REPORT NO. 3

THE REPORT OF THE PROMOTIONAL SECRETARY

In reviewing the events of the past year, the first thing that comes to my mind was the passing of Brother Tim Hayes. He was a longtime friend, a brother in the Lord, dedicated servant who had a compassionate heart, a man of great ideas, a wonderful story teller and a successful family man. He served in our state in many different areas but was especially good as our treasurer and the organizer of the Disaster Relief Team. He and his wife Kathy served well as a team. He will be greatly missed by our association for years to come. A new director of the Disaster Relief Team and a new treasurer will be introduced at this meeting.

As I have previously stated: "I want to commend the men and women who serve on our state boards. It is wonderful to see how they work together to help the churches. These dedicated people spend many hours and drive many miles to take care of the business of this association.

The board members who oversee all our boards (Camp Hope, Christian Education, Master's Men, Disaster Response Unit, Women Active for Christ, Illinois Missions and Church Training Service) plus the officers, the Executive Board and the various committees need a round of applause. They work hard all year so that this association functions properly." We will hear reports from all our boards and committees. They will have reports about some exciting things they have done this past year and will present plans for next year plus recommendations on how to accomplish the goals they present to this body.

The Bridge Builders for the Cross sent a letter to me during the Texas hurricane season and they had made connections with three Free Will Baptist pastors in the Houston area. These three men coordinated the work during the recovery period and the Bridge Builders were able to deliver hundreds of dollars to the relief effort. The organization sent a special thank you note to the churches of Illinois for their donations and prayers. The Bridge Builders began as a relief group ministering to Cuba and has expanded to Mexico and areas in the United States. Gary Curry of Oklahoma and Jim Dycus from Illinois are the administrators of this tax exempt, non-profit organization.

In getting information to our Free Will Baptist families, I have to address the printed issues of the Illinois Newsletter plus we also send it out in a PDF format to almost 150 email addresses each month. The number I have to mail out by USPS is now just above 600. For the past few years the revised postal rules required a different way to fold, tab and address each piece. The time involved in mailing has probably tripled during the past two years. However, we have a new printing company that now prints the publication and imprints the address on it plus they have a machine which tabs the newsletter and it is ready for mailing when I receive from them. Thanks to Mike and Barbara Thomas (Thomas Printing of Benton) for this new process. It is a tremendous timesaver for me.

. Some churches have an email network for their church which works very well for them. I send an email copy to the church which is then sent out to all their members. Other churches receive the online issue and print it for distribution among their members. Please consider doing this for your congregation. Please note: we will continue to make the individual mailings each month unless you instruct us to do otherwise.

I hope all our pastors have received their copy of the new magazine, PULP1T. It is sponsored by One Magazine and carries the 1 in its name, Pulp1t. It is free to pastors and will be published only occasionally. If you have not received this publication, you may request a copy giving me your mailing address or you may contact One Magazine.

The annual Camp Meeting went well as Rusty Miller led the music and Chaplain Kerry Steedley preached the powerful word of God. His messages were very encouraging. Thanks to the churches that supported the Camp Meeting and special thanks to the Ina Church for hosting the breakfast for pastors and leaders.

We have had some pastoral changes in our state this year, and new churches added to the association. When our district reports are given today, we can update our information.

REPORT OF THE CHRISTIAN EDUCATION BOARD

The Christian Education Board met four times since the last State Meeting. Our annual Christian education seminar last year was well received and attended. Dr. Eddie Moody from North Carolina spoke on "Surviving Culture," or dealing with the challenges our churches face as we try to uphold biblical views of morality and sexuality.

For 2018, we asked Dr. Robert Picirilli to speak at the Thursday night seminar (March 17, 2018, 7:00 p.m., Peace FWB Church). We are pleased that the program committee again asked Dr. Picirilli to speak twice during the Friday sessions of the State Meeting.

Due to lack of interest, we will no longer offer assistance for pastors to attend the Small Town Pastor's Conference in April. Last year, only two pastors, both CE Board members, attended. However, if other conferences, such as the D6 Conference, come to our area, we will consider assisting our pastors at that time if there is enough interest.

We do encourage all our pastors to attend a free workshop on pastoral health to be presented by Brother Jim Mullen beginning at 9:00 am, Saturday, March 3, at Calvary FWB Church in Salem. The church will provide a brunch between sessions. The CE Board is grateful to support and promote this effort as part of Calvary Church's revival with Brother Mullen.

Once again, we have provided scholarships and financial assistance for Illinois students attending Welch College. In 2017, we paid \$4,200 in scholarships divided evenly among students from Illinois and \$1,500 in ministerial student scholarships. In the current semester (Spring 2018), we will award 10 Welch College students at least \$216 each.
