Proceedings of the 79th Annual Session

The minutes of the Seventy-ninth Annual Session of the Georgia Association of Free Will Baptists, when convening at the First Free Will Baptist Church in Albany, Georgia, on March $18^{\rm th}-20^{\rm th}$, 2015.

WEDNESDAY EVENING WORSHIP SERVICE

The Sounds of Praise, an ensemble of gifted vocalists from the Albany First FWB Church, provided a prelude of special music.

Bro. Mark Walker led the congregation in singing a medley of the up-tempo songs, "Happy Day", "Today is the Day", and "O Happy Day".

Bro. Ti Barnhill welcomed the congregation, gave pertinent information regarding the church's facilities, and led in an opening prayer.

Worship continued with congregational singing that included "Down at the Cross", "Your Great Name", and "Your Name". In between those songs, Bro. Wayne Miracle read Proverbs 18:10 and Acts 4:12.

Bro. Mark Walker introduced the evening speaker, Rev. Randy Jackson, the pastor of the Midway FWB Church in Moultrie, Georgia.

The Sounds of Praise provided special music prior to the evening message.

Preaching from the Gospel of John, chapter 9, Bro. Randy preached an inspiring message entitled, "Jesus: The Answer to Man's Darkness".

Before his message from God's Word, Bro. David spoke regarding the availability of Free Will Baptist historical information, and North American church planting and church revitalization efforts.

Using 1st Corinthians 13:13 as his text, Bro. David brought a powerful and convicting message on the subject, "Love Is Greater".

After brief announcements, Bro. Rick Cason adjourned the Bible Conference.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON BUSINESS SESSION

Call to Session & Preliminaries

The 79th Annual Session convened at 2:00 PM on Thursday, March 19, with Bro. Mark Walker leading the congregation in singing "He Keeps Me Singing".

Clerk Keith Lloyd officially called the 79th Annual Session to order and Moderator Wayne Miracle began with a Scripture reading from 1st Peter 5:1-11.

The Moderator welcomed everyone and recognized the Standing Delegates, which includes ordained ministers and deacons, board members and missionaries.

Bro. Bobby Taylor gave a partial report of the Credentials Committee with a total voting registration of 44.

A motion was made, seconded, and carried to seat all elected delegates.

The Moderator then recognized the national messengers and welcomed other visitors.

A motion was made, seconded, and carried to receive and approve the Committee on Committees report.

GAFWB Executive Board Report

Clerk Keith Lloyd gave the Executive Board report, which included the activities and decisions of the Board since that last Annual Session, as well as recommendations from the Board to the 79th Annual Session. A motion was made and seconded to receive the printed report as information. The motion carried.

At the recommendation of the Board, a motion was made and seconded to approve a 2016 Cooperative Budget of \$320,000.00. The motion carried.

GAFWB Executive Secretary / Treasurer Report

Executive Secretary/Treasurer William Smith gave the Executive Office report.

In 2014, Acts 1:8 giving increased by 1.42%, Cooperative gifts decreased by 1.14%, and Designated gifts increased by 3.74%. Total giving in 2014 increased by \$12,104.21, or 1.43%, when compared to 2013. Georgia Free Will Baptists gave an average of \$141.43 per member to outside causes.

Bro. William extolled the values of the Minister's Retirement Program, the Cooperative Program, the Women Active for Christ ministry, and the Acts 1:8 Program.

There are currently 16 Georgia churches without pastors.

Chris and Tori Sargent, international missionaries to Spain, are stateside and available to hold services in Association churches. Bro. William encouraged new churches to get on board with the Acts 1:8 Program to help alleviate missions funding.

A few typographical areas were noted in the Digest of Reports financial records.

Office records and procedures were found to be in order by the Auditing Committee.

A motion was made and seconded to receive the report as information. Questions were asked, from the floor, regarding how personal records are kept and protected, the financial liability status on the Valdosta property, and the state's financing of the Cartersville property. Bro. Ron Wallace led in prayer for the success of the congregation currently meeting and leasing the Cartersville property. After all questions were sufficiently answered, the motion carried.

National Executive Office & ONE Magazine Report

Executive Secretary Keith Burden reported for the **National Executive Office** and ONE magazine. He thanked Georgia for those serving on various national boards and committees, and for the financial support of national ministries.

Information was giving regarding the upcoming national convention in Grand Rapids, Michigan on July 19-23, 2015. Registration information is given in ONE magazine.

A brief overview of giving to national offices and ministries was given. Special attention was given to explain new attempts at church revitalization efforts.

He encouraged Associational churches to incorporate last year's NAFWB statement on homosexual marriage into their own local church government documents.

NAFWB Retirement & Insurance Department Report

Bro. Ray Lewis reported for the *Retirement and Insurance Department*. Bro. Lewis will be retiring in 2015 after 32 years with the department. He asked for prayers as the Board seeks his replacement. The Department currently pays out approximately \$150,000 per month in retirement funds, but many pastors and churches are still not participating. Bro. Lewis strongly encouraged all employees of FWB churches to get on board.

Bro. Jack Daniels, Chairman of the Retirement and Insurance Board, thanked Bro. Lewis, on behalf of all Georgia participants, for his faithful, dedicated service to the Department. Bro. Billy Hanna led in prayer for Bro. Ray Lewis and for the Board as they seek his replacement.

Georgia Women Active for Christ

Sis. Sandra Jackson reported for the Georgia Women Active for Christ (GWAC).

The complete minutes of the GWAC Annual Meeting will be included within the official minutes of the 79th Annual Session. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to receive the report as information.

Women Nationally Active for Christ

Sis. Diana Bryant reported for the Women Nationally Active for Christ (WNAC).

Last year, WNAC gave over \$435,000.00 to missions programs, awarded college scholarships to five young ladies, and provided a laundry room and twin sheet sets to the Cedars of Lebanon Seminary in Cub. They also facilitated two women's conferences on a foreign mission field.

The provision closet continues to be a blessing to missionaries and their children.

The WNAC was recognized as an official department of the NAFWB at last year's convention. They will now receive funds through The Together Way plan.

GEORGIA BOARD REPORTS

GAFWB Board of Trustees Report

Bro. Russell Horne gave the report for the Board of Trustees.

This report and the financial report are included in the Digest of Reports. A motion was made, seconded and carried to receive the report as information.

GAFWB Board of Christian Education

Bro. Randy Jackson gave the report for the Board of Christian Education.

The board is responsible for retreats, state youth competition, the Georgia State Historical Society, and Charles Clark Scholarships.

Historical records will soon be available online.

This report and the financial report are included in the Digest of Reports. A motion was made, seconded and carried to receive the report as information.

GAFWB Board of Missions Report

In board chairman Bro. Billy McKinney's absence (due to injury), vice chairman Bro. Rick Cason gave the report for the Board of Missions.

Bro. Rick gave an update on the group that is currently leasing the Cartersville property. He asked the Association to continue to pray for that group's success.

The Board has no current plans to begin any new mission planting efforts in Georgia, but they are prayerfully considering when and where God would have them focus their attention next. The sale of the Cartersville property will greatly improve the Board's ability to begin a new church plant.

This report and the financial report are included in the Digest of Reports. A motion was made and seconded to receive the report as information. A question was raised concerning the future vision and success of church planting efforts, and whether or not a day of fasting and prayer would be in order to that end. After Bro. Rick responded to the question, the motion carried.

A question was raised regarding the criteria used by the Executive Board when making the determination that 2015 would be the last year of Bro. Barry Long's inclusion in the Acts 1:8 Program. Bro. William Smith answered the question and gave clarification in regards to the Board's administration of the Acts 1:8 Program.

Home missionaries to Marana, Arizona, Jeff Goodman and Josh Bennett, gave updates on the success of the church planting efforts there. They thanked Georgia for the one year extension of their inclusion in the Acts 1:8 Program.

Home missionary to Castle Rock, Colorado, Donnie Burke, gave a report on the success of the work there which included a slide-show of the people involved in the church and stats regarding conversions, baptisms, attendance, and giving. They are currently pursuing the acquisition of property in order to establish a permanent church facility. He thanked the Association for their continued support and inclusion in the Acts 1:8 Program.

After brief announcements, a motion was made and seconded to adjourn from the business session until Friday morning. The motion carried.

THURSDAY EVENING WORSHIP SERVICE

A prelude of special music was provided by "The Georgia Boys Quartet", which consisted this year of Tanner Stahl, Tim Horne, Mark Walker, and Buddy Johnson.

Bro. William Smith introduced the evening speaker, Rev. Dale McCoy, the pastor of the First FWB Church in Jesup, Georgia.

Bro. David Williford reported for *Welch College*. He thanked the Association for their financial support and for sending their students to the college. Bro. David made a plea for continued support, and updated the Association on the relocation plans, which have recently hit another obstacle from the neighborhood association.

Bro. David Womack reported for **Randall House Publications**. They are excited about the launch of the brand new D6 2nd Generation curriculum. The entire story of the Bible will be covered in a 6-year sequence of study, establishing and enforcing a biblical world view for the students. There will also be a digital delivery option of the curriculum.

Bro. Clint Morgan reported for the *International Missions Department*. He first thanked the state of Georgia for their faithful financial support through the years. In 2014, the department ended "in the black" financially. The annual World Mission Offering is an important aspect of mission funding, and Bro. Clint encouraged the participation of all Georgia churches. Five major objectives of the department were reviewed. In closing, Bro. Clint made a plea for individual, personal, "faith promise" financial support. As an addendum to the IM report, *Missionary to Spain*, Bro. Chris Sargent, was also given opportunity to report on that work. Bro. Clint answered questions regarding designated and general fund giving: both are essential to keeping missionaries on the field.

Bro. David Brown gave the report for the *Free Will Baptist Foundation*. He thanked Georgia for the input of their board member, and for Bro. William Smith's assistance in securing endowments. Bro. David stressed the future benefit of endowments for Free Will Baptist ministries and encouraged members to tithe on their estates by giving to the Foundation's endowment fund. The foundation is now offering estate planning seminars to assist people in preparing their estate documents. As a test for a broader future program, grants will soon be offered to national agencies and commissions.

Bro. Danny Williams reported the *Alabama Children's Home*. He thanked Georgia for their past and continuing financial and prayer support. There are currently 21 children who are being cared for by the Home. The children are been converted, baptized, and discipled in the faith. Director Mike Corley has resigned in order to take on another ministry opportunity; the board is looking for his replacement. Information was given regarding several fundraising activities that will soon take place.

Sis. Mallory White reported for *Free Will Baptist Family Ministries*. She gave updates on the many activities of the ministry and thanked Georgia for their support. A number of children have given their life to Christ over the last year. They are counseling many who are struggling with addictions and/or in crisis pregnancy situations. With the recent acquisition of a property in Arkansas, the ministry of fostering children will be extended to that area as well. Continuing prayers were solicited.

(Bro. David Crowe reported for the *National Home Missions Department* during the Thursday Bible Conference.)

Resolutions Committee Report

Representing the Resolutions Committee, Bro. Dale McCoy presented the following resolutions for the Association's approval and action:

1. RESOLUTION #1, CONCERNING RELIGIOUS LIBERTY:

WHEREAS, the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists have both historically and currently, taken "the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice:" and

WHEREAS, it is that same Word of God, also known as the Bible, the Holy Scriptures, and other like names, that have been the bedrock of the United States of America since its inception; and

WHEREAS, the founding document of our Country, faithfully echoing the first chapters of the Bible with these words, "... that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness...;" and

WHEREAS, The U. S. Constitution Guarantees to either freely express these rights or choose not to express these God given rights; and

WHEREAS, The Georgia Constitution since 1777, has also guaranteed the freedom of religion for its citizens; and

WHEREAS, these rights are being relentlessly attacked by an ever increasing secular society nationally, statewide and even locally; and

WHEREAS, if these trends continue and there is not an united front to stand against these threats to our liberties, freedom of religion and worship, we run the risk of not only losing them now but in the future for our children and grand-children:

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that we, the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists stand with like-minded groups that are faithfully committed the Bible, its private and public proclamation, and defense of our "God given rights;" and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that for educational purposes, we avail ourselves of resources such as The Ethics & Religious Liberty Commission of the Southern Baptist Convention (http://erlc.com), The Alliance Defending Freedom (http://alliancedefendingfreedom.org),The Family Research Council (http://www.frc.org), and others like them; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that we pledge to defend the God-given and constitutionally guaranteed right of every American citizen to worship God freely in thought, word, and action, according to the dictates of his or her conscience, and to support the passage of legislation such as Religious Freedom Restoration Act or other laws protecting religious liberty in our state and nation.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that copies of this Resolution be forwarded to Georgia's Governor, the Lieutenant Governor, the Speaker of the House and the sitting state senators and representatives who represent the people of Georgia, as well as to Georgia's two United States Senators and to the Justices of the Supreme Court of the United States of America.

2. RESOLUTION #2, REGARDING THE DEFENSE OF BIBLICAL MARRIAGE:

WHEREAS, Georgia Free Will Baptists have maintained a Biblical stance on the issues of marital equality and the primacy of Biblical marriage in society: and

WHEREAS, we believe that marriage is both a covenantal relationship and an institution established by God, rather than simply a human social construct (Genesis 2:24, Matthew 19:4-6, Ephesians 5:22-23); and

WHEREAS, Georgia Free Will Baptists embrace the Biblical definition of marriage as the exclusive life-long union of one man and one woman; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of Georgia spoke clearly in 2004 when 76 percent of the people voted for an amendment to the Georgia Constitution that makes it unconstitutional for the state to recognize or perform same sex marriage or civil unions:

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that we encourage Christians to be informed concerning the political life of our state and nation, so as to protect religious freedoms guaranteed in our constitution; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that we strongly encourage the political and judicial leaders of our state to abide by the Constitutional Amendment of our state that prohibits same sex marriage and civil unions; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that despite our opposition to same sex marriages on convictional grounds, Georgia Free Will Baptists express Christian love and concern for those who struggle with same sex attraction, or any other sexual activity outside the bounds of God's creative design for marriage, acknowledging that every person is of eternal value to our Creator and that every person desperately needs the redemption that Jesus has provided through His death, burial and resurrection: and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that copies of this Resolution be forwarded to Georgia's Governor, the Lieutenant Governor, the Speaker of the House and the sitting state senators and representatives who represent the people of Georgia, as well as to Georgia's two United States Senators and to the Justices of the Supreme Court of the United States of America.

3. RESOLUTION #3. CONCERNING APPRECIATION TO OUR HOSTS:

WHEREAS, the Georgia Association of Free Will Baptists have enjoyed and appreciated the outstanding hospitality extended by the First Free Will Baptist Church of Albany;

BE IT RESOLVED, that we extend to them a rising vote of thanks to the Pastor, Staff, and Congregation of our host Church.

A motion was made, seconded, and carried to receive the report as information.

A motion was made to amend Resolutions #1 and #2 to include sending copies to Georgia's executive and legislative representatives, to Georgia's two United States Senators, and to the Justices of the Supreme Court of the United States of America. The motion to amend was seconded and carried.

A motion was made and seconded to adopt RESOLUTION #1, as amended. The motion carried and will be acted upon accordingly.

A motion was made and seconded to adopt RESOLUTION #2, as amended. The motion carried and will be acted upon accordingly.

A motion was made and seconded to adopt RESOLUTION #3. The motion carried and was acted upon accordingly.

Final Report of the Nominating Committee

After the Clerk's reading of the first nomination of the committee, a motion was made, from the floor, to re-elect the current officers, Moderator Wayne Miracle, Assistant Moderator Rick Cason, Clerk Keith Lloyd, and Assistant Clerk Tim Horne, each with terms expiring in 2017. The motion was seconded and carried.

The Association as recessed briefly before the morning worship service.

FRIDAY MORNING WORSHIP SESSION

The session reassembled with Bro. Mark Walker serving as the worship leader and Bro. Terry Tribble presiding. The congregation sang "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms", and "Joy Unspeakable".

Bro. Terry Tribble introduced the speaker, Rev. Phil Bozeman, who is the pastor of the Turner's Chapel Free Will Baptist Church in Butler, Georgia.

Taking his text from Luke 19:1-10, Bro. Phil preached an inspiring and encouraging message concerning the salvation of Zaccheus and how it illustrates the gracious, satisfying, and empowering work of Christ in our lives.

The congregation sang "I Need the Every Hour" as an opportunity to respond to the Word was given.

Executive Secretary/Treasurer Report January 1, 2014 – December 31, 2014

Welcome to the Seventy-ninth annual session of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. We have gathered to conduct our state association business and receive reports from our state boards and national agencies.

This digest contains reports from all the Georgia State Boards. The board reports and all financial reports cover the period of January 1, 2014 – December 31, 2014

Thank you for your faithful support during 2014. Receipts through the State Office totaled \$860,538.47. Of this amount \$298,410.35 was Cooperative Receipts, \$214,829.24 was Georgia Acts 1:8 Receipts and \$347,298.88 was Designated Receipts. We had a decrease of \$3,455.00 or 1.14% in Cooperative Receipts, an increase of \$3,001.05 or 1.42% in Georgia Acts 1:8 Receipts, an increase of \$12,528.16 or 3.74% in Designated Giving and an increase of \$12,104.21 or 1.43% in total giving.

Your faithfulness to support the *Georgia Cooperative Plan* and the *Georgia Acts 1:8 Plan* makes it possible for the gospel to be shared in foreign countries, new churches to be planted in Arizona and Colorado. Scholarships are given each semester to Georgia students who attend Welch College. You also help fund six sessions of youth camp, four retreats and the retirement program for Georgia pastors. By supporting these two plans you are supporting every phase of the state work and all of the national departments except for Randall House Publications.

Dale and Sandra Bishop, Doug and Miriam Bishop, Joni and Heath Hubbard and Nathan and Linda Snow are ministering in Japan. Matt and Christina Price are ministering in France. Chris and Tori Sargent are raising funds and plan to go ministers with the M-Team in Spain this fall.

Josh and Ashley Bennett along with Jeff and Heather Goodman are planting a church in Arizona. Donnie and Susan Burke and Barry and Jessica Long are planting churches in Colorado.

Georgia Free Will Baptists gave a total of \$1,012,476.93 or \$141.43 per member to district, state, and national ministries in 2014. Thank you for your faithful support.

Please pray for our 16 churches that are without a pastor.

I thank God for giving me the opportunity to serve Him in the **Great State of Georgia**. It has been seventeen wonderful years of service and ministry for me in the State Office. Thank you for your prayers and support.

Executive Board Report March 2014 – March 2015

Since our last Annual Session, the Executive Board has met to conduct the State business at the following times and locations:

March 18, 2015, First FWB Church, Albany (prior to 79th Annual Session)

December 16, 2014, White Oaks FWB Church, Macon

September 16, 2014, Little Ocmulgee State Park, McRae

From these meetings, the following items are presented for general information and/or approval at this 79th Annual Session.

2015 State Meeting Program

 Featured speakers were chosen for the 79th Annual Session's Bible Conference and Worship Sessions.

Budget Approvals

A 2015 calendar year budget of \$850,000.00. A 2015 Cooperative Budget of \$320,000.00, a 2015 Acts 1:8 Budget of \$225,000.00 and an estimated \$305,000.00 in *Designated Giving* is included in the overall budget. A proposed 2016 *Cooperative Budget* of \$320,000.00 is included with this report.

Acts 1:8 Program Actions

- 2015 disbursements were adopted as follows: 65% to the Global Evangelism Fund;
 20% to the Georgia Mission Board; 4% each to Home Missionaries Josh Bennett,
 Donnie Burke, Jeff Goodman; and 3% to Home Missionary Barry Long.
- The state's five year Acts 1:8 commitments to Donnie Burke (Castle Rock, CO), Jeff Goodman (Marana, AZ), and Josh Bennett (Marana, AZ) as Home Missionaries were extended by one year. The missionaries were asked to submit an annual report to the Executive Board by August 15 in order for the board to determine the possibility of inclusion and the budget percentage for the following year. (2015 will be the 6th year of their inclusion.)
- The state's one year extension of a 5 year Acts 1:8 commitment to Barry Long (Aurora, CO) as a Home Missionary was extended by another year. The board informed Bro. Barry that unless significant growth occurs in attendance and giving in 2015, this will be the last year of his inclusion in the Acts 1:8 Program. (2015 will be the 7th year of his inclusion.)

Contingency Fund Purchases

 The Board approved the replacement of State Office computers and printers, as the need arises, due to Microsoft no longer supporting older operating systems.

State Office Personnel Salaries

• The Board approved a 2% annual salary increase in 2015 for Executive Secretary William Smith, and a 4% salary increase for Office Secretary Rhonda Chandler.

Executive Board Meeting and Prayer Retreat

 An Executive Board Meeting and Prayer Retreat is scheduled for September 14-15, 2015, at the Little Ocmulgee State Park in McRae.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-I AWS

GEORGIA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS, Inc.

PREAMBLE

We, the Free Will Baptist of the State of Georgia, do ordain this Constitution for the purpose of advocating, promoting and increasing all phases of the cause of Christ.

ARTICLE I

This assembly shall be known as the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.

Article II

- **SECTION 1.** The officers of this association shall be Moderator, an Assistant Moderator, a Clerk, an Assistant Clerk, and an Executive Secretary/Treasurer.
- **SECTION 2.** The Executive Board shall be composed of the regular officers; the chairman of each of the standing boards; and the previous moderator, as an ex officio member for a period of two years following his term of office; and the moderator of the District Associations not represented shall serve as members at large.
- **SECTION 3.** This Association shall be composed of ordained Ministers, ordained Deacons, Missionaries, and Board Members who are members of affiliated bodies; one (1) delegate for every three hundred (300) members or fraction thereof from District Associations; one (1) delegate for every one hundred (100) members or fraction thereof from each local affiliated church.
- **SECTION 4.** All delegates from District Associations and local churches shall be elected from the laity of the body sending them.
- **SECTION 5.** Funds to meet current needs of this body shall be paid to the treasurer of this association. Each District Association will give a minimum of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per delegate authorized, and each local church will give twenty-five (\$25.00) per delegate.
- **SECTION 6.** In order to pay our Georgia State Association's annual representation fee to the National Association, each local association is to be responsible to promote, receive and forward the amount designated by the National Association per church per year to the State Office, along with their annual State Association representation fee, on or before our annual State Association session.

ARTICLE III

- **SECTION 1.** It shall be the privilege of each affiliated District Association to recommend a member for each standing board. Terms of office on these boards shall be on a rotating basis which will necessitate the election by the State Association of five (5) members every two (2) years, thus giving each member a four (4) year term of office.
- **SECTION 2.** There shall be a **Board of Missions** composed of members who are noted for their missionary zeal.

- **A.** The Board of Missions shall employ missionaries as needed to establish Free Will Baptist mission/churches in the State of Georgia. These missionaries may be employed exclusively or jointly with other Free Will Baptist agencies.
- **B.** A mission/church sponsored by the Georgia State Association and their missionaries are under the authority of the State Association and the supervision of the Georgia State Board of Missions.
- **C.** A mission/church does not have autonomous church status. As long as the mission/church is unable to provide for its own business, it is in a dependent relationship to the State Association and its Board of Missions.
- **D.** When the mission/church is self-sustaining, self-governing, self-discipline, and self-propagating. It should be organized into an autonomous Free Will Baptist Church following the procedures adopted by the Georgia State Association.
- **E.** After proper procedures are satisfied and the church is duly organized into autonomous Free Will Baptist church it shall have all normal rights, privileges, and responsibilities of any other Free Will Baptist Church.
- **SECTION 3.** There shall be a **Board of Camping** whose duties shall be to schedule and arrange all camp sessions, and to appoint the Camp Director each year.

SECTION 4. There shall be a **Board of Christian Education** whose duties shall be:

- **A.** To provide educational services for the members of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists.
- **B.** To set policy and supervise the functions of the State Youth Committee. This Board shall appoint this Committee to carry out Board policy.
- **C.** To organize sponsor and promote educational and inspirational retreats for our members.
 - **D.** To organize, sponsor and promote Sunday School and Church Training seminars.
- **E.** To set policy and supervise the Historical Committee. This Board shall appoint the Historical Committee to gather and set forth for public knowledge and posterity the history of Georgia Free Will Baptists.
- **SECTION 5.** There shall be a **Board of Trustees** whose duties shall be; maintenance, upkeep and insuring of all State Association properties; the planning and supervision of all future developments and expansion of these properties as directed by the State Association except otherwise provided in this Constitution.
- **SECTION 6.** There shall be a **Credentials Committee**, which shall consist of three (3) members of three-year terms. And the term of one expiring each year thereafter according to seniority of service, who shall be in charge of the registration and examination of delegates and the receiving of all dues.
- **SECTION 7.** There shall be two members on the Board of Trustees of the Free Will Baptist Children's Home, Eldridge, Alabama, elected for terms of four (4) years. Election will take place on odd years and shall be staggered.
- **SECTION 8.** There shall be a **Georgia State Master's Men.** They shall select their own officers and conduct their own business.

SECTION 9. There shall be a **Georgia State Woman's Auxiliary Convention (GWAC).** They shall elect their officers, conduct their business and maintain their treasury.

ARTICLE IV

- **SECTION 1.** All officers except board members and the Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be elected to serve a term of two (2) years. The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be employed by the Executive Board of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, subject to the ratification of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists at its next regular session, for an indefinite period, with an agreement of sixty (60) day notice of termination by either the Executive Secretary/Treasurer or the Executive Board.
- **SECTION 2.** Standing Boards of the State Association have no power of final authority to hire, full–time employees until the matter has been presented to and acted on by the State Association in session except where otherwise provided.
- **SECTION 3.** The Executive Board may fill vacancies on any of the boards or committees, which occur between regular sessions of this State Association, until the convening of the annual session of said association.
- **SECTION 4.** Election of all General Officers shall take place on the odd years of the calendar.
- **SECTION 5.** If a member of any board fails in the function of his or her duty without good and sufficient reasons, the board of which the delinquent is a member may declare that particular office vacant. Further, this body shall have and does reserve the right to deal with the officer or board member who does not conduct his or her office in a Christian, business like manner according to the rules of Christian conduct as set forth in the New Testament.

Any standing board of this State Association may appoint proxies to serve in lieu of the absent members.

At the pleasure of the boards, and subsequent to the meeting from which the regular member is absent, the boards have the right to deal with the delinquent member in the manner stated in this section.

SECTION 6. The Chairman or Vice-Chairman of said board, or by the Moderator or Assistant Moderator of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, upon the request of the majority of the members of said boards, may call boards into session.

SECTION 7. An auditing Committee shall consist of three (3) members elected for three (3) three year terms.

AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be changed, altered, or amended by two-thirds (2/3) vote of all delegates present and voting at any regular session of the State Association. Prior to a final vote on any amendment, change or alteration, said amendment, change or alteration shall be submitted in writing to the Clerk of this association and shall lie on the table from one (1) business meeting to the next during the same session, during which time it shall be read at least two (2) times in open session. Officers, standing boards, and/or standing committees may be added or deleted as the need arises.

BY-LAWS

SECTION 1

- **A.** All real property, checking and savings account or any other assets of this Association shall be in the name of the *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists*. *Inc.*
- **B.** One or more of the corporate officers of the Association shall be the legal signers of all Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. business. These officers are: the Moderator as the corporate President; the Clerk as the corporate Vice-President; and the Executive Secretary/Treasurer as the Secretary/Treasurer.
- **C.** The State Office shall be responsible for the safekeeping of the corporate seal and all official documents of the State Association.
- **D.** No State Board may borrow money or financially obligated the State Association without the approval of the Executive Board.
- **E.** The fixed assets (building, land) of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists shall not be liquidated except by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the delegates present and voting at any regular session of the Association.
- The Executive Board shall have the authority to approve the sale of properties donated to any Board of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc., upon recommendation of the Board to which the donation was made, with proceeds remaining under the authority of the recommending Board."
- **F.** The records of all financial transaction shall be open to all members of the Georgia State Association. The financial transactions of the State Office and State Boards shall be audited annually.
- **G.** Annual financial reports of the State Office and State Boards and the auditor's report shall be made to the State Association in session an be entered in the Annual State Minutes.
- **H.** The State Treasurer shall be bonded in amount stipulated by the State Executive Board.
- I. This Association shall meet for its regular session annually on the third Thursday in March.

SECTION 2

- **A.** When the State Association is not in session, the State Executive Board shall be duly authorized to do business in the name of the State Association.
- **B.** The State Association has full authority to direct the State Executive Board in all business conducted on its behalf.
- **C.** The State Executive Board shall report to the State Association in session concerning the business conducted for the State Association since its last convening.
- **D.** The State Executive Board has the prerogative of deferring any matter to the State Association as a whole but is not under obligation to do so.
- **E.** The State Executive Board shall meet quarterly in the following months: March, September, and December. The March meeting shall be held just prior to the regular meeting of the State Association.

F. Any and all correspondence from any member of this State Association, (includes either individual, group, Board or District Association) directed to any Board, or Chairman of said Board, or any officer of this State Association, or any open letters to any or all District Associations of this State, that pertains to any business which is desired or required to be brought before this body at any scheduled or special called meeting, shall be properly sent directly to the Clerk of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, The clerk will be responsible for routing the correspondence to its proper designation. All correspondence as mentioned above, shall be required to be received by the Clerk of the State Association at least 30 days prior to any scheduled State Association Meeting if said correspondence contains business that is to be introduced and discussed at said meeting.

SECTION 3

- **A.** The moderator shall preside at the Annual Session of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists and the meetings of the Executive Board. The Moderator shall be the President of the Corporation known as the *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists*, *Inc.*
- **B.** The Assistant Moderator shall preside in the absence of the Moderator and/or when appointed by the Moderator as the need arises.
- **C.** The Clerk shall keep records of the proceedings of the Annual Associational meeting and of the Executive Board meetings. It shall also be his responsibility to have the minutes of these sessions printed and distributed. The Clerk shall be the Vice-President of the Corporation known as *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*
- **D.** The Assistant Clerk in the absence of the Clerk, shall fulfill the functions and duties of the Clerk as stated in paragraph C of this document.

SECTION 4

- **A.** The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be responsible and accountable to the Executive Board in the fulfillment of the duties of his office as determined by the Executive Board.
- **B.** The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be allowed four (4) weeks vacation per year with pay.
- **C.** Funds received by the Executive Secretary/Treasurer for revivals, special speaking engagements and promotional meetings shall go into the Cooperative Fund. The exception to this regulation relates to remuneration received by the Executive Secretary during his four (4) weeks vacation, which shall be his personally and need not be accounted for to this State Association.
- **D.** Salary, mileage and operational expenses of the Executive Secretary/ Treasurer shall be determined by the Executive Board.
- **E.** The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be the Secretary/Treasurer of the Corporation known as the *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*
- **F. General Promotion.** He is to represent, or cause to be represented, the association at all affairs of interest to the association and he is to promote the work of the association in such a manner so as to unify the association as well as promote both the state and national works, missionaries, mission conferences, etc. Through personal communication he shall keep close contact with pastors, churches, and district association.

- **G. Administration.** He shall administer the affairs of the executive office and carry out the responsibilities delegated to him by the State Association and the Executive Board. He is to serve with all standing boards and committees of the association in an ex-official capacity. He is to report to the association during each annual session.
- **H. Stewardship.** He shall serve as treasurer of this association. An accurate and complete record of all funds received and disbursed shall be kept and a written report shall be included in his report to this association in its annual session. He shall receive, hold and disburse money as is made available by the State Association to the various boards. Disbursements to the various boards will be made available when requested.
- **I. Publication.** It shall be his duty to edit and publish the state paper. He shall direct the production of general promotional materials, pamphlets, audiovisuals, and books as approved by the Executive Board.
- **J. Arranging State Association.** He shall expedite the planning of the State Association program, enroll all ministers and delegates, print and distribute minutes, and investigate future sites for the annual session.

SECTION 5

- **A.** The Executive Board shall serve as the Placement Committee for the State Association. In this capacity the board shall investigate places suitable for this meeting and make recommendations to said State Association. Meeting places shall be determined two (2) years in advance.
- **B.** The Executive Board shall plan the program for the annual meetings of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists and the annual meetings shall follow the programs as closely as possible. Business sessions shall be conducted according to the commonly accepted rules of Parliamentary Procedure.
- **C.** The Executive Board shall formulate the budget for the State Association annually and recommend to the body in the session the allocations to be observed in the Cooperative Plan for Giving. This board shall, in addition to the above stated duties, also recommend a mileage rate for travel by the members of all standing boards in said association.

SECTION 6

The Moderator shall appoint necessary committees unless otherwise provided for by the body.

SECTION 7

These By-Laws may be altered, changed, or amended at any regular session of this association by two-thirds (2/3) vote of delegates present and voting

GEORGIA WOMEN ACTIVE FOR CHRIST Of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. Constitution and By-Laws

Article I

Name

This organization shall be known as Georgia Women Active for Christ a division of the Georgia Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc., commonly known by its initials, GWAC. Its members shall elect officers, conduct business and maintain a treasury.

Article II

Purpose

The purpose of this organization shall be to assist the various women composing the GWAC in providing opportunities to understand and fulfill the Great Commission through their responsibilities in the family, church, community, and around the world.

It shall bring the women of each district together for fellowship, sharing information, encouraging one another in the work of the Lord and furthering the purpose and goals of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists.

Article III

Officers

- 1. The officers of this convention shall be president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, field worker, historian, two media coordinators, and a member at large, all of which are elected by the convention. These officers shall serve as the State Executive Board. A minimum of five officers shall be a guorum for transacting business.
- 2. Any officer or elected board member of this convention must be an active member of a local Free Will Baptist Church and an active member of the GWAC group of a local church
- Executive Board members are required to attend all scheduled board meetings and GWAC sponsored events. Any officer missing two meetings/events, without providing the president with reason of the absence, is subject to review and removal by the Executive Board.

Article IV

Membership

- 1. This convention shall be composed of: the officers of the convention, district presidents, district field workers, ten delegates (duly accredited by the credentials committee) from each district convention, four delegates and the president from each local GWAC in good standing with its district convention.
- 2. Local groups in an area where there is no district convention may be represented with five delegates by payment of their membership dues. All delegates, as well as officers of the convention, shall be in good standing with a church that is in good standing with the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, and shall perform the duties as set forth for them in the present WNAC manual and this Constitution and By-Laws.

Article V

Meetings

- 1. The annual meeting shall be held each year the day before the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists convention in the same place or at such a time and place determined at the previous annual meeting or by the Executive Board.
- 2. A prayer retreat shall be held annually, time and place to be planned by the Executive Board.

Article VI

Amendments

This Constitution may be amended at any annual meeting of the convention by a twothirds vote of the members present.

By-Laws

Article I

Duties of Officers

President – The president shall preside over all meetings, appoint such committees as may be needed; call the Executive Board together when necessary; be ex-officio member of all committees, except the nominating committee; see that reports are sent promptly to the WNAC secretary; and perform all duties pertaining to such an office.

Vice President – The vice president shall preside in the absence of the president or by her request and otherwise assist her in the oversight of the work in general. She shall serve as chairman of the credentials committee.

Secretary – The secretary shall keep an accurate record of all proceedings of the convention and Executive Board meetings; preserve all valuable papers and turn same over to her successor; make an annual report to the WNAC secretary on a form available from the WNAC office within 15 days after the State GWAC Convention; compile the districts' slate of officers and addresses immediately after the convention; send a slate of state officers to the WNAC secretary and to each state officer. She is responsible for getting the minutes prepared and to the state associational office in time to be included in the state minutes each year.

Treasurer – The treasurer shall have charge of all funds belonging to this convention and shall pay out same only when authorized by the convention. The treasurer shall keep an accurate account, and give a written report of all funds received and disbursed at each annual meeting of the convention. She is required to deposit all checks in her possession and disburse all designated funds by the 30th of each month. She shall be bonded through the state office and audited annually.

Field Worker – The field worker shall promote GWAC programs through personal contact and the distribution of literature and serve where needed as directed by the Executive Board.

Historian – The historian shall keep a historical record and have a display at all state meetings and serve where needed as directed by the Executive Board.

Member at Large – The members at large shall help promote the work in general, meet with the Executive Board, and serve where needed as directed by the Executive Board.

Media Coordinators – Two Media Coordinators who will be responsible for compiling, editing and publishing the *Georgia Women in Touch* Newsletter, and serve where needed as directed by the Executive Board. Articles should be sent to the state executive office by the 1st of each month. They may either write the articles or ask someone to write the articles for them.

Article II

Elections

A nominating committee shall nominate the general officers and members at large. Following the nominating committee's report, opportunity shall be given for nominations from the floor. In case of more than one nominee for any particular office, a vote will be taken for each; otherwise they may be elected by acclamation. The officers shall be elected every two years on odd number years. Not more than one-half of the elected officers shall be changed in any regular election. All elections shall be held at the closing sessions of the annual convention.

Article III

Expenses

Estimated expenses for the state work shall be set by an annual budget approved by the convention. The Executive Board must approve all reimbursement.

Article IV

Boards and Committees

Executive Board – This Board shall be composed of six officers, two media coordinators, and one member at large elected by the convention. Five of these shall compose a quorum. They shall hold meetings for the transaction of business as often as necessary. It shall be the duty of the Executive Board to maintain an oversight of the work at large. The Board shall act for the convention when necessary. It shall prepare the program for the regular meetings and fill any vacancy between elections.

Resolutions Committee – A resolutions committee shall be appointed by the president. A member of the Executive Board shall chair this committee. This committee shall review all resolutions presented, having the prerogative of passing on to the convention those resolutions that are deemed proper and profitable. Resolutions should be properly worded, i.e. "Be it Resolved....."

Nominating Committee – The nominating committee shall be composed of one member from each district convention and shall be elected one year prior to making their report. The names of the members from each district shall be submitted with the convention annual report. The president shall appoint a chairperson from the members of the nominating committee.

Credentials Committee – The vice president shall be the chairman of the credentials committee and the president shall appoint two other members. This committee shall examine the reports of the represented women's groups to see if fees are paid and if reports are in order.

Finance Committee – The treasurer shall be chairman of the finance committee and the president may appoint four other members. This committee reviews the financial records for the year, reports on same to the convention, and makes recommendations of disbursements of funds to the convention.

Registration Committee – The president shall appoint members as needed to serve on this committee. This committee registers those in attendance and gives a report to the convention.

Article V

Dues and Reports

Active members shall pay dues yearly as required by the GWAC Convention for membership. State treasurer must receive all dues for all members no later than November 15th. The state treasurer than has to compile a report that reflects the membership of the paid GWAC members for the current reporting year.

Current dues per member: GWAC Dues - \$3.00, WNAC Dues - \$15.00,

Total Dues - \$18.00

District secretaries and treasurers <u>annual</u> reports shall be filed with the state secretary and treasurer no later than January 15th following the close of the previous year.

Reporting Deadlines:

District Treasurer to State Treasurer – December 1st

District Secretary to Sate Secretary – January 15th

Article VI

Gifts

Season of Prayer Offerings-

- **1. Pre-Easter Week of Prayer** offering is used for Foreign Missions in memory of Laura Bell Barnard, our first foreign missionary.
- 2. Pre-Thanksgiving Week of Prayer offering is used for National Home Missions in memory of Mrs. Lizzie McAdams, a great writer of our literature and one of the first National officers.
- **3.** The December Week of Prayer offering is used for State Missions in memory of Mrs. Alice E. Lupton, our first National president.
- **Co-Laborer Offering** A financial plan of support for WNAC. Each local GWAC is encouraged to support the WNAC office with a monthly offering.

Provision Closet - This project helps missionaries as they return home to pick up household items, etc., from the closet at the National Office. Each local GWAC is encouraged to keep abreast of the items and supplies needed as they are periodically listed in the **Co-Laborer** magazine, and give to this project as needed.

WNAC Emphasis – A special offering to supplement the Co-Laborer Offerings for WNAC expenses of operation, literature, etc. This offering is received during August.

Remembrance Fund – This is a fund established by WNAC and a distinct way to honor any occasion the donor wishes to note: Anniversaries, birthdays, or as a memorial gift at the time of death. A remembrance card notifying the family of the person being honored, and the donor, will be entered in the permanent Book of Remembrances in the WNAC office. These gifts will be used to advance the kingdom of God through WNAC. A Remembrance Service is to be conducted at our state GWAC convention each year.

Dr. Mary Ruth Wisehart Foreign Student Scholarship Fund – Any GWAC group who wishes may contribute to this special fund set up by WNAC to train Nationals from our foreign fields. February is designated as Foreign Student month.

Dot Harvey Loan Fund – This revolving loan fund was established in honor of Miss Dot Harvey, a forerunner of youth work in Georgia, by the Georgia Women's Auxiliary Convention in 1954 to aid worthy Georgia students attending Free Will Baptist Bible College. Each local group is asked to donate monthly toward this project. A special offering is received in September to add to this fund.

Westfield Church Fund –This fund is used to assist the church in Kotogiri, South India in memory of Miss Laura Bell Barnard. All groups are encouraged to give to this Georgia project monthly.

Other Gifts – The state GWAC may decide on and promote other projects for funds at its own discretion.

Lora Shutes Mission Project – This is a statewide project with the goal set each year at the annual convention. Funds are disbursed to missionaries through the State Acts 1:8 Program.

GWAC Emphasis – June is designated as GWAC Emphasis Month. Each group is asked to receive a special offering to supplement GWAC operational expenses.
