The 36th Session of Liberty No. 2 Association of Free Will Baptist met at the Youth Campground on August 15, 16, 1969. FRIDAY MORNING The session opened August 15, with Rev. F. C. Barber and Rev. E. 2. Grant the request of Pleasant Grove Church and question Rev. Blaine Bishop and if found worthy ordain him to the full gospel ministry.

3. Grant Lookout Mt. request and call in question Rev. Nolan K. Holland and if found worthy ordain him to the full gospel ministry.

4. That this body meet quarterly and the sessions meet on Saturday before the 3rd Sunday in the following months. February, May, August and November. The August session will be held two days beginning on Friday morning at 9 o'clock. This will be the yearly meeting.

5. That the body elect a moderator and assistant moderator at the close of each session to serve for the next session.

6. The clerk of the quarterly meeting and association be the same and held office for 2 years.

7. The moderator appoint a committee to make provisions for the Saturday night communion and feet washing service for this session of the association.

8. The moderator appoint a committee on Family Religion and Literature a year in advance of the Association to enable them to have ample time to make a more complete report. This would eliminate the reprinting of the previous year's report.

9. The moderator requested the Executive Board of the S.S. Convention along with the President to arrange for a revival at the Campground before cold weather.

10. The entrance fee to each of the 4 conferences be changed to \$10.00 in lieu of the present amounts being paid In addition to the entrance fee it is recommended that the churches continue to contribute toward paying for the printing of the minutes.

11. We recommend that the Clerk's pay be changed from the present method to \$10.00 each for the 4 conferences. That the moderator be paid \$10.00 for the yearly conference held in August.

TEMPERANCE - We your Temperance Committee recommend that our people practice temperance in the home, church, school, at work and in all our activities as taught by the Holy Bible.

AUDITING - We your Auditing Committee have examined the books of the association clerk-treasurer and Home Missions and find them in order with money correct.

RESOLUTION - We the Resolution Committee suggest that each member of the association begin and end each day with prayer and do our best for our Lord.

Be it resolved that:

Whereas, we the baptized believers in Christ, that comprise

the body of Liberty No. 2 Association of Free Will Baptist are convinced that the scriptures teach total abstainence from alcoholic beverage. That we here and now in keeping with out belief go on record publicly and unanimously as being opposed to the sale and distribution of alcoholic beverage, whether legal or illegal. That our member churches be advised to deal quickly and harshly with any member who votes or supports distribution of whiskey and beer in any way.

ORGANIZING COUNCIL - No work to report.

LITERATURE - We your Literature Committee recommend that our churches use literature that teaches the Bible and Free Will Baptist doctrine only. And to abstain from the use of any literature other than Christian. Also to oppose the sale of any literature other than Christian.

EDUCATION - We should resolve to use our denominational literature in churches and homes. We should prayerfully consider the reading matter brought into our homes. Also to encourage daily Bible reading.

DECEASED - We find the following belonging to our churches have departed to be with the Lord.

SUNDAY SCHOOL - We are glad to report that each church has a Sunday School. Sunday School is the teaching agency of the church and should have the best teachers they can get. Therefore we recommend the church help the class select their teachers. Where the church does not elect them.

ORDAINING COUNCIL - We the ordaining council have questioned Rev. Nolan K. Holland and Rev. Blaine Bishop for the ministry also Bro. David Gupton and Bro. Billy Earl Higginbotham for Deacon's.

We find these men to be in harmony with the Bible and sound in doctrine. Therefore we recommend them to be ordained.

MINISTERS & DEACONS - We recommend that the association grant all ministers representing in persons or by letter be granted a certificate of standing. All deacons reporting in person or by letter be granted a Certificate of Standing. To all Ministers and Deacons 65 years of age or older be granted a Lifetime Certificate of Standing.

FAMILY RELIGION - We recommend that the old report be done away with and this new one be adopted. We suggest that there be a survey made in each church to find out how many families hold daily devotions. And encourage those who do not to begin to do so.

We recommend that they use the Free Will Baptist Literature and the Bible. We wish parents would teach their small children respect for the church and its property.

ASSOCIATIONAL RULINGS

I. Each minister, ordained or licensed, must report in person or by letter to each session of this association to receive proper credentials for the coming year. Unless he is too old, or too feeble to attend, then he, as a Free Will Baptist minister, receives a life time certificate of standing. 2. Each minister, ordained or licensed, of churches belonging to this association is expected to affiliate with minister's conference and cannot be recognized as a minister nor pastor churches of this association except they comply with this ruling.

3. Each ordained minister must bear yearly certificates of standing to be eligible to pastor churches of this association, license of all licensed ministers must be renewed.

4. Ministers coming to us from another denomination must hold membership in some church of this association for one (1) year before being eligible to pastor churches of this association.

5. Licensed ministers must bear license for one (1) year before being eligible for ordianation unless called to pastor a church, then he can be ordained before a year is finished.

6. Churches must use letter forms sent them each year by the clerk. 7. That this body elect a moderator and assistant moderator at the close of each session of this conference to serve for the next session. (Changed 1969)

8. That this body adopt a unified program.

9. That this body rules that any minister of this association has the right to use the tent when not being used by regular elected evangelist by inviting the regular evangelist to assist him in the revival.

10. That each church pay an entrance fee of \$10.00 to each session of this conference (4 sessions a year). And continue to contribute toward paying for the printing of the minutes. (Changed 1969)

11. That the Minister's Conference convene on Friday night instead of Friday evening as heretofore practiced.

12. That the clerk be paid \$10.00 each session (4 sessions a year) for his services. (Changed 1969)

13. That the moderator appoint all standing committees and any other committees he may need.

14. That there be no church organized without seven (7) charter members.

15. This body try to buy the property or land when and where a new church is organized. The deeds be made in a way that if it should not be pleased to remain a Free Will Baptist Church that the property divert back to the Quarterly Meeting or Association that purchased the property or land.

16. That each ordained man, (minister or deacon) and licensed minister pay \$1.00 to register to vote in the association. Passed in 1961, amended

17. Each church being entitled to one (1) delegate. Every church containing fifty (50) members be entitled to two (2) delegates, and one (1) additional delegate for every twenty-five (25) members or major fraction. Page 81, 1963 Treatise.
