PROCEEDINGS

The ninetieth session of the Jasper Free Will Baptist Association of Alabama convened at Cedrom Grove Free Will Baptist Church, Carbon Hill, Alabama Friday, October 1, 1976 at 9:00 A.M.

The session opened with the congregation singing "I Never Shall Forget That Day" led by Rev. Ray Ritch. Rev. Danny Thompson prayed the opening prayer.

The moderator introduced Rev. Pearl P. Barnes, pastor of the local church, who led in a devotional service. He read from 1 John 3:1-3 and after some comments led in prayer.

The welcome address was given by Walter Lewellen and the response by Brother Bill Nicholson.

The moderator, Rev. O. Z. Johnson, called the session to order for business. A partial report of the Credentials Committee was read and a motion made. seconded and carried to receive the report and adopt item by item. Item number one was read and adopted. Roger Houston and Mrs. Margie Bardbury. They sang "This Is What Heaven Means To Me." After the congregation had sung, "Some Day," Rev. Holley Wayne Spiller sang "The Only Thing There Made By Man Are The Sears In The Hands Of Jesus."

Rev. O. Z. Johnson brought the moderator's message using as his subject "Free Will Baptist Doctrine." He read The Articles of Faith one through nine and expounded each one of them. After an invitation was given, Rev. Pearl Barnes, pastor of the church. made some announcements concerning the noon meal. Rev. J. A. REPORT OF QUARTERLY MEETING TO

ASSOCIATION OCT. 1-2, 1976

The Quarterly Meeting of the Jasper Association held four (4) meetings during the 1975-76 Associational year. They were held with: New Liberty Church on December 6, 1975; Mt. Pleasant Church on February 28, 1976; Free Waters Church on May 29, 1976; and Pocahontas Church on August 28, 1976.

The following churches were represented at all four meetings: Bear Creek, Bethlehem, Brilliant, Carbon Hill, Cedrom Grove, Edgars Chapel, Free Waters, Good Springs, Guin, Gum Springs, Liberty, Mt. Olive, New Liberty, Mt. Pleasant, New Oak Grove, Pocahontas, Shady Grove, Union Chapel, Union Hill, Winfield, Hackleburg, and Hamilton.

Holly Springs represented at three (3) meetings; Red Bay at Two (2) meetings; and Lone Star and Spring Hill at one (1) meeting.

There were twenty (20) ministers, two (2) visiting ministers and nine (9) deacons present at the meeting on December 6, 1975; Twenty-six (26) ministers and twelve (12) deacons present at the meeting on February 28, 1976; Twenty-three (23) ministers and thirteen (13) deacons present at the meeting on May 29, 1976; and Twenty-two (22) ministers and ten (10) deacons present at the meeting on August 28, 1976.

GENERAL BOARD

The General Board met September 27, 1976 at the Hamilton Free Will Baptist Church and passed the following recommendations:

1. We recommend that Brother O.Z. Johnson be placed on the Credentials Com-

2. We recommend the following men to serve on the Board of Christian Education: Rev. Donnie Gunnin for a five (5) year term and Rev. Richard Cordell to finish the unexpired term of Rev. Dennis Haygood which expires in 1979.

3. We recommend that the clerk be paid one hundred thrity-five dollars, the moderator sixty-five dollars, the assistant moderator twenty dollars and the assistant clerk fifty dollars.

4. We recommend that the first Quarterly Meeting (October 30, 1976) go to Good Springs, the second (January 29, 1977) to Hamilton, the third (May 28, 1977) to Carbon Hill and the fourth of (July 30, 1977) to Edgar's Chapel. We recommend that the first session of the Jasper Association (September 30, 1977) be held at the youth camp and the second session (October 1, 1977) at Hamilton.

5. We recommend that each church send an offering to each annual session for retired ministers, and that each church support this cause regularly. We also recommend that each church support regularly the cause of foreign missions, home missions, Children's Home and Bible College.

6. We recommend that money for retired ministers be given to Rev. J. A. Godsey

7. We recommend that each church urge its General Board member to attend the meeting of the board.

8. We recommend that the first Sunday in NovOmber (November 7) be designated as Youth Camp Day.

Note: There is an indebtedness of \$20,000 on the camp. The note will be due in July of 1977. By paying this note on or before it is due, we can save interest.

9. Because the youth camp needs consistent support, we recommend that each church give a minimum of 2 percent of its overall budget to the camp.

10. We recommend that W. B. Hughes be retained on the Youth Camp Board of Directors.

Art. 4. We believe that the grace of God comprehends all spiritual blessings; That the Gospel is the power unto salvation; that the Holy Spirit not only reproves the world of sin but is the means whereby sinners are converted, regenerated and saved. —Romans 10:12

Art. 5. We believe that Christian faith is belief in Jesus Christ, the Son of God and Redeemer of the world and in the inspiration of the Holy Scriptures; That faith comes by hearing and hearing by the word of God. —John 3:16

Art. 6. We believe that repentance is sorrow for sin and the kind of sorrow which constitutes Godly repentance must be preceded by effectual conviction. 2 Cor. 7:9-

Art. 8. We do not believe under the gospel dispensation that any soul is elected to eternal life unconditionally but that those who by faith persevere to the end will be saved; that it is possible for men who have been converted to make shipwreck of faith, turn again to sin and be finally lost. -Luke 9:62.

Art. 9. We believe that good works is the result of faith and that those who have not faith can not do anything pleasing or acceptable to God. -Matt. 7:19-20.

Act. 10. We believe that Christian baptism is in the emersion of a believer in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, that baptism can not be spiritually administered without faith in the subject who receives it. -Romans 6:4.

Art. 11. We believe the Supper instituted by our Savior is a recommendable ordinance; that it was instituted by Christians and that all Christians unite in observing the sacred service, regardless of name or denominational distinction. -1 Cor. 2:18-20.

Art. 12. We believe that man is a living soul, that the body will die; but the soul is immortal; that death is the separation of the mortal and immortal parts of human beings. Gen. 2:7.

Art. 13. We believe in the resurrection of the dead. CONSTITUTION ARTICLEI NAME AND MEMBERSHIP

SECTION I This association shall be known as the Jasper Free Will Baptist Association of Alabama; and shall be composed of ordained ministers, deacons, members of the General Board, and delegates from the several churches forming the same, All ordained ministers, deacons, and members of the General Board shall be considered standing delegates provided they are members and in good standing with a local church in good standing with this body.

SECTION II Churches wishing to become a member of this association must adopt its articles of Faith, the National Treaties and make formal written request. Each church shall be entitled to three (3) delegates.

SECTION II Other governing organs of this association shall be a General Board, an Executive Committee, a Credential Committee, and as many other committees as deemed necessary by the moderator. SECTION III The General Board shall consist of the moderator and clerk along with one person from each church that is a part of this body. Each person from the local churches shall serve for two years with one half being elected each year as so specified in the printed minute. It shall be the responsibility of the board to formulate all items of general business during the annual session of this association as well as any other responsibility so relegated by the moderator or the body. When this association is not in session, this board shall have power to act as the body; but such action must be approved by the association. SECTION IV The Executive Committee shall consist of the moderator and clerk

along with five (5) others from the General Board. These five shall be elected each year by the General Board. This committee shall function as - or instead of - the General Board, when directed to do so by the moderator, the General Board or the Association.

SECTION V The Credential Committee shall consist of three (3) persons with the senior member in point of service replaced each year. Recommendations for replacement shall come from the General Board. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to examine all letters coming to this body from churches, ministers, and other associations. This committee shall also examine all ministers who become a part of this body either by ordination or by letter. It is expected that all ministers coming from other associations will present letters of recommendation; however in some cases the committee may see fit to recommend the

ARTICLE II AUTHORITY

SECTION I This body shall be considered an advisory council having no authority over the internal affairs of any local church unless said church depart from the Articles of Faith and from the National Treatise. Whenever conditions warrant it, this association shall have power to reprimand or exclude any local

SECTION II The association shall have power to deal with ministers who may become guilty of deviating from Free Will Baptist Doctrine, whose character may become questionable; or who shall in any other way conduct himself so as to bring reproach upon the ministry.

SECTION III All questions of doctrine and all matters pertaining to a local church, or to an individual minister or group of ministers, shall be decided by a two-thirds vote of this association. All other matters shall require only a majority. Exception: any church desiring membership in this body must obtain unanimous vote of delegated body when in annual session.

SECTION IV Each church of this association shall be urged to promote and support all state and national projects of the denomination.

SECTION V No church shall have the right to accept as members those who have not been baptized by an ordained minister.

ARTICLE III ORGANIZATION

SECTION I The officers of this association shall be a moderator, and assistant

acceptances of such persons who have not yet received such letters. Any item of business pertaining to ministers or conduct of ministers must originate with this committee. Business matters handled by this committee may be referred to the association or to the General Board.

SECTION VI The moderator of this association shall be regarded as an ex-officio member of all board and committees.

SECTION VII Candidates for ordination to the ministry shall present their request for ordination to the Credential Committee at least by the time of the last Quarterly Meeting before the Annual Session using forms prepared and approved by this body.

SECTION VIII Preachers coming to us from other associations or from other denominations, shall present their requests to the Credential Committee at time of a Quarterly Meeting or Annual Session. Such requests shall be acted upon at time of following Quarterly Meeting or Annual Session.

ARTICLE IV MEETINGS

SECTION I This association shall meet annually on Friday before the first Sunday in October at a place determined at the previous session; and shall not adjourn finally until all business is transacted.

SECTION II The associational year shall end August 31 each year and all letters to the association should be mailed to the clerk no later than the first Sunday in September of each year.

SECTION III There shall also be as many Quarterly Meetings as shall be deemed necessary during each year.

SECTION IV The officers of the Quarterly Meeting shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a clerk-treasurer, and an assistant clerk-treasurer, who shall be elected annualy.

ARTICLE V ORDINATIONS

SECTION I Each church shall have the right to select and ordain all deacons who serve in such church. Th ordaining council shall consist of two ministers and at least one deacon; or of one minister and at least two deacons.

SECTION II Any man who becomes convinced that the Lord has called him to preach the Gospel shall be licensed by the church of which he is a member. After he has been licensed for a period of one year and has proved his worth the local church shall then make formal request to this association that he be ordained. This local church, of which he is a member, and which licensed him, must be able to show proof of his worthiness as to his ability, sincerity and desire. If after he has been examined by the responsible ones of this body, he then be found worthy, he shall be ordained by this association. All ordinations to the ministry must be done at the annual session or a quarterly meeting. (Amended October 2, 1976)

SECTION III All ministers are required to report yearly to the Credential Committee of this body. Such report shall be for year beginning September 1 and ending August 31; and shall be due September 1 of current year. Any minister who fails to comply shall be dropped from the roll of ministers. ARTICLE VI DISCIPLINE

SECTION I Any church placed on probation by this association shall represent to Quarterly Meetings and to the annual session by letter and fees; but shall not have the right to vote by delegates, standing or otherwise, in either quarterly meetings to the annual session as long as such church is on probation. Exception: Any minister who is a member of such church is in good standing with this association and pastoring another church shall not be so penalized.

SECTION II No minister having been put on probation by this association shall have the right to vote in either quarterly meetings or the annual session.

SECTION III "The Pastor, who preaches, the Word of God, ministers to the needs of the members, and exercises general leadership within the congregation. It is expected that he will unite with the local church if he is not a member when called. When the minister becomes pastor of a given local church, is his responsibility to obtain good standing in the association of which that church is a member if he is not already in good standing therein. The association may, for example, refuse to seat delegates from a local church if there is a breach of fellowship being dealt with." (National Treatise, 1969 Page 50A. Page 59B, Page 63B.) ARTICLE VII AMENDMENTS

RULES OF DECORUM

1. This Association shall be called to order by the moderator and presided over by officers elected at the last session.

2. The Association shall be opened and closed by singing and prayer.

The names of delegated shall be noted and referred to as often as is necessary.
The Moderator shall not be entitled to a vote except in case of a tie and then he shall give the deciding vote. He shall be entitled to speak on any subject after others have spoken, provided someone else serves as Moderator while he speaks.
Only one person shall speak at a time and he shall arise and address the Moderator, and after recognition by the Moderator, he shall proceed.

No person shall be interrupted while speaking unless he shall depart from the subject under discussion or use words of personal reflection.

7. No person will be allowed to speak more than twice on the same subject without permission from the Association – nor more than fifteen (15) minutes at a

9. No delegate shall absent himself from the Association without leave of loderator.

10. Any minister absent from the Annual Session of this Association for two years in succession without legal excuse shall be dropped from the roll of ministers.
