**Mission Rally, January 18, 2014
Winfield Free Will Baptist Church**

The session began at 6:00 PM with Bro. Mark Riggs, moderator opening the meeting. He commented there would be no business during this meeting, it was solely for missions. He stated there would be a separate meeting in the Gymnasium for the young people. He thanked the Winfield church for hosting the rally.

Bro. Charles Lynn of the Winfield church gave the welcome and prayed the opening prayer. Bro. Jeremy Robinson from the Red Bay church led the congregation in singing *I Love To Tell The Story* and *The Unclouded Day*.

The Trio from the Red Bay Church blessed the congregation with special music singing *I'd Rather Have Jesus*.

Bro. Rusty Carney, Missionary to Japan was the first speaker He stated they had been in Japan for four years. He said Japan is a very spiritually dark country. There are 127.5 million people there and only 1% is Christian. This year three were baptized at the church where they are working. He thanked everyone for letting him share the work with them.

Bro. Josh Provow, Missionary to Bulgaria spoke next. He stated they would be in language school there for the next two years. After language school they would began a church planting work in southern Bulgaria. There are about 7 million people in Bulgaria with a Turkey minority of about 600,000 and in that minority only 1 out of 10,000 are Christians.

Bro. Bud Bivens, Missionary to Mexico spoke next. He stated because of the drug cartel he has to travel by bus now, and about 90% of the policemen are bad. He gave information about the work there. He asks for prayer and thanked everyone for their help.

Bro. Daniel Speers, Missionary to Japan spoke next. He thanked everyone for allowing him to be there. He grew up in a small church outside of Nashville and remembered the missionaries coming to their church and how this had a great impact on him. He made several comments about Japan and thanked everyone for their support.

Bro. Cliff Donoho, Missionary to Florida spoke next. He stated their church is in their seventh month. They had sixty-two in attendance last month and two have been baptized. He made other comments about the work in Florida and thanked everyone for their support.

Bro. Tim Riggs, Missionary to Mobile spoke next. He stated this is the third year for the Upward Basketball program. Over 50 signed up and most of those families are not in church which is a great opportunity to reach people for Christ. He thanked everyone for their support.

Bro. Rick Cash, Alabama State Executive Director spoke next. He gave the Acts 1:8 report and the International Missions report in the absence of Bro. Danny Williams. He encouraged all pastors to pick up a M.S.O. packet. He stated 75 churches participated last year. Six churches from the Jasper Association participated and gave \$10,704.05. He gave a brief report on Acts 1:8 and thanked everyone for their support.

Bro. Jeremy Robinson led the congregation in singing *Revive us Again* and *Jesus I Love Thee*.

Bro. Steve Lytle, Missionary to Panama spoke next. Both he and his wife Judy went to Bible College. They were married in 1972 and began mission work in 1975. They planted churches in Panama from 1977 until 2000. He served state side from 2000-2008. In 2008 he went back to serve in Panama. He thanked everyone for allowing him to come.

The Trio from Red Bay blessed the congregation with special music.

Bro. Dexter Guin, Missionary to Colorado gave the evening message. He used Ezekiel 22:30 for his text. He preached a very challenging sermon on 'Building a Spiritual Wall'. Bro. Mark Riggs gave an invitation and closed in prayer.

The offering was received with Bro. Charles Lynn praying the offertory prayer. The announcements were given. Refreshments would be served in the fellowship hall. The meeting was adjourned. Bro. Tommy Franks dismissed and asked the blessing on the food.

District Meeting, June 14, 2014 **New Liberty Free Will Baptist Church**

He stated there are twenty children on campus right now and they have taken care of thirty-five different children over the last twelve months. 2013 was the best year the home has had with record income. The first five months this year is about \$50,000 behind this time last year. In the first week of June the young people went to The Camp of the Wilds in North Carolina. They also attend Trinity camp and went on a mission trip to Oklahoma. In the last four weeks four have been saved. He asked everyone for prayer. M/S/C.

Bro. Ashley Culp, director of the Trinity Camp spoke next. He thanked everyone for their support for the fourteen years he has been at the camp. During the off season the camp housed groups from Habitat for Humanity. He has five staff members working for him this summer. During Junior week they had five saved. He thanked everyone for their support. M/S/C.

Bro. Adam and wife Apryl, from the New Liberty church blessed the congregation with special music *I've Been Blessed*.

Bro. Adam Smith brought the first message from Luke 24:49-53. He gave a powerful message on 'The Causes of a Powerless Church'.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:30AM for break.

September receipts were \$58,609.95 YTD. Acts 1:8 receipts through September totaled \$388,790.30. This is \$14,033.66 less than we received in the first 9 months of 2013. It is also \$25,677.70 behind what is needed on a monthly basis to meet the budget. He thanked the Jasper Association for giving YTD gifts totaling \$54,155.56. He gave a report on the work in Mobile M/S/C.

Bro. Mark Riggs also gave the Children's Home report in the absence of Bro. Danny Williams. Since 1947 the home has cared for approximately 900 children. Presently there are 22 children on campus. The home finished in the black for 2013, however the first nine months of this year is down \$60,000. The home purchased a small two-bedroom house on a lot adjacent to the property. Over the summer months, six of the teens made salvation decisions. The Fall Harvest drive is coming up. Also the 10th Annual Benefit Singing for the Home will be on Saturday, October 18 at 7:00PM. He thanked everyone for their support. M/S/C.

Bro. Ashley Culp, Trinity Youth Camp Director gave the camp report next. He thanked everyone for their support. He stated they finished the year in the black. At this year's camps 10 were called to preach, 8 were called to missions and 38 were saved. He thanked everyone for their support of the camp. M/S/C.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

13. Gospel Ordinances. Baptism, or the immersion of believers in water, and the Lord's Supper, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel. Feet Washing, an ordinance teaching humility, is of universal obligation, and is to be ministered to all true believers.

14. Tithing. God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ endorsed it in the Gospel (Matthew 23:23), and the apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let everyone of you lay by him in store, as God hath prospered him"

15. The Christian Sabbath. The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works, and activities, and for personal communion with God.

CONSTITUTION OF THE JASPER ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTIST

ARTICLE I

NAME

This body shall be known as the Jasper Association of Free Will Baptist of Alabama.

ARTICLE II

MEMBERSHIP

SECTION I. The membership of the Jasper Association shall consist of all churches that, upon the approval of this body, shall become members.

SECTION II. A local church that wishes to become a member of this

Association must adopt the National Treatise and make formal written request. A two-thirds vote of the delegates present must be recorded for acceptance into this Association.

ARTICLE III REPRESENTATION

Each church holding membership in this Association shall be entitled to three (3) delegates. Ordained ministers, deacons and General Board members who are in good standing with this Association, shall be standing delegates.

ARTICLE IV OFFICERS

The Officers of the Jasper Association shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a Clerk/Treasurer, and assistant Clerk/Treasurer, each of whom shall be elected every two (2) years with the election coming on even years.

ARTICLE V BOARDS

SECTION I. General Board (a) Composition. The General Board shall be composed of the moderator, assistant moderator, clerk/treasurer, assistant clerk/treasurer, the pastor and one member from each local church that is a part of this body. Each member from a local church shall serve a two year term with one-half of the members being elected each year. (b) Executive committee. An Executive Committee shall consist of the moderator, assistant moderator, clerk/treasurer and five (5) members from the General Board. These five members shall be elected annually by the General Board. This committee shall function as the General Board when said Board is not in session. (c) Duties. The General Board shall formulate all items of general business during the annual session of the Association, as well as other responsibilities so delegated by the body. When this Association is not in session, this Board shall have power to act as the body.

SECTION II. Board of Directors of the Trinity Free Will Baptist Camp. The Jasper Association shall be represented to the Board of Directors of the Trinity Free Will Baptist Youth Camp by three (3) members. Each member shall serve a term of three (3) years with one term expiring each year.

SECTION III. Mission Board. The Mission Board shall consist of five (5) members. Each member shall serve for a five (5) year term with one term expiring each year. The Mission Board's responsibilities will be to help set up mission conferences and to promote Foreign and Home Missions in the Jasper Association.

SECTION IV. State Board Member. The Jasper Association Moderator shall represent this Association to the General Board of the Alabama State Association.

In his absence, the Assistant Moderator will serve as his proxy.

SECTION V. Childrens Home Trustee. This person shall represent the Jasper Association on the Childrens Home Board of Trustees. This member Shall serve a term of Two (2) Years and give a report to each annual session of the Jasper Association.

ARTICLE VI STANDING COMMITTEES

SECTION I. Credentials Committee. The Credentials Committee shall consist of five (5) persons with the senior member in point of service replaced each year. Recommendations for replacement shall come from the General Board. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to examine all letters coming to this body from the churches and other associations, as well as, all ministerial reports. This committee shall also examine all ministers who become a part of this body whether by ordination or by letter. It is expected that all ministers coming from other associations will present letters of recommendation; however, in some cases the committee may see fit to recommend the acceptance of such persons who have not yet received such letters. Any item of business pertaining to ministers or conduct of ministers should be presented first to this committee. Business matters handled by this committee may be referred to the Association or to the General Board.

SECTION II. Nominating Committee. Shall consists of Five (5) members, elected for period of Five years, with the senior member in point of service expiring each year. It shall be responsibility of this Committee to make nominations for Associational Officers and submit such nominations to the General Board.

SECTION III. Finance Committee. The Finance Committee shall consist of three (3) members elected for a period of three years, with the senior member in point of service expiring each year. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to examine the financial report and bank statements of the Association, verify their accuracy, and report to the Association at the Annual Session.

SECTION IV. The moderator of this Association shall be an ex-officio member of all boards and committees.

ARTICLE VII MEETINGS

SECTION I. This Association shall meet annually on Saturday (Whole Day) before the first Sunday in October at places determined at the previous session; and shall not adjourn until all business is transacted. Nominating Committee to meet annually on first Tuesday night of August at seven p.m. at Hamilton FWB Church and General Board to meet annually on second Monday Night of August at seven p.m. at Winfield FWB Church.

SECTION II. The associational year shall end on August 31st and all letters to the Association should be mailed to the clerk no later than the third (3rd) Sunday in September of each year.

SECTION III. There shall be two (2) other District Meetings during the Associational year. The meetings will be held in January and June.

SECTION IV. The officers of the Jasper Association shall serve as the officers of the District Meeting.

ARTICLE VIII

MINISTERS AND DEACONS

SECTION I. Any man who becomes convinced that the Lord has called him to preach the gospel shall be licensed by the church of which he is a member. (The church should contact the Credentials Committee for a copy of "Guidelines for Licensed Ministers").

If, after a period of one (1) full year, he has been called to an approved work such as pastor, assistant pastor, youth minister, full-time evangelism, or missionary work, he may then be examined by the responsible ones of this body to determine his worthiness for ordination. The local church, of which he is a member, must be able to show proof of his worthiness as to his character, doctrine, ability, sincerity, and desire. If, after having been examined, he then be found worthy, he shall be ordained by this Association. All ordinations to the ministry must be approved at the annual session or at a quarterly meeting of the Jasper Association. If, after the period of one (1) full year has expired, the licensee has not been called to an approved work, his license may then be renewed each year or until he has been called to an approved work. No one may be ordained who has not been called to an approved work.

SECTION II. Candidates for ordination to the ministry shall present their request for ordination to the Credentials Committee, (using forms prepared and approved by this body), at least by the time of the last regular meeting prior to the ordination date requested.

SECTION III. Preachers coming to us from other Free Will Baptist Associations shall present their request for membership to the Credentials Committee at any quarterly meeting or annual session and said request may be acted upon at that session.

SECTION IV. Preachers coming to us from other denominations shall present their requests to the Credentials Committee at any quarterly meeting or annual session. Such request shall be acted upon at the time of the following regular meeting be it quarterly meeting or annual session.

SECTION V. All ministers having been previously approved by this Association, shall receive a Card of good standing annually upon receipt of Church Letter

listing all approved ministers of that Church.

SECTION VI. Each church shall have the right to select and ordain all deacons who serve in such church. The ordaining council shall consist of two ordained ministers and at least one deacon, or one ordained minister and at least two deacons.

ARTICLE IX DISCIPLINE

SECTION I. This body shall be considered an advisory council having no authority over the internal affairs of any local church unless said church depart from the Articles of Faith or from the National Treatise. Whenever conditions warrant it, this Association shall have power to withdraw fellowship from any local church.

SECTION II. Any church being dealt with because of a disciplinary problem shall represent to the quarterly meeting and annual session by letter and fees, but shall not have the right to vote by delegates, standing or otherwise, until the matter is settled. Exception: Any minister who is a member of such church but is ministering to another church that is in good standing with the Association shall not be so penalized.

SECTION III. All questions of doctrine and all matters pertaining to a local church, or to an individual minister or group of ministers, shall be decided by a two-thirds vote of this Association.

SECTION IV. No minister whose conduct is being questioned by this Association shall have the right to vote in either the quarterly meeting or annual session.

SECTION V. The pastor who preaches the word of God, ministers to the needs of the members, and exercises general leadership within the congregation is expected to unite with the local church if he is not a member when called..."

When the minister becomes pastor to a given local church, it is his responsibility to obtain good standing in the association of which that church is a member if he is not already in good standing therein." (A Treatise of the Faith and Practices of the Original Free Will Baptist, 1973, 50 A: Page 59B.)

SECTION VI. No church shall accept as members those who have not been baptized by an ordained minister.

ARTICLE X AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be amended at any session of this association by two-thirds vote of voting body present, provided proposed amendment is presented in writing, read, placed on the table during morning session, and acted upon during afternoon session.

RULES OF DECORUM

1. This Association shall be called to order by the moderator and presided over by officers elected at the previous annual session.
2. The association shall be opened and closed by singing and prayer.
3. The names of delegates shall be noted and referred to as often as is necessary.
4. The moderator shall not be entitled to a vote except in case of a tie and then he shall give a deciding vote. He shall be entitled to speak on any subject after others have spoken, provided someone else serves as moderator while he speaks.
5. Only one person shall speak at a time and he shall arise and address the moderator, and after recognition by the moderator, he shall proceed.
6. No person shall be interrupted while speaking unless he shall depart from the subject under discussion or use words of personal reflection.
7. No person will be allowed to speak more than twice on the same subject without permission from the moderator nor more than five (5) minutes at a time.
8. No person shall laugh or talk in a disturbing manner while discussion is going on.
9. No delegate shall absent himself from the association without leave of the moderator.
10. Any minister absent from the annual session of this association for two years in succession shall be dropped from the roll of ministers. Exception: Full-time evangelists or Missionaries serving in the other states or countries, students who are attending college, those serving in the armed forces.
11. These Rules of Decorum may be amended at any session of this association by the two-thirds vote of body present, provided proposed amendment is presented in writing, read, placed on the table during morning session, and acted upon during afternoon session

GUIDELINES FOR RETIRED MINISTERS FUND

I. Qualifications

- A. The minister/missionary must be at least 65 years old or totally disabled.
- B. He must have served in the Jasper Association for at least 10 years as pastor of affiliated churches or in full time missionary work, sanctioned by the National Association of Free Will Baptist and meet all other qualifications.
- C. He must not be in the pastorate or missionary at the present.

- D. He must maintain membership in a local church affiliated with the Jasper Association.
- II. **Procedure for Participation**
 - A. The local church, of which the retired minister/missionary is a member, must make a **WRITTEN REQUEST** to the Jasper Association **ANNUALLY** recommending the minister/missionary and stating his qualifications to participate in the Jasper Association Retired Ministers Fund. No funds will be given any retired minister/missionary without this written request.
 - B. Each retired minister/missionary, which meets the qualifications, will receive \$600 annually as the funds are available.
- III. **Funding of the Account**
 - A. We recommend that each church in the Jasper Association send at least \$100 annually for the Retired Ministers Fund to provide funding for the account.

GUIDELINES FOR LICENSED MINISTERS IN THE JASPER ASSOCIATION

I. RULES PERTAINING TO THE LICENSED MINISTER

- A. Qualifications for the Licensee
 - 1. He must be a member of a church which belongs to the Jasper Association.
 - 2. He must give evidence to his church that he is divinely called to preach, whereupon the local church is authorized to examine him for license. This examination should include the areas of the candidate's life, doctrine, reputation, and his convictions and abilities regarding the work of the ministry. His present and prospective educational qualifications should also be considered. Upon completion of such an examination, the local church shall determine whether or not to grant license. The ministerial license shall be valid for a period of one year but is renewable annually.
 - 3. He must have his license renewed annually by said church and kept in force until ordination.
- B. The Activities of the Licensee
 - 1. According to the general practices of Free Will Baptist, a licensed minister is urged to afford himself of every opportunity to preach the word. He is free to exercise all the privileges and responsibilities of an ordained minister with the exception of officiating at the observances of the ordinances and weddings.
 - 2. The licensee should consider the period between his receiving license and being ordained as a time of study and training in preparation for his calling.
- C. His Relationship to the Association
 - 1. The clerk of the church should report the names of licensed ministers to the

clerk of the Association who will forward a copy of these guidelines to each licensee.

2. Licensed ministers are expected to attend regular meeting of the Jasper Association and the Quarterly Meetings.

II. SUGGESTIONS FOR PREPARATION FOR ORDINATION

A. Attend Free Will Baptist Colleges or Bible Institutes if possible.

B. Seek the counsel of experienced pastors.

C. Make as thorough a study as possible of the following:

1. The Holy Bible
2. Free Will Baptist Doctrine
3. Systematic Theology
4. Homiletics
5. Pastoral theology and church administration
6. Evangelism
7. Church History (especially FWB history)

III. SUGGESTED SCHEDULE OF WORK LEADING TO ORDINATION

A. As soon as licensee feels that he is qualified to become a candidate for ordination, he should request a list of study questions from the Credentials Committee of the Association. We would strongly encourage him to proceed with his examination before entertaining a definite call to a church. However, no one may be ordained who has not been called to an approved work. (See ARTICLE VIII SECTION I).

B. At least two months before the Credentials Committee meets, he should secure the examination. He should make five copies of the completed examination (one for each member of the Committee), and send them to the Credentials Committee no later than two months before its meeting.

C. The candidate is required to pass an oral examination administered by the Committee.

D. The Committee will report to the candidate on whether he passed or what areas he may need additional study in.

E. When the approved candidate has passed the examination, the Committee will recommend his ordination to the Association. This recommendation will be made only after the candidate has been licensed for one full year. The candidate should have definite prospects of a church pastorate or another approved work that would justify his being ordained.
