

PROCEEDINGS

The Thirty-third Annual Session of the Jasper Free Will Baptist Association, convened with Liberty church, Marion county, Ala., October 4, 5, and 6, 1919. The introductory sermon was preached by Rev. J. B. Ford. Text: Hebrews 12:1. After preaching, an intermission of one hour was taken for refreshments after which the ministers and delegates were requested by the moderator of meet in the house. They organized and proceeded to business.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

The Association met pursuant to the moderator's request (Rev. J. L. Connor). Singing by the congregation. Prayer by Rev. J. W. Porter of the Vernon Association. The moderator called the house to order and business was transacted as follows:

1. Brethren J. L. Eads and W. M. Fowler were appointed reading

clerks.

2. Letters from the different churches were called for, handed in and read, and contents noted. (See statistical table.)

3. Called for petitionary letters. No churches were received.

4. On motion it was agreed to permanently organize the body, which was done by electing Rev. J. L. Conner, Moderator; Fred B. Elliott, Secretary, and W. J. Underwood, Treasurer.

5. Called for correspondence from sister associations. Received and

seated the following:

From the Vernon Association:-Rev. J. W. Porter.

From the State Line:—Revs. H. Howell, J. K. Boyette. These brethren were cordially received, and the moderator and clerk extended to them the right hand of fellowship.

6. On motion the moderator appoint all the committees. The fol-

lowing committees were appointed.

7. On Preaching:—Brethren James Thorp, Robert Franks, and A. J. Ingle together with the deacons of Liberty church.

8. On Documents and Order of Business:—Revs. W. D. Martin, B. N. Roberts, J. R. Ford with the Moderator and Clerk.

9. On Sabbath Schools:-H. R. Mink, Chairman.

10. On Literature:—Robert Bostic, J. B. Keeton, and J. B. Smith.
11. On Deceased Ministers and Members:—Rev. B. M. Adkins,
Chairman.

12. On Finance:—Brethren Robert Franks, J. T. White, E. D. Flury.
13. On Associational Funds:—Brethren J. A. Keeton, J. W. Elliott,

and J. M. Underwood.

14. Preaching committee report that Rev. P. T. Keeton preach on Saturday night. Rev. J. L. Conner is to conduct a memorial service in bonor and respect to our beloved brother in Christ, Rev. E. C. Thomas, deceased. Sunday morning, October 5, Rev. J. W. Porter to preach at 11 o'clock. Extended report of the committee:—No preaching on Saturday night; Rev. P. T. Keeton to preach on Sunday night; Rev. W. D. Martin to preach on Monday 6th, at 11 o'clock, A. M.

On motion, the association adjourned by singing, prayer and benediction, until Monday morning, October 6, 1919.

ORDER OF SERVICE SUNDAY.

On Sunday morning the memorial service in honor of Rev. E. C.

Thomas, deceased, was opened and conducted by Rev. J. L. Conner. Many of the brother ministers arose and made known their respects for Rev. E. C. Thomas, deceased. Very feeling and appropriate songs were sung by the congregation, led by Rev. B. N. Roberts. At 11 o'clock, Rev. J. W. Porter preached a very interesting sermon to a large and well behaved congregation. Immediately after this, the communion was conducted by the moderator, Rev. J. L. Conner. Singing and the benediction closed the Sunday morning service.

Sunday night Rev. P. T. Keeton preached an interesting sermon to a large and well behaved concourse of people, using as a text, Rev. 6:17. "For the great day of his wrath is comt and who shall be able to stand?" Benediction. This closed the order of service on Sunday.

MONDAY MORNING PROCEEDINGS.

The association met pursuant to adjournment. After singing and prayer, the Moderator, Rev. J. L. Conner, called the body to order. The clerk was authorized to call the roll. The ministers and delegates present answered to their names.

Delegates are noted in statistical table.

The moderator announced a quorum present and the association ready for business.

Reports of committees were called for in regular order. They were adopted as follows:

On Documents and Order of Business.

Section 1. We, your committee on Documents and Order of Business, beg leave to report as follows:-We find three petitionary letters for the next session of this association, and we leave it to the body to say where it shall be held.

Sec. 2... We recommend that the clerk superintend the printing of the minutes and that he have the work done to the best advantage. That he have \$7.50 for his services, same to be paid out of the minute funds.

Sec. 3. That the Moderator have \$6.00 for his services, same to be paid out of the Associational funds; Treasurer have \$5.00 for his services, same to be paid out of the Associational funds.

Sec. 4. That this Association pay the sum of \$150.00 for the balance due on the house and lot bought at Guin, Ala. Same to be paid at this setting of the association. For contract, see section 4a.

Sec. 5. That the name of the Rev. H. J. Hicks be placed on our

minutes as an ordained minister.

Sec. 4a. We recommend that the Association buy the property described in the contract of the Building Committee of the Masonic Fraternity of the first part, and Rev. W. D. Martin and Robert Franks, parties of the second part. Said property being in the town of Guin, Ala., Marion county. That the deed of said property be made to the Jasper Free Will Baptist Association, and that we pay \$150.00 this year, 1918, and \$150.00 one year hence, 1919. The above is the price stipulated in the contract.

Sec. 6. That the following named brethren be ordained at this setting of the association, viz.; Chesley L. Paunders, John Tucker, L. E.

Beasley, O. C. Rich.

Sec. 7. We further recommend that the Presbytery, composed of Revs. W. D. Martin, M. B. Martin, and J. k. Ford examine as to their knowledge of the doctrine and government of our denomination.

Sec. 8. That Rev. P. T. Keeton be restored as an ordained minister, and that his name be placed on our minutes as such. The above sections were all adopted. REV. W. D. MARTIN, Chairman.

Sec. 4a. Insertion to show contract involved on Literature.

We, your Committe on Literautre report as follows: We recommend the use of Free Will Baptist Literature in our Sabbath Schools, together with the prayerful study of the Holy Bible. We urge each church to procure good literature from the Free Will Baptist of Ayden, N. C.

On Sabbath Schools.

We, your committee on Sabbath Schools beg leave to submit the following report: By investigation we find six Sabbath Schools in our Association. They are at the following named churches: Shady Grove, Liberty, Union Hill, Pleasant Hill, Guin Chapel, and Pearce's Chapel. We find that the interest for Sabbath Schools is not what it should be. We recommend that our ministers or pastors of our churches earnestly urge the cause of Sabbath Schools in our churches, and that they preach one or more sermons each year on the subject of Sabbath Schools.

We recommend that each church organize a Sabbath School. That

each pastor aid, assist and insist that the same be done.

We further recommend that the work of the Sabbath Schools be reported in the form of a Statistical Table and be printed in the minutes of the Association.

MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS.

Resolved 1. That any minister of this association that is found guilty of circulating false reports, by pen or otherwise on a brother minister, which is liable to impair and destroy his influence, shall be deemed guilty of a disciplinary offence, and after discipline has been use, if he does not show signs of penitence, he shall be excommunicated from the association and published in our denominational papers.

2. It is agreed to retain a financial system as we se the great need of such, and we recommend that each member of this association pay annually 50c in connection with the minute funds; and we ask all of our minis-

ters to use their best efforts in the collection of these funds.

And it is further understood that our Treasurer keep a true record of all funds paid in, and how the same are paid out, such funds to be disposed of through the Moderator and Clerk, being authorized by the Association, such funds to be used for no other purpose than the building up of the Jasper Free Will Baptist Association, i. e. aiding distressed and disabled ministers and poor widows and orphans.

3. Be it Resolved, That members shall not hold their membership out of the church over one year after date, and they are under the jurisdiction

of the church to which they belong.

4. Be it Resolved, That any minister of the Jasper Free will Baptist Association who desires to set forth the full functions of the Gospel, the same shall be made known to the Annual Association by a recommendation from the church or churches to which they belong. And if on examination they be found worthy, the association shall ordain them, but all ordinations must be done at the annual associations.

5. On motion, it was agreed that each minister report annually the amount of money he has received, the number of miles travelled, the number of sermons preached, the number of public prayers offered, the number of marriage ceremonies performed, the number of visits made to the sick,

and the burial services attended during the Associational year.

6. The following preamble and resolution was presented and adopted: Whereas, the Jasper Free Will Baptist Association is without proper representation with her sister associations, and feeling the great need of the cause of Christ that we elect corresponding delegates. The following were elected, to wit:

To Bear Creek Association:—Bro. R. M. Mullins, and Rev. J. R. Ford. Little Brown Creek Association:—Bro. J. T. Thorp, Rev. B. N. Roberts. Vernon Association:—Rev. J. C. Conner, Bro. Robert Franks.

Morning Star Association:—Rev. J. L. Conner, Rev. W. D. Martin.

Tennessee River Association:-Bro. Robert Franks.

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7. On motion that the Ordaining Council, to-wit: Rev. W. D. Martin, Rev. J. R. Ford, and Rev. M. R. Martin, ordain and set forth to the full functions of the Gospel, Revs. John Tucker, O. C. Rich, L. E. Beasley, and C. L. Pounders, and that the Segretary be authorized to write the above named brethren their credentials.

8. On motion it is agreed to hold the next session of this association with Pleasant Ridge church, Itawamba county, Miss., two miles west of Red Bay, Ala., on the I. C. R. R. Same to convene on Saturday before the

First Sunday in October, 1920.

9. On motion Rev. M. R. Martin was elected to preach the introduc-

tory sermon and Rev. B. N. Roberts is his alternate.

10. On motion it is agreed to reimburse Bro. Robert Franks with \$6.00.

11. On motion it is agreed that the Articles of Faith, Constitution and Rules of Decorum of the Jasper Free Will Baptist Association be appended to the minutes.

12. On motion it is agreed that the Secretary superintend the printing of the Minutes and have the work done to the best advantage, and that

he be allowed \$7.50 for his services.

13. On motion, Be it Resolved, That the Jasper Free Will Baptist Association, assembled at Liberty church, Marion county, Ala., tender its thanks to the church and surrounding community, and in a special manner to the ladies and good sisters for their hospitality, and to the young people for their good behavior; and to the officers for their faithful services during this session of the association.

RULES OF DECORUM.

Article 1. The Association shall be called to order by the Moderator who presided at the last session; former Clerk also officiating until the body is fully organized.

Art. 2. The Association shall be opened and closed with singing and

prayer.

Art. 3. The Moderator and Clerk shall be chosen by ballot at each session of the Association. A majority of votes by the delegates present elects.

Art. 4. The names of delegates from the different churches shall be enrolled and called as often as necessary during the session.

Art. 5. A majority of delegates present shall rule in all cases except

the reception of members, then it shall be unanimous.

Art. 6. The Moderator shall not be entitled to vote, except in case of a tie, and then he shall give the deciding vote. He shall also speak on any question after others have spoken, provided he appoint some one to the chair while he is speaking.

Art. 7. Only one person shall speak at the same time, and he shall rise and address the Moderator, and after recognition by the Moderator,

proceeed.

Art. 8. No brother shall be interrupted while speaking, unless he depart from the subject under discussion, or use words of personal reflection. Art. 9. No person shall be allowed to speak more than twice on the

same subject without leave of the Association, nor more than fifteen minutes at a time.

Art. 10. No person shall laugh or talk during the time the debates are

going on.

Art. 11. No member shall absent himself from the Association without have of the Moderator.

CONSTITUTION.

Article 1. This Association shall be known as the Jasper Free Will Baptist Association of Alabama, and being composed of ministers and delegates from the different churches forming the same, and each church being Lititled to three delegates.

Art. 2. This body shall be considered an advisory council.

Art. 3. All questions of doctrine and matters of general interest shall be decided by a two-thirds vote of the Association, and the decision shall be final.

Art. 4. The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer, which shall be chosen by a majority vote at each session of the Association.

Art. 5. The Association shall meet annually at such time and place as may be agreed upon by a previous annual session and shall not adjourn finally, until all the business is transacted.

Art. 6. Churches wishing to become members of this Association must

adopt its Articles of Faith and conform to its usages.

Art. 7. We agree as churches of this Association to use our best influence to promote the interest of all moral and benevolent institutions, Art. 8. No member of this Association shall be eligible to the office of Moderator more than two successive sessions, unless no other member be competent to act in that capacity.

Art. 9. Any church of this Association, failing to be represented for two years in succession, the same shall be dropped from our minutes.

ARTICLES OF FAITH.

OF GOD.—Article 1. We believe there is one, and but one living and true God. Who is in personality, the Father, the Son and Holy Ghost. Equal and harmonious in every Divine perfection.

OF THE HOLY SCRIPTURES.—Art. 2. We believe that God is the Author of the Holy Bible, and that its teachings constitutes the only infall-

ible doctrine for the government of his church.

OF ORIGINAL APOSTASY .- Art. 3. We believe that Adam was created holy; but by voluntary transgression fell into depravity, and con-

sequently involved his posterity in sin.

OF FREE GRACE.—Art. 4. We believe that the Grace of God comprehends all spiritual blessings. That the Gospel is the power of God unto salvation. That the Holy Spirit not only reproves the world of sin, but is the means whereby sinners are converted, regenerated and saved.

OF CHIRSTIAN FAITH.—Art. 5. We believe that Christian Faith is belief in Jesus Christ as the Son of God and Redeemer of the world, and we believe in the inspiration of the Holy Scriptures. That "Faith comes

by hearing and hearing by the Word of God."

OF REPENTANCE.—Art. 6. We believe that Repentance is sorrow for sin, and the kind of sorrow which constitutes godly repentance must be preceded by effectual conviction for sin.

OF FREE AGENCY.—Art. 7. We believe that the human will is free, and that men have ability to accept or reject the conditions of salvation as

they are revealed in the Holy Scriptures.

OF PERSEVERANCE.—Art. 8. We do not believe the Gospel dispensation that any soul is elected to eternal life unconditionally; but those who by faith persevere to the end will be saved. That it is possible for men who have been converted, to "Make shipwreck of the Faith," turn again to sin and be finally lost!

OF GOOD WORK.—Art. 9. We believe that good work is the result of Faith, and not of necessity. That those who have Faith will do works of righteousness; while those who have no Faith can not do anything pleas-

ing or acceptable unto God.

OF CHRISTIAN BAPTISM.—Art. 10. We believe that Christian Baptism is the immersion in water of a believer in the names of the Father, Son and Holy Ghost. That baptism cannot be Scripturally administered

without Faith in the subject who receives it.

OF THE LORD'S SUPPER.—Art. 11. We believe the Supper was instituted by our Savior as a commemorative ordinance. That the bread and wine represent his body and blood. That it was instituted for Christians and that all Christians should unite in observing that sacred service, regardless of names or denominational distinctions.

OF THE SOUL.—Art. 12. We believe that man is a living soul. That the body will die, but that the soul is immortal. That death is the

separation of the mortal and immortal parts of human beings.

OF THE RESURRECTION.—Art. 13. We believe in the Resurrection of the dead. When the resurrection shall take place the soul and body will reunite and form an immortal being. That the righteous will be received into a state of everlasting happiness, to reign with God forever and ever. But the wicked will be bound hand and foot and be cast into outer darkness. "The wicked are driven away in their wickedness, but the righteous have hope in their death."
