1966 Temperance Committee Report as follows:

- 1. We affirm the stand that the National Association has taken toward tobacco, that being, total abstainance for the cause of Christ. That using it in any form is detrimental to our Christian witness and living. I Thessalonians 5:21-22.
 - Verse 21 Prove all things; hold fast that which is good.

Verse 22 - Abstain from all appearance of evil.

- 2. We affirm our stand on total abstainance from all intoxicating beverages.
- 3. We shall keep ourselves from worldly amusements such as shows, dances, and books that do not edify Christ.

Titus 2:12 Teaching us that denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously and Godly, in this present world.

I John 2:15-16 Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him: For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eye, and the pride of life, is not of the Father, but is of the world.

4. We ought always to be mindful of what we say, and strive to watch what we say so as not to hurt or offend others.

Pure religion and undefiled before God and the Father is this, to visit the father-less and widows in their afflictions, and to keep himself unspotted from the world.

RESOLUTION COMMITTEE REPORT - Partial

- 1. In regard to the last paragraph on Page 9 of 1966 State Minutes we realize that due to the shortage of ordained men the date of 1967 be amended to read go into effect at a later date when the State feels it has enough ordained men to abide by this ruling.
- 2. Due to the cost of printing and mailing the Arrow, we recommend that the Arrow be reduced to one $8\frac{1}{2} \times 14\frac{1}{4}$ folded sheet and mailed in bundles to the churches in Kansas. Other than this they are only to go to Paid subscribers. Subscriptions to be \$1.00 per year. That the Editors fee be lowered to \$10.00 per month.

June 1965 to June 1966, the cost of printing to the State was \$477.60. Most of this was for the Arrow. It was only printed 10 times.

June 1966 to June 1967 the cost of printing was \$412.09. Most of this was for the Arrow.

Such a person is rebellious to the principles to the Kingdom of God and his righteousness, and cannot enter into a sinless heaven in such a backslidden condition. Unless this person has committed the unpardonalbe sin, (Mark 3:20 he can ask, and receive forgiveness for his backslidding.

KANSAS STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS CONSTITUTION

PREAMBLE: From long experience, we, the members of the Free Will Baptist Denomination, being regularly baptized upon a profession of our faith in Jesus Christ, and relaizing the necessity of a bond of unity and fellowship among us as a church and to preserve and maintain correspondence and co-ordination within us, do therefore ordain this constitution for our better denominational government.

- ARTICLE 1. This Association shall be called The Kansas State Association of Free Will Baptists and shall be composed of such regularly organized and disciplined Free Will Baptist Yearly Meetings, conveniently located as may embody themselves under this consitution.
- ARTICLE 2. This Association shall consist of elecgted delegates from the several Yearly Meetings and Churches of which it is composed. Each Yearly Meeting is entitled to 5 delegates and every Church is entitled to one delegate, providing said Yearly Meetings and Churches are in good standing. Ordained Ministers and ordained deacons, who are serving on local church deacon boards, and all elected officers of the State Association.
- ARTICLE 3. The Officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator and a Clerk-Treasurer; who shall be chosen at each session of the Association, with assistants as may be found necessary. The Executive board shall consist of 5 ordained ministers, elected for 1,2,3,4 and 5 yr, terms, with one term to expire each year
- ARTICLE 4. Any well organized and well regulated Free Will Baptist Yearly Meeting, composed of such Churches as conform with the practices and adopt the doctrines of the Free Will Baptist denomination, as published in the Treatise of the National Association, may at any time, on application by vote of this body, become a member thereof

ARTICLE 4 Con't)

- 1. Providing they adopt and adhere to State Questionaire Number 1,2 & the for Ministers and Deacons.
- 2. Failure to comply with this ruling concerning licensing and ordination of ministers and deacons will result in withdrawal of fellowship.
- ARTICLE 5. This Association shall have power to discipline the Yearly Meetings of which it is composed, and to exclude them for disorderly walk if labor proves unsuccessful, but in no case reverse their decisions, nor to interfere with any of their internal regulations.
- ARTICLE 6. It shall be the duty of the Yearly Meetings of this Association to represent themselves by letter, delegates, and a fee of \$5.00 per church, and report their standing and statistics, at which time time the Association shall act upon such questions and topics as may be referred to it by its respective Yearly Meetings and transact such other business not repungent to this Constitution.
- ARTICLE 7. This Association shall have power to adopt any regulations or by-laws not inconsistent with this consitution, which may be deemed essential to the further regulation of its session.
- ARTICLE 8. This consitution may be amended or changed at any regular session of this Association by two-thirds vote present, provided the proposed amendment or change be laid on the table for at least 8 hours.

- The Secretary-Treasurer shall keep an accurate record of all business transactions, be responsible for all funds received and disbursed; shall superintend the printing of the minutes.
