PROCEEDINGS

Proceedings of the eighty-seventh annual session of the Jasper Free Will Baptist Association.

The body was called into session Friday morning at 9:00 a.m. by the moderator. A period of devotion was led by Rev. Calvin Bevins. The welcome address was given by Curt Griffin; and the response was given by Lowell Parker.

A partial report was given by the Credential Committee approving letters from all churches except Shady Grove and Mt. Pleasant. The moderator appointed Lowell Parker to assist the clerk in reading the letters.

A report was given by the Credential Committee approving letters from Mt. Pleasant and Shady Grove churches. Letters from all churches were read and delegates seated.

Nominations were made to General Board for terms expiring in 1973 and other vacancies. A motion carried to elect by acclamation. An Executive Committee was elected consisting of Lowell Parker, Letus Atkinson, Allen Brasseal, Donald Kivette, and Floy Franks along with the moderator and clerk.

Rev. Bill Smith brought the message in the worship service. An offering of \$80.86 was received for missions.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON

After song and prayer the moderator recognized Rev. Carlton Lambert who spoke for Free Will Baptist Children's Home. The General Board was excused from the assembly and asked to assemble for business session.

A motion carried to accept the report of Quarterly Meetings. A motion carried to accept the report of Woman's Auxiliary.

The rest of the afternoon was given to messages from Rev. Gurley Roberts and Rev. Dennis Hagood. Before adjourning, the moderator read some proposed additions to the constitution. A motion carried that these be tabled.

A motion carried removing items from table placed there on Friday for consideration by the body.

Each of the items were considered separately; and in compliance with a request, the moderator divided item one into two parts with the last sentence becoming part two and the remainder being part one. A motion carried adopting part one; but part two was lost. (See Report)

Subsequent motions carried adopting items two and three.

Rev. Paul Ketteman was guest speaker in the morning worship service. An offering of \$62.60 was received for Free Will Baptist Bible College and Free Will Baptist Children's Home.

Final report from Credential Committee was read; and motion carried to accept the report. (See Report) Subsequent motions carried adopting each item of the report.

SATURDAY AFTERNOON

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, and the support of missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Art. 6. We believe that repentance is sorrow for sin and the kind of sorrow constitutes Godly repentance and must be preceded by effectural conviction -- II Cor 7:9-10.

Art. 7. We believe that the human will is free and man as ability to accept or reject the conditions of salvation as they are revealed in the Holy Scriptures.--Micah 6:8.

Art. 8. We do not believe under the gospel dispensation that any soul is elected to eternal life unconditionally but that those who by faith perserver to the end will be saved; that it is possible for men who have been converted to make shipwreck of faith, turn again to sin and be finally lost. -- Luke 9:62.

Art. 9. We believe that good works is the result of faith and that those who have not faith can not do anything pleasing or acceptable to God.-Matt. 7:19-20.

Act. 10. We believe that Christian baptism is in the emersion of a believer in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, that baptism can not be spiritually administered without faith in the subject who receives it. - Romans 6:4

Art. 11. We believe the Supper instituted by our Savior is recommendable ordinance; that is was instituted by Christians and that all Christians units in observing the sacred service, regardless of name or denominational distinction.—I Cor.II:18-20.

Art. 12. We believe that man is a living soul; that the body will die; but the soul is immortal; death is the separatation of the mortal and immortal; that death is the separation of the immortal parts of human beings. -- Genesis 2:7.

Art. 13. We believe in the resurrection of the dead. When the resurrection shall take place the soul and body will reunite and form an immortal being, that the righteous will be received in a state of everlastin happiness to reign with God forever and ever, but the wicked will bound hand and foot and sast into outer darkness. The wicked are given away in their wickeness, but the righteous have hope in their death.—John 5:28-29.

CONSTITUTION ARTICLE I NAME AND MEMBERSHIP

SECTION I This association shall be known as the Jasper Free Will Baptist Association of Alabama; and shall be composed of ordained ministers, deacons, members of the General Board, and delegates from the several churches forming the same. All ordained ministers, deacons and members of the General Board shall be considered standing delegates provided they are members and in good standing with a local church is in good standing with this body.

SECTION II Churches wishing to become a member of this association must adopt its articles of Faith, the National Treaties and make formal written request. Each church shall be entitled to three (3) delegates.

ARTICLE II AUTHORITY

Section I This body shall be considered an advisory council having no authority over the internal affairs of any local church unless said church depart from the Articles of Faith and from the National Treatise. Whenever conditions warrant it, this association shall have power to reprimand or exclude any local church.

Section II. The association shall have power to deal with ministers who may become guilty of deviating from Free Will Baptist Doctrine, whose character may become questionable; or who shall in any other way conduct himself so as to bring reproach upon the ministry.

Section III All questions of doctrine and all matters pertaining to a local church, or to an individual minister or group of ministers, shall be decided by a two-thirds vote of this association. All other matters shall require only a majority. Exception; any church desiring membership in this body must obtain unanimous vote of delegated body when in annual session.

Section IV Each church of this association shall be urged to promote an support all State and National Projects of the demonination.

Section V No church shall have the right to accept as members those who have not been baptized by an ordained minister.

ARTICLE III ORGANIZATION

Section I The officers of this association shall be a moderator, and assistant clerk-treasurer who shall be elected annually.

Section II Other governing organs of this association shall be a General Board, and Executive Committee, a Credential Committee, and as many other committees as deemed necessary by the moderator

Section III The General Board shall consist of the moderator and clerk along with one person from each church that is a part of this body. Each person from the local churches shall serve for two years with one half being elected each year as so specified in the printed minute. It shall be the responsibility of the board to formulate all items of general business during the annual session of this association as well as any other responsibility so relegated by the moderator or the body. When this association is not in session, this board shall have power to act as the body; but such action must be approved by the association.

Section IV The Executive Committee shall consist of the moderator and clerk along with five(5) others from the General Board. These five shall be elected each year by the General Board. This committee shall function as-or instead of-the General Board, when directed to do so by the moderator, the General Board or the Association.

Section V The Credential Committee shall consist of three (3) persons with the senior member in point of service replaced each year. Recommendations for replacement shall come from the General Board. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to

examine all letters coming to this body from churches, ministers, and other associations. This committee shall also examine all ministers who become a part of this body either by ordination or by letter. It is expected that all ministers coming from other associations will present letters of recommendation; however in some cases the committee may see fit to recommend the acceptances of such persons who have not yet received such letters. Any item of business pertaining to ministers of conduct of ministers must originate with this committee. Business matters handled by this committee may be referred to the association or to the General Board.

Section VI The moderator of this association shall be regarded as an ex-official member of all boards and committees.

Section VIICandidates for ordination to the ministry shall present their request for ordination to the Credential Committee at least by the time of the last QuarterlyMeeting before the Annual Session using forms prepared and approved by this body.

Section VIII Preachers coming to us from other association or from other denominations, shall present their requests to the Credential Committee at time of a Quarterly Meeting or Annual Session. Such requests shall be acted upon at time of following Quarterly Meeting or Annual Session.

ARTICLE IV MEETINGS

Section I This association shall meet annually on Friday before the first Sunday in October at a place determined at the previous session; and shall not adjourn finally until all business is transacted.

Section II The associational year shall end August 31 each year and all letters to the association should be mailed to the clerk no later than the first Sunday in September of each year.

Section III There shall also be as many Quarterly Meetings as shall be deemed necessary during each year.

Section IV The officers of the Quarterly Meeting shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a clerk-treasurer, and an assistant Clerk-treasurer, who shall be elected annually.

ARTICLE V ORDINATIONS

Section I Each church shall have the right to select and ordain all deacons who serve in such church. The ordaining council shall consist of two ministers and at least one deacon; or of one minister and at least two deacons.

Section II Any man who becomes convinced that the Lord has called him to preach the gospel shall be licensed by the church of which he is a member. After he has been licensed for a period of time and has proved his worth the local church shall than make formal request to this association that he be ordained. This local church, of which he is a member, and which licensed him, must be able to show proof of his worthiness as to his ability, sincerity and desire. If after he has been examined by the responsible ones of this body, he then be found worthy; he shall be ordained by this association. All ordinations to the ministry must be done at the annual session.

Section III All ministers are required to report yearly to the Credential Committee of this body. Such report shall be for year beginning September 1 and ending August 31; and shall be due September 1 of current year. Any minister who fails to comply shall be dropped from the roll of ministers.

"ARTICLE VI" DISCIPLINE

Section I Any church placed on probation by this association shall represent to Quarterly Meetings and to the annual session by letter and fees; but shall not have the right to vote by delegates, standing or otherwise, in either quarterly meetings to the annual session as long as such church is on probation. Exception; any minister who is a member of such church is in good standing with this association and pastoring another church shall not be so penalized.

Section II No minister having been put on probation by this association shall have the right to vote in either quarterly meetings or the annual session.

Section III It is expected that all pastors of churches of this body will be members of this association. If a church of this association has a pastor who is not a member of this association after one year's time; such church es shall be placed on probation.

ARTICLE VII AMENDMENTS

Section I This constitution and rules of decorum may be amended at any annula session of this association by a two-thirds vote of delegates present; provided proposed amendment is presented in writing, read one day, placed on the table, and adopted the next

RULES OF DECORUM

- 1. This Association shall be called to order and presided over by officers elected at the last session.
- The Association shall be opened and closed by singing and prayer.
- The names of delegated shall be noted and referred to as ofter as is necessary.
- 4. The Moderator shall bot be entitled to a vote except in case of a tie and then he shall give the deciding vote. He shall be entitled to speak on any subject after others have spoken, provided someone else serves as Moderator which he speaks.
- 5. Only one person shall speak at a time and he shall arise and address the Moderator, and after recognition by the Moderator, he shall proceed.
- No person shall be interrupted while speaking unless he shall depart from the subject under discussion or use words of personal reflection.
- 7. No person will be allowed to speak more than twice on the same subject without permission from the Association nor more than fifteen (15) minutes at a time.
 - 8. No person shall laugh or talk while discussion is going on.
- No delegate shall absent himself from the Association without leave of Moderator.
- 10. Any minister absent from the Annual Session of this Association for two years in succession without legal excuse shall be droppped from the roll of ministers.
