#### ON HOME MISSION

- 1. We, your committee on Home Miss on, report as follows: We pray that each church member let his or her light so shine that the world might see Jesus through them. We recommend that our churches cooperate with our association more in home missions. It is every christians duty to be found doing something for the upbuilding of sabbath school, prayer meeting and all church services. Visit the sick. Have prayer wit hthem. Have services in their homes. Help those that need your help, urge men and women, boys and girls that does not attend services to go to church and suday school, that they may hear the Word of God preached—there is much to be done in home mission. Let us study the Bible with a prayerful heart, asking God to help us understand it and do exactly as it says.
- 2. We recommend that the association appoint two evangelists.

  Each church have two offerings a year for foreign mission and send to our National Treasurer.
- 3. We recommend that the Association appoint a field worker for our children's home at Eldridge. Respectfully submitted, Rev. A.L.Warren, Rev. W. H. Ryland, Cecil Kilgore. Report received and committee discharged.

#### ON ORDER OF BUSINESS

1. We recommend that the association meet on Saturday before the first Sunday in October, 1947.

2. We recommend that the Moderator be paid \$15.00 and the Clerk \$15.00 and the assistant moderator \$2.50 out or the associational fund.

3. We find several churches asking for the next session of the Association. We reccommend that the body decide.

4. We recommend that any of our preachers staying from the annual session of the association three years in succession without a lawful excuse presented in writing, be dropped from the minutes.

5. We recommined that our preachers practice tithing and teach our members to do the same and that we support the different phases of our denominational work.

6. We recommend that item two and five of miscellaneous business be made item eight and nine of the constitution.

7. We recommend that the committee on Documents and Order of Business be retained to plan the program for the next session of the association and that matters of dispute and points of docume be presented to this committee and if necessary present it to the association.

8. We recommend that each minister make a written report to the annual session of the association.

- 1. By a unanimous vote the next session of this Association will convene with Mt. Pleasant church on Saturday before the first Sunday in October, 1947.
- 2. Be it resolved that any minister of the Jasper Free Will Baptist Association who desires to set forth the full functions of the Gospel, the same shall be made known to the Association by recommendation from the church or churches to which they belong. If upon examination they are found worthy the Association may ordain them but all ordinations must be done at the annual Association.
- 3. By motion the Articles of Faith and Rules of Decorum were ordered appended to our minutes.
- 5. Be it resolved that we will not accept the baptism of any unordained minister.
- 6. By a motion Rev. H. A. Pitts and Rev. Grady Hudson were made evangelists for the next year.
- 7. By a motion Rev. A. L. Warren was made the Home Mission Field Worker.
- 8. By a motion the Clerk was authorized to pay W. H. May \$24.75 out of the surplus of the associational fund, balance due on the tent.
- 9. By motion the Association adjourned to meet at the above named place, after which there was singing by the chor and the parting hands were taken amid tears and joy.

#### CHURCH COVENANT

Having been brought, as we humbly trust, by divine grace to embrace the Lord Jesus Christ as our Savior, and having obtained just fication by faith in his name, we as members of the Free Will Baptist Church at agree:

1. to watch over each other in love, to pray for each other as members of common faith, ever striving to keep the unity of the spirit in the bonds

of peace.

- 2. We will not speak evil of one of another, nor will we prosecute or expose the faults of the weak members of our church; but we will endeavor to be governed by Paul's instruction to Timothy, "That we will reprove, rebuke and exhort" each other as members of common brotherhood.
- 3. We are commanded to do good unto all men, especially to those who are of the houshold of Faith. But we should remember that our relations to each other are closer, and the obligations more binding, than that of a common bond of Christian unity. In adopting this Covenant we become as a family, and assume in a Christian sense the care and responsibility that the members of a family should feel for each other.
- 4. We will attend the stated meetings of our church unless we are providentially hindered, or uncontrollable circumstances prevent us. And we will contribute of our means as the Lord has prospered us for the support of our pastor and other necessary expenses of our church. And we will prefer the service of our own church to that of any other, and will pray for our pastor while he is preaching the word to us.
- 5. We will not injure our influence in the house of the Lord by occupying seats among the ungodly and sinners; but will occupy seats near the pulpit and use the natural powers which the Lord has given us to praise His holy name. We will sing with those who sing and pray with those who pray.
- 6. We will not be guilty of the sin of Sabbath breaking by making Sunday visits to our neighbors, which is a double sin against the law of God. For in so doing we fall to attend the house of the Lord and hinder others who might wish to do so. Let us remember the law of Moses which condemns Sabbath breaking, and the words of the inspired apostle which says: "Forsake not of the assembling of yourselves together as the manner of some is."
- 7. We will not neglect secret and public prayers, and those of us who are heads of families will strive to decide our household to the service of God by teaching our children the great necessity of the Christian rel gion as the only hope of happiness after death. We will adopt the Covenant of Joshua, the servent of the Lord, and say, "but as for me my house we will serve the Lord."

# ARTICLES OF FAITH

- Art. 1. We believe there is one and but only one living, true God, who is in personality the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, equal and harmonious in every divine perfection. 1st Timothy 2-5.
- Art. 2. We believe that God is the author of the Holy Bible, and that its teachings construe the only infalible doctrine of the government of His church. 2 Timothy 3-16.
- Art. 3. We believe that Adam was created holy, but by voluntary transgression fell into depravity, and consequently involved his posterity in sin. Genesis 3-6.
- Art. 4. We believe that the grace of God comprehends all spiritual blessings; that the Gospel is the power unto salvation; that the Holy Spirit not only reproves the world of sin, but is the means whereby sinners are converted, regenerated and saved. Romans 10-12.
- Art. 5. We believe that Christain faith is belief in Jesus Christ, the Son of God and Redeemer of the world, and in the inspiration of the Holy Scriptures, that faith comes by hearing and hearing by the word of God. John 3-36.
- Art. 6. We believe that repentance is sorrow for sin and the kind of sorrow which constitutes Godly repentance must be preceded by effectual conviction for sin. 2 Cor. 7-9-10.
- Art. 7. We believe that the human will is free, and that man has ability to accept or reject the conditions of salvation as they are revealed in the Holy Shiptures. Micha 4-6-8.
- Art. 8. We do not believe under the gospel dispensation that any soul is elected to eternal life unconditionally, but that those who by faith persevere to the end will be saved; that it is possible for men who have been converted to make shipwreck of faith, turn again to sin and be finally lost. Luke 9-62.
- Art. 9. We believe that good works is the result of faith, and that those who have faith will do works of righteougness, while those who have no faith do anything pleasing or acceptable to God. Matt. 7, 19-20.
- Art. 10. We believe that Christian baptism is in the emersion of a believer in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, that baptism cannot be spiritually administered without faith in the subject who receives it. Rom. 6-4:
- Art. 11. We believe the Supper instituted by our Savior is a commemorable ordinance; that it was instituted by Christians and that all Christians unite in observing the sacred service, regardless of name or denominational distinction. 1 Cor. 11, 18-29.
  - Art. 12. We believe that man is a living soul; that the body will die;

but the soul is immortal; that death is the separation of the mortal and immortal parts of human beings. Genesis 2-7.

Art. 13. We believe in the resurrection of the dead. When the ressurrect on shall take place the soul and body will reunite and form an immortal being, that the righteous will be received into a state of everlasting happiness to reign with God forever and ever, but the wicked will be bound hand and foot and cast into outerdarkness. The wicked are driven away in their wickedness, but the righteous have hope in their death, John 5,28-29.

#### CONSTITUTION

- 1. This Association shall be known as the Jasper Free Will Baptist Association of Alabama, and being composed of ministers and delegates from the different churches forming the same, each church being entitled to three (3) delegates.
  - 2. This body shall be considered an advisory council.
- 3. All questions of doctrine and matters of general interest shall be decided by two-thirds vote of the Association, and the decision shall be final.
- 4. The officers of the Association shall be a Moderator and Clerk-Treasurer, who shall be chosen by a majority vote at each session of the Association.
- 5. The Association shall meet annually at such time and place as may be agreed upon by previous Annual Session, and shall not adjourn finally until all business is transacted.
- 6. Churches wishing to become members of this Association must adopt its Articles of Faith, and conform to its usages.
- 7. We agree, as Churches of this Association, to use our best nfluence to promote the interest of all moral and benevolent institutions, such as Temperance Cause, Sunday School, Missionary Work, etc.

#### RULES OF DECORUM

- 1. This Association shall be called to order by the Moderator who presided at the last session, the former Clerk also offic ating until the body is fully organized.
  - 2. The Association shall be opened and closed by singing and prayer.
- 3. The Moderator and Clerk shall be chosen by ballot at each session of the Association. A majority of votes by delegates present elects.
- 4. The names of the delegates from the different churches shall be enrolled and called for as often as necessary during the session.
- 5. A majority of delegates shall rule in all cases except the reception of members; then it shall be unanimous.
- 6. The Moderator shall not be entitled to a vote except in case of a tie, and then he shall give the deciding vote. He shall be entitled to speak on any question after others have spoken, provided he appooints some one to the chair while he is speaking.
- 7. Only one person shall speak at a time and he shall rise and address the Moderator, and after recognition by the Moderator, he shall proceed.
- 8. No brother shall be interrupted while speaking unless he shall depart from the subject under discussion or use words of personal reflection.
  - 9. No person will be allowed to speak more than twice on the same

subject without leave of the Association- nor more than 15 minutes at a time.

- 10. No person shall laugh or talk while the debate is going on.
- 11. No person shall absent himself from the Association without leave of the Moderator.
