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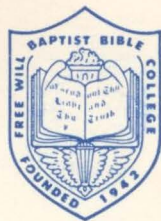

LEAGUE—We have had four (4) League Rallies the past year with good attendance.

Our Youth Encampment was a blessing to the League and all the Churches.

There were 35 to 40 saved during the encampment.

Our average attendance in League was 90.

We would like for each League to put their average League attendance in their Church letter next year.

S. officers and teachers meet at least once quarterly to discuss and work out all problems of S.S. and Doctrine points.

RESOLUTIONS IN YEARLY MEETING

This board shall make reports any time to Assn. when called for and especially must make an annual report.
