JASPER ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTIST <u>Missionary Rally, January 17, 2015</u> <u>Winfield Free Will Baptist Church</u>

The session began at 6:00 PM with Bro. Danny Williams, moderator opening the meeting. He commented this would be the 40th Annual Missions conference in our state. There would be 22 missionary speakers taking part in the conference going to 60 different churches in the state. Eight churches in the Jasper Association will have missionary speakers on Sunday.

Host Pastor, Bro. Kent Nelson was recognized next. He welcomed everyone to the Winfield Church. After making opening comment about the missionaries he prayed the opening prayer. Bro. Jeremy Robinson from the Red Bay church led the congregation in singing *Jesus Saves*.

The Trio from the Red Bay Church blessed the congregation with special music singing *Redemption Drawth Nigh*

Bro. Bud and Sis. Ruth Bivens, missionaries to Mexico were the first speakers. Ruth spoke about how unsafe it was in Mexico because of the drug cartel. She said Bro. Bud could now help with other church construction because they have Mexican teachers now that take care of the Bible Institute. She made many other comments about the Mexico work and thanked everyone for their support.

Bro. Terry Miller, missionary to Ft. Collins, Colorado spoke next. He shared information about his family and where they went to college. He has been pastoring at the Shade Grove Church here in Alabama. He said they were going to Ft. Collins, Colorado to the Snow Ridge Church. The church was started back in the early '80s, but has been without a pastor for the last two years. He said Home Missions had just started a church revitalization program and through this program he and his wife would be able to help bring the church back to self supporting. He thanked everyone and asks for continued prayer and support.

Bro. Jerry Gibbs and wife, missionaries to France spoke next. He stated they finished up in April of this year. The church was able to ordain their first French pastor during the summer. They left France after forty years of ministry there. They are still with missions going to different churches promoting missions and recruiting workers here in the United States. They ask for prayer for themselves and the work in France.

Bro. Barry Long, missionary to Aurora, Colorado spoke next. During 2014 four people accepted Christ and they've already had one saved in January of this year. He shared more information about the work there and thanked everyone for their support.

Bro. Josh Bennett, missionary to Arizona spoke next. He is helping plant a church in the northwest side of Tucson. This year the church as almost doubled. They began the year in the low eighties but by December they were averaging around 154. In 2014 they had 55 people saved and already 5 saved this year. He shared more information about the work their and thanked everyone.

Bro. Dexter Guin, missionary to Colorado Springs, Colorado spoke next. He stated over 50 people had been saved this year and they baptized four in December. He shared more information about the work there and thanked everyone.

Bro. Rick Cash, Alabama State Executive Director spoke next. He shared information about the new executive office building. It is an 1850 sq ft building built with sacrificial giving at a cost of \$87,255.43 which is \$47.00 per sq ft. Today's average cost to build a house is \$140 to\$150 per sq ft. The Acts 1:8 budget for 2015 is \$505,000. Acts 1:8 receipts for 2014 was \$512,673 which was \$40,000 below the budget goal, but was \$7,296 above the 2013 budget. The Jasper association gave \$74,028.68 in 2014. He gave reports on Home and Foreign mission works. He thanked everyone for their support.

Bro. Jeremy Robinson led the congregation in singing *I Love To Tell The Story*. The Winfield Ladies Trio blessed the congregation with special music next.

Bro. Clint Morgan, General Director of FWB International Missions gave the evening message. He preached a very powerful and informative message using John 3:16. He closed with prayer and gave and invitation.

The offering was received with Bro. Kent Nelson praying the offertory prayer.

Bro. Donald Smith, presented the mission project for this summer next. The mission project will be Bro. Mark McCraney who is going to Castle Rock, Colorado. The funds raised will go to the building fund to help build a church there. There will be a special fund raiser on August 15th with songwriter and comedian Aaron Wilburn. The time and location will be announced later. A short video was shown of the church plans. He thanked everyone for their support.

The announcements were given next. World Mission packets are available for the associational pastors. Refreshments would be served in the fellowship hall. Bro. Danny Williams had all the missionaries come to the front and Bro. Kent Nelson presented each family with a gift basket. The meeting was adjourned. Bro. Rick Cash dismissed and asked God's blessings on the missionaries and ask the blessing on the food.

NOTE, There was a separate meeting held in the gymnasium for the young people during this meeting.

Annual Meeting, September 12, 2015 Liberty Free Will Baptist Church

The session opened at 9:00AM with Bro. Hunter Miles leading the congregation in singing *Higher Ground*. Bro. Mark Riggs, host pastor, welcomed everyone to the session and gave instructions regarding their facilities.. Bro. Adam Smith led the opening prayer. Bro. Hunter Miles led the congregation in singing *Mansion Over The Hill Top*.

Bro. Danny Williams, moderator called the meeting to order. Bro. Donald Smith, clerk gave the roll call of the delegates. The standing delegates voted to seat the delegates for the session. M/S/C.

Bro. Hunter Miles, blessed the congregation with special music singing *I Will Rise.*

Bro. Kent Nelson, pastor of the Winfield church brought the first message of the day from Genesis 32:22-32 titled *A Wrestling Match.* His Message was very inspiring and he closed with prayer.

The meeting was adjourned for break at 10:00 AM Bro. Ashley Culp led the prayer.

The meeting reconvened at 10:20 AM.

Bro. Danny Williams, Alabama State Executive Director spoke next. He gave the Acts 1:8 report. The 2015 Acts budget goal is \$505,000. This requires \$42,083 each month. As of August they have received \$335,874.45. He thanked the Jasper Association for giving \$50,462.14 this year. He said our partnerships with Russia and Mexico are still ongoing with the support of eight church planters and two Bible Institutes, Five church plantings in Mexico have been dedicated since 2011. There are two more church plantings scheduled to be completed and dedicated in Mexico in 2015 as a result of funding from Alabama FWB. He gave a report on Home Missions beginning with Dothan Eastside FWB Church. They are involved in a revitalization project, Bro, Billy Bevan is serving as the missionary pastor in this project. They have already seen a high day of 87 in Sunday morning attendance. They are averaging in the fifties on Sunday morning and forties on Sunday night. The Bay City Church in Mobile continues to work toward becoming a self supporting church. They are averaging in the mid seventies on Sunday morning worship attendance and near sixties on Wednesday nights. The following events are upcoming. Ministers Retreat October 19-21 at Lake Guntersville, and the State Association meeting November 4-6 at Forestdale FWB.

Bro. Danny Williams also gave the Children's Home report. The Home is in transition right now as the board begins to search for a new director. Bro Danny has accepted the State Executive Director positions. There are 15 at the home right now and they average around 19 to 20. They are fully staffed. The fall fund raisers are drawing near. The Fall Harvest drive is ongoing and will go through Thanksgiving. The 11th Annual Benefit Singing will be October 24th at the home. The singing is sponsored by the Friendship State Line Church, and the Toy Run Motorcycle Ride will be the first Saturday in December. Bro. Danny thanked each one for their support.

Bro. Ashley Culp, Trinity Youth Camp Director gave the camp report next. He thanked everyone for their support of the camp. They had forty-three salvation decisions this summer, four called to ministry, and three called to the mission field. Preachers for the summer were Bro. Charles Cook, Bro. Jason Culp, Bro. Stephen Jackson, and Bro. Zack Gibson. He already has two confirmed for the 2016 camp.

During the off season they constructed a 40 by 26 metal building with two motel style rooms inside at a cost of \$22,000. The rooms will be used for special speaker, and missionaries in the area needing a place to stay. He thanked everyone for their faithfulness to the camp

Bro. Donald Smith gave the Mission Board report next. Our Mission project this summer was Bro. Terry Miller headed for Ft. Collins, Colorado. We had a special fund raiser on August 17th at the Winfield church with Aaron Wilburn. That night \$3,200 was raised and Aaron gave half of the proceeds he sold that night bringing the nightly total to \$3269. To date we have raised \$3,919. He thanked everyone for their support. M /S/C

The Resolution and Appreciation Committee Report was given next by Bro. Adrian Nottonson .We, the Resolution and Appreciation Committee of the Jasper Association; wish to express our appreciation to the following churches for hosting the meetings of the Jasper Association in 2015. 



CONSTITUTION OF THE JASPER ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTIST

ARTICLE I

NAME

This body shall be known as the Jasper Association of Free Will Baptist of Alabama.

ARTICLE II MEMBERSHIP

SECTION I. The membership of the Jasper Association shall consist of all churches that, upon the approval of this body, shall become members.

SECTION II. A local church that wishes to become a member of this Association must adopt the National Treatise and make formal written request. A two-thirds vote of the delegates present must be recorded for acceptance into this Association.

ARTICLE III REPRESENTATION

Each church holding membership in this Association shall be entitled to three (3) delegates. Ordained ministers, deacons and General Board members who are in good standing with this Association, shall be standing delegates.

ARTICLE IV OFFICERS

The Officers of the Jasper Association shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a Clerk/Treasurer, and assistant Clerk/Treasurer, each of whom shall be elected every two (2) years with the election coming on even years.

ARTICLE V BOARDS

SECTION I. General Board (a) Composition. The General Board shall be composed of the moderator, assistant moderator, clerk/treasurer, assistant clerk/ treasurer, the pastor and one member from each local church that is a part of this body. Each member from a local church shall serve a two year term with one-half of the members being elected each year. (b) Executive committee. An Executive Committee shall consist of the moderator, assistant moderator, clerk/treasurer and five (5) members from the General Board. These five members shall be elected annually by the General Board. This committee shall function as the General Board when said Board is not in session. (c) Duties. The General Board shall formulate all items of general business during the annual session of the Association, as well as other responsibilities so delegated by the body. When this Association is not in session, this Board shall have power to act as the body.

SECTION II. Board of Directors of the Trinity Free Will Baptist Camp. The Jasper Association shall be represented to the Board of Directors of the Trinity Free Will Baptist Youth Camp by three (3) members. Each member shall serve a term of three (3) years with one term expiring each year.

SECTION III. Mission Board. The Mission Board shall consist of five (5) members. Each member shall serve for a five (5) year term with one term expiring each year. The Mission Board's responsibilities will be to help set up mission conferences and to promote Foreign and Home Missions in the Jasper Association.

SECTION IV. State Board Member. The Jasper Association Moderator shall represent this Association to the General Board of the Alabama State Association. In his absence, the Assistant Moderator will serve as his proxy.

SECTION V. Childrens Home Trustee. This person shall represent the Jasper Association on the Childrens Home Board of Trustees. This member Shall serve a term of Two (2) Years and give a report to each annual session of the Jasper Association.

ARTICLE VI STANDINGCOMMITTEES

SECTION I. Credentials Committee. The Credentials Committee shall consist of five (5) persons with the senior member in point of service replaced each year. Recommendations for replacement shall come from the General Board. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to examine all letters coming to this body from the churches and other associations, as well as, all ministerial reports. This committee shall also examine all ministers who become a part of this body whether by ordination or by letter. It is expected that all ministers coming from other associations will present letters of recommendation; however, in some cases the committee may see fit to recommend the acceptance of such persons will be aven not yet received such letters. Any item of business pertaining to ministers or conduct of ministers should be presented first to this committee. Business matters handled by this committee may be referred to the Association or to the General Board.

SECTION II. Nominating Committee. Shall consists of Five (5) members, elected for period of Five years, with the senior member in point of service expiring each year. It shall be responsibility of this Committee to make nominations for Associational Officers and submit such nominations to the General Board.

SECTIONIII. Finance Committee. The Finance Committee shall consist of three

(3) members elected for a period of three years, with the senior member in point of service expiring each year. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to examine the financial report and bank statements of the Association, verify their accuracy, and report to the Association at the Annual Session.

SECTION IV. The moderator of this Association shall be an ex-officio member of all boards and committees.

ARTICLE VII MEETINGS

SECTION I. This Association shall meet annually on Saturday (Whole Day) before the first Sunday in October at places determined at the previous session; and shall not adjourn until all business is transacted. Nominating Committee to meet annually on first Tuesday night of August at seven p.m. at Hamilton FWB Church and General Board to meet annually on second Monday Night of August at seven p.m. at Winfield FWB Church.

SECTION II. The associational year shall end on August 31st and all letters to the Association should be mailed to the clerk no later than the third (3rd) Sunday in September of each year.

SECTION III. There shall be two (2) other District Meetings during the Associational year. The meetings will be held in January and June.

SECTION IV. The officers of the Jasper Association shall serve as the officers of the District Meeting.

ARTICLE VIII MINISTERS AND DEACONS

SECTION I. Any man who becomes convinced that the Lord has called him to preach the gospel shall be licensed by the church of which he is a member. (The church should contact the Credentials Committee for a copy of "Guidelines for Licensed Ministers").

If, after a period of one (1) full year, he has been called to an approved work such as pastor, assistant pastor, youth minister, full-time evangelism, or missionary work, he may then be examined by the responsible ones of this body to determine his worthiness for ordination. The local church, of which he is a member, must be able to show proof of his worthiness as to his character, doctrine, ability, sincerity, and desire. If, after having been examined, he then be found worthy, he shall be ordained by this Association. All ordinations to the ministry must be approved at the annual session or at a quarterly meeting of the Jasper Association. If, after the period of one (1) full year has expired, the licensee has not been called to an approved work, his license may then be renewed each year or until he has been called to an approved work. No one may be ordained who has not been called to an approved work. SECTION II. Candidates for ordination to the ministry shall present their request for ordination to the Credentials Committee, (using forms prepared and approved by this body), at least by the time of the last regular meeting prior to the ordination date requested.

SECTION III. Preachers coming to us from other Free Will Baptist Associations shall present their request for membership to the Credentials Committee at any quarterly meeting or annual session and said request may be acted upon at that session.

SECTION IV. Preachers coming to us from other denominations shall present their requests to the Credentials Committee at any quarterly meeting or annual session. Such request shall be acted upon at the time of the following regular meeting be it quarterly meeting or annual session.

SECTION V. All ministers having been previously approved by this Association, shall receive a Card of good standing annually upon receipt of Church Letter listing all approved ministers of that Church.

SECTION VI. Each church shall have the right to select and ordain all deacons who serve in such church. The ordaining council shall consist of two ordained ministers and at least one deacon, or one ordained minister and at least two deacons.

ARTICLE IX DISCIPLINE

SECTION I. This body shall be considered an advisory council having no authority over the internal affairs of any local church unless said church depart from the Articles of Faith or from the National Treatise. Whenever conditions warrant it, this Association shall have power to withdraw fellowship from any local church.

SECTION II. Any church being dealt with because of a disciplinary problem shall represent to the quarterly meeting and annual session by letter and fees, but shall not have the right to vote by delegates, standing or otherwise, until the matter is settled. Exception: Any minister who is a member of such church but is ministering to another church that is in good standing with the Association shall not be so penalized.

SECTION III. All questions of doctrine and all matters pertaining to a local church, or to an individual minister or group of ministers, shall be decided by a two-thirds vote of this Association.

SECTION IV. No minister whose conduct is being questioned by this Association shall have the right to vote in either the quarterly meeting or annual session.

SECTION V. The pastor who preaches the word of God, ministers to the needs

of the members, and exercises general leadership within the congregation is expected to unite with the local church if he is not a member when called..."

When the minister becomes pastor to a given local church, it is his responsibility to obtain good standing in the association of which that church is a member if he is not already in good standing therein." (A Treatise of the Faith and Practices of the Original Free Will Baptist, 1973, 50 A: Page 59B.)

SECTION VI. No church shall accept as members those who have not been baptized by an ordained minister.

ARTICLE X AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be amended at any session of this association by twothirds vote of voting body present, provided proposed amendment is presented in writing, read, placed on the table during morning session, and acted upon during afternoon session.

RULES OF DECORUM

1. This Association shall be called to order by the moderator and presided over by officers elected at the previous annual session.

2. The association shall be opened and closed by singing and prayer.

3. The names of delegates shall be noted and referred to as often as is necessary.

4. The moderator shall not be entitled to a vote except in case of a tie and then he shall give a deciding vote. He shall be entitled to speak on any subject after others have spoken, provided someone else serves as moderator while he speaks.

5. Only one person shall speak at a time and he shall arise and address the moderator, and after recognition by the moderator, he shall proceed.

6. No person shall be interrupted while speaking unless he shall depart from the subject under discussion or use words of personal reflection.

7. No person will be allowed to speak more than twice on the same subject without permission from the moderator nor more that five (5) minutes at a time.

8. No person shall laugh or talk in a disturbing manner while discussion is going on.

9. No delegate shall absent himself from the association without leave of the moderator.

10. Any minister absent from the annual session of this association for two years in succession shall be dropped from the roll of ministers. Exception: Full-time evangelists or Missionaries serving in the other states or countries, students who are attending college, those serving in the armed forces.

11. These Rules of Decorum may be amended at any session of this association by the two-thirds vote of body present, provided proposed amendment is presented in writing, read, placed on the table during morning session, and acted upon during afternoon session

GUIDELINES FOR RETIRED MINISTERS FUND

Qualifications

I.

- A. The minister/missionary must be at least 65 years old or totally disabled.
- B. He must have served in the Jasper Association for at least 10 years as pastor of affiliated churches or in full time missionary work, sanctioned by the National Association of Free Will Baptist and meet all other qualifications.
- C. He must not be in the pastorate or missionary at the present.
- D. He must maintain membership in a local church affiliated with the Jasper Association.

II. Procedure for Participation

- A. The local church, of which the retired minister/missionary is a member, must make a <u>WRITTEN REQUEST</u> to the Jasper Association <u>ANNUALLY</u> recommending the minister/missionary and stating his qualifications to participate in the Jasper Association Retired Ministers Fund. No funds will be given any retired minister/missionary without this written request.
- B. Each retired minister/missionary, which meets the qualifications, will receive \$600 annually as the funds are available.

III. Funding of the Account

A. We recommend that each church in the Jasper Association send at least \$100 annually for the Retired Ministers Fund to provide funding for the account.

GUIDELINES FOR LICENSED MINISTERS IN THE JASPER ASSOCIATION

I.RULES PERTAINING TO THE LICENSED MINISTER

A. Qualifications for the Licensee

1. He must be a member of a church which belongs to the Jasper Association.

2. He must give evidence to his church that he is divinely called to preach, whereupon the local church is authorized to examine him for license. This examination should include the areas of the candidate's life, doctrine, reputation, and his convictions and abilities regarding the work of the ministry. His present and prospective educational qualifications should also be considered. Upon completion of such an examination, the local church shall determine whether or not to grant license. The ministerial license shall be valid for a period of one year but is renewable annually.

3. He must have his license renewed annually by said church and kept in force until ordination.

B. The Activities of the Licensee

1. According to the general practices of Free Will Baptist, a licensed minister is urged to afford himself of every opportunity to preach the word. He is free to exercise all the privileges and responsibilities of an ordained minister with the exception of officiating at the observances of the ordinances and weddings.

2. The licensee should consider the period between his receiving license and being ordained as a time of study and training in preparation for his calling. C. His Relationship to the Association

1. The clerk of the church should report the names of licensed ministers to the clerk of the Association who will forward a copy of these guidelines to each licensee.

2. Licensed ministers are expected to attend regular meeting of the Jasper Association and the Quarterly Meetings.

II. SUGGESTIONS FOR PREPARATION FOR ORDINATION

A. Attend Free Will Baptist Colleges or Bible Institutes if possible.

- B. Seek the counsel of experienced pastors.
- C. Make as thorough a study as possible of the following:
 - 1. The Holy Bible
 - 2. Free Will Baptist Doctrine
 - 3. Systematic Theology
 - 4. Homiletics
 - 5. Pastoral theology and church administration
 - 6. Evangelism
 - 7. Church History (especially FWB history)

III. SUGGESTED SCHEDULE OF WORKLEADING TO ORDINATION

A. As soon as licensee feels that he is qualified to become a candidate for ordination, he should request a list of study questions from the Credentials Committee of the Association. We would strongly encourage him to proceed with his examination before entertaining a definite call to a church. However, no one may be ordained who has not been called to an approved work. (See ARTICLE VIII SECTIONI).

B. At least two months before the Credentials Committee meets, he should secure the examination. He should make five copies of the completed examination (one for each member of the Committee), and send them to the Credentials Committee no later than two months before its meeting.

C. The candidate is required to pass an oral examination administered by the Committee.

D. The Committee will report to the candidate on whether he passed or what areas he may need additional study in.

E When the approved candidate has passed the examination, the Committee will recommend his ordination to the Association. This recommendation will be made only after the candidate has been licensed for one full year. The candidate should have definite prospects of a church pastorate or another approved work that would justify his being ordained.
