PROCEEDINGS

Proceedings of the eighty-eighth annual session of the Jasper Free Will Baptist Association.

. The body was called into session Friday morning October 4, 1974 by the moderator. Rev. Pearl P. Barnes, host pastor, welcomed us to Cedrom Grove Church; and also led in a period of devotion. The response to the welcome was given by Letus Atkinson.

A partial report was given by the Credential Committee approving letters from all churches except Poplar Log and Parrish. A request from Poplar Log that they be dropped from the association was also noted. A motion carried adopting each of the items. (See Reports) The moderator appointed Rev. Dennis Kizzire to assist the clerk in reading church letters. Letters were read and delegates seated.

Nominations were made to General Board for terms expiring in 1974 and other vacancies. A motion carried to elect by acclamation. An Executive Committee was elected by the General Board consisting of Allen Brasseal, Pearl P. Barnes, Lowell Parker, Floy Franks and Letus Atkinson along with moderator and clerk.

Because it was necessary for the moderator to be away in the afternoon, he named Rev. W. B. Hughes to preside over General Board Meeting; and Rev. N. A. Patterson to preside in the sanctuary.

The Woman's Auxiliary Report was read. A motion carried accepting the same. (See Reports)

Rev. James F. Walden brought the message in the worship service. An offering of \$85.83 was received for missions.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON

After song and prayer the moderator asked the General Board to assemble outside for their annual meeting.

A motion carried to accept the report of Quart-

erly Meeting as read. (See Reports)

The rest of the afternoon was given to messages by Rev. Donnie Gunnin and Rev. Billy Robbins.

Rev. Otis Parmer was recognized as a visiting brother from Vernon Association.

SATURDAY MORNING

A period of devotion was conducted by Rev. Woodrow Matthews, hos pastor. Brother Matthews welcomed us to Mt. Olive Church.

Rev. Kenneth Walker was recognized; and gave a

brief report of the mission work in Mobile.

The clerk called the names of all delegates; and a motion carried to seat them. The roll of ministers was also called and most were present.

A motion carried accepting the Appreciation Com-

mittee Report. (See Reports)

A motion carried accepting the Obituary Report. A period of silent prayer was observed in memory of those named. (See Reports)

A motion carried accepting the report of Board

of Christian Education. (See Reports)

After the reading of the Finance Report, a motion carried accepting the same. (See Reports)

The moderator named delegates to other associations as follows; Vernon: O. Z. Johnson, Ella Markham, Lela Akers, Gurley Roberts; Mississippi State Line: Gurley Roberts; North Alabama; Ray Ritch. By general consent it was agreed that the moderator would name delegates to the State Association at the time of that session.

The General Board Report was read by the clerk. A motion carried that report be accepted and adopt item by item. Subsequent motions carried adopting

each of the items. (See Reports)

Some time was spent discussing Article 6 Section 3 of the Constitution. A motion carried that this matter be referred to the General Board for consideration sometime before next annual session. Such meeting is to be open; and the General Board is expected to make recommendation at next annual session.

The Credential Committee Report was read; and motion carried to accept the same. Subsequent mo-

tions carried adopting each of the items.

Rev. Ray Ritch gave brief report of upcoming

State Association to be held in Florence.

CONSTITUTION ARTICLE I NAME AND MEMBERSHIP

SECTION I This association shall be known as the Jasper Free Will Baptist Association of Alabama; and shall be composed of ordained ministers, deacons, members of the General Board, and delegates from the several churches forming the same. All ordained ministers, deacons and members of the General Board shall be considered standing delegates provided they are members and in good standing with a local church is in good standing with this body.

SECTION II Churches wishing to become a member of this association must adopt its articles of Faith, the National Treaties and make formal written request. Each church shall be entitled to three (3) delegates.

ARTICLE II AUTHORITY

Section I This body shall be considered an advisory council having no authority over the internal affairs of any local church unless said church depart from the Articles of Faith and from the National Treatise. Whenever conditions warrant it, this association shall have power to reprimand or exclude any local church.

Section II The association shall have power to deal with ministers who may become guilty of deviating from Free Will Baptist Doctrine, whose character may become questionable; or who shall in any other way conduct himself so as to bring reproach upon the ministry.

Section III All questions of doctrine and all matters pertaining to a local church, or to an individual minister or group of ministers. shall be decided by a two-thirds vote of this association. All other matters shall require only a majority. Exception; any church desiring membership in this body must obtain unanimous vote of delegated body when in annual session.

Section IV Each church of this association shall be urged to promote an support all state and National Projects of the demonination.

Section V No church shall have the right to accept as members those who have not been baptized by an ordained minister.

ARTICLE III ORGANIZATION

Section I The officers of this association shall be a moderator, and assistant clerk-treasurer who shall be elected annually.

Section II Other governing organs of this association shall be a General Board, and Executive Committee, a Credential Committee, and as many other committees as deemed necessary by the moderator

Section III The General Board shall consist of the moderator and clerk along with one person from each church that is a part of this body. Each person from the local churches shall serve for two years with one half being elected each year as so specified in the printed minute. It shall be the responsibility of the board to formulate all items of general business during the annual session of this association as well as any other responsibility so relegated by the moderator or the body. When this association is not in session, this board shall have power to act as the body; but such action must be approved by the association.

Section IV The Executive Committee shall consist of the moderator and clerk along with five(5) others from the General Board. These five shall be elected each year by the General Board. This committee shall function as-or instead of-the General Board. when directed to do so by the moderator, the General Board or the Association.

Section V The Credential Committee shall consist of three (3) persons with the senior member in point of service replaced each year. Recommendations for replacement shall come from the General Board. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to

examine all letters coming to this body from churches, ministers. and other associations. This committee shall also examine all ministers who become a part of this body either by ordination or by letter. It is expected that all ministers coming from other associations will present letters of recommendation; however in some cases the committee may see fit to recommend the acceptances of such persons who have not yet received such letters. Any item of business pertaining to ministers of conduct of ministers must originate with this committee. Business matters handled by this committee may be referred to the association or to the General

Section VI The moderator of this association shall be regarded as Board. an ex-official member of all boards and committees.

Section VIICandidates for ordination to the ministry shall present their request for ordination to the Credential Committee at least by the time of the last QuarterlyMeeting before the Annual Session using forms prepared and approved by this body.

Section VIII Preachers coming to us from other association or from other denominations, shall present their requests to the Credential Committee at time of a Quarterly Meeting or Annual Session. Such requests shall be acted upon at time of following Quarterly Meeting or Annual Session.

ARTICLE IV MEETINGS

Section I This association shall meet annually on Friday before the first Sunday in October at a place determined at the previous session; and shall not adjourn finally until all business is tran-

Section II The associational year shall end August 31 each year sacted. and all letters to the association should be mailed to the clerk no later than the first Sunday in September of each year.

Section III There shall also be as many Quarterly Meetings as shall be deemed necessary during each year.

Section IV The officers of the Quarterly Meeting shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a clerk-treasurer, and an assistant Clerk-treasurer, who shall be elected annually.

ARTICLE V ORDINATIONS

Section I Each church shall have the right to select and ordain all deacons who serve in such church. The ordaining council shall consist of two ministers and at least one deacon; or of one minister and at least two deacons.

Section II Any man who becomes convinced that the Lord has called him to preach the gospel shall be licensed by the church of which he is a member. After he has been licensed for a period of time and has proved his worth the local church shall than make formal request to this association that he be ordained. This local church, of which he is a member, and which licensed him, must be able to show proof of his worthiness as to his ability, sincerity and desire. If after he has been examined by the responsible ones of this body, he then be found worthy; he shall be ordained by this association. All ordinations to the ministry must be done at the annual session.

Section III All ministers are required to report yearly to the Credential Committee of this body. Such report shall be for year beginning September 1 and ending August 31; and shall be due September 1 of current year. Any minister who fails to comply shall be dropped from the roll of ministers.

"ARTICLE VI" DISCIPLINE

Section I Any church placed on probation by this association shall represent to Quarterly Meetings and to the annual session by letter and fees; but shall not have the right to vote by delegates, standing or otherwise, in either quarterly meetings to the annuyal session as long as such church is on probation. Exception; any minister who is a member of such church is in good standing with this association and pastoring another church shall not be so penalized.

Section II No minister having been put on probation by this association shall have the right to vote in either quarterly meetings or the annual session.

Section III It is expected that all pastors of churches of this body will be members of this association. If a church of this association has a pastor who is not a member of this association after one year's time; such church es shall be placed on probation.

ARTICLE VII AMENDMENTS

Section I This constitution and rules of decorum may be amended at any annula session of this association by a two-thirds vote of delegates present; provided proposed amendment is presented in writing, read one day, placed on the table, and adopted the next

RULES OF DECORUM

- 1. This Association shall be called to order and presided over by officers elected at the last session.
- 2. The Association shall be opened and closed by singing and
- 3. The names of delegated shall be noted and referred to as ofter prayer.
- 4. The Moderator shall bot be entitled to a vote except in case of a as is necessary. tie and then he shall give the deciding vote. He shall be entitled to speak on any subject after others have spoken, provided someone else serves as Moderator which he speaks.
- 5. Only one person shall speak at a time and he shall arise and address the Moderator, and after recognition by the Moderator, he

- 7. No person will be allowed to speak more than twice on the same subject without permission from the Association - nor more than fifteen (15) minutes at a time.
