The sixty-fifth (65th) annual session of the Georgia Union Association of the Original Free Will Baptists convened with Double Branches Church near Unadilla, Georgia, Thursday October 6,1960.

THURSDAY MORNING

Opened by singing "Sweet Hour of Prayer." Prayer offered by Bro. Ernest J. Barker. Welcome to body extended by Pastor, Rev. H. D. Faircloth. Moderator, Rev. W. L. Amerson, welcomes the body and reads Phillipians 2:1-4 as a lesson text. Moderator read and commented on the Church Covenant. Prayer offered by Bro. E. C. Morris.

Call to order by Moderator.

Call for corresponding letters from the various churches.

Motion carried for Moderator to appoint letter readers. He appoints Bro. Ernest J. Barker and Bro. Billie Ray Amerson.

Read the letters and completed the roll.

Churches responding with letters and delegates: Liberty Chapel, Antioch, Buelah Springs, Double Branches, Pleasant Hill, Little Bethel, Bethlehem, Mt. Ararat, Pine Level, Christian Hill, New Ebenezer, Bay Springs, and the Quarterly Conference.

Motion carried to adopt letters as read and seat all delegates present and

others as they come.

Motion carried to suspend regular order of business and enter into the worship hour.

Opened the worship hour by singing "Amazing Grace." Prayer offered

by Bro. J. R. Davidson.

Bro. E. B. Duckworth, Pastor of Liberty Chapel in Macon was the speaker for the hour. He read his scripture from the book of Nehemiah. He used as a text Nehemiah 2-18 "Let us strengthen our hands for the good work." Bro. Duckworth reminds us of our slackness in our striving in God's work and our wholehearted striving for worldly gain. He asks us have we kept pace in our church with the gains made by worldness. He cites us to the real fact of our leaving the old landmark (the Bible) and we, as a people and Free Will Baptists have been the eternal loser. He asks have we looked beyond our present trouble, (Khruchev, Nixon, Kennedy Eisenhower, it al) to the real reason for the aforementioned trouble? Let our churches awaken to the fact that our walls are down and the things of the devil and the world are creeping into our churches and our lives.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON

Opened by singing "Anywhere is Home." Prayer offered by Rev. Everett Kelly. Moderator uses as a scripture lesson, Galatains 5-1

Call for petitionary letters.

One received from Wilson's Chapel, Cobbtown Road, Thomaston, Ga.

Introduce visiting brethren and invite them to seats with us.

Responding were the following, Rev. A. C. Truluck from the Union Association, Rev. E. C. Morris from State Association, Rev. J. R. Davidson from Chattachoochie Association, Bro. H. W. Grimsley and family from the Chattachoochie Association.

Call for corresponding messengers from other bodies. Responding were Bro. Morris from the State and Bro. Davison from the Chattahoochie.

Motion carried to appoint various committees.

Motion carried for chair to appoint someone to work in the field in the promotion of Women's Auxiliary in the Georgia Union Association. The Moderator appoints Sis, Evelyn Collins of Liberty Chapel Church.

Motion carried to keep the yearly meeting of our association on Thursday

and Friday before the second (2nd) Sunday in October.

Next session to convene with Pine Level Church near Chester, Ga. Motion carried for chair to appoint D. C. Moderator appoints Bro. Fletcher Swearingen. Bro. Elmer Leonard and Bro. N. C. Perry.

Motion carried to excuse D. C. in order for them to prepare their report. Motion carried to suspend regular order of business and give time to Rev. E. C. Morris to speak in behalf of the State promotional work and Rev. J. R. Davidson to speak in behalf of the Bible College and the church in Atlanta.

Bro. Davidson gives us the location of the church. Entering Atlanta on U. S. Highway 23 from the south, turn right on Memorial Drive, turn left on Clay St. The name of the church is on a sign. Bro. Davidson urges each one to cooperate in pushing the Lord's work in Atlanta.

Bro. Davidson passed out some tracts about the work at the Bible College in Nashville, Tenn. A few years ago some 95 percent of the Free Will Baptists were against the opening of an institute of higher learning. An offering was

taken for the college.

Bro. E. C. Morris tells us that the National League convention will be held in Georgia in 1961 in June. The expense is to be paid for by the State of Georgia. Acting as host church Bro. Donald Self of Pine Level Church is on

t helinance committee for the Georgia Union Association.

Bro. Morris gives us a citation on our cooperation with the Unified program. He tells us that twelve out of thirteen churches have participated this year. Bro. Morris tells us that the Georgia Union is the highest per capita giver in the state. It amounts \$1.66 compared to last years \$1.28. He awards certificates of appreciation to the following churches: Bay Springs, Wilson's Chapel, Buelah Springs, Little Bethel, Liberty Chapel. The following churches were on the Honor Roll for quota giving: Pine Level ,Pleasant Hill, New Ebenezer, Antioch, Double Branches, Christian Hill.

Bro. Donald Self gave a special card concerning the funds for the League

Convention.

Motion carried to declare the motion to accept the petitionary as out of order.

Motion carried for the church which petitioned the association to meet with the Ordaining Council.

Rev. Hoyt Findley read a revision of rules for licensing of ministers.

Motion carried to table the proposed changes until the next day and then to deal with them, item by item.

Bro. E. J. Barker speaks for the mission board in the proposal to add eight (8) new members. This would give each church a representative on this board.

Motion carried to table the proposals until the next day.

Opened by singing "Love Lifted Me". Prayer offered by Bro. T. B. Etheridge.

Bro. E. C. Morris used as a lesson text Acts 3-2. He spoke of that beautiful gate and how that many things are beautiful if we are christians.

FRIDAY MORNING

Opened by singing "Jesus Hold My Hand." Prayer offered by Rev. Roscoe Pitts. Moderator used as a scripture lesson James 1, 22-25.

Call for committee reports.

Motion carried to adopt Education report (see reports.)

Motion carried to suspend regular order of business and enter into miscellaneous business.

Motion carried to print 400 minutes.

Motion carried to pay Clerk \$25.00 and Moderator \$15.00.

Call for volunteers to the State Association as delegates. Volunteering were Bro. Billie Ray Amerson, Bro. Sherman Jones and Bro. John F. Ross as alternate.

Motion carried to send \$20.00 to state for fee.

Motion carried to retain Bro. T. B. Etheridge and Bro. E. L. Long to act in behalf of the Youth Camp.

Motion carried to represent to our sister association by delegate or minute. Motion carried to retain all standing board members except the misison board.

Motion carried to adopt proposals of mission board concerning new

members.

Motion carried to use laymen only on this board.

Motion carried for each church to recommend one of their members to a nominating committee.

Motion carried for chair to appoint the nominating committee.

Motion carried to excuse the committee on state of churches and character

of ministers.

Motion carried to select a committee to look into the proposals for revision of rules for licensing of ministers.

The commttee is as follows: Rev. E. B. Duckworth, Rev. Joe Frank Smith and Bro. Horace Hobbs.

Motion carried to excuse Ordaining Council. Bro. H. D. Faircloth to act as Moderator.

Motion carried to accept the following reports: Temperance, Sunday School and suggestions. (see reports.)

Motion carried to suspend business and enter into worship hour.

Rev. J. R. Davidson was in charge of the worship service. He recalled many fond memories connected with Double Branches Church. He used Matthew 5 1-16 as a scripture lesson. He looked to the gospel in the light of symbols. Salt is one of the symbols, used as a peneration. It is a purifier and then it is a preserver. Salt is then a thirst provoker. Bro. Davidson pointed out that salt, after it attributes of good, is also a petuifier, thereby listing its usefulness. Let us ponder in our hearts, these things and see how salty we are. Bro. Davidson stresses the real fact that we are the reflections of the real light, which is the Christ, our Lord.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. THE BIBLE—The scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were by inspiration of God, and are our infallable rules of Faith and Practice,

2. GOD—There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator of the universe; and in the Scrptures as Father, Son and Holy Ghost, yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore, obey.

3. CHRIST—Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in His divine nature truly God, in his nature truly man. The meditor between God and man, one crucified. He is now risen and glorified, and is our present Savious and Lord.

 THE HOLY SPIRIT—The scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God. He is the Reprover, Comforter, Guide and Sanctifier of men.

5. THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD—God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special arts of grace, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of man requires.

 THE SINFULNESS OF MAN—Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity therefore, inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin, and become guilty before God.

7. THE WORK OF CHRIST—The Son of God by His incarnation, life, sufferings, death and resurrection, effected for all a redeption from sin that is full and free is the ground of salvation by faith.

8. THE TERMS OF SALVATION—The conditions of salvation are :1. Repentance of sincere sorrow for sin and hearty reunuciation of it. 2. Faith of the unswerved commital of one's self to Christ as Saviour and Lord with purpose to love and obey His in all things. In the exercise of saving faith with the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit freed from domination of sin and become a child of God. 3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death.

9 ELECTION—God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the condition of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ, men became His elect.

10. FREEDOM OF WILL—The human will is free and self-controlled having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the spirit, or to resist them and perish.

11. SALVATION FREE—God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.

12. PERSERVERANCE—All believers in Christ, who through grace preserves in holiness to the end of life, have promised of eternal salvation.

13. GOSPEL ORDINANCES—Baptism, or the immersion of believers in water, and the Lords Supper are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel; Feet Washing, and ordinance teaching humility, of universal obligation, and to be admnistered to all true believers.

14. TITHINGS—God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ endorses it in Gospel (Matt. 23:23) and the Apostle Paul said, "upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store as God hath prospered him" (1 Cor. 16:2.)

15. THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH—The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements, for erst, worship, Holy works and activities, and for persona lcommunion with God.

16. RESURRECTION, JUDGEMENT AND FINAL RETRIBUTION — The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men on the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damhation; then the wicked will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life.

CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God by faith in Christ and adopted the word of God as our rule faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things and to abstain from appearances of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scripture, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith and good works, endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour, Jesu sChrist."

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences; public worship and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness; and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and to seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and so far as we are able promote the success of the church and of the gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principles sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come and His will be done on earth as it is heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises; the support of missions, the success of Sunday Schools; and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of Peace santify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

BY-LAWS

REVISED VERSION

Article 1. Annual conferences shall be annually held.

Article 2. Every Elder, Minister, Deacon and Board member in good standing and delegates shall duly attend.

Article

3. If any member in the judgement of the conference shall show anger in his discussion on any subject shall forfeit his seat in the conference.

Article 4. No member of the annual conference shall be at liberty to withdraw without leave of the moderator.

Article 5. The conference shall always adjourn by vote.

Article 6. There shall annually be a committee of finance chosen to settle with the treasurer and report to the conference.

Article 7. The officers and standing committee shall be entitled to seats in annual conference.

Article 8. No Elder, Minister, Deacon, Board Member or delegate shall, during the sitting of the annual conference, be at liberty to fill any place, as to preaching or hearing at the stage, only as liberty shall be granted by the conference.

 Article 9. Conference shall always open and adjourn by Prayer and Praise of God.

Article 10. The minutes of the conference shall be signed by the moderator and clerk.

Article 11. The moderator shall read or have read the by-laws and the church covenant at the opening of business session annually.

Article 12. All church clerks shall furnish moderator a list of delegates 15 days prior to convening of each annual session.

CONSTITUTION

REVISED VERSION

Article 1. This yearly meeting or association shall be called the Georgia Union Association and shall be composed of such regularly organized and disciplined Free Will Baptist churches and Quarterly meetings, conveniently located, as may embody themselves under this constitution.

Article 2. The conference of this body or association shall consist of Ministers, Deacons, and Board Members in good standing and delegates from the several churches and the quarterly meetings of which it is composed, all of whom shall have voting power. Every quarterly meeting with 500 members or less shall be entitled to one delegate and quarterly meetings with more than 500 members shall be entitled to one delegate plus one delegate for each additional 500 members or fraction thereof.

Article

Article

SIXTY-FIFTH ANNUAL SESSION

Every church with 50 members or less shall be entitled to three (3) delegates, and churches with more than 50 members shall be entitled to three (3) delegates, plus two (2) for each additional 50 members or fraction thereof.

Article

3. The officers of this yearly meeting or association shall be a clerk and treasurer, moderator, vice moderator and a mission treasurer, who shall be chosen at the close of every session of the yearly meeting or association, and whose term of office shall begin immediately following adjournment of each annual session.

4. Any well organized and well regulated Free Will Baptist church or quarterly meeting as conform to the practices and adopt the doctrines of the Free Will denomination, as published in the Treatise of their faith, and in the minutes of the national association and one in favor of all benevolent enterprise of the denomination may at any time on application by two-thirds vote of this body, become a member thereof.

Article 5. This yearly meeting or association shal lhave power to disclipine the churches of which it is composed and to exclude them for disorderly work, if labor proves unsuccessful, but in no case to reverse their decision nor interfere with any of their internal regulations.

6. The sessions of this yearly meeting or association shall be held on Thursday and Friday before the second Sunday in October, at which time it shall be the duty of the churches and quarterly meeting of which this yearly meeting or association is composed, to represent themselves by letter and delegates and report their standings, prospects and statistics, at which time the association shall act upon such questions and topics as may be referre dto it by its respective churches and quarterly meetings and transact such other business not repugnant to this constitution or to the practices of the denomination as in its judgement may promote the cause of Christ and the interests of the churches and quarterly conferences within the limits of this yearly meeting or association.

Article
7. This yearly meeting or association shall have power to adopt any regulations or by-laws, not consistant with this constitution, which may be deemed essential to the further regulation of its session.

Article 8. This constitution shall not be changed or altered except by two-thirds majority of all members present at a regular session. All proposed amendments shall be in writing and shall be read in open session during first day, then lie on table until second day, read for second time in open session prior to being considered.

RULES FOR ORDINATION OF MINISTERS Revised 1960

1. Applicant shall bear license for not less than one (1) year and shall be recommended to the quarterly conference or association by the church of which he is a member.

Be called to one (1) or more churches, except that evidence be shown whereas the applicant can be useful in evangelistic work.

3. Applicant shall be examined by the ordaining council, who having been duly elected by the association to which they hold membership. Examination shall be held at a Quarterly meeting or the annual association while in session.

4. Applicant shall meet the qualifications as laid down in the scripture of the Old and New Testaments. Measure up to the standards of Free Will Baptists and our church covenant, of which have bee nadopted by this body.

5. These rules may be changed and re-wirtten only by a two-thirds (2/3) majority of those voting, for a change, by the Georgia Union Association. The same shall be carried in the minutes of the Georgia Union Association of Free Will Baptists.

RULES FOR LICENSING OF MINISTERS Revised 1960

1. Applicant must be a member of church recommending him, and if applicant is coming from another denomination or association, he shall be a member of church recommending him for not less than three (3) months from date receiving letter stating he is in good standing with church, denomination and association he is leaving.

2. Applicant shall be examined and asked the following questions at the quarterly meeting or annual association while in session, by the ordaining council duly elected by the annual association.

Q. 1. Do you believe and accept the Old and New Testaments as inspired word of God?

Q. 2. Do you believe in baptism by immersion in water?

Q. 3. Do you believe the ordinances of the Lord's supper and washing of the saints feet?

Q. 4 .Do you believe in tithing and offerings as given in the inspired word of God?

Q. 5. Do you believe in the sale and use of intoxicating beverages?

3. Approved license shall carry the name of all three (3) council members and the seal of the Georgia Union Association of the Free Will Baptists.

4. Applicant shall meet the qualifications as laid down in the scripture of the Old and New Testament, measure up to the standards of the treaties of

the National Association of Free Will Baptists and our church covenant of which have been adopted by this body.

5. No applicant for license to the ministry will be eligible for license if

he or she has more than one lving husband or wife.

6. These rules may be changed and re-written only by two-thirds 2/3) majority of those voting at a regular session of the Georgia Union Association.
