The 15th annual session of the Jasper Freewill Baptist Association convened with Gum Springs Church, Marion county, Alabama, October 5th and 7th, 1901. The introductory sermnon was preached by Rev. William A. Nelson, Rev. J. J. Wesley, alternate. The text was 1st Timothy, 4th chapter, 16th verse.

After preaching, an intermission of one hour was taken for rest and refreshments; after which the ministers and delegates were requested to meet in the house, organize and proceed to business.

The Association met pursuant to adjournment. Singing by the congregation, prayer by Rev. L. F. Black. Rev. W. A Nelson, Moderator of the last session being present, called the house to order, and business was transacted as follows, viz:

1. Revs. J. J. Wesley and J. L. Conner were appointed reading clerks.

2. Letters from the churches are called for, handed in and read, and contents noted as per statistical table.

3. Called for petitionary letters, and opened the door for the reception of new churches into the body. Received letters from Pilgrim's Rest and Shady Grove churches. The letters were read, and after careful examination, it was found that the petitionary churches were organized on our Articles of Faith; that they are sound in doctrine, and werecommend that they be received into the Association.

On motion, it is agreed to receive Pilgrim's Rest and Shady Grove Churches into this Association, that the Moderator extend the right hand of fellowship, and that their names be enrolled on the minutes.

4. It was then agreed to permanently organize the body which was done by electing Rev. J. J. Wesley, Moderator; Bro. Robert Franks, Clerk, and Bro. John L. Conner Corresponding Secretary.

5. Called for correspondents from sister Associations and received the following: Little Brown's Creek represented by letter; Cullman Association represented by Rev. J. W. Riggs; Bear Creek Association represented by Bro. L T. Hopson and J. W. Alexander, These brethren were cordi-

ON DECEASED MINISTERS AND MEMBERS.

We your committee on deceased ministers and members submit the following report: Since our last Association death has taken from our midst Bro. John G. Williams, born July 15th, 1876, and died July 10th, 1901; aged 24 years, 11 months and 26 days. Sister Nancy J. May was born December 6th 1845, and died September 27th, 1901; aged 55 years. 11 months and 21 days. She was a member of Mt. Olive Church. Bro. Timothy McGuire, a member of Mt. Joy Church, died December 14th, 1900; aged 67 years, 8 months and 9 days. Bro. J. F. Files, a member of Beech Grove Church, died in the 70th year of his age. Sister S. J. Files, also a member of Beech Grove Church, died aged 23 years, 3 months and 18 days. Sister Mary A. Webb, a member of Pleasant Grove Church, died August 15th, 1901; aged about 67 years. Rev. Thomas D. Walker, a member of Mt. Hope Church, died December 23, 1900; aged 65 years, 10 months and 11 days. Sister Mary Oliver died April 20th. 1901; aged 18 years 5 months and 7 days. Sister Lucinda Rea, a member of Antioch Church, died March 2nd, 1901; aged 28 years. Sister A. L. Sticher, a member of Shady Grove Church, died December 1st 1900; age not given.

These have all died in the triumphs of a living faith, and while we mourn their loss, we feel that it is Heaven's gain.

RESOLVED 1 That we tender our sincere love and sympathy to the bereft churches and families in this the sad hour of their bereavements. And we bow in humble submission to the will of our Heavenly Father who doeth all things well. For we know that all things work together for good to them who love God. We recommend that all our churches make a careful report of the number of deaths, dates and ages of their deceased members during the associational year.

The deacons of the different churches have not reported any thing of disorderly conduct against any of our ministers; and therefore, we judge their characters to be good.

Resolved that any minister of this Association who is found guilty of circulating false reports by pen or otherwise on a brother minister, which is liable to injure his usefulness and destroy his influence, shall be guilty of a disciplinary offense, and after discipline has been used, if he does not show signs of true penitence and reformation, he shall be excommunicated from this Association, and published in our denominational paper.

On motion, it is agreed to adopt a financial system as we see the great need of such; and we recommend that each male member that belongs to the Jasper Association pay annually twenty five cents, and that those of the females that wish to pay anything can do so. This is in connection with the minute funds. And it is further understood that at our next Association we elect a regular Treasurer, to keep a true record of all the funds that is paid in; and also, how the same is paid out. These funds are to be disposed of by the Association through the Moderator and Clerk, being empowered by the body. Said money is to be used for no other purpose than for the building up of the Jasper Freewill Baptist Association. Such as aiding destitute and disabled ministers, poor widows and orphans.

On motion, the Association adjourned for preaching and refreshments, and to meet at 2 o'clock, p. m. Prayer by Rev. G. C. Elliott

On motion, it is agreed that each minister report annually the amount of money he receives, the number of miles traveled, the number of sermons preached, the number of prayers offered, the number of marriage ceremonies performed, the number of visits made to the sick and burial services attended during the associational year.

On motion, it is agreed that the Moderator appoint a Treasurer to fill the office; whereupon, Bro. Walter W. Nelson is appointed Treasurer.

On motion, it is agreed that in lieu of the standing committees on ministerial character, that the Deacons of the churches look after the preachers and report in their church letters to the Association their standing.

On motion, it is agreed that a collection be taken up for the benefit of Rev. J. W. Riggs of the Culman Association whose eye sight is very dim. The Association contributed liberally and the same was highly appreciated by the dear old brother.

On motion, it was agreed that members leaving any of our churches without letters of dismission, that we withdraw the hand of church fellowship from them. The following preamble and resolution was presented and unanimously adopted.

Whereas, the Jasper Association is without proper representation with her sister Associations, and feeling the great need of the spirit of union, which is essential to the furtherance of the cause of Christ, that we elect corresponding delegates and the following are elected:

Vernon Association-Brethren W. W. Nelson, F. B. Elliott and W. A. Smith.

Culman Association—Revs. W. A. Nelson, J. L. Conner, J. J. Wesley and Bro. Robert Franks.

North River Association-Brethren G. C. Pike, D. Z. Griffin and Joseph Atkins.

Little Brown's Creek-Revs. T. M. Canup, S. B. Ramsey and S. W. Brooks,

On motion, Rev. L. F. Black was granted a letter of recommendation to preach as an evangelist in and out of the bounds of this Association.

On motion, it was agreed to give Horse Creek Church a letter of dismission from this Association to become a member of the Culman Association at her own request.

Union Meetings for the associational year having proved to be a failure, it was by motion agreed to dispense with them for the next associational year. And we consider the business meeting previously named to meet with Mt. Olive Church, in lieu thereof.

On motion, it is agreed that the next session of this Association will meet with Mount Pleasant Church, eight miles North of Winfield station on the K. C. M. & B. Railroad; and that it convene Saturday before the first Sunday in October, 1902

On motion, Rev. G. C. Elliott is elected to preach the introductory sermon; Rev. R A. Nix, alternate.

On motion, it is agreed that the Articles of Faith, Constitution and Rules of Decorum be appended to the minutes.

On motion, it is agreed that the Clerk superintend the printing of the minutes, that the work be done at the BAPTIST REVIEW Job Office, Goldsboro, N. C. That the publisher be instructed to divide them among the cuurches according to their contributions; and that the Clerk be allowed five dollars for his services.

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On motion, a vote of thanks is given to Gum Springs Church and the citizens of this community, for kindness shown to members and visitors of the Association.

Ou motion, a vote of thanks is given to the officers of the Association for the faithful manner in which they have discharged their duty.

On motion, the Association adjourned to meet at the time and place above named Closing service conducted by the Moderator with feeling and appropriate remarks A hymn was sung and the parting hand was taken amid tears and shouts of joy.

ARTICLE 1. The Association shall be called to order by the Moderator who presided at the last session. Former Clerk also officiating until the body is fully organized.

2. The Association shall be opened and closed with singing and prayer.

3. The Moderator and Clerk shall be chosen by ballot at each session of the Association. A majority of votes by the delegates present elects.

4. The names of delegates from the different churches shall be enrolled and called as often as necessary during the session.

5. A majority of delegates shall rule in all cases, except in the reception of churches, then it shall be unanimous.

6. The Moderator shall not be entitled to vote, except in cases of a tie; and then he shall give the deciding vote. He shall be entitled to speak on any question after others have spoken, providing he appoints some one to the chair while he is speaking.

7. Only one person shall speak at the same time, and he shall arise and address the Moderator; and after recognition by the Moderator, proceed.

8. No brother shall be interrupted while speaking, unless he depart from the subject under discussion, or use words of personal reflection.

9. No person shall be allowed to speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the Association, nor more than fifteen minutes at a time.

RULES OF DECORUM.

10. No member shall laugh or talk during the time the debates are

CONSTITUTION.

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ARTCLE 1. This Association shall be known as the Jasper Freewill Baptist Association, of Ala., and being composed of delegates from the different churches forming the same, each church being entitled to three delegates.

2. This body shall be considered an advisory counsel, but having no authority over the affairs of the churches.

3. Each church in this Association shall be considered an advisory body, and shall control its own internal affairs in matters of discipline, &c It may however in extreme cases call aid from sister churches

4. All questions of doctrine and matters of general interest shall be settled by a two thirds vote of the Association, and the decision shall be final.

5. The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer, who shall be chosen at each session by a majority of votes.

6. This Association shall meet annually at such time and place as may be agreed upon by a previous annual session, and shall' not adjourn finally until all the business is transacted.

7. Churches wishing to become members of this Association must adopt its Articles of Faith and conform to its usages.

8. We agree as churches of this Association to use our best nfl uence to promote the interest of all moral and benevolent institutions, such as the Tempeance Cause, Sabbath School, Missionary Work, &c.

9. No member of this Association shall be eligible to the office of Moderator more than two successive sessions, unless no other member be competent to act in that capacity.

10. Any church of this Association failing to be represented for two years in succession, its name shall be dropped from our minutes.

OF GOD-ARTICLE 1., We believe there is on a, and but one, living and true God. Who is in personality the Father, Son and Holy Ghost. Equal and har monious in every Divine perfection.

OF FREE GRACE .- ART. 4. We believe that the grace of God comprehends all spiritual blessings. That the Gospel is the power of God unto Salvation. That the Holy Spirit not only reproves the world of sin, but is the means whereby sinners are converted and made wise unto Salvation.

OF PERSEVERANCE .- ART. 8. We do not believe under the Gospel dispensation, that any soul is elected to eternal life, unconditionally. But that those who by Faith persevere to the end will be saved That it is possible for men who have been converted, to "Make shipwreck of the Faith " turn again to sin and be finally lost.

OF GOOD WORK .- ART. 9. We believe that good work is the result of Faith and not of necessity. That those who have Faith will do works of righteousness: while those who have no Faith, cannot do anything pleasing or acceptable unto God .

OF CHRISTIAN BAPTISM,-ART. 10. We believe that Christian Baptism is the immersion in water of a believer in the names of the Father, Son and Holy Ghost. That Baptism cannot be Scripturally administered without Faith in the subject who receives it.

OF THE LORD'S SUPPER.-ART. 11. We believe the Supper was instituted by our Saviour as a commemorative ordinance. That the bread and wine represent His body and blood. That it was instituted for Christians, and that all Christians should unite in observing that sacred service, regardless of names or denominational distinctions.

OF THE SOUL-ART. 12. We believe that man is a living soul. That the body will die, but that the soul is immortal. That death is the separation of the mortal and immortal parts of human beings.

OF THE RESURRETION -- ART. 13. We believe in the resurrection of the dead. When the resurrection shall take place the soul and body will reunite and form an immortal being That the righteous will be received into a state of everlasting happiness, to reign with God forever and ever. "But the wicked will be bound hand and foot, and cast into outer darkness. The wicked are driven away in their wickedness, but the righteous have hope in heir death."

ARTICLES OF FAITH.

OF THE HOLY SCRIPFURES .- ART. 2. We believe that God is the Author of the Holy Bible; and that its teachings constitute the only infallible doctrine for the government of His church.

OF ORIGINAL APOSTASY.-ART. 3. We believe that Adam was created holy; but by voluntary transgression fell into depravity, and consequently involved his posterity in sin.

OF CHRISTIAN FAITH .- ART 5. We believe that Christian Faith is belief in Jesus Christ as the Son of God and Redeemer of the world, and we believe in the inspiration of the Holy Scriptures. That "Faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the Word of God."

OF REPENTANCE.-ART. 6. We believe that repentance is sorrow for sin and the kind of sorrow which constitutes godly repentance, must be preceded by effectual conviction for sin.

OF FREE AGENCY .- ART. 7. We believe that the human will is free, and that men have ability to accept or reject the conditions of salvation as they are revealed in the Holy Scriptures.
