The report was adopted and the committee discharged. On motion we adjourn to meet Friday, at 9 o'clock A. M.

FRIDAY MORNING SESSION.

The body met pursuant to adjournment, and was called to order by the Moderator. Scripture reading by Rev. Warren Ren-

froe and prayer by Y. T. Wiggins.

The Moderator announced the body ready for business, and the Clerk called the roll, and the names of the ministers and delegates arriving since adjournment were enrolled, and the Moderator extended the right hand of fellowship to them. The letters were read and the state of the same noted.

Call for the report of ministers was read as follows:

Rev. W. H. Bailey-Miles traveled, unknown; sermons preached, unknown; members received, 5; number baptized 2.

Rev. N. T. Cardwell—Miles traveled, 540; sermons preached, 57; members received, 17; number baptized, 12; money received, \$62.73; railroad fare, 75c.

Rev. Warren Renfroe-Miles traveled, 600; sermons preached, 72; members received, 14; number baptized, 5; money received, \$55.17; railroad fare, \$10.00.

Rev. J. W. Joiner—Miles traveled, 200; sermons preached, 27;

members received 20; baptized 2; churches organized, one; money received \$7.45; railroad fare, 15c.

Rev. W. É. Thompson—Miles traveled, 791; sermons preached, 40; members received, 1; money received, \$29.15; railroad fare, \$12.04.

Rev. J. B. Ray—Miles traveled, 1016; sermons preached, 36; members received, 3; money received, \$11.30; railroad fare, \$16.18,

Rev. R. T. Coleman—Miles traveled, 300; sermons preached, 31; members received, 12; baptized, 4; money received, \$2.80.

Rev. G. W. Little—Miles traveled, 1483; sermons preached, 75; members received, 17; number baptized, 11; money received, \$33.64; railroad fare, \$28.22.

Rev. A. J. Browning—Miles traveled, 3318; sermons preached, 130; members received, 43; number baptized, 11; churches organized, 2; money received, \$172.01; railroad fare, \$35.74.

Rev. D. N. Rowland—Miles traveled, 564; ser mons preached, 39; members received, 4; money received, \$8.60; railroad fare, \$3.76.

On motion we adjourn to meet at 2 P. M., and the Home Mission Board holds a short session to transact such business as may come before it.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

Called to order by the Moderator, with Scripture reading, singing; prayer by Rev. N. G. Baggett; we omit roll call.

Call for letters and received 5, and the delegates names are enrolled and the Moderator extends the right hand of fellowship to them.

Call for the reports of the Committees and none being ready to report, we suspend the regular order of business to hear some suggestions from Rev. E. L. St. Clair, and on motion said suggestions are laid over for miscellaneous business.

The Committee on the State of the Ministry, reports as follows:

We, your Committee, beg to make this our report: We believe the ministers are too slack with their work, the churches are not at work as they should be, and we believe that the ministers are to be held responsible to a certain degree. While they, as far as we know, have not conducted themselves so bad, but their neglect of duty in their pastorial work, we would like to see more vim in the ministry.

ON SUGGESTIONS.

We, your committee, suggest that the first 5th Sunday meeting meet with Harvest Home Church on Friday before the 5th Sunday in December, 1906, at 10 o'clock A. M., and the second 5th Sunday meeting meet with New Home Church on Friday before the 5th Sunday in March, 1907, at 10 o'clock A. M., and the 3rd to meet with Macedonia Church in St. Rosa county, Fla., on Friday before the 5th Sunday in June, 1967, at 10 o'clock A. M., and the 4 to meet with Friendship Church, Escambia county, Ala., on Friday before the 5th Sunday in September, 1907, at 10 o'clock A. M., and that the next annual session of this Association meet with Shiloh Church, Escambia county, Fla., on Thursday before the 4th Sunday in October, 1907, at 10 o'clock A. M.

ON SUNDAY SCHOOLS AND TEMHERANCE.

We find from the reading of the church letters that very few of our churches have any Sunday School, and we request that the pastors of each church encourage their churches to build up their Sunday Schools, as we believe that a Sunday School is the very life of any community and the backbone of the church. We further recommend that each church use such literature as would be the upbuilding of the Sunday School cause, and we suggest the use of the Freewill Baptist Literature, Published at Ayden, N. C., when practicable. We also request that the body take some step toward sending out some one as a Sunday School worker to build up the cause in our Association as to Temperance. Brethren, we think we should be temperate in all things.

SATURDAY MORNING SESSION.

The body met pursuant to adjournment. Scripture realing by

Rev. A. J. Browning and prayer by R. M. Chambless.

The Moderator announced the body ready for business, and the Clerk called the roll, and Rev. D. N. Rowland came forward and his name was enrolled, and the Moderator extended the right hand of tellowship to him, and he hands over 85 cents for Minutes and 55 cents for Home Missions, to the credit of Range Church.

On motion, Rev. J. B. Trotter, a Methodist minister, is accorded a welcome hand and a seat with us.

COMMITTEE ON HOME MISSIONS.

We find that there has been only \$21.93 paid into this fund this year up to this meeting, less amount paid for blanks, &c., \$1.55; balance on hand, \$20.38; sent in by letters and otherwise collected during this meeting, \$11.53; total on hand, \$31.91.

We believe that this Association could do better if we will try, and if we all had the love of God in our hearts as we should have, would not let this good work by, as we need so much Mis-

sion work done in our Association.

We regret to part with those we love, but let us hope to meet above, where parting come no more, and let us realize that our loss is their happy and eternal gain.

Call for Miscellaneous Business.

On motion the body elects three Trustees as follows: R. M. Chambless, W. H. L. Peebles and T. M. Coleman, whose duty it shall be to look into the titles of church property in this Association, and all deeds should be made to said Trustees and their successors in office, for the use and benefit of the Freewill Baptist of the Liberty Association.

At the suggestion of Rev. E. L. St. Claire, a motion prevails that this Association will become a member of the National General Conference of Freewill Baptists and Brother R. M. Chambless is elected by the body, and Rev. A. J. Browning is appointed by Elder St. Clair as delegates to represent this Association in the next session of said Conference and each church is asked to take up collections for the purpose of raising funds to defray their expenses.

On motion Rev. G. W. Little, R. P. Watts, N. G. Baggett and N. T. Cardwell are elected Messengers to the State Convention

of Freewill Baptists.

Motion to adopt the Frewill Baptist, a paper published at Ayden, N. C., and also Zion's Hymn Books, as the organs of this Association, is adopted.

On motion we adjourn to 2 P. M.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

Scripture reading by the Moderator and prayer by Rev. N. G. Baggett. The Clerk called the roll and the Moderator announced the body ready for business.

Motion by Rev. R. P. Watts to change the time of the meet-

ing of the Association in annual session, is defeated.

THE HOME MISSION BOARD

Reports as follows: Money in the hands of the Home Mission Treasurer at present, \$31.91. We suggest that this money be held subject to the order of the Home Mission Board, and that the said Board be given power to transact any business that may come before it both financially and morally, and that they report to the annual Association.

On motion of W. H. L. Peebles, the body decides not to put

out any Evangelist this year.

Motion by Brother Peebles that all preachers in this Association shall report to the Home Mission Board at each Fifth Sunday Meeting, either in person or by letter, all churches known to be without a pastor, general condition, &c. Motion is carried.

After considerable discussion, pro and con, the following res

olution is adopted:

Be it Resolved by this body that a committee of five be selected to draw up a form of government for the guidance of the Liberty Association; said document to be presented to the next Fifth Sunday meeting, and then and there be put in shape to be carried before the churches for their approval or rejection; and that each

church instruct its delegates to the annual session of this association for or against said government, in order that the same may be then and there fairly and finally ratified or rejected by the majority of the churches. The committee is as follows: R. M. Chambless, G. W. Little, N. G. Baggett, Warren Renfroe and T. M. Coleman.

On motion, Rev. Warren Renfroe was elected to write the next circular letter, and Rev. G. W. Little was elected to preach the next introductory sermon; Rev. R. P. Watts his alternate.

On motion, the treasurer was instructed to pay the clerk \$8

for his services in getting up the minutes and \$15 to have same printed; and a collection was taken up for Home Mission work. Amount collected \$2.68.

On motion of Rev. R. P. Watts we extend a vote of thanks to the church and community at large for their hospitality and kindness to this body during this session. Also on motion of W. H. L. Peebles we extend a vote of thanks to Rev. J. B. Trotter for his kindness and brotherly love in calling in his appointment at the M. E. Church on account of our association being in session.

On motion, we adjourn to meet with Shiloh Church, Escambia County, Fla., on Thursday before the fourth Sunday in October.
