CHURCH COVENANT

Having been brought, as we humbly trust, by divine grace to embrac the Lord Jesus Christ is our Savior, and having obtained justification by

faith in his name, we as members of the Free Will Baptist Church at

These men are gone to be with God. Listed by W. D. Martin.

1. To watch over each other in love, to pray for each other as members of common faith, ever striving to keep the unity of the spirit in the bond of peace.

2. We will not speak evil of one or another, nor will we prosecute or expose the faults of the weak memebers of our church; but we will endeavor to be goverend by Paul's instruction to Timothy, "That we will reprove, rebuke and exhort" each other as members of common brotherhood.

3. We are commanded to do good to all men, especially to those who are of the household of Faith. But we should remember that our relations a family, and assume in a Christian sense the care and responsibility that the

members of a family should feel for each other.

4. We will attend the stated meetings of our church unless we are providently hindered, or uncontrolleble circumstances prevent us. And contribute of our means as the Lord has prospered us for the support of our psator and other necessary expenses of our church. And we will prefer the service of our own church to that of any other, and will pray for our pastor while he is preaching the word to us.

Let us remember the law of Moses which condemns Sabbath breaking, and the words of the inspired apostle which says: 'Forsake not of the assembling of yourselves together as the manner of some is."

7. We will not neglect secret and public prayers, and those of us who by teaching our children the great necessity of the Christian Religion as the are heads of families will strive to decide our household to the service of God only hope of happiness after death. Art. 4. We believe that the grace of God comprehend all spiritual blessings; that the Gospel is the power unto salvation; that the Holy Spirit not only reproves the world of sin, but it is the means whereby sinners are converted, regenerated and saved. Romans 10:12.

Art. 5. We believe that Christian faith is belief in Jesas Christ, the Son of God and Redeemer of the world, and in the inspiration of the Holy Scriptures; that faith comes by hearing and hear ng by the world of God. Jno.3:16

Art. 6. We believe that repetance is sorrow for sin and the kind of sorrow which constitutes Godly repentance must be preceded by effectual conviction for sin. 2 Cor. 7:9-10.

- Art. 7. We believe that the human will is free, and man has ability to accept or reject the conditions of salvation as they are revealed in the Holy Scriptures. Michael 4:6-8.
- Art. 8. We do not believe under the gospel dispensation that any soul is elected to eternal life unconditionally, but that those who by faith persevere to the end will be saved; that it is impossible for men who have been converted to make shipwreck of faith, turn again to sin and be finally lost. Luke 9:62.

Art. 9. We believe that good works is the result of faith, and that those who have faith will do works of righteousness, while those who have no faith do anything pleasing or acceptable to God. Matt. 7:19-20.

Art. 10. We believe that Christian baptism is nother ellersion of a believer in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, that baptism cannot be spiritually administered without faith in the subject who receives it. Rom. 6:4.

- Art. 11. We believe the Supper instituted by our Savior is recommemerable ordinance; that it was instituted by Christians and that all Christians unite in observing the sacred service, regardless of name or denominational distinction. 1 Cor. 11:18-29.
- Art. 12. We believe that man is a living soul; that the body will die; but the soul is immortal; that death is the separation of the mortal and immortal parts of human beings. Genesis 2:7.
- Art. 13. We believe in the resurrection of the dead. When the resurrection shall take place the soul and body will reunite and form an immortal being, that the righteous will be received in a state of evelasting happiness to reign with God foreve and ever, but the wicked will be bound hand and foot and cast into outerdarkness. The wicked are driven away in their wickedness but the righteous have hope in their death. John 5:28-29.

CONSTITUTION

This Association shall be known as the Jasper Free Will Baptist Association of Alabama, and being composed of ministers and delegates from the different churches forming the same, each church being entitled to three (3) delegates.

- 2. This body shall be considered an advisory council.
- 3. All questions of doctrine and matters of general interst shall be dec ded by two-thirds vote of the Association, and the decision shall be final.
- 4. The officers of the Association shall be a Moderator and Clerk-Treasurer, who shall be chosen by a majority vote at each session of the Association.
- 5. The Association shall meet annually at such time and place as may be agreed upon by previous Annual Session, and shall not adjourn finally until all business is transacted.

6. Churches wishing to become members of this Association must adopt its Art.cles of Faith, and conform to its usages.

- 7. We agree as churches of this Association, to use our best influence to promote the interest of all moral and benevolent institutions, such as Temperance Cause, Sunday School, Missionary Work, etc.
- 8. Be it resolved that any minister of the Jasper Free Will Baptist Association who desires to set forth the full functions of the Gospel, the same shall be made known to the Association by recommendation from the church or churches to which they belong. If upon examination they are found worthy, the Association may adorn them but all ordinations must be done at the Annual Association.
- 9. Be it resolved that we will not accept the baptism of any unordained

m.nister.

RULES OF DECORUM

- 1. This Association shall be called to order by the Moderator who presided at the last session, the former clerk alo officiating until the body is fully organized.
 - 2. The Association shall be opened and closed by singing and prayer.
- 3. The Moderator and Clerk shall be chosen by ballot at each session of the Association. A majority of votes of delegates present elects.
- 4. The names of the delegates from the different churches shall be enrolled and called for as often as necessary during the sess on.
- 5. A majority of delegates shall rule in all cases except the reception of members; when it shall be unanimous.
- 6. The Moderator shall not be entitled to a vote except in case of a tie and then he shall give the deciding vote. He shall be entitled to speak on any question after others have spoken, provided he appoints someone to the chair while he is speaking.
- 7. Only one person shall speak at a time and he shall arise and address the Moderator, and after recognition by the Moderator, he shall proceed.
- 8. No brother shall be interrupted while speaking unless he shall depart from the subject under discussion or use words of personal reflect on
- 9. No person will be allowed to speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the Association—nor more than 15 minutes at a time.

 10. No person shall laugh or talk while the debate is going on.
- 11. No person shall absent himself from the Association without leave of the Moderator.
