

COMMITTEES

PROCEEDINGS

The Ninety-Sixth Session of the Jasper Association of Free Will Baptists convened with the Liberty Free Will Baptist Church October 1, 1982 at 9:00 A.M. Rev. Fred Jones, Moderator, presided over the session.

The session was opened with the congregation singing, "Blessed Assurance," led by Rev. Bud Hill. Rev. David Crowe led the opening prayer. Rev. Bud Hill led in singing, "Love Lifted Me." Rev. Fred Jones gave some opening remarks. Rev. Bud Hill led the congregation in singing, "Praise Him."

Rev. Donald Kivette brought the Morning Devotion on Galatians Chapter Six and encouraging everyone on the importance of perservance.

Rev. Dale Pitts, Pastor of the Host Church, gave the welcome. Rev. Hershel Beard gave the response.

The moderator appointed the following committees: OBITUARY: Joyce Lolley, Sister Patterson, Sister Barnes. APPRECIATION: Jane Yielding, Helen Tittle, Ruthie Miller. FINANCE: Chuck Eichwurtzle, Edgar Atkinson, Esther Following opening remarks by the Assistant Moderator on the responsibilities of delegates, the Clerk read the roll of delegates. Motion was made, seconded, and carried to seat the delegates for both days of the session. Each church was encouraged to designate the delegates for each session.

The moderator recognized visiting delegates at this time: P. A. & Audie Barnes from the Lovejoy F.W.B. Church, Rev. Jack Harder and Rev. Danny Ballard from the Mississippi-Alabama Stateline Association, Rev. Dennis Kizzire from the Vernon Association, Rev. Dan Ireland and his parents, representing ALCAP.

The General Board Report was read by the clerk and a motion was made, seconded and carried to adopt the report item by item.

ITEM NO. 5 - Constitution change concerning the expansion of the Credentials Committee was tabled until the Saturday Session.

ITEM NO. 6 — The election of Rev. David Crowe to the Board of Christian Education was postponed until Saturday.

ITEM NO. 11 — Those to fill vacancies on the General Board were elected at this time with Lone Star and Gum Springs as the only two churches without representatives.

ITEM NO. 12 — Recommendation that the Third Quarterly Meeting be held at the New Liberty F.W.B. Church instead of the Hamilton Church passed. Also, the meeting places for the Annual Session in 1983 was postponed until the Saturday Session.

ITEM NO. 17 — The meeting place for the Annual General Board was postponed until Saturday.

All other items of the report carried.

The 1982 Quarterly Meeting was postponed until Saturday.

The Moderator declared a short recess.

MORNING SERVICE

Rev. Bud Hill led the congregation in singing, "Sunlight." Rev. Dan Ireland, representing ALCAP, explained the importance of being counted for the Lord in our legal matters with regard to governmental decisions. Rev. Bud Hill again led in singing, "There Is Power In the Blood." Special Music was provided by the Host Church as Sis. Pat Pitts sang "I Believe Jesus."

Rev. Fred Jones brought the Moderator's Message. He read from Acts Chapter 2 and Chapter 4 and spoke on the subject of "Heavenly Grace" and "Holy Boldness" as an evidence of the Christian life.

The assembly was recessed for the noon meal. Rev. Bobby Duncan prayed for God's Blessing on the food.

AFTERNOON SESSION

The session reconvened with Rev. Bud Hill leading the congregation in singing, "Victory in Jesus."

The Moderator called for the Report of the Obituary Committee. Report was read and received by a standing moment of silent meditation followed in prayer by Rev. Calvin Bevins. The report of the Appreciation Committee was read and received by a standing expression of thanks by the body to the Liberty Church.

The Moderator recognized Rev. Woodrow Matthews who gave the report of the Northwest Alabama Free Will Baptist Youth Camp. The report was adopted as read. Bro. Item No. 5 — Article VI Section 1 of the Constitution was changed to read (5) persons instead of (3) persons. Rev. Clovis Tucker was elected to serve a 4-year term on the Credentials Committee. Rev. Dale Pitts was elected to serve a 5-year term on the Credentials Committee. Item No. 6 - Bro. David Crowe was elected to serve on the Board of Christian Education pending acceptance into the Association by letter of recommendation from former Association. Item No. 12 - The meeting places for the Annual Meeting in 1983 were decided, as the Union Chapel Church invited the Association for the Friday Session on September 30 and the Mt. Pleasant Church invited the Association for the Saturday Session on October 1. Motion was made, seconded, and carried to accept these invitations. Item No. 17 -The meeting place for the Annual General Board Meeting was decided, as the Red Bay invited the Board to meet with them. Motion was made, seconded, and carried to accept this invitation. The Moderator called for the Quarterly Meeting Report. The clerk gave the report which was accepted as read. The Moderator recognized the Pastor of the Host Church, Rev. Billy Ray Smith, who explained the facilities to the Association.

Education. Motion was made, seconded and carried to receive this report.

The Moderator then recognized Rev. Dennis Kizzire, representing the Alabama State Mission Board, who spoke concerning the purchasing of church bonds for the Alabaster Work. He also encouraged churches to submit items to the Alabama Digest for publication.

The Moderator called for the Report of the Financial Committee. Motion was made, seconded, and carried to receive this report.

Rev. Bud Hill led the congregation in singing, "When We All Get to Heaven." Special Music was again provided by Sister Pat Pitts who brought inspiring music with an accordion and sang, "There Is A River."

The Moderator introduced Rev. Phillip Cook, Pastor of the Hackleburg F.W.B. Church. He brought the Afternoon Message entitled "The Sin of Simplicity" using Proverbs Chapter one as his text.

Rev. Bud Hill led the congregation in a closing hymn of "Amazing Grace." The Session was closed in Prayer by Rev. Dale Pitts.

SATURDAY MORNING SESSION

The Saturday Session was held at the Brilliant Free Will Baptist Church. Bro. Duane Hughes led the congregation in an opening song entitled, "The Light of the World Is Jesus." Rev. Byron Meyer led the opening prayer followed by Bro. Hughes again leading the congregation in singing, "Blessed Assurance."

Moderator Fred Jones introduced Rev. Bud Hill, Pastor of the Winfield F.W.B. Church, who discussed enlarging our churches by utilizing the ATTACK program and challenged each church to work toward outreach. Bro. Duane Hughes led the congregation in singing, "We'll Work Til Jesus Comes." The moderator recognized Rev. Terry Booker, Pastor of the Hamilton F.W.B. Charch, who discussed the importance and process of making disciples.

The Moderator recognized the delegates and instructed them on the importance of the business session. Rev. William Pate gave a Partial Report of the Credentials Committee Items 1-7. Motion was made, seconded, and carried to adopt the report item by item. Every item was passed as read. The items of the General Board Report that were tabled until Saturday were acted upon item by item. The Moderator then declared a short recess.

MORNING SERVICE

Bro. Don Collins led the congregation in singing, "Joy Unspeakable." An offering of \$90.04 was received. The Moderator recognized special visitors. Special Music was provided by Bro. Holly Wayne Spillers from the Miss.-Ala. Stateline Association.

The Moderator introduced Rev. David Cox, Assistant Pastor of the First F.W.B. of Guin, who brought the Morning Message entitled "Building and Battling" using Matthew Chapter Sixteen, verse eighteen as his text. The inspiring message was followed by an altar of prayer led by Rev. Woodrow Matthews. The congregation was dismissed for the noon meal by Rev. Clovis Tucker, who prayed for the blessing upon the food.

AFTERNOON SESSION

The session reconvened with Bro. Don Collins leading the congregation in singing, "Count Your Blessings." Prayer was offered by Rev. David Hayes. The Moderator again recognized the Appreciation Committee Chairman who gave a report concerning the efforts of the Brilliant Church. The report was received by a standing expression of gratitude.

The Moderator recognized Rev. William Pate, who gave the Completed report of the Credentials Committee, Items 8-10. Each item was voted upon individually and passed.

The Moderator recognized Rev. Carlton Lambert, who gave the Children's Home Report. Motion was made, seconded, and passed to accept this report.

The Moderator recognized Rev. Richard Cordell, who reported on the 1983 Area-Wide Missionary Conference to be held January 12-26. He also reported on the Pastors and Workers Conference to be held February 7-9. He introduced the Southeastern Free Will Baptist College as a quality institution for the training of Christian Workers. Motion was made, seconded, and carried to accept these reports as information.

The Moderator recognized Bro. Don Collins, Association Treasurer, who gave the Treasurer's Report. Motion was made, seconded, and carried to accept the report.

The Moderator recognized Rev. Richard Cordell, who introduced a resolution for consideration.

Whereas, Southeastern Free Will Baptist College will begin in the fall of 1983, and

Whereas, this institution will be training and supplying Free Will Baptist preachers and Christian workers to our Jasper Association as well as to the rest of our denomination.

We, hereby, recommend that our churches support Southeastern Free Will Baptist College. Motion was made, seconded, and carried to adopt this resolution.

The Moderator recognized Rev. Bud Hill, who introduced a resolution for consideration.

The Moderator entertained a motion to contribute \$250 of Associational Funds to the Pastors and Workers Conference. Motion was seconded, and carried.

The following officers were elected to serve for the coming year: Moderator -Fred Jones; Assistant Moderator - Bud Hill; Clerk - Terry Booker; Assistant Clerk - Phillip Cook; Treasurer - Don Collins.

The Moderator recognized Rev. Billy Ray Smith, Pastor of the Brilliant Church, who came to preside over the Ordination Service of Bro. Philip Miles. He read from I Timothy Chapter Three and 2 Timothy Chapter Four and challenged him to make fullproof of his ministry. Rev. William Pate led the Prayer of dedication followed by the laying on of hands by all ordained ministers and deacons present. The Moderator appointed as Fraternal Delegates: Rev. David Hayes, Mt. Moriah Association; Rev. Terry Booker, Miss.-Ala. Stateline Association; Rev. Billy Ray Smith, Vernon Association.

There was no Woman's Auxiliary Report.

Motion was made, seconded, and carried to authorize the Assistant Moderator to appoint as delegates those who are in attendance at the State Association Meeting. Motion was made, seconded, and carried to adjourn the session.

The Moderator met with the other officers as well as with the remaining General Board members present and appointed an Executive Board of the General Board, which is to decide Associational matters when the Association is not in session. The following are the members appointed: Duane Hughes, Winfield; Donald Kivette, Cedrom Grove; Edward Holland, Good Springs; Farell Pollard, Free Water; R. E. Landers, Edgar's Chapel.

GENERAL BOARD REPORT

The General Board of the Jasper Association of Free Will Baptists met September 2, 1982 at the Mt. Pleasant Free Will Baptist Church with Moderator Bro. Fred Jones presiding. The meeting was opened with Bro. Duane Hughes leading the group in singing "Love Lifted Me."

Bro. Bud Hill brought the devotional. He read and encouraged those present with Psalm 133:1 about the unity of the brethren.

The Moderator recognized the representatives from each church. Five churches vere represented.

The following recommendations were discussed and passed.

1. We recommend that Bro. Bud Hill be elected to represent the Jasper Association as STATE GENERAL BOARD MEMBER.

2. We recommend that Bro. Donald Kivette be retained as Children's Home rustee.

3. We recommend that Bro. Richard Cordell be elected to the Credentials Committee to fill an unexpired term until 1983.

4. We recommend that Bro. Bill Smith be elected to the Credentials Committee for a three year term.

5. We recommend that Article VI Section I be changed to read 5 persons instead of 3. We also recommend that these positions be filled from nominations from the floor to serve 4-year and 5 year terms.

6. We recommend that Bro. David Crowe be elected to the Board of Christian Education to fill unexpired term until 1984.

7. We recommend that Bro. David Hayes be elected to the Board of Christian Education. His term to expire in 1987.

8. We recommend that Bro. Fred Jones be elected to the Youth Camp Board of Directors. His term expiring in 1985.

9. We recommend that Bro. Bill Smith be elected to the Youth Camp Board of Directors, to fill unexpired term until 1984.

10. We recommend that Bro. Donald Kivette be elected to the General Board to fill unexpired term of Cedrom Grove.until 1983.

11. We recommend that the General Board members nominated by each church be accepted as General Board members and any positions not filled to be filled with recommendations from the floor.

12. We recommend that the First Quarterly Meeting be held January 22, 1983 at the Free Water F.W.B. Church.

We recommend that the Second Quarterly Meeting be held at the Winfield F.W.B. Church on March 26, 1983.

We recommend that the Third Quarterly Meeting be held June 25, 1983 at the New Liberty F.W.B. Church.

We recommend that the place of the first and second days of the Annual Meeting in 1983 be decided at this session.

13. We recommend that each church of the Jasper Association give to the Youth Camp on a systematic basis (i.e.) monthly or quarterly.

14. We recommend that the moderator be paid sixty-five (65) dollars, the assistant Moderator twenty (20) dollars, the clerk one hundred (100) dollars, the assistant clerk (85) eighty-five dollars, and the treasurer seventy-five (75) dollars.

15. We recommend that the money for retired ministers be divided equally between those who are retired at this time.

16. We recommend that each church send an offering to each annual meeting for retired ministers and that each church support this cause regularly. We also recommend that each church support regularly the causes of foreign missions, home missions, Children's Home, and Free Will Baptist Bible College.

QUARTERLY MEETING REPORT

1982

The Quarterly Meeting of the Jasper Association convened three times this year. The first meeting was held January 23, 1982 at the Cooper F.W.B. Church. The meeting was opened with a hymn and prayer. General Association business was conducted by the body.

Following the business session, special music was provided by Rev. John Gibbs, Director of Development, National Home Missions Department. The following missionaries were introduced and spoke: Rev. Bobby Poole, Missionary to Brazil; Rev. John Gibbs, representing the Home Missions Work; Rev. Rodney Outlaw, missionary to Headland, Al.

Following a short recess, congregational singing along with a special missionary offering was conducted. Several additional missionaries were introduced and each challenged our local association: Rev. Walter Ellison, missionary to Uruguay; Rev. Jeff Turnbough, missionary to Spain; Trymon Messer, Assistant Director, National Home Missions.

CONSTITUTION OF THE JASPER ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

ARTICLE I

NAME

This body shall be know as the Jasper Association of Free Will Baptists of Alabama.

ARTICLE II MEMBERSHIP

SECTION I. The membership of the Jasper Association shall consist of all churches that, upon the approval of this body, shall become

SECTION II. A local church that wishes to become a member of this Association must adopt the National Treaties and make formal written request. A two-thirds vote of the delegates present must be record-

ARTICLE III REPRESENTATION

Each church holding membership in this Association shall be entitled to three [3] delegates. Ministers and deacons who are in good standing with this Association and members of the General Board shall be standing delegates.

ARTICLE IV OFFICERS

The officers of the Jasper Association shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a clerk, an assistant clerk, and a treasurer each of whom shall be elected at the close of each regular session.

ARTICLE V BOARDS

SECTION I. General Board [a] Composition. The General Board shall be composed of the moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, assistant clerk, and treasurer, and one member from each local church that is a part of this body. Each member from a local church shall serve a two year term with one-half of the members being elected each year. [b] Executive committee. An Executive Committee shall consist of the moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, and treasurer and five [5] members from the General Board. These five members shall be elected annually by the General Board. This committee shall function as the General Board when said Board is not in session. [c] Duties. The General Board shall formulate all items of general business during the annual session of the Association, as well as other responsibility so delegated by the body. When this Association is not in session, this Board shall have power to act as the body.

SECTION II. Board of Christian Education. The Board of Christian Education shall consist of five [5] members. Each member shall serve for a five [5] year term one term expiring each year.

SECTION III. Directors of North West Alabama Free Will Baptist Youth Camp shall be composed of three [3] members who shall serve for a term of three [3] years each with one term expiring each year.

ARTICLE VI STANDING COMMITTEES

SECTION I. Credentials Committee. The Credentials Committee shall consist of five (5) persons with the senior member in point of service replaced each year. Recommendations for replacement shall come from the General Board. It shall be the responsibility of this commiticee to examine all letters coming to this body from churches, ninisters, and other associations. This committee shall also examine all ministers who become a part of this body either by ordination or by letter. It is expected that all ministers coming from other associations will present letters of recommendation; however, in some cases the committee may see fit to recommend the acceptance of such persons who have not year received such letters. Any item of business pertaining to ministers or conduct of ministers should be presented first to this committee. Business matters handled by this committee may be referred to the Association or to the General Board. SECTION II. The moderator of this Association shall be an exofficio member of all boards and committees.

SECTION I. Any man who becomes convinced that the Lord has called him to preach the Gosepl shall be licensed by the church of which he is a member. [The church should contact the Credentials Committee for a copy of "Guidelines for Licensed Ministers"] After he has been licensed for a period of one [1] year and has proved his worth, the local church shall then make formal request to this Association that he be ordained. The local church, of which he is a member, must be able to show proof of his worthiness as to his character, doctrine, ability, sincerity, and desire. If after he has been examined by the responsible ones of this body, he then be found worthy, he shall be ordained by this Association. All ordinations to the ministry must be approved at the annual session or a quarterly meeting. SECTION II. Each church shall have the right to select and ordain all deacons who serve in such church. The ordaining council shall consist of two ordained ministers and at least one deacon or one ordained minister and at least two deacons. SECTION III. Candidates for ordination to the ministry shall present their request for ordination to the Credentials Committee at least by the time of the last regular meeting before the ordination using forms prepared and approved by this body.

ARTICLE VII MEETINGS

SECTION I. This Association shall meet annually on Friday before the first Sunday in October at a place determined at the previous session; and shall not adjourn finally until all business is transacted.

SECTION II. The associational year shall end August 31st and all letters to the Association should be mailed to the clerk no later than the third [3rd] Sunday in September of each year.

SECTION III. There shall be three [3] quarterly meetings during each associational year. The annual meeting of the Association shall take the place of the fourth [4th] quarterly meeting.

SECTION IV. The officers of the Jasper Association shall serve as the officers of the Quarterly Meeting.

ARTICLE VIII ORDINATION

SECTION IV. Preachers coming to us from other Free Will Baptist Associations shall present their requests for membership to the Credentials Committee at the time of the quarterly meeting of the annual session, and said requests may be acted on at that session.

B. Preachers coming to us from other denominations shall present their requests to the Credential Committee at the time of a quarterly meeting or the annual session. Such requests shall be acted upon at the time of the following quarterly meeting or annual session. Revised October 6, 1979.

SECTION V. All ministers are required to report yearly to the Credentials Committee of this body. Such report shall be for year beginning September 1st and ending August 31st, and shall be due September 1st of current year. Any minister who fails to comply shall be dropped from the roll of ministers.

ARTICLE IX DISCIPLINE

SECTION I. This body shall be considered an advisory council having no authority over the internal affairs of any local church unless said church depart from the Articles of Faith or from the National Treatise. Whenever, conditions warrant it, this Association shall have power to withdraw fellowship from any local church.

SECTION II. Any church being dealt with because of a disciplinary problem shall represent to the quarterly meeting and annual session by letter and fees, but shall not have the right to vote by delegates, standing or otherwise, until the matter is settled. Exception: Any minister who is a member of such church but is ministering to another church that is in good standing with the Association shall not be so penalized.

SECTION III. All questions of doctrine and all matters pertaining to a local church, or to an individual minister or group of ministers, shall be decided by a two-thirds vote of this Association.

SECTION IV. No minister whose conduct is being questioned by this Association shall have the right to vote in either the quarterly meeting or annual session.

SECTION V. The pastor, who preaches the word of God, ministers to the needs of the members, and exercises general leadership within the congregation is expected to unite with the local church if he is not a member when called ... "When the minister become pastor of a given local church, it is his responsibiliy to obtain good standing in the association of which that church is a member if he is not already in good standing therein." [A Treatise of the Faith and Practices of the Original Free Will Baptists, 1973 pp. 50 A; Page 59B.

SECTION VI. Each church of this Association shall be urged to promote and support all district, state and national projects of the

denomination.

SECTION VII. No church shall accept as members those who have not been baptized by an ordained minister.

ARTICLE X AMENDMENTS

SECTION I. This Constitution may be amended at any annual session of this association by a two-thirds vote of delegates present, provided proposed amendment is presented in writing, read one day, placed on the table, and adopted the next.

RULES OF DECORUM

1. This Association shall be called to order by the moderator and presided over by officers elected at the last session.

2. The association shall be opened and closed by singing and prayer. 3. The names of delegates shall be noted and referred to as often as is necessary.

4. The moderator shall not be entitled to a vote except in case of a tie and then he shall give the deciding vote. He shall be entitled to speak on any subject after others have spoken, provided someone else serves as moderator while he speaks.

5. Only one person shall speak at a time and he shall arise and address the moderator, and after recognition by the moderator, he shall proceed.

6. No person shall be interrupted while speaking unless he shall depart from the subject under discussion or use words of personal reflection.

7. No person will be allowed to speak more than twice on the same subject without permission from the modertor nor more than five [5] minutes at a time.

8. No person shall laugh or talk in a disturbing manner while discussion is going on.

9. No delegate shall absent himself from the association without leave of the moderator.

10. Any minister absent from the annual session of this association for two years in succession without legal excuse shall be dropped from the roll of ministers

11. These Rules of Decorum may be amended at any annual sessin of this association by a two-thirds vote of delegates present, provided proposed amendment is presented in writing, read one day, placed on the table, and adopted the next.

GUIDELINES FOR LICENSED MINISTER IN THE JASPER ASSOCIATION

I. RULES PERTAINING TO THE LICENSED MINISTER

A. Qualifications for the Licensee

1. He must be a member of a church which belongs to the Jasper Association.

2. He must give evidence to his church that he is divinely called to preach, whereupon the local church is authorized to examine him for license. This examination should include the areas of the candidate's life, doctrine, reputation, and his convictions and abilities regarding the work of the ministry. His present and prospective educational qualifications should also be considered. Upon completion of such an examination, the local church shall determine whether or not to grant license. The ministerial license shall be valid for a period of one year but is renewable annually.

3. He must have his license renewed annually by said church and kept in force until ordination.

B. The Activities of the Licensee

1. According to the general practics of Free Will Baptists, a licensed minister is urged to afford himself of every opportunity to preach the word. He is free to exercise all the privileges and responsibilites of an ordained minister with the exception of pastoring a church and officiating at the observances of the ordinances and wedding.

2. The licensee should consider the perod between his receiving license and being ordained as a time of study and training in preparation for his calling.

C. His Relationship to the Association

1. The clerk of the church should report the names of licensed ministers to the clerk of the Association who will forward a copy of these guidelines to each licensee.

2. Licensed ministers are urged and expected to attend the regular meetings of the Jasper Association and the Quarterly Meetings.

6. Church History [especially F. W. B. history]

III. A SUGGESTED SCHEDULE OF WORK LEADING TO ORDINATION

A. As soon as licensee feels that he is qualified to become a candidate for ordination, he should request a list of study questions from the Credentials Committee of the Association. We would strongly encourage him to proceed with his examination before entertaining a definite call to a church.

B. At least two months before the Credentials Committee meets, he should secure the examination. He should make three copies of the completed examination [one for each member of the Committee], and send them to the Credentials Committee no later than two years before its meeting.

C. The candidate is required to pass an oral examination administerd by the Committee.

D. The Committee will report to the candidate on whether he passed or what areas he may need additional study in.

E. When the approved candidate has passed the examination, the Committee will recommend his ordination to the Association. This recommendation will be made only after the candidate has been licensed for one full year. It is recommended that the candidate have definate prospects of a church pastorate or another form of Christian service that would justify his being ordained.


