

# REPORT NO. 3 PROMOTIONAL SECRETARY'S REPORT Report of the Promotional Secretary

As I prepared to make my annual report to this association I decided to review some of the reports of the past. Ten years ago, our state boards were doing very well in the activities assigned to them by this body. I am happy to announce that we still have people committed to the work of the Lord and to the work of Free Will Baptists. In fact, all our boards are actively engaged in promoting the work of their departments. You will be excited to hear what is happening this year.

Of course, all the work has to be coordinated by our state officers who serve you. I am impressed by the co-operation of the boards, the Executive Committee and our moderator. They follow the instructions of this voting body to insure that business is done in the way you specify. Plus, there are many issues to be handled during the year when this association is not in session. These dedicated people make decisions in your behalf then report to you annually for your approval. The people of our association should be proud that they are represented by men of integrity. I want to express my appreciation to all who serve.

Ten years ago our mailing list for the Illinois Newsletter was revamped by making a request for subscribers to send in their address. Of the nearly 1,600 receiving the publication, 503 responded. That number has now grown so that about 800 families receive the paper each month. The Illinois Newsletter and One Magazine are both mailed without charge to any Free Will Baptist family.

I try to keep the addresses up to date, but I can't do it without your help. If you know of someone who has moved, passed away, etc., please drop a note to our address or if you are not on the current mailing list, please give me your name and address. We want everyone to be informed of our work. Hopefully, we will go online with the newsletter this year.

One thing that has not changed over the years is the constant need of the churches. Several churches need help because of low attendance or because no pastor is available. This past year saw a drop in the total number of churches in our association to 38. This is the lowest number of active congregations in several years. Brother Dan McEvers, pastor at First Church of Peoria Heights passed away in September; Brother Harlen Johnson moved to Indiana and Brother Karel Smith retired and was replaced by Brother Marcellus Leonard.

We need to pray for our pastors and church leaders. The young men today who are taking lead of these congregations are facing issues we never dreamed of a few years ago. The humanist movement and all its interests are driving our future generations away from the truth of God. These young men will face spiritual battles that will try the very soul of the church. Everything sacred will be contradicted. The battle has already begun; bills are already in our state legislative bodies intended to force churches to approve of everything from abortion to same-sex marriage. Pray that God will raise up strong, spiritual leaders that will guide our congregations to be faithful to Him and His Word. Pray that we may finish well!

In closing, let me encourage our churches to continue to support the ministries on of State Association. We have a valuable treasure in our young people and we must reach them at any cost. Your church can help with all these ministries by supporting the state Together Way Plan plus additional funding for all boards operating in our state work.

This one-flesh relationship is emblematic of the union of Christ and His church. It is the sole and beautiful context of the divine plan for the marital relationship of man and woman as image-bearers of God, as well as the foundation for the family as the basic, divinely ordained unit of human society. Violations of this one-flesh union, whether heterosexual or homosexual premarital or extramarital, contravene the divine plan for the family and for the conception and rearing of children, bringing spiritual despair, guilt, and death to individuals and cultures. Genesis 1:26-28; 2:18, 20-25; Exodus 20:14; Deuteronomy 5:18; Matthew 19:4-6; Romans 1:18-32; 1 Cor. 7:1-5; Ephesians 5:21-33; 1 Thessalonians 4:3-5; and Hebrews 13:4.

#### Section 1

That all properties of the Illinois State Association including Camp Hope and any other properties obtained in the future will not be used in any way to support the homosexual movement or the performance of gay marriages.

#### Section 2

That all personnel of the State Association will not be involved in any way with the homosexual movement or the performance of gay marriages.

#### Section 3

That all personnel or volunteers that participate in any state function or activity must not be involved in a homosexual lifestyle. This would pertain especially to all who work at Camp Hope or Church Training Service activities.

#### Section 1

That all properties of the Illinois State Association of Free Will Baptist including Camp Hope and any other properties obtained in the future will not be used in any way to support the homosexual movement or the performance of same sex marriages.

#### Section 2

No personnel of the State Association of Free Will Baptist will be involved with the promotion of the homosexual movement or the performance of same sex marriages.

#### Section 3

That all personnel or volunteers that participate in any state function or activity must not be involved in a homosexual lifestyle. This would pertain especially to all who work at Camp Hope or Church Training Service activities.
