OF  
THE 35th ANNUAL SESSION  
JASPER FREEWILL BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

The thirty-fifth annual session of the Jasper Freewill Baptist Association convened with Mount Pleasant church, Marion county, Alabama October 1, 2, 3, 1921. The introductory sermon was preached by Rev. L. E. Beasley followed by Rev. M. R. Martin, text used: Matt. 5:47—"What do ye more than others." After preaching an intermission of about one hour was taken for refreshments.

OCTOBER 1. SATURDAY EVENING

The house was called to order for business by the Moderator, Rev. M. R. Martin, at 1:30; singing by the choir; and prayer by Rev. M. R. Martin, after which the Moderator announced the Association ready for business, which was transacted as follows:

The Moderator appointed Bro. W. M. Fowler and Rev. J. L. Conner reading clerks.

Letters from the various churches were handed in, read and the names of the delegates, ministers, and standing committees were enrolled.

Called for petitionary letters whereupon Brilliant Chapel presented a letter asking admittance into the association, and upon examination, was found to have organized on the Articles of Faith of the Jasper Freewill Baptist Association, was received into the association and delegates names enrolled. The Moderator and Clerk extended them the right hand of fellowship.

Motion the Association go into an election for Moderator, Clerk, and Treasurer, which was done and Rev. B. M. Atkins was elected Moderator, Fred E. Elliot Clerk, and Bro. W. J. Underwood Treasurer.

The newly elected officers took their seats and business was transacted in the following way:

Called for correspondence from sister associations. The following were received Rev. H. Howell from the State Line Association; Brethren W. Archie Keeton and Man Robins from the Morning Star Association.

Motion that the Moderator appoint all committees, they were appointed as follows:

Committee on preaching: Brethren J. T. Tharp, J. M. Underwood, W. M. Fowler, with the deacons of this church.

On document and order of business: Rev. J. L. Conner, Rev. W. D. Martin, Bro. E. A. Frederick, with the Moderator and Clerk.

On Sabbath Schools:—Rev. Jonh Tucker, G. C. Webb, K. M. Pollard.

On Literature:—Rev. J. R. Ford, Lee Conner, J. W. Roberson, R. Gardener.

On deceased Ministers and Members:—Rev. P. T. Keeton, Rev. A. L. Warren, Bro. Harve Mays.

Committee on Finance:—John R. Franks, L. Mann, J. T. White, M. N. Mays.

Committee on preaching reported Rev. A. R. Lawler preach to-night, Rev. J. R. Williams alternate. Rev. J. J. Wesley preach tomorrow at 9:00 o'clock. Rev. P. T. Keeton at 11:00 o'clock. Rev. G. W. Flippo tomorrow night.

Saturday night Rev. A. R. Lawler preached, text used: Jonah 1:6, followed by Rev. J. R. Williams.

### ORDER OF SERVICE SUNDAY

Rev. H. Howell preached, text used Psalms 8:4. At 11 o'clock Rev. P. T. Keeton preached, text used Luke 22:19; 1st. Cor. 11:24—"This do in remembrance of me." After which the Lord's supper was set forth and many partook of the emblems, also many of the brethren and sisters washed feet.

Sunday night Rev. G. W. Flippo preached. Text used: Luke 22:21—"But behold the hand of him that betrayeth me is with me on the table."

Monday morning October 3rd., about 8:00 o'clock the house was called to order by the Moderator; Rev. B. M. Atkins; song by the congregation; and prayer by Rev. J. R. Ford.

The names of delegates, ministers and standing committee were called after which the Moderator announced a quorum present and the house ready for business.

Called for the reading of Saturday's and Sunday's proceedings which was read and adopted as read.

Motion that Bro. Henry Shelnut be seated as a corresponding delegate from Vernon Association.

Motion that Bro. T. A. Fisher of the M. E. Church be seated.

Committees were requested to retire from the house and formulate their reports. Singing was conducted by the choir during the absence of the committee after which the committee on preaching reported Rev. J. J. Wesley to preach at 11:00 o'clock, Rev. A. L. Warren alternate.

On motion the association adjourned for preaching and refreshments.

Rev. J. J. Wesley preached. Text used Numbers 22:34—"I have sinned." Rev. A. L. Warren followed by prayer after an intermission of about one hour the house was called to order by the Moderator; songs by the congregation and prayer by Rev. L. E. Beasley.

By motion the report was read by sections and adopted as amended..

We your committee on documents and order of business beg leave to report as follows:

We find one petitionary letter for the next session of this association. We recommend that the next session be held with Shady Grove church.

We recommend that the clerk superintend the printing of the minutes and he have \$6.00 for his service, paid out of the minute funds, and that the Moderator have \$5.00 for his services as Moderator, paid out of the associational funds.

We recommend that the deed to Guin chapel church be kept in the hands of the treasurer of the association.

We recommend that each male member of this association pay annually twenty five cents associational funds.

We recommend a ministers and deacons meeting.

We recommend that Bro. G. B. Ford and Brother I. H. Hollis be examined and ordained if found worthy.

We recommend that no excluded members be received from other churches without proper signs of repentance.

ON SABBATH SCHOOLS—We your committee on Sabbath Schools beg leave to submit the following:

By investigation we find ten churches have Sabbath schools, to-wit: Free Water, Union Hill, Gum Springs, Mt. Pleasant, Mt. Olive, Shady Grove, Guin Chapel, Union Chapel, Pleasant Hill, Brilliant Chapel. We find the Sabbath schools are not what they should be. We recommend that all our ministers urge the cause of Sabbath schools in our churches.

We recommend that those who are pastors of churches preach one or more sermons on the importance of Sabbath schools and that they aid and insist that Sabbath schools be organized in their churches.

We recommend that the work be reported in the form of a statistical table and be printed in the minutes.

## MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS

1. Resolved that any minister of this association that is found guilty of circulating false reports by pen or otherwise

on a brother minister which is liable to impair or destroy his influence shall be deemed guilty of a disciplinary offence, and after discipline has been used if he does not show sign of repentance he shall be excommunicated from the association and published in our denominational papers.

2. It is agreed to retain a financial system. We recommend that each male member pay twenty-five cents annually as associational funds.

3. Be it resolved that no minister of this association accept the baptism of any ordained minister.

4. Be it resolved that members shall not hold their membership out of the church over one year after date, and that they are still under the jurisdiction of the church to which they belong.

5. Be it resolved: That any minister of the Jasper Free-will Baptist Association who desires to set forth the full functions of the Gospel the same shall be made known to the annual association by a recommendation from the church or churches to which they belong, and if on examination they be found worthy the association shall ordain them, but all ordinations must be done at the annual association.

6. By motion it is agreed to discontinue the ministers' reports.

7. By motion it is agreed that the Moderator appoint corresponding delegates to our sister associations, whereupon the following were appointed:

To the Little Brown Creek Association, Bro. J. T. Tharp, Rev. P. T. Keeton, and Bro. J. A. Keeton; Vernon Association, Rev. E. R. Franks, Rev. J. L. Conner, Rev. L. E. Beasley; State Line Association, Rev. J. J. Wesley, Rev. A. L. Warren, J. L. Eads.

8. By motion it is agreed to examine Bro. I. H. Hollis and G. B. Ford for ordination and if found worthy ordain them at this session of the association. By motion it was agreed that the Moderator appoint a presbytery to examine Bro. J. H. Hollis and Bro. G. B. Ford and if found worthy to proceed to ordain them.

The Moderator appointed Rev. J. J. Wesley, Rev. W. D. Martin, Rev. J. R. Ford, as a presbytery. At the request of Bro. G. B. Ford it was granted by motion that his ordination be withheld at this session. The presbytery proceeded to examine Bro. J. H. Hollis, found him worthy and ordained him.

9. By a rising vote it is agreed that Poplar Log have the ministers and deacons' meeting. By motion it is agreed that it

convene Saturday before the second Sunday in May, 1922, Rev. J. J. Wesley to preach the introductory sermon.

By motion it is agreed that the Articles of Faith, Constitution, and Rules of Decorum of the Jasper Freewill Baptist Association be appended to our minutes.

11. By motion it is agreed the next session of this association be held with Shady Grove church, 7 miles north of Hackleburg on the I. C. R. R., the same to convene Saturday before the first Sunday in October, 1922. Rev. A. L. Warren to preach the introductory sermon.

12. On motion it is resolved that this, the Jasper Freewill Baptist Association assembled at Mt. Pleasant, Marion County, Alabama, do hereby tender our sincere thanks to the officers and delegates of this august body, and to the good sisters and community at large, our deepest love and respect for their kindness and friendship toward us. We will long remember you.

12. Motion that the Moderator appoint delegates to the State convention to be held with Mt. Olive church, whereupon the following were appointed: Brethren W. A. Smith, J. W. Roberson, and J. A. Nelson.

14. On motion the Association adjourned to meet at the time and place mentioned above.

15. Song by the congregation and prayer by Bro. F. A. Fisher of the M. E. Church. Then the parting hand was taken mingled with tears of Christian love and affection. Then the benediction closed this session of the association.

## CONSTITUTION

Article 1. This Association shall be known as the Jasper Freewill Baptist Association of Alabama, and being composed of ministers and members and delegates from the different churches from the same, each church being entitled to three delegates.

Art. 2. This body shall be considered an advisory council.

Art. 3 All questions of doctrine and matters of general interest shall be settled by a two-thirds vote of the Association, and the decision shall be final.

Art. 4. The officers of this association shall be a Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer, which shall be chosen by a majority vote at each session of the Association.

Art. 5. This Association shall meet annually at such a time

and place as may be agreed upon by a previous annual session, and shall not adjourn finally until all the business is transacted.

Art. 6. Churches wishing to become members of this association must adopt its Articles of Faith and conform to its usages.

Art 7. We agree as churches of this Association to use our best influence to promote the interest of all moral and benevolent institutions, such as the Temperance Cause, Sunday Schools, Missionary work,, etc.

Art. 8. No member of this Association shall be eligible to the office of Moderator more than two successive sessions unless no other member be competent to act in that capacity.

Art. 9. Any church of this Association failing to be represented for two years in succession, its name will be dropped from our minutes.

## ARTICLES OF FAITH

ARTICLE 1. Of God.—We believe that there is one and only one, living and true God, who is in personality the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, equal and harmonious in every divine perfection.—I Timothy 2:5.

ART. 2. Of the Holy Scriptures—We believe that God is the author of the Holy Bible, and that its teachings constitute the only infallible doctrine for the government of His church.—2nd. Timothy 3:16.

ART. 2. Of the Apostasy—We believe that Adam was created holy, but by voluntary transgression fell into depravity, and consequently involved his posterity in sin.—Genesis 3:6.

ART. 4. Of Free Grace—We believe the grace of God comprehends all spiritual blessings; that the gospel is the power of God unto salvation; that the Holy Spirit, not only reproves the world of sin, but is the means whereby sinners are converted unto salvation.—Romans 16:12.

ART. 5. Of Christian Faith—We believe that Christian faith is belief in Jesus Christ as the Son of God and redeemer of the world, and we believe in the inspiration of the Holy Scriptures that "faith comes by hearing and hearing by the word of God.—John v:3.

ART. 6. Of Repentance—We believe that repentance is sorrow for sin, and the kind of sorrow which constitutes Godly repentance must be preceded by effectual conviction of sin.—2 Corinthians 7-9-10.

ART. 7. Of Free Agency—We believe that the human will is free and that men have ability to accept or reject the



conditions of salvation as they are revealed in the Holy Scriptures.—Micah 6:8.

ART. 9. Of Preservance—We do not believe under the Gospel dispensation that any soul is elected to eternal life unconditionally, but that those who by faith persevere to the end will be saved, that it is possible for men who have been converted to "make shipwreck of the faith," turn again to sin and be finally lost.—Luke 9:62.

ART. 9. Of Good Work—We believe that good work is the result of faith and of necessity; that those who have faith will do works of righteousness, while those who have no faith cannot do anything pleasing unto God.—Matt. 7-19-20.

ART. 10. Of Christian Baptism — We believe that Christian Baptism is the immersion in water of a believer in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Ghost; that baptism cannot be scripturally administered without faith in the subject who receives it.—Romans 6:4.

ART. 11. Of The Lord's Supper—We believe that the Supper was instituted by our Savior as a commemorative ordinance: that the bread and wine represent His body and blood; that it was instituted for Christians and all Christians should unite in observing that sacred service, regardless of name or denominational distinction; we also believe that the saints ought to wash each other's feet.—1 Cor. 11-28-29.

ART. 12. Of the Soul—We believe that man is a living soul, that the body will die, but the soul is immortal; that death is the separation of the mortal and immortal parts of the body.—Genesis 2-7.

ART. 13. Of the Resurrection—We believe in the resurrection of the dead; when the resurrection shall take place the soul and body will unite and form an immortal being; that the righteous will be received into a state of everlasting happiness to reign with God forever and ever; "but the wicked will be bound hand and foot and cast into outer darkness;" the wicked are driven away in their wickedness, but the righteous have hope in their death.—John 5-28-29.

#### RULES OF DECORUM

1. This Association shall be called to order by the Moderator who presided at the last session, former Clerk will also officiate until the body is fully organized.
2. The Association shall be opened and closed by singing and prayer.
3. The Moderator and Clerk shall be chosen by ballot

at each session of the Association, a majority of the votes by the delegates present elects.

4. The names of the delegates from the different churches shall be enrolled and called as often as necessary during the session.

5. A majority of delegates present shall rule in all cases except in the reception of churches, then it shall be unanimous.

6. The Moderator shall not be entitled to vote except in case of a tie, and then he shall give the deciding vote. He shall be entitled to speak on any question after others have spoken, provided he appoint someone to the chair while he is speaking.

7. Only one person shall speak at a time, who shall rise and address the moderator.

8. No brother shall be interrupted while speaking unless he departs from the subject under discussion, or use words of personal reflection.

9. No person shall be allowed to speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the Association, nor more than 15 minutes at a time.

10. No person shall laugh or talk during the time the debates are going on.

11. No member shall absent himself from the Association without leave of the Moderator.
