Resolutions Committee Report**

Representing the Resolutions Committee, Rev. Herbert Waid presented the following resolutions for the Association's approval and action:

1. ***"Be it resolved, that every Georgia Free Will Baptist Church participate in the annual World Mission Offering."***
2. ***"Be it resolved, that each of us daily take to the LORD the great need of all of our financially stressed ministries."***
3. ***"Be it resolved, that each of us pray for God's will in the upcoming United States presidential election."***



4. ***“Be it resolved, that we give a rising vote of appreciation to the White Oaks Free Will Baptist Church for their gracious hosting of this Annual Session of the State Association.”***

A motion was made, seconded, and carried to receive the report as information.

Noting the difficult year that the White Oaks Church had in dealing with the death of their pastor, Rev. Paul Creech, and the fact that they were currently in search of a new pastor, the 4<sup>th</sup> resolution was acted upon with a rising vote of thanks and applause from the Association.

Rev. Rick Wilson, noting the critical crossroads of our nation, asked that the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> resolutions be acted upon by the Association gathering together at an altar of prayer. Rev. Herbert Waid led in prayer.

Rev. Billy McKinney exhorted the Association, and the Christian Church as a whole, to be involved in the America political process by voting for those candidates who best represent their faith, rather than voting for the most “elect-able” candidate.

### **Final Report of the Nominating Committee**

Rev. Aaron Baldrige made the following recommendations on behalf of the Committee: Virginia Grant was nominated to serve on the Auditing Committee for a term to expire in 2015; Donna Jewell was nominated to serve on the Credentials Committee for a term to expire in 2014. A motion was made to elect these nominations by acclamation. The motion was seconded and carried.

### **Miscellaneous Business**

From the floor, a motion was made by Bro. Gerald Smith of the Bay Springs Free Will Baptist Church that a Constitutional change be made to include “of Jesus Christ” to the name of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptist. The Moderator noted that the motion was technically out of order because, as a Constitutional change, it had not been submitted to the Clerk in written form prior to the meeting.

With all business and reports complete, no Friday afternoon business session would be necessary. Rev. Bill Crank led the Association in a closing prayer. A motion to adjourn the 76<sup>th</sup> Annual Session was made, seconded, and carried.

## **FRIDAY MORNING WORSHIP SESSION**

The session reassembled with Rev. Mark Walker serving as the worship leader and Rev. Keith Horn presiding. After the congregational hymn, “The Church’s One Foundation”, Rev. Keith Horn led in an opening prayer and introduced the speaker, Rev. Trent Dykes, who is the pastor of the First Free Will Baptist Church in Eastman.

Rev. Tim Horne, accompanied by his parents, the Rev. Russell and Sis. Rachel Horne, blessed the assembly with a song entitled, “Every Need Supplied”.

Using Ezra 3:11-13 as his text, Rev. Trent Dykes preached a challenging message entitled, “Soul Winning Changes Everything”.

Rev. Royce Horne led the Association in a closing prayer.

## **FRIDAY EVENING WORSHIP SESSION**

Rev. Bobby Taylor presided at the evening worship session and Rev. Monte McKenzie served as the worship leader. Following the opening song, “Famous One”, the Rev. S.E. Newberry led in an opening prayer.

The congregation sang together the recently written, “In Christ Alone”, which was beautifully blended together with the chorus of the old hymn, “The Solid Rock”.

Rev. Bobby Taylor introduced the evening speaker, Rev. Aaron Baldrige, who currently serves as the pastor of the Calvary Free Will Baptist Church in Columbus.

Bro. Aaron preached a wonderfully inspiring and challenging message from Colossians 1:3-14 on the subject of “Remembering What Christ Has Done”. Because of the position, power, and produce of the believer, we have a great hope in Christ.

After the invitational hymn, “Just As I Am”, Rev. Mark Walker led the 76<sup>th</sup> Annual Session of the Georgia Association of Free Will Baptists in a benedictory prayer.

### **Final Credentials Committee Report**

Rev. Dale McCoy submitted the final report of the Credentials Committee as follows: 31 standing delegates and 8 elected delegates for a total voting delegation of 39. There were also 27 visitors registered for a total registration of 66. The highest attendance count was 129, which was taken during the Thursday evening worship service. Sis. Donna Jewell assisted Bro. Dale on the Credentials Committee.

### **Executive Secretary/Treasurer Report January 1, 2011 – December 31, 2011**

Welcome to the Seventy-sixth annual session of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. We have gathered to conduct our state association business and receive reports from our state boards and national agencies. God richly blessed our state during 2011.

This digest contains reports from all the Georgia State Boards. The board reports and all financial reports cover the period of January 1, 2011 – December 31, 2011.

Thank you for your faithful support during 2011. Receipts through the State Office totaled \$886,347.84. Of this amount \$305,063.89 was *Cooperative Receipts*, \$225,474.62 was *Georgia Acts 1:8 Receipts*, and \$355,809.33 was *Designated Receipts*. We had an increase of \$5,874.24 or 1.96% in *Cooperative Receipts*, an increase of \$12,025.76 or 5.63% in *Georgia Acts 1:8 Receipts*, and a decrease of \$34,135.78 or 3.71% in total giving.

Your faithfulness to support the *Georgia Cooperative Plan* and the *Georgia Acts 1:8 Plan* makes it possible for the gospel to be shared in foreign countries, new churches to be planted in Georgia, Alaska, Arizona and Colorado. Scholarships are given to Georgia students to attend Free Will Baptist Bible College. You also help fund eight sessions of youth camp, four retreats and the retirement program for Georgia pastors. By supporting these two plans you are supporting every phase of the state work and all of the national departments except for Randall House Publications.

Georgia Free Will Baptists gave a total of \$1,049,449.64 or \$138.23 per member to district, state, and national ministries in 2011. This is amazing when you consider the difficult economic times in which we live. Thank you for your faithful support.

The unsure economic future has presented us with many challenges. In 2010 the Executive Board did the responsible thing and made cuts in the 2010 and 2011 Georgia State budgets in order to operate without significant deficits. Thankfully we met our budget in 2011 and trust God to help us meet our budget in 2012.

Currently we have 20 churches that are without a pastor. That is 18% of our churches. Please pray for these churches. This problem is not unique to our state or to our denomination. We need to pray for our young men to accept the Gospel call and we must challenge them by preaching sermons on answering the call of God upon their life.

I thank God for giving me the opportunity to serve Him in the **Great State of Georgia**. It has been fourteen wonderful years of service and ministry for me in the State Office. Thank you for your support and your continued prayers.

From these meetings, the following items are presented for general information and/or approval at this 76<sup>th</sup> Annual Session.

### **2012 State Meeting Program**

- Featured speakers for the 76th Annual Session were selected as follows: Wednesday evening – Dr. Charles Thigpen; Thursday morning Bible Conference – Dr. Matt Pinson (with IM Director Clint Morgan as an alternate if Dr. Pinson is unable to attend); Thursday evening – Rev. Mike Locklear; Friday morning – Rev. Trent Dykes; and, Friday evening – Rev. Aaron Baldrige.

### **Budget Approvals**

- A 2012 calendar year budget of \$850,000.00 is proposed. This includes the Georgia Coop Budget of \$310,000.00, Acts 1:8 Budget of \$225,000.00 and an estimated \$315,000.00 in *Designated Giving* is included in the overall budget. A proposed 2013 *Cooperative Budget* of \$315,000.00 is included with this report for your approval.

### **2012 Acts 1:8 Disbursements**

- 2012 Acts 1:8 disbursements are as follows: 65% to the Global Evangelism Fund, 25% to the Georgia Mission Board, and 2% each to Home Missionaries Josh Bennett, Donnie Burke, Jeff Goodman, Barry Long, and Ron Wallace.

### **Friday Evening Service of the Annual Session**

- With no conclusive input from district associations or a definitive consensus among Executive Board members, the Board would like the State Association to consider whether or not to discontinue the Friday evening service of the Annual Session.

### **2020 NAFWB Convention**

- Negotiations are still underway with the Cobb County Galleria for the possibility of hosting the 2020 NAFWB Convention.

### **State Office Personnel Salaries**

- The Board approved a 2% annual salary increase in 2012 for Executive Secretary William Smith, and a 5% salary increase for Office Secretary Rhonda Chandler.

### **Bible College Scholarship**

- The Board approved a one time scholarship of \$1,000.00 to the Free Will Baptist Bible College in memory of Rev. Paul Creech, which was designated to the account of his daughter, Debra Creech.

### **2013 Annual Session**

- At the request of the church, the Board recommends that the 77<sup>th</sup> Annual Session in 2013 be hosted by the New Hope FWB Church in Jesup, Georgia.

The Mission Board recognizes that the Free Will Baptists of Georgia desire churches in areas of growing population, and for the Board to faithfully steward the funds given to this goal. To this mission we, too, remain committed. We need our GA State brothers and sisters to be committed in prayer, sending, and vision to the Great Commission given by our Lord Jesus, the Christ!

Do we need more missionaries? Absolutely! On every church pew and Sunday School chair sits God's missionaries – us. All are called to go...yes, to the whole world, and that includes our streets, schools, workplaces, and the world! Everyone is called to pray! 



**AUDITING COMMITTEE REPORT

BAPTISTS**



## CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

### GEORGIA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS, Inc.

#### PREAMBLE

We, the Free Will Baptist of the State of Georgia, do ordain this Constitution for the purpose of advocating, promoting and increasing all phases of the cause of Christ.

#### ARTICLE I

This assembly shall be known as the ***Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.***

#### Article II

**SECTION 1.** The officers of this association shall be Moderator, an Assistant Moderator, a Clerk, an Assistant Clerk, and an Executive Secretary/Treasurer.

**SECTION 2.** The Executive Board shall be composed of the regular officers; the chairman of each of the standing boards; and the previous moderator, as an ex officio member for a period of two years following his term of office; and the moderator of the District Associations not represented shall serve as members at large.

**SECTION 3.** This Association shall be composed of ordained Ministers, ordained Deacons, Missionaries, and Board Members who are members of affiliated bodies; one (1) delegate for every three hundred (300) members or fraction thereof from District Associations; one (1) delegate for every one hundred (100) members or fraction thereof from each local affiliated church.

**SECTION 4.** All delegates from District Associations and local churches shall be elected from the laity of the body sending them.

**SECTION 5.** Funds to meet current needs of this body shall be paid to the treasurer of this association. Each District Association will give a minimum of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per delegate authorized, and each local church will give twenty-five (\$25.00) per delegate.

**SECTION 6.** In order to pay our Georgia State Association's annual representation fee to the National Association, each local association is to be responsible to promote, receive and forward the amount designated by the National Association per church per year to the State Office, along with their annual State Association representation fee, on or before our annual State Association session.

#### ARTICLE III

**SECTION 1.** It shall be the privilege of each affiliated District Association to recommend a member for each standing board. Terms of office on these boards shall be on a rotating basis which will necessitate the election by the State Association of five (5) members every two (2) years, thus giving each member a four (4) year term of office.

**SECTION 2.** There shall be a **Board of Missions** composed of members who are noted for their missionary zeal.

A. The Board of Missions shall employ missionaries as needed to establish Free Will Baptist mission/churches in the State of Georgia. These missionaries may be employed exclusively or jointly with other Free Will Baptist agencies.

B. A mission/church sponsored by the Georgia State Association and their missionaries are under the authority of the State Association and the supervision of the Georgia State Board of Missions.

C. A mission/church does not have autonomous church status. As long as the mission/church is unable to provide for its own business, it is in a dependent relationship to the State Association and its Board of Missions.

D. When the mission/church is self-sustaining, self-governing, self-discipline, and self-propagating. It should be organized into an autonomous Free Will Baptist Church following the procedures adopted by the Georgia State Association.

E. After proper procedures are satisfied and the church is duly organized into autonomous Free Will Baptist church it shall have all normal rights, privileges, and responsibilities of any other Free Will Baptist Church.

**SECTION 3.** There shall be a **Board of Camping** whose duties shall be to schedule and arrange all camp sessions, and to appoint the Camp Director each year.

**SECTION 4.** There shall be a **Board of Christian Education** whose duties shall be:

A. To provide educational services for the members of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists.

B. To set policy and supervise the functions of the State Youth Committee. This Board shall appoint this Committee to carry out Board policy.

C. To organize sponsor and promote educational and inspirational retreats for our members.

D. To organize, sponsor and promote Sunday School and Church Training seminars.

E. To set policy and supervise the Historical Committee. This Board shall appoint the Historical Committee to gather and set forth for public knowledge and posterity the history of Georgia Free Will Baptists.

**SECTION 5.** There shall be a **Board of Trustees** whose duties shall be; maintenance, upkeep and insuring of all State Association properties; the planning and supervision of all future developments and expansion of these properties as directed by the State Association except otherwise provided in this Constitution.

**SECTION 6.** There shall be a **Credentials Committee**, which shall consist of three (3) members of three-year terms. And the term of one expiring each year thereafter according to seniority of service, who shall be in charge of the registration and examination of delegates and the receiving of all dues.

**SECTION 7.** There shall be two members on the Board of Trustees of the Free Will Baptist Children's Home, Eldridge, Alabama, elected for terms of four (4) years. Election will take place on odd years and shall be staggered.

**SECTION 8.** There shall be a **Georgia State Master's Men**. They shall select their own officers and conduct their own business.

**SECTION 9.** There shall be a **Georgia State Woman's Auxiliary Convention (GWAC)**. They shall elect their officers, conduct their business and maintain their treasury.

#### **ARTICLE IV**

**SECTION 1.** All officers except board members and the Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be elected to serve a term of two (2) years. The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be employed by the Executive Board of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, subject to the ratification of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists at its next regular session, for an indefinite period, with an agreement of sixty (60) day notice of termination by either the Executive Secretary/Treasurer or the Executive Board.

**SECTION 2.** Standing Boards of the State Association have no power of final authority to hire, full-time employees until the matter has been presented to and acted on by the State Association in session except where otherwise provided.

**SECTION 3.** The Executive Board may fill vacancies on any of the boards or committees, which occur between regular sessions of this State Association, until the convening of the annual session of said association.

**SECTION 4.** Election of all General Officers shall take place on the odd years of the calendar.

**SECTION 5.** If a member of any board fails in the function of his or her duty without good and sufficient reasons, the board of which the delinquent is a member may declare that particular office vacant. Further, this body shall have and does reserve the right to deal with the officer or board member who does not conduct his or her office in a Christian, business like manner according to the rules of Christian conduct as set forth in the New Testament.

Any standing board of this State Association may appoint proxies to serve in lieu of the absent members.

At the pleasure of the boards, and subsequent to the meeting from which the regular member is absent, the boards have the right to deal with the delinquent member in the manner stated in this section.

**SECTION 6.** The Chairman or Vice-Chairman of said board, or by the Moderator or Assistant Moderator of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, upon the request of the majority of the members of said boards, may call boards into session.

**SECTION 7.** An auditing Committee shall consist of three (3) members elected for three (3) three year terms.

#### **AMENDMENTS**

This Constitution may be changed, altered, or amended by two-thirds (2/3) vote of all delegates present and voting at any regular session of the State Association. Prior to a final vote on any amendment, change or alteration, said amendment, change or alteration shall be submitted in writing to the Clerk of this association and shall lie on the table from one (1) business meeting to the next during the same session, during which time it shall be read at least two (2) times in open session. Officers, standing boards, and/or standing committees may be added or deleted as the need arises.

## **BY-LAWS**

### **SECTION 1:**

**A.** All real property, checking and savings account or any other assets of this Association shall be in the name of the *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*

**B.** One or more of the corporate officers of the Association shall be the legal signers of all Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. business. These officers are: the Moderator as the corporate President; the Clerk as the corporate Vice-President; and the Executive Secretary/Treasurer as the Secretary/Treasurer.

**C.** The State Office shall be responsible for the safekeeping of the corporate seal and all official documents of the State Association.

**D.** No State Board may borrow money or financially obligated the State Association without the approval of the Executive Board.

**E.** The fixed assets (building, land) of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists shall not be liquidated except by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the delegates present and voting at any regular session of the Association.

The Executive Board shall have the authority to approve the sale of properties donated to any Board of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc., upon recommendation of the Board to which the donation was made, with proceeds remaining under the authority of the recommending Board."

**F.** The records of all financial transaction shall be open to all members of the Georgia State Association. The financial transactions of the State Office and State Boards shall be audited annually.

**G.** Annual financial reports of the State Office and State Boards and the auditor's report shall be made to the State Association in session and be entered in the Annual State Minutes.

**H.** The State Treasurer shall be bonded in amount stipulated by the State Executive Board.

**I.** This Association shall meet for its regular session annually on the third Thursday in March.

### **SECTION 2.**

**A.** When the State Association is not in session, the State Executive Board shall be duly authorized to do business in the name of the State Association.

**B.** The State Association has full authority to direct the State Executive Board in all business conducted on its behalf.

**C.** The State Executive Board shall report to the State Association in session concerning the business conducted for the State Association since its last convening.

**D.** The State Executive Board has the prerogative of deferring any matter to the State Association as a whole but is not under obligation to do so.

**E.** The State Executive Board shall meet quarterly in the following months: March, September, and December. The March meeting shall be held just prior to the regular meeting of the State Association.

**F.** Any and all correspondence from any member of this State Association, (includes either individual, group, Board or District Association) directed to any Board, or Chairman of said Board, or any officer of this State Association, or any open letters to any or all District Associations of this State, that pertains to any business which is desired or required to be brought before this body at any scheduled or special called meeting, shall be properly sent directly to the Clerk of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists. The clerk will be responsible for routing the correspondence to its proper designation. All correspondence as mentioned above, shall be required to be received by the Clerk of the State Association at least 30 days prior to any scheduled State Association Meeting if said correspondence contains business that is to be introduced and discussed at said meeting.

### **SECTION 3.**

**A.** The moderator shall preside at the Annual Session of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists and the meetings of the Executive Board. The Moderator shall be the President of the Corporation known as the *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*

**B.** The Assistant Moderator shall preside in the absence of the Moderator and/or when appointed by the Moderator as the need arises.

**C.** The Clerk shall keep records of the proceedings of the Annual Associational meeting and of the Executive Board meetings. It shall also be his responsibility to have the minutes of these sessions printed and distributed. The Clerk shall be the Vice-President of the Corporation known as *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*

**D.** The Assistant Clerk in the absence of the Clerk, shall fulfill the functions and duties of the Clerk as stated in paragraph C of this document.

### **SECTION 4.**

**A.** The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be responsible and accountable to the Executive Board in the fulfillment of the duties of his office as determined by the Executive Board.

**B.** The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be allowed four (4) weeks vacation per year with pay.

**C.** Funds received by the Executive Secretary/Treasurer for revivals, special speaking engagements and promotional meetings shall go into the Cooperative Fund. The exception to this regulation relates to remuneration received by the Executive Secretary during his four (4) weeks vacation, which shall be his personally and need not be accounted for to this State Association.

**D.** Salary, mileage and operational expenses of the Executive Secretary/ Treasurer shall be determined by the Executive Board.

**E.** The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be the Secretary/Treasurer of the Corporation known as the *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*

**F. General Promotion.** He is to represent, or cause to be represented, the association at all affairs of interest to the association and he is to promote the work of the association in such a manner so as to unify the association as well as promote both the state and national works, missionaries, mission conferences, etc. Through personal communication he shall keep close contact with pastors, churches, and district association.

**G. Administration.** He shall administer the affairs of the executive office and carry out the responsibilities delegated to him by the State Association and the Executive Board. He is to serve with all standing boards and committees of the association in an ex-official capacity. He is to report to the association during each annual session.

**H. Stewardship.** He shall serve as treasurer of this association. An accurate and complete record of all funds received and disbursed shall be kept and a written report shall be included in his report to this association in its annual session. He shall receive, hold and disburse money as is made available by the State Association to the various boards. Disbursements to the various boards will be made available when requested.

**I. Publication.** It shall be his duty to edit and publish the state paper. He shall direct the production of general promotional materials, pamphlets, audiovisuals, and books as approved by the Executive Board.

**J. Arranging State Association.** He shall expedite the planning of the State Association program, enroll all ministers and delegates, print and distribute minutes, and investigate future sites for the annual session.

## **SECTION 5.**

**A.** The Executive Board shall serve as the Placement Committee for the State Association. In this capacity the board shall investigate places suitable for this meeting and make recommendations to said State Association. Meeting places shall be determined two (2) years in advance.

**B.** The Executive Board shall plan the program for the annual meetings of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists and the annual meetings shall follow the programs as closely as possible. Business sessions shall be conducted according to the commonly accepted rules of Parliamentary Procedure.

**C.** The Executive Board shall formulate the budget for the State Association annually and recommend to the body in the session the allocations to be observed in the Cooperative Plan for Giving. This board shall, in addition to the above stated duties, also recommend a mileage rate for travel by the members of all standing boards in said association.

## **SECTION 6.**

The Moderator shall appoint necessary committees unless otherwise provided for by the body.

## **SECTION 7.**

These By-Laws may be altered, changed, or amended at any regular session of this association by two-thirds (2/3) vote of delegates present and voting

**GEORGIA WOMEN ACTIVE FOR CHRIST**  
**Of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.**  
**Constitution and By-Laws**

**Article I**

**Name**

This organization shall be known as Georgia Women Active for Christ a division of the Georgia Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc., commonly known by its initials, GWAC. Its members shall elect officers, conduct business and maintain a treasury.

**Article II**

**Purpose**

The purpose of this organization shall be to assist the various women composing the GWAC in providing opportunities to understand and fulfill the Great Commission through their responsibilities in the family, church, community, and around the world.

It shall bring the women of each district together for fellowship, sharing information, encouraging one another in the work of the Lord and furthering the purpose and goals of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists.

**Article III**

**Officers**

1. The officers of this convention shall be president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, field worker, historian, two media coordinators, and a member at large, all of which are elected by the convention. These officers shall serve as the State Executive Board. A minimum of five officers shall be a quorum for transacting business.

2. Any officer or elected board member of this convention must be an active member of a local Free Will Baptist Church and an active member of the GWAC group of a local church.

2. Executive Board members are required to attend all scheduled board meetings and GWAC sponsored events. Any officer missing two meetings/events, without providing the president with reason of the absence, is subject to review and removal by the Executive Board.

**Article IV**

**Membership**

1. This convention shall be composed of: the officers of the convention, district presidents, district field workers, ten delegates (duly accredited by the credentials committee) from each district convention, four delegates and the president from each local GWAC in good standing with its district convention.

2. Local groups in an area where there is no district convention may be represented with five delegates by payment of their membership dues. All delegates, as well as officers of the convention, shall be in good standing with a church that is in good standing with the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, and shall perform the duties as set forth for them in the present WNAC manual and this Constitution and By-Laws.

**Article V**

**Meetings**

1. The annual meeting shall be held each year the day before the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists convention in the same place or at such a time and place determined at the previous annual meeting or by the Executive Board.

2. A prayer retreat shall be held annually, time and place to be planned by the Executive Board.

## Article VI

### Amendments

This Constitution may be amended at any annual meeting of the convention by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

### By-Laws

## Article I

### Duties of Officers

**President** – The president shall preside over all meetings, appoint such committees as may be needed; call the Executive Board together when necessary; be ex-officio member of all committees, except the nominating committee; see that reports are sent promptly to the WNAC secretary; and perform all duties pertaining to such an office.

**Vice President** – The vice president shall preside in the absence of the president or by her request and otherwise assist her in the oversight of the work in general. She shall serve as chairman of the credentials committee.

**Secretary** – The secretary shall keep an accurate record of all proceedings of the convention and Executive Board meetings; preserve all valuable papers and turn same over to her successor; make an annual report to the WNAC secretary on a form available from the WNAC office within 15 days after the State GWAC Convention; compile the districts' slate of officers and addresses immediately after the convention; send a slate of state officers to the WNAC secretary and to each state officer. She is responsible for getting the minutes prepared and to the state associational office in time to be included in the state minutes each year.

**Treasurer** – The treasurer shall have charge of all funds belonging to this convention and shall pay out same only when authorized by the convention. The treasurer shall keep an accurate account, and give a written report of all funds received and disbursed at each annual meeting of the convention. She is required to deposit all checks in her possession and disburse all designated funds by the 30<sup>th</sup> of each month. She shall be bonded through the state office and audited annually.

**Field Worker** – The field worker shall promote GWAC programs through personal contact and the distribution of literature and serve where needed as directed by the Executive Board.

**Historian** – The historian shall keep a historical record and have a display at all state meetings and serve where needed as directed by the Executive Board.

**Member at Large** – The members at large shall help promote the work in general, meet with the Executive Board, and serve where needed as directed by the Executive Board.

**Media Coordinators** – Two Media Coordinators who will be responsible for compiling, editing and publishing the *Georgia Women in Touch* Newsletter, and serve where needed as directed by the Executive Board. Articles should be sent to the state executive office by the 1<sup>st</sup> of each month. They may either write the articles or ask someone to write the articles for them.

## Article II

### Elections

A nominating committee shall nominate the general officers and members at large. Following the nominating committee's report, opportunity shall be given for nominations from the floor. In case of more than one nominee for any particular office, a vote will be taken for each; otherwise they may be elected by acclamation. The officers shall be

elected every two years on odd number years. Not more than one-half of the elected officers shall be changed in any regular election. All elections shall be held at the closing sessions of the annual convention.

### **Article III**

#### **Expenses**

Estimated expenses for the state work shall be set by an annual budget approved by the convention. The Executive Board must approve all reimbursement.

### **Article IV**

#### **Boards and Committees**

**Executive Board** – This Board shall be composed of six officers, two media coordinators, and one member at large elected by the convention. Five of these shall compose a quorum. They shall hold meetings for the transaction of business as often as necessary. It shall be the duty of the Executive Board to maintain an oversight of the work at large. The Board shall act for the convention when necessary. It shall prepare the program for the regular meetings and fill any vacancy between elections.

**Resolutions Committee** – A resolutions committee shall be appointed by the president. A member of the Executive Board shall chair this committee. This committee shall review all resolutions presented, having the prerogative of passing on to the convention those resolutions that are deemed proper and profitable. Resolutions should be properly worded, i.e. "Be it Resolved...."

**Nominating Committee** – The nominating committee shall be composed of one member from each district convention and shall be elected one year prior to making their report. The names of the members from each district shall be submitted with the convention annual report. The president shall appoint a chairperson from the members of the nominating committee.

**Credentials Committee** – The vice president shall be the chairman of the credentials committee and the president shall appoint two other members. This committee shall examine the reports of the represented women's groups to see if fees are paid and if reports are in order.

**Finance Committee** – The treasurer shall be chairman of the finance committee and the president may appoint four other members. This committee reviews the financial records for the year, reports on same to the convention, and makes recommendations of disbursements of funds to the convention.

**Registration Committee** – The president shall appoint members as needed to serve on this committee. This committee registers those in attendance and gives a report to the convention.

### **Article V**

#### **Dues and Reports**

Active members shall pay dues yearly as required by the GWAC Convention for membership. State treasurer must receive all dues for all members no later than November 15<sup>th</sup>. The state treasurer then has to compile a report that reflects the membership of the paid GWAC members for the current reporting year.

Current dues per member: GWAC Dues – \$3.00, WNAC Dues – \$15.00,

Total Dues – \$18.00

District secretaries and treasurers annual reports shall be filed with the state secretary and treasurer no later than January 15<sup>th</sup> following the close of the previous year.

Reporting Deadlines:

District Treasurer to State Treasurer – December 1<sup>st</sup>

District Secretary to State Secretary – January 15<sup>th</sup>

## Article VI

### Gifts

#### **Season of Prayer Offerings-**

**1. Pre-Easter Week of Prayer** offering is used for Foreign Missions in memory of Laura Bell Barnard, our first foreign missionary.

**2. Pre-Thanksgiving Week of Prayer** offering is used for National Home Missions in memory of Mrs. Lizzie McAdams, a great writer of our literature and one of the first National officers.

**3. The December Week of Prayer** offering is used for State Missions in memory of Mrs. Alice E. Lupton, our first National president.

**Co-Laborer Offering** – A financial plan of support for WNAC. Each local GWAC is encouraged to support the WNAC office with a monthly offering.

**Provision Closet** - This project helps missionaries as they return home to pick up household items, etc., from the closet at the National Office. Each local GWAC is encouraged to keep abreast of the items and supplies needed as they are periodically listed in the **Co-Laborer** magazine, and give to this project as needed.

**WNAC Emphasis** – A special offering to supplement the Co-Laborer Offerings for WNAC expenses of operation, literature, etc. This offering is received during August.

**Remembrance Fund** – This is a fund established by WNAC and a distinct way to honor any occasion the donor wishes to note: Anniversaries, birthdays, or as a memorial gift at the time of death. A remembrance card notifying the family of the person being honored, and the donor, will be entered in the permanent Book of Remembrances in the WNAC office. These gifts will be used to advance the kingdom of God through WNAC. A Remembrance Service is to be conducted at our state GWAC convention each year.

**Dr. Mary Ruth Wisheart Foreign Student Scholarship Fund** – Any GWAC group who wishes may contribute to this special fund set up by WNAC to train Nationals from our foreign fields. February is designated as Foreign Student month.

**Dot Harvey Loan Fund** – This revolving loan fund was established in honor of Miss Dot Harvey, a forerunner of youth work in Georgia, by the Georgia Women's Auxiliary Convention in 1954 to aid worthy Georgia students attending Free Will Baptist Bible College. Each local group is asked to donate monthly toward this project. A special offering is received in September to add to this fund.

**Westfield Church Fund** – This fund is used to assist the church in Kotogiri, South India in memory of Miss Laura Bell Barnard. All groups are encouraged to give to this Georgia project monthly.

**Other Gifts** – The state GWAC may decide on and promote other projects for funds at its own discretion.

**Lora Shutes Mission Project** – This is a statewide project with the goal set each year at the annual convention. Funds are disbursed to missionaries through the State Acts 1:8 Program.

**GWAC Emphasis** – June is designated as GWAC Emphasis Month. Each group is asked to receive a special offering to supplement GWAC operational expenses.
