Moderator ruled that according to our decorum and treatise adopted in recent years, the Association was without authority to have ordaining Council, but one should be appointed by the quarterly conference when next in session.

On motion we take up miscellaneous work.

On motion Rev. Neal H. Parrish, John Ross, Ernest J. Barker, W. W. Hobbs and Robert Rogers were elected as members of Mission Board of this body, to meet annually with our Ministerial Association. (See Board.)

On motion we have 500 minutes printed.

On motion we pay Clerk and Moderator same as last year, \$10.00 and \$5.00 respectively.

On motion Rev. J. W. Hightower is to preach Introductory sermon.

An offering was taken for Rev. J. F. Smith, amounting to \$11.50. An offering was taken, securing funds to help pay for building in Macon, Ga., in the amount of \$52.25.

#### RESOLUTION REPORT

To all the beloved Laymen of the churches composing the Georgia Union Association. We beg to offer the following as our report. You will note that your committee is composed of ministers, for the first time in the history of our Association. We are proud to report that persuant to a vote of this body two years ago, your preachers have organized ourselves into a ministers Association and have held four sessions. These have proven of great work to us as ministers. We are far more united today, we are better able to understand each other, and to know our work as God's ministers. We are better able to understand to what extent our lives and work affects your life and work in bringing about the progress and growth of our Association that we all so much desire.

Our non growth as an Association is most discouraging to ministers and Laymen alike, but we, the preachers, assume the blame for this awful condition that has dominated so long. We confess, as preachers, we have failed to preach to you the need, and blessedness of cur giving of our substance in the better promoting of our Master's churches.

We as ministers in our deliberations have plans whereby we can swing out of a condition of stagnation into one of progress. As we see it our cause is starving to death for want of financial support, and in order to set a better example before our laymen, along the line of financial support for our cause in general, we, as members of your Association deem it most proper and fitting that we set an example by assessing ourselves to begin with that others might see our good works and be constrained to follow. And we having done this feel that our lay members will gladly join us in this effort. In view of the foregoing; Be it resolved by this body:

1st. That we establish a mission Board composed of five members of this body, who have shown convincing proof of their interest in the expansion of our cause and that this board meet annually with our ministerial Association.

2nd. That upon our return to our homes and respective churches, we will, as ministers and laymen, agitate among all our members the cause of missions and the importance of giving our means for the support of the same.

3rd. That our preachers who have Sundays to spare establish mission fronts, and preach regularly with the hope or prospect of organizing churches. However, it shall be the duty of a committee from the mission Board to investigate any proposed mission point and decide whether or not if such a point is a good prospect for a new church. It shall be the duty of the mission Board to pay the expenses of any preacher who shall keep up any mission point.

- 4th. That the following shall be the purposes for which the money in our treasury shall be used.
  - A. In paying expenses of ministers who have mission points.
  - B. In helping weak churches in paying expenses of pastors.
- C. In helping new churches to build houses of worship and in repairing churches, where the local body is unable to make such repairs.
- D. In the support of our State work and also our National and educational work.
- E. In supporting the dependent aged and infirm among us, both laymen and ministers.
- 5th. It shall be the duty of pastors to read these resolutions to their respective churches frequently emphasizing the importance of each of us complying with what is set out in them.

#### ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. THE BIBLE. The Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rules of faith and practice.
- 2. GOD. There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator of the universe; and in the Scriptures as Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore, obey.
- 3. CHRIST. Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified, He is now risen and glorified, and is our ever present Savior and Lord.
- 4. THE HOLY SPIRIT. The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God. He is the Reprover, Comforter, Guide and Sanctifier of men.
- 5. THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD. God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts of grace, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of man requires.
- 6. THE SINFULNESS OF MAN. Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity, therefore, inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability sin, and become guilty before God.
- 7. THE WORK OF CHRIST. The Son of God by His incarnation, life, sufferings, death and resurrection, effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free and is the ground of salvation by faith.
- 8. THE TERMS OF SALVATION. The conditions of salvation are. 1. Repentance of sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it. 2. Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Savior and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin and becomes a child of God. 3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death.
- 9. ELECTION. God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ men become his elect.
- 10. FREEDOM OF THE WILL. The human will is free and self-controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit, or to resist them and perish.

- 11. SALVATION FREE. God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.
- 12. PERSEVERENCE. All believers in Christ, who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, have promise of eternal salvation.
- 13. GOSPEL ORDINANCES, BAPTISM, or the immersion of believers in water, and the LORD'S SUPPER, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel; FEET WASHING, an ordinance teaching humility, of universal obligation, and to be administered to all true believers.
- 14. TITHING. God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ indorsed it in the Gospel (Matt. 23:23) and the apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store as God hath prospered him." (1 Cor. 16:2.)
- 15. THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH. The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart for secular employments and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works and activities, and for personal communion with God.
- 16. RESURRECTION, JUDGMENT AND FINAL RETRIBUTION. The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked will "go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

#### CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith, and good works, endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."

We will not forget the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences; public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.


We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of Missions, the success of Sunday schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

#### **BY-LAWS**

- Article 1. Annual conference shall be annually held.
- Art. 2. Every elder, minister and preacher, in good standing, and delegates shall duly attend.
- Art. 3. If any member in the judgment of the conference, shall show anger in his discussion on any subject, he shall forfeit his seaf in that conference.
- Art. 4. No member of the annual conference shall be at liberty to withdraw without leave of the moderator.
  - Art. 5. The conference shall always adjourn by vote.
- Art. 6. There shall annually be a committee of finance chosen to settle with the treasurer and report to conference.
- Art. 7. The officers and standing committees shall be entitled to seats in the annual conference.
- Art. 8. No Elder, minister, preacher or delegate shall, during the sitting of the annual conference, be at liberty to fill any place, as to preaching or hearing at the stage, only as liberty shall be granted by the conference.
- Art. 9. Conference shall always open and adjourn by prayer and praise of God.
- Art. 10. The minutes of the conference shall be signed by the moderator and the clerk.
- Art. 11. Hereafter this body will not pay the expenses of corresponding delegates from other Associations.
- Art. 12. Members of Ordaining Council shall hold office for a period of 3 years.
