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Proceedings of the 88th Annual Session

The Official Minutes of the Eighty-Eighth Annual Session of the Georgia Association of Free Will Baptists, when convening at the Awaken FWB Church in Tifton, Georgia, on March 21st & 22nd, 2024.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON BUSINESS SESSION

Call to Session & Preliminaries

At 2:00 PM, the GAFWB convened with Clerk Keith Lloyd officially calling the Eighty-Eighth Annual Session to order and introducing the Moderator, Wayne Miracle, who began the session with a Scripture reading from Galatians 5:16-26, followed by reading a portion of the FWB Treatise Articles of Faith.

The Moderator welcomed everyone and recognized the Standing Delegates, which includes ordained ministers and deacons, board members and missionaries. Delegates of individual church and district associations were recognized. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to seat all elected delegates.

Bobby Taylor gave a partial report for the Credentials Committee.

The Moderator then recognized the national messengers and welcomed other visitors.

GAFWB Executive Board Report

Clerk Keith Lloyd read and presented a printed report of the Executive Board. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to receive the report as information.

Executive Secretary / Treasurer Report

Executive Secretary/Treasurer William Smith began his report with an overview of the 2023 giving and financial status. Last year's giving exceeded all expectations: 2023 closed with \$1.7 million in net assets. Details are included in the Digest of Reports.

Updates were given regarding baptisms, missionaries, and missions. The financial accounts of our Georgia missionaries are in great shape.

The Cooperative Budget supports all facets of FWB missions and ministries.

There are currently 22 GAFWB churches without pastors.

Bro. William Smith expressed appreciation for the opportunity to serve as GAFWB Executive Secretary and for the support shown for the last 26 years. On-going health issues have led him to this decision to retire from his Executive Secretary position.

A motion was made, seconded, and carried to receive this report as information.

National Executive Office Report

Eddie Moody reported for the Executive Office. He began by thanking Georgia for their support in so many ways. The purpose of the Office is to provide support for Free Will Baptist churches. An online directory is available for churches to submit their address, pictures, and information. Information about several other resources was shared.

The 2024 National Convention will be held in Tampa, Florida, and he encouraged bringing young people to the Convention.

Eddie Moody also gave a report for ***International Missions***. He began by reading a thank you letter to Executive Secretary William Smith from IM Director Clint Morgan.

Georgia FWB's were encouraged to pray for missionaries and the people they are called to reach, to go on mission opportunities, and to give in support of missions.

Women Active for Christ

Courtney Adams reported on the Georgia WAC one-day retreat. They exceeded their fund-raising goal and established new goals in support of various missionaries. She encouraged our churches to establish active women's ministries. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to receive this report as information.

Eddie Moody reported for the ***National WNAC*** on behalf of Ruth McDonald. He encouraged FWB women to take advantage of their online magazine, attend various retreats, and listen to podcasts. The SHINE Conferences are designed for young ladies between 12 and 18 years old: the next conference will be held in February 2025 and will be available to simulcast in local churches.

GEORGIA BOARD REPORTS

GAFWB Board of Missions Report

Rick Cason gave the report for the Board of Missions. The Board is not only charged with establishing new churches but also revitalizing plateaued or declining churches.

The Mission Board's written report and financial report are included in the Digest of Reports. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to receive the report as information.

GAFWB Board of Trustees Report

William Smith gave a report for the Board of Trustees on behalf of David Wolfe.

The Trustee Board's written report and financial report are included in the Digest of Reports. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to receive the report as information.

GAFWB Board of Camping Report

Mark Walker gave the report for the Board of Camping. For the first time since 2019, a State Teen Camp for 2024 will be held at Ocoee Retreat Center in Tennessee.

The Camp Board's written report and the financial report are included in the Digest of Reports. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to receive the report as information.

GAFWB Board of Christian Education

Kent Barwick gave the report for the C.E. Board on behalf of Royce Horne. Information was given about retreats, scholarships, and historical records.

The C.E. Board's written report and financial report are included in the Digest of Reports. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to receive the report as information.

Executive Secretary Search Committee Report, Nomination, and Election

Moderator Wayne Miracle reported on the receipt of two resumes and subsequent interviews regarding the vetting and nomination of a new Executive Secretary to replace William Smith upon his pending retirement on July 31, 2024.

Clerk Keith Lloyd reported that both the Search Committee and the Executive Board have unanimously agreed to nominate Dr. Rick Cason to the 88th Annual Session of the GAFWB for election as the new Executive Secretary.

Delegates received written ballots to cast a "Yes" or "No" vote to elect Dr. Rick Cason. A motion and second to vote on Dr. Rick Cason as the new Executive Secretary was made. Hearing no questions, the motion carried.

After ballot collection and counting by Assistant Clerk Tim Horne and Credentials Committee Chairman Bobby Taylor, the Clerk reported that Dr. Rick Cason received 23 "yes" votes and 1 "no" vote as the new Executive Secretary.

MISCELLANEOUS REPORTS

David Brown reported for the **Free Will Baptist Foundation**. He thanked Bro. William Smith for all his support. Grants are being offered again this year to FWB ministries. Financial updates and opportunities were briefly outlined.

Todd Parish reported for **Welch College**. The financial condition and enrollment numbers were shared. Recovery from the pandemic has been slow, but God has been faithful to provide the finances and students necessary to sustain the ministry of the school. The generosity of several Georgia churches and the GAFWB was noted.

After brief announcements from the Moderator, the Session gathered around newly elected Executive Secretary Rick Cason with S.E. Newberry leading in prayer. Following this prayer, the Session recessed from Business until Friday morning.

THURSDAY EVENING WORSHIP SERVICE

Led by the Awaken Church worship team, the congregation sang "Glorious Day" and "Goodness of God". Tim Horne welcomed the Association, led in an opening prayer, and introduced the speaker, NAFWB Executive Secretary Dr. Eddie Moody.

After honoring retiring Executive Secretary William Smith, Dr. Moody delivered a message on "Qualities of Leadership" from Numbers 13-14.

Following the worship service, Kent Barwick and Randy Jackson presented William and Tera Smith with gifts from the Association for their 26 years of faithful service to GAFWB as Executive Secretary. A retirement reception followed.

FRIDAY MORNING WORSHIP SERVICE

The session opened with Austin Long leading the congregation in "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms". Dr. Rick Cason read from the FWB Treatise.

Tim Horne introduced the morning speaker, Matt Mouser, the pastor of the First FWB Church in Columbus. Taking his text from Colossians 1:21-23, Bro. Matt declared the truth regarding "The Past, Future, and Present of the Christian".

The congregation took a 10-minute break before business resumed.

FRIDAY MORNING BUSINESS SESSION

Moderator Wayne Miracle asked Clint Adams to read another section from the FWB Treatise. Assistant Moderator Rick Cason read a Scripture selection from Luke 24:1-6.

OTHER MISCELLANEOUS REPORTS & BUSINESS

Ron Hunter reported for **Randall House Publications**. Generational discipleship is the purpose and intent of every facet of the D6 Family Ministry. Information was given regarding the various resources provided by Randall House.

John Brummitt gave a report on behalf of the **Board of Retirement**. They recently added another investment option to better serve the needs of pastors. The Institutional Program is designed to help churches with building projects or major renovations. Financial training seminars and resources are also offered to pastors and churches.

International Missions reports were given by Nathan Snow (Japan) and Matt Price (France). Bro. Nathan shared about his new position as the President of JEMA (Japanese Evangelical Missionary Association) and Sis. Linda's role as a teacher in Okinawa Christian School. Bro. Matt gave positive reports about God's work in France and a ministry

expansion of training pastors into Togo, Africa. Demographics, ministry activities, and testimonies of God's faithfulness were shared by both missionaries.

Josh Bennett reported for the **North America Ministries**. Information was given regarding the special offering received for NAM, new church plants all over the nation, and the work God is doing in Georgia through the Awaken Church in Tifton. Resources and support are available to plateaued and declining churches who need revitalization. Disaster response, chaplaincy certifications, cross-cultural ministries, and the Church Extension Loan Fund are also a part of their efforts.

Danny Williams reported for **Alabama Children's Home**. The home currently has 22 children. A troubling new trend is the increasing number of adopted children being given up by their parents. Financially the home is better off than it has ever been. Prayers were solicited for the house parents now serving, for others to be called to this ministry, and for the total wellbeing of the children in their care.

Resolutions Committee Report

A resolution of a standing vote of thanksgiving to the Awaken Church for their gracious hospitality in hosting the Association for two years in a row.

2025 Cooperative Budget

A motion was made, seconded, and carried to adopt a Coop Budget of \$320,000.

Final Credentials Committee Report

Bobby Taylor submitted the final report of the Credentials Committee as follows: 31 standing delegates and 1 elected delegate for a total voting delegation of 32. There were also 42 visitors registered for a total registration of 74. The highest attendance was 99, during the Thursday evening worship service.

A motion was made, seconded, and carried to receive the report as information.

Delegates to the National Convention

A motion was made to elect Jerry McClary and Wanda McClary as delegates to the 2024 National Convention in Tampa, Florida, and to give Executive Secretary William Smith the authority to appoint additional or alternate delegates as necessary. The motion was seconded and carried.

Report of the Nominating Committee

Moderator Wayne Miracle read a list of people nominated by district associations to serve on the state's boards and committees. A motion was made and seconded to accept the nominations presented by the district associations. The motion carried.

Executive Board Report March 2023 – March 2024

Since our last Annual Session, the Executive Board has met to conduct the State business at the following time and location:

- March 16, 2023, Hilton Garden Inn, Tifton
- October 5, 2023, Awaken FWB Church, Tifton

From this meeting, the following items are presented for general information and/or approval at this 88th Annual Session.

Budget Approvals

- A 2024 calendar year budget of \$825,000.00. A 2024 Acts 1:8 Budget of \$165,000.00 and an estimated \$340,000.00 in *Designated Giving* is included in the overall budget. A proposed 2025 *Cooperative Budget* of \$320,000.00 is included with this report.

2024 Acts 1:8 Disbursements

- The overall budget distribution is as follows: State Board of Missions – 14%; National Home Missionaries – 21%; International Missionaries – 63%; International Missions Support Services – 2%.
- Individual missionary disbursements: Home Missions – Bennett 7%, Suggs 7%, Franks 7% (*newly added at Awaken Church*); International Missions - Bishop 9%, Hubbard 9%, Price 9%, Sargent 12%, Snow 12%, Griffin 12%.

Property Developments

- Oak Grove FWB Church in Miller County has been closed for over 30 years, with the building damaged beyond repair. An adjoining property owner expressed interest in purchasing the building and approximately 7/10ths of an acre. An attorney is trying to determine if the GAFWB is the legal title holder. The Board approved the sell of the building and property if that opportunity presents itself.

State Office Personnel

- The Board approved a 2024 annual salary increase of \$1/hour for Office Secretary Dorita McCracken's salary, from \$19/hour to \$20/hour.
- The Board approved a maximum budget of \$5,000.00 for a Retirement Reception for Executive Secretary William Smith at the 2024 Annual Session.
- The Board appointed the GAFWB Officers and one At-Large Member to serve as the Search Committee for interviewing and vetting new Executive Secretary candidates.

Future GAFWB Annual Sessions

- Due to renovations at the Colquitt Church, the 88th Annual Session will be hosted again at the Awaken Church in Tifton; the 2025 89th Annual Session is scheduled to be hosted by the First FWB Church in Columbus; and, the 2026 90th Annual Session is scheduled to be hosted by the New Hope Church in Jesup.

**Board of Christian Education Report
January 1, 2023 – December 31, 2023**

In keeping with our mission, the Board of Christian Education is dedicated to provide educational opportunities, quality retreats and historical information to the churches of our state. RETREATS: During the past year (2023) there were no retreats. As reported to the State Association last year, we were informed in January that the long-time site for most all of our retreats, the Lake Blackshear Resort, was being closed to lodging indefinitely for structural repairs. The need for affordable alternative sites and the continued rise in costs (especially food costs) are the challenges we face at this time.

We appreciate those who look forward to attending the state retreats. As a board, we continue to covet your prayers as we seek to overcome these challenges and plan for retreats that will be beneficial, enjoyable and reasonably affordable for GAFWB.

Greetings from your Georgia State Free Will Baptists Mission Board. Thank you for your support of missions via the Cooperative Plan, the Georgia Acts 1: 8 Plan and local giving. Even in the midst of troubling and trying times, God has continued to bless His work through Georgia Free Will Baptists. He is worthy of our praise, worship and faithful obedience to His calling.

The purpose of the Georgia FWB State Mission Board; to assist in the establishment of Free Will Baptist Churches in the state of Georgia. The purpose has been broadened to also allow engagement in revitalization of Free Will Baptist churches, when deemed advisable, strategic and feasible to do so.

Awaken Church: Tifton, Georgia. The Georgia State Mission board has partnered with Free Will Baptists North American Ministries in a joint project in Tifton. We saw our average attendance move from 122 to 176 from 2022 to 2023. In the early part of 2024, we have jumped to 200. We saw 25 people pray prayers of salvation in 2023, and we have baptized 63 since the Awaken launched in 2018. Our giving grew in 2023 and we continue to see positive signs in 2024. 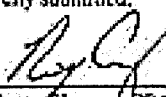
**AUDITING COMMITTEE REPORT

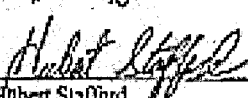

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

GEORGIA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS, Inc.

PREAMBLE

We, the Free Will Baptist of the State of Georgia, do ordain this Constitution for the purpose of advocating, promoting and increasing all phases of the cause of Christ.

ARTICLE I

This assembly shall be known as the *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*

Article II

SECTION 1. The officers of this association shall be Moderator, an Assistant Moderator, a Clerk, an Assistant Clerk, and an Executive Secretary/Treasurer.

SECTION 2. The Executive Board shall be composed of the regular officers; the chairman of each of the standing boards; and the previous moderator, as an ex officio member for a period of two years following his term of office; and the moderator of the District Associations not represented shall serve as members at large.

SECTION 3. This Association shall be composed of ordained Ministers, ordained Deacons, Missionaries, and Board Members who are members of affiliated bodies; one (1) delegate for every three hundred (300) members or fraction thereof from District Associations; one (1) delegate for every one hundred (100) members or fraction thereof from each local affiliated church.

SECTION 4. All delegates from District Associations and local churches shall be elected from the laity of the body sending them.

SECTION 5. Funds to meet current needs of this body shall be paid to the treasurer of this association. Each District Association will give a minimum of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per delegate authorized, and each local church will give twenty-five (\$25.00) per delegate.

SECTION 6. In order to pay our Georgia State Association's annual representation fee to the National Association, each local association is to be responsible to promote, receive and forward the amount designated by the National Association per church per year to the State Office, along with their annual State Association representation fee, on or before our annual State Association session.

ARTICLE III

SECTION 1. It shall be the privilege of each affiliated District Association to recommend a member for each standing board. Terms of office on these boards shall be on a rotating basis which will necessitate the election by the State Association of five (5) members every two (2) years, thus giving each member a four (4) year term of office.

SECTION 2. There shall be a **Board of Missions** composed of members who are noted for their missionary zeal.

A. The Board of Missions shall employ missionaries as needed to establish Free Will Baptist mission/churches in the State of Georgia. These missionaries may be employed exclusively or jointly with other Free Will Baptist agencies.

B. A mission/church sponsored by the Georgia State Association and their missionaries are under the authority of the State Association and the supervision of the Georgia State Board of Missions.

C. A mission/church does not have autonomous church status. As long as the mission/church is unable to provide for its own business, it is in a dependent relationship to the State Association and its Board of Missions.

D. When the mission/church is self-sustaining, self-governing, self-discipline, and self-propagating. It should be organized into an autonomous Free Will Baptist Church following the procedures adopted by the Georgia State Association.

E. After proper procedures are satisfied and the church is duly organized into autonomous Free Will Baptist church it shall have all normal rights, privileges, and responsibilities of any other Free Will Baptist Church.

F. The Board of Missions may also engage in church revitalization, and employ a pastor or missionary as needed for this ministry. The guidelines, qualifications, and criteria for this relationship (church, Board of Missions, and missionary/pastor) are detailed in the Mission Board Handbook of the Georgia Association of Free Will Baptists.

SECTION 3. There shall be a **Board of Camping** whose duties shall be to schedule and arrange all camp sessions, and to appoint the Camp Director each year.

SECTION 4. There shall be a **Board of Christian Education** whose duties shall be:

A. To provide educational services for the members of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists.

B. To set policy and supervise the functions of the State Youth Committee. This Board shall appoint this Committee to carry out Board policy.

C. To organize sponsor and promote educational and inspirational retreats for our members.

D. To organize, sponsor and promote Sunday School and Church Training seminars.

E. To set policy and supervise the Historical Committee. This Board shall appoint the Historical Committee to gather and set forth for public knowledge and posterity the history of Georgia Free Will Baptists.

SECTION 5. There shall be a **Board of Trustees** whose duties shall be; maintenance, upkeep and insuring of all State Association properties; the planning and supervision of all future developments and expansion of these properties as directed by the State Association except otherwise provided in this Constitution.

SECTION 6. There shall be a **Credentials Committee**, which shall consist of three (3) members of three-year terms. And the term of one expiring each year thereafter according to seniority of service, who shall be in charge of the registration and examination of delegates and the receiving of all dues.

SECTION 7. There shall be a **Georgia State Master's Men**. They shall select their own officers and conduct their own business.

SECTION 8. There shall be a **Georgia Woman's Active for Christ Convention (GWAC)**. They shall elect their officers, conduct their business and maintain their treasury.

ARTICLE IV

SECTION 1. All officers except board members and the Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be elected to serve a term of two (2) years. The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be employed by the Executive Board of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, subject to the ratification of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists at its next regular session, for an indefinite period, with an agreement of sixty (60) day notice of termination by either the Executive Secretary/Treasurer or the Executive Board.

SECTION 2. Standing Boards of the State Association have no power of final authority to hire, full-time employees until the matter has been presented to and acted on by the State Association in session except where otherwise provided.

SECTION 3. The Executive Board may fill vacancies on any of the boards or committees, which occur between regular sessions of this State Association, until the convening of the annual session of said association.

SECTION 4. Election of all General Officers shall take place on the odd years of the calendar.

SECTION 5. If a member of any board fails in the function of his or her duty without good and sufficient reasons, the board of which the delinquent is a member may declare that particular office vacant. Further, this body shall have and does reserve the right to deal with the officer or board member who does not conduct his or her office in a Christian, business like manner according to the rules of Christian conduct as set forth in the New Testament.

Any standing board of this State Association may appoint proxies to serve in lieu of the absent members.

At the pleasure of the boards, and subsequent to the meeting from which the regular member is absent, the boards have the right to deal with the delinquent member in the manner stated in this section.

SECTION 6. The Chairman or Vice-Chairman of said board, or by the Moderator or Assistant Moderator of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, upon the request of the majority of the members of said boards, may call boards into session.

SECTION 7. An auditing Committee shall consist of three (3) members elected for three (3) three year terms.

AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be changed, altered, or amended by two-thirds (2/3) vote of all delegates present and voting at any regular session of the State Association. Prior to a final vote on any amendment, change or alteration, said amendment, change or alteration shall be submitted in writing to the Clerk of this association and shall lie on the table from one (1) business meeting to the next during the same session, during which time it shall be read at least two (2) times in open session. Officers, standing boards, and/or standing committees may be added or deleted as the need arises.

BY-LAWS

SECTION 1

A. All real property, checking and savings account or any other assets of this Association shall be in the name of the *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*

B. One or more of the corporate officers of the Association shall be the legal signers of all Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. business. These officers are: the Moderator as the corporate President; the Clerk as the corporate Vice-President; and the Executive Secretary/Treasurer as the Secretary/Treasurer.

C. The State Office shall be responsible for the safekeeping of the corporate seal and all official documents of the State Association.

D. No State Board may borrow money or financially obligated the State Association without the approval of the Executive Board.

E. The fixed assets (building, land) of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists shall not be liquidated except by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the delegates present and voting at any regular session of the Association.

The Executive Board shall have the authority to approve the sale of properties donated to any Board of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc., upon recommendation of the Board to which the donation was made, with proceeds remaining under the authority of the recommending Board."

F. The records of all financial transaction shall be open to all members of the Georgia State Association. The financial transactions of the State Office and State Boards shall be audited annually.

G. Annual financial reports of the State Office and State Boards and the auditor's report shall be made to the State Association in session and be entered in the Annual State Minutes.

H. The State Treasurer shall be bonded in amount stipulated by the State Executive Board.

I. This Association shall meet for its regular session annually on the third Thursday in March.

SECTION 2

A. When the State Association is not in session, the State Executive Board shall be duly authorized to do business in the name of the State Association.

B. The State Association has full authority to direct the State Executive Board in all business conducted on its behalf.

C. The State Executive Board shall report to the State Association in session concerning the business conducted for the State Association since its last convening.

D. The State Executive Board has the prerogative of deferring any matter to the State Association as a whole but is not under obligation to do so.

E. The State Executive Board shall meet in the following months: March, September, and December. The March meeting shall be held just prior to the regular meeting of the State Association.

F. Any and all correspondence from any member of this State Association, (includes either individual, group, Board or District Association) directed to any Board, or Chairman of said Board, or any officer of this State Association, or any open letters to any or all District Associations of this State, that pertains to any business which is desired or required to be brought before this body at any scheduled or special called meeting, shall be properly sent directly to the Clerk of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists. The clerk will be responsible for routing the correspondence to its proper designation. All correspondence as mentioned above shall be required to be received by the Clerk of the State Association at least 30 days prior to any scheduled State Association Meeting if said correspondence contains business that is to be introduced and discussed at said meeting.

SECTION 3

A. The moderator shall preside at the Annual Session of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists and the meetings of the Executive Board. The Moderator shall be the President of the Corporation known as the *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*

B. The Assistant Moderator shall preside in the absence of the Moderator and/or when appointed by the Moderator as the need arises.

C. The Clerk shall keep records of the proceedings of the Annual Associational meeting and of the Executive Board meetings. It shall also be his responsibility to have the minutes of these sessions printed and distributed. The Clerk shall be the Vice-President of the Corporation known as *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*

D. The Assistant Clerk in the absence of the Clerk shall fulfill the functions and duties of the Clerk as stated in paragraph C of this document.

SECTION 4

A. The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be responsible and accountable to the Executive Board in the fulfillment of the duties of his office as determined by the Executive Board.

B. The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be allowed four (4) weeks vacation per year with pay.

C. Funds received by the Executive Secretary/Treasurer for revivals, special speaking engagements and promotional meetings shall go into the Cooperative Fund. The exception to this regulation relates to remuneration received by the Executive Secretary during his four (4) weeks vacation, which shall be his personally and need not be accounted for to this State Association.

D. Salary, mileage and operational expenses of the Executive Secretary/ Treasurer shall be determined by the Executive Board.

E. The Executive Secretary/Treasurer shall be the Secretary/Treasurer of the Corporation known as the *Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.*

F. **General Promotion.** He is to represent, or cause to be represented, the association at all affairs of interest to the association and he is to promote the work of the association in such a manner so as to unify the association as well as promote both the state and national works, missionaries, mission conferences, etc. Through personal communication he shall keep close contact with pastors, churches, and district association.

G. Administration. He shall administer the affairs of the executive office and carry out the responsibilities delegated to him by the State Association and the Executive Board. He is to serve with all standing boards and committees of the association in an ex-official capacity. He is to report to the association during each annual session.

H. Stewardship. He shall serve as treasurer of this association. An accurate and complete record of all funds received and disbursed shall be kept and a written report shall be included in his report to this association in its annual session. He shall receive, hold and disburse money as is made available by the State Association to the various boards. Disbursements to the various boards will be made available when requested.

I. Publication. It shall be his duty to edit and publish the state paper. He shall direct the production of general promotional materials, pamphlets, audiovisuals, and books as approved by the Executive Board.

J. Arranging State Association. He shall expedite the planning of the State Association program, enroll all ministers and delegates, print and distribute minutes, and investigate future sites for the annual session.

SECTION 5

A. The Executive Board shall serve as the Placement Committee for the State Association. In this capacity the board shall investigate places suitable for this meeting and make recommendations to said State Association. Meeting places shall be determined two (2) years in advance.

B. The Executive Board shall plan the program for the annual meetings of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists and the annual meetings shall follow the programs as closely as possible. Business sessions shall be conducted according to the commonly accepted rules of Parliamentary Procedure.

C. The Executive Board shall formulate the budget for the State Association annually and recommend to the body in the session the allocations to be observed in the Cooperative Plan for Giving. This board shall, in addition to the above stated duties, also recommend a mileage rate for travel by the members of all standing boards in said association.

SECTION 6

The Moderator shall appoint necessary committees unless otherwise provided for by the body.

SECTION 7

These By-Laws may be altered, changed, or amended at any regular session of this association by two-thirds (2/3) vote of delegates present and voting

Local pastors seeing their need for solid Biblical training have contacted the St Nazaire church to see about the possibility of hosting a training seminar. This seminar will seek to encourage and equip local Togolese pastors to be ready to face today's challenges.

In addition, we hope to become more involved with Operation Togo to help build school buildings and churches in the area.

2) Rusty and Brenda Carney: IMpact Japan Bible Project

Imagine wanting to know more about Jesus and read the Bible, but you can't because it is either not provided in your language or is very unaffordable.

The Word of God, Christian Hymns, and literature have all been used throughout centuries to help deepen, strengthen, and enrich our relationship with God. GEORGIA WOMEN ACTIVE FOR CHRIST
Of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.
Constitution and By-Laws

Article I

Name

This organization shall be known as Georgia Women Active for Christ a division of the Georgia Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc., commonly known by its initials, GWAC. Its members shall elect officers, conduct business and maintain a treasury.

Article II

Purpose

The purpose of this organization shall be to assist the various women composing the GWAC in providing opportunities to understand and fulfill the Great Commission through their responsibilities in the family, church, community, and around the world.

It shall bring the women of each district together for fellowship, sharing information, encouraging one another in the work of the Lord and furthering the purpose and goals of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists.

Article III

Officers

1. The officers of this convention shall be president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, field worker, historian, two media coordinators, and a member at large, all of which are elected by the convention. These officers shall serve as the State Executive Board. A minimum of five officers shall be a quorum for transacting business.

2. Any officer or elected board member of this convention must be an active member of a local Free Will Baptist Church and an active member of the GWAC group of a local church.

3. Executive Board members are required to attend all scheduled board meetings and GWAC sponsored events. Any officer missing two meetings/events, without providing the president with reason of the absence, is subject to review and removal by the Executive Board.

Article IV

Membership

1. This convention shall be composed of: the officers of the convention, district presidents, district field workers, ten delegates (duly accredited by the credentials committee) from each district convention, four delegates and the president from each local GWAC in good standing with its district convention.

2. Local groups in an area where there is no district convention may be represented with five delegates by payment of their membership dues. All delegates, as well as officers of the convention, shall be in good standing with a church that is in good standing with the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, and shall perform the duties as set forth for them in the present WNAC manual and this Constitution and By-Laws.

Article V

Meetings

1. The annual meeting shall be held each year the day before the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists convention in the same place or at such a time and place determined at the previous annual meeting or by the Executive Board.

2. A prayer retreat shall be held annually, time and place to be planned by the Executive Board.

Article VI

Amendments

This Constitution may be amended at any annual meeting of the convention by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

By-Laws

Article I

Duties of Officers

President – The president shall preside over all meetings, appoint such committees as may be needed; call the Executive Board together when necessary; be ex-officio member of all committees, except the nominating committee; see that reports are sent promptly to the WNAC secretary; and perform all duties pertaining to such an office.

Vice President – The vice president shall preside in the absence of the president or by her request and otherwise assist her in the oversight of the work in general. She shall serve as chairman of the credentials committee.

Secretary – The secretary shall keep an accurate record of all proceedings of the convention and Executive Board meetings; preserve all valuable papers and turn same over to her successor; make an annual report to the WNAC secretary on a form available from the WNAC office within 15 days after the State GWAC Convention; compile the districts' slate of officers and addresses immediately after the convention; send a slate of state officers to the WNAC secretary and to each state officer. She is responsible for getting the minutes prepared and to the state associational office in time to be included in the state minutes each year.

Treasurer – The treasurer shall have charge of all funds belonging to this convention and shall pay out same only when authorized by the convention. The treasurer shall keep an accurate account, and give a written report of all funds received and disbursed at each annual meeting of the convention. She is required to deposit all checks in her possession and disburse all designated funds by the 30th of each month. She shall be bonded through the state office and audited annually.

Field Worker – The field worker shall promote GWAC programs through personal contact and the distribution of literature and serve where needed as directed by the Executive Board.

Historian – The historian shall keep a historical record and have a display at all state meetings and serve where needed as directed by the Executive Board.

Member at Large – The members at large shall help promote the work in general, meet with the Executive Board, and serve where needed as directed by the Executive Board.

Media Coordinators – Two Media Coordinators who will be responsible for compiling, editing and publishing the *Georgia Women in Touch* Newsletter, and serve where needed as directed by the Executive Board. Articles should be sent to the state executive office by the 1st of each month. They may either write the articles or ask someone to write the articles for them.

Article II

Elections

A nominating committee shall nominate the general officers and members at large. Following the nominating committee's report, opportunity shall be given for nominations from the floor. In case of more than one nominee for any particular office, a vote will be taken for each; otherwise they may be elected by acclamation. The officers shall be elected every two years on odd number years. Not more than one-half of the elected

officers shall be changed in any regular election. All elections shall be held at the closing sessions of the annual convention.

Article III

Expenses

Estimated expenses for the state work shall be set by an annual budget approved by the convention. The Executive Board must approve all reimbursement.

Article IV

Boards and Committees

Executive Board – This Board shall be composed of six officers, two media coordinators, and one member at large elected by the convention. Five of these shall compose a quorum. They shall hold meetings for the transaction of business as often as necessary. It shall be the duty of the Executive Board to maintain an oversight of the work at large. The Board shall act for the convention when necessary. It shall prepare the program for the regular meetings and fill any vacancy between elections.

Resolutions Committee – A resolutions committee shall be appointed by the president. A member of the Executive Board shall chair this committee. This committee shall review all resolutions presented, having the prerogative of passing on to the convention those resolutions that are deemed proper and profitable. Resolutions should be properly worded, i.e. "Be it Resolved....."

Nominating Committee – The nominating committee shall be composed of one member from each district convention and shall be elected one year prior to making their report. The names of the members from each district shall be submitted with the convention annual report. The president shall appoint a chairperson from the members of the nominating committee.

Credentials Committee – The vice president shall be the chairman of the credentials committee and the president shall appoint two other members. This committee shall examine the reports of the represented women's groups to see if fees are paid and if reports are in order.

Finance Committee – The treasurer shall be chairman of the finance committee and the president may appoint four other members. This committee reviews the financial records for the year, reports on same to the convention, and makes recommendations of disbursements of funds to the convention.

Registration Committee – The president shall appoint members as needed to serve on this committee. This committee registers those in attendance and gives a report to the convention.

Article V

Dues and Reports

Active members shall pay dues yearly as required by the GWAC Convention for membership. State treasurer must receive all dues for all members no later than November 15th. The state treasurer then has to compile a report that reflects the membership of the paid GWAC members for the current reporting year.

Current dues per member: GWAC Dues – \$3.00, WNAC Dues – \$15.00,

Total Dues – \$18.00

District secretaries and treasurers **annual** reports shall be filed with the state secretary and treasurer no later than January 15th following the close of the previous year.

District Treasurer to State Treasurer – December 1st

District Secretary to State Secretary – January 15th

Article VI

Gifts

Season of Prayer Offerings-

1. Pre-Easter Week of Prayer offering is used for Foreign Missions in memory of Laura Bell Barnard, our first foreign missionary.

2. Pre-Thanksgiving Week of Prayer offering is used for National Home Missions in memory of Mrs. Lizzie McAdams, a great writer of our literature and one of the first National officers.

3. The December Week of Prayer offering is used for State Missions in memory of Mrs. Alice E. Lupton, our first National president.

Co-Laborer Offering – A financial plan of support for WNAC. Each local GWAC is encouraged to support the WNAC office with a monthly offering.

Provision Closet - This project helps missionaries as they return home to pick up household items, etc., from the closet at the National Office. Each local GWAC is encouraged to keep abreast of the items and supplies needed as they are periodically listed in the **Co-Laborer** magazine, and give to this project as needed.

WNAC Emphasis – A special offering to supplement the Co-Laborer Offerings for WNAC expenses of operation, literature, etc. This offering is received during August.

Remembrance Fund – This is a fund established by WNAC and a distinct way to honor any occasion the donor wishes to note: Anniversaries, birthdays, or as a memorial gift at the time of death. A remembrance card notifying the family of the person being honored, and the donor, will be entered in the permanent Book of Remembrances in the WNAC office. These gifts will be used to advance the kingdom of God through WNAC. A Remembrance Service is to be conducted at our state GWAC convention each year.

Dr. Mary Ruth Wisehart Foreign Student Scholarship Fund – Any GWAC group who wishes may contribute to this special fund set up by WNAC to train Nationals from our foreign fields. February is designated as Foreign Student month.

Dot Harvey Loan Fund – This revolving loan fund was established in honor of Miss Dot Harvey, a forerunner of youth work in Georgia, by the Georgia Women's Auxiliary Convention in 1954 to aid worthy Georgia students attending Free Will Baptist Bible College. Each local group is asked to donate monthly toward this project. A special offering is received in September to add to this fund.

Westfield Church Fund – This fund is used to assist the church in Kotogiri, South India in memory of Miss Laura Bell Barnard. All groups are encouraged to give to this Georgia project monthly.

Other Gifts – The state GWAC may decide on and promote other projects for funds at its own discretion.

Lora Shutes Mission Project – This is a statewide project with the goal set each year at the annual convention. Funds are disbursed to missionaries through the State Acts 1:8 Program.

GWAC Emphasis – June is designated as GWAC Emphasis Month. Each group is asked to receive a special offering to supplement GWAC operational expenses.
