## KANSAS STATE HOME MISSION BOARD REPORT JUNE 13, 1974

1973 and 1974 has been an active year for the State Home Mission Board, there has been several meetings with our Missionaries as we have met to evaluate and plan the work of our mission churches.

The Church in Hutchinson has had a fruitful year. The attendance has been very good. Souls have been saved, and the finances of the church has improved greatly. The church is now ready to assume much of the pastor's salary.

The Board feels that the church in Hutchinson under the leadership of Bro. Stephens has developed into a well established Free Will Baptist Church.

Bro. Kenneth Stephens will be coming off the State payroll, this summer, except for token financial help as funds are available. Bro. Stephens is to be commended for his good work in the city of Hutchinson.

The work in the city of Emporia, Kansas is developing, under the leadership of Bobby Clyatt, The church at present has six fine families giving the church a good foundation from which to build. The church has sold bonds and purchased 32 acres of land, in an ideal location for the future home of the church.

The finance of the church has been real good, and the average of \$550.00 per month, has enabled the church to assume a part of the pastor's salary.

The Board feels that one of the hindrences to the churches groweth, is a lack of better place to meet for worship. Please make this a matter of prayer. It will be a while before the Emporia church can be self sustaining. Continue to pray for the people of Emporia, Kansas.

The State Home Mission Department is considering ways where by we might be of help to the churches of our state that are having a difficult time getting their churches moving forward.

Since we are a small group of people in Kansas, we would be limited as to the kind of help that we could provide, but we do feel that we could be of great assistance to a church that wanted help. we would not want control of the church property in any way. but, only for advice and direction.

- 5. Work with local church and pastor to evaluate the church program.
- 6. Set goals and methods of reaching them.
- 7. Possible financial help, providing funds are available.

Kenneth Stephens has been meeting with group of people in Sedgwick, Kansas who have expressed interest in possible affiliation with the Kansas Free Will Baptist. We attended a revival service with the folks there and was very impressed with their spirit and love for the Lord. we also met and had lunch with the pastor of the group of people, Bro. Pray for this group of fine people that they may know God's Will. There have been other contacts by phone and letters.

# KANSAS STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTIST CONSTITUTION & BY-LAWS

PREAMBLE: From long experience, we, the members of the Free Will Baptist Denomination, being regularly captized upon a profession of our faith in Jesus Christ, and realiging the necessity of a bond of unity and fellowship among us as a church and to preserve and maintain correspondence and co-ordination within us, do therefore ordain this constitution for a better denominational government.

ARTICLE 1. NAME: This Association shall be called "THE KANSAS STATE ASSOCIA" ION of Free Will Baptists" and shall be composed of such regularly organized and conviently located, as may embody themselves under thes constitution.

ARTICLE 2. MEMPERSHIP: This Association shall consist of elected delegates from the several Yearly Meetings and Churches of which it is composed. Each Yearly Meeting is entitled to 5 delegates and every Church is entitled to one delegate, providing said Yearly Meetings and Churches are in good standing. Ordained Ministers and ordained deacons, who are serving on local church deacon boares, and all elected officers of the State Association

ARTICLE 3. OFFICERS: The officers of thes Association shall be a Moderator. Asst. Moderator, and a Treasurer-Clerk, with asst. as may be found necessary. The Executive board shall consist of 3 ordained ministers, elected for a 1, 2, and 3 year term, with one term to expire each year.

ARTICLE 4. REPRESENTATION: Any, well organized and well regulated Free Will Baptist Yearly Meeting, composed of such churches as conform with the practice and adopt the doctrines of the Free Will Baptist denominati n, as published in the Treatise of the National Association, may at any time, on application by vote of this body, become a member thereof.

1. Providing they adopt and adhere to State Questionaire number 1, 2, and the one for Ministers and Deacons.

2. Failure to comply to with this ruleing concerning licensing and

ordination of ministers and deacons will result in withdrawal of fellowship.

ARTICLE 5. DISCIPLINE: This Association shall have power to discipline the Yearly Meetings of which it is composed, and to exclude them for disorderly walk if labor proves unsuccessful, but in no case reverse their decisions. nor to interfere with any of their internal regulations.

ARTICLE 6. DELEGATES & FEES: It shall be the duty of the Yearly Meeting of this Association to represent themselves by letter, delegates, and a fee of \$5.00 per Church, and report their standing and statistics, at which time the Association shall act upon such question and topics as may be referred to it by its respective Yearly Meetings and transact such other business not repugnant to this Constitution.

ARTICLE 7. BY-LAWS: This Association shall have power to adopt any regulations or by-laws not inconsistent with this constitution, which may be deemed essential to the further regulation of its session.

ARTICLE 3. AMENDMENTS: This Constitution may be amend don changed at any regular session of this Association by two-thir s vote present, provided the proposed amendment or change be laid on the table for at least 8 hours.

# By-Laws

Section 1. OFFICERS: All Officers and board members shall be men who are members in good standing of an affiliated Kansas State Association. They shall be elected at the discretion of this association.

## SECTION 2. OFFICERS DUTIES

- 1. Moderator
  The moderator ahall be the principle executive of the Association.
  He shall preside at the meetings of the State Association. He shall be an ex-orficio member of all Boards.
- 2. Assistant Moderator:
  In the absence of the Moderator, or in the event of his death, inability, or refusal to act, the Assist. Moderator shall perform the duties of the Moderator, and when so acting, shall have all the powers of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the Moderator. The Asst. Moderator shall perform such duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the Moderator or by the Association.
- 3. Clerk:
  To be custodian of the Association records, in general, perform all duties incidental to the office of Clerk and such duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the Moderator or Association.
- 4. Assistant Clerk:
  In the absence of the Clerk, or in the event of his death, inability, or refusal to act, the Asst. Clerk shall perform the duties of the Clerk and when so acting, shall have all the power of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the Clerk. The Asst. Clerk shall perform such duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the Clerk or the Association.
- He shall be a man with some bookeeping atility. It shall be his duty to receive and promptly deposit to the tank account of the State Association all checks and honies. He shall pay all fixed expenditures, and miscellanious expenditure incurred in the normal operation of his office. He shall keep accurate records of all receipts and disbursments with proper vouchers. He shall balance his books monthly. He shall live an itemized written monthly report to the editor of the State Publication to be printed. He is the custodian of all records(financial), legal papers, and associational documents.
- 6. Parlimentarian:
  He shall have a good working knowledge of parlimentary Law. He is to advise the Moderator or any member on the proper proceeding, according to Roberts Rules of Order.

# SECTION 3. BOARDS AND THEIR DUTIES

1. Executive Board:
It shall be the duty of this Board to act in behalf of the Association when it is not in session. It shall be cound to carry out the directions of the Association, and shall hold itself bound by every consideration

of morality and honor to carry out the wished of this Association and to act under its instructions in whatever technicle rights, civil laws and the decisions of the courts may live it in certain emergencies.

It shall be the duty of this board to sign their signatures to engrand all papers concerning properties, indestedness, bonds, or other legal documents pertaining to the execution of the will of this Association.

The members shall assist and direct such work for the eneral promotion of this association as is deemed needful or necessary as the eans available shall permit.

All decisions of this board shall be coverned by the teneral tenets of this Association and shall not violate this constitution. This teard shall organize itself and elect such officers as necessary to the orderly conduct of its affairs and labors. This board shall keep an accurate record of all meetings decisions, and work done and shall make a report in writing at each annual session of the Association. All records shall be available to this Association at its request.

Whereas this board represents the Association when not is session it and it alone shall have the power to call the association into special conference provided each affiliated association shall be liven notice at least ten (10) days prior to the meeting of such special conference.

2. MISSION BOARD:

It shall be the duty of this board to labor to further the Gospel of Jesus Christ into the uttermost parts of the earth. In accomplishing this, they are to indeavor to extablish missions and churches in communities within the bounds of this Association with whatever moral and financial assistance that may be theirs. In cases of small churches failing to function, whatever assistance deemed appropriate shall be rendered to maintain the effective witness of that church by either direct labor with the church or with an associational board in instances where the affiliated association has a functional board or a ency.

this board shall be empowered to receive and convey title to real property in the area of its labors.

the promotion of missionary endeavor from a local, state or national level shall come within the scope of endeavor of this board. This board shall assist throw in maintaining prayer and financial support of missionary enterprises through whatever channels available.

Whereas missionary and exangelistic lators are so intimately related, this board shall assist through participation or assistance in maintaining a strong evangelistic thrust in the life of affiliated associations.

This board shall organize itself and elect such officers as necessary to the orderly, conduct of its affairs and labors. This board shall keep an accurate record of all meetings, decisions, work done, funds received and distursed and shall make a report in writing at each annual session of this association. All records shall be available to this association at its request.

The daties of this board shall be to plan and assist in organizing and sustaining strong S nday School, C urch Training Service, and any educational endeavor such as conferences, in every church in each association affiliated with the state association with every means of promotion and assistance available to them. This board shall plan, coordinate and conduct state wide youth caps or camp.

This board shall or anize itsel and elect such officers as necessary to the orderly conduct of its affairs and labors. This board shall keep an accurate record of all meetings, decisions, work done, funds received and disbursed and shall make a report in writing at each annual session of this association. All records shall be available to this association at its request.

## SECTION 4. ASSOCIATIONAL REPRESENTATIVES

- This member is to e elected at the discretion of this association. He shall be a man with a concern for letter education for the people of our denomination. He shall tring to the board the wishes of this association. He shall report to this association at the annual session, the work, plans and need of the Board.
- 2. General Board Member to the National Association of F.W.B..
  He shall be elected for a two (2) year term. He shall meet with the
  General Board of the Nat. Assn. of F.W.B. and shall take to it the desires
  of this Association.

# SECTION 5. ORGANIZATION OF NEW CHUFCHES

- 1.
  1. When a church is a member of a Qtly. Conf. or Assn. within the State and desires to change membership to nother Qtly. Conf. or Assn. it will
  - 1. Request a dismissal to unite with another Qtly. Conf. or Assn., a letter of dismissal and recommendation is given, if said church is in good standing.
    - A. All members of said church holding State offices or Board Membership will continue their duty if church follows outlined procedure.
    - B. If church desire not to fellow with the outlined procedures, all members holding State Office or Board Membership positions will be declared vacant and replaced by the Executive Board.
  - 2. Any church or minister desiring to start a Mission in an area where there is an organized F.W.B. Church that is a member of the Kansas State Assn. will first seek the cooperation of said church. No minister should help organize a group into a church that is out of fellowship with an established F.W.B. Church that is a member of the Kansas State Association.

# Kansas State Association of F.W.Bapt. Standing Rules of Order

- 1. All business eetings shall be opened by singing, reading a portion of God's Word, and prayer, and shall be closed with prayer.
- 2. All business, except routine, shall be Liou, but before the body by committees, but should any committee refuse or fail to present to this body any business given it by any member of this association, then such business may be presented to the body by any member.
- 3. No one shall speak more than five minutes or more than twice on the same subject without the consent of the Moderator.
- 4. Any member of this body can appeal from the decision of the moderator to the Association and by a two-thirds majority vote thereon, the objection shall be a stained or rejected.
- 5. No one shall leave the Association when in a business session without the consent of the Moderatof.
- 6. Anyone desiring to speak shall arise and say "brother moderator", but shall speak no further untill he or she is recognized by the Moderator.
- 7. The Moderator shall stop discussions when not carried on in a christian spirit, or when it is likely to lead to discord or division.
- 8. The officers of this lody shall submit, at every annual session a written report of the work done for this Essociation.
- 9. This Association may correspond by messenger or otherwise with other religious bodies.
- 10. All resolutions and reports shall bear the names of all the members of the committee, anxious who favor them; and if the names be not a majority of such committee, the clerk shall not read the aresolution or report. A Minority report may be received however.
- 11. All committees shall be appointed by the moderator which shall be assisted by a committee on committees. This committee on committees shall be appointed by the moderator.
- 12. A majority of votes shall be final upon all subjects e cept to amend the constitution and by-laws, receive Qtly. Meetings or Association, the changing of the members of the committees appointed by the moderator and over ruling the moderator, then it shall require a 2/3 majority.
- 13. The sessions of this Association shall convene Thurs. nite, Friday, Friday nite, and Saturday untill noon preceeding the third Sunday of June each year.
- 14. These By-laws may be ammended or changed at any regular session of this Association by two-thirds vote present.
- 15. This Association shall adopt "Roberts Rules of Order"
