JASPER ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTIST District Meeting, January 19, 2013 Liberty Free Will Baptist Church

The session began at 9:00AM with Bro. Hunter Miles leading the congregation in singing *When The Roll Is Called Up Yonder*. Bro. Bryan Silas led in prayer. Bro. Mark Riggs, host pastor gave the welcome and brought the devotion using Isaiah 45:5-6 for his text. Bro Mark brought a very inspiring devotion on 'How God Reveals Himself'.

Bro. Mark Riggs, moderator called the session to order. The clerk, Bro. Donald Smith gave the roll call of delegates. M/S/C by the standing delegates to seat the delegates for the session.

Bro. Danny Williams, Mission Conference Director was recognized first. He gave a report on the Children's Home, how God had answered three specific prayers: 1) Good weather for the Toy Run, raised about \$76,000. 2) Had a good strong financial year, finished in the green. 3. Answered the need for house parents. Bro. Danny then gave thoughts concerning the Mission conference using scripture from Acts 4:12. He stated eighteen different speakers and fifty five churches were involved in the conference in January. The World Mission's offering will be in April. One million dollars was raised last year with fifty-one churches helping raise the funds in the state of Alabama, six of those from the Jasper Association. The Red Bay church gave the largest in the state. He stated they would like to have one hundred percent of the churches to be involved this year. Mission packets were given out, and he thanked everyone for their support. Bro. Danny closed in prayer.

Bro. Heath Ferguson, Missionary to Houston Texas was recognized next. He stated they should be in the field in less than six months, and they have reached 70% of the support needed. He shared many facts about the State of Texas. He said they already have $3\frac{1}{2}$ acres north of Houston paid for, and they already have a place to meet free of charge. Services are planned to begin in late February. He read from 1Corinthians 3: 5-7, he thanked everyone for their support.

Bro. Rick Cash, Alabama State Promotional Office Director spoke next. Bro. Cash began by asking everyone to stand and ask Bro. Bryan Silas to lead in prayer. He stated total Acts 1:8 giving for 2012 was \$543,620, which was short of the budget goal of \$612,000 by \$68,380. He thanked the Jasper association for \$83,440.

Bro. David Snow, Missionary to Japan was recognized next. He stated Japan is the second largest unreached people in the world, and there are over 125 million people living in Japan. He shared many interesting facts about Japan, thanked everyone and asked prayer for himself and his family.

The meeting was adjourned for break at 10:20A.M. The session reconvened at 10:40A.M. Bro Hunter Miles led the congregation in singing *Where Could I*

Go. Page Riggs blessed the congregation with special music. Bro. Mark Riggs lead in prayer.

Bro. David Sexton, Missionary to Suffolk, Virginia spoke next. Bro. Sexton used Ephesians 3:20-21, for his text. He stated Suffolk is the 11th largest city in the United States, with a population of 83,000 people. 64% of the residence claim no religious affiliation. He shared many facts about the work there, and thanked everyone for their support.

Bro. Jamie Lancaster, Missionary to Uruguay was recognized next. He gave a very interesting report on their work. He thanked everyone for their financial and prayer support.

Bro. Bud Bivens, Missionary to Mexico was recognized next. He shared information about the drug cartel situation in Mexico. In the last six years 70,000 people have been killed because of drugs. It has become very dangerous to travel in Mexico. Because of this, he now has a beard, wears an old cowboy hat and sunglasses, and an old gray T-shirt, and he said no one brothers him. He shared many facts about the work there, and thanked everyone for their support.

An offering was received next. Bro. Joe Tolbert led the prayer, and Bro. Hunter Miles blessed the congregation with Special music during the offering singing, *Little Is Much When God Is In It.* After the announcements the meeting was adjourned. Rev. Freddie Miles dismissed and asked the blessing on the food.

District Meeting, June 08, 2013 New Liberty Free Will Baptist Church

The session opened at 9:00 AM with Bro. Ray Selman leading the congregation in singing. Victory In Jesus. Bro. Adam Smith, host pastor led in prayer. Bro. Ray Selman led the congregation in singing Getting Ready To Leave This World.

Bro. Mark Riggs delivered the moderator's message. He read from Psalm 85, and gave his devotion on "New Grace", and closed in prayer.

Bro. Adam Smith, host pastor, welcomed everyone to the session and gave instructions regarding their facilities.

Bro. Mark Riggs, moderator, called the meeting to order. The clerk, Bro. Donald Smith gave the roll call of the delegates. M/S/C to accept them as read and seat them as delegates.

Bro. Rick Cash gave the first reports on Acts 1:8 and the Alabama State Promotional Office, and the Children's Home. May's Acts 1:8 receipts were \$35,002.37; year to date through May was \$223,538.68. This is \$17,391 less than received in the first 5 months of 2012. This is \$17,380 behind what is needed monthly to make budget. He stated Acts 1:8 giving was down in six out of thirteen associations. The Jasper association gave \$83,409.35 last year, so far this year the association as given \$31,452.25; which is \$3000 down from this time last year. He gave an update on Home and Foreign mission works, and thanked everyone for their support on the construction of the state office. So far \$64,187.58 has been spent on the new state office. Bro. Cash gave the Children's Home report next. Over the last twelve months the Children's Home has ministered to thirty-three different children. They now have new house parents, but are in need of another. Recently the home received a large gift for capitol improvements. The Toy Run will be the first Saturday in December. Last year approximately 1700 people and 850 motorcycles were there and they raised \$75,000 for the home. There have been six saved and four baptized during this last year. He thanked everyone for their support. M/S/C.

Bro. Mark Riggs, moderator proposed that the Jasper Association give \$150.00 for 1sq. ft. to go toward the cost of the new state office. M/S/C.

Bro. Ashley Culp, director of the Trinity Camp spoke next. He thanked the association for their support over the years and especially for the last thirteen years he as been there. His summer staff had arrived. For junior week, they have about 100 planning to attend. During the last year one air conditioner unit in the girl's dorm was replaced, and 1300 ft. of flooring was replaced in the top of the gym. A group from Michigan staying at the camp installed the flooring saving about \$2100 on labor. Next year the dining hall will need some repair during the off season. He shared events from last week's camp, and thanked everyone for their support. M/S/C.

Bro. Adam and Apryl Smith, from the New Liberty church blessed us with special music singing Beulah Land.

Bro. Ashley Culp, director of the Trinity Youth Camp brought the morning message. He gave a powerful message from Mark 3:1-6, on "A Guy's Withered Hand". He closed with prayer.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:30AM for break.

The meeting reconvened at 11:00AM with Bro. Ray Selman leading the congregation in singing The Love of God.

Bro. Donald Smith, Credentials Committee member gave the credentials committee report next. The credentials committee met on April 29, 2013 at the Liberty FWB church. We met with Bro. Adam Smith for ordination into the gospel ministry. We, as a committee recommend that Bro. Adam be ordained into the gospel ministry. M/S/C.

Bro. Donald Smith, Mission Board Chairman was recognized again with the Mission Board report. The mission project for this summer will be The Barry Long Family in Aurora, Colorado. The project will help raise funds to pay rent on the building they are using. There will be a benefit talent program featuring the talents of the Jasper Association churches on Saturday, August 17, 2013 at the Winfield FWB church beginning at 7:00PM. He encouraged each church to take part. The project will run from June 8th to September 23rd. The goal this year is \$3000, and he thanked everyone for their support. M/S/C.

Bro. Adam Smith & Family, from the New Liberty church bless the congregation with special music singing, That Heavenly Home.

Church Deacon's were honored next Bro. Mark Riggs made comments concerning deacon's using 1Timothy 3:8-13, and presented each deacon with a certificate, and thanked them for their service to their church. He had each of the deacon's wife's stand and be recognized. Bro Rick Cash blessed the deacons with prayer.

The offering was received next with Bro. Steve Lindsey leading the offertory prayer.

He thanked the New Liberty church for being the number one over all giver this year. He stated they have nine weeks booked for 2014. The only available weeks remaining are Memorial Day & July 4th week. He said the camp has a kind of partnership with Habitat Of Humanity, college students from different colleges come and do work in the area, and stay at the camp for a couple of days at a time. The Alabama State C E Board has planned two activities this year (Jan./Aug). He thanked everyone for their support. M/S/C.

Bro. Mark Riggs gave the State Promotional Office report in the absence of Bro. Rick Cash. September receipts were \$36,102.62 YTD, Acts 1:8 receipts through September total \$402,823.96. This is \$14,710.26 less than we received in the first 9

months of 2012 It is also \$30,826.01 behind what is needed on a monthly basis to meet the full budget. The 2013 Acts budget goal is \$578,200. He thanked the Jasper Association for giving YTD gifts totaling \$53,476.14. He gave reports on the work in Russia & Mexico. M/S/C.

Bro. Mark Riggs also gave the Children's Home report in the absence of Bro. Danny Williams. The home has ministered to thirty-five children over the past year. Presently there are eighteen children on campus. They still need another couple to serve in the role of house parents. They received a sizeable estate gift designated for capital improvements. The gift is also being used to purchase additional property adjacent to the campus. The Toy Run will be the first Saturday in December. Last year was the 10th year for the ride, and had over 850 motorcycles, and about 1700 people attended. Financially the benefit generated over \$75,000 in donations. Four of the children made a salvation decision this year. The income is running slightly behind budget projections. He thanked everyone for standing with the home financially. M/ S/C.

Bro. Mick Edwards, the guest speaker gave a report on Welch college. M/S/C.

General Board Partial Report—The General Board of the Jasper Association of Free Will Baptist met at the Winfield Church on August 19, 2013 at 7:00 P.M. for the annual meeting. Bro. 



ARTICLES OF FAITH

6. The sinfulness of Man. Man was Created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His prosperity, therefore, inherits a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.

7. The Work of Christ. The Son of God by His incarnation life, sufferings, death and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free, and is ground of salvation by faith.

8. The Terms of Salvation. The conditions of salvation are (1) Repentance of sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it (2) Faith or the unreserved

committal of one's self to Christ as Savior and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith, the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin, and becomes a child of God. (3) Continuance in faith and obedience until death.

11. Salvation Free. God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.

12. Perseverance. All believers in Christ, who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, have promise of eternal salvation.

13. Gospel Ordinances. Baptism, or the immersion of believers in water, and the Lord's Supper, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel. Feet Washing, an ordinance teaching humility, is of universal obligation, and is to be ministered to all true believers.

14. Tithing. God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ endorsed it in the Gospel (Matthew 23:23), and the apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let everyone of you lay by him in store, as God hath prospered him"

15. The Christian Sabbath. The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works, and activities, and for personal communion with God.

CONSTITUTION OF THE JASPER ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTIST

ARTICLE I NAME

This body shall be known as the Jasper Association of Free Will Baptist of Alabama.

ARTICLE II MEMBERSHIP

SECTION I. The membership of the Jasper Association shall consist of all churches that, upon the approval of this body, shall become members.

SECTION II. A local church that wishes to become a member of this Association must adopt the National Treatise and make formal written request. A two-thirds vote of the delegates present must be recorded for acceptance into this Association.

ARTICLE III REPRESENTATION

Each church holding membership in this Association shall be entitled to three (3) delegates. Ordained ministers, deacons and General Board members who are in good standing with this Association, shall be standing delegates.

ARTICLE IV OFFICERS

The Officers of the Jasper Association shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a Clerk/Treasurer, and assistant Clerk/Treasurer, each of whom shall be elected every two (2) years with the election coming on even years.

ARTICLE V BOARDS

SECTION I. General Board (a) Composition. The General Board shall be composed of the moderator, assistant moderator, clerk/treasurer, assistant clerk/ treasurer, the pastor and one member from each local church that is a part of this body. Each member from a local church shall serve a two year term with one-half of the members being elected each year. (b) Executive committee. An Executive Committee shall consist of the moderator, assistant moderator, clerk/treasurer and five (5) members from the General Board. These five members shall be elected annually by the General Board. This committee shall function as the General Board when said Board is not in session. (c) Duties. The General Board shall formulate

all items of general business during the annual session of the Association, as well as other responsibilities so delegated by the body. When this Association is not in session, this Board shall have power to act as the body.

SECTION II. Board of Directors of the Trinity Free Will Baptist Camp. The Jasper Association shall be represented to the Board of Directors of the Trinity Free Will Baptist Youth Camp by three (3) members. Each member shall serve a term of three (3) years with one term expiring each year.

SECTION III. Mission Board. The Mission Board shall consist of five (5) members. Each member shall serve for a five (5) year term with one term expiring each year. The Mission Board's responsibilities will be to help set up mission conferences and to promote Foreign and Home Missions in the Jasper Association.

SECTION IV. State Board Member. The Jasper Association Moderator shall represent this Association to the General Board of the Alabama State Association. In his absence, the Assistant Moderator will serve as his proxy.

SECTION V. Childrens Home Trustee. This person shall represent the Jasper Association on the Childrens Home Board of Trustees. This member Shall serve a term of Two (2) Years and give a report to each annual session of the Jasper Association.

ARTICLE VI STANDINGCOMMITTEES

SECTION I. Credentials Committee. The Credentials Committee shall consist of five (5) persons with the senior member in point of service replaced each year. Recommendations for replacement shall come from the General Board. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to examine all letters coming to this body from the churches and other associations, as well as, all ministerial reports. This committee shall also examine all ministers who become a part of this body whether by ordination or by letter. It is expected that all ministers coming from other associations will present letters of recommendation; however, in some cases the committee may see fit to recommend the acceptance of such persons who have not yet received such letters. Any item of business pertaining to ministers or conduct of ministers should be presented first to this committee. Business matters handled by this committee may be referred to the Association or to the General Board.

SECTION II. Nominating Committee. Shall consists of Five (5) members, elected for period of Five years, with the senior member in point of service expiring each year. It shall be responsibility of this Committee to make nominations for Associational Officers and submit such nominations to the General Board.

SECTION III. Finance Committee. The Finance Committee shall consist of three

(3) members elected for a period of three years, with the senior member in point of service expiring each year. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to examine the financial report and bank statements of the Association, verify their accuracy, and report to the Association at the Annual Session.

SECTION IV. The moderator of this Association shall be an ex-officio member of all boards and committees.

ARTICLE VII MEETINGS

SECTION I. This Association shall meet annually on Saturday (Whole Day) before the first Sunday in October at places determined at the previous session; and shall not adjourn until all business is transacted. Nominating Committee to meet annually on first Tuesday night of August at seven p.m. at Hamilton FWB Church and General Board to meet annually on second Monday Night of August at seven p.m. at Winfield FWB Church.

SECTION II. The associational year shall end on August 31st and all letters to the Association should be mailed to the clerk no later than the third (3rd) Sunday in September of each year.

SECTION III. There shall be two (2) other District Meetings during the Associational year. The meetings will be held in January and June.

SECTION IV. The officers of the Jasper Association shall serve as the officers of the District Meeting.

ARTICLE VIII MINISTERS AND DEACONS

SECTION I. Any man who becomes convinced that the Lord has called him to preach the gospel shall be licensed by the church of which he is a member. (The church should contact the Credentials Committee for a copy of "Guidelines for Licensed Ministers").

If, after a period of one (1) full year, he has been called to an approved work such as pastor, assistant pastor, youth minister, full-time evangelism, or missionary work, he may then be examined by the responsible ones of this body to determine his worthiness for ordination. The local church, of which he is a member, must be able to show proof of his worthiness as to his character, doctrine, ability, sincerity, and desire. If, after having been examined, he then be found worthy, he shall be ordained by this Association. All ordinations to the ministry must be approved at the annual session or at a quarterly meeting of the Jasper Association. If, after the period of one (1) full year has expired, the licensee has not been called to an approved work, his license may then be renewed each year or until he has been called to an approved work. No one may be ordained who has not been called to an approved work.

SECTION II. Candidates for ordination to the ministry shall present their request for ordination to the Credentials Committee, (using forms prepared and approved by this body), at least by the time of the last regular meeting prior to the ordination date requested.

SECTION III. Preachers coming to us from other Free Will Baptist Associations shall present their request for membership to the Credentials Committee at any quarterly meeting or annual session and said request may be acted upon at that session.

SECTION IV. Preachers coming to us from other denominations shall present their requests to the Credentials Committee at any quarterly meeting or annual session. Such request shall be acted upon at the time of the following regular meeting be it quarterly meeting or annual session.

SECTION V. All ministers having been previously approved by this Association, shall receive a Card of good standing annually upon receipt of Church Letter listing all approved ministers of that Church.

SECTION VI. Each church shall have the right to select and ordain all deacons who serve in such church. The ordaining council shall consist of two ordained ministers and at least one deacon, or one ordained minister and at least two deacons.

ARTICLE IX DISCIPLINE

SECTION I. This body shall be considered an advisory council having no authority over the internal affairs of any local church unless said church depart from the Articles of Faith or from the National Treatise. Whenever conditions warrant it, this Association shall have power to withdraw fellowship from any local church.

SECTION II. Any church being dealt with because of a disciplinary problem shall represent to the quarterly meeting and annual session by letter and fees, but shall not have the right to vote by delegates, standing or otherwise, until the matter is settled. Exception: Any minister who is a member of such church but is ministering to another church that is in good standing with the Association shall not be so penalized.

SECTION III. All questions of doctrine and all matters pertaining to a local church, or to an individual minister or group of ministers, shall be decided by a two-thirds vote of this Association.

SECTION IV. No minister whose conduct is being questioned by this Association shall have the right to vote in either the quarterly meeting or annual session.

SECTION V. The pastor who preaches the word of God, ministers to the needs

of the members, and exercises general leadership within the congregation is expected to unite with the local church if he is not a member when called..."

When the minister becomes pastor to a given local church, it is his responsibility to obtain good standing in the association of which that church is a member if he is not already in good standing therein." (A Treatise of the Faith and Practices of the Original Free Will Baptist, 1973, 50 A: Page 59B.)

SECTION VI. No church shall accept as members those who have not been baptized by an ordained minister.

ARTICLE X AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be amended at any session of this association by twothirds vote of voting body present, provided proposed amendment is presented in writing, read, placed on the table during morning session, and acted upon during afternoon session.

RULES OF DECORUM

1. This Association shall be called to order by the moderator and presided over by officers elected at the previous annual session.

2. The association shall be opened and closed by singing and prayer.

3. The names of delegates shall be noted and referred to as often as is necessary.

4. The moderator shall not be entitled to a vote except in case of a tie and then he shall give a deciding vote. He shall be entitled to speak on any subject after others have spoken, provided someone else serves as moderator while he speaks.

5. Only one person shall speak at a time and he shall arise and address the moderator, and after recognition by the moderator, he shall proceed.

6. No person shall be interrupted while speaking unless he shall depart from the subject under discussion or use words of personal reflection.

7. No person will be allowed to speak more than twice on the same subject without permission from the moderator nor more that five (5) minutes at a time.

8. No person shall laugh or talk in a disturbing manner while discussion is going on.

9. No delegate shall absent himself from the association without leave of the moderator.

10. Any minister absent from the annual session of this association for two years in succession shall be dropped from the roll of ministers. Exception: Full-time evangelists or Missionaries serving in the other states or countries, students who are attending college, those serving in the armed forces.

11. These Rules of Decorum may be amended at any session of this association by the two-thirds vote of body present, provided proposed amendment is presented in writing, read, placed on the table during morning session, and acted upon during afternoon session

GUIDELINES FOR RETIRED MINISTERS FUND

Qualifications

I.

- A. The minister/missionary must be at least 65 years old or totally disabled.
- B. He must have served in the Jasper Association for at least 10 years as pastor of affiliated churches or in full time missionary work, sanctioned by the National Association of Free Will Baptist and meet all other qualifications.
- C. He must not be in the pastorate or missionary at the present.
- D. He must maintain membership in a local church affiliated with the Jasper Association.

II. Procedure for Participation

- A. The local church, of which the retired minister/missionary is a member, must make a <u>WRITTEN REQUEST</u> to the Jasper Association <u>ANNUALLY</u> recommending the minister/missionary and stating his qualifications to participate in the Jasper Association Retired Ministers Fund. No funds will be given any retired minister/missionary without this written request.
- B. Each retired minister/missionary, which meets the qualifications, will receive \$600 annually as the funds are available.

III. Funding of the Account

A. We recommend that each church in the Jasper Association send at least \$100 annually for the Retired Ministers Fund to provide funding for the account.

GUIDELINES FOR LICENSED MINISTERS IN THE JASPER ASSOCIATION

I.RULES PERTAINING TO THE LICENSED MINISTER

A. Qualifications for the Licensee

1. He must be a member of a church which belongs to the Jasper Association.

2. He must give evidence to his church that he is divinely called to preach, whereupon the local church is authorized to examine him for license. This examination should include the areas of the candidate's life, doctrine, reputation, and his convictions and abilities regarding the work of the ministry. His present and prospective educational qualifications should also be considered. Upon completion of such an examination, the local church shall determine whether or not to grant license. The ministerial license shall be valid for a period of one year but is renewable annually.



D. The Committee will report to the candidate on whether he passed or what areas he may need additional study in.

E When the approved candidate has passed the examination, the Committee will recommend his ordination to the Association. This recommendation will be made only after the candidate has been licensed for one full year. The candidate should have definite prospects of a church pastorate or another approved work that would justify his being ordained.


