Sunday Service.

After singing by the choir and prayers and testimonies by the congregation, Rev. W. J. Benson preached an able discourse. Text used, 21 chapter and 26th verse, "Follow Me" after which the congregation was dismissed for 10 minutes.

Sunday At 11 O'clock.

Rev. Vester Burkett preached to a large concourse of Christian people of all denominations. Text used, Amos 3rd chapter and 3rd verse, "Can Two walk together except they be agreed." After there were a collection taken up for the Freewill Baptist Orphans Home at Eldridge, Ala., in the sum of \$219.11, after which the congregation was dismissed.

Sunday Night

After singing by the choir and devotional service conducted by Rev. H. A. Pitts, Rev. A. L. Warren preached an able sermon to a large congregation. Text used, 126 Salms and the 3rd verse: "the Lord hath done great

things for us Whereof we are glad after preaching the Lord's Supper was served to a large audience of christians of different denominations and supper being ended there were a large number of christians washed each others feet.

Monday Morning Sevice.

After singing by the choir and prayer by G. W. Flippo, the roll was called, the Moderator then declared a quorum present and the body ready for business.

3 The committee went to work while the rest of the congregation carried on a Devotional Service, conducted by Rev. Frank Lee, of Vernon Association.

Raymond Riggs preached an able discourse, Text used, 2nd Peter, 2nd chapter, 2 verses, "And many shall follow their pernicious ways by reason of whom the way of truth shall be evil spoken of." After preaching there was a collection taken for Foreign Mission in the sum of \$112.00. The body adjourned for one hour for refreshments.

4. We find that several churches are asking for the next session of the Association. We recommend that this body shall decide which church shall have it.

5. We recommend that A. L. Warren and Vester Burkett be appointed evangelists and that they may have the priviledge to go wherever God may lead them, with the right to take a freewill offering to pay their expense.

6 We find in the reading of the letters, that Wm. R. Hullett was recommended for ordination and Bro. Bonner was recommended for be recogzed and his name be enrolled in our minutes as a regular ordained minister and the committee be appointed to examine them.

7. We recommend that any of our preachers staying away from our Association three years in succession without a lawful excuse, and that this excuse must be presented in writing and in case they fail to do so their name be dropped from the minutes.

8. We recommend that each church hold conference at least quarterly and that the following items be added to the form of conference:

(1) That acknowledgements be made, (2) that distressed members be seen about and whatever needed may be supplied by the church.

9 We recommend that our preachers practice tithing and teach our

members to do the same and that we support the different phases of our en e ve state l'estre en en ence denominational work.

ARTICLES OF FAITH.

Art. 1. We believe there is one and but one lving, true God, who in personality the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, equal and harmonious in every divine perfection. First Timothy, 2-5.

Art. 2. We believe that God is the author of the Holy Bible, and that teachings constitute the only infallible doctrine of the government of His

church. 2 Timothy, 3-16.

- Art. 3. We believe that Adam was created holy, but by voluntary transgression fell into depravity, and consequently involved his posterity in sin. Genisis 3-6.
- Art. 4. We believe that the grace of God comprehends all spiritual blessings; that the Gospel is the power unto salvation; that the Holy Spirit not only reproves the world of sin, but is the means whereby sinners are converted regenerated and saved. Romans, 10-12.
- Art. 5. We believe that Christian faith is belief in Jesus Christ, the Son of God and Redeemer of the world, and in the inspiration of the Holy Scriptures, that faith comes by hearing and hearing by the word of God. John. 3-36.
- Art. 6. We believe that repentance is sorrow for sin and the kind of sorrow which constitutes godly repentance must be preceded by effectual conviction for sin. 2 Cor. 7-9-10.

Art. 7. We believe that the human will is free and that man has ability to accept or reject the conditions of salvation as they are revealed in the

Holy Scriptures. Micha 4-6-8.

Art. 8. We do not believe under the gosne' dimensation that any sou! is elected to eternal life unconditionally, but that those who by faith persevere to the end will be saved: that it is possible for men wno mave been was verted to make shipwreck of faith, turn again to sin and be finally lost. Juke 9-62.

Art. 9. We believe that good works is the result of faith, and that those who have faith will do works of righteousness, while those who have no

faith do anything pleasing or acceptable to God. Matt. 7. 19-20.

Art. 10. We believe that Christian baptism is in the immersion of a believer in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, that baptism cannot be spiritually administered without faith in the subject who receives it. Rom. 6-4.

Art. 11. We believe the Supper instituted by our Savior is a commerable

ordinance; that it was instituted by Christians and that all Christians unite in observing the sacred service, regardless of name or denominational distinction. 1 Cor. 11, 18-29.

Art. 12. We believe that man is a living soul; that the body will die; but that the Son is immortal; that death is a separation of the mortal and

immortal parts of human beings. Genissis 2-7.

Art. 13. We believe in the resurrection of the dead. When the Ressurection shall take place the soul and body will reunite and form an immortal being, that the righteous will be received into a state of everlasting happiness to remain with God forever and ever, but the wicked will be bound hand and foot and cast into outer darknes. The wicked are driven away in their wickedness, but the righteous have hope in their death. John 5, 28-29.

CONSTITUTION

1. This Association shall be known as the Jasper Free Will. Baptist Association of Alabama, and being composed of Ministers and Delegates from the different churches forming the same, each church being entitled to three (3) de egates.

2. This body shall be considered an advisory council.

3. All questions of doctrine and matters of general interest shall be decided by two-thirds vote of the Association, and the decision shall be final.

4. The officers of the Association shall be a moderator and clerk-trearsuer, who shall be chosen by a majority vote at each session of the Association.

5. The Association shall meet annually at such time and place as may be agreed upon by previous Annual Session, and shall not adjourn finally until all business is transacted.

6. Churches wishing to become members of the Association must adopt

its Articles of Faith, and conform to the usages.

7. We agree, as Churches of the Association, to use our best influence to promote the interest of all moral and benevolent institutions, such as Temperance Cause, Sunday School, Missionary Work, etc. RULES OF DECORUM

1. This Association shall be called to order by the Moderator who presided at the last session, the former Clerk also officiating until the body is fully organized.

The Association shall be opened and closed by singing and prayer. 3. The Moderator and Clerk shall be chosen by ballot at each session of the Association. A majority of votes by delegates present e ects.

The names of delegates from different churches shall be enrolled and called for as often as necessary during the session.

5. A majority of delegates shall rule in all cases except the reception of

members; Then it shall be unanimous.

6. The Moderator shall not be entitled to vote except in case of a tie, and then he shall give the deciding vote. He shall be entitled to speak on any question after others have spoken, provided he appoints some one to the chair while he is speaking.

7. Only one person shall speak at the time and he shall arise and address the Moderator, and after recognition by the Moderator he shall proceed.

8. No brother shall be interrupted while speaking unless he shall depart from the subject under discussion or use words of personal reflection.

9. No person will be allowed to speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the Association-nor more than 15 minutes at a time.

10. No person shall laugh or talk while the debate is going on.

11. No person shall absent himself from the Association without leave of the Moderator.

CHURCH COVENANT.

Having been bought, as we humbly trust, by divine grace to embrace the Lord Jesus Christ as our Savior, and having obtained justification by faith in his name, we, as members of the Freewill Baptist Church at..... agree:

1. To watch over each other in love, to pray for each other as members of a common faith, ever striving to keep the unity of the spirit in the bonds of peace.

2. We will not speak evil one of another, nor will we prosecute or expose the faults of the weak members of our church, but we will endeavor to be governed by Paul's instruction to Timothy. "That we will reprove, rebuke and exhort" each other as members of a common brotherhood.

3. We are commanded to do good unto all men, especially to those who are of the household of Faith. But we should remember that our relations to each other are closer, and the obligation more binding than that of a common bond of Christian unity. In adopting the Covenant, we become as a family, and assume in the Christian sense the care and responsibility that the members of a family should feel for each other.

4. We will attend the stated meetings of our church unless we are providentially hindered, or uncontrollable circumstances prevent us. And we will contribute of our means as the Lord has prospered us for the support of our pastor and other necessary expenses of our church. And we will pefer the service of our own church to that of any other, and will pray for our pastor while he is preaching the word to us.

5. We will not injure our influence in the house of the Lord by occupying seats among the ungodly and sinners: but will occupy seats near the pulpit and use the natural powers which the Lord has granted us to praise His holy name. We will sing with those

who sing and pray with those who pray.

- 6. We will not be guilty of the sin of Sabbath breaking by making Sunday visits to our neighbors, which is a double sin against the law of God. For in so doing we fail to attend the house of the Lord and hinder others who might wish to do so. Let us remember the law of Moses which condemns Sabbath breaking, and the words of the inspired apostle which says, "Forsake not the assembling of yourselves together as the manner of some is."
- 7. We will not neglect secret and public prayers, and those of us who are heads of families will strive to dedicate our household to the service of God by teaching our children the great necessity of the Christian religion as the only hope of happiness after death. We will adopt the covenant of Joshua, the servant of the Lord, and say, "but as for me my house we will serve the Lord."
