

PRROCEEDINGS

Proceedings of the eighty-fourth annual session of the Jasper Free Will Baptist Association.

The body was called into session at 9:30 on Friday morning. A period of devotion was led by Rev. O. Z. Johnson. The welcome address was given by Dewey Burleson. Response was offered by Milton Rhudy.

Rev. Bll Duncan, Lowell Parker and William E. Atkinson were named reading clerks. Letters from sixteen churches were read. Delegates were seated from all churches.

Nominations were made for General Board members whose terms expired in 1970. A motion carried to elect by acclamation.

A motion carried to accept the report of the Executive Committee pertaining to Union Chapel Church (See Reports)

After a period of intermission, Rev. James Pittman delivered the morning message. An offering of \$75.46 was received for Missions. Rev. A. J. Lambert, Rev. Billy Robbins and Rev. Wise Holcomb were recognized as visiting ministers.

A motion carried to accept the report of Woman's Auxiliary. (See Reports)

The rest of the afternoon was given to messages from Rev. Larry Nix and Rev. Ted Pittman. Rev. James Walden prayed the benediction.

SATURDAY MORNING

After song and prayer, Rev. W. O. Miller led us in a period of devotion.

The moderator called for the report of the Finance Committee.

A motion carried to accept the same. (See Reports)

A motion carried to accept the report of Board of Christian Education which was given by William E. Atkinson. (See Reports)

A motion carried to accept report of Obituary Committee. (See

Reports)

The Appreciation Committee Report was read. A motion carred to accept with a rising vote of thanks to both host churches. (See Reports)

Rev. Rill Duncan, Rev. J. A. Godsey, and B. B. Pounders were named by the moderator as delegates to the Mississippi State Line Association. Rev. James Walden, Rev. O. Z. Johnson and Rev. W. O. Miller were named delegates to the Vernon Association. Those named delegates to the State Association were; W. L. Vaughn, Verla Wright, Minnie Knight, Martha Yocum, Jay Sullins, and Floy Franks. A motion carried granting the moderator the right to name others and make any changes necessary at the State Meeting.

The moderator then asked for a roll call of delegates. Those present were properly recognized.

Ministers present were given a chance to answer to the roll call at this time also.

A brief report was given by Rev. Billy Ray Smith concerning the Children's Home.

The clerk read the report from the General Board. A motion carried to accept and adopt item by item. (See Reports) Subsequent motions carried adopting each of the items.

Some time was allotted Rev. Kenneth Walker, Missionary to Mobile. Pertinent facts were stated and an appeal was made for prayer and financial support for this project.

Rev. Jack Paramore brought the morning message after giving some information on Free Will Baptist Bible College. An offering of \$127.00 was received for the College and Children's Home.

SATURDAY AFTERNOON

After song and prayer, the moderator called for reading of the Credential Committee Report. (See Reports) Subsequent motions carcried adopting each of the items.

- 2. We will not speak evil of one another, nor will we prosecute or expose the faults of the weak members of our church; but we will endeavor to be governed by Paul's instructions to Timothy: "That we will reprove, rebuke and exhort," each other as members of common brotherhood.
- 3. We are commanded to do good to all men, especially to those who are of the household of Faith. But we should remember that our relations, a family, and assume in a Christmas sense the care and responsibility that the members of a family should feel for each other.
- 4. We will attend the state meetings of our church unless we are providentially hindered, or uncontrollable circumstances prevent us. And contribute our means as the Lord has prospered us for the support of our pastor while he is preaching the word to us.
- 5. We will not injure our influence in the home of the Lord by occuping seats among the ungodly and sinners, but will occupy seats near pulpit and use the natural power which the Lord has given us to praise His holy name. We will sing with those who sing and pray with those who pray.
- 6. We will not be guilty of the sin of Sabbath Breaking by making Sunday visits to our neighbors, which is a double si nagainst the law of God. For in so doing we fail to attend the house of the Lord and hinder others from so doing if they want to do so. Let us remember the law of Moses which condemns Sabbath breaking, and the words of the inspired apostle which says: "Forsake not the assembling of your selves together as the manner of some is."
- 7. We will not neglect secret and public prayers and those of us who by teaching our children the great necessity of the Christian religion as heads of families will strive to decide our household to the service of God, only hope for happiness after death. We will adopt the

Convenent of Joshua, the servant of the Lord, and say "But as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord."

ARTICLES OF FAITH

- Art. 1. We believe there is but one and only one living true God, who is in personality the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, equal and harmonious in every divine perfection.—1st Timothy 2:5.
- Art. 2 We believe that God is the Author of the Holy Bible, and that its teachings construe the only infallible doctrine of the government of His Church, 2nd Timothy 3.16.
- Art. 3. We believe that Adam was created holy, but by voluntary transgression fell into depravity and consequently involved his postrity in sin—Genesis 3:6.
- Art. 4. We believe that the grace of God comprehends all spiritual blessings! that the Gospel is the power unto salvation; that the Holy Spirit not only reproves the world of sin but is the means wherebysinners are converted, regenerated and saved.—Romans 10:12.
- Art. 5. We believe that Christian faith is belief in Jesus Christ, the Son of God and Redeemer of the world and in the inspiration of the Holy Scriptures; that faith comes by hearing and hearing by the word of God.—John 3:16.
- Art. 6. We believe that repentance is sorrow for sin and the kind of sorrow constitutes Godly repentance and must be preceded by effectual conviction.—II Cor. 7:9-10.
- Art. 7. We believe that the human will is free and man as abiilty to accept or reject the conditions of salvation as they are revealed in the Holy Scriptures.—Micah 6:8.
- Art. 8. We do not believe under the gospel dispensation that any soul is elected to eternal life unconditionally but that those who by faith perserver to the end will be saved; that it is possible for men who have been converted to make shipwreck of faith, turn again to sin and be finally lost.—Luke 9:62.
- Art. 9. We believe that good works is the result of faith and that those who have not faith can not do anything pleasing or acceptable to God.—Matt. 7:19-20.
- Art. 10. We believe that Christian baptism is in the emersion of a believer in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, that baptism can not be spiritually administered without faith in the subject who receives it.—Romans 6:4.
- Art. 11. We believe the Supper instituted by our Savior is recommendable ordinance; that it was instituted by Christians and that all Christians unite in observing the sacred service, regardless of name or denominational distinction.—I Cor. II:18-20.
- Art. 12. We believe that man is a living soul; that the body will die; but the soul is immortal; death is the separation of the mortal

and immortal; that death is the separation of the immortal parts of human beings.—Genesis 2:7.

Art. 13. We believe in the resurrection of the dead. When the resurrection shall take place the soul and body will reunite and form an immortal being, that the righteous will be received in a state of everlasting happiness to reign with God forever and ever, but the wicked will be bound hand and foot and cast into outer darkness. The wicked are driven away in their wickeness, but the righteous have hope in their death.—John 5:28-29.

CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I

NAME AND MEMBERSHIP

Section I This association shall be known as the Jasper Free Will Baptist Association of Alabama; and shall be composed of ordained ministers, deacons, members of the General Board, and delegates from the several churches forming the same. All ordained ministers, deacons and members of the General Board shall be considered standing delegates provided they are members and in good standing with a local church that is part of this association; and provided such church is in good standing with this body.

Section II Churches wishing to become a member of this association must adopt its articles of Faith, the National Treatise and make formal written request. Each church shall be entitles to three (3) delegates.

ARTICLE II

AUTHORITY

——Section I This body shall be considered an advisory council having no authority over the internal affairs of any local church unless said church depart from the Articles of Faith and from the National Treatise. Whenever conditions warrant it, this association shall have power to reprimand or exclude any local church.

Section II The association shall have power to deal with ministers who may become guilty of deviating from Free Will Baptist Doctrine, whose character may become questionable; or who shall in any other way conduct himself so as to bring reproach upon the ministry.

Section III All questions of doctrine and all matters pertaining to a local church, or to an individual minister or group of ministers, shall be decided by a two-thirds vote of this association. All other matters shall require only a majority. Exception; any church desiring membership in this body must obtain unanimous vote of delegated body when in annual session.

Section IV Each church of this association shall be urged to promote and support all State and National Projects of the denomination.

Section V No church shall have the right to accept as members those who have not been baptized by an ordained minister.

ARTICLE III

ORGANIZATION

Section I The officers of this association shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a clerk-treasurer, and an assistant clerk-treasurer who shall be elected annually.

Section II Other governing organs of this association shall be a General Board, an Executive Committee, a Credential Committee, and as many other committees as deemed necessary by the modrator.

Section III The General Board shall consist of the moderator and clerk along with one person from each church that is a part of this body. Each person from the local churches shall serve for two years with one half being elected each year as so specified in the printed minute. It shall be the responsibility of this board to formulate all items of general business during the annual session of this association as well as any other responsibility so relegated by the moderator or the body. When this association is not in session, this board shall have power to act as the body; but such action must be approved by the association.

Section IV The Executive Committee shall consist of the moderator and clerk along with five (5) others from the General Board. These five shall be elected each year by the Genral Board. This committee shall function as-or instead of-the General Board, when directed to do so by the moderator, the General Board or the Association.

Section V The Credential Committee shall consist of three (3) persons with the senior member in point of service replaced each year. Recommendations for replacement shall come from the General Board. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to examine all letters coming to this body from churches, ministers, and other associations. This committee shall also examine all ministers who become a part of this body either by ordination or by letter. It is expected that all ministers coming from other associations will present letters of recommendation; however in some cases the committee may see fit to recommend the acceptance of such persons who have not yet received such letters. Any item of business pertaining to ministers or conduct of ministers must originate with this committee. Business matters handled by this committee may be referred to the association or to the General Board.

Section VI. The moderator of this association shall be regarded as an ex-official member of all boards and committees.

ARTICLE IV

MEETINGS

Section I This association shall meet annually on Friday before the first Sunday in October at a place determined at the previous session; and shall not adjourn finally until all business is transacted. Section II. The associational year shall end August 31 each year and all letters to the association shauld be mailed to the clerk no later than the first Sunday in September of each year.

Section III There shall also be as many Quarterly Meetings as shall be deemed necessary during each year.

Section IV. The officers of the Quarterly Meeting shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a clerk-treasurer, and an assistant Clerk treasurer, who shall be elected annually.

ARTICLE V

ORDINATIONS

Section I Each church shall have the right to select and ordain all deacons who serve in such church. The ordaining council shall consist of two ministers and at least one deacon; or of one minister and at at least two deacons.

Section II Any man who becomes convinced that the Lord has called him to preach the gospel shall be licensed by the church of which he is a member. After he has been licensed for a priod of time and has proved his worth the local church shall then make formal request to this association that he be ordained. This local church, of which he is a member, and which licensed him, must be able to show proof of his worthiness as to his ability, sincerity and desire. If after he has been examined by the responsible ones of this body, he then be found worthy; he shall be ordained by this association. All ordinations to the ministry must be done at the annual session.

Section III All ministers are required to report yearly to the Credential Committee of this body. Such report shall be for year beginning September 1 and ending August 31; and shall be due September 1 of current year. Any minister who fails to comply shall be dropped from roll of ministers.

ARTICLE VI

DISCIPLINE

Section I Any church placed on probation by this association shall represent to Quarterly Meetings and to the annual session by letter and fees; but shall not have the right to vote by delegates, standing or otherwise, in either quarterly meetings or the annual session as long as such church is on probation. Exception; any minister who is a member of such church but in good standing with this association and pastoring another church shall not be so penalized.

Section II No minister having been put on probation by this association shall have the right to vote in either quartely meetings or the annual session.

ARTICLE VII

AMENDMENTS

Section I This constitution and rules of decorum may be amended at any annual session of this association by a two-thirds vote of delegates present; provided proposed amendment is presetned in writing, read one day, placed on the table, an dadopted the next day.

RULES OF DECORUM

- 1. This Association shall be called to order and presided over by officers elected at the last session.
- 2. The Association shall be opened and closed by singing and prayer.
- 3. The names of delegates shall be noted and referred to as often as is necessary.
- 4. The Moderator shall not be entitled to a vote except in case of a tie and then he shall give the deciding vote. He shall be entitled to speak on any subject after others have spoken, provided someone else serves as Moderator while he speaks.
- 5. Only one person shall speak at a time and he shall arise and address the Moderator, and after recognition by the Moderator, he shall proceed.
- 6. No person shall be interrupted while speaking unless he shall depart from the subject under discussion or use words of personal reflection.
- 7. No person will be allowed to speak more than twice on the same subject without permission from the Association—nor more than fifteen (15) minutes at a time.
 - 8. No person shall laugh or talk while discussion is going on.
- 9. No delegate shall absent himself from the Association without leave of Moderator.
- 10. Any minister absent from the Annual Session of this Association for two years in succession without legal excuse shall be dropped from roll of ministers.
