The Christian Education Board activities for the past year consisted primarily of planning and carrying out our Kansas State Youth Camp and Kansas Men's Retreat.

The 2015 Kansas State Youth Camp was held June 8 through June 12, 2015, at Camp Horizon near Arkansas City, Kansas. Rev. Jeff Sloan, Pastor of the Bixby FWB Church in Bixby, OK was the evangelist. The camp was attended by 102 campers and 29 workers for a total of 131.

The 2016 Kansas State Men's Retreat was held March 4-6, 2016, at Westminster Woods Camp near Fall River, Kansas. Rev. Daniel Phillips, Pastor of Airport FWB Church in Tulsa, OK, was the speaker. The retreat was attended by 50 men and teen boys, including the speaker.

The 2016 Kansas State Youth Camp is scheduled to be held May 30 through June 3, 2016 at Camp Horizon near Arkansas City, Kansas with Kansas Pastors as evangelists.

Charlotte Brooks was selected as Camp Director and James O. Brewer as Assistant Director.

The fee will be \$180.00 per camper and worker if prepaid by May 2, and \$220.00 thereafter.

We the Home Mission Board respectfully submit the following report to the Kansas State Meeting for the reporting period of June 2015 through May 2016.

Through the grace of God and the support of fellow Christians, the Kansas Home Mission Board has two missionaries on the field, Bro. A.J.Warden of Prairie Meadows and Bro. Derl Hicks of Ark City.

The Kansas Home Mission board through the support of contributors was able to provide Bro. AJ with \$1,000 in monthly support and Bro. Derl with \$1,200 in monthly support during the year. It truly is a blessing to the state of Kansas to have these two families serving the Lord and their communities in both Olathe and Arkansas City.

Over the year, the Home Mission Board met to discuss the following items:

- Prairie Meadows Mission Account (Very Low in Funds... Below the \$500 Mark)
 - Approved \$300 per month in additional support from the General Home
 Mission Board Account from May of 2015 through January of 2016
 - o Encouraged Bro. AJ to send out a letter to each church requesting the amount needed from each church to provide \$1000 in Monthly Funding
 - o Spoke to Bro. AJ about the possibilities of securing a part-time job to continue supporting his family while the amount of donations are down
- Arkansas City Mission Status
 - Discussed Bro. Derl continuing to pay back the building fund at a minimum of \$100 per month.
 - Building payments have not come in regularly (2 this reporting period).
- Kansas City Church Status (Bethel Free Will Baptist Church)
 - o Several Home Mission Board Members went out to go speak to the people about the future status of the church
 - Possible merging of Prairie Meadows /Bethel
 - Current Status: Still Looking for a FWB Pastor
 - Promotional Director is assisting by sending candidate's resumes
- Ulysses Church Status (Currently Leased)
 - o Secured a Deposit of \$25,000 and an agreement for Spanish Assembly of God Church to Purchase the building within one year for \$115,000.
 - o Rented the building for \$600 per month until 1 year purchase
 - FWB Home Mission Board is paying quarterly insurance on the building
 - o Items included in the sale of the building:
 - The pews/sound system stay, but the pulpit(s), offering tables, and any FWB documentation or memorabilia was removed from the church and redistributed to any of the KS churches in need.
 - o Proceeds of the sale will be distributed as follows:
 - 10% of the funds be invested into the General Home Mission Board Fund
 - 90% to be placed in an interest bearing account for utilization on a new mission work in the state of Kansas.

At current we have approximately 20 regular attendees, 13 of whom are 16 and under. We have regular worship service on Sunday morning at 10:30 AM and our Sunday night service at 5:00 varies between out reach, fellowship, praise time, and teaching. We meet at 6:00 on Wednesday evening for prayer and children's church. We are currently teaching through the Torch Lighter series with our kids teaching them about true hero's who have given much for the cause of Christ.

With the arrival of summer our 3 teens will be out in the community picking up trash, volunteering at the nursing homes, prayer walking, engaging in various out reach events, and we have plans to travel to Bartlesville, Ok. for them to volunteer at Voice of the Martyrs. We currently conduct services at 2 different nursing homes and have recently been looking for ways to show thanks to the staff who work so hard for the residents. We are also in the process of starting a depression support group to help people in our community find freedom from depression and the self harm and suicide that often accompany depression. We will be launching the support group within a local ministry called Crops of Righteousness that started from within our school district as a response to the needs of some poverty stricken families in our community. As our church does not have the people needed to start the support group we feel God had already placed us in Crops so that the framework needed would be in place. I want to thank the Mission Board for paying for our training and Jason Bruns for connecting us with Word of Life Christian Counseling in Wichita that we are working through. I would also like to once again take this moment to jump on my soap box and say that if God has indeed been taken out of our schools is is because of the apathy of Christians not the evil intentions of others. In Ark City Christians in our school district continue to bind together to proclaim Jesus Christ to our community.

We have felt led to do intensive ministry in the area of one of our local elementary schools and are building up to a back to school event in August, we need much prayer for that. Kaitlin will be leaving at the beginning of September to live in Thailand for 6 months as the house mother of a sex trafficking safe house run by Night Light International. She is still raising money for this mission trip and needs a few thousand dollars yet. Please keep her in prayer. Gabrielle leaves in a few days to go to Alaska on a mission trip. She feels called to some form of vocational missions and has ministered in Johannesburg South Africa, New Orleans, and by the leading of the Holy Spirit has been the driving force behind the support group ministry. Dawn and I are obviously very proud of our girls. We are also proud of our foster children who have been with us a year and have come to be like our own children.

Please pray that God will send us a youth leader, we desperately need someone to work with the abundance of children God has blessed us with at church. We also need continued wisdom and guidance as we seek to effectively minister to our community. I would also like to take this chance to encourage everyone to support the FWB church plant in Hawaii. - 1. I worked with the Bethel FWB church in Kansas City, KS, on securing a pastor to fill the vacancy left by Rev. Bob Franklin. Letters were sent out to all the FWB Promotional Directors, all 4 colleges affiliated with the denomination, and the national offices—a copy of that letter is attached. To the best of my knowledge, several resumes were sent to Bethel for their consideration. Follow-up attempts were made by myself and others in the state, but to the best of my knowledge the Bethel church did not candidate an individual, and their pulpit remains vacant.
- 2. I talked with members of the Parson's FWB church in Parsons, KS, concerning looking for an ordained FWB preacher to replace Bro. Phil Phelps due to his declining health. Letters were sent out to all the FWB Promotional Directors, all 4 colleges affiliated with the denomination, and the national offices—a copy of that letter is attached. I was informed after several weeks' time that Bro. Phelps' health had improved and that he was no longer considering resignation from Parsons.
- 3. The state website was revamped and is current with state events and information as of 9 June 2016.
- 4. I gave a brief, verbal report at the November joint Quarterlies meeting on my activities from June 2015 November 2015.
- 5. I consolidated pictures from the 2016 Youth Camp and uploaded them to the state website.
- 6. I sent out letters to all 9 churches associated with the state, and the Bethlehem FWB church in Van Buren, AR. A copy of that letter is attached and consisted of statistics of salvations/rededications, a summary of events & speakers, and a thank you to the Camp Horizon staff, Education Board, and Sis. Charlotte Brooks.

- 7. For my convenience (and any wishing to have access) I compiled a mailing list of the 9 churches associated with the state, as well as the Westside FWB church. That list is attached and is current as of 9 Jun 2016.
- 8. I presented this report at the state meeting in Salina, KS, 10 June 2016.

KANSAS STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

(updated 06/11/2016)

PREAMBLE

From long experience, we the members of the Free Will Baptist denomination, being regularly baptized upon a profession of our faith in Jesus Christ, and realizing the necessity of a bond of unity and fellowship among us as a church and to preserve and maintain correspondence and coordination within us, do therefore ordain this constitution for a better denominational government.

ARTICLE I - NAME

This Association shall be called the Kansas State Association of Free Will Baptists, and shall be composed of such regularly organized and disciplined Free Will Baptist Quarterly Conferences, conveniently located, as may embody themselves under this constitution.

ARTICLE II - MEMBERSHIP

This Association shall consist of elected delegates from the several Quarterly Conferences and Churches of which they are composed. Each Quarterly Conference is entitled to five (5) delegates and every Church is entitled to one (1) delegate, providing said Quarterly Conferences and Churches are in good standing. Ordained ministers and ordained deacons, who are serving on local church deacon boards, and all elected officers of the State Association shall be standing delegates.

ARTICLE III - OFFICERS

The officers of this association shall be moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, assistant clerk, treasurer, and assistant treasurer. The executive board shall consist of three (3) men who are ordained ministers or deacons, elected for a one (1), two (2), and three (3) year term, with one term to expire each year.

ARTICLE IV - REPRESENTATION

Any well organized and well regulated Free Will Baptist Quarterly Conference, composed of such churches as conform with the practice and adopt the doctrines of the Free Will Baptist denomination as published in the Treatise of the National Association, may at any time, on application and by vote of this body, become of member thereof.

- 1. Providing they adopt and adhere to State questionnaire number 1, 2, and the one for ministers and deacons.
- 2. Failure to comply with this ruling concerning licensing and ordination of ministers and deacons will result in withdrawal of fellowship.

ARTICLE V - DISCIPLINE

This Association shall have power to discipline the Quarterly Conferences of which it is composed, and to exclude them for disorderly walk if labor proves unsuccessful, but in no case reverse their decisions, nor to interfere with any of their internal regulations.

ARTICLE VI - DELEGATES AND FEES

It shall be the duty of the Quarterly Conferences of this Association to represent themselves by letter, delegates, and a fee of \$150.00 per church, and report their standings and statistics, at which time the Association shall act upon such questions and topics as may be referred to it by its respective Quarterly Conferences and transact such other business not repugnant to this constitution. Each local church is entitled to one (1) delegate to this Association, provided a letter of recommendation is presented to the clerk of this Association, from the local church, signed by the local church clerk or its pastor.

ARTICLE VII - BY-LAWS

This Association shall have power to adopt any regulations or by-laws not inconsistent with this constitution, which may be deemed essential to the further regulation of its session.

ARTICLE VIII - AMENDMENTS

This constitution may be amended or changed at any regular session of this Association by two-thirds vote present, provided the proposed amendment or change be laid on the table for at least eight (8) hours.

ARTICLE IX - ASSOCIATIONAL YEAR

The reporting period for this Association will begin April 1 and end March 31.

BY-LAWS

SECTION 1 - OFFICERS

All officers and board members shall be members in good standing of a local church affiliated with the Kansas Sate Association. They shall be elected at the discretion of this Association.

SECTION 2 - OFFICERS DUTIES

- 1. <u>Moderator</u>: The Moderator shall be the principle executive of the Association. He shall preside at the meetings of the State Association. He shall be an ex-officio member of all boards and committees.
- 2. <u>Assistant Moderator</u>: In the absence of the Moderator, or in the event of his death, inability, or refusal to act, the Assistant Moderator shall perform the duties of the Moderator, and when so acting, shall have all the powers of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the Moderator. The Assistant Moderator shall perform such duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the Moderator or by the Association.
- 3. <u>Clerk</u>: To be custodian of the Association records, in general, perform all duties incidental to the office of Clerk and such duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the Moderator or Association.
- 4. <u>Assistant Clerk</u>: In the absence of the Clerk, or in the event of his death, inability, or refusal to act, the Assistant Clerk shall perform the duties of the Clerk and when so acting, shall have all the power of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the Clerk. The Assistant Clerk shall perform such duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the Clerk or the Association.

- 5. Treasurer: The treasurer shall be a person with some bookkeeping ability. It shall be his duty to receive and promptly deposit to the bank account of the State Association all checks and monies. He shall pay all fixed expenditures, and miscellaneous expenditures incurred in the normal operation of his office. He shall keep accurate records of all receipts and disbursements with proper vouchers. He shall balance his books monthly. He shall give an itemized written report to each annual Associational meeting. He shall give a written monthly report to the editor of the State publication to be printed. He is the custodian of all records (financial), legal papers, and Associational documents.
- 6. <u>Assistant Treasurer</u>: In the absence of the Treasurer, or in the event of his death, inability, or refusal to act, the Assistant Treasurer shall perform the duties of the Treasurer and when acting, shall have all the power of and be subjected to all the restrictions upon the Treasurer. The Assistant Treasurer shall perform such duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the Treasurer or the Association.
- 7. <u>Parliamentarian</u>: He shall have a good working knowledge of parliamentary law. He is to advise the Moderator or any member of the proper procedure, according to Roberts' Rules of Order.

SECTION 3 - BOARDS AND THEIR DUTIES

Each state board shall provide a proposed plan for the coming year with their vision statement and proposed budget, so that the state body of Free will Baptists will be apprised of the growth and expansion of the state work.

1. Executive Board: It shall be the duty of this board to act in behalf of the Association in an emergency situation when the Association is not in session, provided there is not sufficient time to call the Association into special session. The declaration of emergency shall be unanimous by all three board members. It shall be bound to carry out the directions of the Association and shall hold itself bound by every consideration of morality and honor to carry out the wishes of this Association and to act under its instructions in whatever technical rights, civil laws, and the decisions that the courts may give it in certain emergencies.

It shall be the duty of this board to sign their signatures to any and all papers concerning property, indebtedness, bonds, or other legal documents pertaining to the execution of the will of this Association.

The members shall assist and direct such work for the general promotion of this Association as is deemed needful or necessary as the means available shall permit.

All decisions of this board shall be governed by the general tenets of this Association and shall not violate this constitution. This Board shall organize itself and elect such officers as necessary to the orderly conduct of its affairs and labors. This board shall keep an accurate record of all meetings, decisions, and work done and shall make a report in writing at each annual session of the Association. All records shall be available to this Association at its request.

Whereas, this board represents the Association, when not in session as provided above, it or a majority of the active local churches who are members of this State Association shall have the power to call the Association into special conference provided each affiliated Quarterly Conference shall be given notice at least ten (10) days prior to the meeting of such special conference.

2. <u>Mission Board</u>: It shall be the duty of this board to labor to further the Gospel of Jesus Christ into the uttermost parts of the earth. In accomplishing this, they are to endeavor to establish missions and churches in communities within the bounds of this Association with whatever moral and financial

assistance that may be theirs. In cases of small churches failing to function, whatever assistance deemed appropriate shall be rendered to maintain the effective witness of that church by either direct labor with the church or with a Quarterly Conference board in instances where the affiliated Quarterly Conference has a functional board or agency.

This board shall be empowered to receive and convey title to real property in the area of its labors.

The promotion of missionary endeavor from a local, state, or national level shall come within the scope of endeavor of this board. This board shall assist in maintaining prayer and financial support of missionary enterprises through whatever channels available.

Whereas missionary and evangelistic labors are so intimately related, this board shall assist through participation or assistance in maintaining a strong evangelistic thrust in the life of affiliated Quarterly Conferences.

This board shall organize itself and elect such officers as necessary to the orderly conduct of its affairs and labors. This board shall keep an accurate record of all meetings, decisions, work done, funds received and disbursed, and shall make a report in writing at each annual session of this Association. All records shall be available to this Association at its request.

3. <u>Christian Education Board</u>: The duties of this board shall be to plan and assist in organizing and sustaining strong Sunday School, Church Training Services, and any educational endeavor such as conferences, in every church in each Quarterly Conference affiliated with the State Association with every means of promotion and assistance available to them. This board shall plan, promote, coordinate, and conduct statewide youth activities, camp(s), etc. It shall approve all state competitors to the National Youth Conference.

This board shall organize itself and elect such officers as necessary to the orderly conduct of its affairs and labors.

This board shall keep an accurate record of all meetings, decisions, work done, funds received, and funds disbursed. It shall make a report in writing at each annual session of this Association. All records shall be available to this Association at its request.

SECTION 4 - ASSOCIATIONAL REPRESENTATIVES

1. <u>General Board Member to the National Association</u>: He shall be elected for a three (3) year term. He shall meet with the General Board of the National Association of Free Will Baptists, and shall take to it the desires of this Association.

SECTION 5 - ORGANIZATION OF NEW CHURCHES

- 1. When a church is a member of a Quarterly Conference within the State and desires to change membership to another Quarterly Conference, it will:
 - A. Request a dismissal to unite with another Quarterly Conference. A letter of dismissal and recommendation is given, if said church is in good standing.

- 1) All members of said church holding State office or board membership will continue their duty if church follows outlined procedure.
- 2) If church desires not to follow with the outlined procedures, all members holding State office or board membership positions will be declared vacant and replaced by the Executive Board.
- B. Any church or minister desiring to start a mission in an area where there is an organized Free Will Baptist church that is a member of the Kansas State Association will first seek the cooperation of said church. No minister should help organize a group into a church that is out of fellowship with an established Free Will Baptist church that is a member of the Kansas State Association.

SECTION 6 - THE PRACTICE OF ACCEPTING MINISTERS INTO THE STATE OF KANSAS

- 1. No minister shall be examined or accepted into the local Kansas Quarterly unless it has been requested by a local church of that Quarterly. The minister must be a member of that church.
 - A minister transferring from one Quarterly to another within the Denomination shall undergo the following:
 - A. He is examined by the local Quarterly's examining council.
 - B. He is required to present a letter of good standing by the Quarterly of which he was last a member.
 - C. His Ordination Credentials may then be "ratified" by the Quarterly upon recommendation of the examining council.
- 3. A minister from another denomination wishing to unite with the Free Will Baptist Denomination must first unite with a local Free Will Baptist Church and will then be subject similar to that in Item 2. Upon a vote of acceptance he shall be issued Free Will Baptist credentials.
- 4. A minister from an independent Free Will Baptist Church wishing to unite with the Free Will Baptist Denomination must first unite with a local Free Will Baptist Church.

The following procedure shall take place:

- A. His local Free Will Baptist Church shall request he be examined by the Quarterly.
- B. He will then be set aside for 12 months of probation by the Quarterly upon recommendation of the examining council.
- C. During that 12 months of probation he shall:
 - 1) Have the status of a licensed minister with the Quarterly and State Association.
 - 2) Have the status of an ordained minister in the local church.
- D. After 12 months the local church may request his credentials be "ratified".

- E. His ordination credentials may then be "ratified" by the Quarterly upon re-examination and recommendation of the examining council.
- 5. A minister from another independent church or denomination wishing to unite with the Free Will Baptist Denomination must first unite with a local Free Will Baptist Church and then be subject to the same procedure as that in Item 4. Upon a vote of acceptance he shall be issued Free Will Baptist credentials.

STANDING RULES OF ORDER

- 1. All business meetings shall be opened by singing, reading of a portion of God's Word, and prayer and shall be closed with prayer.
- 2. All business, except routine, shall be brought before the body by committees, but should any committee refuse or fail to present to this body any business given it by any member of the Association, then such business may be presented to the body by any member.
- 3. No one shall speak more than five minutes or more than twice on the same subject without the consent of the Moderator.
- 4. Any member of this body can appeal the decision of the chair to the Association and by a two-thirds majority vote thereon, the objection shall be sustained or rejected.
- 5. No one shall leave the Association when in a business session without the consent of the Moderator.
- 6. Anyone desiring to speak shall arise and say "Brother Moderator," but shall speak no further until he or she is recognized by the Moderator.
- 7. The Moderator shall stop discussions when not carried on in a Christian spirit or when it is likely to lead to discord or division.
- 8. The Officers of this body shall submit, at every annual session, a written report of the work done for this Association.
- 9. This Association may correspond by messenger or otherwise with other religious bodies.
- 10. All resolutions and reports shall bear the names of all the members of the committee who favor them; and if the names be not a majority of such committee, the Clerk shall not read the resolution or report. A minority report may be received however.
- 11. All committees shall be appointed by the Moderator which shall be assisted by a Committee on Committees. This Committee on Committees shall be appointed by the Moderator.
- 12. A majority of votes shall be final upon all subjects except to amend the constitution and by-laws, receive Quarterly Conferences, the changing of the members of the committees appointed by the Moderator and overruling the Moderator, then it shall require a two-thirds majority.
- 13. The annual sessions of this Association shall convene the last Thursday night, Friday, Friday night, and Saturday until noon of April.
- 14. These by-laws may be amended or changed at any regular session of this Association by two-thirds vote present.
- 15. This Association shall adopt "Roberts' Rules of Order."
