#### Jasper Association of Free Will Baptists District Meeting January 22, 2000 Pocahontas Free Will Baptist Church

The District Meeting was called to order by Moderator, Rev. Roger Lucas at 9:00 AM. Bro. Brad Williams, Youth and Music Director of Red Bay FWB Church led congregation in singing *A Shelter in the Storm* followed by prayer by Rev. Jerry Williams, of the Winfield FWB Church. Bro. Brad Williams then led congregation in singing *I'll Fly Away*. Moderator and pastor of host church, Rev. Roger Lucas, gave opening remarks, explained facilities and then gave devotion using Psalms 15:1. He asked two questions (1) Why are you here? (2) To be seen or to see and worship God? He then pointed out that verse 2 answers both questions. He then closed with prayer.

The moderator then called for the seating of delegates for this meeting. MSC that delegates be seated.

The January District Meeting of the Jasper Association is used to hear from missionaries both foreign and home of Free Will Baptists. We will list them and highlights of their comments in the order in which they spoke in this meeting.

Rev. Rick Cash, State FWB Promotional Office and Trinity Youth Camp Director. Rev. Cash used Mark 10:17-22. Subject Why the church is not on the move for Christ. He stated the Church 9is at fault on the inside because of unbelief. He stated that we are blessed beyond measure but on the most part we are not going forward for christ because un-belief and indifference. He then read from Ephesians 4:27-29 which says that God permits us to have so that we may give to those in need. He then gave an example of a small church at Lawley, Alabama who, when challenged, stepped out in faith and gave well beyond their means and is continuing to do so, He then gave report of how the Acts 1-8 Program is doing, good but cautioned we should never be satisfied.

Rev. Roger Raper, Home Missionary to Fort Collins, Colorado who shared their blessings and also their not so good blessings. He then shared letter the church received concerning their church sign which had been vandalized. This letter stated that their church had their church sign vandalized also and they enclosed a check to help repair their church sign. Thanked all for helping in this ministry and asked all to pray for that ministry in Fort Collins, Colorado.

Rev. Fred Jones, Home Missionary to Prattville, Alabama. Bro. Jones in his opening remarks stated that any missionary work, foreign or home, is a cooperative work between God, the people and the missionary sent. Awesome what God has and is doing in Prattville, Alabama and also all over the world. Asked all to pray that *soon* the church in Prattville, Alabama would be self-supporting. Rev. Jones then used Acts 13:1-4 which is the starting point for the Apostle Paul's first missionary journey. Rev. Jones said that the Lord always

calls and uses **busy** people. The Lord issues calls to different **service** and to different **places**. Rev. Jones stated that all whom the Lord redeems, He intends them to be **missionaries**. Rev. Jones stated that often time we become comfortable in our comfort zones therefore we *hear not* the call of the Holy Spirit. He stated we must be willing to go and adapt to the culture where called to. *Present* the *Gospel wherever* you are called. Just get *busy* and *share* the *Gospel*. God calls and uses only busy people.

Moderator and host pastor, Rev. Roger Lucas sang *Our God Reigns*. He asked congregation to join in on the chorus. Bro. Brad Williams, with Mrs. Helen Lucas at the piano, led the congregation in singing *Kneel at the Cross*.

Rev. David Potette, Home Missionary to Chicago, Illinois. He stated that he receives more support from Alabama than any other state. He encouraged everyone to support the ACTS 1-8 Program. His work in Chicago has been mixed with blessings and also hardships while there. First two years there met in his living room. Now meeting in store front building, which is not very conducive to some who look for an elaborate building, he stated it is very hard to attract but only the Have Nots. He stated that often time when their church helps people they often take the help then leave to be seen no more. A different place to work in Chicago than a lot of other places. He stated the city drains one's time but that is no Quit in him. Thanked all for previous help and encouraged all to continue to help. Sin is never pretty.

Offering was taken \$145.25 to be given to ACTS 1-8 Program as voted by body. Prayer by Rev. Thomas Scott, Pastor of Red Bay FWB Church.

Rev. Ken Bailey Foreign Missionary to Japan spoke and thanked all present for continued support down through the years. He then used Romans 10:12-15. We need to realize that there is but **One Way** to be saved **The Lord Jesus Christ**. Often times our feelings get in the way of presenting the Gospel to all people, *no exceptions*. He stated they must have a *call* from the Lord, they must *hear* the Gospel to be saved. He asked everyone present to continue their support but especially their prayers.

Rev. Jeff Lunsford, Foreign Missionary to Mongolia. Rev. Lunsford stated that Mongolia is a Communist country between Russia and China. They have adopted the English language as their secondary language so that they can enter the technology world as English is the language of technology the world over. Gave some facts concerning Mongolia. He stated that most of their population is under 25 years of age. Climate is extreme and conditions are primitive but Christ has called him and he has answered that call. He stated that when Christ calls, He also makes a way to not only survive but to present the Gospel to those who have not heard this wonderful Gospel.

Song Mission Field America was played. Service was closed with altar prayer honoring all missionaries and special prayer for Icie Mae Fredericks who was

in the hospital in Birmingham. Rev. Danny J. Williams, pastor of Winfield FWB Church led this prayer with all in altar praying also.



# JASPER ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS CONSTITUTIONAL CHANGE

The General Board of the Jasper Association of Free Will Baptists recommends that the following change be made to the Constitution as follows:

#### ARTICLE V SECTION V

Children's Home Trustee

As reads presently:

This person shall represent the Jasper Association on the Children's Home Board of Trustees. This member to be elected each year and give a report during each annual session of this association.

Recommended to read: This person shall represent the Jasper Association on the Children's Home Board of Trustees. This member shall serve a term of Two (2) years and give a report at each annual session of the Jasper Associaton.

#### **CHURCH COVENANT**

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise, by His grace, to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity of the world from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures secret prayer, "family devotions, and social worship; and by selfdenial, faith and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel; nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace. To be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, and the support of missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

#### ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. The Bible. The Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of faith and practice.

**2.** God. There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver, and Righteous Governor of the universe; and in the Scriptures as Father, Son, and Holy Ghost; yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore, and obey.

**6.** The sinfulness of Man. Man was Created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His prosperity, therefore, inherits a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.

**7.** The Work of Christ. The Son of God by His incarnation life, sufferings, death and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free, and is ground of salvation by faith.

The conditions of salvation are (1) Repentance of sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it (2) Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Savior and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith, the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin, and becomes a child of God. (3) Continuance in faith and obedience until death.

**9. Election.** God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of Salvation. Hence by faith in Christ men become His elect.

10. Freedom of Will. The human will is free and self-controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit, or to resist them and perish.

11. Salvation Free. God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.

**12. Perseverance.** All believers in Christ, who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, have promise of eternal salvation.

**13. Gospel Ordinances.** Baptism, or the immersion of believers in water, and the Lord's Supper, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel. Feet Washing, an ordinance teaching humility, is of universal obligation, and is to be ministered to all true believers.

**14. Tithing.** God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ endorsed it in the Gospel (Matthew 23:23), and the apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let everyone of you lay by him in store, as God hath prospered him"

(I Cor. 16:2a.)

**15.** The Christian Sabbath. The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works, and activities, and for personal communion with God.

16. Resurrection, Judgement and Final Retribution. The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. # CONSTITUTION OF THE JASPER ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTIST

#### ARTICLE I NAME

This body shall be known as the Jasper Association of Free Will Baptist of Alabama.

#### ARTICLE II MEMBERSHIP

SECTION I. The membership of the Jasper Association shall consist of all churches that, upon the approval of his body, shall become members.

SECTION II. A local church that wishes to become a member of this Association must adopt the National Treaties and make formal written request. A two-thirds vote of the delegates present must be recorded for acceptance into this Association.

#### ARTICLE III REPRESENTATION

Each church holding membership in this Association shall be entitled to three (3) delegates. Ordained ministers, deacons and General Board members who are in good standing with this Association, shall be standing delegates.

#### ARTICLE IV OFFICERS

The Officers of the Jasper Association shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a Clerk/Treasurer, and assistant Clerk/Treasurer, each of whom shall be elected every two (2) years with the election coming on even years. No officer shall serve more than two (2) consecutive terms.

#### ARTICLE V BOARDS

SECTION I. General Board (a) Composition. The General Board shall be composed of the moderator, assistant moderator, clerk/treasurer, assistant clerk/treasurer, the pastor and one member from each local church that is a part of this body. Each member from a local church shall serve a two year term with one-half of the members being elected each year. (b) Executive committee. An Executive Committee shall consist of the moderator, assistant moderator, clerk/treasurer and five (5) members from the General Board. These five members shall be elected annually by the General Board. This committee shall function as the General Board when said Board is not in session. (c) Duties. The General Board shall formulate all items of general business during the annual session of the Association, as well as other responsibilities so delegated by the body. When this Association is not in session, this Board shall have power to act as the body.

SECTION II. Board of Directors of the Trinity Free Will Baptist Camp. The Jasper Association shall be represented to the Board of Directors of the Trinity Free Will Baptist Youth Camp by three (3) members. Each member shall serve a term of three (3) years with one term expiring each year.

SECTION III. Mission Board. The Mission Board shall consist of five (5) members. Each member shall serve for a five (5) year term with one term expiring each year. The Mission Board's responsibilities will be to help set up mission conferences and to promote Foreign and Home Missions in the Jasper Association.

SECTION IV. State Board Member. The Jasper Association Moderator shall represent this Association to the General Board of the Alabama State Association. In his absence, the Assistant Moderator will serve as his proxy.

SECTION V. Childrens Home Trustee. This person shall represent the

Jasper Association on the Childrens Home Board of Trustees. This member Shall serve a term of Two (2) Years and give a report to each annual session of the Jasper Association.

#### ARTICLE VI STANDING COMMITTEES

SECTION I. Credentials Committee. The Credentials Committee shall consist of five (5) persons with the senior member in point of service replaced each year. Recommendations for replacement shall come from the General Board. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to examine all letters coming to this body from the churches and other associations, as well as, all ministerial reports. This committee shall also examine all ministers who become a part of this body whether ordination or by letter. It is expected that all ministers coming from other associations will present letters of recommendation; however, in some cases the committee may see fit to recommend the acceptance of such persons who have not yet received such letters. Any item of business pertaining to ministers or conduct of ministers should be presented first to this committee. Business matters handled by this committee may be referred to the Association or to the General Board.

SECTION II. Nominating Committee. Shall consists of Five (5) members, elected for period of Five years, with the senior member in point of service expiring each year. It shall be responsibility of this Committee to make nominations for Associational Officers and submit such nominations to the General Board.

SECTION III. Finance Committee. The Finance Committee shall consist of three (3) members elected for a period of three years, with the senior member in point of service expiring each year. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to examine the financial report and bank statements of the Association, verify their accuracy, and report to the Association at the Annual Session.

SECTION IV. The moderator of this Association shall be an ex-officio member of all boards and committees.

# ARTICLE VII MEETINGS

SECTION I. This Association shall meet annually on Friday and Saturday before the first Sunday in October at places determined at the previous session; and shall not adjourn finally until all business is transacted. All business possible to be conducted on first day of each annual meeting and second day of each annual meeting be used for Worship, Preaching and any business as required to be conducted. Nominating Committee to meet annually on first Tuesday night of August at seven p.m. at Hamilton FWB Church and General Board to meet annually on second Monday Night of August at seven p.m. at Winfield FWB Church.

SECTION II. The associational year shall end on August 31st and all letters to the Association should be mailed to the clerk no later than the third (3rd) Sunday in September of each year.

SECTION III. There shall be two (2) other District Meetings during the Associational year. The meetings will be held in January and June.

SECTION IV. The officers of the Jasper Association shall serve as the officers of the District Meeting.

## ARTICLE VIII MINISTERS AND DEACONS

SECTION I. Any man who becomes convinced that the Lord has called him to preach the gospel shall be licensed by the church of which he is a member. (The church should contact the Credentials Committee for a copy of "Guidelines for Licensed Ministers").

If, after a period of one (1) full year, he has been called to an approved work such as pastor, assistant pastor, youth minister, full-time evangelism, or missionary work, he may then be examined by the responsible ones of this body to determine his worthiness for ordination. The local church, of which he is a member, must be able to show proof of his worthiness as to his character, doctrine, ability, sincerity, and desire. If, after having been examined, he then be found worthy, he shall be ordained by this Association. All ordinations to the ministry must be approved at the annual session or at a quarterly meeting of the Jasper Association .If, after the period of one (1) full year has expired, the licensee has not been called to an approved work, his license may then be renewed each year or until he has been called to an approved work. No one may be ordained who has not been called to an approved work.

SECTION II. Candidates for ordination to the ministry shall present their request for ordination to the Credentials Committee, (using forms prepared and approved by this body), at least by the time of the last regular meeting prior to the ordination date requested.

SECTION III. Preachers coming to us from other Free Will Baptist Associations shall present their request for membership to the Credentials Committee at any quarterly meeting or any quarterly meeting or annual session and said request may be acted upon at that session.

SECTION IV. Preachers coming to us from other denominations shall present their requests to the Credentials Committee at any quarterly meeting or annual session. Such request shall be acted upon at the time of the following regular meeting be it quarterly meeting or annual session.

SECTION V. All ministers having been previously approved by this Association, shall receive a Card of good standing annually upon receipt of Church Letter listing all approved ministers of that Church.

SECTION VI. Each church shall have the right to select and ordain all deacons who serve in such church. The ordaining council shall consist of two ordained ministers and at least one deacon, or one ordained minister and at least two deacons.

#### ARTICLE IX DISCIPLINE

SECTION I. This body shall be considered an advisory council having no authority over the internal affairs of any local church unless said church depart from the Articles of Faith or from the National Treatise. Whenever conditions warrant it, this Association shall have power to withdraw fellowship from any local church.

SECTION II. Any church being dealt with because of a disciplinary problem shall represent to the quarterly meeting and annual session by letter and fees, but shall not have the right to vote by delegates, standing or otherwise, until the matter is settled. Exception: Any minister who is a member of such church but is ministering to another church that is in good standing with the Association shall not be so penalized.

SECTION III. All questions of doctrine and all matters pertaining to a local church, or to an individual minister or group of ministers, shall be decided by a two-thirds vote of this Association.

SECTION IV. No minister whose conduct is being questioned by this Association shall have the right to vote in either the quarterly meeting or annual session.

SECTION V. The pastor who preaches the word of God, ministers to the needs of the members, and exercises general leadership within the congregation is expected to unite with the local church if he is not a member when called..."

When the minister becomes pastor to a given local church, it is his responsibility to obtain good standing in the association of which that church is a member if he is not already in good standing therein." (A Treatise of the Faith and Practices of the Original Free Will Baptist, 1973, 50 A: Page 59B.)

SECTION VI. No church shall accept as members those who have not been baptized by an ordained minister.

### ARTICLE X AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be amended at any session of this association by twothirds vote of voting body present, provided proposed amendment is presented in writing, read, placed on the table, and acted upon during later session.

#### RULES OF DECORUM

- 1. This Association shall be called to order by the moderator and presided over by officers elected at the previous annual session.
- 2. The association shall be opened and closed by singing and prayer.
- 3. The names of delegates shall be noted and referred to as often as is necessary.
- 4. The moderator shall not be entitled to a vote except in case of a tie and then he shall give a deciding vote. He shall be entitled to speak on any subject after others have spoken, provided someone else serves as moderator while he speaks.
- 5. Only one person shall speak at a time and he shall arise and address the moderator, and after recognition by the moderator, he shall proceed.
- 6. No person shall be interrupted while speaking unless he shall depart from the subject under discussion or use words of personal reflection.
- 7. No person will be allowed to speak more than twice on the same subject without permission from the moderator nor more that five (5) minutes at a time.
- 8. No person shall laugh or talk in a disturbing manner while discussion is going on.
- 9. No delegate shall absent himself from the association without leave of the moderator.
- 10. Any minister absent from the annual session of this association for two years in succession shall be dropped from the roll of ministers. Exception: Full-time evangelists or Missionaries serving in the other states or countries, students who are attending college, those serving in the armed forces.
- 11. These Rules or Decorum may be amended at any annual session of this association by the two-thirds vote of delegates present, provided proposed amendment is presented in writing, read one day, placed on the table, and acted upon the following day.

#### GUIDELINES FOR RETIRED MINISTERS TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR SUPPORT FROM JASPER ASSOCIATION

- 1. That the local church present in writing to the association a recommendation of the minister involved, stating his qualifications for support.
- 2. The proposed minister must have served in the Jasper Association for at least a total of ten (10) years as pastor of affiliated churches.
- 3. The proposed minister would be at least sixty-five (65) years of age or totally disabled.

#### GUIDELINES FOR LICENSED MINISTERS IN THE JASPER ASSOCIATION

#### I. RULES PERTAINING TO THE LICENSED MINISTER

- A. Qualifications for the Licensee
  - 1. He must be a member of a church which belongs to the Jasper Association.
- 2. He must give evidence to his church that he is divinely called to preach, whereupon the local church is authorized to examine him for license. This examination should include the areas of the candidate's life, doctrine, reputation, and his convictions and abilities regarding the work of the ministry. His present and prospective educational qualifications should also be considered. Upon completion of such an examination, the local church shall determine whether or not to grant license. The ministerial license shall be valid for a period of one year but is renewable annually.
- 3. He must have his license renewed annually by said church and kept in force until ordination.
- B. The Activities of the Licensee
- 1. According to the general practices of Free Will Baptist, a licensed minister is urged to afford himself of every opportunity to preach the word. He is free to exercise all the privileges and responsibilities of an ordained minister with the exception of officiating at the observances of the ordinances and weddings.
- 2. The licensee should consider the period between his receiving license and being ordained as a time of study and training in preparation for his calling. C. His Relationship to the Association
- 1. The clerk of the church should report the names of licensed ministers to the clerk of the Association who will forward a copy of these guidelines to each licensee.
- 2. Licensed ministers are expected to attend regular meeting of the Jasper Association and the Quarterly Meetings.

#### II. SUGGESTIONS FOR PREPARATION FOR ORDINATION

- A. Attend Free Will Baptist Colleges or Bible Institutes if possible.
- B. Seek the counsel of experienced pastors.
- C. Make as thorough a study as possible of the following:
  - 1. The Holy Bible
  - 2. Free Will Baptist Doctrine
  - 3. Systematic Theology
  - 4. Homiletics
  - 6. Evangelism

7. Church History (especially FWB history)

#### III. SUGGESTED SCHEDULE OF WORK LEADING TO ORDINATION

- A. As soon as licensee feels that he is qualified to become a candidate for ordination, he should request a list of study questions from the Credentials Committee of the Association. We would strongly encourage him to proceed with his examination before entertaining a definite call to a church. However, no one may be ordained who has not been called to an approved work. (See ARTICLE VIII SECTION I).
- B. At least two months before the Credentials Committee meets, he should secure the examination. He should make five copies of the completed examination (one for each member of the Committee), and send them to the Credentials Committee no later than two months before its meeting.
- C. The candidate is required to pass an oral examination administered by the Committee.
- D. The Committee will report to the candidate on whether he passed or what areas he may need additional study in.
- E. When the approved candidate has passed the examination, the Committee will recommend his ordination to the Association. This recommendation will be made only after the candidate has been licensed for one full year. The candidate should have definite prospects of a church pastorate or another approved work that would justify his being ordained.
