The Little River Association of Free Will Baptists held it's annual meeting on October 18, 1997 at the Cool Springs Free Will Baptist Church. The meeting opened with a congregational song, "Victory in Jesus", followed with a prayer by Rev. Steve Hughes. The devotion was given by Rev. Otis Whitehead, home missionary to Jacksonville, FL, and his text was taken from Luke 14:16-24.

The welcome from the host church was given by Rev. Steve Hughes and the response from the association was given by Rev. Billy Sumner.

Moderator Ronnie Moore called the meeting to order. Rev. Kent Barwick opened in prayer and the Credentials Committee report was given by Rev. Keith Lloyd. The report was as follows: 13 churches, 8 pastors, 4 other ministers, 9 deacons, and 43 delegates were present. This made the total number of voting delegates for the day, 64. A motion was made and carried to seat these delegates.

The State COOP offering was received and totaled \$160.05. The minutes and treasurers report of the last meeting were read and approved.

Rev. Keith Lloyd read a report from the Executive Committee. The report was received as read and becomes an integral part of these minutes.

Rev. Rowan Sirmans read the recommendations from the Nominating Committee and asked that the Executive Committee look in to the possibility of dissolving unnecessary committees. The Nominating Committee report was received as read.

Rev. Steve Hughes gave a report from the Ordaining Council. The Council encourages all pastors to be present at district meetings as stated in the LRA Constitution and By-Laws. The Ordaining Council is still waiting on the Letters of Good Standing for Rev. Damon Dodd and Rev. Gerald Brown. The Ordaining Council report was received as given.

No report from the LRA Trustee Board. Rev. Steve Hughes made a motion that the Board be "de-activated" until needed. After some discussion about the possibility of the LRA owning property in Nashville, GA, Rev. Hughes withdrew his previous motion. Rev. Hughes then made a motion that the Trustee Board look in to this property and report back to the association at the next quarterly meeting. Motion was seconded and carried.

Rev. Steve Hughes read a report from the LRA Mission Board and thanked everyone who took part in the Mission Banquet. The report was received as read and becomes an integral part of these minutes.

Rev. Kent Barwick gave a report from the LRA C.E. Board and

their intentions to plan a Sunday School enlargement seminar and other evangelistic techniques. The C.E. Board would like to highlight Evangelistic techniques at our January meeting. The C.E. Board report was received as given.

Bro. Chester Chancey gave a report from the LRA Finance Committee. This report was received as read and becomes an integral part of these minutes.

Rev. Steve Hughes gave a report from the State Missions Board. The Board unanimously recommends the sale of the North Fayette mission property. This will be voted on by the State Association at it's Annual Meeting in November. Rev. Hughes also stated the need for more mission activity in the Metro-Atlanta area. The State Mission Board report was received as given.

Bro C.M. Chafin gave a report from the State Trustee Board. The Board met on Oct. 6 at the State Office in Moultrie and moved to sell the property there and rent property until a new office could be built, Bro. Chafin expressed his concern over this proposal and informed the association that this would be a matter of business at the State Association meeting in Nov. The report was received as given.

Bro. Kent Barwick gave a report from the State Camp Board. He informed the association of plans to secure a 4-H Camp in the North Georgia area, and of plans to hold both low and high teen camps simultaneously. Bro. Kent also encouraged pastors to promote the state camp session. The Camp Board report was received as given.

Rev. Kent Barwick gave a report from the State C.E. Board. The Sr. Saint's Retreat doubled in registrations from last years attendance. He also encouraged continued support of the FWBBC and attendance at the State meeting. This report was received as given.

Rev. Steve Hughes gave reports on the National Fund-Raising Drive and the Double-in-a-Decade Membership Drive. The campaign for the National Fund Raising Drive will end on 12-31-97. Georgia is still \$8000.00 short of it's goal. These reports were received as given.

After a brief recess, Rev. Rowan Sirmans, representing the Nominating Committee, opened the floor for any other nominations to fill the LRA offices for 1998. No nominations were received from the floor. Bro. Rowan then made a motion that all nominations from the Nominating Committee be seated in their respective offices. The motion was seconded and carried. The listing of the new officers for 1998 can be found in the first few pages of the Annual Minutes.

Old Business: None

New Business: The recommendation from the Executive Committee

to supply each church with one (1) set of minutes for every ten (10) members or fraction thereof, was moved upon and carried.

A motion was made that the C.E. Board work with Rev. Gerald Brown and the Tifton 1st church to provide the program for the January association meeting. Motion was seconded and carried.

With no further business, announcements from churches were received and a motion to adjourn from the business session was made, seconded and carried.

A congregational hymn, "Just a Little Talk with Jesus", began our special worship service. Rev. Steve Hughes introduced Rev. Fred Hersey, retired missionary to Japan, who shared with us about his ministry there. Sis. Debbie Griffin, missionary to Japan, ministered to us with the song, "Great is Thy Faithfulness", with Sis. June Hersey accompanying her on the piano. After our special Mission Rally Offering, which totaled \$3031.00, Rev. Ronald Wallace, missionary to Alaska, brought the morning message from Jonah 1:4-10, 4:9-11.

Rev. Fred Hersey dismissed us in prayer and a wonderful lunch was provided by the members of Cool Springs FWB Church.
