CHRISTIAN EDUCATION BOARD REPORT

The Christian Education Board met December 9, 1978 and June 15, 1979.

At the December meeting, a Pastor's and Layman's Retreat was set for May 3,4, and 5, 1979 with Rev. Bob Ketchum from Oklahoma as guest speaker. Registration fee was \$10.00 each at Camp Adda Walden near Salina. The retreat was attended by 20 men full time and the guest speaker. Others visited some of the services at random. This portion of the report is for information only.

We recommend the following to the State Association: The 1979 Youth Camp be held in two sessions with Rev. Ken Stephens as Junior Camp Director and Bro. Gary Brunson as Senior Camp Director.

Junior Camp will be for those who are currently (1978-79 school year) in the 2nd thru 6th grades, and will be held July 9 thru July 13.

Senior Camp will be for those who are currently (1978-79 school year) in the 7th grade or higher, and will be held July 30 thru August 3.

Enrollment fees for each session will be \$15.00 for the first person per family per session and \$10.00 for each additional person per family per session.

The 1978 Youth Camp Rules shall be adopted for the 1979 Youth Camp.

KANSAS STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS CONSTITUTION & BY-LAWS

PREAMBLE.

From long experience, we the members of the Free Will Baptist denomination, being regularly baptized upon a profession of our faith in Jesus Christ, and realizing the necessity of a bond of unity and fellowship among us as a church and to preserve and maintain correspondence and co-ordination within us, do therefore ordain this constitution for a better denominationly government.

ARTICLE I. NAME

This association shall be called the Kansas State Association of Free Will Baptists, and shall be composed of such regularly organized and disciplined Free Will Baptist yearly Meetings, conveniently located, as may embody themselves under this constitution.

ARTICLE II. MEMBERSHIP

This association shall consist of elected delegates from the several Yearly Meetings and Churches of which it is composed. Each Yearly Meeting is entitled to 5 delegates and every Church is entitled to one delegate, providing said Yearly Meetings and Churches are in good standing. Ordained Ministers and ordained deacons, who are serving on local church deacon boards, and all elected officers of the State Association shall be standing delegates.

ARTICLE III. OFFICERS

The officers of this association shall be a moderator, asst. moderator, and a clerk-treasurer, with an assistant as may be found necessary. The executive board shall consist of 3 ordained ministers, elected for a 1, 2, and 3 year term, with one term to expire each year.

ARTICLE IV. REPRESENTATION

Any well organized and well regulated Free Will Baptist Yearly Meeting, composed of such churches as conform with the practice and adopt the doctrines of the Free Will Baptist denomination as published in the Treatise of the National Association, may at any time, on application and by vote of this body, become a member thereof.

- 1. Providing they adopt and adhere to State questionaire number 1, 2, and the one for ministers and deacons.
- Failure to comply with this ruling concerning licensing and ordination of ministers and deacons will result in withdrawal of fellowship.

ARTICLE V. DISCIPLINE

This association shall have power to discipline the Yearly Meetings of which it is composed, and to exclude them for discorderly walk if labor proves unsuccessful, but in no case reverse their decisions, nor to interfere with any of their internal regulations.

ARTICLE VI. DELEGATES & FEES

It shall be the duty of the Yearly Meetings of this Association to represent themselves by letter, delegates, and a fee of \$10.00 per church, and report their standing and statistics, at which time the association shall act upon such questions and topics as may be referred to it by its respective Yearly Meetings and transact such other business not repugnant to this constitution.

ARTICLE VII. BY-LAWS

This association shall have power to adopt any regulations or by-laws not inconsistent with this constitution, which may be deemed essential to the further regulation of its session.

ARTICLE VIII. AMENDMENTS

This constitutuion may be amended or changed at any regular session of this association by two-thirds vote present, pro-vided the proposed amendment or change be laid on the table for at least 8 hours.

BY-LAWS

SECTION 1. OFFICERS

All officers and board members shall be men who are members in good standing of an affiliated Kansas State Association. They shall be elected at the discretion of this association.

SECTION 2. OFFICERS DUTIES

1. MODERATOR

The moderator shall be the principle executive of the association. He shall preside at the meetings of the State Association. He shall be an ex-officio member of all boards.

2. ASSISTANT MODERATOR

In the absence of the moderator, or in the event of his death, inability, or refusal to act, the assistant moderator shall perform the duties of the moderator, and when so acting, shall have all the powers of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the moderator. The assistant moderator shall perform such duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the moderator or by the association.

3. CLERK

To be custodian of the association records, in general, perform

all duties incidental to the office of clerk and such duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the moderator or association.

4. ASSISTANT CLERK

In the absence of the clerk, or in the event of his death, inability, or refusal to act, the assistant clerk shall perform the duties of the clerk and when so acting, shall have all the power of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the clerk. The assistant clerk shall perform such duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the clerk or the association.

5. TREASURER

He shall be a man with some bookkeeping ability. It shall be his duty to receive and promptly deposit to the bank account of the state association all checks and monies. He shall pay all fixed expenditures, and miscellanious expenditures incurred in the normal operation of his office. He shall keep accurate records of all receipts and disbursments with proper vouchers. He shall balance his books monthly. He shall give an itemized written report to each annual associational meeting. He shall give a written monthly report to the editor of the state publication to be printed. He is the custodian of all records (financial), legal papers, and associational documents.

6. PARLIMENTARIAN

He shall have a good working knowledge of parlimentary law. He is to advise the moderator or any member on the proper procedure, according to Roberts Rules of Order.

SECTION 3. BOARDS AND THEIR DUTIES

1. EXECUTIVE BOARD

It shall be the duty of this board to act in behalf of the Association when it is not in session. It shall be bound to carry out the directions of the Association, and shall hold itself bound by every consideration of morality and honor to carry out the wishes of this Association and to act under its instructions in whatever technicle rights, civil laws and the decisions of the courts may give it in certain emergencies.

It shall be the duty of this board to sign their signatures to any and all papers concerning property, indebtedness, bonds, or other legal documents pertaining to the execution of the will of this Association.

The members shall assist and direct such work for the general promotion of this association as is deemed needful or necessary as the means available shall permit.

All decisions of this board shall be governed by the general tenets of this Association and shall not violate this constitution. This board shall organize itself and elect such officers as necessary to the orderly conduct of its affairs and labors. This board shall keep an accurate record of all meetings decisions, and work done and shall make a report in writing at each

annual session of the Association. All records shall be available to this association at its request.

Whereas this board represents the Association when not in session it and it alone shall have the power to call the Association into special conference provided each affiliated association shall be given notice at least ten (10) days prior to the meeting of such special conference.

2. MISSION BOARD

It shall be the duty of this board to labor to further the gospel of Jesus Christ into the uttermost parts of the earth. In accomplishing this, they are to indeavor to establish missions and churches in communities within the bounds of this association with whatever moral and financial assistance that may be theirs. In cases of small churches failing to function, whatever assistance deemed appropriate shall be rendered to maintain the effective witness of that church by either direct labor with the church or with an associational board in instance where the affiliated association has a functional board or agency.

This board shall be empowered to receive and convey title to real property in the area of its labors.

The promotion of missionary endeavor from a local, state or national level shall come within the scope of endeavor of this board. This board shall assist in maintaining prayer and financial support of missionary enterprises through whatever channels available.

Whereas missionary and evangelistic labors are so intimately related, this board shall assist through participation or assistance in maintaining a strong evangelistic thrust in the life of affiliated associations.

This board shall organize itself and elect such officers as necessary to the orderly conduct of its affairs and labors. This board shall keep an accurate record of all meetings, decisions, work done funds received and disbursed and shall make a report in writing at each annual session of this association. All records shall be available to this association at its request.

3. CHRISTIAN EDUCATION BOARD

The duties of this board shall be to plan and assist in organizing and sustaining strong Sunday School, Church Training Service, and any educational endeavor such as conferences, in every church in each association affiliated with the State Association with every means of promotion and assistance available to them. This board shall plan, coordinate and conduct state wide youth camps or camp.

This board shall organize itself and elect such officers as necessary to the orderly conduct of its affairs and labors.

This board shall keep an accurate record of all meetings, decisions, work done, funds received of this association. All records shall be available to this association at its request.

SECTION 4. ASSOCIATIONAL REPRESENTATIVES

1. HILLSDALE BOARD MEMBER

This member is to be elected at the discretion of this Association. He shall be a man with a concern for better education for the people of our denomination. He shall bring to the board the wishes of this association. He shall report to this association at the annual session, the work, plans and need of the Board.

2. GENERAL BOARD MEMBER TO THE NAT'L ASS'N.

He shall be elected for a two (2) year term. He shall meet with the General Board of the Nat'l Ass'n. of F.W.B. and shall take to it the desires of this association.

SECTION 5. ORGANIZATION OF NEW CHURCHES

1. When a church is a member of a quarterly conference or association within the state and desires to change membership to another quarterly conference or association it will:

1) Request a dismissal to unite with another quarterly conference or association. A letter of dismissal and recommend-

ation is given, if said church is in good standing.

A. All members of said church holding state office or board membership will continue their duty if church follows outlined procedure.

B. If church desires not to follow with the outlined procedures, all members holding state office or board membership positions will be declared vacant and replaced

by the Executive Board.

2) Any church or minister desiring to start a mission in an area where there is an organized F.W.B. church that is a member of the Kansas State Association will first seek the cooperation of said church. No minister should help organize a group into a church that is out of fellowship with an established F.W.B. church that is a member of the Kansas State Association.

STANDING RULES OF ORDER

1. All business meetings shall be opened by singing, reading a portion of God's Word, and prayer, and shall be closed with

prayer.

2. All business, except routine, shall be brought before the body by committees, but should any committee refuse or fail to present to this body any business given it by any member of the association, then such business may be presented to the body by any member.

3. No one shall speak more than five minutes or more than twice on the same subject without the consent of the moderator.

4. Any member of this body can appeal the decision of the chair to the association and by a two-thirds majority vote thereon, the

objection shall be sustained or rejected.

5. No one shall leave the association when in a business session without the consent of the moderator.

- 6. Anyone desiring to speak shall arise and say "brother moderator", but shall speak no further untill he or she is recognized by the moderator.
- 7. The moderator shall stop discussions when not carried on in a christian spirit, or when it is likely to lead to discord or division.
- 8. The officers of this body shall submit, at every annual session a written report of the work done for this association.

9. This association may correspond by messenger or otherwise with other religious bodies.

10. All resolutions and reports shall bear the names of all the members of the committee who favor them; and if the names be not a majority of such committee, the clerk shall not read the resolution or report. A minority report may be received however.

11. All committees shall be appointed by the moderator which shall be assisted by a committee on committees. This committee on committees shall be appointed by the moderator.

12. A majority of votes shall be final upon all subjects execpt to amend the constitution and by-laws, receive quarterly meetings or associations, the changing of the members of the committees appointed by the moderator and over ruling the moderator, then it shall require a two-thirds majority.

13. The sessions of this association shall convene Thursday night, Friday, Friday night, and Saturday untill noon preceding the third Sunday of June each year.

14. These by-laws may be ammended or change at any regular session of this association by two-thirds vote present.

15. This association shall adopt "Roberts Rules of Order".
