CHURCH COVENANT

Having been brought, as we humbly trust, by divine grace to embrace the Lord Jesus Christ is our Savior, and having obtained justification by faith in his name, we as members of the Free Will Baptist Church at

1. To watch over each other in love, to pray for each other as members of common faith, ever striving to keep the unity of the spirit in the bond of peace.

2. We will not speak evil of one or another, nor will we prosecute or expose the faults of the weak members of our church; but we will endeavor to governed by Paul's instruction to Timothy, "That we will reprove, rebuke and exhort" each other as members of common brotherhood.

3. We are commanded to do good unto all men, especially to those who are of the household of Faith. But we should remember that our relations a family, and assume in a Christian sense the care and responsibility that the

members of a family should feel for each other.

4. We will attend the stated meetings of our church unless we are providently hindered, or uncontrollable circumstances prevent us. And contribute of our means as the Lord has prospered us for the support of our pastor and other necessary expenses of our church. And we will prefer the service of our own church to that of any other, and will pray for our pastor while he is preaching the word to us.

5. We will not injure our influence in the house of the Lord by occupying seats among the ungodly and sinners; but will occupy seats near the pulpit and use the natural powers which the Lord has given us to praise His holy name. We will sing wit hthose who sing and pray with those who pray.

6. We will not be guilty of the sin of Saabath breaking by making Sunday visits to our neighbors, which is a double sin against the law of God. For in so doing we fail to attend the house of the Lord and hinder others who might wish to do so. Let us remember the lawofMoses whichcondemns Sabbath breaking, and the words of the inspired apostle which says: "Forsake not of the assembling of yourselves together as the manner of some is."

7. We will not neglect secret and public prayers, and those of us who are heads of families will strive to decide our household to the service of God by teaching our children the great necessaity of the Christian Religion as the only hope of happiness after death. We will adopt the Covenant of Joshua, the servent of the Lord, and say, "but as for me my house we will serve the

ARTICLE OF FAITH

Art. 1. We believe there is but one and only one living, true God, who is in personality the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, equal and harmonious in every divine perfection. 1st Timothy 2:5.

Art. 2. We believe that is the author of the Holy Bible, and that its teachings construe the only infalible doctrine of the government of His church. 2 Timothy 3:16.

Aft. 3. We believe that Adam was created holy, but by voluntary trans... gression fell into depravity, and consequently involved his posterity in sin. Genesis 3:6.

Art. 4. We believe that the grace of God comprehend all spiritual tlessings; that the Gospel is the power unto salvation; that the Holy Spirit no only reproves he world of sin, but it is the means whereby sinners are converted, regenerated and saved. Romans 10:12.

Art. 5. We believe that Christian faith is belief in Jesus Christ, the Son of God and Redeemer of the world, and in the inspiration of the Holy Scriptures; that faith comes by hearing and hearing by the word of God. Jno. 3:16

Art. 6. W ebelieve that repentance is sorrow for sin and the kind of sorrow which constitutes Godly repentance must be preceded by effectual conviction for sin. 2 Cor. 7:9-10.

Art. 7. We believe that the human will is free, and that man has ability to accept or reject he conditions of salvation as they are revealed in the Holy Scriptures. Michael 4:6-8.

Art. 8. We do not believe under the gospel dispensation that any soul is elected to eternal life unconditionally, but that those who by faith persevere to he end will be saved; hat it is possible for men who have been converted to make shipwreck of faith, turn again to sin and be finally lost. Luke 9:62.

Art. 9. We believe that good works is the result of faith, and that those who have fatih will do works of righteousness, while those who have no faith do anything pleasing or acceptaable to God. Matt. 719-20.

Art. 10. We believe that Christian baptism is in the emrsion of a be. liever in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, that baptism cannot be spiritually odministered without faith in the subject who receives it. Rom. 6:4.

Art. 11. We believe the Supper instituted by our Savior is a commem-, orable ordinance; that it was instituted by Christian and that all Christians unite in observing the sacred service, regardless of name or denominational distinction. 1 Cor. 11:18-29.

Art. 12. We believe that man is a living soul; that the body will die; but the soul is immortal; tha death is the separation of the mortal and im-

mortal pars of human beings. Genesis 2:7.

Art. 13. We believe in the resurrection of the dead. When the resurrection shall take place the soul and body will reunite and form an immortal being, that the righteous will be received in a state of ever asting happiness toreign with God forever and ever, but the wiced will be bound hand and foot and cast into outerdarkness. The wicked are driven away in their kickedness but the righteous have hope in their death. John John 5:28-29.

CONSTITUTION

This Association shall be known as the Jasper Free Will Baptist Association of Alabama, and being composed of ministers and delegates from the different churches forming the same, each church being entitled to three (3) delegates.

2. This body shall be considered an advisory council.

- 3. All questions of doctrine and matters of general interest shall be decided by two-thirds vote of the association, and the decision shall be final.
- 4. The officers of the Association shall be a Moderator and Clerk_Treasurer, who shall be chosen by a majority vote at each session of the Associa-
- 5. The Association shall meet annually at such time and place as may be agreed upon by previous Annual Session, and shall not adjourn finally until all business is transacted.
- 6. Churches wishing to become members of this Association must adopt its Articles of Faith, and conform to its usages.

7. We agree, as churches of this Association, to use our best influence to promote the interest of all moral and benevolent institutions, such as

Temperance Cause, Sunday School, iMsisonary Work, etc.

8. Be it resolved that any minister of the Jsaper Free Will Baptist Association who desires to set forth the full functions of the Gospel, the same shall be made known to the Association by recommendation from the church or churches to which they belong. If upon examination they are found worthy the Association may adorn them but all ordinations must be done at the Annual Association.

9. Be it resoled that we will not accept the baptism of any unordained minister.

RULES OF DECORUM

1. This Association shall be called to order by the Moderator who presided at the last session, the former clerk also officiating until the body is fully organized.

2. The Association shall be opened and closed by singing and prayer. 3. The Moderator and Clerk shall be chosen by ballot at each session of the Association. A majority of votes of delegates present elects.

4. The names of the delegates from the different churches shall be enrolled and called for as often as necessary during the session.

5. A majority of delegates shall rule in all cases except the reception

of members; hen it shall be unanimous.

6. The Moderator shall not be entitled to a vote except in case of a tie, and then he shall give he deciding vote. He shall be entitled to speak on any question after others have spoken, provided he appoints someone to the chair while he is speaking.

7. Only one person shall speak at a time and he shall arise and address the Moderator, and after recognition by the Moderator, he shall proceed.

- 8. No brother shall be interrupted while speaking unless he shall depart from the subject under discussion or use words of personal reflection.
- 9. No person will be allowed to speak more than twice on the same su_ ject without leave of the Association—nor more than 15 minutes at a time.
- 10. No person shall laugh or alk while the debate is going on. 11. No person shall absent himself from the Association without leave of the Moderator.
