The Liberty Association of Free Will Baptist No. 2 in its 18th annual Session with the First Free Will Baptist Church of Talladega, Alabama, September 21 and 22, 1951.

The house was called to order at 9:15 Friday morning by the clerk after which Rev. J. T. Windsor the former moderator, took charge until officers of this term were elected.

Opened with scripture reading 13th chapter of 1st Corinthians. Then Rev. C. L. Fench led in prayer.

BUSINESS TRANSACTED

Move and second carried for moderator to replace absent members on credential committee. Bros. Leroy Smith, D. J. O'Donnell and Bro. S. W. McDonough were appointed.

Letters from churches were given to the credential committee with minutes from last Association for approval.

There were some good singing at this time, songs being led by Bro. Edward Ledlow and Bro. W. W. Callahan.

It was carried for the moderator to appoint a Home Mission Board. Rev. Floyd C. Barber (Chr.) Bro. Mark Edge, and Rev. S. W. McDonough.

Committee reports-All carried by move and second.

Devotional—Bro. S. W. McDonough to bring the 11 o'clock message Friday morning.

A partial report of the committee.

Song at this time, "O I Want to See Him." led by Rev. Marvin Wyatt.

Then services turned to Rev. S. W. McDonough for the message, using the scriptures 1 Thes. 4:15-17 and St. John 12:35-36 a wonderful message.

Moderator gave the floor to Rev. H. T. Perkins and he commended the young minister on the message. Then a song while the body shook hand with Bro. McDonough.

The moderator called on Rev. Leroy Smith to lead in prayer. Then the people praised God with their wonderful testimonies.

Song "Going That Way" led by Rev. Edward Ledlow. Then dismissed in prayer by Sister Hattie Owens for the noon hour to reassemble at one o'clock.

Reassembled at 1:15 Bro. Hubert Ledlow leading songs "Camping in Canaan" and "When They Ring The Golden Bells."

House called to order by the clerk at 1:25. Moderator taking charge reading Ps. 9 then prayer by Rev. Marvin Wyatt.

Devotional—Rev. J. T. Windsor for the Friday night message. Rev. Edward Ledlow for the Saturday morning message. Sister Essie Dollar for the devotional Saturday night. Rev. Johnie Burnham the Communion message Saturday night.

Resolution—1. Each church of this association continue to pay 7½% of church income into the Home Mission treasury. Special collections and funds exempted. 2. Everyone especially ministers follow up every prospect for new Free Will Baptist Churches. S. W. McDonough, chairman.

Auditing—We find clerk and Treasury report to balance with \$27.65 Bal. in Treasury. Also find \$112.00 in the Q. M. Treasury, and \$51.00 in the Home Mission Treasury. D. J. O'Donnell, chairman.

Ministerial Standing—Ministers ordained to-day be given credentials for the coming year. Rev. E. T. Nicholson who didn't report to ministers conference be given credentials. He misunderstood the date of conference.

Bros. E. O. Morris and Bro. Edward Ledlow be granted license to preach 1 year.

Credential Committee—Have examined all letters and minutes found o. k. and turned them to business committee to take up business in them. Mark Edge, chairman.

Temperance—In order to further temperance we should be temperate in all things, especially in drinking ("Mine" Total abstain from sinful amusements and intoxicating drink) John Wilcox, chairman.

Literature—Same from 1950 minutes be printed. We urge all parents to closely examine literature that comes into their homes and encourage their children to read wholesome literature based on the word of God. Heb. 4:12, For the word of God is sharper than any two-edged sword piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit and of the joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart. Bro. Herman Dollar, chairman.

Family Religion—We urge the parents to teach their children to respect the right of others, and the house of God.

And the parents to live their religion daily before their children reading the Bible and praying with them. Children obey your parents. Chester O'Donnell, chairman.

Education—We recommend the parents to teach their children from infancy to always observe the ordinances of God. To hold a daily Bible reading with their children in order to get them interested in the Lord's work. That the parents bring up their children according to Pro. 22:6. Train up a child in the way he should go and when he is old he will not part from it.

That they teach them to fear God. That all the literature in their home be good, wholesome, literature. That the parents teach their children not to take of worldly pleasures.

Plus 1950 report—We recommend our people to take advantages of every opportunity to study the Bible and Christian Literature from the Free Will Baptist Press.

That our churches not having a Sunday School or League organize one or both that our children might learn more of God's word. Rev. Elbert Taylor, chairman.

Sabbath School—We should devote more time and study to the work of the Lord's Day, to keep it holy. For we know that He is the Creator of all things, and on the seventh day did rest from all His labor. The Sunday School is the most important school that was ever taught, so let us all teach our little children from the fire-side in our homes, In the church don't just send them to but come and bring them. Also teach them to reverence the Lord. Bro. Paul Callahan, chairman.

Deceased Members—We find that there are two members deceased from our body, Bro. Bartley Kindrick a Deacon and Sister Josephine Henderson of Friendship Church, whom we deem our loss but Gods gain. We ask that this body stand in silent prayer in recognition of these our Bro. and Sister in Christ. Bro. A. A. Bradshaw, chairman.

At this time the quarterly meeting letter was read and adopted by the body and the delegate seated.

There were short but interesting talks made on the church and other subjects by Bro. D. J. O'Donnell, Rev. H. T. Perkins, Sister Essie Dollar, Rev. J. B. Ledlow, Rev. Cleo Elder, Bro. W. W. Callahan, Rev. J. W. Burnham, and Sister "Grandma Callahan."

All Business carried by proper move and second.

- (1) Business—Money orders to home mission board be returned to sender for purpose of cashing. Then cash be returned to the Home Mission Board.
- (2) This body reimburse Bro. D. J. O'Donnell delegates to National Association, to represent Liberty No. Two Association there, the sum of \$31.00 expenses.
- (3) Liberty No. 2 delegate to the State Association be granted power to appoint delegate to National Association to represent Liberty No. 2 Association there.
- (4) Bro. S. W. McDonough from Trinity church and Bro. Edward Ledlow from Talladega church and Bro. E. O. Morris from Friendship church, Be called in question and if found worthy be granted license to preach the Gospel one year.
- (5) Rev. Floyd C. Barber from Friendship church and Rev. Elbert Taylor from Guiding Light church be questioned and if found worthy be ordained to the full work of the Gospel Ministry.
 - (6) That a Field Evangelist be elected. (Rev. Edward Ledlow elected)
- (7) Each minister and deacon give one day's pay for the purpose of helping buy a new tent. Money to be turned in to the Home Mission Board at the first Q. M. in 1952.
 - (8) This body back the efforts of the Youth Camp Movement.
- (9) The next Quarterly meeting be postponed until Saturday before the 5th Sunday in December at Wattsville church.
- (10) That the 19th session of this body be held with Friendship church at Pell City.
- (11) All money received by the Home Mission Board in the past year for the Field Evangelist be given him. (Rev. W. C. Patterson)
- (12) This body grant the Field Evangelist Power to appoint an assistant Evangelist if he desires.
- (13) Discuss and see about ten acres offered by Bro. Tom Sanders for a camp site. Power given moderator to appoint three men to see about this property. Bros. C. L. Finch, Herman Dollar, Leroy Smith appointed.
- (14) Ordination certificate recommended by council from Quarterly Meeting be used when ministers or Deacons come from another denomination.

Credential Committee gave their report on the letters and they were read and adopted and the delegates seated.

Bro. Rayford Abrams appointed on the auditing committee in the absence of Rev. Marvin Wyatt.

BY-LAWS

1. Each session shall be opened by singing, scripture reading, and prayer, and shall be closed with prayer.

- 2. Each Sunday School shall send one delegate for the organization and one additional delegate for every twenty-five (25) members or major fraction thereof. These delegates, along with all ordained ministers in good standing with the Association shall constitute the official board and shall transact all business properly coming before said body.
- 3. Visiting Brethren and Corresponding Messengers shall be recognized by the presiding officer and invited to a seat in council. They shall not, however have the power to vote on any question.
- 4. Members from five (5) different Sunday Schools and Leagues shall constitute a quorum to transact business, but a smaller number may adjourn from time to time.
- 5. The president or vice-president shall preside at all meetings, and in their absence the body may choose one to preside.
- 6. Anyone wishing to speak shall arise and address the presiding officer as "Bro. President" or "Sis. President" and be recognized before speaking.
- 7. No subject shall be discussed without a motion and a second, and the question stated by the president.
- 8. No report shall be adopted except by a motion and a second and a vote taken.
- 9. The president shall appoint all committees unless otherwise directed by the body.
- 10. Each Church send \$5.00 Entrance Fee. Each Sunday School with more than fifty (50) members, \$5.00. Each Sunday School with more than twenty (25) members and less than fifty, \$2.50. Each Sunday School with less than twenty-five (25) members, \$1.00. Each League, \$2.00.
- 11. Delegates may be sent to represent at once both the Sunday School and the League but must be so authorized and must come equipped with the proper credentials.
- 12. These By-Laws may be temporarily suspended or permanently altered by a two-thirds vote of all members present at any regular business meeting of the Convention.

CONSTITUTION

Preamble: In order to strengthen and unify our Christian word and the building of Christian character among the members of the Liberty Association of Free Will Baptists, and to promote and maintain a correspondence

with each other in an association-wide organization, we propose to band ourselves together n an organic union to keep the rules of such an organization according to the following plan:

Article 1. This organization shall be composed and known as the Sunday School and League Convention of Liberty No. 2 Association of Free Will Baptists.

Article II. This Convention shall be composed of regularly organized Sunday Schools and Leagues within the bounds of said Association and shall meet on the second fifth Sunday of each year. The place of meeting will be decided at each previous session.

Article III. Any Sunday School or League desiring to become a member of this Convention shall send two (2) or more delegated representatives with a petitionary letter, stating the desire of their particular organization to become a member of this Body. They shall be received by a majority vote of all members present.

Article IV. The officers of this Convention shall be President, who shall preside at all meetings; a Vice-President, who shall preside over meetings in the absence of the President; a secretary and treasurer who shall keep a true and accurate record of every meeting and every business transaction, and to have, hold and convey or convoy any and all funds entrusted to him or her by the Convention. Other officers may be elected as deemed necessary by this Body.

Article V. An Executive Committee, composed of three (3) members, to be elected so that their terms expire alternately thus: one to be elected for one year; one to be elected for two years; and one to be elected for three years. They shall be elected by the body and shall attend to all business matters between regular annual sessions and also shall arrange the program for the Annual Session. One of these members shall be chosen from the Sunday School, one from the League, and one shall be elected at large.

Article VI. All officers, including Executive Committee members, must be Christians and Free Will Baptists.

Article VII. This Constitution may be altered or amended by a two-thirds vote of all members present at any regular business meeting, but notice of such intended change must be given at least twenty-four hours in advance of the proposed amendment or alteration. Any amendment or alteration voted by this body shall be final.

ASSOCIATIONAL RULINGS

- 1. Each Minister, Ordained or Licensed must report in person or by letter to each session of this Association to receive proper credentials for the coming year.
- 2. Each minister, ordained or licensed of churches belonging to this Association is expected to affiliate with the minister's conference and cannot be recognized as a minister nor pastor churches of this Association except they comply with this ruling.
 - 3. Each ordained minister must bear yearly certificates of standing to

be eligible to pastor churches of this association. License of all licensed ministers must be renewed.

- 4. Ministers coming to us from another denomination must hold membership in some church of this association for one (1) year before being eligible to pastor churches of this association.
- 5. Licensed ministers must bear license for one (1) year before being eligible for ordination.
- 6. Churches must use letter form sent them each year by the Clerk to be recognized by this Association.
- 7. That this body elect officers in the beginning of each session and not in the closing for one (1) year ahead as heretofore practiced.
 - 8. That this body adopt a unified program.
- 9. This body rules that any minister of this Association has a right to use the tent when not being used by regularly elected evangelist, by inviting the evangelist to assist in the revival.
- 10. That each church pay an entrance fee of \$5.00 same to be used for the expense of the association.
- 11. That the ministers' conference convene on Friday night instead of Friday evening as heretofore practiced.
 - 12. That the Clerk be paid \$10.00 each term for his services.
- 13. All Pasters abstain from the practice of UNKNOWN tongues, or the use of them in his church, without an interpreter, or have his credentials recalled and he be declared unworthy, this applying to any other doctrine not in accord with God's Word.

FREE WILL BAPTIST ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. The Bible. The Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of faith and practice. I Tim. 3:16.
- 2. God. There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver, and Righteous Governor of the universe; and in the Scriptures as Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore, and obey. I Cor. 8:6; Matt. 28:19.
- 3. Christ. Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified, He is now risen and glorified, and is our ever present Savior and Lord. St. John 1:1-12.
- 4. The Holy Spirit. The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God. He is the Reprover, Comforter, Guide and Sanctifier of men. St. John 16:7, 8; Acts 2:4; Eph. 4:4-6.
- 5. The Government of God. God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts of grace, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of men requires. Ps. 22:28; 97:2.
 - 6. The Sinfulness of man. Man was created innocent, but by disobe-

dience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity, therefore, inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability sin, and become guilty before God. Gen. 2:17; 3:19.

- 7. The Work of Christ. The Son of God by His incarnation, life, suffering, death and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free and is the ground of salvation by faith. I John 2:2.
- 8. The Terms of Salvation. The conditions of salvation are: 1. Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it. 2. Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Saviour and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin and becomes a child of God. 3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death. II Cor. 7:10; Pro. 28:13.
- 9. Election. God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ men become His elect. I Tim. 2:4.
- 10. Freedom of the Will. The human will is free and self-controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit and live, or to resist them and perish. Joshua 24:15.
- 11. Salvation Free. God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely. Rev. 22:17.
- 12. Perseverance. All believers in Christ, who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, have promise of eternal salvation. St. John 15:6; II Peter 2:20-22.
- 13. Gospel Ordinances. BAPTISM, or the immersion of believers in water, and the LORD'S SUPPER, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel; FEET WASHING, an ordinance teaching humility, of universal obligation, and to be ministered to all true believers. Mark 16:15; II Cor. 4:5; St. John 13:14.
- 14. The Christian Sabbath. The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works and activities, and for personal communion with God. Gen. 2:3; Exod. 20:8-11.

FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH COVENANT

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith, and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ."

We will not forget the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences; public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.
