

## PROCEEDINGS

The ninety-third session of the Jasper Association of Free Will Baptists convened with Hackleburg Free Will Baptist Church, Hackleburg, Alabama, October 5, 1979 at 9:00 a.m. Rev. Roger Houston was moderator.

The session opened with congregation singing "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms" and "Tis So Sweet To Trust In Jesus" led by Rev. Jay Sullins. Rev. Malone Cobb prayed the opening prayer. Rev. Johnny Sexton, Pastor of Cooper Free Will Baptist Church, brought the devotion. He read from Ecclesiastes 11:6 and made some comments. He closed with prayer. Rev. Lamar Cox, Pastor of the host church, gave the welcome. Response was by Rev. O. Z. Johnson.

The moderator appointed the following committees: Obituary, Della Mae Roberts, Gail Gunnin, Elmira York. Appreciations: Zora Nelson, Nelladean Sparks, Kathleen Boshell. Finance: Paul Jaggers, Dewey Burleson, Walter Lewellen.

A partial report of the Credentials Committee was read by Rev. A. J. Looper. Motion made, seconded and carried to receive and adopt item by item. Items 1 through 4 were carried. The right hand of fellowship was given to the pastor, deacons, and delegates from the Cooper Free Will Baptist Church.

The moderator recognized Rev. Carthell Nalls from the Beaver Creek Free Will Baptist Association.

After the clerk and assistant clerk had called the roll of delegates, Rev. Donnie Gunnin made a motion and it was seconded and carried to seat the delegates.

The report of the General Board was read by the clerk. A motion was made, seconded and carried to receive the report and adopt item by item. Items 1 through 10 were adopted. Item 11 contained a Constitutional change and was of necessity tabled. Item 12 was adopted and the incoming members of the General Board elected.

Rev. Ray Ritch announced the Alabama State Association to be held with the Dothan Free Will Baptist Church November 8, 9, and 10, 1979. Brother Bill Foster, representative of the National Sunday School and Church Training Board, brought greetings and explained the program of the Board. Motion made, seconded and carried to receive the report as information.

The report of the Quarterly Meeting was read and a motion was made, seconded and carried to adopt the report.

Motion made, seconded and carried that each church send a donation of \$10 for the entertainment of the Association at North West Free Will Baptist Youth Camp on Saturday, October 4, 1980.

A moderator declared a recess. Rev. Ray Ritch led in prayer.

## MORNING SERVICE

The morning service was opened with singing "I Feel Like Traveling On" and "It Was Love" led by Rev. Jay Sullins. Mrs. Nellie Jackson sang "Broken Pieces" as the special music. Rev. Roger Houston brought the Moderator's message. He read Romans 8:10-17 and preached from the subject: "Mature Christians." He said Mature Christians are able to hear the Word of God, comprehend spiritual things, control the three most tempesteous parts of the body. They are to be able to stand, remember, admonish others and to teach others. "Where He Leads Me" was sung as the invitation song.

Rev. Lamar Cox, pastor of the host church, made the announcements concerning the noon meal. Rev. Woodrow Matthews led in prayer.

#### AFTERNOON SESSION

The afternoon session was opened with the congregation singing "Fill My Way With Love" and "Everybody Will Be Happy Over There" led by Rev. Jay Sullins. The afternoon message was brought by Rev. Fred Jones, Pastor of Free Water Free Will Baptist Church. He read from 1 Timothy Chapter 4 and preached about the cults and occult. He warned against principalities and powers, the rulers of the darkness of this world and spiritual wickedness in high places. The service was closed with an altar prayer.

Mrs. Gail Gunnin read the report of the Obituary Committee: A motion was made, seconded and carried to adopt the report. The Moderator asked the congregation to stand in a few moments of silent prayer in memory of those who have gone on to be with the Lord. Rev. Mike Cordell led in prayer.

Rev. Carthell Nalls thanked the Association for helping the New Hope Free Will Baptist Church of Guin, Alabama to build a new building.

The session was dismissed to meet with Red Bay Free Will Baptist Church, Saturday, October 6, 1979.

## SATURDAY MORNING

The Saturday morning session opened with the congregation singing "Glory to His Name" and "Sunlight, Sunlight" led by Rev. Jay Sullins. Rev. Pearl P. Barnes gave the devotion. He read I Corinthians 13:11 and Matthew 5:48 and made some comments. Brother Donnie Gunnin led in prayer. Rev. Leroy Forelines from Free Will Baptist Bible College, Rev. Louie Bates from Birmingham District Association and Rev. Pat Butrum from the Free Will Baptist Children's Home were recognized as visitors. The Moderator called for a roll call of delegates. Motion made, seconded and carried to seat the delegates who were not present in the Friday session. The clerk called the roll of ministers. Rev. Bryon Meyer and Rev. Malone Cobb were appointed as fraternal delegates to the Vernon Association.

Rev. Pat Butram gave the report of the Home for Children, Eldridge, Alabama. He reported 22 children at the home with 8 teenage boys. Rev. A. J. Looper explained the Parents and Mothers program of the Home. A motion was made, seconded and carried to receive the report as information.

Rev. Woodrow Matthews read the report of the Board of Christian Education. Motion made, seconded and carried to adopt the report. The report of the North West Alabama Free Will Baptist Youth camp was read by Rev. Woodrow Matthews and a motion made, seconded and carried to adopt the report.

Rev. O. Z. Johnson made a motion and it was seconded and carried to take from the table item 11 of the General Board report. Motion made, seconded and carried to adopt the report.

The final report of the Credentials Committee was made and a motion made, seconded and carried to adopt item by item. All items were adopted by motion and seconded.

Brother Don Collins gave the report of the treasurer. Motion made, seconded and passed to adopt the report.

A motion was made, seconded and carried that the Association give \$200 toward the expense of the Pastors' and Workers' conference to be held at Muscle Shoals Free Will Baptist Church February 11-13, 1980.

The Appreciations Committee report was read and adopted.

The following officers were elected for the ensuing year: Moderator, Rev. Roger Houston, Assistant Moderator, Bro. Walter Sloan, Clerk, Rev. W. B. Hughes, Assistant Clerk, Rev. Danny Thompson, Treasurer, Bro. Don Collins.

A motion was made, seconded and carried to accept the partial report of the Finance Committee's report and instruct the clerk to complete the report.

#### MORNING SERVICE

The morning service began with the congregation singing "Praise Him! Praise Him!" led by Rev. Jay Sullins. Rev. Richard Cordell led in prayer. The Moderator introduced Rev. Leroy Forelines for the morning message. He brought greetings from Free Will Baptist Bible College and gave the following information: Report on the inauguration of Dr. Charles A. Thigpen as President of the college, 525 students enrolled for the fall semester and campus revival with Rev. Godron Sebestian. He reported that Alabama gave 13 percent over its quota for last year. The quota for '79-'80 is \$43,500.

Following this report Rev. Forlines read Psalms 143:10 and preached on seeking, finding and doing God's will. At the end of the message he concluded with the following thoughts. Nothing is the will of God that contradicts Scripture. Don't neglect your own desires if it does not contradict the will of God. It will appear reasonable to others.

One will recognize the responsibility of the church is not his alone. The will of God will be joyful and fruitful. It will come with the available opportunities.

An offering of \$105.40 was received.

Rev. Danny Thompson, Pastor of the host church, made announcements concerning the noon meal. After some other announcements had been made, a motion was made, seconded and carried to adjourn the session. Rev. Danny Thompson led the closing prayer.

## GENERAL BOARD REPORT

The General Board of the Jasper Association of Free Will Baptist met September 29, 1979 at Hamilton Free Will Baptist Church. Moderator Roger Houston presided over the meeting. The Meeting was opened with a song. Prayer was by Brother Jerry Stephens. Brother W. A. Roberts read Psalms 24:1 and made some comments.

The following recommendations were discussed and passed:

1. We recommend that Brother Donnie Gunnin be elected to the Credentials Committee for a three year term.

2. We recommend that Brother Richard Hendrix be elected to the Board of Christian Education. His term to expire in 1984.

3. We recommend that the moderator be paid sixty-five (65) dollars, the assistant moderator twenty (20) dollars, the clerk one hundred thirty five (135) dollars, the assistant clerk fifty (50) dollars and the treasurer seventy-five (75) dollars.

4. We recommend that the first quarterly meeting be held January 12, 1980 instead of December 29, 1979. We recommend that this meeting be held at Mt. Pleasant Free Will Baptist Church. We recommend that the March 29th meeting be held with New Liberty Free Will Baptist Church at their invitation. We recommend that the June 28th meeting be held with Cedrom Grove Free Will Baptist Church.

We recommend that the first day of the annual meeting (October 3, 1980) be held with New Liberty Free Will Baptist Church at their invitation, and the second day (October 4) be held at the North West Alabama Free Will Baptist Youth Camp.

5. We recommend that the money for retired ministers be divided equally between those who are retired at this time.

6. We recommend that each church send an offering to each annual meeting for retired ministers and that each church support this cause regularly. We also recommend that each church support regularly the causes of foreign missions, home missions, home for children and Free Will Baptist Bible College.

7. We recommend that each church urge its General Board member to attend the meeting of the General Board.

8. We recommend that the first Sunday in November (November 4) be designated as Youth Camp Sunday.

B. We recommend that each church give a minimum of 2 percent of its overall budget to the Youth Camp.

9. We recommend that Brother A. J. Looper be elected to the Youth Camp Board of Directors.

10. We recommend that the church send as many men delegates to the associational meetings as possible.

11. We recommend that Article VIII, Section IV. of the Constitution be changed to read as follows: Preachers coming to us from other Free Will Baptist Associations shall present their requests for membership to the Credentials Committee at the time of a Quarterly Meeting or the Annual Session, and said request may be acted on at that session.

B. Preachers coming to us from other denominations shall present their requests to the Credentials Committee at the time of a Quarterly Meeting or the annual session. Such request shall be acted upon at the time of the following quarterly meeting or annual session.

12. We recommend that the following men be elected to the General Board.

## CHURCH COVENANT

## CONSTITUTION OF THE JASPER ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

## ARTICLEI

## NAME

This body shall be known as the Jasper Association of Free Will Baptists of Alabama.

## ARTICLE II

### MEMBERSHIP

SECTION I. The membership of the Jasper Association shall consist of all churches that, upon the approval of this body, shall become members.

SECTION II. A local church that wishes to become a member of this Association must adopt the National Treaties and make formal written request. A two-thirds vote of the delegates present must be recorded.

#### ARTICLE III

### REPRESENTATION

Each church holding membership in this Association shall be entitled to three (3) delegates. Ministers and deacons who are in good standing with this Association and members of the General Board shall be standing delegates.

### **ARTICLE IV**

## OFFICERS

The officers of the Jasper Association shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a clerk, an assistant clerk, and a treasurer each of whom shall be elected at the close of each regular session.

#### **ARTICLEV**

#### BOARDS

SECTION I. General Board (a) Composition. The General Board shall be composed of the moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, assistant clerk, and treasurer, and one member from each local church that is a part of this body. Each member from a local church shall serve a two year term with one-half of the members being elected each year. (b) Executive committee. An Executive Committee shall consist of the moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, and treasurer, and five (5) members from the General Board. These five members shall be elected annually by the General Board. This committee shall function as the General Board when said Board is not in session. (c) Duties. The General Board shall formulate all items of general business during the annual session of the Association, as well as any other responsibility so delegated by the body. When this Association is not in session, this Board shall have power to act as the body.

SECTION II. Board of Christian Education. The Board of Christian Education shall consist of five (5) members. Each member shall serve for a five (5) year term with one term expiring each year.

SECTION III. Directors of North West Alabama Free Will Baptist Youth Camp. The directors of North West Alabama Free Will Baptist Youth Camp shall be composed of three (3) members who shall serve for a term of three (3) years each with one term expiring each year.

## **ARTICLE VI**

### STANDING COMMITTEES

SECTION I. Credentials Committee. The Credentials Committee shall consist of three (3) persons with the senior member in point of service replaced each year. Recommendations for replacement shall come from the General Board. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to examine all letters coming to this body from churches, ministers, and other associations. This committee shall also examine all ministers who become a part of this body either by ordination or by letter. It is expected that all ministers coming from other associations will present letters of recommendation; however, in some cases the committee may see fit to recommend the acceptance of such persons who have not yet received such letters. Any item of business pertaining to ministers or conduct of ministers should be presented first to this committee. Business matters handled by this committee may be referred to the Association or to the General Board.

SECTION II. The moderator of this Association shall be an ex-officio member of all boards and committees.

## ARTICLE VII

## MEETINGS

SECTION I. This Association shall meet annually on Friday before the first Sunday in October at a place determined at the previous session; and shall not adjourn finally until all business is transacted.

SECTION II. The associational year shall end August 31st and all letters to the Association should be mailed to the clerk no later than the third (3rd) Sunday in September of each year.

SECTION III. There shall be three (3) quarterly meetings during each associational year. The annual meeting of the Association shall take the place of the fourth (4th) quarterly meeting.

SECTION IV. The officers of the Jasper Association shall serve as the officers of the Quarterly Meeting.

#### ARTICLE VIII ORDINATIONS

SECTION I. Any man who becomes convinced that the Lord has called him to preach the Gospel shall be licensed by the church of which he is a member. (The church should contact the Credentials Committee for a copy of "Guidelines for Licensed Ministers") After he has been licensed for a period of one (1) year and has proved his worth, the local church shall then make formal request to this Association that he be ordained. The local church, of which he is a member, must be able to show proof of his worthiness as to his character, doctrine, ability, sincerity, and desire. If after he has been examined by the responsible ones of this body, he then be found worthy, he shall be ordained by this Association. All ordinations to the ministry must be approved at the annual session or a quarterly meeting. SECTION II. Each church shall have the right to select and ordain all deacons who serve in such church. The ordaining council shall consist of two ordained ministers and at least one deacon or one ordained minister and at least two deacons.

SECTION III. Candidates for ordination to the ministry shall present their request for ordination to the Credentials Committee at least by the time of the last regular meeting before the ordination using forms prepared and approved by this body.

SECTION IV. Preachers coming to us from other Free Will Baptist Associations shall present their requests for membership to the Credentials Committee at the time of a quarterly meeting of the annual session, and said requests may be acted on at that session.

B. Preachers coming to us from other denominations shall present their requests to the Credentials Committee at the time of a quarterly meeting or the annual session. Such requests shall be acted upon at the time of the following quarterly meeting or annual session.

Revised October 6, 1979.

SECTION V. All ministers are required to report yearly to the Credentials Committee of this body. Such report shall be for year beginning September 1st and ending August 31st, and shall be due September 1st of current year. Any minister who fails to comply shall be dropped from the roll of ministers.

## ARTICLEIX

#### DISCIPLINE

SECTION I. This body shall be considered an advisory council having no authority over the internal affairs of any local church unless said church depart from the Articles of Faith or from the National Treatise. Whenever conditions warrant it, this Association shall have power to withdraw fellowship from any local church.

SECTION II. Any church being dealt with because of a disciplinary problem shall represent to the quarterly meeting and annual session by letter and fees, but shall not have the right to vote by delegates, standing or otherwise, until the matter is settled. Exception: Any minister who is a member of such church but is ministering to another church that is in good standing with the Association shall not be so penalized.

SECTION III. All questions of doctrine and all matters pertaining to a local church, or to an individual minister or group of ministers, shall be decided by a two-thirds vote of this Association.

SECTION IV. No minister whose conduct is being questioned by this Association shall have the right to vote in either the quarterly meeting or annual session.

SECTION V. The pastor, who preaches the Word of God, ministers to the needs of the members, and exercises general leadership within the congregation is expected to unite with that local church if he is not a member when called . . . "When the minister becomes pastor of a given local church, it is his responsibility to obtain good standing in the association of which that church is a member if he is not already in good standing therein." (A Treatise of the Faith and Practices of the Original Free Will Baptists, 1973 pp 50A.; Page 59B.

SECTION VI. Each church of this Association shall be urged to promote and support all district, state and national projects of the denomination.

SECTION VII. No church shall accept as members those who have not been baptized by an ordained minister.

## ARTICLEX

### AMENDMENTS

Section 1. This Constitution may be amended at any annual session of this association by a two-thirds vote of delegates present, provided proposed amendment is presented in writing, read one day, placed on the table, and adopted the next.

#### RULES OF DECORUM

1. This Association shall be called to order by the moderator and presided over by officers elected at the last session.

2. The association shall be opened and closed by singing and prayer.

3. The names of delegates shall be noted and referred to as often as is necessary.

4. The moderator shall not be entitled to a vote except in case of a tie and then he shall give the deciding vote. He shall be entitled to speak on any subject after others have spoken, provided someone else serves as moderator while he speaks.

5. Only one person shall speak at a time and he shall arise and address the moderator, and after recognition by the moderator, he shall proceed.

6. No person shall be interrupted while speaking unless he shall depart from the subject under discussion or use words of personal reflection.

7. No person will be allowed to speak more than twice on the same subject without permission from the moderator nor more than five (5) minutes at a time.

No person shall laugh or talk in a disturbing manner while discussion is going on.

9. No delegate shall absent himself from the association without leave of the moderator.

10. Any minister absent from the annual session of this association for two years in succession without legal excuse shall be dropped from the roll of ministers.

11. These Rules of Decorum may be amended at any annual session of this association by a two-thirds vote of delegates present, provided proposed amendment is presented in writing, read one day, placed on the table, and adopted the next.

## GUIDELINES

### FOR

### LICENSED MINISTERS IN THE JASPER ASSOCIATION

#### I. RULES PERTAINING TO THE LICENSED MINISTER

#### A. Qualifications for the Licensee

1. He must be a member of a church which belongs to the Jasper Association.

2. He must give evidence to his church that he is divinely called to preach, whereupon the local church is authorized to examine him for license. This examination should include the areas of the candidate's life, doctrine, reputation, and his convictions and abilities regarding the work of the ministry. His present and prospective educational qualifications should also be considered. Upon completion of such an examination, the local church shall determine whether or not to grant license. The ministerial license shall be valid for a period of one year but is renewable annually.

3. He must have his license renewed annually by said church and kept in force until ordination.

## B. The Activities of the Licensee

1. According to the general practices of Free Will Baptists, a licensed minister is urged to afford himself of every opportunity to preach the word. He is free to exercise all the privileges and responsibilities of an ordained minister with the exception of pastoring a church and officiating at the observances of the ordinances and weddings.

2. The licensee should consider the period between his receiving license and being ordained as a time of study and training in preparation for his calling.

## C. His Relationship to the Association

1. The clerk of the church should report the names of licensed ministers to the clerk of the Association who will forward a copy of these guidelines to each licensee.

2. Licensed ministers are urged and expected to attend the regular meetings of the Jasper Association and the Quarterly Meetings.

## **II. SUGGESTIONS FOR PREPARATION FOR ORDINATION**

A. Attend Free Will Baptist Bible College if possible.

## B. Attend ALABAMA BIBLE INSTITUTE.

C. Seek the counsel of an experienced pastor or pastors.

D. Make as thorough a study as possible of the following:

- 1. The Holy Bible
- 2. Systematic Theology
- 3. Homiletics
- 4. Pasteral Theology and Church Administration
- 5. Evangelism
- 6. Church History (especially, F.W.B. history)

## **III. A SUGGESTED SCHEDULE OF WORK LEADING TO ORDINATION**

A. As soon as licensee feels that he is qualified to become a candidate for ordination, he should request a list of study questions from the Credentials Committee of the Association. We would strongly encourage him to proceed with his examination before entertaining a definite call to a church.

B. At least two months before the Credentials Committee meets, he should secure the examination. He should make three copies of the completed examination (one for each member of the Committee), and send them to the Credentials Committee no later than two weeks before its meeting.

C. The candidate is required to pass an oral examination administered by the Committee.

D. The Committee will report to the candidate on whether he passed or what areas he may need additional study in.

E. When the approved candidate has passed the examination, the Committee will recommend his ordination to the Association. This recommendation will be made only after the candidate has been licensed for one full year. It is recommended that the candidate have definite prospects of a church pastorate or another form of Christian service that would justify his being ordained.
