Rev. James Roy Ledford

Oct. 31, 1945 - Feb. 26, 2009

Licensed to preach October 30, 1971

Ordained Minister March 29, 1980

James was the son of Rev. Gus and Sylvia Ledford and is survived by his wife of 29 years, Wanda Boings Ledford, five sisters, and four brothers.

James was a faithful minister of the Gospel from the time he accepted the call of the Lord to preach His word. He visited and preached in many churches in western North Carolina and eastern Tennessee. He was the pastor of Piney Hill Free Will Baptist Church at different times, he maintained a radio ministry for several years, he started a prayer service at the apartment complex where he lived, and he helped in many revivals. He was a great asset to the Jack's Creek Association and Ministers Conference, as well as, a great citizen of this world. Another Saint has finished his race and gone to receive his reward.

James not only ministered to countless people through preaching, but he also demonstrated his love for all people. This was evident by his interaction with children, the elderly, and with unbelievers. Although, he never had much in the way of possessions, he had a generous heart to give, sometimes all that he had, to someone who was in need.

The family of Rev. James Ledford is very grateful for the tombstone that was purchased by donations from many of his friends.

Troy grew up under the Christian influence of his parents and his grandmother, Ruetta McCourry. In June, 1940, as he was walking along Jack's Creek Road in the Clearmont Community, he came upon four men sitting on the bank of the road. The Lord impressed him to read them some Scripture from the little testament in his pocket. He preached his first message to them as he stood in the ditch beside the road. Three of those four men later responded to the call of the Lord to preach. This was the beginning of his many years of service as a minister in this world. He never entertained the thought of retiring or quitting, even when his body began to weaken. His accomplishments and experiences would fill a book. He never forgot his roots nor let pride direct his life. When he started in the Lord's work, he determined to complete his life doing the same.

He served the Jack's Creek Association and Ministers Conference in many different capacities as long as he was able. As his strength began to fade, he continued to remain aware of the work of the Association and Conference. He is one of the great heroes of this Association and this world. Troy served as the pastor of many churches during the 68 years of his ministry, and was the pastor of Pensacola Free Will Baptist Church when his discharge from service came. His love for the Lord and all people was evident in every part of his life. He helped in many revivals, conducted countless weddings, and led hundreds to the Lord. He had friends everywhere, and he proved his friendship every day. Article 1. This session shall be opened and closed with prayer.

Article 2. There shall be no conversation by members, one with another, so as to interrupt business while in session.

Article 3. Every member wishing to speak shall first rise to his feet and address the moderator.

Article 4. No member shall interrupt another while speaking.

Article 5. We will admit of no other title but that of Brother while in session.

Article 6. Every member speaking shall attend to the subject under consideration.

Article 7. No member shall speak more that three times on one subject. No member is to speak more that five minutes on one subject.

Article 8. Every motion made and seconded shall be attended to unless withdrawn by those who made it.

Article 9. No member shall absent himself from the body while in session without leave of the Moderator.

Article 10. On all motions, when the vote of the body is taken, a majority shall prevail.

Article 11. The Moderator shall have the same privilege to speak as another member providing the Chair is filled.

Article 12. Any member transgressing the above rules shall be admonished by the Moderator.

Also, in the Thursday afternoon session we heard from Rev. Barry Simpson from the International Free Will Baptist Ministries. Rev. Simpson reminded us of our commitment to our Missionaries on foreign fields. He also informed us that this next year we will be celebrating seventy-five years of mission work in the world. In 2010, Oklahoma City will host all our missionaries who will be called home so all Free Will Baptists can say "Thank you" for their services.

Rev. Simpson also talked to us of a book of the history of Free Will Mission work with five hundred copies of the book being bound with leather. The cost will be \$500.00 per copy with the proceeds going to the general fund of Free Will Baptist Missions.

Rev. Simpson also informed us that they are in the process of changing how the accounts for each individual Missionary is handled and that these missionaries will no longer have to work from a deficit account while they are in the field.

Rev. Frank Woods from Free Will Baptist Children's Ministries spoke to us about how things were going and gave a report on the seventieth anniversary of the children's home. He also announced two singings to be held in Marion N.C. and Mountain City, Tennessee, with proceeds going to the home. Rev. Woods then gave out plaques for the churches who participated in the Mother's Day program and the gifts given from the individual churches. Finally, Rev. Woods says, "I want to thank the members of the Jacks Creek Conference for your prayers and support for the FWB Family Ministries. All of you are such an important part of this ministry. From July 2008 thru June 2009, you have contributed over \$37,000 to our ministry. We have seen 184 young people accept Christ. Since January 2009, 74 young people have made decisions for Christ. The total love offering for the Mother's Day Fund was around \$62,000." He also encouraged churches to have a baby shower for mothers who have babies at the home. The Hope Center saw 96 babies born in 2008 and in the first six months of 2009, 52 babies were born.

Randy English who represents the Mission Board for the state of Tennessee spoke about the Walk-a-thon and told us that this year the Walk-a-thon will be held this year the second Saturday in September at Harmony Freewill Baptist Church in Hampton, Tennessee.

We then heard from the rules committee (Rev. Rodney Deyton) on the procedure to add to or change a rule in our conference and that they request the information on the burial fund to be included in our minutes so that everyone has access to that information.

In other business, Bro. Frank Cable talked about a thank you card he had received from the family of Rev. James Ledford. He also gave us information on the headstone for Rev. Ledford and the burial insurance for the widow of Rev. Ledford. He then recommended that the obituary and a picture of Rev. Ledford and Rev. Troy McCourry be given a special place in our minutes.

Thursday 7 PM Preaching Service

The service began with congregational singing "He Set Me Free". Brother Marvin Hensley welcomed everyone. Prayer was by Rev. Ulis Miller. The Big Creek Church Quartet sang "What a Meeting in the Air", "Rock of My Soul", and "I Need Jesus". The message was by Reverend Dean Murphy, reading from Haggai 1:2, I Corinthians 15:58. The title of the message was "Consider Your Way". He preached a very inspiring message. Song by Danny Miller, "Just As I Am". Rev. Marvin Hensley dismissed with prayer.

Friday 9:30 A.M. Business Session

The session began with the congregation singing "I Never Shall Forget the Day". Rev. Marvin Hensley welcomed the conference back. Devotions were given by Rev. Norman Loveless, reading from St. John 9:1. Prayer was by Rev. Junior McKinney. The session was called to order by the Moderator. Rules of Decorum was read by the clerk. Ministers' roll call was made. Additionally church letters were read. Visiting ministers were called for; none noted. Visiting churches were called for; none noted. Moderator then called for the committee reports to be given.

ASSOCIATION COMMITTEE REPORTS

Churches, Pastors, and Deacons: Rev. Ulis Miller spoke on a previous report given by last year's committee. He stressed the importance of the

deacons and pastors working together for the benefit of the Church. He also talked about the responsibility of both offices and how important it is for them to visit the sick and lost and to see to the needs of the widows.

Foreign Missions: Rev. Marvin Hensley made reference to the change of name of foreign missions to Free Will Baptist International Ministries. This was done recently by the Missions Board in Nashville. Rev. Bobby Revis talked about the account set up for each missionary and reported that only \$15,000 could be held in one individual account. If they receive more, then that money would be rolled over into a general missions fund out of that Missionary's name.

Disabled Ministers Fund: At present, the oldest living minister in our conference is Theodore Fleenor. The longest serving minister in the Jacks Creek Conference is Verno Davis. We now have a func established to financially assist any disabled minister in our conference 2 Cor.9:7, Gal.6:10. If you know of a need from our ministers, talk tc someone on the Investigating Committee. Pray for those who are ir need. Acts: 12:1-11. A phone call, a personal visit, a card or a letter, a fruit basket, or a flower or some thoughtful deed can be so wonderful. Often, their disability or sickness isolates them from the fellowship they have enjoyed through the years of their ministry. A friendly conversation, a Biblical discussion and a few minutes of Godly fellowship can be very encouraging and uplifting.

These ministers have given so much of their lives to minister to us, especially during the times we have had great need. Education: Education in its broadest sense is any act or experience that has a formative effect on the mind, character, or physical ability of an individual. 2 Timothy 3:7 describes worldly education as; "ever learning and never able to come to the knowledge of the truth." For a person to be established in faith, one needs to be rooted and grounded in God's word. As

2 Timothy 2:15 says, "study to show thyself approved unto God a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth". It is important to know what you believe and why you believe it. We, as the body of Christ, need a greater knowledge and understanding of the word of God. The root of many problems in our homes, marriages, families and churches stem from a lack of knowledge. Hosea 4:6 tells us, "My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge:

because thou hast rejected knowledge, I will also reject thee.." The solution to this problem is education. The technique is to study that we may show ourselves approved.

Disabled Ministers Fund: Rev. Jonas Revis gave the Disabled Ministers Fund current report stating that we started with \$249,684. We received \$1,780 today, and we had taken in \$3,205 in our Ministers Conferences, received \$1,840 for the burial fund, \$1,100 for minutes and as of this Friday, we have \$257,660.99.

Ladies Auxiliary: The ladies auxiliary of Low Gap Freewill Baptist Church has been established, and we encourage others to be part of this spiritual and physical support that it has given to the women of the church. As Christians, all women should be willing to help when needed. This special time together has given young and older women the support they have needed. The study of God's word is greatly needed and when it is done with others, it helps build a prayerful group of women that come together for Christ. "Lend a helping hand and share a word of kindness". Children's Family Ministry: Bro. Mike Allison spoke to us about the upcoming benefit singings with the Inspirations and the Good Shepherd quartets. He talked about the mothers who are being helped with their newborn babies and how God is touching and saving many lost souls. He thanked the churches for their gift of \$3,441 from this association and conference. He stated that they offered love, hope, and opportunity through their ministry which we are helping fund.

Sunday School: We strongly believe that Sunday school is the backbone of any church. A Sunday school teacher needs to be spirit filled as well as an example of a Christian in the way they dress and conduct their lives before children. We feel that Sunday school is the foundation for the child's life. "Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it", Proverbs 22:6. It provides an opportunity for each individual age group to express their thoughts and feelings with people their own age. Children and adults alike are usually more willing to talk about things in a small group of people than they are to get up in front of the whole church to speak or ask a question. Sunday school is not only for children but for all of us, to help us grow in wisdom and knowledge of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

Article 1 - **The True God** - We believe that there is one and only one living and true God who is in personality the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, equal and harmonious in every divine perfection. "For there is one God, and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus; who gave himself a ransom for all, to be testified in due time." I Timothy 2:5-6

Article 2 - **Holy Scriptures** - We believe that God is the author of the Holy Bible, and its teachings constitute the only infallible doctrine. "All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness:" II Timothy 3:16

Article 3 - **Original Apostasy** - We believe that Adam was created holy, but by voluntary transgression fell into depravity and consequently involved his posterity in sin. "And when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was pleasant to the eyes, and a tree to be desired to make one wise, she took of the fruit thereof, and did eat..." Genesis 3:6

Article 4 - Free Grace - We believe that the grace of God comprehends all spiritual blessings; that the Gospel is the power of God unto salvation; that the Holy Spirit not only reproves the world of sin, but is the means whereby sinners are converted and made wise unto salvation. "For there is no difference between the Jew and the Greek: for the same Lord over all is rich unto all that call upon him." Romans 10:12

Article 5 - Christian Faith - We believe that Christian faith is belief in Jesus Christ as the Son of God and Redeemer of the world and in the divinity of the Holy Scriptures; that faith comes by hearing the Word of God. "He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life: and he that believeth not the Son shall not see life; but the wrath of God abideth on him." John 3:36

Article 6 - Repentance - We believe that repentance is sorrow for

sin, and the kind of sorrow which produces Godly repentance must be effectual conviction of sin. "Now I rejoice, not that ye were made sorry, but that ye sorrowed to repentance: for ye were made sorry after a godly manner, that ye might receive damage by us in nothing. For godly sorrow worketh repentance to salvation not to be repented of: but the sorrow of the world worketh death." II Corinthians 7:9-10

Article 7 - Free Agency - We believe that the human will is free, and that men have the ability to accept or reject the conditions of salvation, "... what is good; and what doth the Lord require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?" Micah 6:8

Article 8 - **Perseverance** - We do not believe, under the Gospel dispensation, any soul is elected to eternal life unconditionally, but that those who by faith persevere to the end will be saved; that it is possible for men, who have been converted, to make shipwreck of the faith, turn again to sin, and be lost. "And Jesus said unto him, No man, having put his hand to the plough, and looking back, is fit for the kingdom of God." Luke 9:62

Article 9 - Good Works - We believe that good works are the result of faith and not of necessity; that those who have faith will do works of righteousness, while those who have not faith cannot do anything pleasing or acceptable to God. "Every tree that bringeth not forth good fruit is hewn down, and cast into the fire. Wherefore by their fruits ye shall know them." Matthew 7:19-20

Article 10 - Christian Baptism - We believe that Christian baptism is the immersion of a believer in water, in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost; that baptism cannot be Scripturally administered without faith in the subject who receives it. "Therefore we are buried with him by baptism into death: that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life." Romans 6:4

Article 11 - The Lord's Supper - We believe that the supper was instituted by our Savior as a commemorative ordinance; that the bread and fruit of the vine represent His body and blood; that it was instituted for Christians, and that all Christians should unite in service regardless of name of denominational distinction. "But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of that bread, and drink of that cup. For he that eateth and drinketh unworthily, eateth and drinketh damnation to himself, not discerning the Lord's body." I Corinthians 11:28-29

Article 12 - Feet Washing - we believe that washing the saints' feet is a command of our Savior, and that his followers ought to practice the same. "If I then, your Lord and Master, have washed your feet; ye also ought to wash one another's feet." John 13:14

Article 13 - **The Gospel** - We believe it is the duty of all churches to support the Gospel. "Even so hath the Lord ordained that they which preach the Gospel should live of the Gospel." I Corinthians 9:14

Article 14 - Judgment Day - We believe in one general Judgment Day. Hebrews 9: 27. "Because he hath appointed a day, in the which he will judge the world in righteousness by that man whom he hath ordained..." Acts 17:31. "When the Son of Man shall come in his glory, and all the holy angels with him, then shall he sit upon the throne of his glory: And before him shall be gathered all nations: and he shall separate them one from another, as a shepherd divideth his sheep from the goats:" Matthew 25:31-32. We believe that the tribulation precedes the Judgment of both righteous and sinners. Matthew 24:21-31, II Peter 2:10-13, II Thessalonians 2:6-9, Revelations 21:1-6, Revelations 19:6-9

CHURCH COVENANT

1. Having given ourselves to God by faith in Jesus Christ and adopted the Word of God according to the original Free Will Baptist doctrine as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to each other by the help of God.

2. We solemnly covenant before God that we will carefully observe the commandments implied by a confession of faith, and in the spirit of meekness, rebuke and admonish those who have gone astray, and watch over each other's reputation and use our influence to the upbuilding of the church and for the advancement of the cause of Christ, endeavoring to seek the unity of the Spirit in the bonds of peace, and to confess our faults one to another, and to strengthen those that are weak.

3. We promise that by the help of God we will faithfully practice family and secret prayer, and strive to cultivate the doctrine of God's revealed Word in the minds of those under our care.

4. We also agree to use our influence for the support of the Gospel and to contribute liberally to aid the ministry according to our several abilities. Also, we agree to be liberal with those that are afflicted and needy, and especially those of the household of faith.

5. We also agree to attend all regular meetings regularly if not providentially hindered and submit to all ordinances implied in a Profession of Faith.

6. We also agree to abstain from all sinful and vain amusements.

7. We also agree to abstain from all intoxicating liquors and not to use it as a beverage, nor to aid or assist in the manufacture of such nor to furnish it to others.

8. We also agree to encourage home and foreign missions, education, Sabbath schools, good morals, and everything that is to the glory of God and to the welfare of men. May the God of peace sanctify us wholly and preserve us blameless until the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, that we may be happily admitted into the Kingdom of God, may ascribe honor unto the Lamb forever. Amen.

Constitution of Jack's Creek Free Will Baptist Association

1. This Association shall be composed of delegates chosen and sent from each church.

2. The delegates chosen and sent shall be recommended in a letter from the church to which they belong and shall include the minister and some of the ablest members belonging to the church.

3. The Association shall elect annually a moderator and a clerk. The moderator shall not serve more than four (4) consecutive terms at one time. Amended August 9, 1986

4. The Rules of Decorum shall be read immediately after the body is organized.

5. The Association will encourage a sound ministry; such as present Christ as an all-sufficient Savior; having made salvation possible for every human being on the terms of the Gospel, which is freely offered to all.

6. Any minister in good standing, whether a delegate or not, may be invited to a seat and take part in the deliberation, and have his name enrolled in our Minutes.

7. The Association may appoint such committees as may be necessary to the expedition of business, and every committee appointed to any particular business shall report their proceedings in writing to the Association while in session, and all reports may be adopted or rejected by the body.

8. The Association shall have a book in which shall be kept an

accurate account of all its proceedings.

9. Any church may become a member of the Association by making application by letter or by delegate and adopting our Articles of Faith and Church Covenant.

10. The Association may withdraw from any church that becomes disorderly or refuses to be represented.

11. There shall be an Association Fund for defraying expenses and charges that may accrue and for replenishing such. Each church may contribute at pleasure.

12. There shall be a treasurer appointed by the Association, whose duty it shall be to have care of and account for the money committed to his charge.

13. The Association shall use the Free Will Baptist Treatise in full.

14. Each church shall be allowed one vote for every ten members or fraction thereof.

15. The Association advises all its churches to commemorate the death and suffering of our Lord at least twice a year.

16. The Association shall pay its clerk at least \$5.00 for his services per annum.

Constitution and By-Laws Jack's Creek Free Will Baptist Ministers Conference

Article 1. This body shall be known as The Ministers Conference of the Jack's Creek Association of Free Will Baptist and shall be composed of all licensed and ordained ministers of said Association.

Article 2. This Conference may receive any Christian minister, as a visiting minister. He may take part in any Biblical discussion. He may not vote or take part in the transaction of business matters.

Article 3. This body shall elect a moderator quarterly, and a clerk annually, both ordained ministers of one year or more membership in this Conference after his ordination. Amended August 1, 2009

Article 4. Each church may send two of its members as delegates to this Conference with all privileges of visiting brethren, as provided by Article 2.

Article 5. This Conference shall meet on Saturday before each fifth Sunday and in connection with the yearly Association with some church in the Association previously agreed upon or at the call of the moderator, provided that more than one session may not be held with any church during the same Conference year.

Article 6. The moderator is empowered and it is his duty to call an extra session of the Conference upon the petition of the members of this Conference; provided, however, that said petition is properly signed by seven members, three of whom shall be ordained ministers.

Article 7. The Conference, upon being organized each year, shall proceed to elect an Ordaining Council composed of five regularly ordained ministers; all having been ordained at least two years, and one or more shall have served one or more years on the Ordaining Council, and one of the senior members shall be the chairman of the Council thus constituted. It shall be their duty to examine candidates, grant licenses, and conduct ordinations.

Article 8. The Ordaining Council, when properly organized, shall have charge of all examinations and ordinations of candidates for the ministry who have been ordered before it by the Conference.

Article 9. All men applying to this Conference for a license to preach, for ordination, or for membership, shall present a letter of recommendation from the Free Will Baptist Church of which he is a member. This letter shall be dated and signed by the pastor, the deacons, and the clerk. Upon the majority approval of this Conference, the applicant will be received under our watchcare. The applicant shall sign a waiver permitting our Investigating Committee to check on his personal life. The Committee should submit their report at the next scheduled Conference. If the Committee recommends the applicant and the majority of the Conference approves, the applicant and his wife (if married) will be questioned by the Ordaining Council as to his divine calling, his qualifications, and his doctrinal beliefs. Upon the approval of the Ordaining Council and the majority approval of the Conference, the applicant will be licensed, ordained, or accepted as a member of this Conference. No member shall meddle with the work of another or injure his reputation for usefulness, but watch over each other in love, and thus promote harmony and love among the membership.

Article 10. Revised by a unanimous vote March 9, 2003. All applicants licensed by this Conference will be licensed to preach for one year. Upon the majority approval of the Conference, the license may be renewed annually. This license does not permit the licensed preacher to officiate at a marriage. A licensed preach may baptize converts and administer the Communion and Feet Washing service under the direct supervision of an ordained Free Will Baptist minister. Licensed preachers are expected to preach at least twenty-four sermons a year. If any preacher neglects to do so, (unless providentially hindered) he will be entitled to a seat in this Conference only as a visiting minister. All new licensed preachers will be assigned to one of our most able pastors for the period of two (2) years. Only pastors that are willing to accept the responsibility to work with the licensed preachers will be asked to participate. The licensed preachers in this program are with the pastor to observe and learn and are not to interfere or hinder the work of that Pastor. The licensed preacher will not be considered to be an associate pastor. The senior pastor that he has served under will, at the end of the wo (2) years, present a complete report to the Ministers Conference in a written letter. Any new applicants on or after this date, March 29, 2003, will be required to go through this program. The new applicants are asked to attend the senior pastor's church when he is not preaching somewhere. The licensed preacher at the end of this program, providing a good report was received from the senior pastor, may request to be ordained. Amended August 1, 2009

Article 11. Each member is urged and expected to attend all

jular meetings of the Conference. Any minister being absent from two ssions of the Conference in succession shall stand charged with linquency and shall be deprived of his vote on any question until he fers a satisfactory reason for his absence. His delinquency charge may removed by a majority vote of the Conference. Any minister who oes not report to the Conference in any fashion for one year shall be ropped from the roll and his credentials called for.

The above requirements shall not apply to any minister who is rendered unable to attend by reason of a continued disability of himself or his family. The minister or his family may report such circumstances in a letter to the Conference or by phone call or e-mail to the clerk or assistant clerk.

Article 12. Ordained ministers (men) from sister Associations seeking membership with this Conference shall present a letter of recommendation from their Conference, dated and signed by the Moderator or Clerk, in addition to the requirements of Article 9. If the Applicant is accepted by this Conference, a new Certificate of Ordination will be issued with the name of his original Conference and the names of the Ordaining Council on the margin.

Article 13. The Conference may withdraw fellowship from any member who becomes disorderly. Any person presenting a charge against a minister must sign his name to the charge or it will be null and void.

All charges against a minister will be brought to the Conference and a recommendation made before proceeding farther. Amended August 10, 1996.

Article 14. To constitute a quorum, at least half of the members on the roll must be present in order for the meeting to be called to order and business conducted. No session of Conference will be considered legal if fifteen or more ordained ministers are not present. Amended August 1, 2009

Article 15. No member shall serve as a pastor of a church which does not enforce discipline, care for its pastor, and contribute to other benevolent enterprises according to its ability.

Article 16. The moderator shall have the power to appoint any or all committees to carry on the work of the Conference.

Article 17. Necessary expenses of this organization shall be met by voluntary contributions or by assessment of the members. Article 18. This Constitution and By-Laws or any article thereof, may be suspended or amended, by a two-thirds vote of the Conference.

Article 19. Membership in this body shall be proof of good standing in the ministry.

Article 20. This Conference will only allow its members to preach, teach, and use the King James Version (KJV) of the Bible as we believe it is the infallible Word of God. Added August 1, 2009

The above Constitution and By-Laws was duly adopted by the Conference in regular session at North Bend Free Will Baptist Church, June, 1919. Readopted in Conference, September, 1944. Revised and re-adopted at Locust Gap Free Will Baptist Church, Mountain City, TN, August 9, 1975. Amended March 28, 2003

Resolutions and Rules - Adopted Since 1948

53rd Session 1948 - When committees are chosen for the Association, they are to have a minister as chairman. The remainder of the committee is to be chosen from the delegates.

60th Session 1955 - A motion was passed not to license any woman to preach.

63rd Session 1958 - Any person teaching or holding a church office is to be a member of the Free Will Baptist Denomination.

76th Session 1971 - Any person writing a letter to the investigating committee must sign the letter, or the letter will be considered null and void.

80th Session 1975 - Jack's Creek Ministers Conference is opposed to the so called Millennium or Millennial Doctrine as preached today. Any of our ministers found to be preaching or teaching this said doctrine, shall have their license called for and their names dropped from the ministers roll.

83rd Session 1978 - The Jack's Creek Free Will Baptist Association does not condone or allow homosexuality among its people, that it is deemed to be a deadly sin. Leviticus 20:13, Romans 1:26-32. Also we are opposed to abortion in any form. "Thou shalt not kill," the fifth Commandment. Exodus 20:13.

We do not accept mixed color marriages, because it pleased God to make everything after its own kind, and to separate the people of the

earth. Genesis 11:1-9.

84th Session 1979 - No minister will be allowed to serve on more than one committee of investigation or ordaining council.

Jack's Creek Ministers Conference does not condone our ministers performing a wedding and joining together in Holy Matrimony anyone who has been previously married and divorced.

August 13, 1983 - Ministers Conference - Concerning ministers marrying people that have been divorced: "If they have separated, divorced but not re-married, and get back together (and choose to remarry) minister may marry them."

"We, your Ordaining Council, recommend to the conference that a bylaw be passed that any preacher, who leaves his church and starts a New Work within (10) ten miles, consisting of members of the Old Church, be dealt with by the Conference by calling for his credentials.

89th Session 1984 - Resolutions Committee Report: We make a motion that the following resolution be accepted, "This committee will be known as the Rules Committee. It shall consist of five men: three deacons and two pastors. None on this committee shall belong to or attend the same church. All motions to make new, or change existing rules or bylaws, shall be given to said committee in writing and signed. The committee will consider the motion, then upon its decision, bring the motion to the floor for explanation in detail. This body shall then vote on the motion as they may choose. However, if the committee cannot agree that the motion should be presented to the body, the motion will then be dead."

August 12, 1994 - Rules Committee report: "We also make the following motion: No one is to be nominated for any office or committee unless present at the meeting in which the nomination occurs, unless the nominee has been informed and agrees prior to the nomination to accept the position if elected."

August 8, 1997 - Rules Committee report: "The Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer of the Jack's Creek F.W.B. Disabled Ministers Fund will be elected by the Jack's Creek F.W.B. Association for an indefinite period of time. A new Treasurer and/or Assistant Treasurer may be elected at the request of the current treasurer, at the decease or withdrawal from the Association by the treasurer, or by a majority vote of this Association."

August 7, 1998 - Brother Charlie Trivette presented the church

flag and a certificate to be given to all ministers' wives or next of kin at the close of a minister's funeral. The idea was accepted and agreed to be paid for out of the Home Missions fund, motion being approved by the Association.

November 28, 1998 - A motion was passed that anyone bringing a charge against a minister in the Conference would be subject to being investigated by the same Investigating Committee as the minister, before the charge would be brought before the Conference.

July 30, 1999 - 1 p.m. Business Session: A motion was passed to reprint and use the Treatise that was written by the Committee appointed in 1985.

October 28, 2000 - Ministers Conference - Bro. Charlie Trivette spoke on the flags to be presented at funerals of deceased ministers. Bro. Trivett made a motion that the presiding minister call in advance to find out the wishes of the family. The motion was approved.

September 29, 2001 - Ministers Conference - A decision was made that when a Conference was called (postponed) after inclement weather, it would be a standing rule that it would convene the next Saturday.

January 29, 2005 - Ministers Conference - A motion was passed stating, "If the Investigating Committee got a signed letter requesting an investigation of a preacher ten days or sooner before the next Conference, they have the authority to go ahead with the investigation. If it was within the ten days before the next conference, they will wait for the Conference Approval.

By-Laws Jack's Creek Free Will Baptist Disabled Minister's Fund

1. This organization shall be known as the Jack's Creek Free Will Baptist Disabled Minister's Fund. Therefore, it is not to be considered a retirement program.

2. The purpose of this fund shall be to render financial aid to any member in good standing. However, the need must be due to a physical disability.

3. This fund shall be managed by a board of directors consisting of five men, three of these will be ordained ministers and two church laymen. Board members will be appointed by the Association and will serve for a five year term. Each member's term will expire in a rotating manner that will require one new member to be appointed each year. Each member will serve his last year on the board in the position of board Chairman. It will be the responsibility of the board to manage this fund in such a way to provide the most return possible for the money we may have to invest. It will also be the responsibility of the board to budget the amount of money available to pay out each year. The amount to be used each year will be the amount of interest earned on the money invested.

4. Funding of this organization shall be done by requesting each member of the Conference to voluntarily take at least five dollars per week from his regular church contributions, or whatever amount God may direct him to give on a regular basis. This may be accomplished either by allowing the church the minister is pastoring to deduct the amount each week from his salary, and writing a check to the quarterly Conference for the amount deducted, or the ministers may bring their contributions to the conference. Anyone contributing to this fund will receive a receipt for their contribution. Churches are to be encouraged to take part in the support of this program as they feel God would have them to do. The funding of this program is never to be considered as dues to be paid, or a tax to be levied on the ministers or churches.

5. Qualification for financial help shall not be established at any given age, due to age alone. Financial help shall be given when properly applied for after the Investigating Committee has made a fair and impartial investigation. If the applicant is approved, the Investigating Committee has the authority to request help for the applicant up to the amount of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) without consulting the Board of Directors, providing an application has been completed for a record to be reviewed by the Board of Directors. Otherwise the Board of Directors will be consulted and said Board will determine the amount and method of financial help to be given. The Board may direct the amount to be paid in lump sum or monthly for the duration of the need. (Amended August 12, 1977)

6. A standard form application will be furnished by this organization. This application is to be properly completed by the Investigating Committee while the investigation is being conducted. Application for financial help may be requested by the individual in need, or by the church to which he belongs or may be pastoring.

Burial Fund

Article 1. This fund shall be known as the Jack's Creek Free Will Baptist Ministers Burial Fund.

Article 2. This fund has two levels of benefits to choose from: (A) For an annual premium of \$15.00, a member will receive \$500.00 of death benefits, and (B) For an annual premium of \$30.00, a member will receive \$1,000.00 of death benefits.

Article 3. Participation in this program is completely voluntary.

Article 4. Any minister, who is in good standing and a member of the Jack's Creek Ministers Conference, has the option to participate in this program, provided he makes that election within one year of the date he becomes a member of this Ministers Conference. His wife has the option to participate in this same program for the same benefits and the same annual premium. Her premiums will be in addition to his premiums.

Article 5. A membership application must be completed, signed, dated, and the first annual premium paid to be enrolled in this program.

Article 6. Annual premiums are due and payable in advance at the Ministers Conference held in conjunction with the Jack's Creek Free Will Baptist Association each year. On October 29, 1983, a motion was passed to give a 90 day grace period for paying the annual premium to the Burial Fund.

Article 7. Any minister, who fails to pay his annual premium, who withdraws from the Ministers Conference, or who is dismissed from the Ministers Conference, forfeits his rights to the benefits of this program. He is not entitled to a refund of any of the premiums paid into this Fund. If his wife is a member of this program, she forfeits her benefits and will not receive any refund of premiums paid.

Article 8. If the minister precedes his wife in death, she has the option to continue in this program as long as she conducts herself as a Christian, remains unmarried, and pays her annual premiums.

This program was established August 12, 1978. The second benefit level (B) was added August 8, 1980.
