3. Each ordained minister must bear yearly certificates of standing to be eligible to pastor churches of this association, license of all licensed ministers must be renewed.

8. That this body adopt a unified program.

10. That each church pay an entrance fee of \$10.00 to each session of this conference (4 sessions a year) . and continue to contribute toward paying for the printing of the minutes. (Changed 1969)

11. That the Minister's Conference convene on Friday night instead of Friday evening as heretofore practiced.

12. That the moderator be paid \$10.00 for the 4th Qt. Session which is the annual session in August. This session only for his service; that the clerk be paid \$10.00 each session (4 sessions a year for his services, and he be paid eight (8) cents per mile for his expenses other than coming to association and quarterly meetings. Passed 1972. The Trustee of the children's home be paid eight (8) cents per mile, Passed 1970.

13. That the moderator appoint all standing committees and any other committees he may need.

14. That there be no church organized without seven (7) charter members. Passed 1947.

LIBERTY NO. 2

CONSTITUTION OF SUND AY SCHOOL AND LEAGUE CONVENTION

Preamble: In order to strengthen and unify our Christian work and the building of Christian character among the members of the Liberty No. 2 Sunday School Convention of Free Will Baptist, and to promote and maintain a corre spondence with each other in a convention wide organization. We propose to band ourselves together in an organic union to keep the rules of such an organization according to the following plan:

Article I. This organization shall be composed and known as the Sunday School and League Convention of Liberty No. 2 Association of Free Will Baptist.

Article II. This convention shall be composed of said association and shall meet at 2 P.M. Saturday before the 4th Sunday in April of each year and continue through Sunday, the place of meeting will be Liberty No. 2, Camp Ground 3 miles north of Pell City, Ala., unless otherwise stated.

Article III. Any Sunday School or League desiring to become a member of this convention shall send two (2) or more delegated representatives with a petitionary letter, stating the desire of their particular organization to become a member of this body. They shall be received by a majority vote of all members present.

Artivle IV, The officers of this convention shall be President who shall preside at all meetings, a Vice-President who shall preside over meetings in the absence of the President; a Secretary-Treasurer who shall keep a true and accurate record of every meeting and every business transaction, and to have, hold and convey any and all funds entrusted to him or her by the convention. Other officers may be elected as deemed necessary by this body.

Article V. An Executive committee, composed of three (3) members to be elected so that their terms expire alternately thus: One to be elected for one year: one to be elected for two years; and one to be elected for three years. They shall be elected by the body and shall attend to all business matters between regular and annual sessions. One of the members shall be chosen from the Sunday School, one from the League, and one shall be elected at large.

Article VI. All officers: including Executive Committee members must be Christians and Free Will Baptist.

Article VII. This Constitution may be altered or amended by a twothirds vote of all members present at any regular business meeting, but notice of such intended change must be given at least twenty-four hours in advance of the proposed amendment or alteration. Any amendment or alteration voted by this body shall be final.

BY-LAWS OF SUNDAY SCHOOL AND LEAGUE CONVENTION I. Each session shall be opened by singing. Scripture reading and prayer, and shall be closed with prayer.

2. Each Sunday School shall send one delegate for the organization and one additional delegate for every twenty-five (25) members or major fraction thereof. These delegates, along with all ordained ministers and deacons with the superintendent in good standing with the Association shall constitute the official board and shall transact all business properly coming before said body.

3. Visiting brethren and corresponding messengers shall be recognized by the presiding officer and invited to a seat in council. They shall not however, have the power to vote on any question.

4. Members from five (5) different Sunday Schools and Leagues shall constitute a quorum to transact business, but a smaller number may adjourn from time to time.

5. The president or Vice-president shall preside at all meetings, and in their absence the body may choose one to preside.

6. Anyone wishing to speak shall arise and address the presiding officer
as "Brother President" or "Sister President" and be recognized before speaking.
7. No subject shall be discussed without a motion and a second and the question stated by the president.

8. No report shall be adopted except by a motion and a second and a vote

9. The president shall appoint all committees unless otherwise directed

I O. Each Sunday School shall send \$5.00 entrance fee, League \$2.00.
I I. Delegates may be sent to represent at once both the Sunday School and the League, but must be so authorized and must come equipped with the proper credentials.

I 2. Attendance Banner: Each Sunday School give the number on the roll and the one with the greatest percentage attending receive the banner. If number on roll is not given we go by the church roll.

13. The Secretary-Treasurer shall be paid \$5.00 each session for service

14. These By-Laws may be temporarily suspended or permanently altered by a two-thirds vote of all members present at any regular business meeting of the convention.
