The Fifty-Fifth Annual Session of the Georgia Union Association of Free Will Baptists, convened with Double Branch Church, Dooly County, Georgia, Thursday, October 6, 1949.

Talk by Betty Lou Barker on encampment.

Rev. E. C. Morris and Rev. C. J. Harvey both spoke of the progress made at Camp Mt. Bethel, and of the necessity that we send our young people to encampment, better training and equipping them for the Master's work. The Churches were urged to send representatives to next summer's league convention and to also support it with financial means.

On motion we send fee to State and National Association.

On motion Clerk and Moderator be paid same as before.

On motion we suspend miscellaneous business and take up regular business.

Various reports were called for by Moderator and those read were as follows: Finance report, Temperance report, State of Churches and character of Ministers, Educational report. The above reports adopted and committee released. (See reports.)

An offering in the amount of \$17.00 was taken for Bro. W. W. Potter.

Letter from Antioch Church was read requesting that credentials for Rev. G. C. Sullivan be prepared, as reason given for not doing so.

Next session of Sunday School Convention convenes at Mt. Bethel, Youth Training Camp, on highway 41, 5 miles North from Ashburn, first Sunday in September, 1950.

On motion a rising vote of thanks to Double Branch Church and community was extended for the generous hospitality and kindness shown during this session.

On motion Clerk prepare manuscript for press without being read before body.

Rev. Neal H. Parrish made report for Mission Board, stating that board had not supported any movement, but was now making plans that our Mission work can and will be supported.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. THE BIBLE. The Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rules of faith and practice.
- 2. GOD. There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator of the universe; and in the Scriptures as Father, Son and Holy Ghost, yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore, obey.
- 3. CHRIST. Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified, He is now risen and glorified, and is our ever present Savior and Lord.
- 4. THE HOLY SPIRIT. The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God. He is the Reprover, Comforter, Guide and Sanctifier of men.
- 5. THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD. God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all being and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts of grace, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of man requires.
- 6. THE SINFULNESS OF MAN. Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity, therefore, inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability sin, and become guilty before God.
- 7. THE WORK OF CHRIST. The Son of God by His incarnation, life, sufferings, death and resurrection, effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free and is the ground of salvation by faith.
- 8. THE TERMS OF SALVATION. The conditions of salvation are: 1. Repentance of sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renuication of it. 2. Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Savior and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin and becomes a child of God. 3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death.
- 9. ELECTION. God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ men become his elect.
- 10. FREEDOM OF THE WILL. The human will is free and self-controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the spirit, or to resist them and perish.
- 11. SALVATION FREE. God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.

- 12. PRESERVERENCE. All believers in Christ, who through grace presevere in holiness to the end of life, have promise of eternal salvation.
- 13. GOSPEL ORDINANCES, BAPTISM, or the immersion of believers in water, and the LORD'S SUPPER, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel; FEET WASHING, an ordinance teaching humility, of universal obligation, and to be administered to all true believers.
- 14. TITHING. God commanded tithes and offering in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ indorsed it in the Gospel (Matt. 23:23) and the apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store as God hath prospered him." (I Cor. 16:2.)
- 15. THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH. The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart for secular employments and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works and activities, and for personal communion with God.
- 16. RESURRECTION, JUDGMENT AND FINAL RETRIBUTION. The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked will "go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this sclemn covenant.

We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith, and good works, endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."

We will not forget the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences; public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness; and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Chris-

tian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises; the support of Missions, the success of Sunday schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

BY-LAWS

- Article 1. Annual conference shall be annually held.
- Art. 2. Every Elder, Minister and Preacher, in good standing, and delegates shall duly attend.
- Art. 3. If any member in the judgment of the conference, shall show anger in his discussion on any subject, he shall forfeit his seat in that conference.
- Art. 4. No member of the annual conference shall be at liberty to withdraw without leave of the Moderator.
 - Art. 5. The conference shall always adjourn by vote.
- Art. 6. There shall annually be a committee of Finance chosen to settle with the Treasurer and report to conference.
- Art. 7. The officers and standing committees shall be entitled to seats in the annual conference.
- Art. 8. No Elder, Minister, preacher or delegate shall, during the sitting of the annual conference, be at liberty to fill any place, as to preaching or hearing at the stage, only as liberty shall be granted by the conference.
- Art. 9. Conference shall always open and adjourn by prayer and praise of God.
- Art. 10. The minutes of the conference shall be signed by the Moderator and the Clerk.
