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THE LITTLE MISSOURI RIVER FREE-WILL BAPTIST ASSOCIATION.

PREAMBLE.—From a long series of experience, we, the members of the Free Will Baptist Church of Christ, being regularly baptised upon the profession of our faith in Jesus Christ, and convinced of the necessity of a combination of churches to perpetuate a union and communion between us and preserve and maintain a correspondence with each other; do therefore propose to keep orders and rules of our Association according to the following plan or form of Government:

ARTICLE 1.—The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the different churches in our union not exceeding three delegates from each church, and who, upon producing letters, shall be entitled to seats.

ART. 2.—Letters from the different churches are to express their number in fellowship; the number received by experience, letter or recommendation; the number dismissed, excludcd; restored and that have died since the last Association.

ART. 3.—The members to be chosen and convened to be denominated "The Little Missouri River Free Will Baptist Association," being composed of sundry churches in the State of Arkansas. The Association to have no power to lord it over God's heritage, nor to have any ecclesiastical power over the churches; reserving the right of withdrawing from any church acting disorderly.

ART. 4.—The Association to have a Moderator and Clerk who are to be chosen by the suffrages of the members present.

ART. 5.—Newly constituted churches may be admitted into the Association on petition by letter and delegates, and if, on examination, they are found to be orthodox and orderly, they may be received into the Association, the Moderator giving the right hand of fellowship.

ART. 6.—No question from any church shall come under the consideration of the Association unless it has been discussed in its own church.

ART. 7.—Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the Association except it be withdrawn by the member who made it.

ART. 8.—The Association is to endeavor to furnish the churches with the minutes of the Association in proportion to the number of members in each church, the distribution being at the discretion of the Association.

ART. 9.—It shall be the duty of the clerk to keep a regular file of the minutes of this Association.

ART. 10.—The minutes of the Association shall be read and corrected, if needed, and signed by the Moderator and clerk before closing.

ART. 11.—Amendments to this form of government may be made at any time when a majority of the members may deem it necessary.

Rules of

OF THE LITTLE MISSOURI RIVER FREE-WILL BAPTIST ASSOCIATION.

- 1.—At every sitting the business making the motion shall be opened and closed with prayer by the Moderator or whomsoever he may request.
- 2.—Any ministers of the Gospel of the Free Will Baptist Church are to be invited to seats at the Annual Associations, and allowed to vote, or discuss any subject.
- 3.—Those who speak shall rise and address the Moderator. Personal reflection shall be avoided in all debates.
- 4.—No motion shall be discussed without first being seconded.
- 5.—When a motion has been made and seconded and a member proposes a discussion, the Moderator shall put the question; "Shall this question be discussed?" If negatived, the question shall be dismissed.
- 6.—If any proposition or motion, under debate, contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and the vote taken separately.
- 7.—Motions made and lost shall not be recorded on the minutes unless so ordered by the party making the motion.
- 8.—No one shall speak more than twice on any subject without special leave of the Moderator.
- 9.—All questions shall be decided by a majority of the members present.
- 10.—No member shall be absent without leave of the moderator, and if so, his name shall be left off of the minutes.
- 11.—No member shall leave this body, while in session, without leave of the Moderator.
- 12.—Minutes shall be leisurely read and corrected, if necessary, before the rising of the Association.
- 13.—In future sessions of this Association arrangements shall be made so as to insure two or more sermons each day, or other equivalent devotional exercise during the day.
- 14.—The rules of order shall be distinctly read from the chair immediately after the organization of the Association.
- 15.—Alteration may be made in these rules at any regular session.

Minutes

The Little Missouri River Free-Will Baptist Association met with Pleasant Grove Church, Pike County, Arkansas, on the 3rd, 4th and 5th days of October, 1891. The introductory sermon was preached by Elder Z. D. Lawless from Isaiah 55th chapter and 4th verse, after which the Association went into an election for Moderator and Clerk which resulted as follows; Elder Z. D. Lawless was elected Moderator, D. Moore clerk and J. H. Lawless assistant clerk.

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... which corresponded to the real... were called for, and letters from the following churches were presented, with the names of the delegates from each church: Speedwell church, R. Porter and R. M. Cogburn; Pleasant Grove church, D. F. Pinzon, J. T. Ailer and J. H. Lawless; Concord church, W. L. Westbrook, Bethel church, J. A. Fox, W. T. Bell, J. F. Greer and J. A. Barton; Rock Springs church no. 2, B. F. Ralls and J. F. Musgraves. By motion D. Moore was seated as a delegate from Holly Creek church.

Petitionary letters were then called for, and one was presented from Corinth Church Pike County, M. Travis, William Travis and John Whisenhunt as delegates. The letter was read and received and the right hand of fellowship extended to the delegates by the moderator.

By motion the Moderator appointed the following committees: committee on arrangement, D. Moore, J. H. Lawless and J. F. Musgraves; committee on credentials, J. W. Brewer, R. Porter and J. F. Greer; committee on finance, B. F. Ralls, M. Travis and W. T. Bell; committee on resolution, D. Moore, J. H. Lawless and J. F. Greer.

Committee on arrangement report as follows; prayer meeting on Sabbath at 9 o'clock A. M. by Eld. J. A. Fox, preaching at 11 o'clock A. M. by Eld. J. F. Greer with Bro.

Pinckerton to follow; preaching at 2 o'clock P. M. by Eld. J. W. Brewer with Bro. J. A. Fox to follow, and services continued by communing and foot washing at 4 o'clock P. M. Eld. J. A. Fox Baptised Bro. Parker. Monday, Oct. 5th, the Association met pursuant to adjournment the Moderator in the chair, prayer by Bro. D. B. James. The roll was called and a quorum was present. The committee on arrangements made their report which was prayer meeting by Brother J. A. Welch at 9 o'clock A. M.; preaching at 11 o'clock by Elder B. Cox and Bro. Rogers; preaching at 3 o'clock P. M. by Elders Brewer and Markam. Then the Committee on finance made their report.

The Committee on Resolutions reported as follows;

1st.—“Resolved that we hold a union meeting at Bethel church, commencing on Friday night before the second Sabbath in August, 1892.

2nd.—“Resolved that we adopt the articles of the Southern Baptist Association, amending article 11.

3rd.—“Resolved that the Free Will Baptist Church adopt the following rules: On receiving members into the Church that in “granting them all of the rights and privileges when baptized,” the word ‘baptized’ shall be left out.

4th.—“Resolved that hereafter when we go into communion and washing feet we will make a distinction between christians and the

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world, or sinners by having the seated separately.

5th.—Resolved that hereafter all disorderly members shall not be recognized in our Church.

6th.—Resolved that hereafter we will license our preachers instead of liberating them.

6th.—Resolved that we solicit our preachers and lay members to write an essay to be examined at our camp-meeting at Bethel, that we may have it published with our next minutes.

By motion the above resolutions were adopted and the committee, Z. P. Lawless, D. Moore and J. P. Greer discharged.

The following general resolutions were agreed upon: "Resolved that we communicate with the

Resolved that our next association convene with Rock Springs church no. 2, Howard County, Arkansas, commencing on Friday night before the first Sabbath in October, 1892; Elder Z. D. Lawless to preach the introductory sermon, and Bro. J. A. Fox to follow.

Resolved that we tender our thanks to the brethren and citizens of this vicinity for their kind hospitality during our stay with them."

Articles of Faith

OF GOD.—ARTICLE 1. We believe there is one, and but one living and true God: Who is in personality the Father, Son and Holy Ghost. Equal and harmonious in every divine perfection.

For there is one God, and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus.—1 Tim. 2c., 5v.

OF THE HOLY SCRIPTURES.—ART. 2. We believe that God is the author of the Holy Bible, and that its teachings constitute the only infallible doctrine for the government of His Church.

All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction,

OF ORIGINAL APOSTASY.—ART. 3. We believe that Adam was created when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was pleasant to the eyes, and a tree to be desired to make one wise, she took of the fruit thereof, and did eat; and gave also unto her husband with her and he did eat.—Gen. 3c., 6v.

OF FREE GRACE.—ART. 4. We believe that the grace of God comprehends all spiritual blessings

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salvation: That the Holy Spirit not only reproves the world of sin, but is the means whereby sinners are converted and made wise unto salvation.

For there is no difference between the Jew and the Greek; for the same Lord over all is rich unto all that call on him.—Rom. 10c. 12.

OF CHRISTIAN FAITH.—ART. 5. We believe that Christian Faith is belief in Jesus Christ as the Son of God and Redeemer of the world and is the divinity of the Holy Scriptures. That "Faith cometh by hearing and hearing by the Word of God."

He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life: and he that believeth not on the Son shall receive life: but the wrath of God abideth on him.—John 3c., 36v.

OF REPENTENCE.—ART. 6. We believe that repentance is sorrow for sin, and the kind of sorrow which constitutes godly repentance must be preceded by effectual conviction for sin.

For godly sorrow worketh repentance to salvation not to be repented of; but the sorrow of the world worketh death.—Cor. 7c., 10.

OF FREE AGENCY.—ART. 7. We believe that the human will is free, and that men have ability to accept or reject the conditions of salvation as they are revealed in the Holy Scriptures.

He hath shewed thee, O man, what is good, and what doth the Lord require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?—Mich. 6c., 8v.

OF PERSEVERENCE.—ART. 8.

We do not believe under the Gospel dispensation, that any soul is elected to eternal life unconditionally. But that those who by faith persevere to the end will be saved. That it is possible for men who have been converted to "Make shipwreck of the faith," turn again to sin and be finally lost.

And Jesus said unto him, No man having put his hand to the plough, and looking back, is fit for the kingdom of God.—Luke 9c., 62.

OF GOOD WORKS.—ART. 9. We believe that good work is the result of faith, and not of necessity. That those who have faith will do works of righteousness; while those who have no faith, cannot do any thing pleasing or acceptable unto God.

Every tree that bringeth not forth good fruit is hewn down and cast into the fire.—Matt. 6c., 19 and 20.

OF CHRISTIAN BAPTISM.—ART. 10. We believe that Christian Baptism is the immersion in water of a believer in the names of the Father, Son and Holy Ghost. That baptism cannot be Scripturally administered without faith in the subject who receives it.

Therefore we are buried with him by baptism into death; that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life.—Rom. 6c., 4v.

GOSPEL ORDINANCES.—ART. 11.

We believe the Lord's Supper and the washing of one another's feet, are ordinances of Jesus Christ; to be perpetrated under the Gospel of universal obligation and to

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be administered to all true believers.

OF THE SOUL.—ART. 12. We believe that man is a living soul. That the body will die, but that the soul is immortal. That death is the separation of the mortal and immortal parts.

And the Lord God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life, and man became a living soul.—Gen. 2c., 7v.

OF THE RESURRECTION.—ART. 13 We believe in the resurrection of the dead. When the resurrection

place the will reunite and form an individual being. That the righteous will be received into a state of everlasting happiness, to reign with God for ever and ever; But the wicked shall be bound hand and foot, and cast into outer darkness.

Marvel not at this, for the hour is coming in which all that are in the grave shall hear his voice.

And shall come forth; they that have done good unto the resurrection of life; and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation.—John 5c., 28, 29.
