

1. Each minister, ordained or licensed, must report in person or by letter to erch session of this association to receive proper credentials for the coming rear. Unless he is too old, or too feeble to attend, then he, as a Free Will Paptist Minister, receives a life-time certificate of standing,

Each minister, ordained or dicensed, of churches belonging to this association, is expected to affiliate with minister's conference and cannot be recognized as a minister nor pastor churches of this association except they comply with this ruling.

3. Each ordained minister must be ar yearly certificates of standing to be eligible to pastor churches of this association, license of all licensed ministers must be renewed.

4. Licensed ministers must bear license for one (1) year before being eligible for ordination unless called to pastor a church, then he can be ordained before a year is finished.

5. Churches must use letter forms sent them each year by the clerk.

6. That this body elect a moderator and assistant moderator at the close of the annual session and he serve two (2) years, for both the Quarterly and Annual. The election coming on the odd year. Changed 1972 The clerk be elected at the close of the session. (Annual session) and he serve two (2) years. The election coming on the even year, and he take office the 1st guarterly session after the annual session of association. Passed 1972.

7. That this body adopt a unified program.

8. That each church pay an entrance fee of \$20.00 for the November, February and May session, and \$25.00 for the August Session, of this association. (4 sessions a year) and continue to contribute toward paying for the printing of the minutes, (Changed August Session 1980)

9. That the ministers and deacons conference convene on Friday night instead of Friday evening as heretofore practiced.

10. That the moderator be paid \$10.00 for the fourth quarterly session which is the annual session in August. This session only for his service. That the clerk be paid \$30.00 each session (4 sessions a year) for his services, and he be paid (35) thirty-five cents per mile for his expenses other than coming to asse

siation and quarterly meetings. Changed August 1980. The trustee of the chNdren's home be paid fifteen (15) cents per mile. Changed November session 1975.

11. That the moderator appoint all standing committees, and any other committee he may need.

12. That there be no church organized without seven (7) charter members. Passed 1947.

13. This body try to buy the property and land when and where a new church is organized. The deeds be made in such a way that if it should not be pleased to remain a Free Will Baptist church that the property divert back

t o the Quarterly meeting or ansociation that purchased the property or land. Passed 1961.

14. Ordanied ministers and deacons and licensed ministers are standing delegates. Each church being entitled to one (I) delegate, and every church containing fifty (50) members be entitled to two (2) delegates and one (I) additional delegate for every twenty-five (25) members of major fraction. Page 81, 1963 Treatise.

15. That no money be voted out of the association treasury till all the association expenses are paid, the moderator, clerk, trustee to children's home, entrance fee to State Association and minutes, along with the expense of the office, ministers and deacons cards. Passed 1971.

16. We recommend that each deacon be required to join minister and deacon conference, and each one when he come 65 years of age be given a life time certificate of standing. Adopted August 1980.

RULES FOR MINISTERS AND DEACONS CONFERENCE

1. That we elect a moderator and assistant moderator in August at the ministers and deacons conference and he must have attended at least one ministers and deacons conference before being elected moderator or assistant moderator.

2. That there be a ministers and deacons meeting four times a year, Friday night, one week before the quarterly meeting except at association which would meet Friday night of the association.

3. If he reports by letter he receive a certificate of standing and if unable to report due to sickness or car trouble he still will be issued a certificate of standing.

4. At the ministers and deacons conference the moderator appoint a committee of 3 ordained men that they visit any minister or deacon that is in question to see if their conduct is still becoming to being a minister or deacon. Any minister or deacon not belonging to this minister and deacon conference will not be recognized as a minister or deacon and will not have a right to vote, but will be treated as a brother in Christ.

5. That each minister and deacon pay a \$1.00 fee at each meeting for the Association treasury for expenses.

6. That any minister or deacon be a member of any church of the Liberty #2 Association be allowed to join the ministers and deacons conference at any of the Ministers and deacons meetings.

7. That this ministers and deacons conference will not recognize a minister or deacon with two (2) living wives or ordain him, I Tim. 3:2.

8. A minister in Liberty #2 Association is not to perform a marriage ceremony if a man or woman are divorced and has another living husband or wife.

FREE WILL BAPTIST ARTICLES OF FAITH

I. THE BIBLE. The Scripture of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and are infallible rule of faith and practice. I. Tim. 3:16. 2. GOD. There is one living and true God, revealed in mature as the Creator, Preserver, and Righteous Governor, of the Universe: and in the Scriptures as Father. Son and Holy Ghost, yet as one God, infinitely wise and good whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore and obey. I Cor. 9 8:6; Matt. 28:19.

3. CHRIST. Christ is God manifest in the flesh: in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified, He is now risen and glorified, and is our ever present Savior and Lord. St. John 1:1-12.

4. THE HOLY SPIRIT. The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the Attribute of God. He is the reprover, comforter, guide and sanctifier of men. St. John 16:7, 8, Acts 2:4; Eph. 4:4-8.

5. THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD. God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts of grace, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of men requires, Psa. 22:17; 97:2.

6. THE SINFULNESS OF MAN. Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His prosperity, therefore inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of account ability, sin and become guilty before God. Gen. 2:17; 3:19.

7. THE WORK OF CHRIST: The Son of God by His incarnation of life, suffering death and resurrection affected for all redemption from sin that is full and free and is the ground of salvation by faith. I John 2:2.

8. THER TERMS OF SALVATION. The conditions of salvation are: (1) Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it, (2) Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Savior and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin and becomes a child of God. (3) Continuance in faith and obedience until death.

II Cor. 7:10; Pro. 28:13.

9. ELECTION. God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation, hence by faith in Christ, men become His elect. 1 Tim. 2:4.

IO. FREEDMON OF THE WILL. The human will is free and self-controlled having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the spirit or to resist them and perish. Joshua 24:17.

II. SALVATION FREE: God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosever will may come and take the water of life freely. Rev. 22:17

12. PERSEVERANCE. All believers in Christ who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, have promise of eternal salvation. St. John 15:16; II Pet. 2:20-22.

1'3. GOSPEL ORDINANCES. Baptism, or the immersion of believers in water, and the Lord's Supper, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel, feet washing, an ordinance teaching humility, is of universal obligation, and is to be ministered to all true believers, Mark 16:15; II Cor. 4:5; St. John 13:14. 14. TITHING. God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament. Jesus endorsed it in the Gospel (Matt. 23:23) and the Apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let everyone of you lay by him in store, as God hath prospered him." I Cor. 15:2a.

15. THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH. The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements for rest, wor-ship, Holy works, and activities, and for personal communion with God. Gen. 2:3; Exodus 20:8-11.

16. RESURRECTION, JUDGMENT AND FINAL RETRIBUTION. The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation: then the wicked will "go away into eternal" punishment, but the righteous into eternal life." John 5:29; Matt. 25:46.
