#### RULES OF ORDER AND BY-LAWS

- 1. The clerk or assistant clerk, or in their absence, the senior minister in years of service, shall call the Association into conference. If a quorum is present, the Moderator, or in his absence, the assistant Moderator, shall take charge. If neither is present, the senior minister in years of service shall act as moderator.
- 2. It shall be the duty of the clerk to enroll the Delegates to the Association, who shall present themselves with proper evidence of their rights to be seated therein. In case of questionable representation, however, the cases under question shall be referred to the Credentials (Examining) Board. It shall be the privilege of the Moderator to seat delegates in a body in a designated section of the assembly room at the beginning of each business session as deemed necessary by the Moderator.
  - Each session of the Associational meetings shall be opened by Scripture reading and prayer, and shall be closed with a prayer.
  - Those who speak shall rise, address and be recognized by the Moderator. Personal reflections shall be avoided in all debates.
  - 5. No motion shall be discussed without being seconded.
  - 6. When a motion has been made and seconded and a member opposes its discussion, the Moderator shall put the question, "Shall it be discussed?" If negative, the question shall be dismissed.
  - 7. If any proposition as motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and a vote taken.
  - 8. Motions made and lost shall not be recorded.
  - No one shall speak more than twice on any subject without special permission of the Moderator, nor more than ten minutes.
  - 10. All questions shall be decided by a majority of the delegates voting, except it shall take a two-thirds vote of all delegates present to overrule a ruling of the Moderator.
  - 11. The "yeas" and the "nays" may be counted on any question by request of any delegate present.
  - 12. No member shall absent himself without special permission of the Moderator.
  - 13. No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one member of any committee, provided the person nominated be elected.
  - 14. Alterations may be made in these rules and by-laws at any annual session of the Association
  - 15. The Moderator shall not allow discussions when not carried on in a Christian spirit; or when he thinks it will cause discord or division.

16. No person shall serve on more than one standing board at a time in the Association.

17. No women will be licensed or ordained as ministers or allowed to preach in our Association.

# CONSTITUTION OF THE KIAMICHI ASSOCIATION Preamble

We, the members of the Kiamichi Association, being regularly baptized upon a profession of faith in Jesus Christ, and realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as a church; and to preserve and maintain correspondence and cooperation among us, do therefore ordain this constitution for our government, and general welfare. We do hereby adopt the Treatise of the Faith and Practices of the Free Will Baptist as revised in 1969 at the National Association.

ARTICLE 1 - NAME: This yearly meeting or Association shall be called "Kiamichi Association of Free Will Baptist of Oklahoma".

ARTICLE 2 - COMPOSITION: This Association shall be composed of such duly organized Free Will Baptist Churches agreeing to abide by this constitution.

#### ARTICLE 3 - REPRESENTATION: •

Section 1: The acting members, or standing delegates, of this body shall be: Pastor, Assistant Pastor, and their wives, five (5) Deacons and their wives, and Church Clerks belonging to any church composing this Association.

Section 2: The regular meetings of this Association shall also consist of three (3) delegates from each church chosen by the respective churches (delegates limited -- total 18 each church).

Section 3: Each church shall be represented by letter, with or without delegates. Such reports should meet the requirements of the Association, using forms provided by the Association.

ARTICLE 4 - OFFICERS AND DUTIES: The officers of this Association shall consist of a Moderator, an Assistant Moderator, a Clerk, an Assistant Clerk, a Treasurer, and an Assistant Treasurer. These shall be elected by the body at the annual session. 1234

#### ARTICLE 5 - BOARDS AND COMMITTEES, AND THEIR DUTIES:

Section 1: Standing Boards: These shall consist of a maximum of five (5) elected members.

EXECUTIVE BOARD: This Association shall have an Executive Board, consisting of a maximum of 5 members elected to serve terms of 5,4,3,2, and 1 years. It shall be the duty of this board to act in behalf of the Association when it is not in session. It shall have authority to elect such officers as might be necessary for its own government and to carry out the plan and undertaking of the Association. It shall

have authority to act on any business submitted by any board or church between session of the Association. It shall be the duty of this board to sign their signature to any and all papers concerning properties, indebtedness, bonds, or other legal documents pertaining to the execution of the will of this Association. This board shall not incur indebtedness, or sell or convey real property without the express direction of this Association. It shall be the duty of this board to establish and assist missions and churches within the bounds of this Association, wherever needed. This board shall keep a record of all work done, meetings held, and make a full and complete report to all regular meetings of this body. No meeting will be called without notifying every board member.

EXAMINING BOARD: This Association shall have an Examining Board, consisting of a maximum of 5 ordained men elected to serve terms of 5, 4, 3, 2, and 1 years. It shall be the duty of this board to meet with all Ministers and Deacons desiring either ordination, license, or membership into the Association; request having been made by the Church of which the candidate is a member. They shall examine all candidates by a set of questions, approved by the Association, and if the examination proves satisfactory, recommendation is made to the body. This board shall act on matters of credentials pertaining to individuals or churches as invited by the local church and to make recommendations.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION BOARD: This Association shall have a board of Christian Education, consisting of 5 members elected to serve terms of 5, 4, 3, 2, and 1 years. It shall be the duty of the board to promote Christian education in every church of this Association. It shall assist in sustaining a strong Church Training Service in each church, and help plan and promote C.T.S. rallies and youth camps in this Association when called upon. This planning will consist of arranging for a director, evangelist, teachers, and other workers as needed. It shall have the authority to elect such officers as necessary to carry out its functions.

Section 2: Non-Standing Committees (Boards) - These shall consist of three (3) members appointed as follows:

PULPIT COMMITTEE: Appointed at each meeting with responsibility to select persons to bring morning message and the afternoon devotion.

RESOLUTION COMMITTEE: Appointed at each meeting with responsibility to handle resolutions and make recommendations thereof to the afternoon business session.

OBITUARY COMMITTEE: Appointed at each meeting with the responsibility to obtain a list of deceased members of the past quarter of Association Churches.

ARTICLE 6 - MEMBERSHIP:

Section 1: Newly organized churches may petition for membership by letter and delegates. Upon examination, if they are found to be orthodox and orderly, they may be received in the Association by vote of the majority present. The Moderator may give the right hand of fellowship.

Section 2: Any church coming from another Association or quarterly meeting, may upon examination and vote of this Association, become a member provided a letter of recommendation is furnished by the Association or quarterly meeting from which they come, or upon approval and recommendation of Examining Board.

ARTICLE 7 - DISCIPLINE: This Association shall have the right to settle any question of discipline, doctrine, or practice, that properly comes before it from any church of which it is composed, and to exclude them for disorderly conduct if labor proves unsuccessful; but in no case to reverse their decisions, nor to interfere with any of their regulations.

ARTICLE 8 - FINANCES: The Association operations shall be financed through the Cooperative Plan. At the annual meeting, \$35.00 is due for state expenses from each local church.

ARTICLE 9 - BUSINESS: The business of the Association while in session shall include questions and topics as may be referred to it by the churches in their letters, resolutions and recommendations presented by its boards, committees, or individual members.

ARTICLE 10 - PREROGATIVE: This yearly meeting or Association shall have power to adopt any regulations or by-laws not inconsistent with this constitution, which may be deemed essential to the further regulations of its session.

ARTICLE 11 - PARLIAMENTARY PROCEDURE: Questions or deliberations shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order.

ARTICLE 12 - AMENDMENTS: This constitution may be altered or amended by a two-thirds vote of the delegates present at any regular yearly meeting of the Association.

#### CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise, by His grace, to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men".

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith, and good woks endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ".

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observances of the ordinances of the Gospel; nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly praying and toiling that the kingdom of God may come and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday schools, and evangelist efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

#### ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. THE BIBLE The Scriptures of the Old and New Testament were given by the inspiration of God, and are infallible rules of faith and practice.
- 2. GOD There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver and Righteous Governor of the Universe, and in the Scriptures as the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore and obey.
- 3. CHRIST Christ is God manifest in the flesh: in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified. He is now rise and glorified as our ever present Savior and Lord.
- 4. THE HOLY SPIRIT The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God. He is the Reprover, Comforter, Guide, and Sanctifier of all men.
- 5. THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts of Grace, not otherwise provided for as highest welfare of man requires.
- 6. THE SINFULNESS OF MAN Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity, therefore, inherited a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.

- 7. THE WORK OF CHRIST The Son of God, by His incarnation, life, suffering, death, and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free and is the ground of salvation by faith.
- 8. THE WORK OF SALVATION The conditions of salvation are: 1. Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and the hearty renunciation of it. 2. Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Saviour and Lord, with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith, the soul is rewarded by the Holy Spirit; freed from the dominion of sin and becomes a child of God. 3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death.
- 9. ELECTION God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ, men become His elect.
- 10. FREEDOM OF WILL The human will is free and self controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit and live, or to resist them and perish.
- 11. SALVATION FREE God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.
- 12. PERSEVERANCE All believers in Christ, who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, have the promise of eternal salvation.
- 13. BACKSLIDING AND APOSTASY. A person who has been regenerated or born again and is living in unconfessed, unforgiven sin, is rebellious to the principles of the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and therefore is a backslider in a lost condition who must repent and be restored to the right relationship with God or be eternally lost. We recognize, according to Hebrews 6:4-6, that it is possible for a person to get in the condition that he could never return to Christ. This, we believe, is Apostasy. We also recognize that a regenerate person can fall into sin, be in a lost condition and still not be an apostate. This person, through repentance, can be reconciled to God.
- 14. GOSPEL ORDINANCES Baptism, or the immersion of believers in water, and the Lord's Supper, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel; Feet Washing, an ordinance teaching humility, of universal obligation, and to be administered to all true believers.
- 15. TITHING God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ endorsed it in the Gospel (Matthew 23:23), and the Apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store as God hath prospered him." 1 Corinthians 16:2.
- 16. THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from the secular employment and amusements for rest, worship, holy works and activities, and for personal communion with god.
- 17. RESURRECTION, JUDGMENT, AND FINAL RETRIBUTION The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked shall "go away into eternal punishment but the righteous unto eternal life".

#### PERMANENT RESOLUTIONS

April 22, 1978 -- That Kiamichi Association increase our outside giving by 5%, and this be designated to Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College. This will make our giving 90% to Co-Op with 25% designated to Hillsdale and 10% to stay in the Association.

January 19, 1980 -- Each church in our Association should support and back The Master's Men and promote The Master's Men in their church to develop a closer relationship between the men of the Kiamichi Association.

June 28, 1980 -- The Christian Education Board of the Kiamichi Association, in cooperation with S.A.N.E. organization, begin to work with each church in the Association to recommend ways and means to oppose legislation to legalize "Liquor by the Drink" and "Pari-mutuel Betting". Also that each church in the Kiamichi Association agree to accept the challenge to engage in active and open campaign toward defeating these two state campaigns.

April 18, 1981 -- That each church send a list of the people deceased each quarter in their letter to the Association.

October 4, 1981 -- That \$30.00 be paid to the General Board Member to help with expenses for the State Association.

June 26, 1982 (revised June 1986) — We resolve that we keep a total of 20% of Co-Op moneys; 10% to be deposited in the District Co-Op account, and 10% to be deposited in a separate account to be used by the Christian Education Board for youth purposes.

October 1, 1983 -- Whereas the time allowed on the mornings of our quarterly meetings is limited and whereas the duty performed by the Examining Board is of such importance to our Association, as well as our denomination, that decisions should not be rushed, be it resolved that any petitionary letter, or any request for examination, be submitted at least two weeks in advance of the Quarterly Meeting so the Examining board may meet with the candidates prior to our Saturday Business session. Also, all men to be examined must be present during the examination.

October 4, 1986 — Whereas the time period between requesting a letter of recommendation and receiving one from another Association for a minister requesting acceptance into the Kiamichi Association is so uncertain, be it resolved that the Examining Board call the Moderator of the candidate's previous association and report their findings with their recommendations, and that ministers be accepted on promise of a letter of recommendation.

October 3, 1987 -- Be it resolved that we place name tags on all that attend the Association meetings. The Association will supply name tags.

October 3, 1987 — Be it resolved that the Kiamichi Association of Free Will Baptist, by a permanent resolution, adopt the reporting forms made available from the National Association Executive Office (forms #501, #502, #503, and #504), as the authorized reporting forms for the Kiamichi Association, and be it resolved that the Associational Clerk secure for each church in the Association the complete number of these forms needed for the coming calendar year from the National Executive Office, and these forms be made available at the annual meeting each year.

January 21, 1989 -- In order that we may have a record of the students of any Free Will Baptist College who are from the Kiamichi Association, be it resolved that we include in our October minutes each year the names of all Kiamichi Association students who attend any Free Will Baptist College, along with their grade and home church.

October 7, 1989 — Be it resolved that the following rotation be established for quarterly and annual meetings of Kiamichi Association of Free Will Baptist: McAlester First, Canadian Shores, Lone Grove, North McAlester, Crowder, Wilburton, Eufaula, and Salonia. Further, that if any churches join the Association, that they be placed into the rotation in order, immediately following Salonia.

October 7, 1989 -- Be it resolved that the following dates be established for quarterly and annual meetings of Kiamichi Association of Free Will Baptist: The third Friday and Saturday in January; the third Friday and Saturday in April; the third Friday and Saturday in June; the first Friday and Saturday in October.

June 16, 1990 -- Be it resolved that the Kiamichi Association have a three-member nominating committee, elected annually, to provide a slate of nominees for all offices to be filled at the annual meeting; and be it resolved that a job description be written for each office in the Association, with the descriptions to be kept on file as information.

October 6, 1990 -- Be it resolved that the Friday night services of the quarterly and annual meetings be designated as youth services, and that a Youth Director be elected by the Association.

October 6, 1990 -- Whereas our Christian Education Board activities are growing, especially in regard to the annual Youth camp, and whereas, the Christian Education Board receives 10% of the District Co-Operative receipts, therefore, be it resolved, that an annual treasurer's report be given by the Christian Education Board and be printed in our minutes.

# QUARTERLY MEETING January 19-20, 1990 at McAlester First

#### Friday Night 7:30 p.m. Service

The Kiamichi Association Youth Rally was hosted by the McAlester First Church. Rev. Homer Young, host church pastor, welcomed the congregation to the church, and Rev. Russell Lowe led in prayer. Vanessa Kirk, accompanied by Kathy Higgins, led congregational singing. Special music was presented by Jesse Martinez from Canadian Shores; Amy, William, and Kathy Higgins from McAlester First; Danyel and Ronny Zummer and Shannon Hearod from Lone Grove; and Danyel Zummer from Lone Grove. Bro. Danny Zummer, 1990 camp director, shared announcements about youth camp. The church count was taken, and Rev. Homer Young led in prayer. The film "Bennie" was shown, and the church count was announced. 107 were present, with 48 being age 20 and under, and 59 being age 21 and over. Canadian Shores won the attendance banner with 17 present age 20 and under. Rev. Arty Hearod led the dismissal prayer and asked the blessing on the refreshments, which were provided by the host church.

#### Saturday 9:30 a.m. Service

Jennye Hickman, Clerk, called the service to order, and Rev. Ronnie Drake led in prayer. Rev. Homer Young, host church pastor, welcomed the Association to the church. Rev. David Taylor, Moderator, read Acts 4:5-13, and gave the group a challenge for the 1990's to be people who "have been with Jesus". Ronny Zummer, accompanied by Jennye Hickman, led in congregational singing. Bro. Dean Lawson of McAlester First Church gave the morning devotion from Matthew 8:5-10. Letters from all eight churches were read and approved, after corrections were made. Delegates were seated, and Rev. Russell Lowe led in prayer. Rev. Taylor read from the Rules of Order, numbers 1, 3, 4, and 7. Assistant Moderator Rev. Russell Lowe appointed the following committees: -- Charlie Clifton, Jerry Jackson, and Jack Mouser; Resolution -- Gary Smith, Chuck Murray, and Fred Clifton; Obituary -- Frances Eldridge, Tillie Oliver, and Opal Hickman. The minutes of the October, 1989, annual meeting were read and approved. Copies of the treasurer's report were distributed, and the report was approved. Following a break, the following committee reports were presented: Pulpit Committee -- Rev. Arty Hearod to bring the morning message. Resolution Committee -- one proposal was submitted, which read as follows: That the Association consider forming a nominating committee before the next annual meeting for the purpose of making contact with people willing to hold offices, and to describe the jobs and duties of each one. Also, consider writing "job descriptions" on each of the duties. A motion and second was made to table this proposal until the April, 1990, meeting, and this motion carried. The Clerk was instructed to send a copy of the proposal to each church and encourage them to discuss it before the next meeting. Obituary Committee -- One death during the past guarter. Bro. Dalton Farhart from McAlester First Church. Rev. Homer Young led in prayer. Rev. Taylor asked for reports from the standing boards. The reports were as follows: Christian Education Board -- Bro. Danny Zummer gave

a report about 1990 youth camp. Examining Board -- Recommend that Rocky Barlow, member of Lone Grove Free Will Baptist Church, be ordained as a deacon in their church at their convenience. Motion and second to accept this report, and the motion carried. Jennye Hickman gave a report from the Kiamichi District Woman's Auxiliary. Rev. Taylor read a letter of encouragement from State Executive Secretary Rev. Connie Cariker concerning roll Call Sunday, March 25, 1990. Rev. Homer Young gave a report from the State Missions Board. There was no old or unfinished Motion and second was made to grant Rev. Doug Christian, who has joined the South Grand River Association, a letter of good standing. The motion carried. Rev. Homer Young announced that he has Leon Kilbreath videos available for use by the Association, and Rev. Taylor gave information about the Free Will Baptist Book Store's tape lending library. Motion and second was made to adjourn the business session, and the motion carried. Bro. Jack Mouser led in prayer.

#### Worship Service

Ronny Zummer, accompanied by Jennye Hickman, led in congregational singing. special music was presented by Gary and Mary Smith and Jack and Darlene Mouser from McAlester First; Wanda Gibson, Tracy Black, Shelly Morrison, and Alene Pearce from Canadian Shores; Jennye Hickman from Lone Grove; Rev. Ronnie Drake from Eufaula; and Chuck Murray from Eufaula. Rev. Taylor, accompanied by Rev. Drake, led the congregation in singing "What a Friend We Have in Jesus". Rev. Ronnie Gibson led in prayer. Rev. Arty Hearod took his message text from John 6:20. Bro. Earl Folsom led the dismissal prayer and asked the blessing on the noon meal.

# QUARTERLY MEETING April 10-21, 1990 at Canadian Shores

#### Friday Night 7:30 p.m. Service

The Kiamichi Association Youth Rally was hosted by the Canadian Shores Youth Director Jennye Hickman called the service to order, and Rev. Ronnie Gibson, host church pastor, welcomed the congregation the church. Alene Pearce, accompanied by Sue Bradley. Rev. Russell Lowe led in prayer.
