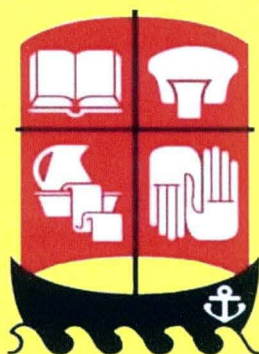

Mission Board: Rev. Roy Woods – Chairman

The Mission Board has not meet because of Coronavirus. The Mission Board is declining in funds. A word was given of encouragement to the churches to give. As of December 31st, the Mission Board had \$44,276.01 in Nashville; after withdrawing \$18,000.00 for local fund, it left the total as \$26,276.01. Balance at Colony Bank as of March 31st before

the transfer of the \$18,000.00 was \$964.94. Mission Department givings from local churches was March, \$334.65; April, \$327.50; May, \$407.50. Georgia Union offering was given to the Mission Board and that was a total of \$213.00. Checks have been made for May, June, and July for the Sargents, Suggs, and Snows for \$6,000.00. This leaves a total in the Colony Bank of \$14,247.59. The Mission Board has a grand total of \$40,523.60. The State Mission Board met and spoke of revitalization, which is needed in many churches today; (State) executive board requested to add to their guidelines. Have set up basic guidelines for revitalization projects. The work at Tifton is continuing and they are averaging about 122 people. M/S/C

Constitution and By-Laws

Georgia Union Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.

(Revised 1980; 1/81; 4/82; 4/89; 1/90; 6/91; 10/92; 10/93; 10/95; 10/97;
6/98; 4/99; 1/00; 4/00; 10/00; 10/12; 1/15; 10/15; 7/18; 10/20)

ARTICLE 1: Name and Affiliation

Section 1. Name. This Association shall be known as the Georgia Union Association of Free Will Baptist, Inc. (this "Association").

Section 2. Affiliation. This Association and its member churches adopt the Treatise of Faith and Practices of the National Association of Free Will Baptists, adopted by the National Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. on November 7, 1935, at Nashville, Tennessee, and its revisions dated 1948, 1956, 1958, 1969, 1973, 1974, 1977, 1979, 1981, 1992, 1996, 2001, 2004, 2005, 2007, 2008, 2010, and any and all future revisions (the Treatise"), which is on file at the offices of the National Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc., at 5233 Mt. View Road, Antioch 37013. The Treatise is by this reference incorporated herein and made a part hereof.

ARTICLE 2: Member Churches

(a) Any well-organized Free Will Baptist Church or Mission conveniently located to the majority of the member churches may apply for membership in this Association. The applicant church or mission must conform to the Treatise, and any further requirements established by this Association.

(b) The Executive Board (defined below) shall investigate and submit their recommendation to this Association before any church or mission can be accepted into this Association.

(c) This Association may discipline member churches or missions, if labor proves unsuccessful, by exclusion or withdrawing fellowship. However, in no case can this Association reverse the church's or mission's decisions, nor interfere with any of their internal regulations.

(d) A two-thirds majority vote of the voting delegates of this Association is required for acceptance or exclusion of any church or mission.

(e) Ministers, deacons, officers, committee and board members in good standing shall be standing delegates to this Association and shall duly attend each quarterly conference.

(f) Each church or mission shall be entitled to the following delegates with full voting privileges: 50 members or below - 3 delegates; over 50 members - 3 delegates, plus 2 for each 50 members or fraction thereof.

(g) The Association fee for each meeting shall be:

(h) The National Fee of \$200.00 per member church is payable prior to the National Convention in July of each year.

(i) This Association shall adopt a Budget at the Annual Conference in October of each year, which budget shall be proposed by the Executive Board. The annual budget shall become effective January 1 of the following year.

ARTICLE 3: Officers

(a) The Officers of this Association shall consist of: Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer (the "Officers"), and shall be elected by a majority vote of eligible voting delegates at the Annual Conference in October, or at any other regular quarterly conference if an office becomes vacant before such officer's term expires. Officers shall service two-year terms, with tenure beginning immediately at the close of the October session.

(b) The Moderator shall preside over each Quarterly Conference according to established parliamentary usage. It shall be his duty to see that all business is carried on in a way pleasing to God. The moderator is chairman of the Executive Board and shall call this Board into

session as needed. The moderator is an ex-officio member of all committees and boards of this Association, as needed. He shall be the official representative of this Association.

(c) The Clerk shall keep accurate records and minutes of each Quarterly Conference and Executive Board meeting. The Clerk shall prepare the minutes for publication in the Annual Minute Book and see that they are printed and available for distribution at the January session. The Clerk is responsible for all the correspondence and records of this Association.

(d) The Treasurer shall receive and disburse all funds as directed by this Association. The Treasurer shall be chairman of the Finance Committee and will submit a financial report to each Conference.

(e) The Assistants to the above officers shall serve in the full capacity of the office when the elected officer is absent or unable to serve.

ARTICLE 4: Executive Board

The Executive Board shall consist of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, and Chairpersons of the Trustee Board, Mission Board, Christian Education Board, Camp Board, and Ordaining Board, and one member at large. The Executive Board is the official body of this Association when not in session and is empowered to act on behalf of this Association on matters that, in the judgement of the Executive Board, should not be delayed until the next Quarterly Conference. The Moderator shall be chairman of the Executive Board.

The Executive Board shall have the power to investigate any church or mission belonging to this Association concerning their doctrinal views. Such investigative request(s) must be submitted to the Executive Board in writing and signed by two persons who are members in good standing of a member church.

ARTICLE 5: Boards

A. Ordaining Board.

(i) The Ordaining Board shall consist of five (5) ministers in good standing, elected to five-year terms on a staggered basis.

(ii) Ordaining Board members shall be paid the current IRS mileage rate for work performed between quarterly conferences.

(iii) The Ordaining Board shall investigate and question candidates for licensing or ordination as they deem

necessary and as outlined by other regulations adopted by this Association. The Ordaining Board shall have the authority to deal with and investigate discipline issues on a case-by-case basis. All requests for investigations must be submitted in writing and signed by two or more witnesses.

(iv) No candidate for licensing or ordination may come to this Association for a vote until the recommendation of the Ordaining Board has been submitted to the Executive Board.

B. Mission Board.

The Mission Board shall consist of five (5) members in good standing, who have a zeal for missions, and shall be elected to 2 year terms on a staggered basis. The Mission Board shall have the general oversight of all missions supported by this Association as outlined in the Constitution of the Mission Board. The Board shall submit a report of activities to this Association during each Quarterly Conference.

C. Christian Education Board

The Christian Education Board shall consist of five (5) members in good standing, and shall be elected to 3 year terms on a staggered basis. The Christian Education Board shall have the general responsibility of all Christian Education endeavors of this Association as outlined in the Constitution of the Christian Education Board. The Christian Education Board shall submit a report of activities to this Association during each Quarterly Conference.

D. Digest Committee

The Digest Committee shall consist of three (3) members in good standing, elected to three-year terms on a staggered basis. The Digest Committee shall compile the information from the church letters submitted by each church at a Quarterly Conference and a report given by the Digest Committee at such Quarterly Conference.

E. Nominating Committee.

The Nominating Committee shall consist of three (3) members in good standing, elected for a term of one year. The Nominating Committee shall submit their recommended nominees at the Annual Conference in October, for all officers, boards and committee members with expired terms. The Nominating Committee should meet as a committee and contact each nominee, if possible, for their approval prior to submitting their names for nomination. Additional nominees may be submitted from the floor by any eligible voting delegate, except members of the Nominating Committee, during the Annual Conference.

F. Finance Committee

The Finance Committee shall consist of the Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer of this Association, and one other member of this Association who is in good standing and who has knowledge of financial matters, and who shall be elected for a term of one year. The Finance Committee shall function at each Quarterly Conference to count all monies and report the results of each financial tally, using appropriately prepared forms for such reports.

G. Temporary Committees.

Temporary committees (such as a resolutions committee) may be appointed as needed during any Quarterly Conference to carry on the business or to address any prevailing subject of the current times as may be determined by this Association.

The Chairman of the Christian Education, Missions, Camp and Trustee Boards shall be the state representatives on the respective state boards.

Each Board or Committee shall meet immediately after the Annual Conference in October to elect a Chairperson, and shall submit this information to the Clerk.

ARTICLE 6: Quarterly Conferences

(a) This Association shall meet on the Saturday before the second Sunday in January, April, July and October of each year. Conference will begin at 10:00 a.m.

(b) It shall be the duty of each member church or mission to represent themselves at each Quarterly Conference by letter which reports statistics and standings, and by voting delegates. All requests which require the attention of a committee or board must be in writing and submitted to the Clerk.

(c) This Association shall have the power to adopt any regulation or bylaws which will amend the Constitution, which may be deemed essential to the further regulation of this Association.

(d) This Association shall act upon such questions and topics referred to it by its member churches and transact any other business consistent with Constitution or to the practices of the Treatise.

(e) The Executive Board shall be the Program Committee and shall be responsible for the speakers and program outline.

(f) The member churches shall rotate alphabetically in hosting this Association but may ask to be excused for cause.

(g) The parliamentary procedures in this Association shall be governed by Roberts Rules of Order.

ARTICLE 7: Policy Regarding Marriage

The Policy stated below has been duly adopted by the National Association of Free Will Baptist, Inc., the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. and each member church in the Georgia Union Association of Free Will Baptist, Inc.

“This statement expresses the beliefs of this Association regarding marriage and human sexuality. It is based on the application of Biblical principles to our faith, our life, and our practice, and is in intentional accord with the Treatise of the Faith and Practices of Free Will Baptists, especially as expressed in the Appendix to Chapter IV, Section 1, as adopted by the National Association of Free Will Baptists (July 2008), of which our Association is a member.

A civil government’s sanction of a union will be recognized as a legitimate marriage by this Association only to the extent that it is consistent with the Biblical definition of marriage expressed in this Policy Statement (this “Policy”), which means the marriage between one man and one woman as expressed by God in Genesis 2: 23-25: vs. 23 “*And Adam said, This is now bone of my bone, and flesh of my flesh: she shall be called Woman because she was taken out of Man.*” vs.24: “*Therefore shall a man leave his father and mother, and shall cleave unto his wife: and they shall be one flesh.*” vs. 25: “*And they were both naked, the man and his wife, and were not ashamed.*”

HUMAN SEXUALITY

This Association follows what the Bible reveals as the “sure foundation” of the teachings of Jesus Christ and his apostles (Mathew 7:24-29; 1 Corinthians 14:37). If the body of this Association is to bear the name *Christian* authentically, we are called to teach and practice these teachings and are not at liberty to depart from them for a different authority. Though we strive to live peaceably with all people and to obey legitimate government authority, if the two come into conflict about matters as foundational as marriage, we must ultimately obey God rather than man (Acts 4:18-21).”

Recognizing that we all struggle with sin, this Association will provide an environment that welcomes people who struggle with sexual sin. We will seek to love all people in Jesus’ name, pointing them toward Christ’s power to forgive and heal. While the Bible teaches that those who engage in sexual immorality sin against their own bodies, we also recognize that sexual sin is not characterized in Scripture as being more severe than other forms of sin. We will seek God to discern ways that we can directly and indirectly minister and share God’s love with those who struggle with every

kind of sin. We also recognize that there is a difference between temptation and behavior and that, while temptation is something unavoidable, we are responsible for our behavior.

For Membership in this Association:

- 1 No member(s) of any Church in this Association may enter into a sexual union other than Biblical marriage as defined by this Policy without being subject to discipline within this Association.
- 2 No person practicing a sexual union other than Biblical marriage, as defined by this Policy, will be considered for membership in any church in this Association.

For Our Staff (Ministers):

1. Every minister or other staff member employed by any Church in this Association shall affirm the statement of faith on marriage and human sexuality adopted by this Association.
- 2 Ministers employed by any Church in this Association shall be subject to dismissal and/or loss of ordination for violating this statement of faith on marriage and human sexuality or by officiating at a marriage ceremony that violates the letter or the spirit of this Policy.

Use of Our Facilities of any Church in this Association:

In a general way, and as a result of the religious beliefs described above – beliefs to which we must practice fidelity – it is our policy that the facilities of any of Church in this Association may not be used for any ceremony that in any way approves of, solemnizes, supports, or allows a same-sex union, a polygamous union, or any union that constitutes child abuse. Specific policies that express this include the following:

1. Only those applicants whose marriage is in accord with the Biblical view of marriage expressed in this Policy will be approved for weddings in any facilities of any Church in this Association. In making use of any of the facilities of any Church in this Association, they shall conduct themselves in a manner consistent with this Policy.
2. Only ordained or duly licensed clergy approved by any Church in this Association and conducting themselves in a manner consistent with this Policy shall officiate at marriage ceremonies conducted on any properties of any Church in this Association.
3. All our Churches in this Association shall decline any application for use of any facilities of any Church in this Association when there are significant concerns that one or both of the applicants may not be

qualified to enter into the sacred bond of marriage for theological, doctrinal, moral or legal reasons.

ARTICLE 8: Constitutional Amendments

This Constitution and Bylaws shall not be changed or altered except by two-thirds majority of all eligible voting members present at a Quarterly Conference. All proposed amendments shall be in writing and shall be read during the morning conference, then tabled until afternoon, unless, however, the eligible voting members present vote to suspend such time limit. The amendment can then be removed from the table, read again and acted upon. No action concerning changes of this Constitution or Bylaws can be taken until all committees are present.

BYLAWS

(Revised 1985; 10/87; 6/91; 1/00; 10/00; 10/15; 4/19)

1. Any eligible voting member, who, in the judgment of this Association, shows anger in discussing any subject, shall forfeit their seat in that Conference.
2. No member shall be at liberty to withdraw without leave of the Moderator.
3. In the absence of the appointed speaker for devotions and messages of each conference, the Moderator shall appoint a substitute. In the absence of the Moderator and Assistant Moderator, the Clerk shall call the session to order and elect a moderator pro-tem for that Conference.
4. All ministers on roll shall attend at least two meetings per year or send a letter or oral message explaining their absence in order to remain in good standing with this Association. Ministers on the Honor Roll are exempt from this requirement.
5. This Association shall open and close each Conference with prayer and praise to God.
6. The Association shall adjourn each Conference by vote and prayer.
7. There shall be a Finance Committee chosen to work with the Treasurer, and report to this Association.
8. The Executive Board shall be in charge of disbursement of the retirement fund for retired ministers.

9. Excess funds from this Association, after all expenses have been paid at the end of each fiscal year, and a reasonable balance maintained, may be distributed to the various boards at the discretion of the Executive Board.
10. Any Minister who is requesting to be added to the association honor roll must be 65 years old.
11. On the occasion of a National, State, or Local event that hinders the regular meeting of the Georgia Union Association, the Georgia Union Association Executive Board shall have the authority to conduct the business of the association on behalf of the association.

State Camping Board Representative

(Adopted 1/22)

The Georgia Union Association will elect one person from its number to serve on the State Camping Board. This representative will be elected to a five year term.

Constitution and Bylaws of the Christian Education Board

(Revised 1/82; 4/94; 7/95; 6/98; 10/00)

ARTICLE I: NAME

Section 1. The name of this Board shall be the Christian Education Board of the Georgia Union Association.

Section 2. The purpose of this Board shall be to promote and execute all phases of Christian Education set forth in this Constitution and as may be delegated to the Board by the Georgia Union Association.

ARTICLE II: MEMBERS

Section 1. This Board shall consist of five (5) members, three of which may serve to be a quorum. One or two or more shall be laymen.

Section 2. Each Board Member will serve for three years. The first year of the cycle, the terms of two board members shall expire, the second year, the

terms of two more board members shall expire, and the third year, the term of one board member shall expire. The cycle will then be repeated.

Section 3. Each member of this Board shall be elected by the Georgia Union Association.

Section 4. Each member of this Board shall show an interest in promoting Christian Education. He shall attend as many meetings as possible and as many functions sponsored by this Board as possible. Failure to do so may result in dismissal from the Board and a replacement sought immediately.

Section 5. This Board shall be responsible for election of its own officers and directors for each of its activities.

ARTICLE III: OFFICERS

Section 1. The officers of this Board shall be a chairman, vice-chairman and a secretary/treasurer, to be elected annually by the Board.

Section 2. The duties of the officers shall be (a) the chairman shall preside over each meeting according to established parliamentary procedures and shall appoint all committees. He shall be an ex-officio member of all committees; (b) the vice-chairman shall serve in the full capacity of the chairman when the chairman is unable to serve; (c) The secretary/treasurer shall keep the minutes of Board meetings, notes of other activities and is responsible for receiving and disbursing all finances as directed by this Board. He shall also make the reports as outlined in Article V.

ARTICLE IV: MEETINGS

Section 1. This Board shall meet often enough to see that its work is carried out effectively.

Section 2. The Board chairman may call special meetings when necessary.

ARTICLE V: REPORTS

This Board shall present a written report at each session of the Association, outlining the Board's immediate activities and future plans.

ARTICLE VI: FINANCES

This Board shall be supported by the quota of finances allotted to it by the Georgia Union Association, gifts from churches, registration fees from workshops, etc., and personal gifts.

ARTICLE VII: ACTIVITIES

Section 1. This Board shall sponsor activities for the Association and its youth as deemed necessary throughout the year.

Section 2. These activities shall be financed with registration fees, offerings or other feasible means.

Section 3. This Board shall sponsor other activities such as retreats, workshops, seminars, teacher training courses, etc., at its discretion.

BYLAWS

1. This Constitution and Bylaws may be amended in any regular session of the Georgia Union Association and by a 2/3rds majority vote provided that the amendment was tabled in the morning session.

2. Board members shall be reimbursed for their meetings to called meetings; other mileage shall be reimbursed at the discretion of the Board.

Constitution and Bylaws of the Georgia Union Mission Board

(Adopted 1975; Revised 1979; 7/81; 10/87; 10/98; 4/01)

PREAMBLE

We, the Georgia Union Association of the Original Free Will Baptists, do ordain this Constitution and Bylaws for the purpose of promoting all missions endeavors of the Georgia Union Association

ARTICLE I

NAME: This organization shall be known as the Georgia Union Board of Missions of the Original Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE II

MEMBERS: This Board shall be composed of five (5) members. (Members to be elected for a two (2) year period alternating by electing two (2) one year and three (3) the next year so as not to have an all new board at any time.) Each member must be a member in good standing with the church that is a member in good standing with the Georgia Union Association. If any member is employed by the Board or is called to work with or pastor a Mission or Mission Church supported by the Board, he will make this known to this Association and relinquish his position on the Mission Board. Members are elected at the discretion of the Association.

ARTICLE III

OFFICERS: Officers of this Board shall be Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer, elected annually.

ARTICLE IV

MEETINGS: This Board shall hold four (4) regular meetings each year, to be decided by the Board and meetings when necessary to be called by the Chairman.

ARTICLE V

COMMITTEES: Committees shall be appointed by the Board or its Chairman as needs arise who would demand the work of a committee.

ARTICLE VI

REPORTS: Section 1. This Board should report annually to the Georgia Union Association, giving account of all funds received and disbursed and activities of the Board during this year and state the objectives and future plans for the following year.

Section 2. The Secretary and Treasurer serving on the Mission Board shall submit written reports to the Board members as often as the Board may deem necessary. Also, reports shall be submitted through our state publications as often as may be deemed necessary by the Board.

ARTICLE VII

FINANCE: This Board shall be supported by special offerings, Church and personal gifts.

ARTICLE VIII

Section 1. **MISSIONS.** (A) Missions receiving help from this Board must either be established or accepted by this Board.

(B) This Board shall have authority over said mission in all matters in regard to calling a pastor and overseeing the mission work until such mission becomes a church.

(i) The Board reserves the right, in consultation with the mission, to regulate and reconcile the financial disbursements of any and all of the mission churches under its sponsorship with a view of helping these groups to remain financially solvent.

(ii) Neither the mission church nor the missionary shall incur any major indebtedness requiring monthly payments involving the work other than ordinary accounts, such as utilities, church supplies (literature, cleaning supplies, etc.), without written consent of the Board.

(iii) Neither the mission church nor the missionary shall involve themselves in site location or land purchase until the Board has first been notified of such intentions and has inspected and approved the proposed site or land purchase.

(iv) Any real estate of whatsoever type or style available and to be purchased, rented, leased or otherwise contracted for must first be approved by the Board. Final approval must be given by the Georgia Union Association of Free Will Baptists in session with all titles and deeds or lease agreements being made in the name of the Georgia Union Association of Free Will Baptists.

(v) Land purchases authorized by the Board and made in the name of the Board will be financed in a manner approved by the Board. Any appeals for funds with which to make such purchase shall be under the auspices and in the name of the Board for and in behalf of the mission church.

(vi) Title to any real property purchased for a mission church under the sponsorship of the Board shall be retained by the Board until such time as the mission church is organized into a bona-fide Free Will Baptist Church and is operating on a self-sustaining basis. At any time title will be transferred to the church, said title shall contain a revision clause as follows: "If _____ Free Will Baptist Church, located at _____, ever ceases for any reason(s) whatsoever to operate and function as a Free Will Baptist Church or pull themselves out of the Georgia Union Association, this property, with all the appurtenances thereto affixed and belonging, shall revert to the Board of Missions of the Georgia Union Association of Free Will Baptists."

(vii) All missions must comply with Article VIII (1) (A) and signed by the pastor and clerk, as follows:

"We agree to abide by these guidelines:

Signed:

Mission Pastor

Mission Clerk

Board Chairman

Board Clerk"

(C) Inasmuch as responsive assistance and supervision both to the mission and from the Association is essential for successful mission work, the following counties shall be designated as the home missions field for this Mission Board: Bibb, Peach, Twiggs, Wilkinson, Laurens, Bleckley, Houston, Macon, Dooley, Pulaski, Dodge, Wheeler, Telfair, Wilcox, Crisp, and any additional counties as deemed expedient by the Mission Board and accepted by this Association.

Section 2. CHURCHES. (A) Any church receiving financial aid must accept such on conditions agreed upon by the Board and the Church.

(B) Any church finding itself unable to operate as such, may request mission status, or mission church status.

ARTICLE IX

STATUS. When the congregation has reached a stage where they desire to organize into a church, it shall request said status upon completion of an examination by the Georgia Union Association Executive Board using guidelines as set forth by the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists for mission churches.

BYLAWS

DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. CHAIRMAN. The Chairman shall preside over each meeting, preserve order, govern the body accordingly to established parliamentary usage, and appoint all temporary committees. He shall have the right to call meetings when it is necessary and where.

Section 2. VICE CHAIRMAN. It shall be the duty of the Vice Chairman to serve in the full capacity of the Chairman when the Chairman is absent.

Section 3. SECRETARY AND TREASURER. The Secretary shall keep an accurate record of all transactions and Board meetings and preserve the same, keep all valuable documents and surrender same to his successor in office, send out a report of the work of the Board as often as the Board requires. All funds shall be held and disbursed by the Treasurer at the approval of the Board.

Section 4. EX-OFFICIO MEMBERS. The Chairman shall be an ex-officio member of all committees.

ARTICLE I

QUORUM: Three (3) members will compose a quorum. Voting is restricted to members or their proxies.

ARTICLE II

AMENDMENTS: This Constitution and Bylaws may be amended by two-thirds vote of the membership of the Georgia Union Association while in session.

The Constitution and By-laws of the Ordaining Board of The Georgia Union Association of Free Will Baptists

(Adopted July 2001) (Revised Jan. 2002)

Article I

The Name and Purpose

Section 1. The name of this Board shall be the Ordaining Board of the Georgia Union Association of Free Will Baptists.

Section 2. The purpose of the Ordaining Board shall be threefold:

The first purpose of the Ordaining Board shall be the furtherance of the message of salvation through Jesus Christ through the licensing, guidance, and ordaining of men who have answered God's call to preach the Gospel to the world.

The second purpose is to provide watch care over all ministers in the Association, concerning both their good standing in the association and their faithful adherence to the tenets of the faith and doctrines of the Word of God, as expressed and held by Georgia Union Free Will Baptists in The Treatise of Faith and Practices of the National Association of Free Will Baptists.

The third purpose of this Board is to promote a good and cooperative spirit among all the ministers in the Association.

Article II

Responsibilities of the Ordaining Board

Section 1. The first responsibility of this Board shall be to investigate, examine, and make recommendations to the Georgia Union Association, concerning applicants who desire to be licensed and/or ordained to preach the Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

Section 2. The second responsibility of this Board is to examine and make recommendations to the Georgia Union Association concerning the acceptance of ministers who transfer into our association, into one of our churches as a pastor or in a similar position, and who are coming from other Free Will Baptist church associations or from other denominations. Established questionnaires and guidelines shall be used in all cases.

Section 3. The third responsibility of this Board shall be to investigate and make recommendations to the association concerning the retaining of ministerial credentials and the disciplining of ministers because of immoral conduct or their holding of doctrinal beliefs contrary to the treatise of the National Association of Free Will Baptists, as held to by this Association. All requests for investigation of conduct must be submitted in writing and signed, with two or more witnesses.

The Board shall have the authority to thoroughly question a minister about doctrinal issues when such questions arise and make recommendations to the Association when their investigation is finished.

Section 4. The fourth responsibility of this Board shall be the oversight of our associational rules for good standing and the giving of recommendations to the Association regarding ministers within our association, who violate those associational rules for good standing.

Section 5. The fifth responsibility of this Board shall be the establishment of guidelines that govern doctrinal purity and proper ministerial conduct.

Article III

Members of the Ordaining Board

Section 1. Members of this Board shall consist of five ministers in good standing elected in regular session by the Georgia Union Association.

Section 2. Board members shall be elected for a five-year term with one member of the Board rotating off the Board each year.

Section 3. Board members are expected to faithfully attend Board meetings.

Section 4. Board members shall be reimbursed at the current mileage rate of the IRS for their attendance at Board meetings.

Article IV

Officers of the Ordaining Board

Section 1. Officers. The officers of this Board shall be Chairman, Vice-Chairman and Secretary.

Section 2. Election of Officers. Each officer shall be elected annually by the Board at the close of the October Annual Meeting of the Georgia Union Association.

Section 3. Duties of the Officers. The duties of the officers shall be:

The Chairman shall preside over each meeting, following parliamentary procedures established in Roberts Rules of Order, and shall be responsible for a written report to the Georgia Union Association each quarter.

2. The Vice-Chairman shall act as Chairman when the Chairman is unavailable.

3. The Secretary shall keep written minutes of all Board meetings.

Article V

The Meetings of the Ordaining Board

Section 1. This Board shall meet at least once each quarter.

Section 2. The time and place of the first Board meeting of the next quarter shall be announced at each Associational meeting and included in the Board's report.

Section 3. The attendance of three members shall constitute a quorum.

Article VI

Reports of the Ordaining Board

Section 1. Written reports of the Ordaining Board shall be given at each Georgia Union Associational Quarterly meeting, preferably by the Chairman.

Section 2. The quarterly report shall contain the following items:

1. Recommendations from the Board to the Georgia Union Association.
2. A brief summary of the Board's activities during the preceding quarter.

Section 3. A minority report shall be submitted on all recommendations that are not unanimous.

Article VII

Associational Bylaws of the Ordaining Board

Section 1. Rules for the Licensing of Ministers.

1. Applicant must be a member of the church recommending him, and if applicant is coming from another denomination or association, he shall be a member of the church recommending him for not less than three (3) months from the date of receiving the letter stating that he is in good standing with the church, denomination and association that he is leaving.
2. Applicant shall complete "The Georgia Union Association Application for Licensing of Ministers" and return it to the chairman of the Ordaining Board prior to the Ordaining Board meeting. The Ordaining Board shall study all applications for licensing before their meeting and then examine the candidate at their meeting. The Ordaining Board shall make a recommendation to the Georgia Union Association concerning each candidate for licensing. If approved by the Association, the candidate's local church shall issue him a license valid for one year. The candidate's license shall be renewed each year, providing his local church has recommended renewal of his license, the Ordaining Board examines the licensee and recommends renewal, and the Association votes approval.
3. Approved license shall carry the names of the pastor, clerk, and church issuing the license.
4. Applicant shall meet the qualifications as laid down in the Scripture of the Old and New Testaments, measure up to the standards of The Treatise of the National Association of Free Will Baptists and our Church Covenant, which have been adopted by this body.
5. No applicant for license to the ministry will be eligible for license if he or his wife has more than one living husband or wife. Paul's statement in 1 Timothy 3:2, and Titus 1:6, namely, "the husband of one wife", is to be looked upon as making ineligible as ministers...anyone who has been divorced and remarried, regardless of the cause of the divorce or the guilt or the innocence of either partner...that said persons, whose marital state disqualifies them to be ministers...not be discouraged in their Christian lives or Christian service but that they be encouraged to live faithfully for Christ and serve Him.
6. Upon receipt of a minister's license, which is renewable annually, it is required that each licensee complete the following items which are to be considered a part of the examining criteria as indicated in paragraph 2:

- a. Read “A Free Will Baptist Handbook” by Matthew Pinson, “Faith for Today” by Dr. J.D. O’Donnell, and “What the Bible Says About Tongues”, by Robert E. Picirilli, which will be provided by the Association.
- b. Read “A Treatise of Faith and Practices of the Original Free Will Baptists” with current revisions.
- c. Be prepared to discuss personal habits and concern for:
 - (i) Church and personal visitation; (ii) Soul winning efforts and results; (iii) Personal Bible study; and (iv) Sermon preparation.

Section 2. Rules for Calling Pastors.

1. Each church should familiarize themselves with the rules for licensing of ministers and ask the candidate the same questions even though he may or may not be coming for license. If a member of another association, the pastor should indicate that he is in good standing. The degree of investigation of the candidate is left to the church’s discretion. Each church should be mindful of the standards of this Association for the good of the body.
2. No pastor of a church or mission in this Association can hold license or ordination papers from another denomination and be in good standing with this body. Any candidate coming to this Association from another denomination shall be placed under the watch care of this denomination and the church he is pastor of for twelve (12) months. All other license or ordination papers must be turned over to this Association and the clerk may destroy them or return them to the denomination from which they were issued.
3. All ministers desiring to transfer or join this Association shall:
 - a. Be recommended to this Association in writing by one of our member churches or missions. All ministers from any Free Will Baptist Association coming into this Association shall complete the questionnaire of the Georgia Union Ordaining Board and return the completed questionnaire to the Chairman of the Ordaining Board, two weeks in advance of its meeting date. All licensees and those desiring to be ordained must submit their completed State Ordaining Questionnaire to the Chairman of the Ordaining Board, two weeks before the meeting of the Ordaining Board. The date and place of the Ordaining Board meeting is to be announced at each quarterly Georgia Union Association meeting. Questionnaires may be obtained from the Chairman of the Ordaining Board or from the Clerk of the Georgia Union Association.”
 - b. The candidate shall meet with the Ordaining Board. No candidate for membership in this Association may come to this body for a vote until the recommendation of the Ordaining Board is submitted.

- c. If there are any questions concerning the candidate's doctrine or character, the Association may open the examination to the majority present at the Association. The church recommending the candidate, or any member person, should make known any questions that should be considered.
- d. Transferring ministers shall be under the watch care of this body until a letter of good standing is received from his previous association. The Association Clerk must request in writing a letter of good standing from the association that said minister is transferring from.
- e. It is the responsibility of the church or mission calling a pastor to inform him of the requirements of this Association.

Section 3. Rules for the Ordination of Ministers.

- 1. Applicant shall bear license for not less than one year and shall be recommended to the quarterly Association by the church of which he is a member.
- 2. Be called to one or more churches, except that evidence be shown whereas the applicant can be useful in evangelistic work.
- 3. Applicant shall be examined by the Ordaining Board, who having been duly elected by this Association to which they hold membership. Examination shall be held at the discretion of the Ordaining Board.
- 4. Applicant shall meet the qualifications as laid down in the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments and measure up to the standards of Free Will Baptists and our Church Covenant, which have been adopted by this body. The pastor and his family are strongly admonished to uphold the standards of the Word of God by being faithful in attendance on the Lord's Day.
- 5. No applicant for ordination into the ministry will be eligible for ordination if he or his wife has more than one living husband or wife. Paul's statement in 1 Timothy 3:2 and Titus 1:6, namely, "the husband of one wife", is to be looked upon as making ineligible as ministers...anyone who has been divorced and remarried, regardless of the cause of the divorce or the guilt or the innocence of either partner...that said persons, whose marital status disqualifies them to be ministers...not be discouraged in their Christian lives or Christian service but that they be encouraged to live faithfully for Christ and serve Him.
- 6. The credentials of any minister who joins in membership with a church of another denomination shall be considered null and void. The minister shall voluntarily return his credentials to the Georgia Union Association Clerk. If he does not, the Association Clerk shall send a letter, certified mail, return receipt requested, notifying such minister that his credentials are null and void, and request him to return his credentials to the Association Clerk. The Clerk shall notify the State Office of the status of such minister's credentials and ask the State

Office to place notification in the State Promotional Bulletin of the minister's status.

Section 4. Rules for Ministers.

1. All ministers on roll, licensed or ordained, must be a member of one of the churches or missions in the Georgia Union Association of Free Will Baptists.
2. All ministers on roll, licensed or ordained shall attend at least two associational meetings each year or send a written or oral message to the Associational Clerk, explaining their absence in order to remain in good standing with this Association. Ministers on honor roll are exempt from this requirement.
3. Good standing is hereby defined as:
 - a. Having the privilege to pastor or hold a ministerial position in a church or mission in this Association.
 - b. Being a standing delegate in this association.

These privileges are revoked when the minister is no longer in good standing, and can only be reinstated with the recommendation of the Ordaining Board and the vote of this Association.

4. A minister, who is no longer in good standing in this association, shall be required to be re-examined by the Ordaining Board of this Association, who shall recommend to the association, whether or not the minister is to be placed back on the roll of ministers in good standing. The Association shall vote to accept or reject the recommendation of the Ordaining Board.
5. All ministers shall be expected to abide by the beliefs and practices of Free Will Baptists, as defined in the Treatise of the Faith and Practices of Free Will Baptists, and shall be expected to turn in their credentials of ordination, when they no longer hold to Free Will Baptist doctrines and beliefs.
6. All ministers are expected to submit to the decision of the association and relinquish their credentials of ordination if they are called for by this association of churches.

Section 5. Discipline Procedures of Ministers For Lack Of Attendance at Association Meetings.

The following procedures shall be followed when a minister reaches the point of being in danger of losing his good standing in the Association, because of lack of attendance:

1. The associational clerk shall notify the minister, the clerk of his church, and the Chairman of the Ordaining Board, in writing of the minister's failure to keep the associational attendance requirement, and that his good standing is in danger of being suspended in the Association.
2. The Chairman of the Ordaining Board shall notify the minister in writing, of the date and time of the next Ordaining Board meeting,

where his attendance will be required. The Ordaining Board will determine at that meeting, what if any, further action, is required.

3. If the Ordaining Board, after examining the minister, is satisfied with his answers, and the minister agrees to comply with the attendance requirements, no further action will be necessary. If not, the Ordaining Board will make a recommendation to the Association that the minister is considered to be out of good standing.
4. If the minister continues out of good standing in the Association, for two more quarters, refusing to abide by the attendance requirement, the Ordaining Board shall make a recommendation to the Association, that the minister's credentials be revoked.
5. Any minister, whose credentials have been revoked, must be reexamined by the Ordaining Board, as if he had never been considered by this Association.

Article VIII

Constitutional Changes

Amendments: This Constitution and Bylaws may be amended by two-thirds vote of the membership of the Georgia Union Association while in session.

Constitution of The Trustee Board of The Georgia Union Association of Free Will Baptists

(Adopted April 8, 2006) (Revised April 7, 2007)

Article I

The Name

The name of this Board shall be the Trustee Board of the Georgia Union Association of Free Will Baptists.

Article II

The Purpose

The Board of Trustees shall have general charge of all real and personal property (the Property") belonging to, or in the name of, the Georgia Union Association, and shall assume full responsibility of said Property, including, but not limited to, holding deeds; maintenance; upkeep; and/or disposition of said Property, and shall make sure such Property is adequately insured. (The Georgia Union treasurer has possession of the Association's insurance policy.) All decisions regarding the purchase and/or sale of any Property must be presented to and approved by a majority vote of the Georgia Union Association while in session.

Article III

Members of the Trustee Board

- Section 1. This Board shall be composed of five (5) members.
- Section 2. Board members shall serve five-year terms on a staggered basis, with one member rotating off each year.
- Section 3. Each member shall be elected by the members of this association in regular session.
- Section 4. This Board shall be responsible for electing its own officers.
- Section 5. Board members shall be reimbursed at the current mileage rate of the IRS for their attendance at Board meetings.

Article IV

Quorum

Three (3) members will compose a quorum. Voting is restricted to members or their proxies.

Article V

Amendments

This Constitution may be amended by two-thirds vote of the membership of the Georgia Union Association while in session.
