Proceedings of the 42nd session of the Jasper Free Will Baptist Association which convened with Mt. Olive Church, Marion County Alabama, October 6 and 8, 1928.

Song by choir, prayer by Eld. Tom Britt, the introductory sermon was preached by Rev. J. J Wesley, Text Matt. 16: 19. After preaching intermission one hour for dinner.

Evening Session, Oct. 6

Song by choir, praver by Rev. A. L. Warren the former Moderator Rev. Joe S. Fredrick being present called the body to order and bus iness was transacted as follows.

1st The Moderator appointed Revs. Grady Williams and J. O. Jones reading clerks.

2nd Called for letters from the churches they were handed in and read and contents noted as per statstical table,

At 9 o'clock, after song and prayer, Rev. W. C. Austin preached to a large and attentive audience. Text, "Go Foward,"

At 11 o'clock, Rev. A. L. Warren. Moderator preached to a very large audience. Text, 1st Peter 3;18. After which the Lords Supper was served and all Christians were invited to commune with us and the Ordinance of feet washing was prepared and a great many participated in washing each others feet amid much tears and shouting. Rev. Tom Britt preached to a large crowd in the graveyard at 11 o'-clock. Text Matt. 16-26.

Sunday night at 7:30 after song and prayer Rev. P. T. Keeton preached te a large audience, Text 1st. Sam. 26-21.

Monday Morning Session

The Association met persuant to adjournment, song by choir prayer by Rev. P. T. Keeton.

There being a quorum present the Moderator called the bidy to order ready for buisness.

1. Reports of committies was called for in regular order and presented as follows.

On Document and Order of Business

- 1. We recomend that this Associaton meet on Saturday before the 1st Sunday in October 1929, at the place designated by the assembley of this session.
- 2. We recommend that the next session of the Association meet next with Red Bay, Church.
- 3. We recommend that each minister make annual report each year of his work.
- 4. We recommend that Rev. M. R. Martin, have \$15.00 out of the the Association funds.
- 5. We recommend that the Clerk have \$10.00 out of Minut: funds for his service.
- 6. We recommend that the Moderator hava \$5.00 for his service out of Associational funds.
 - 7. We recommend the ordination of Bro. J. R. Benson.
- 8. We recommend that Free Water Church have \$15.00 out of Association funds for reconstruction work on church.
- 9. We recommend that Brilliant Chappel Church have \$15.00 on building new church when work begins.
- 10. We recommend that we release committie on ministers caractor and a new committee be apointed on the account of old age of some of the committee and death of some.
 - 11. We recommend that a Ministers and Deacons meeting be

held at Shady Grove, at 11 o'clock on Friday, Saturday and Sunday the 3rd in June 1929 and Rev. B. M. Atkins preach introductory sermon.

- 12. We recommend that each church send one or two deacons as delegates to Ministers Meeting.
- 13. We recommend that the pastors at each church in the Association make an effort to collect 25 cents from each male member of their churches for Association funds.
- 14. We recommend that the Moderator appoint Delegates to State Meeting.
- 15. We recommend that the pastor of the church and the clerk of same where the Association convenes have delegates assigned to the verious homes of the comunity,
- 16. We recommend that our constitution be appended to our minute.
- 17. We recommend that an ammendment to our constitution to be known as section 10 that all of our Licened and Ordained Ministers and standing committees are standing delegates of the Jasper Free Will Baptist Association.

By pen or otherwise, on a brother Minister which is liable to impair and destroy his influence shall be deemed guilty of deciplinary offence. After deciplin has been used, if he does not show signs of penitence he shall be excommunicated from the Association, and published in our denominational literature

7th. It is agreed to retain a financial system, as we see the great need of suc 1.

We recommend that each member of this Association pay annualy 50 cents in conection with the minute funds. Ask all our Ministers to use their best efforts in collecting these funds, and it is futher understood that our treasurer keep a true record of all funds paid in and how the same is paid out; such funds to be disposed of through the Moderator and Clerk being authorized by the Association. Said funds to be used to no other purposees than the up building of the Jasper Free Will Baptist Association i, e, aiding distressed and disable ministers and poor widows and orphans.

8th. Be it resolved, that members shall not hold their membership out of the church over one year after date, and they are under Jurisdiction of the church to which they belong,

9th. Be it resolved that any Minister of the Jasper Free Will Baptist Association who desires to set forth the full functions of the Gospel, the same shall be made known so the Association by recommendation from the church or churches to which they belong If on examination they are found worthy, the Association may ordain them. But all Ordinations must be done at the Annual Association.

10th. Be it resolved that we will not accept the Baptism of any unordained minister.

11th. By motion our Articles of Faith and Rules of Decorum and Constitution be appended to our Minutes.

12th. On motion the Association adjourned to meet at the time and place above named.

Articles Of Faith

Article 1. OF GOD---We believe there is one. And but one living and true God. Who is in personality the Father the Son and Holy Ghost; equal and harmonious in every Devine perfection,

Article 2. OF THE HOLY SCRIPTURES --- We believe that

God is the Author of the Holy Bible and that its teachings construe the only infallible doctrine of the government of His church.

Article 3. OF ORIGINAL APOSTASY -- We believe that Adam was created Holy: but by voluntarly transgression fell into depravity. And consequently involved his posterity in sin.

Article 4. OF FREE GRACE---We believe that the grace of God comprehends all spiritual blessings. That the Gospel is the power of God unto salvation. That the Holy Spirit not only reproved the world of sin but is the means whereby sinner are converted, regenerated and saved.

Article 5. OF CHRISTIAN FAITH .-- We believe that Christian Faith is belief in Jesus Christ as the Son of God and Redeemer of the world. And we believe in the inspiration of the Holy Scriptures. That Faith come hearing and believing, by the Word of God.

Article 6. OF REPENTANCE --- We believe that Repentance it soriow for sin and the kind of sorrow which constitutes godly repentance mus' be preceded by effectully conviction of sin.

Article 7 OF FREE AGENCY---We believe that the human will is liee, and the men have ability to accept or reject the conditions of salvation as they are revealed in the Holy Scriptures.

Article 8. OF PRESERVANCE---We do not believe under the Gospel dispensation that any soul is elected to eternal life unconditionally; but those who by faith presevere to the end will be saved. That it is possible for men who have been converted, to "Make shipwreck of faith," turn again to sin and be finally lost,

Article 9. OF GOOD WORKS -- We believe that good works is the result of Faith. That those who have Faith will do works of righteousness; while those who have no faith can not do anything pleasing or acceptable unto God.

Article 10. OF CHRISTIAN BAPTISM --- We believe that Christian Baptism is the immersion in water of a believer, in the name of the Fatner, Son and Holy Ghost.

That baptism cannot be scripturly administered without Faith in the subject who receives it.

Article 11. OF THE LORDS SUPPER---We believe the supper instured by our Saviour as a comme morative ordinance. That it was

instituted for Christians and that all Christians unite in observing the sacred service, regardless of name adnominational distinctions.

Article 12. OF THE SOUL --- We believe that man is a living soul. That the body will die, but that the Soul is immortal. That death is the seperation of the moral and immoral parts of human being.

Article 13. OF THE RESURRECTION-We believe in the Resurrection of the dead. When the resurrection shall take place the soul and body will reunite and form an immoral being. That the righteous will be received in a state of everlasting happings, to reign with God for ever and ever. But the wicked will be bound by hand and foot and be cast into outer darkness. "The wicked are driven away in their wickekness, but the righeous have hope in the death."

Rules of Decourm

1. The Association shall be called to order by the Moderator who presided at last session; former Clerk also officiating until the body is fully organized.

2. The Association shall be opened and closed with singing

and prayer.

3. The Moderator and Clerk shall be chosen by ballot at each session of the Association. A majority of votes by the delegates present elects.

4. The names of delegates from the different churches shall be enrolled and called as often as necessary during the session.

5. A majority of delegates present shall rule in all cases ex-

cept the reception of members, then it shall be unanimous.

6. The Moderator shall not be entitled to vote, except in cases of a tie and then he shall give the deciding vote. He shall also speak on any question after others has spoken, providing he appoints some one to the chair while he is speaking.

7. Only one person shall speak at the same time and he shall arise and address the Moderator and after recognition by Moderator proceed.

8. No brother shall be interrupted while speaking, unless he departs from the subject under discussion, or use words of personal reflection.

- 9. No person shall be allowed to speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of Association, not more than fifteen minutes at a time
- 10. No person shall laugh or talk during the time the debate is going on.
- 11. No person shall absent himself from the Association without leave of the Moderator.

Constitution

- 1. This Association shall be known as the Jasper Free Will Baptist Association of Alabama and being composed of ministers and delegates from the different churches forming the same, each church being entitled to three delegates.
 - 2 This body shall be considered an advisory council.
- 3. All questions of doctrine and matters of general interest shall be decided by two-thirds vote of the Association and the decision shall be final.
- 4. The Officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Clerk as d Treasure, which shall be chosen by a majority vote at session of the Association
- 5. The Association shall be meet annually at such time and place as may be agreed upon by a previous annual session and shall not adjaurn finally until all business is transacted.
- 6. Churches wishing to become members of this Association must adopt its Articles of Faith and conform to its usages.
- 7. We agree as churches of this Association to use our best influence to promote the interest of all moral and benevolent institution, such as the Temperance Cause, Sunday School, Missionary Work, etc.
