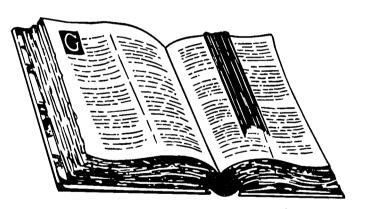

MARCH 16, 2001 FRIDAY MORNING SESSION

The 2001 State Association meeting was hosted by the Pittsburg Free Will Baptist Church of Pittsburg Illinois. The representation of our seven districts had a total registration of 178 attending. The Theme for this session was COMMITTED TO THE COMMISSION.

REPORT NO. 2 REPORT OF THE PROMOTIONAL SECRETARY

In my opening comments I want to express appreciation to all members of our state boards for the work accomplished in the year 2000. Each one is to be commended for keeping at their particular mission in Illinois. These men give many hours attending meetings and making decisions which guide throughout the year. Thanks to all of you.

The **Promotion Fund** did very well in spite of rising costs in all areas of the work. Not only was the cost of postage for the *Illinois Newsletter* increased twice, the cost of publication was also

increased. Plans are in the making to do a cost study to get a lower production cost for our monthly paper. The method of mailing could be changed from each individual receiving the *Newsletter* to a bulk mailing to the churches and distribution being made from the local congregations. Also, our mailing list which now totals 1,596 per month could be revised and updated by rewriting this list to include only those who really want the paper each month. This list would have to be compiled fro ma survey sheet mailed to every household. There are probably several on our mailing list who have died, moved or are simply no longer interested in our state work. We will keep everyone updated on this project.

You will notice in the State Treasurer's Report that the Promotion Fund can actually increase by about \$1,500 during the year thanks to increased allocations from the Together Way plus the insurance dividend received last year from *Brotherhood Mutual Insurance*

Company.

This coming year the Executive Board will ably have a busier schedule for this office. I am in the process of leaving the pastorate of the Ina Church and will have more time to devote to the promotional office. This, in turn, will mean more mileage and time and more expenses. Let me encourage every church to place this office in your budget. All promotional services are available to every church and the newsletter is sent free of charge to all who request it. However all these things have a cost. Just the *Newsletter* alone cost about \$3.75 per year for you to get a copy delivered to your home. Ask your church to help underwrite this expense.

At the time this report was written the following churches needed pastors: Decatur, Moline, Johnston City, Oak Grove, and Ina. New pastors include Brother David Burgess at Oak Valley, Brother Tony Kash at Salem, and Brother Michael Kniffen at Nason, and one of our

pastors, Brother Loyd Crain passed away.

Thank you for praying for me as I spoke at the graduation at Free Will Baptist Bible College in May and at the National Association in California last July. It is always a privilege to represent Illinois in our denominational meetings. Thank you for letting me serve in this office for another year.

REPORT NO. 5 ILLINOIS BOARD OF MISSIONS REPORT TO ILLINOIS STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS MARCH 16-17, 2001

Progress! Victories! The year of 2000 marked a year of unusual activity in our missions' projects. We have seen a new project begun, new building activity, and purchasing new property, as well as having need for more room/building. These events are results of souls being won and precious people added to our missions' rolls.

These situations have driven us to our knees more often, but it is the

type of "problems" we need to see. What a joy it is to work with such a board with our missionaries and the work so close to their hearts!

The projects in Illinois (now four!) require most of our focus and attention. These are the ones for which we are fully responsible. This does not minimize the importance and our interest in the foreign missionaries and other home missionaries and other home missionaries from Illinois.

Briefly (oral reports of missionaries present will be part of this report).....

<u>Chicago</u> - Bro. Potete can verify--yes, a building with a parking has been purchased. Its location is on a main street (Diversey) in Chicago. What a joy for this mission group to move into a facility that is "their own"! With a long awaited success come challenges - challenges with building codes and zoning requirements. These are "challenges" go overcome and proceed!

Wheeling, IL - Bro. Drozdov, our Russian pastor, is laboring in the Chicago suburbs to build a Russian Free Will Baptist Chruch. We are now contributing a small amount each month to assist this National Home Mission Project.

Elgin - Bro. Carl Hawkins, a Centralia, IL (E.C. District) transplant, has given himself, as have his wife, Shelia, and their sons, to the task of building a strong Free Will Baptist Church . Bro. Carl is a "tentmaker" undertaking this project. The work is going well, and Bro. Carl is to be commended.

<u>Springfield</u> - Bro. Ken Doggett has seen a great "breakthrough" in growth during 2000! It is exciting to see endurance, faithful door knocking, and other work return dividends in souls. Bonnie's health has stablized. Thank you for your support and prayers.

Bro. Doggett is in a challenging phase of his mission ministry. He needs to secure more room to keep growing, he has set a goal of raising \$100,000.00 to go toward building. This is imperative for the mission to move toward self-support. We, as a board, strongly encourage our fellow FreeWill Baptists to contribute to this need.

<u>Mascoutah</u> - Bro. Jon Cannon has seen great progess in this growing area. Much needed space has been added to the mission's facilities! They have done a marvelous job on this addition, and with this increased space they can now grow to be self-supporting. Their outreach program has been successful!

Albuquerque, NM - The new address for our newest home missionaries from Illinois. The Mark Shores family will be leaving us and heading west. Thank you to those who have had them for a service in your church. We encourage every one of our churches in Illinois to invite and welcome Bro. Mark to share his burden and plans for the Albuqerque project. (NOTE: Our Illinois Regional Support program, IRS, is still in its "taking hold" phase, so Bro. Shores must have designated support to be able to go to New Mexico as a missionary.)

Our foreign missionaries are in challenging times. New leadership is planning new things. Many, if not all, of our foreign missionaries, are coming home for meeting in the near future. Pray for these champions for Christ. Of special concern and interest is:

Sarah Malone, China - teacher and administrator
Mark King, China - teacher
Dennis Owen family, Uruguay
Dennis Teague family, France

Some of these continually struggle with keeping their accounts in the black. As of December 31, 2000, the Teague account was +3,940.29 and the Owen account was -2.939.66.

Regional Support is working! It has seen success in other states. We are encouraged at whta we have seen accomplished in Illinois. We also need every Free Will Baptist church to give something monthly to the Regional Support program. (This is totally seperate from Co-op or Together Way Plan giving). It is exclusively for missions.

Take the mission posters and put them in your church. Encourage your people to get to know each missionary by sight (photo) and where they serve. Encourage contests, ect., and reward youth and adults who can match the missionary with the field (city, state, country) of service! Pray for them! Sunday School and CTS classes, Women Active for Christ, Master's Men, and youth groups can pick a missionary for that class (session) to pray for and give an offering to. You can encourage funds to be sent to the Illinois Regional Support program, so that all of these missionaries receive a part of it!

Greetings from the Christian Education Board. It is our pleasure and joy to be able to serve this state in the area of education. It is our challenge to seek to provide opportunities of education for our young who make be looking at attendig one of our Free Will Baptist Colleges as well as the body of the state association. Some of the services of this board are:

- 4. Plan and promote a seminar for the State Meeting on Thursday evenings. Our speaker this year is Dr. Steve Balin who addressed issues within the public schools and the ministry Christians may legally pursue within the school.
- 5. We are also planning a Mid-Winter Pastors Conference for 2002. A survey is being collected at thi meeting gauging interest. Focus on the meeting will be encouragement and fellowship and open to pastors and laymen. Churches are encouraged to send their pastor as well as pay for their pastor to attend.
- 6. We administer the Ministerial Scholarship Fund as well. All ministerial students attending a Free Will Baptist college are given a \$1000.00 scholarship upon request.
